

Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

Dear Mr. Yarbrough:

I failed to ask what exactly you were searching for, but I assume you are searching the parentage of John Yarbrough. It's difficult for me to make genealogy clear and understandable in a letter, but let's try.

In the year 1800 an Edmond Yarbrough appeared in Mecklenburg County and acquired land on Waxhaw Creek. In 1823 and 1830 a John, James, and Henry Yarbrough acquired land on Waxhaw Creek, and this time span of 23 to 30 years indicates that John. James, and Henry were the sons of Edmond. This covey of Yarbroughs were settled around the headwaters of Waxhaw Creek, which is about 10 miles south west of present Monroe, N.C. The John who purchased land in 1830 from James Yarbrough must be your man for he was the only John: Yarbrough in Mecklenburg at the right time. It looks like James was Johns elder brother.

Searching through old copies of the "Yarborough Family Magazine" I found a querie (copy enclosed) concerning Edmond Yarbrough who lived in Mecklenburg County - his son John is listed in the querie.

It is evident that Mrs. McElrath and Mrs. Heaner have researched the same Yarbrough family line that you are seeking. If you will write to these people I am sure they will be glad to share their finds with you. If the two women who submitted the querie are not now at their 1967 address let me know and possibly I can locate them.

I think it is certain that Edmond Yarbrough was the father of your John, but you will be mighty lucky if you learn the parentage of Edmond - - I am not saying it is impossible.

The querie says that Edmond was born in Anson County, N.C. about 1762. This gives us four possibilities for there were only four Yarbroughs in Anson at that time. These are the earliest records I have found. Richard Yarbrough appeared in Anson and bought land on Little Creek at the Rocky River, 28 October 1756. Joel Yarbrough appeared in Anson, and bought from Richard Yarbrough part of the tract he had acquired, 25 January 1757. I dont know about Richard, but I do know there are good reasons to think that Joel came to Anson from Culpepper County, Va.. Two brothers INDENTATIONS Jonathan (my gr-gr-gr-gr), and Humphrey Yarbrough removed from Culpepper Co. Va. to Anson County and first appeared in the 1763 tax list. They were bachelor brothers, and listed as a family of two. We know these two men were of the Ambrose line and they settled on Lanes Creek at the Rocky River about two miles from Richard and Joel. The four men were probably kinsmen. If I was searching for Edmond's parent I think I would concentrate first on Richard and Joel.

If you have questions, I will be glad to attempt answers.

Dear Mr. Yarborough:

Recently I stumbled on a find that may be of interest to you.

4 June 1771, William McCorkle and wife Ester of Mecklenburg to Thomas Presley of same, for 20 pounds *** 200 acres on waters of North Fork of Waxhaw Creek, including Humphrey Yarboroughs improvements, and joining lands of John Davis, Beards, patended 16 December 1769 *** William McCorkle (Seal), Ester McCorkle (E) (Seal). Witness: John Davies, Henry Yarbrough, John Crockett. Recorded October term 1771.

(Mecklenburg deed book NO.5, Pp. 189-190)

Henry and Humphrey are the earlyest Yarbroughs I have yet found in the Waxhaw Creek area. This may be a wild-goose chase, but probably worth pursueing.

Tracers of the Edmund line say that he was born in Anson County. Prior to 1765 the Waxhaw area was in Anson County.

We know that it is very unlikely that Humphrey Yarbrough was Edmund's father. In 1772 Humphrey (my gr.gr.gr.gr. uncle) received a grant for land in Anson County at the Junction of Lanes Creek and Rocky River. His children were raised in that area, and later scattered to Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, and Tennessee.

But, the Henry Yarbrough is interesting. I have been told that Edmond named a son Henry. As you know it was customary in those days for a man to name a son for his father. If Henry was a young man at the time he signed the deed he would be in the right age bracket to have a son who began acquiring land in the same area in 1800. Edmond's sons began acquiring land in the same area a generation later.

Hope this information will be of help, and not confuse the issue.

With the hereditements and appurte nances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of hand with its appurtenances to the said Edward Yarborough his heirs and assigns forever.

In witness whereof John Sevier, Governor of the state of Tennessee, hath hereun to set his hand a doaused the great seal of the state to be affixed at KNoxville on the 2nd day of August in the year of our Lord 1809 and of the Independence of the United States the 3413

They had a son: James Smith Yarborough who did go to Louisiana, which was included in the records as Natchez Dist. James Smith Yarborough did name one of his sons, Jordon. There were no Thomas Yarborough listed in this family.

* The names Charles, Thomas, and Archibald are names associated with the Henry Yarborough line. (I believe Henry to be the father of the Thomas(W.Bk.2,p.2/1-Oct.1768) and James who lived on the 400 A., was a brother to Thomas and also son of Henry.)

* Tim afraid you will have to look elsewhere for your Thomas J. V. as the Lowis Yarborough who m. Elizabeth Carrett had no sons.

It is true that William (arborough was the mather of the above lawis Y. and there were at least five other children; one may have been the Thomas J., nowever, I believe he was too young(1812) to have been this filliam's son. Am., dr. stated in his letter that he was the youngest son of #illiam, or. (Nm., dr. t 1785)

* Now, this is only my opinion: I lean toward the (my way of identifying this line is Davis-Mathan Yarbrough) - same line as Groves who was the son of James Yarbrough, who had at least 10 children.

One of the primary reasons for my thinking this is: the name Silas Y. (I have never seen it used in any other family) and the name Newton. You will see the enclosed clipping from the Panes, Texas newspaper picture of Lewis Newton Yarbrough, who was a descendant of the James Y. through Groves - Nathan. The Groves line is in you.

It is also my opinion that the James Y. above is thesame as the

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* PERRY COUNTY, TENBESSEE

PERRY COUNTY WAS PART OF HICKMAN COUNTY UNTIL 1821

PERRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, was established November 14, 1821, out of HICKMAN COUNTY. PERRY COUNTY also included all of the present IECARDY COUNTY, and all of this territory had been DICESSE From 1805 to 1807. The part of PERRY now comprising IECARDY COUNTY lies across on the West side of the Tennessee River.

