
To paraphrase Robert Kincaid¹, “The dreams they had were good ones. They didn’t all come true, but they were worth having, all the same.”

Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland “Cy” Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrate from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard – John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The “Old Country” referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from “the old country”; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is “Yarbrough”.

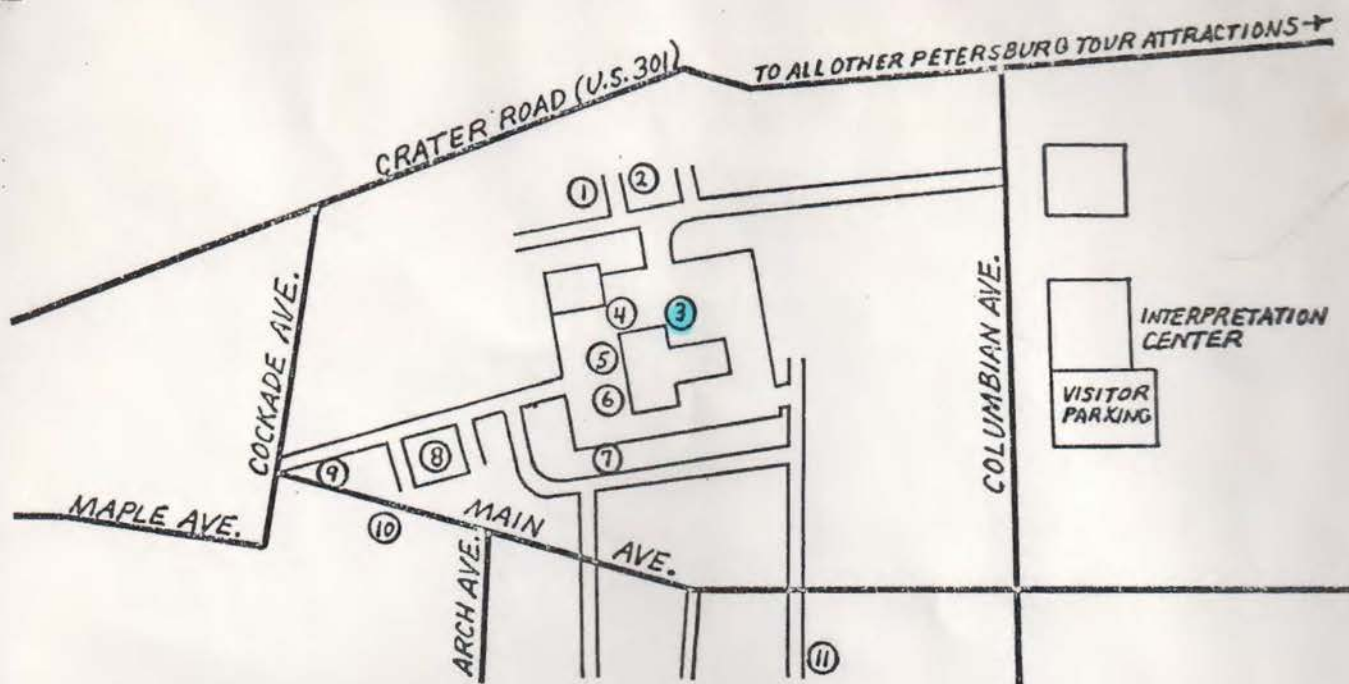

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WALKING TOUR OF BLANDFORD CEMETERY

(* Indicates graves of persons whose stories are told in the Blandford Interpretation Program.)

1. * Grave of Miss Nora Fontaine Maury Davidson. Headmistress of the Confederate School, she led school children on June 9, 1865, in decorating graves of the old men and young boys who on the previous June 9th had given their lives defending Petersburg from Union invasion. From this local observance came the inspiration for national Memorial Day.
2. * Lt. Wales Hurt. Petersburg was able to muster only 129 defenders on June 9, 1864, when 1,300 Union cavalry backed by 3,000 infantry advanced on the city along the narrow Jerusalem Plank Road. Most of the defenders were civilians too young or too old for army service, patients from the hospital and inmates of the jail. Nearly half were captured, wounded or killed. But they stopped the Federal advance until Confederate reinforcements arrived to protect the city. Wales Hurt was among those killed. He was 17.
3. * Gravestone of Richard Scarbrough. This is the oldest gravestone in the cemetery, dating back to 1702. Scarbrough, an Englishman, was one of the founders of Bristol Parish.
4. Memorial to Sir William Skipwith, Baronet. A descendant of the Skipwith family of Prestwold in Leicestershire, he was one of the few noblemen who left England to live in the Virginia Colony.

5. Memorial to John Daly Burk. A political activist and Irish refugee, Burk was a noted historian in the early 19th century and authored a history of Virginia. He was killed in a duel after he criticized the French government in front of a loyal Frenchman.
6. * Memorial to British Major-General William Phillips. He died of illness after a skirmish with Marquis de Lafayette here in the Revolutionary War. Phillips is the highest ranking British officer of the Revolution resting in American soil.
7. Modern Sculpture by Jacques Lipchitz, noted avant-garde sculptor. This is the gravemarker for Thomas Catesby Jones, who purchased the work from Lipchitz in 1929 and brought it from France. Jones left a collection of modern European art, including works by Lipchitz, to the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts.
8. Monument erected by the Washington Artillery of New Orleans. Dedicated to unit members who were killed during the 10-month siege of Petersburg in the last and longest campaign of the Civil War.
9. * Monument to Captain Richard McRae and the Petersburg Volunteers. Wearing cockades on their hats, they marched to Canada and fought in the Battle of Fort Meigs during the War of 1812. In recognition of their valor, President James Madison nicknamed Petersburg "The Cockade City of the Union." The fence, a fine example of decorative ironwork, has one star for each of the 17 states of the Union in 1812.
10. Decorative Ironwork. Some excellent examples of fancy ironwork are located in this area and can be seen as you walk along Main Avenue.
11. Grave of Mrs. Pamela A. Gary. She accompanied her husband, Capt. George G. Gary, aboard the ship Cyrus transporting the first black colonists from Petersburg to the African Republic of Liberia. The first Liberian president, Joseph Jenkins Roberts, was a former resident of Petersburg.

From Main Avenue at the rear of the church, visitors may drive down Arch Avenue to the Memorial Area where 30,000 Confederate soldiers are buried around markers giving the names of their home states. The granite arch over the avenue is a memorial to these men. In the Memorial Area, Crater Monument honors Confederate soldiers who fought in the Battle of the Crater, July 30, 1864. Near it is the mausoleum of Maj.-Gen. William Mahone, who commanded the Confederate defense at the Crater.



