Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.



To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".


TEXAS 1850 COUNTIES



she pushed up every hill in East Texas.

The decade in Louisiana, college, work, and a commission in the U. S. Navy for Charles kept both Moore and Charles outside the county several years. In 1937 Moore Decker returned home to Alto to engage in the cattle and dairy business. In 1935 he m. Hazel Meeks, a high school teacher in Louisiana. Their two children, Mary Charlotte and Eugene Moore III "Gene," attended school in Alto until the family moved to Jacksonville in 1950. Hazel still lives here. After college, Mary worked in Administration at Methodist Hospital in Houston, is in law school, is President of Women Students in Law, and is active in the Democratic Party. Gene earned his PhD. degree at The University of Texas-Austin and teaches at the University of Houston. In 1980 while on leave to the

Daniel David Deerman

Daniel David Deerman d. in Alabama April 30, 1849. After his death, his widow, Rebecca Jane Pickens Deerman, her two children, Martha and 10-months-old Daniel David Deerman II, came to Cherokee Co., Tex., with her parents, Reece and Elizabeth Pickens.

They traveled in ox-drawn wagons. Each time a river had to be crossed the children were hidden in a trunk to avoid high toll charges.

On Dec. 30, 1874, Daniel David Deerman II m. Caroline Acker, daughter of C. C. and Martha Mills Acker. They lived on a farm south of Craft several years and later lived on a farm east of Craft on what is now FM22.

After the death of Daniel David Deerman II July 5, 1896, Caroline continued to operate the farm untileshe moved to Gallatin, where she lived until her death in 1935.

Children of the couple: (1) Mattie Lee Jarratt; (2) John Allen Deerman; (3) Minnie Rebecca Herrington; (4) Marion Oliver Deerman; (5) Columbus Washington Deerman; (5) Mollie Pickron; (6) James Edwin Deerman; (7) Carrie Ival Norwood; (8) Ila Myrtle Moseley; (9) Donnie Dee Price; (10) Daniel David Deerman III. Mrs. Norwood and Mrs. Moseley are the only two surviving children.

Daniel David and Carrie Deerman are buried in the family plot in the Jarratt Cemetery. Part of the present cemetery was at one time a part of the Deerman family farm. — Marie Deerman Kirkpatrick.

The Dement Family

Most of the family in Cherokee County descended from John II. and Elizabeth Dement in Limestone Co., Ala., (John ca. 1800–1849, and Elizabeth, part Indian, ca. 1800–1885).

The couple's oldest son, James P., brought his wife, Susan, and children to Texas early in 1860. John Andrew was five and one-half years old and Sarah was one year old. They look a wife and one-half

when they came to Texas. There could have been Garners, Holberts, Hendersons, Higgins or Barkers. Benjamin and Rebecca York Dement and Thomas and Rachel Cole Dement were already in Cherokee County in 1850. They must have been fairly closely related.

James P. Dement served in the Civil War and was killed July 31, 1864, south of Fort Smith, Ark. His brother, Stephen, was also in that area but came back to Texas. He m. Susan, the widow, June 19, 1865, in Smith Co., Tex. They lived in Cherokee County where they raised seven children.

These children married the following and raised their families in Cherokee: (1) John Andrew m. Sarah Zackery, then m. Martha Melissa Harris; (2) Sarah m. James Anderson Sides; (3) James William m. It is not known what Texas county the Dements came to first, but they were in Cherokee County by the time of the 1880 census. These descendants were cousins to the Dement children above.

Most of the Dements were farmers, church-goers, liked to fish and hunt, and were always ready to help their neighbors if they were sick or in need. Several of their descendants still live in Cherokee County, although not many of them farm any more. Most go to church and do their civic duties as needed. — Flossie Buckner.


Cherokee /County History

The Creekmore Family

Evert Milo "Tom" Creekmore (b. in Georgia Ridge, Ark., Oct. 21, 1870, d. May 10, 1931) m. Alma Louisa Yarbrough (b. March 8,

1882, Angelina Co., Tex.) Sept. 3, 1902.