The first County Seat of PERHY ODIN-TY was PERHYVILLE, on the West side of the river, in what is now DECA.— TUR County, and it so remained the county seat until DECATUR COUNTY was established, in 1845.

PERRY COUNTY was named in honor of the famous Commodore Oliver Hassard PERRY, while DECATUR COUNTY, value from Perry was called DECATUR after Commodore STEXHEN DECATUR.

PERMYVILLE was a somewhat hoted point in the days when it was the County seat of PERMY COUNTY, and it is used that DAVID CROCKETT, ANDREW JACKICH, SAM HOUSTON, JAMES K. PCHK, afterwards President, and other famous early Tennessee lewyers and statemen work often in attendance on court there.

Ferney Stanley tenght the first school in the county on TOM'S CREEK in 1880.

The first steemboat, the GENERAL GRIENE came up the river in 1819, and the first merchant was a man by the hame of JCHN TATES, also on Ton's Grook. FIRST COURT IN PERRY COUNTY HELD AT THE HOME OF JAMES DICKSON

The first county court of PENET COUNTY, was held at the home of JAMES DICKSON on the first Monday in January following the establishment of the County. The home of JAMES DICKSON was on LICK CEPEN.

* LEWIS COUNTY, TENNESSEE

LEWIS COUNTY, TENNESSEE, Was established December 25, 1845, and parts of HICENAM, LANGUAGE, MAYER and some of MAURI COUNTY WATER used to make up its territory.

This county was named in honor of MERINTHER: LIBITS, who in 1809 departed this life at GRINDER'S TAY.
Edd, about eight miles from HGRES.
RALD, the County east of LIBIS CO.
It is one tradition that he come mitted suicide, while on his way from Saint Louis to Washington to

accept the post of GOVERNOR of the LOUISIANA TERRITORY.

DOBBINS AND GRINDERS

The DOBELING and GRINDER FAMILIES, who were the heads of a SMISS COL-CNY, came to what is LEWIS COUNTY about 1807. ROBERT GRINDER owned the Ima where MORINETHER LEWIS died. ROBENGALD was a SMISS name and made the county seat after NMHSURG, which it supplanted.

CHEATHAM COUNTY, TENNESSEE

TERRITORY FOR CHEATHAM FROM FOUR DIFFERENT COUNTIES

The territory necessary for the establishment of CHRATHAM COUNTY, was taken from four other Tennessee Counties, viz. DAVIDSON, ENRESTSOE, DICK-SON and MONTOCHERY. It was estab lished on February 28, 1856, a short time prior to the War Between the States. It derived its name from HATHANINI. CHRATHAM, who was Speaker of the Tennessee Sente at the time the County was created.

The first county court for Cheathen County was held at SYCAMORE MILLS & May 15, 1856.

A. J. Bright R. L. Weekley. SAMUEL WATSON WAS ELECTED THE FIRST COUNTY JUDGE OF CHEATHAM

SAMUEL WATSON was elected the first county judge of Cheathem County and was sworn into office on the first Monday in June, 1856.

Land for the courthous, and other county business was bought from a man named LENNUK. The Court Court held its sessions however, at FOREST HILL, a little South of ASHJAND until Movember, 1887, when it began to hold its first meetings at ASHLAND, selected as the County Seat of the new County.

The town of ASHIAND was incorporated in 1859 under the name of ASHIAND CITT, but on account of negligence on the part of the officials its charter was lost, but it was reincorporated many warms later.

ENSUAMIN DARROW is said to have lived near SYCHARDER MILLE as early as 1790. (The ancestor of GLARMON DAR-MONE, famous Chicago Attorney),

JOHN HYDE and HOWARD ALLEY were early settlers near Pleasant View, and ROBERT HEATON and TRANTON LIE were at ASHLAND CITY (site) in 1796.

. DECATUR COUNTY

THIS COUNTY A PART OF PERRY COUNTY UNTIL ESTABLISHED IN 1845

DECATUR COUNTY is on the West side of the TENNASKE RIVER and came out of PERM COUNTY.

The County was named for Commidore STEPPEN DECAIDE of the United States Navy.

PERRIVILLE, the former County seat of PERM COUNTY "passed out" of the County seat business.

PERRIVILLE was a noted place and in the old days entertained men like Sem Houston, Andrew Jackson, James K. Polk and others who visited. BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS WHO ORGAN -IZED DECATUR COUNTY

In the act establishing DECATUR COUNTY, TERRESSEE, in Movember, of 1845, the following persons were named as the commissioners to organize the new county;

And Samuel was called for jury duty and became constable in 1817 or 1818 (1817-18 Minute Book, pp. and 195). Samuel received deeds from the State of Tunnessee thru assignees, recorded August 3, 1818 (Book 3, pp. 329 and 330), and in the probate records of Stewart Co, we find that he died without a will in about 1832, with Nathan Yarborough serving as the administrator of his estate (Circuit Ct. Book C, p. 189), with Francis, Samuel, Amon and Asa his children (Circuit Ct. Book C, pp. 162-64), and John Ferril their quardian with Joel Jones and William Webster as sureties.

Other Yarboroughs in the early records of Stewart Co. are Richard, Joel, Davis, William, Nathan, John, Edward and Humphrey.

Richard Yarborough was involved in a lawsuit appeal against J.H. Russell in October, 1808 (1808 Minute Book, p. 276). Incidentally, from these early records I learned that court cases were continually postponed, just like on court dockets of today. Richard Yarbrough sued Thomas White in February, 1810 (1810 Minute Book, p. __), and in August, 1810 Richard sold his still to Thomas White, witnesses Samuel Yarborough and Philip Hornberger (Deed Book 3, p. 293). I could not tell from the court records if the lawsuit and sale of the still were connected or not.

According to the 1804-07 Minute Book, on March 11, 1806 Joel Yarbrough was present at a meeting of the county court (p. dated); on June 9, 1806 a grand jury was appointed and Joel Yarborough served as its forenan (p. dated); on December 9, 1806 it was ordered that he, along with Caleb Williams, Daniel Young, Edward Williams and Alexander Trousdale, lay a road from North Cross Creek to the county line (b. dated); on January 4, 1807 he was ordered to serve as a grand and petit juror along with Davis Y. (p. dated); and in July, 1807 he again had jury duty (p. dated).