In 1880 our church paid the pastor \$125.00 for the year. The collection that was taken, which might be just \$1.25, was all given to the pastor. He had no certain amount to receive. In the 1920 Trinity River Baptist Association Minute Book, it shows that the pastor of this church received \$32.50 for the year's work. A special donation was taken at the end of the associational year to cover the different phrases of work and the minute book. This special donation kinda hit the members pretty hard.

People were always being excluded from the fellowship of the church. Usually there was a committee who would go and talk to the members, who had the charges preferred against them. They had to come and make acknowledgement to the church and ask for forgiveness. Then the members would vote to restore them to the church. Reports were made to the church on members, some of which would be false. Of course, this would cause quite an uproar. Then charges might be brought against the person who reported false accusations. Some of the preferred charges that were brought up in our church were: drunkenness, gambling, fighting, profanity, using God's name in vain, dancing, insulting a person, non-attendance, giving dancing parties, unchristian conduct against members, and non-fellowship. Sometimes these charges were found to be false and were dismissed. Charges were brought against one woman for round dancing, and she didn't know it was wrong to round dance. In one

instance, a member was excluded for keeping a saloon and operating a billiard table. Now listen to this one, another was excluding for joining the Methodist Society.

The old church records show that it was not uncommon for a member to come forward and confess his sins. In one instance, a person confessed to the church he had taken the name of the Lord in vain by cursing. He asked God to forgive him and God had forgiven him, and he wanted the church to forgive him.

One man back in 1902, called for a dismissal of his letter, because he could not support some of the people fellow-members were supporting in the general election. After two or three months of business meetings, with long drawn out discussions, his request was refused.

In 1914, the Methodist used our church for services. I suppose this is when the Methodist at Concord first organized; for in 1915 they built their church.

We had not had Sunday school for years until August, 1949, when it was re-organized. Mrs. F.F. Seale, member of our church, had taught Sunday school in the Methodist church for years. In 1949, Mrs. Seale had more Baptist in her class than Methodist; so she started to talking to the church to organize a Sunday school. There was some opposition, some felt there weren't enough to have Sunday school; but the church voted to organize a Sunday school, and we have had Sunday school ever since. I remember Mrs. Seale said she came to Sunday school one

Sunday; she and her child were the only ones present. So, she sat down and prayed before she went home. She taught me in Sunday school. After I was grown, we worked together with young people in 4-H work and in Bible schools. She always did a lot of witnessing, and I feel she lead more young people to Christ than any other person I have known. I know she was the main one that introduced me to our blessed Saviour. To me she was one of the finest Christians that I have ever known. She has gone to her heavenly home. Mrs. Seale was not a member of this church the last years of her life.

There have been many faithful and dedicated Christians in our church, as you know; or it would never have survived all these years. The Lord has been among us, and is still with us to see us through the hardships that we encounter. We know we are one of the Lord's churches. Even though we are small in number, we try to carry on the Lord's work. The records are not complete, about twenty years are missing, but I would like to recognize some of the former leaders that I know carried on the work. I'm sure there were many more that I have no way of knowing about. Back in the early days there was Uncle Jim Mattison, Conner Walker, Virgil Selman, G.B. Selman, Pleas Bull, Willis Willett, and John and Laura Powell. Laura Powell joined the church in 1875 and was a life-time member. Mrs. Daisy Barrett and Mrs. Lena Burns said they always liked to see the Powell's coming to church. There were so

Thank you for your interesting letter of September 8, 1989, and welcome to Yarbrough Family of Yarbrough(all spellings) Researchers.

Robert Price Yarbrough, deceased, a founder of the National Yarbrough conference, was the author of "Yarbrough. The Ambrose Line." This is his only book, but it has had several printings with little appreciable change, an addendum by his widow. The latest printing can be obtained from Jane B. Yarbrough, 3358 Willow Oak Road, Charlotte, NC 28209. Tel. 704/523-4104, for \$25.00 plus \$2.00 postage. It is a wonderful book and if your Yarbrough line is included you are very fortunate. There are several other excellent family written books, but their availability is questionable. Most are available in libraries, and other family members might advise you of the volumes that might include your line.

If you are not aware the National Yarbrough Conference has recently completed its seventh annual conference, meeting in late July in Salt Lake City, Utah. Charles David Yarbrough, still a law student at the University of Texas, in 1966 started the publication of THE YARBROUGH FAMILY MAGAZINE which led to the first conference in Petersburg, VA, in 1981, to re-mark the grave of Richard Yarbrough the Immigrant in Blandford Church Cemetery. "Texas Charlie" died an untimely and tragic death, but the NYC continues and flourishes in his memory. My meager efforts to continue CDY's publication is the Interim News Sheet for YFM, published nine months of the year, September through May. Subscription is by contributions. Some 600 family researchers, libraries, genealogical societies are on the mailing list. Copies go to England, Canada, Alaska and Hawaii. However, I think most of the readers are in the Great State of Texas, closely followed by the "long" state of Tennessee. Most of the Yarbrough families passed through Tennessee to Texas.

I'm adding your name to our INS-YFM mailing list and sending copies of your letter to Karen Mazock, Virginia Beach, VA, Yarbrough Family Historian, Archivist and Query Editor of INS-YFM; Mrs. Frances Lockwood, Comanche, TX, NYC director and longtime researcher; and Rea Donohue, a fellow Texan who with her sister, Ophelia Kessler of New Castle, have outstanding family records of "all" lines. Rea is Breckenridge and they are John Swanson descendants. I hope they will be able to put you in touch with those researching the James N. Yarbrough line and help you with any questions. Good luck, good Yarbrough hunting! Let me know if I can be of any assistance.

The information I have concerning James N. Yarbrough and his family is as follows:

James N. was born 12-10-1811, in North Carolina.

Between 1830 and 1833, he moved to Marengo County, Alabama.

There he married Sarah Axiom; they had three sons - John, Lewis E., and William A.

Sarah Axiom died between 1844 and 1847.

April 22, 1847, James N. married Sarah Boykin, daughter of Jessie and Susan A. Boykin.

James N. and Sarah (Boykin) had two children - James B. and Mary Ann.

Between 1851 and 1859, James N.'s family along with Jessie Boykin's family moved to the small town of Concord, located in Leon County, Texas.

In 1869, James Robert Boyd (my great-great grandfather) married Mary Ann Yarbrough (James N.'s daughter). They had seven children.