Milo Creekmore's first job was driving horse cars across the Arkansas River between Van Buren and Fort Smith, Ark. Later, he became Clerk of the Court in the court of Judge Issac Parker, known as the "Hanging Judge." Later, he became a deputy U. S. He came to Texas in 1869 and received a soldier's grant of 160 acres of land in the northwest corner of Angelina County. He got a job running the ferry at Shook's Bluffin Cherokee County at a crossing on the Neches River on what was called "Smugglers' Road" or the "Contraband Trail." He was the son of Nimrod Billington Yarbrough, who was killed in the Battle of Atlanta in the Civil War. He was a descendant of John Billington of the good ship Mayflower. He named one of his sons Anson Billington, and Nimrod Pinckney named one of his sons Billington Franklin. He, in turn, named one of his sons John Billington:

Nimrod Pinckney Yarbrough has the eleventh oldest family name in recorded English history. It all began when William the Conqueror invaded England in 1066 A. D. He was assisted by Vikings or Norsemen from Denmark and Sweden. Among the Danes was a man named Eustace Yar. When the conquest was finished Eustace Yar was given lands and named Earl of Yarbrough or Earl of Yar's town. Nimrod Pinckney Yarbrough is a direct descendant of that man. Nimrod's mother, Sarah Pinckney, was a lescendant of Charles Cottesworth Pinckney. The family has not established a connection with J. Pinckney Henderson, whose statue graces the lawn of the San Augustine, Tex., courthouse. She is buried in Brownwood, Tex., but why or when she went there has not been determined. Her tombstone reads: "Pioneer Woman." The Blackstone family appears in Nimrod's background but comes to a halt in Boston, Mass.

Another son of John H. and Elizabeth Dement came to Texas ca. 1891 with his family. This was William Joshua and Mary Brooks Dement. They settled near Gallatin and raised their family there. Their children; (1) Robert Officer m. Lou Ella Jenkins; (2) Clara Ann m. Charles Sidney Jenkins; (3) Mary Ella m. Dock Stanford; (4) John William m. Julia Henry; (5) Tera May m. W. W. Partlow; (6) Thomas Nance m. Becky Bailey; (7) James Hogg never married; (8) Dora K. m. R. F. Hardy.

A daughter of John H. and Elizabeth m. Andrew J. Henderson and had (1) Harrison S. m. Matilda Victoria Coon; (2) Matilda m. Major Franklin Haws; (3) James Albert m. Nancy E. Dover Strong; (4) Henry S. m. unknown; (5) Joel P. m. Angeline Wills then m. Clara Irwin; (6) Thomas "Doad" m. Anna D. Haden(?); (7) Nancy Verde m. Will H. Emerson; (8) John A. m. Susie Anna Haws.

It is not known what Texas county the Dements came to first, but they were in Cherokee County by the time of the 1880 census. These descendants were cousins to the Dement children above.

Most of the Dements were farmers, church-goers, liked to fish and hunt, and were always ready to help their neighbors if they were sick or in need. Several of their descendants still live in Cherokee County, although not many of them farm any more. Most go to church and do their civic duties as needed. — Flossie Bueckner.

Denison—King—Hillyer Families

Hinda Davis Denison and her identical twin, Helen Gordon Denison, were b. in 1862 in Monroe Co., Miss., to William Varnum Denison and his second wife, Mary Carolina Evans Denison.

The twins had an older sister, Aberdeen Louanna Denison, and four half-siblings b. to their father's first wife, Maria Louisa Burnett Denison. One half-sibling was Mary Elizabeth Denison, who m. Mary Carolina's brother, Edmond C. "Ed" Evans Sr., in 1870 in Brazos Co., Tex.

After the death of William V. Denison, Mary Carolina brought her three young daughters to Cherokee County to join her brother, "Ed" Evans Sr. The three girls were educated at Larissa. In later years, the twins faithfully attended Larissa homecomings dressed in their black "widow's weed" garments and were well-known in that community. Their deceased spouses were Cicero C. King and James Martin.

Not long after arriving in Texas, the widowed Mary Carolina Denison m. George Robbins Hillyer, a family friend from her childhood and 15 years her senior. He was a kind and loving husband and father to her three daughters. This family lived in Precinct 3, the 1880 Cherokee County census shows.