In 1808. Joel, Davis and George Yarborough made purchases from the estate of Levis Elliott thru executor Philip Hornberger (1807-08 Minute Book, pp. 61-62).

The names of Davis and David Yarborough appear numerous times. I am unable to determine whether these names were used interchangeably by the person transcribing the records or if two people were involved. From studying Stewart Co. census records I believe that there was just one person, "Davis," and that his name was frequently mis-transcribed or mis-copied (and has been mis-copied by researchers in recent years). References in this writing are given based on that assumption, and are all shown as "Davis," even tho the reference may have read "David."

Davis Yarborough was named as a juror on December.11, 1804 (1804-07 Minute Book, p. 12), and again on March 12, 1805 (p. 19), and again on June 12, 1805 (p. 29), served on the grand jury on September 9, 1805 (P. 31), and on petit juries again on September 9, 1805 (p. 14) and December 10, 1805 (p. 45). On March 11, 1806 Davis and Joel were present at a county court meeting mentioned above, and Davis was present at another county court meeting in July, 1807 (p. dated).

In the 1813-15 Court of Pleas and Quarters Minute Book

/ is an entry during the February, 1813 term in which the Court ordered that Rubin Elliott, William Outlaw, Abram Wyatt, William Yarborough, Elisha Askew and Josiah Askew view and mark a road from Dover to the county line towards Rynoldsburgh (p. 11). William Yarborough *of Stewart Co.* purchased land on December 22, 1815 from Elizabeth Nelson of Montgomery Co., Tennessee (Book 5, p. 372), witnesses, Wa B. Nelson and John Hansell. This Elizabeth Nelson was the widow of a large landholder of Montgomery Co., Robert Nelson, who is shown as deceased in Montgomery Co. records beginning in 1814 (Book I, p. 563). In 1817 William was called for jury duty (1817-18 Minute Book, p. 65), and in 1818 William was appointed to be one of those to mark a road from Bowling Green to Hopkinsville, Kentucky (1818-19 Minute Book, p. 338). On February 6, 1818 William sold the land he had purchased from Mrs. Nelson to John Phillips (Book 6, p. 130), witnesses, Barth Murphy and Dennis Roshin.

The names of Edward and Edmond Yarborough appear is Stewart Co. tax rolls thru agents, which indicates to me that they did not actually live in Stewart Co., but had received the land for Revolutionary War service. From a study of the county's deed records it appears to me that the name "Edmond" is a mis-transcription of Edward's name. Humphrey Yarborough's name also appears in tax rolls, and one reference shows "no poll," which likewise indicates to me that he did not actually reside in Stewart Co. (YPH 2/83).

Edward Yarborough was a captain in the American Revolution and was a resident of Rovan, Co., N.C. and received land in Stewart Co. for his services (Edward will be covered in a later issue.). The "Edmond" Yarbbrough appearing in the 1809 Stewart Co. tax roll probably should have been listed' as "Edward," as was the 1810 entry.

Humphrey Yarborough was a resident of Anson Co., N.C., who received North Carolina Revolutionary War Voucher #1897, and his tax roll property in Stewart Co. may have been awarded for his services. I think that it is likely that the 1809 tax enumerator (the same one who listed "Edmond") inadvertently crosslisted the poll for Humphrey (shown as "1 poll") and Davis (shown as "no poll"), but that the roll was corrected in 1810 and 1811.

What all this means to me: I think that George Y., who married Elizabeth Norwood and died in Halifax Co., N.C. in about 1798, was the father of George, Moses, William and James of Montgomery Co. and may have been the father of Samuel of Stevart Co. Of course, George died in Montgomery Co. in about 1847, Moses in Montgomery Co. in about 1840, and Samuel in Stewart Co. in about 1832. And I believe that sons William and James are the ones who later appeared in Coosa and Harengo Cos., Alabama. But as of now I have no definite proof that Samuel of Stewart Co. is the son of George of Halifax Co. and brother of George, Moses, William and James of Montgomery Co. More discussion of these interesting western Tennessee Yarboroughs in the next issue.

Many of these Goswick families are listed as "Gossett" and "Gossit" in the census index books and there has been entirely too many Gossetts and Gossits to cearch the films for accuracy in name specifing. Some of the Gossett and Gosit families will be listed.

This information was sent me by Charles H. Yarbro Reelfoot Lake, Box 158A, Route 1, Tiptonville, Tenn. 38079. I think someone else had given it to him.

Edmund & Sophia and family also Edmund's brother, James, came to Decatur Co., Tenn. in 1818 and settled on Lost Creek. The old home place where they lived first is known as the Billy Ivey Farm of Decaturville and SE of Mt. Lebanon. The cemetary where Edmund and Sophia and others are buried is the Old Yarbro Cemetary just east of this home place. (On top of the hill behind W. E. Turpin's house) There are no markers to the graves so there is no way of knowing just how many were buried there.

Edmund's brother, James, who came with him to this county, married Moses

Richardson's daughter; they had one son, who was named Johnson Yarbro. He went to Missouri at an early age. His mother died very soon after he was born. James met with, an accident. He fell off a horse and died as a result of the fall. He was known as a drinking man. He said that God called him to preach and he refused the call and drinking followed with his death resulting.

Edmund died in 1850 of Malaria and his children scattered to various parts of the country. I will give a brief rundown on his children as I know it.

John H. went to South Carolina and became a Methodist preacher and lived allhis life. He died in 1864. (my note: This couldn't be your John H. Yarbrough could

I have no record of what happened to Nancy & Joseph, but Henry, Aquilla and William stayed in Decatur County and reared large families.

Aquilla moved around quite a bit, he lived at one time on White's Creek near the site of Cedar Grove school house, but finally moved near Parsons, Tenn. He was the forefather of Arthur, Frank, and Verlon and all those around Parsons, TN. (Decatur

william stayed in Decatur County around the Brownsport Furnace area and his children moved to Decaturville around the middle of the 1800's. Several of them held political offices in Decaturville during this period and at least one of them became a doctor.

