Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

In all I have seen of research done on the family of YARBOROUGH in the United States, there seems to be a unanimous decision that anyone who can trace their ancestors as having been here before the Revolutionary War were all descendants of Richard Yarborough I. Although it is evident that they were of the same line of origin, it is also evident that there were other Yarborough immigrants in the early settlement of this country.

RICHARD YARBOROUGH 1 & II, 1615-1652

Records of English passage lists shows Richard Yar-borough booked passage to Virginia in 1635. If the records borough booked passage to Virginia in 1635. If the records are accurate (Wm. and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 5, p. 233), he died at age 87 in 1702. This means he was born in 1615 and was 20 years old when he first come to Virginia. We know that Richard Yarborough I. had a son, Richard II, who was also born in England. (from Court case in 1600) also born in England, (from Court case in 1690). This Richard stated that in 1690 he was 38 years old and was born in England (1652). It is obvious that Richard I made the voyage between England and Virginia more than the one time in 1635. While we do not have the record of the exact place Richard I landed on this continent, it is possible he landed in the vicinity of Yorktown. Some of the earliest records show him present in Counties of Northhampton, King and Queen and King William. It is obvious that his course of migration was up the York River. It has been established that Richard I was of the branch from Yarborough in Lincoln, England, referred to as the "Lincolnshire" branch. About 1600, several members of the "Lincolnshire Yarboroughs" settled in other Counties: William Yarborough settled in Yorkshire, Charles in Nottinghamshire, and Francis in Northamptonshire. One Edmund Yarbrough made his home at Balne Hall, in Yorkshire, and married Sarah, daughter of Thomas Wormeley, of that county.

EDMUND or EDWARD I & II, c 1630-1650

It would appear, from the following record, that this Edmund was also an immigrant to the colonies. Found in the records of York County, Virginia, Book III - Wills, Deeds and Orders, p. 28: "It is ordered that the Sheriff convey Edward Yarbrough, son of Edward Yarbrough, deceased, to the next court to be delivered to constable and from that constable to another constable until he be delivered to Col. Robert Abrall, who is desired by this Court to dispose of him to his Mother (nee Wormely) or other ways which are fitting. Next Court to be 24 August, 1658."

CHRISTIAN or CHRISTOPHERE YARBROUGH, c 1630

(*Ref: "Early Virginia Immigrants 1623-1666 - George Cabel Greer, Baltimore Genealogical Publishing Co., 1960, p. 374)

Christian Yarblow is shown among the arrivals in Virginia in 1653 sponsored by Thomas Willis. Some researchers (Nelle Morris Jenkins) have stated this Christian Yarblow was the same as Richard II and was so called to distinguish him from his Father, Richard I. I believe this not to be so as I feel Richard Yarborough I would have sponsored his own son if it were so.

AMBROSE YARBROUGH b. c 1710

The Yarborough "cousins" in England did/have communication with those who came to Virginia in the colonial days and according to researcher Senator George Washington Yarborough (D. Alabama - probably the foremost authority on the Yarborough Family in America since 1930) another immigrant ancestor of the family was Ambrose Yarbrough who left England in 1732.

Following will be some brief history of these early immigrants:

IMMIGRANT RICHARD YARBOROUGH

Found in the records of the House of Burgesses, the first representative legislative body in America, there are references to Richard Yarburgh, Yarberry (Yarborough).

"At a Grand Assembly began at Green Spring, the 20th day of February 1676, these following Orders of Public charge were made and allowed, viz. *** To Richard Yarberry (sic) 6,000 lbs. of Tobacco ***

(Journals of the House of Eurgesses of Virginia, 1659-1693, H. R. Mcllwaine, 1914 Richmond, Virginia State Library - p 81)

"Att a Generall Assembly Begun att James Citty the 16 day of Aprill in the Thirty sixth years of His Majties Raigne And in the years of our Lord 1684. These following Orders of Publique Charge and Levy were made *** New Kent County *** To Richd Yarburgh (sic) for his service severall tymes in discovering the Senerca Indians and other publique service wth Coll Byrd 001620 (lbs. tobacco) ***

"Xber 7th 1685 *** The Report as come from ye Committee of Claimes, relating to ye New York and Albany Charge is by ye house allowed of and Nr. Auditor Bacon is desired to pay *** To Richd Yarborough Interpreter for his voyage & services L.20 s.00 d.00"



CAPT. E. YARPOROUGH TO GENERAL SUMMER.