Hillyer, Mary Carolina, her daughter, Hinda D. Denison King; her granddaughter, Helen Frances King; her dear cousin, Miss May G. Denison; Cicero C. King, son-in-law; and his King and Palmer kin, are buried in the same family plot in City Cemetery, Jacksonville, Tex. — Lula Lee Eyans Corder.

Leon Devenport Family

When Leon and Christine Devenport arrived in Jacksonville in 1934, Franklin D. Roosevelt was Bresident, the nation was strugalicathrough the Cr. of Developing Leaf 1930, 1931, 1932, 2032. Nice volunteer. "Marcy" is a member of the United Methodist Church, United Methodist Women, Jacksonville Garden Club, Hyperion Study Club, Tyler Woman's Forum, The Royal Order of the Crown, Magna Charta Dames, Descendants of Knights of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Major Thaddeus Beall Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution, and the Cherokee County Genealogical Society.

Sam and "Marcy's" elder son, Fred, is a Methodist minister and has served several churches in the Texas Annual Conference. The younger son, Sam, was a member of the Houston Police Department several years, and is following a sales career. — Marcy Lang.

Claud L. Langston

Claud Lee Langston (b. July 4, 1899, d. Feb. 16, 1979) and Beatrice Wilbourn (b. June 17, 1904) m. Sept. 17, 1922, at 5 P.M. by the Rev. J. M. Spivey in Mt. Selman, Tex.

The ceremony was performed in the front yard of the Spivey home as the couple sat in their 1917 Model T Ford with the top down. Many "witnesses" were there, because the Spivey family was

having a reunion that day.

Claud Langston finished high school at Mixon, then bought a one-chair barber and tailor shop at Mt. Selman. In 1925 he sold the shop and moved to Jacksonville and worked in the O. K. Barber Shop owned by Sam Pat Thompson. The Depression came and many people could not afford 25-cent shaves and 50-cent haircuts, so Claud Langston entered Jacksonville College and worked part-

time in the barber shop.

Claud Langston taught school at Mixon, Mt. Hope, Dialville, and Maydelle and then served four years as Cherokee County Superintendent of Public Instruction. He earned his Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees from Stephen F. Austin State Teachers College (now Stephen F. Austin State University). He spent his life in Cherokee County, except for a short hitch in the U. S. Navy at the close of World War I, one year teaching at Cross Roads in Henderson County, and seven years as Superintendent of public schools in Douglass, Tex. He was a Deacon 40 years in Baptist Churches in Rusk and Alto, was active in Sunday School and Brotherhood, and served both churches as a Sunday School department director. He was a member of the Terrell Masonic Lodge and the Order of the Eastern Star in Alto. His hobbies were fishing, quail hunting, and baseball. He was pitcher on a winning baseball team at Mt. Selman in 1924.

Beatrice Wilbourn Langston moved to Cherokee County from Eastland County in 1909. She attended school at Mt. Selman and in Jacksonville.

The weekend pastime for young people then was "Kodaking" and gathering at the Cotton Belt Railroad depot at Mt. Selman to meet the "Jitney" on its daily runs between Tyler and Lufkin: two short blasts of its whistle, it was stopping, and someone was getting on or off the motor car train.

Along with being housewife and mother, Beatrice Wilbourn Langston's hobbies include cooking, sewing, quilt piecing, and crocheting, which she learned at age 10. Her crocheted afghans are her

pride; she has made about 100 ranging from crib to king size. She has a green thumb also, and was flower chairman of First Baptist Church in Rusk five years before plastic or silk flowers became popular. The church bought flowers only at Christmas and Easter. She worked in the Rusk Drygoods and Mathews-Miller Drygoods Stores in the late 1930's through the late 1950's. She is a member of the Order of the Eastern Star in Alto and lives in Van, Tex.

Gregg, Gus Blankenship, and Alvin Childs, is employed by the Medical Center Hospital in Tyler. 
Honley Langston Family

Honley Langston, (b. 1818, Ala. d. Dec. 24, 1862, Cherokee Co., Tex.) was probably son of the Rev. William and Martha Langston, natives of South Carolina. He m. Sarah Gordan, daughter of Charles Gordan of Virginia, June 28, 1838, in Itawamba Co., Miss.,

where the Gordans and Langstons owned large cotton plantations.