Henry Yarbro (born in Anson County, N. C. in 1790 son of Edmond and Sophia) came to Decatur Co. with his parents in 1818 and settled on the Lost Creek farm. He lived with his parents until 1824, at which time he married Delilah Crawley.

Delilah was the daughter of William Mitchell Crawley from Kentucky. They are buried in the Yarbro Cemetary near the site where they built their first cabin.

Their grave markers read thusly:

Henry Yarbro born 12/18/1790 died 10/25/1866

Delilah Crawley Yarbro born 1808 died 4/12/1886

Their children:

William Mitchell--left home when grown to work on a Mississippi River Boat; died of Cholera in 1848 on Miss. Ri. steamer named The Ammaridh. Buried by a friend on Black Island.

James Loyd--married his first cousin Ann Eliza Yarbro. He was born 1828 and died 1877

Joseph G.--born 1829; married Mary Elizabeth Fisher in 1854 at Cedar Grove on White's Creek. Their children: Mary, Jacob F., Robert E., and Mike.

ilton Jasper Yarbro born 1832, married twice. First to his cousin Minerva Yarbro and then to Maggie G Brock .

I checked the North Carolina revolutionary war soldiers book (975.6M2d) at library to see if Joshua or Edmund was listed and didn't find any. I also checked for Bledsoe, Gilbert, Burke, Crawley and other Yarbrough names. The Index to the Rev. War rolls could be checked on film if you wish and that might have more data but it also may not.

Above evidence indiates that one Joseph Goswick (also called Gossick or Gossett) lived in same county where Sephiah or Sophia Gossett was married to your Edmund. In checking all of the counties of Kentucky for 1810 there was A Samuel Crawleyin in nearby Adair county and a Saml Cralwy in 1800 Tax list for nearby Green county. 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





Have typed the May 18, '66 letter from Joseph T. Yarbrough except for a bit I can't make out and enclose copy. Joseph T.'s letter and the family history outlined by Joseph Gallatin Yarbro check out.

Joseph T. letter

"Paw moved to Tennessee last November, died the 6th of December. He lived only two weeks after he landed here."

"I have married since I seen you but I have been unfortunate. My wife only lived eleven months to a day after we married. She died in '62, the 21st of July, married the 21st of August, '61."

He numbered the baptisms he performed until they reached twelve hundred, then desisted, lest he should sin after the manner of David in numbering the children of Israel. As this occured long before his ministry closed, it would be interesting to know how many he did baptize.

He died at his son-in-law's, in Oglethorpe County, about the year 1845. The last five years of his life were full of suffering, but he said he had nothing to change in the main truths he had

Abraham² Bledsoe, third son of George¹ Bledsoe, married first Kathrine Ball, and secondly, Sarah. On June 6, 1732, Abraham Bledsoe and wife Sarah sold 400 acres in St. Marks Parish Spottsylvania to Thomas Watts. (Crozier 122) He and his brother William Bledsoe also sold part of a patent granted them May 30, 1726. The will of Abraham Bledsoe was dated March 15, 1753, in Granville County, and was probated May 29 of same year. He names wife, Sarah, his sons Isaac, Abraham, Thomas, Jacob, Moses and Aaron, and refers to "the rest of my children". The executors were his wife, Sarah, and his son-in-law, Henry Thornton. Aaron Bledsoe was given a Captains commission in Spottsylvania County in 1756. Isaac Bledsoe served as a private in Dunmore's War, and in the subsequent Indian Wars. ANTHONY BLEDSOE, who was not named in the above mentioned will, was commissioned a Captain in the Colonial troops about 1774.

Abraham Bledsoe was an Ensign in Captain Long's company in 1774. Abraham, Anthony William and George Bledsoe, noted Indian fighters, who removed from Augusta to Washington Co., Virginia, at an early date, were probably cousins of ANTHONY, Isaac and Abraham Bledsoe who settled in Tennessee. One of the four brothers, Abraham, had sons: Thomas, Loven, Anthony, William, and Isaac.

Colonel Anthony Bledsoe was born in Orange County, Va., in 1733. In 1760 he married Mary Ramsey, daughter of Thomas Ramsey, born in Augusta Co., Va., in 1734. One of her brothers, Josiah Ramsey, was captured by the Indians when a child, being returned to the settlements after Boquet's treaty in 1764. He was in the Battle of Point Pleasant, and was a scout in the Cherokee Campaign of 1776 and in 1780 removed to Kentucky, the next year coming to the Cumberland Settlement, where he was a Major of Militia. He died at an advanced age, at the home of his son in Missouri. Other brothers of Mrs. Bledsoe were Henry and William Ramsey, both killed by Indians. She was 54 years of age when her husband was killed. Five years later she married an old man, a pioneer, Nathan Parker. She died in 1808. (Cisco's "Sumner Co.")

Colonel Anthony Bledsoe was a Justice of the Peace in Botetourt, Fincastle, and Washington Counties, Va. He was a Captain in the Colonial Army; Major in Va. Militia in Revolutionary War; was in the "Battle of the Flats", Commander of the troops at Long

MEMO FROM HUGH LESLIE YARBRO -

I am searching for my grandfather, Joseph Lee Yarbro, my great grandfather, John Yarbrough, and my great great grandfather, Joseph (Not sure of the Joseph, but my father, Guy Leslie Yarbro, said that was his name).

My grandfather, Joseph Lee Yarbro, was born August 12, 1861 in Decatur County, Tennessee. Sometime Pater, he and his family moved to Henderson County in what then was the 19th Civil District with a Post Office address of Juno, Tennessee. Where they lived was near what was called Poplar Springs. My grandfather had a younger brother who died when he was about 10t years old. I do find my grandfather in the Census Records of Handerson County in 1900 with all of his and his wife's children (he married Nellie Taylor on January 18, 1885). At one time, he was a mail carrier, according to my only living Aunt.

I believe I have narrowed it down to two lines and here is the information I have. His father, my great grandfather, married a Martha Ward in Decatur County and this was his Mother. After her death, he married a widow by the name of OGLE and from this union there were born three daughters — mattie, Emma and Dixie (Elizabeth, I am told) Yarbro. (One version has it that they were her children from her marriage to Ogle.) I remember Mattie coming to visit my grandfather and grandmother. There was a Naomi who alwas came with her — do not know the relationship — I thought she was her sister. (My Aunt tells me he was married three times).