In 1883, James Robert's family along with James N.'s family moved to Evergreen (now Gustine) in Commanche County, Texas.

James N. Yarbrough died 8-6-1888, his wife Sarah Boykin died 3-15-1892. They are buried in Evergreen Cemetery.

CONCORD #1 MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH

C56

The Concord #1 Missionary Baptist Church was organized on Saturday April 21, 1855, which makes our church 130 years old today, April 21, 1985. Bro. W.A. Walker was the founder and first pastor. Our church is said to be the 2nd oldest church in the state, and our Association, which I think means Missionary Baptist Church. The land for the church was given by Isaac Burleson; the deed being recorded on June 7, 1856. Bro. Walker, the first pastor, is buried in the cemetery here next to the church, the Concord Cemetery. J.N. Yarbrough was the first clerk and U.T. Ashberry, the first deacon.

The charter members were: John Allison, Mirandy Moon, Willis Burkhalter, and Gerzilda Buckhalter. The earliest missionary we can find out anything about who visited our church, was Bro. Peters from Rogers Prairie.

Miss Cora Kay, who passed away in 1976, an aunt of Julia Mae Richardson, had been a member of our church since 1906, was baptized by Bro. Neyland in Buck Creek. This means she was a member for seventy-six years.

supported the church with her money and prayers even when she was unable to attend. At the time of her death, she had been a member of this church longer than any other person. She wrote me a letter in 1970 from Iola where she lived after retiring. I was working on the history of the church for our Historical Marker Dedication. She told me about riding to church on the horn of a saddle with her "Papa". It would be about 3 o'clock in the afternoon before they got home, before conference would adjourn. This extra time was spent "preferring charges" against members for dancing, fighting, cursing, getting drunk, gossiping, and many other things.

She remembered another incident as a child. They had torn down the old church and built a new one and, of course, that took quite a bit of doings in those days considering the shortage of money. When the final note for \$60.00 came due, no one could make good his pledge. The boll weevil had eaten the cotton, and the chinyz bug the corn. So, her papa, and G.P. Kay, wen to the bank and borrowed the money to pay off the note. She said she was just a little girl, but it worried her so much for them to owe \$60.00. It looked as big as the national debt does today.

Back in the early days, revivals were called protracted meetings. I can remember a grandmother never said revival, always protracted meeting and the word revival.

Dear Vivian:

I was thrilled to get your card and learn you are out of the hospital and home again. I chuckled a bit when I read your remark about facing a stack of work. Cousin, I'm afraid you have a terminal case of "Genealogist Disease". If we all worked as diligently as you all the family mysteries would be solved long ago.

I now have definite proof that Humphrey Yarbrough married Mary Lee, daughter of Robert Lee in Anson County. The proof was given to me by Richard C. Fremont of Hackettstown, New Jersey. Richard is descended from Humphrey and Mary and we figure we are 6th. cousins. I also got the same information from Mrs. Truman H. Kuhn of Casselberry, Florida. It's a rather complicated story and I will try to make it as clear as I can.

A young South Carolinian named Wiley Boyakin came to Anson County, N.C. he purchased land near the Rocky River and in 1804 married Millie Yarbrough, daughter of Humphrey and Mary Lee Yarbrough. In 1808 Wiley and Millie emigrated to central Tennessee and later to Illinois. Both are buried in St. Clair County, Illinois.

Wiley and Millie Y. Boyakin in 1807 had a son named Williamson Franklin Boyakin, born in Anson County. Williamson was one year old when his parents went to Tennessee. Williamson became a medical doctor and he lived in central Tennessee, Belleville, Illinois and Marysville, Kansas. His wife, Maria McQuary was buried in Belleville. Dr. Boyakin lived to reach the ripe old age of one hundred and one. The following are excerpts from his obituary published in the "Marysville, Kansas Advocate", 11 June 1908.

"The father of Dr. Boyakin, Wiley Boyakin, was born in 1780, in Edgefield County, South Carolina. Upon reaching manhood he was married in Anson County, North Carolina, on the Rocky River, near the Peedee, his wife being Miss Milly Yarbrough, who was born in 1781 in that county. They lived there until after the birth of Williamson F., which took place May 30, 1807. Later they came to Illinois, where his mother died in 1846, and the father in 1850.

Williamson F. Boyakin was but one year old, when in 1808 when his parents removed with a company from North Carolina to middle Tennessee. The caravan consisted of one hundred two-wheeled carts of primitive construction, not a pound of iron being used in the whole outfit.

This colony settled in middle Tennessee, in Maury, Giles and Stewart counties. Young Boyakin was raised in Giles and Maury counties. In a manner common to the boys in that region his earliest recollections being of taking refuge in a block house to escape from the Indians".

While reading the obituary I was especially interested in the caravan of two wheeled carts; one hundred it said. The obituary gave the names of

quite a few of the party members and some I know were from Mecklenburg and Rowan Counties - it is evident that families came from miles around to join the voyage. The date of the migration checks with the time Lee, Davis and Ambrose Yarbrough left Anson for Tennessee. Ambrose was Humphrey's son - Millie's brother. Ambrose settled in Giles County, Davis in Stewart County and I don't know where Lee settled. Probably other Yarbroughs joined the group. But the most interesting thing is that some members of the party continued northward into the Illinois Territory. Vivian, I firmly believe that your Yarbroughs in Illinois were of this Anson County group. In those early years there were few Yarbroughs in the country and except for the 1808 voyagers all stayed in the South; Illinois was scantily settled at that time, so if your Dempsey was not of that group where in the devil did he come from.

Also enclosed is a copy of a paragraph from a letter written June 25, 1907 by Williamson F. Boyakin when he was one hundred years old. At first I doubted that a hundred year old man could compose and write the letter.

Then I reread the first paragraph of the obituary published by the "Marysville, Kansas Advocate"

True copy:

"He had been in rather poor health for several months but improved considerably during the latter part of May and it was thought he would be able to come to this city on "Decoration Day" to make the address."

Now I realize that if he could address the gathering he certainly could compose and write a good letter. Millie Yarbrough's son must have been a hearcat of a man; he was 101 at that time. There were several glaring errors in his letter but I credit them to the old man's dim memory. However, I think that basically his recollections are correct and of great value.