In 1844 the Rev. William Langston and the Honley Langston families came to the Republic of Texas and settled near Mixon in Cherokee County.

Honley Langston and his son, John Martin Langston, chartered the Old School Presbyterian Church at Mixon during the Republic of Texas, and Honley was the first lay speaker in the church. His children: (1) Rachel, (2) Isaac Newton; (3) John Martin; (4) Mary; (5) Ioamnah; (6) Sarah; (7) Calvin; (8) James; (9) Moses.

John Martin Langston returned from the war and m. Nancy Dickey, who d. in 1876. He m. Mary Lorenia Dew, daughter of Lt. William and Elizabeth Dickey Dew, Sept. 26, 1878. They had (1) Willie Dee; (2) Ronnie Mayvan; (3) John Willard; (4) Lillie Mae, who m. Willis Lemuel Bugg, III; (See Bugg history); (5) Emory; (6) Mary; (7) Rosetti, (8) Finas Martin. From John Martin's first marriage Joe Lee and Drucilla survived.

John Langston d. Jan. 7, 1915, and rests beside his second wife, Mary Dew, in the Mixon Cemetery. — William Bradford Bugg.

Moses Langston

Moses Langston (b. Jan., 1848, d. Dec. 19, 1921) m. Mary Elizabeth Wallace (d. Dec. 25, 1933) on July 4, 1874. Moses Langston was the son of Jacob Langston (d. ca. 1851) and Rebecca James (d. ca. Jan. 1848) daughter of Lydia James), early settlers of Robert of

estill bears the name of his grandmother, Lydia James, a widow, who came to Texas in 1835 when it was ruled by Mexico.

Rebecca Langston, apparently knowing that death was eminent, made a list of her separate property a few months prior to the birth of Moses. Part of the list included land inherited from her mother, Lydia James, and other land totaling more than 1,000 acres; 50 head of cattle branded "JL"; 30 head of hogs; and four iorses consisting of a sorrel, named "Dick", a blue dun named "Chop", a blue dun mare, and a bay colt.

Rebecca d. soon after Moses was b. Lydia Langston Kenney, Moses' oldest sister, gave birth to a son, George Kenney, near the time that Moses was b. In all likelihood, Lydia nursed George and Moses. Moses also had twin sisters, Mary Ann (d. 1871, m. John W. Sharrock May 7, 1868) and Sarah A. (m. James W. Pharr). The

twins were b. in 1843.

When Moses was 10-months-old, his father, Jacob, was m. to Margaret Ann Yarborough by a Methodist minister in Grimes Co., Tex. By the time Moses was two-years-old, he had a half-sister,

Frances E. Langston.

When Moses was about three-years-old, ca. 1851, some common tragedy apparently took the lives of Jacob, Margaret, Frances Langston, and George Kenney, Moses' brother-in-law. In 1851 Lydia Langston Kenney, perhaps assisted by Obadiah Blanton, a resident of the Kenney household in 1850, took Moses and the twins, Mary Ann and Sarah A., to their uncles, Isaac Pinckney Langston and Henley V. Langston, who owned adjoining farms near Mt. Selman in Cherokee County. Lydia Langston Kenney m. Riley J. "Dick" Pierce in August, 1851.

Moses resided in several homes while he was growing up, and in 1860 he was living in the household of James W. Pharr, a pioneer teacher in Cherokee County and the husband of Sarah Langston

Pharr, Moses's sister.

Sarah's twin sister, Mary Ann Langston, was listed as a seamstress in 1860 and lived in the Isaac Pinckney Langston household. Mary Ann m. John W. Sharrock May 7, 1868. After Mary Ann d. in 1871, John Sharrock m. Mrs. Sarah Rebecca "Sis" Kenney Tyra, a ece of Moses Langston.

Moses entered the Confederate Army in August, 1864, at age 16. He served in Co. G, 22nd Texas Inf. His cousin, John M. Langston, was a Corporal in the same unit. Moses returned to Cherokee County after the Civil War and lived with the John W. Sharrock

amily.