Charlotte, 12th May, 1781

Sirı

I was at General Butler's Camp a few days after your letter was received ordering Capt. Read and myself to take command of the Troops, that was sent out under Col. Linton. I set out immediately for Read Quarters with my baggage that came from Virginia and by the Tories residing in Randolph County and on Deep River I was obliged to make my rought by Guilford Court House and Salisbury and Charlotte. I had got as far as the lines of South Carolina when I was taken very sick and obliged to return to this place to the Hospital and am not able to judge when I shall be able for the field. Capt. Read was sent to Salisbury on some business from General Greene and there is no Officers at camp with the North Carolina Troops but Major Eaton and Lieutenant Campbell.

I should be very happy if I could obtain leave of absence for a few weeks for to recover my health and some other husiness that would be something very considerable to me by the death of my brother, since I march from home last August. I hope you will grant my request, as you are sensible that I am the only officer belonging to the State that has been in service until lately for the last ten months past. I should be happy to hear that you and your family are all well. So conclude with my compliments to all friends.

CHAPTER XII

WASHINGTON COMES TO SALISBURY

Hardly had North Carolina entered into the new Union than e President of the United States paid her a visit early in 1791. The Federalists, who were then in control of the country, deed the grand old patriot, General Washington, to tour the uth in order to strengthen their party in territory that was still to their policies. A storm of protest was arising against deralist measures in that section of the Union and the storm is the genesis of an opposition party. The Federalist leaders,

nom Alexander Hamilton, the Secretary of the Treasury, is the foremost, found Washington's enormous popularity a luable asset. The precise effect that Washington had on the d North State is not known, but it did afford an opportunity r patriotic demonstrations such as had never before been witssed in the state.

After Washington had traversed the eastern seaboard as far Savannah he returned through Augusta, Columbia, and Camn. He then stopped at the home of Major Richard Crawford tht miles from North Carolina. Maj. Crawford had reared adrew Jackson and taught him the rudiments of military ence. On May 27 he arrived at the southern border of Meckaburg County, where he was met by a detachment of Salisbury ght Dragoons under Captain Charles Caldwell, a young medi-I student then studying in a physician's home in Salisbury. is group of 13 young men was a part of a larger company reuited in Salisbury to escort the famous general to their town. ney had left the company 15 miles from Salisbury and jouryed to the South Carolina line to await the President. There e young captain, who was scarcely more than a boy, gave e distinguished Washington his first reception into North irolina. Caldwell was frightened at first, but the gentle manr with which Washington received him soon put the captain ease, and the two of them enjoyed a pleasant chat along the to Charlotte. While conversing, Washington inquired of

young Caldwell whether anyone was still alive who had signed the famous Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence. He was told that a few remained but would probably not appear in the village as they were too scattered throughout the country-side and their age would not permit them to attend the ceremonies in Charlotte. Upon reaching Mecklenburg, Caldwell and the other Salisbury dragoons delivered Washington to the Mecklenburg Light Horse.

The presidential party proceeded towards Salisbury on May 29. That night was spent at the home of Major Martin Phifer (Pheiffer) at "Red Hill" in Cabarrus County, three miles west of present Concord. The party got an early start the next morning and after traveling about ten miles were met at the dividing line between Mecklenburg and Rowan by a party of light dragoons of which Charles Caldwell's group had been a part, and proceeded into town under the command of Captain John Beard, who had served in the Revolution. As Washington proceeded on to Salisbury they were met by other companies, one of which was composed of little boys all wearing buck tails from their cap as a symbol of independence. According to Mangum's account this was "the nicest thing he had seen".

As Washington entered the town and pushed his way through the crowd to the court house that stood in the public square where he was to be officially received, a cannon fired fifteen salutes in his honor. After the reception the party moved down Corbin Street to the Yarborough House, located in the middle of the west side of Main between Innes and Council, where they breakfasted.

That afternoon the honorable visitor was waited upon by Judge Spruce Macay, Charles Harris, Montfort Stokes, and Lewis Beard, who presented him with an address:

Sir.