True copy:

"I read this ancestral history of yours with more pleasure, I presume, than I otherwise would have done from the fact that my own mother was of French descent. She was a Yarbrough. Her father, Humphrey Yarbrough was a French Huguenot expelled from France after the revocation of the Edict of Nanteze. He settled in North Carolina married a kinswoman of Richard Lightfoot Lee of Virginia, fought in the Revolution under General Francis Marion. His daughter, Millie Yarbrough married my father, Wiley Boyakin, a South Carolinian, born and raised in Chesterfield County. They settled in Anson County, North Carolina, where I, their second child was born, May 30, 1807. In the summer of 1808 they migrated to Tennessee".

Old one hundred year old Williamson was confused when he said his mother was of French decent. The fact is his father, Wiley Boyakin, was of French decent. But I can understand that for often I get things backwards in my mind, and at times get my grandchildren's names mixed up. In the early 1700's a band of French Huguenots settled in the old Santee area, a few miles north of Charleston, South Carolina. Among the group were two brothers named "BEAUQUIN". Grandsons of these men emigrated upcountry

following the Santee and Wateree into the old Camden area of South Carolina. There in the upcountry, away from the French influence the spelling and pronunciation of their name changed to "Boyakin". Williamson Boyakin also erred when he said Humphrey Yarbrough fought in the Revolution under General Francis Marion. General (the Swamp Fox) Francis Marion fought in South Carolina, so it had to be Wiley Boyakin's father who served under Marion. I find it exciting that Williamson said that Humphrey's wife was a kinswoman of Richard Lightfoot Lee. And there again old Williamson was confused. There was a Francis Lightfoot Lee and he had a brother named Richard Henry Lee. I think Williamson meant to write Francis Lightfoot Lee, but it really makes no difference. Both men were signers of the Declaration of Independence and of the same line as Robert E. Lee. I must research this because my Millie (Jonathan's wife) was Mary Lee's sister. I have a copy of Robert Lee's will and he left Mary Yarbrough furniture, a feather bed and ten pounds ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ proclamation money, and he left my Amelia (Millie) ten pounds proclamation money and a breeding mare.

After trying to separate the wheat from the chaff I know the old man's memory failed him in places but I am convinced he well remembered his grandparents, Humphrey and Mary Lee Yarbrough. Also I believe his recollections are correct concerning the migration to Tennessee. A man doesn't forget things like that.

Vivian, I am excited about the article you wrote for "Fayette Facts". I like the way you narrate and insert little familylore tales - that makes for interesting reading. It's sad that so few people embellish family histories with interesting tidbits about ancestors. Whether they were hero or scoundrel their story is always interesting. Most family histories I have read are about as exciting as reading the "Book of Genesis".

Well, this certainly is a long and rambling letter but what it all boils down to is: I firmly believe your Illinois Yarbroughs were members of and descendants of that band of emigrants from Anson County.

Cousin, take good care of yourself and keep in touch.

YARBROUGH FAMILY

The Yarbrough family is truly one of Fayette's first families. In the Illinois census of 1818, taken when Illinois applied for statehood, there were a number of families living along the Kaskaskia River in what was then Washington County, Ill., now Clinton Co. In the group were Smiths, Inmans, Daniels, Wilburn, Journey, Ezell, and several other Fayette Co. families. By 1820 most of these families had moved on up the river and were in Seminary Twp., Fayette Co. The first record of the Yarbroughs in Fayette Co. was in 1821.

Miss Vivian Yarbrough, now of Pasadena, Calif., and Mrs. Wm. (Dolores) Lee of Cahmpaign, Ill. have spent many years researching the Yarbrough family. They have come up with a great deal of information and many conjectures. The difficulty is that the proof of descent generally is found in estate papers or in land records. In common with many people in Fayette County in the early days, the only one of these Yarbroughs, who are thought to have been brothers, to buy any land was the youngest one, Dempsey. In those days that did not indicate poverty. The land was there, miles of it, and many people made an "improvement", continued for years to live on the government land with out paying taxes. If someone appeared to show an interest in the land on which they had settled, the man could buy it or move elsewhere. There was no law to the effect, but anyone who bought land on which someone else had settled first was expected to buy his "improvement", or he would be censured by his neighbors. All except Dempsey of this generation were dead before 1840. No estates were filed for any of them. The estates dealt only with personal property. If the heirs could come to an agreement and divide the property amicably, there was no need to file an estate. Probate fees and attorney fees tended to eat up an estate very rapidly.

All of the southern Yarbroughs claim descent from one of two immigrant ancestors. Richard Yarbrough and his wife Frances Proctor came from Lincolnshire in England before 1642. His gravestone is still standing at the Old Blandford Church of Bristol Parish.

Ambrose Yarbrough and wife Mary came to Virginia in 1732. Ambrose had land in Culpeper Co., Va. Later he sold this land to Henry Lewis, deed signed Ambrose and Mary. From Virginia they went to Union Co., S. C., where Ambrose died in 1789, his wife surviving. At least two, probably four sons went to Anson Co., N. C. The group, which first appeared on the 1762 tax list included Jonathan, Humphrey (known to be sons of Ambrose), Richard, and Joel. Joel came from Culpeper Co., Va., d before 1790, it is thought, and Richard does not appear after 1790. Jonathan, Humphrey, and Richard were all soldiers in the Revolution, but none have been proved up for the D. A. R., possibly because the court house in Anson Co., N. C. burned, and it is next to impossible to prove anything.

The Yarbroughs lived near the Rocky River in the northwest part of Anson Co. A near neighbor was a Robert Lee. It is proved from the wills of Robert Lee and Jonathan Yarbrough, which survived the fire, that Jonathan's wife was Millie (Amelia) Lee, dau of Robert. It is thought, but cannot be proved that Humphrey's wife was Mary Lee, her sister.

In the 1800 census of Anson Co., Jonathan and Humphrey Yarbrough were still in Anson Co. also Davis, Andrew, James, William, and Lee Yarbrough, who had land and 18 slaves. Robert P. Yarbrough of Charlotte, N. C., who is a descendant of Jonathan and Millie (Lee) Yarbrough, through son Ambrose, who went to Georgia, believes that Lee was the son of Jonathan and Millie.

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We next pick up the trail of the Yarbroughs in Maury Co., Tenn. In the tax lists were the following:

- 1811 -- Lee Yarbrough. (He next appears in the 1820 census of Hickman Co., Tenn. and soon after that in Fayette Co.) Brittain Yarbrough, Absalom Yarbrough, and Solomon Yarbrough. Brittain had 2 polls. Who was the second? It could not be Dempsey, who was too young.
- 1812 -- Solomon, Absalom, and Robert Yarbrough.
- 1813 -- Solomon and Absalom
- 1815 -- same two.
- 1816 -- Absalom. All apparently left soon after this for Illinois.