In checking the ages in the 1830 Census, it is not likely a wife of 32 years of age has a son 16 years old (actually, 19 years). The rest of the children could likely be theirs. Assuming the "J. L." to be my grandfather supports the fact that he was the only living child. Also, my father, Guy Leslie Yarbro, and my Aunt (Glatha Viola Yarbro) have said that their grandfather and grandmother were born in Tennessee and their great grandparents in North Carolina.

In the 1850 Decatur County Census, there is a Sampson Yarbro with a son John Yarbro. Assuming that this Sampson Yarbro is the father of J. S. Yarbro in the Henderson County Census of 1880 (the ages differ) brings me to this about the Michael that is listed.

My grandfather had an Uncle Mike who went from Decatur County to Bmith County, Texas and I have heard him speak of his Uncle Mike. My Uncle Claude Lee Yarbro, just after the turn of the century, went to Texas to work on Uncle Mike's farm. There he met a cousin Laura Belle Yarbrough and they were later married. This Michael was my Aunt Laura Belle's grandfather as listed on the enclosed chart as Cylus Michael Yarbrough.

On an enclosed sheet is William Yarbrough, son of Edmund Yarbro and wife, Sophia Gossett Yarbrough with a son Michael which shows he did go to Smith County, Texas and is buried there. If this is, in fact, the "real" Uncle Michael, then one of his brothers has to be my great grand—Tather. There is no Joseph Loe (or J. L.) shown in the Henry Yarbrough line in the data I have.

My Aunt Glatha (in one of her clearer moments) told me only recently about the connection with the Michael in Texas.

Confederate Veteran.

26, 1862, published a notice of Governor Clark, of North Carolina, saying in part: "These agents have no lawful authority to seize your private arms, and you will be protected in preserving the means of self-defense."

At first, every gunsmith in the South was kept busy altering and repairing these private arms. Perhaps the largest establishment thus employed was that of Samuel Sutherland, "Armorer of the Confederacy," at Richmond. Sutherland, before the war, was a dealer and importer of sporting rifles, pistols, and shotguns. Most of the repair work done in Richmond was under his jurisdiction. Thousands of guns and pistols, collected from citizens and gathered from the early battle fields, were sent to Sutherland's plant for repair and conversion. "Kentucky" sporting rifles with barrels five feet long, were sawed off and made into cavalry carbines. Sutherland's armory was burned when Richmond fell.

MANUFACTURE OF ARMS IN THE SOUTH.

A bill to encourage the manufacture of small arms was passed by the Confederate Congress March 19, 1862, and signed by President Davis a month later.

In April, 1861, Lieut. Roger Jones, commanding the United States Arsenal guard at Harper's Ferry, hearing of the approach of Virginia secessionist troops, set fire to the government buildings and went to Carlisle, Pa. The Virginia troops, aided by residents of Harper's Ferry, extinguished the flames, but not before some of the buildings and about 16,000 finished rifles and muskets had been destroyed. Virtually all the gun-making machinery was saved. The State of Virginia claimed all this property, but it was agreed that the machinery for making the Harper's Ferry rifle be sent to Fayetteville where the State of North Carolina had good steam power.

The machinery for making the long rifled musket was sent to Richmond and set up under the direction of Lieut. Col. J. II. Burton, late master armorer at Enfield, England. The Richmond armory got to work in September, 1861, and at its maximum output turned out 1,000 rifles a month. In making up many of these rifles, the old parts rescued from the ruins at Harper's Ferry were used. Thus it is common to find rifles stamped on the lock plate: "C. S. Richmond, Va.," and on the butt plate "U. S."

When Richmond was evacuated, that part of the machinery which could be removed was taken to Danville, where it was captured by General Wright.

The machinery for making the short Harper's Ferry rifles was set up at Fayetteville and got to work in the spring of 1862. It turned out about 400 rifles a month. These guns were both brass and iron mounted, and most of them were

made for saber bayonets. The lock plates were stamped with the die used at Harper's Ferry, which showed an eagle with the letters "U. S." beneath. At Fayetteville, the "U. S" was cut out, and "C. S. A." (the S upside down) was keyed in. In March, 1865, upon the approach of Sherman's army, the Fayetteville machinery was taken to Egypt and secreted in an old mine, where it was recovered by the Federals in May, 1865, and taken to Raleigh.

The first private firm to be given an arms-making contract by the Confederate government is said to have been McElwaine & Co., Holly Springs, Miss. Betore the war this was known as the Marshall County Manufacturing Company, which owned a large foundry. An act of the Mississippi legislature of July, 1861, empowered the firm to buy additional machinery and "to make and enforce any by-law not contrary to the State constitution." July 8, 1861, the Consederate War Department was notified this firm was making machinery for the construction of Mississippi rifles. Delivery could begin in sixty days, and the output would be 100 a day. General Gorgas reported, August 12, 1861, that the firm had been given a contract for 30,000 rifles, delivery to begin November 1. In June, 1862, Sherman occupied Holly Springs, but found the gun machinery had been removed. The records do not make it clear whether this machinery was moved to Atlanta or Macon.

In May, 1862, George Yarbrough, J. S. Short, and W. S. N. Briscoe formed a partnership for the manufacture of arms, and bought a tract of one hundred actes near Tyler, Tex. A large brick factory was erected and machinery purchased. The Texas Military Board gave the firm a contract for 5,000 rifles, but by September, 1863, only 1,000 had been turned out.