We have the honour to signify to you the joy which your presence, after a tedious journey undertaken at an advanced age in life, affords to the inhabitants of this place. Words are wanting to express our gratitude to heaven for continuing your life, on which our national glory and domestic tranquility, are even at this day, depending.

And having been ranked with those who suffered in the late war, we pledge ourselves to be amongst the foremost to maintain and perpetuate the federal government.

That your life, justly dear to the people of this country, a life precious, an ornament to huntan nature, and a blessing to the United States of America, may long be preserved, is the fervent and unanimous prayer of the people of this village.

Even at this early date the leaders of this town expressed to the President in a subtle way their want of better roads and by implication these Federalists hinted that they desired the federal government to take over the post roads of the country.

In the reply, the original of which is mounted in a case in the Rowan Public Library as a donation by Irvin Oestricher, Washington alluded to the roads in the third paragraph:

Gentlemen:

Your expressions of satisfaction on my arrival in Salisbury, are received with pleasure, and thanked with sincerity.

The interest which you are pleased to take in my personal welfare, excites a sensibility proportioned to your goodness. While I make the most grateful acknowledgment for that goodness, allow me to observe that your own determination, cooperating with that of your fellow-citizens throughout the union, to maintain and perpetuate the federal government, affords a better assurance of order and effective government, with their concomitants private and public prosperity, than the best meant endeavors of any individual could give.

Our national glory, and our domestic tranquility, can never be tarnished or disturbed, while they are guarded by wise laws found in public virtue. Among the measures which an enlight-





Wake County has been the home of the Betts family for eight generations. When the weather

turned warm in 1804, Joseph and Mary Betts and their six children made the 150-mile journey from Isle of Wight County. Va. to White Oak Creek in the southwestern part of Wake County.

Traveling with them were Joseph's nephew. Andrew and his wife and children. Both Jamiles settled near Holly Springs and began to farm, Joseph died two years after arriving in Wake County, but his wife and children continued to work the land for another 20 years.

One son, Barzilla, purchased the family homestead and sold it to Stanford Wheeler in 1832 for \$120. Barzilla courted and married a neighbor. Jane Yates, in 1820. Their family grew to include seven sons and one daughter.

Barzilla's son, Anderson Betts, became a master carpenter for the Raleigh-Gaston Railroad. He married Elizabeth Jordan in 1852, and for many years they lived across the road from 'Inwood Baptist Church, which they helped found, very near What is now Lake Wheeler Road. During the War Between the Stales, a bullet pierced the front door, and the hole remained as long as the house was standing.

Evidently, he didn't like such a long name, so he changed it to Samuel J. Ferebee. The letter J does not mean anything. His family and friends called him Sam.

Samuel and Modecia lived most of their lives at Sligo, North Carolina, in Currituck County, and were the parents of nine children. Modecia died on February 27, 1920. Her death was truly tragic. She and Samuel had taken into their home an elderly woman, and Modecia was combing this woman's hair when her dress became ignited from the open fire. Before it could be extinguished, she was so badly burned that she died as a result of the burns. One can say that she gave her life in the service of another. Samuel never re-married. He died on November 29, 1935.

Sam's grandfather, Mitchell Simmons Ferebee was born in Currituck County, North Carolina, April 7, 1819 and died on November 19, 1889. He was married three times. Mitchell was a Confederate soldier, serving in the 4th N.C. regiment. He was a member of Atlantic Masonic Lodge-No. 238. Resolutions in memory of him were drawn on November 22, 1889 by W.H. Cowell, J.F. Frost and G.W. Williams, committee appointed by the Lodge, and same published in the Elizabeth City "Economist and Falcon."

Sam's great-grandfather, the Reverend Samuel Ferebee, Jr., was born in Currituck County, North Carolina, on February 2, 1795 and died November 16, 1879. He was married five times. He was a Methodist minister who lived in the vicinity of Shawboro, North Carolina. Perkins Chapel was first erected through his efforts and was used by him for services during his lifetime, and is still being used as a place of worship.