When Miss Vivian Yarbrough, who is now 93 years young, was a child, she watched the Fourth of July parade from the widow of her maternal grandfather's office. Later she asked her grandmother Yarbrough if the grandfather might have marched in that parade. The grandmother told her instead about Dempsey Yarbrough, Vivian's great grandfather. She said that during the War of 1812, Dempsey, a lad of 15, was left to take care of things at home while his father and three brothers (Dempsey's or his father's brothers?) were in the army. Absalom, Ambrose, and Jesse Yarbrough of this family were at the Battle of New Orleans. This Ambrose, who did not come to Ill. was living in Giles Co., just south of Williamson Co., where he sold land he had bought from Humphrey Yarbrough, Sr. of Anson Co., N. C. Jesse died in the army, and Solomon was administrator of his estate in Maury Co., no heirs listed. Solomon Yarbrough was the Justice of the peace. Dempsey walked to New Orleans, leaving his mother at home alone.

These are the Yarbroughs, who may or may not have been brothers, who showed up in Fayette County and Clinton Co. early records.

LEE Yarbrough b 1870-80, probably in Anson Co., N. C.. In N. C. he sold land he had owned in Montgomery Co. to a Crittendon. By three deeds, at least two of them made in Tenn. he sold his land in Anson Co. to George Karaker. In his household in 1800 were three females under 10 years. The next time he appears in the census in Hickman Co., Tenn. he had 1 M under 10, 2 M aged 10-16 and 1 M aged 16-24. There was one F under 10, 1 15-26, and 1 aged 26-45, possibly his wife. Lee was over 45, which would make him born 1770-74. He first appears in Fayette Co. 6 Sept., 1824, when he was supervisor of the road from Jeremiah Evans' place toward Belleville as far as the county line. He voted in 1824 and was appointed administrator of the estate of Archibald Ezell 17 Feb., 1825. He was Ezell's brother-in-law. He had possibly been first in Clinton Co. He ran for commissioner in Fayette Co. in 1820. He was involved in various suits some of them for money owed him, at other times for money he owed. One suit followed him from N. C. One for a \$24.00 debt in Clinton Co. was directed to Bond Co. The last entry is 7 March, 1837, when Lee and William Yarbrough collect on a note from Col. John Taylor. Most of the men who owed money to him seem to have been inn keepers.

ABSALOM Yarbrough b 1800-90 was head of the household which was counted in the 1818 Ill. census. He had been administrator of the estate of Jesse Yarbrough, thought to have been his brother, in Maury Co., Tenn. He had bought 190 acres of land on the Hurricane Fork of Snow Creek, a branch of the Duck River from James Campbell for \$500. He had sold the land in three pieces in 1817, preparatory to coming to Illinois. He was nominated for Justice of the Peace in Washington Co. and confirmed 3 Feb., 1821. He was commissioned Ensign in the Illinois Militia, Washington Co. 1822. He does not appear in the 1840 census, but there is a person of the right age in the household of his son Ambrose. His land was sold to Jackson Ammons, 26 May, 1850. He had bought this land in Sec. 15 Looking Glass Twp., and received a deed for the land from Wakefield's administrators Anna and Samri Wakefield.

SOLOMON Yarbrough was in Maury Co., Tenn. In the first Minute Book, 1808-9, there is an entry where Solomon Yarbrough was assigned to work on the road from Chambers Ferry to Akins Gap in Maury Co. In 1815 he was acting Justice of the Peace. June 5, 1821, Solomon Yarbrough, John A. Wakefield, and Rufus Inman were judges for the 5th military district, Fayette Co. He voted in elections. The last mention was in a suit on appeal from the J. P. court against John Enochs. It was terminated by the death of the plaintiff, in this case Solomon.

HUMPHREY Yarbrough appears only once in the Fayette Co. records. It is possible that he does not belong in this group but was the oldest son of Lee. The only mention is on 9 Feb., 1822 a judgment of Humphrey Yarbrough against Daniel Bathrick, a saloon keeper often in the courts, was appealed to the Circuit Court.

DEMPSEY Yarbrough b 6 Aug., 1799 in N. C. d 18 Mar., 1865. He took out a license to marry Mary "Polly" Smith, dau of Adam Smith, Jr. and Margaret Howell, on Mar., 1823. The marriage license was not returned to the court house, as many were not, so we have no record of when or by whom they were married. Mary was b 10 Dec., 1802 in N. C. d 28 Oct., 1868 in Bear Grove Twp. They are buried in the Evans Cemetery. According to descendants they were first buried in the Yarbrough Cemetery, when the bodies taken up and moved. In early life Dempsey was a military man. He was commissioned a Lt. in the Washington Co., Ill. militia 17 June, 1823, then Captain of the 15th Regt. Shelby Co. militia 19 Dec., 1828. He was in the Black Hawk war, 30 Apr., 1832, a Lt. in Capt. John Dement's Spy Battalion, discharged 20 May, 1832 at Ottawa. He received a land warrant, dated 2 Jan., 1854 for 40 acres NE1/4 of SE1/2 Sec. 3; Twp. 6N, R1W (Bear Grove). Dempsey Yarbrough was a justice of the peace for some time, administered a number of estates, was involved in a number of court proceedings. He was school commissioner, issued teachers' certificates in the early days. His last office was as a member of the Board of Supervisors in 1864.

GENERATION I in FAYETTE COUNTY.

CHILDREN OF LEE YARBROUGH, Possible. The only one we can definitely prove is John. John Yarbrough b before 1810 m 18 Apr., 1824 in Fayette Co. his first cousin, Polly Ezell, dau of Archibald Ezell. He died before 30 March, 1846, when Dempsey Yarbrough was appointed administrator of his estate and guardian of the minor children. His last entry in the records is when he bought at the sale of Isham Reavis in 1844. Polly was b ca 1806 in Tenn. d 31 Jan., 1860.

Etheldred Yarbrough b ca 1800-1810 d at his home in Seminary Twp. in 1840. H m 9 Apr., 1824 Nancy Riley. Etheldred was on the Grand Jury list in 1822. Ethel'd was in the Black Hawk War, a private in the same company as Dempsey. John Yarbrough was the first administrator of the estate, but he died. There is a record of Thos. S. Thompson, who was the Probate Justice as administrator, with John Shirley on his bond. Both John and Etheldred had considerable land holdings.