When Little Rock, Ark., was evacuated by the Confederates in September, 1863, headquarters of the District of Arkansas was established at Arkadelphia, sixty-five miles from Little Rock. The gun machinery from the Little Rock arsenal was moved to Arkadelphia, where rifles were made until the Confederates were forced to give up that place. General Cabell complained that the Arkadelphia rifles were no better than shotguns. About October, 1863, the Little Rock and Arkadelphia machinery was removed to Tyler, which became the headquarters of the Trans-Mississippi Department. The Tyler arsenal was purchased by the government and combined with the machinery brought from Arkansas. Colonel Hill was placed in charge, and 200 men and boys were employed. These guns were known as "Texas Rifles," military officers had a poor opinion of them. The lock plates were stamped "Texas Rifle, Tyler, C. S." Specimens of this

E. Berkley Bowie, of Baltimore, is interested in getting the history of this old gun, whose origin is sealed in mystery. It is stamped "C. S" on t'e bree: block and barrel, caliber .56, percussion lock, and is iron mounted. The charge is loaded into the breechblock. All in all, it is a credit to Confederate ingenuity and its inventor should be known, also where manufactured.

Confederate Veteran.

Henry Moyle died at his home, in Butler County, Kans., on November 20, 1918, and his body was consigned to mother earth by his brother Masons after the Episcopal Church services.

Comrade Moyle was born in Cornwall, England, January 23, 1845, and was brought to the United States by his parents when a child. He lived with them in North Carolina until the opening of the War between the States, when he joined Company C, of the 1st North Carolina Infantry, in April, 1861. He was in all the battles before Richmond, being wounded at Big Bethel and also on Sullivan Island. near Charleston, S. C. He was mustered out of service in April, 1865.

Henry Moyle came to Kansas and settled in Butler County in 1869 and was fortunate in accumulating a large body of land which proved to be underlaid with oil and gas, thus making him one of the oil kings of Kansas. His wealth but served to better the man and give him the means to do many deeds of charity that suffering and sorrows might be alleviated.

A true friend, a splendid neighbor, a loyal citizen, and a Christian gentleman. Peace to his ashes!

J. FINCH RAY.

J. Finch Ray, who died at Walnut, Miss., on October 12. 1918, was born in South Carolina, but went to Mississippi as a boy. When the call of his country came, he shouldered his gun and went to the front, serving as a faithful Confederate soldier to the end. In 1871 he was married to Miss Martha Garrett, and to them were born two daughters and a son, who with their mother survive him.

Comrade Ray was a leader in his Church, the Missionary Baptist, and superintendent of the Sunday school for the last twenty-five years. A handsome four-thousand-dollar church building had just been completed at his death, of which he was the founder. He was also the founder of the Chalybeate High School and was a prominent stockholder of the Bank of Chalybeate. The community has lost one of its most enterprising citizens and a good man. To know him was to love him.

RICHARD ABNER JARVIS.

On October 22, 1918, Richard Abner Jarvis, of Hansford, Tex., answered the last roll call on earth. Born February 7, 1845, near DeKalb, Miss., he enlisted in the Confederate army at that place in September, 1862, as a private in Company I, 5th Mississippi Cavalry, Harris's Brigade, Chalmers's Division, Forrest's Corps. He was in the siege of Vicksburg, serving as sharpshooter most of the time, and with his company was quartered in the courthouse at the time it was blown up by a mortar shell, killing many of the company. He was in the fighting at Harrisburg, Selma, and several smaller battles; was wounded several times. He was captured on July 4 and asterwards paroled, but reënlisted later in the 6th Mississippi Cavalry. At Harrisburg his cartridge box was cut from his belt and his gun knocked from his hand by grapeshot. He was near his colonel, Isham D. Harrison, at the time he was wounded. As a comrade, Henry Edwards, raised the colonel in his arms, a bullet pierced the arm of Edwards, causing him to drop the body of Colonel Harrison.

Comrade Jarvis surrendered with his command at Gainesville, Ala. He then returned to Mississippi, locating near DeKalb, and in December, 1869, he was married to Miss Martha L. Murray, a descendant of the Adamses of historic fame. To this union were born seven children, three sons and four daughters, all of whom survive, with their mother.

In 1872 Mr. Jarvis removed to Texas and settled near the line of Fannin and Grayson Counties, later going to Bolivar, in Denton County, and in 1902 he removed to Hansford County, where he died. He was buried in the Lieb Cemetery, near his home, attended by a large concourse of people, many from other counties. His Confederate comrades were among the pallbearers, while Sons of Confederate Veterans marched in front, with Confederate and United States flags at halfmast, to the soft beat of the drum. Thus in the midst of his sorrowing family-wife, children, grandchildren, and friends-the body of this brave Southern soldier was borne to the grave. Devoted to his family, a loving and tender husband and father, a loyal, patriotic citizen, a faithful friend and neighbor, a consistent and devout Christian, an honorable, upright man, he leaves a rich heritage in character and a strong witness to Christianity in his life and death.

Sixteenth Mississippi Regiment and Gen. Lee.-R. K. Gillespie, of Raymond, Miss., writes that Comrade J. V. LeCand is correct in saying that Gen. Lee was led to the rear on that memorable day, May 12, 1864. He sends this certificate: "I. R. J. Gillespie, of the Raymond Fencibles, Company A, Twelfth Mississippi, Harris's Brigade, certify that I saw him make this offer, but could not hear his words. The General rode out in front of our line about forty or fifty steps, and while in that position the Yunkees threw a shell at him, which exploded just in front of him, but failed to injure him or his escort; however, one of the privates in our company was injured by that shell. Gen. Lee then rode forward to the head of the brigade, of which was the Sixtcenth Mississippi, where he was stopped by the boys of the Sixteenth and his horse led to the rear. Then we went into the "Death Angle," where we lost Lieut. Robert Hunter, Lafayette Kelly, and Vernon Phelps-all killed. These three lived in Raymond, Miss., and Willie Gibbs, who lived southwest of Edwards, Miss., lost a leg. Never did men do braver work. Trees were cut down, and the bark torn off within three feet of the ground.

MUSTER ROLL OF COMPANY F, EIGHTH TEXAS.