Moses m. Mary Elizabeth Wallace, daughter of Harvey Wallace and Elizabeth Boyd. Their sons: (1) Joe Willie, b. April, 1875, d. Apr. 28, 1962, m. Pearl Taylor Jan. 8, 1902, three children; (2) Thomas S., b. Sept., 1882, killed in a railroad accident in El Paso

Co., Tex., Aug. 31, 1939, m. Allie Hensley, two children.

Children of Joe Willie Langston and Pearl Taylor, daughter of William Taylor and Ophelia McCarter: (1) Vera Beatrice, b. March 6, 1905, m. Leal Bonner Ryan, who after his death m. Albert Latham Family

Albert "Beck" Latham (b. June 10, 1888, Wells, Tex., d. July 20, 172) m. Pearl Ramsey Aug. 29, 1931, Austonio, Tex., and was the lly son of Enoch E. and Virginia Spinks Latham. His mother died hen he was two-years-old and he and his sister, Bessie Latham okes, were cared for by various relatives until their father mardagain.

He was known affectionally by the name, "Beck," a pickname h

how the name was switched to him. He boarded at a "rooming house" in Wells owned by the Cravens family and was employed at the local sawmill several years. "Beck" was inducted into the U.S. Army in World War I on Sept. 21, 1917, and served two years, most of this time on active duty in France. Luckily, he was not wounded. He was a confirmed bachelor for many years before marrying Pearl Ramsey, daughter of Edward and Aline Tobias Ramsey, in his Model T. Ford.

Edward and Aline Ramsey came to Texas from Alabama. Pearl was born in Bryan, Tex., but moved to Cherokee County when she was three-years-old. When Pearl was 12-years-old, her mother d. of typhoid fever. Pearl then had to assume the responsibilities of caring for the home, her father and younger sister, and a deaf uncle that lived with them, as well as to help with all the farm work. The main crop was cotton, grown on Larrison Creek bottomland. She was a liberated woman, especially for the times, owning and being able to drive her Model T Ford car. A woman driver was most unusual. Also, she could do most of the repair work on her car,

"Beck" and Pearl made their home in Cherokee County all of their married lives. He worked in the logging industry and she cared

for the home and the chilthen.





After returning home, she taught music in the school and had classes at Linwood School on Highway 21. William Jeff Latham Family

William Jeff Latham Sr. (d. June 9, 1900) came to Texas from Alabama, His ancestors were originally from London, Eng. He settled in Forest, Tex., a small town south of Alto. When he came to Texas, he brought several slaves. He bought land extending as far south as Sweet Union and on to the Neches River.

Oldtimer's Recognition Of Sunday, September 10, 1967

in Jacksonville

Editor's Note:

Mrs. D. L. Harry agreed to share this early account a-bout Jacksonville folks and oldtimers, published in the Jacksonville Daily Progress. The date of the article is not known but thought to be in the early 1920's. The late J. A. Templeton, referred to in this article, will be remembered by oldtimers here, but for the infromation of others he was the uncle of John Allen Templeton of Arlington, former owner of the journal here.

"Some time ago Mrs. Amanda Hardgrave Frederick, widow of the late W. C. Frederick, was interviewed by Mr. J. A. Templeton, and her recollections of early days in and around Jacksonville were taken down. He says, "They are as she gave them to me several years ago; I will vouch for them."

"We are sure this story will be read with a great deal of interest:

Frederick, now 83 and a resident of the Jacksonville neighborhood for eighty years, says: 'My father, Frank C. Hardgrayes, moved from Washington county, Arkansas, to this neighborhood in 1844, settling about two miles southwest of the present town. He landed there on the first day of October, 1844, and lived in a log house pur-

chased from a man named Ratcliff. The house was said to have been occupied by a Cherokee-Indian before they were driven ey, out of which it was said he out of this neighborhood in 18-39. Mr. Ratcliff had his home place in another log house out southeast of the town on land now owned by Collins Ross. There were generally some peach trees at these Indian settlements that bore an abund-ance of good fruit for the early home-made kind. settlers.