William Yarbrough m Nancy Yarbrough 12 Apr., 1831, both by con of parents. L Yarbrough gave con, but it did not say for which. William died in Clinton Co. in 1836. John and Etheldred bought at his sale, and John had a claim which was not allowed. No widow or heirs were listed. We have not been able to find any place of burial.

Absalom Yarbrough m Milly Lee, L 12 Apr., 1828. There is no other record of this Absalom except for the marriage record. There is a payment from John Yarbrough's estate to a Milly Gaskill, wife of Willaby Gaskill. This Milly was too old to have been the daughter of John. She may be this Milly who m Willaby M. Gaskill in 1838. Absalom does not appear in the 1830 Fayette Co. census, possibly died young or was in Clinton Co. Nancy (Riley) Yarbrough m Harrison Mattinlee 29 Aug., 1842. She was a widow again in 1850.

Elizabeth Yarbrough b ca 1809 in N. C. m 7 Aug., 1826 John Riley, b ca 1802 in N. C. Both apparently died between 1850 and 1860. We found no estate for John Riley, but a guardianship for the youngest children.
Milly (Amelia) Yarbrough b 29 Feb., 1816 in Tenn. d 9 Nov., 1854 in Seminary Twp. m 14 Jan., 1835 Frederick Smith, son of Delilah (Daniel) Smith. She is bur Seminary Cemetery. Frederick lived until 1883, m (2) Sarah Green. William Yarbrough gave con for his sister.

CHILDREN OF ADSALOM YARBROUGH. He had to have been married twice, the second in Washington Co., Ill. The court house there burned, so there are no early marriage records.

Ambrose Yarbrough b ca 1806-7 in Tenn d 26 Dec., 1861 m 14 Oct., 1832 Sarah Creel. She died 1849 or 50, and Ambrose m (2) Martha Inman 1 Aug., 1858. They were divorced in 1860. Martha Yarbrough appears in the 1860 census at Ramsey with 4 Inman children.

Robert b ca 1810 d 10 March, 1836, unm. Ambrose was the administrator of his small estate.

Rebecca b ca 1816-17 d 14 Jan., 1852 unm. She had entered a piece of land, which thirty years later was claimed by heirs.

Dennis Yarbrough b ca 1836, d 10 Jan., 1854. Name of his wife is not known. He had a son Jefferson J. Yarbrough, aged 24 in 1880

Brittain Yarbrough b 1838 d 1869 m 1 Dec., 1859 Martha K. Reynolds. Martha m (2) _____ Potts and had a child Minnie Potts b 1875 m (3) _____ Howell

CHILDREN OF DEMPSEY YARBROUGH and MARY SMITH

Elizabeth Imanda Yarbrough b 10 Dec., 1826 d Aug., 1877 m 4 Mar., 1840 James Elmore, oldest child of Russell and Lucy Elmore. None of this family appears after the 1870 census. The oldest dau Melinda b ca 1852 m James H. Duffy. Others were Martha b ca 1852, Illinois b ca 1853, Maria ca 1854, and James b ca 1860.

Jesse Willis Yarbrough b 17 Feb., 1827 d 9 Apr., 1876 m Aug., 1852 Elizabeth Scott, dau of John Scott. They had 1 son Wm. J. Yarbrough. Jesse was buried in the McInturff Cem. Elizabeth Scott m (2) John Walker. She is bur South Hill Cem., Vandalia.

LeRoy Yarbrough b 13 June, 1830 d 26 Jan., 1901 m 27 Apr., 1856 Lydia Rodecker. Lydia was the dau of William Rodecker and Eleanor McAdams. She was b in Logan Co., Ohio 31 Jan., 1833 d 24 July, 1891, both bur McInturff Cem.

LaFayette Yarbrough b 3 July, 1832 d 17 Dec., 1896 m 22 Nov., 1857 Mary Ann Rodecker, sister of Lydia. She was b 20 Feb., 1839 near Mulberry Grove, d 21 Feb., 1912 in Bear Grove Twp. bur McInturff Cem.

John C. Yarbrough b 14 Oct., 1835 d 12 Dec., 1868 m 23 Apr., 1861 Elizabeth Pyatt. He is buried at the Pope Cemetery in Hurricane Twp. There is no indication as to what happened to Elizabeth, no ch known.

Nancy Yarbrough b 10 Oct., 1838 d 4 May, 1863 m Apr., 1856 Levi Eakle. She was buried at the Eakle Cemetery. Levi Eakle m (2) Mary Butler and had more children. Nancy left three children: John E., Mary, and Jefferson Eakle.

Susan Ann Yarbrough b 19 Aug., 1840 d 10 June, 1881 m Wm. Gatewood 14 Apr., 1860. She had 2 ch Margaret Gatewood b 1866 and Henry Gatewood b 1868. None of this family are in the 1880 census. She is named in her mother's estate as Susan Ann Yarbrough.

Malinda J. Yarbrough b 30 Oct., 1842 d 15 Nov., 1875 m 2 Oct., 1864 Josiah R. Pilcher. She had 5 children, but three of them died young. Josiah m (2) _____ Wright and went to Kansas.

Mildred Sophronia Yarbrough b 15 Dec., 1843 m (1) 11 Sept., 1867 D. F. Walker, left 3 sons. See Walker family this issue. She m (2) James Jackson Matthews 7 Dec., 1850. She d ca 1910-12, probably in Bond Co.

GENERATION II

CHILDREN OF JOHN YARBROUGH and POLLY EZELL

- Mary "Polly" Yarbrough b ca 1828 m 16 Mar., 1842. She appears in the 1850 census, had 1 ch John George, b ca 1849. Aaron George succeeded Dampsey Yarbrough as guardian of the younger children.
- Lucy b ca 1830/31 m (1) 1 Mar., 1848 Wm. J. McBride. He apparently died soon, for she m (2) 23 July, 1848 Michael Smith, son of John Smith and Elizabeth Daniels. They had 2 sons, died when the children were very small. They were heirs of the grandmother's estate, Jordan Smith their gdn. Children were Wm. Jefferson and John Smith.
- Leander b ca 1835 m (1) Mary Ann Holt, 16 Aug., 1852, both under age. Martin S. Hoover gave consent for Mary Ann, 2 ch. m (2) Elizabeth (Rodecker) Sharp, a sister of the wives of Lekoy and Lafayette Yarbrough. She had 2 Sharp children. He was also known as Lee Yarbrough.
- William Yarbrough b ca 1834-35. There is no marriage record for him in Fayette Co. Wife was Susan. The family appears in the 1870 and 1880 censuses, living near Ramsey. He was a farm renter.
- Nancy Jane Yarbrough b ca 1837 m 4 Apr., 1856. Aaron George does not appear in the census after 1850, no information on children.
- Absalom Yarbrough b ca 1843-4 d 8 Feb., 1865 m (1) Martha A. Daniels 3 Jan., 1863. She had 1 ch who d infancy and she d 12 Dec., 1865 at age 20. Absalom m (2) her sister Catherine Daniels.
- John A. Yarbrough b ca 1845, was dead before 17 Apr., 1852, when mother Polly gave a receipt for the payment of an estate settlement from the father John Yarbrough. Leander was administrator of Polly's estate.