Natt Holman, Sr., of LaGrange, Tex., has preserved the original muster roll of Company F, 8th Texas Cavalry, organized in LaGrange in 1861. They were sworn into service in September, 1861, and elected B. F. Terry as their colonel and Tom Lubbock lieutenant colonel. They were then ordered to report to Gen. A. S. Johnston at Nashville, Tenn. After his death at Shiloh, they were under Generals Bragg, J. E. Johnston, and Hood, department commanders, and Generals Forrest and Wheeler, commanding cavalry. The last two years they served under Wheeler. This company had from first to last, with recruits and transfers from other commands, 117 men, of which thirty-six were killed and wounded, others dying of wounds and disease and since the close of the war. There are now only fourteen known survivors, indicated in the list by *.

aving been driven from its position, our division sped back to keep in allignment with Bowen's, and after this, which was then sometime after mide enemy advanced in force, and was there held n creek by Loring's division until night came on. After repulsing the enemy's first assault they threw forward their line of sharpshooters, and with their utillery on the main line, kept up the fight until dark. About 200 yards to the front, and a little to the left of our battery, there was a large farm house and a row of plantation cabins. These cabins were taken possession of by the enemy's sharpshooters, and they were picking our men off rapidly. Tilghman directed the gun-sergeant to train his gun, a 12-pound howitzer, and dislodge the enemy from the cabins. He dismounted from his horse and gave some directions about sighting the gun. While this was being done a shell from one of the enemy's guns on the line exploded about fifty feet to the front. A ragged fragment of this shell struck the General in the breast, passing entirely through him and killing the horse of his Adjutant a little farther to the rear. His death occurred, of course, very soon, and his remains were carried to the rear. That night they were started

they were buried in the city cemetery in Vicksburg. One more brief item, and I leave the subject for some abler pen. The dislike and jealous treatment of General Pemberton, to which I have alluded, annoved General Tilghman very much all the spring of 1863. General Loring was the close friend of General Tilghman, and stood as a breakwater between the two

to Vicksburg, accompanied by his personal staff and

his son, Lloyd Tilghman, Jr., and the next evening

But on the 15th of May, the day before the batf Baker's Creek, and not two hours in advance of ulsome order to "prepare to meet the enemy," came an order from General Pemberton relieving General Tilghman of his command, and directing the senior Colonel of the brigade to take its command.

Here was a pretty kettle of fish. The whole army right close up, face to face, with Grant's army, twice or three times as strong, and our officers all in a stew.

General Loring again cut the Gordeon knot. The next morning, even after the enemy had disturbed our early repast, this one-armed General rode squarely up to the pompous Pemberton and, in language more forcible than elegant, more caustic than clever, informed the "General Commanding that unless he then and there revoked the order of the day before in reference to General Tilghman that he might dispense with his (Loring's) services for that day's battle." And then it was that an order was hastily written—on the pummel of a saddle, I believe—restoring General Tilghman to his command, and to one more day's faithful, brave service for the Confederacy, and before the sun went down on that day he yielded up his life for the cause he believed just and holy.

It is a well-known fact of history that in the terrific bombardment of Fort Henry by Commodore Foote, with his flotilla of seven gun-boats, and after a large number of the gunners within the Fort had been killed, either by the enemy or the explosion of two heavy guns of our own, that General Tilghman assisted with his own hands in manning the guns of the fort. So is it also true that the last act of this brave man as to sight a field gun, and direct the cutting of a ell fuse, so as to do the best execution upon the

DURING the war, when the Federal troops occupied Franklin, Tenn., a picket force was kept on the Carter's Creek pike, about two and a half miles out, at the head of Campbell's lane. A Confederate scout and sharp shooter, who rode a gray horse and carried a long gun on his shoulder, was in the habit of coming from the west of the pike across the fields and quietly getting in shooting range and firing on the picket and then dash away across the country, making his escape. On at least one occasion one of the pickets was shot from his horse, as the lady, who was then a little girl, tells me. She says the picket in every instance fled to the town, and soon a company would come out the pike looking for the rebels. These attacks of this one rebel occurred frequently, and the family in the brick cottage got in the habit of looking out for the soldier on the gray horse. Some years after the war a son of this family was in Arkansas, and by chance met this soldier who rode the gray horse, and he took delight in telling of his adventures with the Federal picket on the Carter's Creek pike near Franklin.

An old Confederate, Bunkie, La.: "Whilst we are honoring our great heroes who have passed away, we should not lose sight of our heroines-the dear women who were with us in those trying times. It is of one of these I wish to make inquiry. I see no mention of her. I hope her lot has fallen in pleasant places. When our army was routed at Nashville, Tenn., and whilst our troops were in the greatest confusion, a lady (Miss Mary Bradford, I believe, was the name) rushed among the men and bullets and implored the soldiers in the name of God and their country to form and face the foe. Such heroism is rarely seen and not soon forgotten. I don't know where she lived at the time, nor where she is now. Some one of your readers will remember her.

CONCERNING OUR NEXT REUNION.

The question comes, "Is there any probability of a reunion during the coming spring?" Reply goes back, "There is certainty of a reunion during the early spring as nearly as any thing can be determined that is future." That a reunion of United Confederate Veterans will be held in the early spring may be considered positive. It is a question in which independent citizens of the whole South are interested, and are not as subject to orders as they were in times gone by, who, however, are loyally true to their officers and will exercise all deference. The officers themselves are certainly determined upon a reunion, and a gathering of ex-Confederates in the Winnie Davis Wigwam at Birmingham in April or May may be accepted now as the determination. A letter from Capt. Jos. F. Johnston, late Commander of the Hardee Camp at Birmingham, in reply to a question as to the time Birmingham would like, suggested May 20th, the anniversary of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence. It seems most fitting that this great day to all Southern patriots should be celebrated. It would seem best to defer as largely as practicable to the wishes of Birmingham friends who are to entertain the great convention, and hence Capt. Johnston's suggestion is given first prominence. Gen. W. L. Cabell, writing from Dallas, Texas, October 16th, says, in reference to the great reunion, "There was a great mistake made when it did not take place in July. I will favor no meeting that will take place after the 25th of April. My people are farmers, and will not leave their crops in May, and they are all in favor of having a permanent place of meeting hereafter." Texas, because of her great number of organizations, and the Trans-Mississippi Department because of its distance from points east of the Mississippi, deserve special consideration, but we should all harmonize, and all should concede for the "greatest good to the greatest number." The VETERAN is determined upon advocating this reunion, which is not optional except as to the date (the place having been settled by the New Orleans Convention), at an early day, 1894. It seeks to obtain the desires of every Camp in the organization, and requests information as speedily as it can be forwarded from Commanders of these Camps (whether or not meetings be held, the general sentiment may be ascertained

by the Commander), and it will endeavor to show to the Commanding General the wish of the great majority, and implicitly believes that he will promptly respond.