"Accompanying my father's I can remember was opened a-family from Arkansas in 1844 bout 1850. were several families, among them Mr. John Odle's family we called the Old States began who lived near Cane Hill, Ark. coming into the Jacksonville Mr. Odle was so well pleased country in great numbers after.

thought of making that his home but in 1846 pulled up stakes and The family of Nat Yarborough came to Cherokee County were our nearest neighbors. They owned what is now known March, 1846. He went on down as the old Lane home place, Gum Creek and located a 320" acre tract of land recently owned by L. D. Byrd, where he built a log house and cleared land. Becoming dissatisfied he sold out about 1849 and moved to the town of Jacksonville, which had been laid out into lots by Mr. Jackson Smith in 1847. Mr. Odle went into the mercantile business and remained in that capacity under various firm names until 1856 when he sold out and moved to Bosque county on the Brazos River, at that time a strictly frontier county, where Indians gave much trouble. Mr. Odle's son, A. C. Odle, was a visitor here from Bosque county and greatly enjoyed the Golden Jubilee of Jacksonville in 1922.

"Charles Garrett, my mother's cousin, came from Nacogdoches in 1847, about the time Mr. Jackson Smith laid out the town of Jacksonville, and built "Mrs. Amanda Hardgraves a log house at or about the southwest corner of the public square in the old town, in which he kept family groceries and a good supply of powder and lead, as those were very staple articles in the the early days. My father assisted Mr. Garrett in hewing the logs and raising his house. Adjoining Mr. Garrett's "store" a man named Henderson had a grocery store where he sold California Beer and ginger, cakes. When, California Beer proved to be too mild, he had a barrel of whiskcould draw any kind of drink requested.

"I often visited Mr. Ratcliff's "store" for various small articles needed at home, and generally he would give me a stick of

"The first dry goods store that

which he sold to Rev. Isom Lane, who occupied it with his family in 1849. Mr. Yarborough had a son named George who married my sister, Banner. In 1846 in the month of June the Templeton family located of lands adjoining Mr. Yarbe lands adjoining Mr. Yarber rough. Then the Griffin family arrived in 1848 from Tennessee and settled on land joining the Templeton family. Jackson Smith, R. R. Jowell and the Ragsdales all moved in and established homes in 1847. In fact the late forties and early fifties people traveling the public highways were seldom out of sight! of "Covered Wagons," princi-pally from States east of the Mississippi River.

"Among very early doctors to locate at the old town was one Dr. Jackson, who was considered a quack, and soon left, after other doctors began to locate.

"Among the early settlers was a family named Tumbleston that I remember as having lived in a log house near slaughter - house of the late Virgil P. Monkress. Mr. Tumbleston had a son-in-law named Dean who followed farming. He moved to Athens in 1951 and started in the hotel business and some of his family are said to still be operating a hotel on the site located in 1851.

"My father sold out in 1851 to a man named John C. Kennedy, from Tennessee, who owned considerable slaves. After selling to Mr. Kennedy my father moved to Ellis county and settled on Red Oak Creek. He returned to Cherokee county in 1953 and settled on a place southeast of town, not many years ago occupied by Mr. Frederick and myself. My father died there Nov. 6th, 1867. "In the early days camp meet-

ings were common. The tenets of the church were much better observed than at the present

time.

"We had many long drouhts in the fifties. Wheat grew here abundantly until the Negroes he stopped in Laman county and the annexation of Texas in 1845, I were set free in 1865, but just

The Alexanders will rebuild the factory at once, and expect to be able to take care of their orders, as they saved the main part of their stock, and expect to be running again in a short time.

It is not known how the fire originated. A night watchman was employed, but the alarm was not given until the fire was beyond control. Mr. Alexander tried to save his horse, but the fire was too hot for him to reach the barn. The plant is located so far out that it could not be reached by hose from the nearest hydrant.

The engine, boiler and veneer machines were not destroyed, though badly damaged. They can be worked over and put in service again.

This is a serious loss to one of our principal manufacturing institutions, but the Alexander brothers are not the kind of men who brood over unavoidable misfortunes, and while the fire was still burning they were maturing plans for the work of rebuilding, and when their new factory is ready for operation it will show an improvement over the old one.