CHILDREN OF ETHELDRED YARBROUGH and NANCY RILEY

- Maria Jane b ca 1829 m in Clinton Co. 14 May, 1855 to Thos. F. Reeves. In 1870 she was in Fayette Co. living with her brother John, had 3 daus: Nancy b ca 1858, Lydia b ca 1810, Amanda b ca 1853. In 1880 Jane, a widow, was living in Vandalia on Madison St. Nancy and Lydia and a grandchild Clara, b in Mo. aged 4 mos. was living with her. Amanda was working at W. W. Watkins' Hotel.
- Milton A. b before 1835, d between 1840 and 1850
- Nelson W. Yarbrough b before 1835 d 1840-50, Fayette Co.
- Lee Yarbrough b ca 1836, d after 1881 m (1) 7 Feb., 1856, Lydia Tuttle, dau of Cyrus Tuttle and Sarah Seamans. She was born in Madison Co., Ohio. No burial place for either found. Lydia d ca 1878 and Lee m (2) Frances Whitley, dau of Josiah Whitley and Elizabeth Reavis, by S. D. Miles, J. P.
- John E. Yarbrough b 20 Jan., 1838 d 11 Jan., 1923, lived Seminary Twp. m 24 Dec., 1872 Minda Minerva Dugan, b 1848 d 1923. bur Seminary Cem.

CHILDREN OF ELIZABETH YARBROUGH and JOHN RILEY. There were 6 in the household in 1850, but another sister may have been somewhere else.

- Lucinda Riley m 26 Oct., 1853 Andrew J. Taylor, who was sheriff in the 1870's. They had no ch, reared 2 Heather boys
- Mary b ca 1834 m 11 June, 1858 James Hartman

There is a very interesting and long legal paper dealing with this family,
which gives the entire situation. Rebecca Yarbrough, dau of Absalom, had entered
80 acres of government land, but she did not have the title to it at the time of
her death. No taxes were yet due on the land, and her brothers apparently did not
know that she had it. She had bought the land in January, 1852. Her heirs were
brothers Brittain and Dennis and her niece R. J. Reynolds. These were all dead.
A man named Fritz Kreker was in possession of the land, and he was suing to quiet

quiet the title so he could sell it. The heirs to the land had been served with a summons. Only three heirs remained. Ambrose stated that the other two, Jefferson J. Yarbrough, the barber at Salem, and Mary Jane Northcutt did not have the resources to prosecute the case, and so sold their interests to Ambrose Yarbrough. When the action was started, the Northcutts lived in Jacksonville, Ill., but before the matter was settled they had moved to Centralis. Ambrose Yarbrough stated that they were very poor and had a large family. There was no indication of how the case came out.

Dear Larry:

Charles Yarbrow sends me copies of letters periodically with a request that I help a researcher if I can. I just received a copy of your letter. I hasten to mention that this typewriter has a serious spacing problem and to avoid a great deal of frustration on my part, I've written off some notes for you by hand.

You will note that I have not included any information on Ambrose Yarbrough. Anything that I could send would be a duplication of what is contained in R. P. Yarbrough's book, "Yarbrough." The only thing I will mention about Ambrose is that when Bob Yarbrough and I were talking shortly before his death, he mentioned that he had never found anything to prove that Ambrose came to this country in 1732. He commented that for all he knew, Ambrose could have been born in Virginia. While the theory still circulates that Ambrose came here from England, that is all that it is as far as we can prove at this point ... it is a tradition handed down from somewhere. If you find proof, it sure would be welcome to researchers of that line. Our research in England has been limited, but so far we have found nothing on Ambrose there either.

On the enclosed, please note that I have referenced the material as thoroughly as possible. I want to point out, however, that I do not have copies of all these documents in my files. A great deal of this information is abstracts that have been shared with me by other researchers. While they could all be accurate, if you want undisputed proof of your line, I would recommend that you use the enclosed as clues and order the records that may prove your line.

There is no charge for anything I share with you. Postage reimbursement is appreciated, but not necessary. What I do ask in return is that if you do order documents, if you would make me a copy to add to the records in the Y archives, it would be appreciated, not only by me but by other researchers in the family. A great deal of what I can share is because so many others have written and shared what they had. Most of us have learned that we won't live long enough to get to every county we need research from, and by sharing we are accomplishing years of research in short periods of time.

I am enclosing some blank groupsheets and hope that you will fill them out for my records. I believe I can safely say that I have the largest collection of Yarbrough records in this country. Sometimes I can find information on a line through the name of one of the children rather than a head of the family. One room of my home is lined with file cabinets, and the files are sometimes under a child's name



when a researcher has not been able to prove the parentage. I am always happy to search for records for any researcher.

The "index" to my files are books of family group sheets. I have over 5,000 Y families on these sheets. I've made you copies of my sheets on your names. As you can see, they are far from complete. If you can add any information, it would be welcome.

I am enclosing a county map for the state of Alabama. You may want to spend some time researching bordering counties. I made a discovery quite by accident. My line was definitely in Rowan County, NC during one period. I searched the Rowan County records and could not find marriage records. When I visited the area where the family lived, I discovered that while they lived in Rowan County, their farm was only a few miles from the Randolph County line. The Randolph County courthouse was only three miles across the line. The Rowan County Courthouse was over 25 miles from their farm. Sure enough, the marriage records were in Randolph County ... it was some miles closer and that is where they went to get married. Too, at times when the county lines changed, without moving our ancestors found themselves living in a different county.

I hope that something in the enclosed gives you some clues. I'll send along anything else I might find.

I look forward to hearing from you.