Upon investigation it is found that the 25th of April will be Wednesday, and the 20th of May Sunday. Now the VETERAN, in behalf of all comrades, in behalf of the cause for which the organization was created, insists that the reunion should be held as early as the weather and circumstances will admit, and that the reunions thereafter forever be annual. It does not favor a permanent place for reunions, but suggests that the matter can be arranged advantageously as to railroad fares through a committee. However, that is not a matter to be discussed at present. Commanders or Adjutants of Camps can help this cause by immediate attention. Let the VETERAN know when your Camp would like for the reunion to occur. Please write on a postal card answers to these questions: Do you expect your Camp to be represented? If so, by how many? What time in the early spring would you prefer? These questions may be answered by yes or no, giving the number in figures and the date. Please send these answers on postal or on separate paper from other writing.

CORRECT HISTORY WANTED.—A. T. Gay, Graham, Texas: Wm. A. Yarbrough's report of "Memorable Events of the Confederate War," in September Veteran, does great injustice to the Confederates engaged in the battles of Shiloh and Island No. 10. Mr. Yarbrough says that the Federal killed at Shiloh was 1,735, and the Confederate 3,000. He states, too, that Gen. Albert Sidney Johnston was killed on the second day while leading a desperate charge. All who were there are confident that the Federal dead on the field far exceeded those of the Confederates. General Johnston was killed on the evening of the first day.


I have a very vivid recollection of Island No. 10. Mr. Yarbrough's statement concerning this battle is at varience with the facts. He says that the Federals captured 125 guns. They did not get one-fourth of that number. Again he says the Federals captured 13 steamers, 10,000 small arms, 2,000 horses and 6,000 prisoners. Nothing could be farther from the facts than this statement. The Federals did not capture any steamers, and not more than 3,000 small arms, including shot guns and squirrel rifles, and about as many prisoners. I do not know the number, but believe that 3,000 is more than was surrendered, and if they captured more than 100 head of horses they were taken from the citizens in the surrounding country and did not belong to the Confederate service.

I have no desire to appear in print, but believe any statement published in the Confederate Veteran should be accurate, for the little journal will be read by our great-grandchildren. It will be bound in volumes and pass as a legacy to our children. Then let nothing but facts be published in it. It is battling for a true history of the Confederate war. Capt. H. T. Norman, of the First Tennessee Heavy Artillery, could give a true history of the surrender of Island No. 10.

Our Dead

W. R. JANYAKBROUGH was bornein Charlotter N. C., October 24, 1828; and died in the Confederate Soldiers' Home, enear Nashville, June 21, 1907? When a young man Brother Yarbrough located at Montgomery, Ala: and there remained until the opening of the War between the States, when he enlisted as a soldier in the service of the Confedcracy. During the four years and more of that Titanic struggle he was faithful to his duty as he saw it, remaining in the ranks and enduring hardships and facing danger along with his comrades until honorably discharged at the close of the war. Returning to his home, in Montgomery, he engaged in business and prospered until failing health compelled him to seek a more favorable climate. About twenty years ago he moved to San Antonio. Texp and a few years later joined his only some Mr. W. os.] Yarbrough, in Nashville, Tenn, where he remained until his death. Before entering the army he was married to Miss Lydia Sweatt, a beautiful Christian woman, who was faithful to him through all the years of their pilgrimage together, caring for him as a child during the long illness that preceded his death. + Shes still survives, making her home with their only son, Mr. Walter S. Yarbrough, of Nashville, Tenn. 11 his early manhood Brother Yarbrough was converted and united with the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in whose fellowship he lived until the end, serving for many years in various positions of official responsibility. He was an earnest and zealous Christian. It was the custom of his life to allow no opportunity to witness for his Lord to pass by unimproved. The writer was his pastor in three different Churches-an aggregate altogether of ten years--and can therefore bear personal testimony to the constancy of his devotion. During his three years' residence in the Confederate Soldiers' Home he used his atmost endeavor to induce his old comrades to give their hearts to the Master. His end was not only peaceful but triumpliant. For months he looked forward with eager anticipation to the time when the Master should speak his welcome: "Well done." God still keeps his promises. "He that trustth in the Lord, loving-kindness shall ompass him about."



Edwin T. Yarborough b. 1931 in SC

Cuyler E. Yerborough b. 1904 in SC

John Murray Yarborough, b. 1858, in St. d. 1936

Themas L. Yarborough b. 1832(about) in SC d. 1865 in Elmira Yankee Prison John H. Yarborough b. 1805(about) in NC d. 1865 in Tenn.

John H, spelled his name Yarbrough in the 1830 Mecklenburg County, NC census. I have enclosed a copy of the names of his 11 children from the Darlington County 1850 census and also include a copy of the obituary of W. R. A. Yarbrough who was the oldest son. I also enclose a copy (sorry it is so poor) of a letter I recently acquired which was written in May, 1866 by Joseph T. Yarbrough from DEcatur County, Tenn. to my Great-Grandmother and Great-Great Aunt Nancy. The letter from Joseph is

- l. Jim had told Joseph of the death of my Great Grandfather Thomas far away
- 2. James and Elizabeth are in Alabama, also Hester.
 - 33 Pa moved to Tenn in November, 1865 and died 2 weeks later (Dec. 6, 1865).
 - 4. Write to him at Yarbrough's Landing on the Tennesse River in DEcatur County.

Also my grandparents kept in touch with a Mary Fisher who lived in Mineola, Texas and was the Mary who was 5 years old in 1850. Mary had a sister somewhere in Texas who married a Walker. Family history has it that John H. left SC and went to Texas, leaving several of the older children behind.

We have a reunion each November of the descendents of Thomas Yarborough and I am putting together facts for it. If this should be helpful to you, great! If you should have any information that could help me,,I would be grateful to receive it.



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First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.

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² This may take quite some time, depending on the size of files contained therein.

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