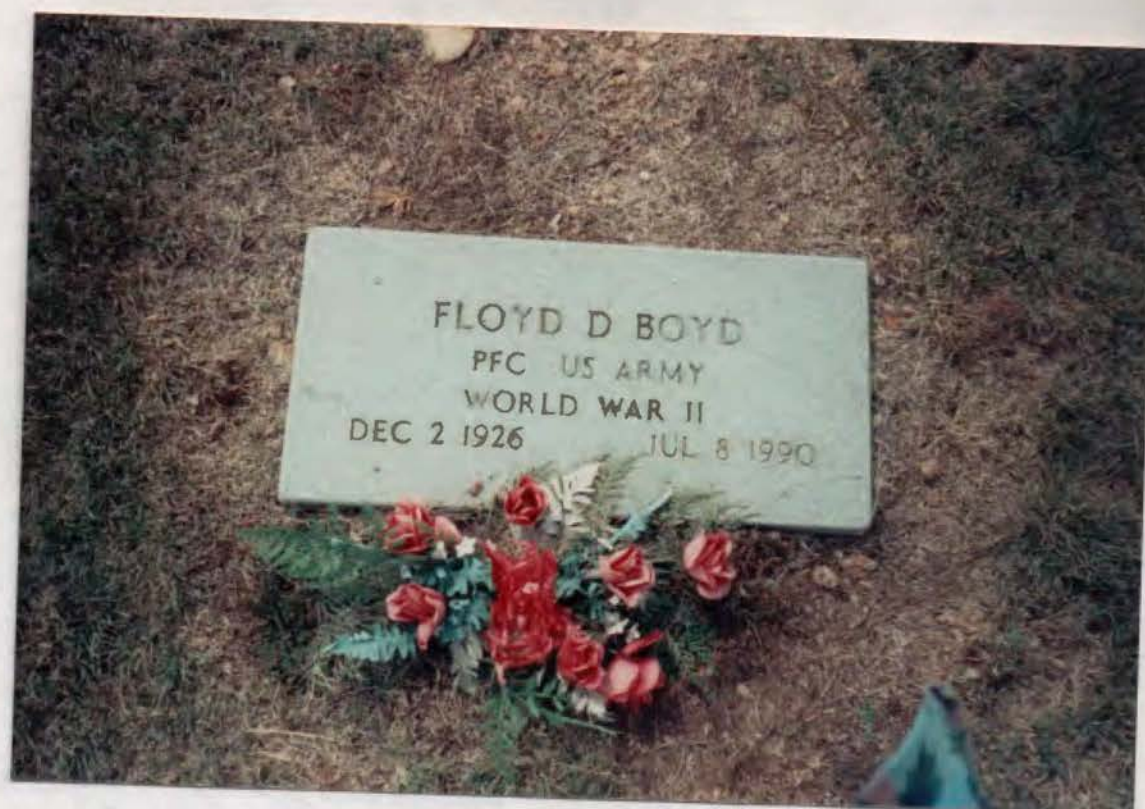

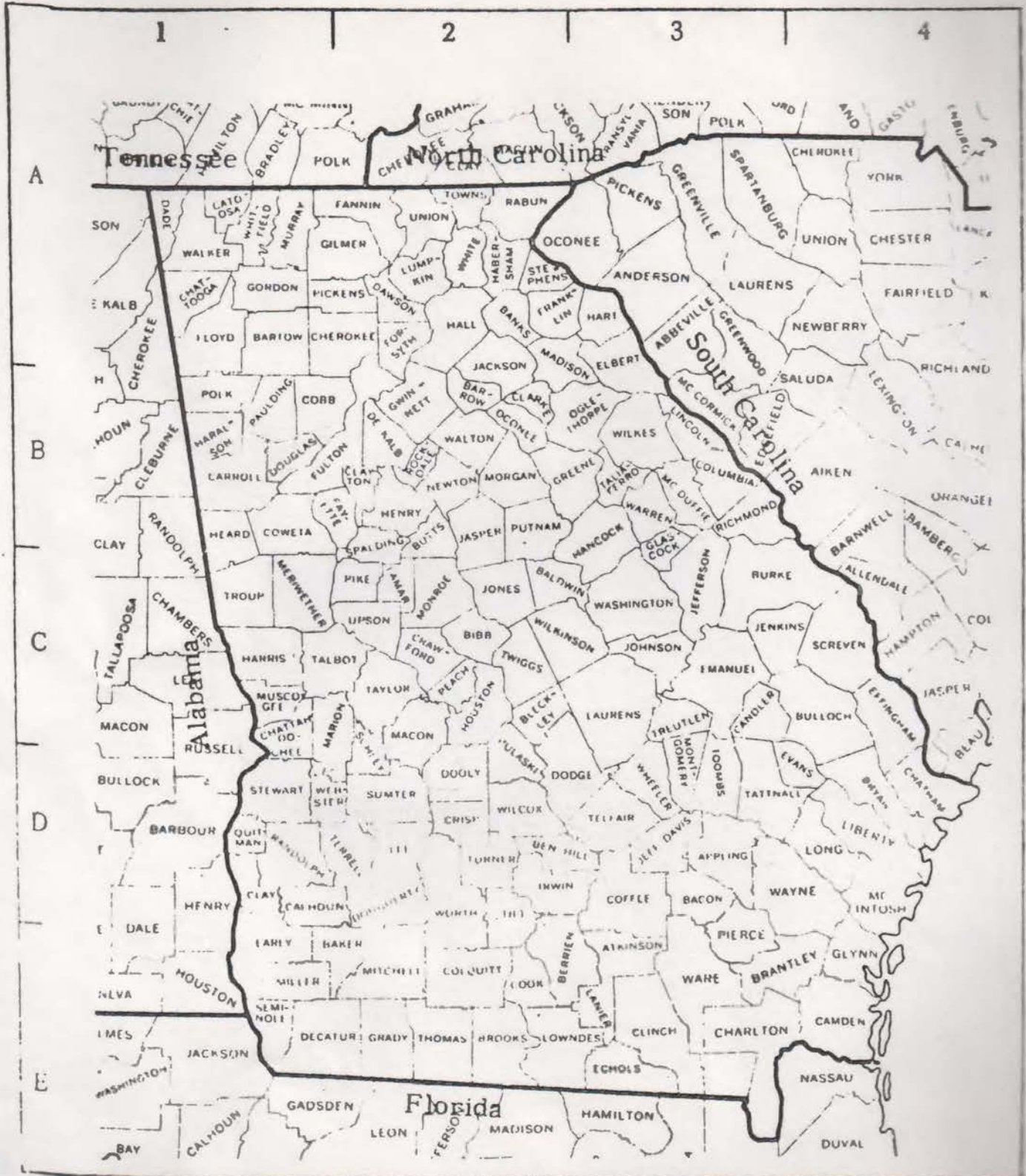