Sam's great-great-grandfather, Samuel Ferebee, Sr., was born in Currituck County, North Carolina, on June 20, 1761 and died November 7, 1845. He was married three times. He was commissioned a Lieutenant in the Revolutionary War. He was collector of State and Continental duties and imports of the convention at Fayetteville, North Carolina, 1789, to ratify the Constitution of the United States and was the last surviving member of that convention. (Wheeler's History, pages 134, 135.)

When Sam was a young man, he decided to give up farming and go in the construction business. He moved to Zebulon, North Carolina, in Wake County. It was there that he met Lois Guarica Brantley, daughter of William Roundtree and Ella Guarica Brantley. They were married on July 13, 1912 and were the parents of two children, Ella Guarica Ferebee

and Harold Royce Ferebee.

During the years that Sam was in the construction business, he supervised the construction of several big jobs for the U.S. Government, also school buildings in central and eastern North Carolina. It was in the Depression of the early thirties, when so many people were standing in bread lines, that Sam went to work for the Works Progress Administration. At this time, he supervised the construction of the Raleigh Little Theatre, Raleigh, North Carolina, and was presented an award for his participation in this WPA project.

Sam's daughter Guarica nicknamed "Reek" by her daddy when she was very young, married Julian Garland Godwin, Jr., from Godwin, North Carolina, on March 14, 1936. They had two sons, Julian Garland Godwin, III, called Jay, and Richard Ferebee Godwin. Reek's husband died on July 21, 1968 and she married William E. Fox, from Franklin, Ohio, on May 22, 1972. They, as well as the sons, live in Raleigh, North Carolina. Jay served with the 101st Airborne Division at Ft. Campbell, Kentucky. He married the former Nancy Harrelson from Tabor City, North Carolina, and they have one son, Jonathan. Richard served in the U.S. Army and was stationed in Vietnam. He is married to the former Anne Cox from Raleigh. North Carolina and Richard has a son by his first marriage. His son is named Richard but is called Rick, and he lives with his daddy.

Harold Royce Ferebee volunteered, during World War II, to serve with the Seabees, one of the volunteer construction battalions for building naval aviation facilities and defending them. He stayed single until he was fifty-six years old at which time he married Derele Joyner, from Bunn, North Carolina, on October 16, 1971. Sam's wife, Lois, died on May 21, 1972. She died of a heart attack while spending the week-end at the Holiday Inn, West Franklin Street, Richmond, Virginia. She had gone with her daughter, Reek, and her husband, Bill, to attend a Spring Forum of the National Association of Women in Construction.

JAMES JOSEPH FERGUSON 25

Although born in England, James Joseph Ferguson spent a good part of his adult life in the Neuse-Falls section of Wake County.

Ferguson was born Feb. 12, 1829, in Manchester, England. He was the oldest son of John and Mary Ferguson. He had two brothers, John and William, and one sister, Mary. They stayed in England and he lost contact with them over the years.

After learning the paper-making trade, Ferguson left England in July, 1848, at the age of 19 and came to America. He arrived in New York in August. He applied his trade in paper mills in New York state before he moved to Cleveland. Ohio.

He married Anne Duffy on May 12, 1857, in Cleveland. About two years later, they moved to Falls in Wake County, N.C. after he accepted a position with with Wake Forest Manufacturing company. (See Anne Duffy.)

The old paper-making plant, established about 1835, is still standing near the dam at Falls Lake in Wake County.

After the death of his wife in 1867, Ferguson and his children moved back to Ohio, the children staying in Cleveland with their grandmother.

Later, Ferguson married Sallie Haley Dunn, born Sept. 26, 1840. She was a daughter of Nat and Mary Durham Dunn of Neuse in Wake County. After living in Tenn. and Ohio, Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson moved back to Neuse and he continued his association with the Wake Forest Manufacturing Company.

Ferguson died September 9, 1901 and Mrs. Ferguson on July 19, 1914. They are buried at the old Dunn burying grounds near the old Ferguson home on the Johnson property on SR 2002.

Ferguson and his second wife had three children: Mary Ferguson, born Dec. 20, 1875 in Hamilton, Ohio; Richard Henry Ferguson, born Feb. 26, 1878 at Neuse; and John Joseph Ferguson, born April 10, 1880 at Neuse.

Mary Ferguson married on April 14, 1898, Edwin Lacy Clark, born Jan. 6, 1870, the son of Frederick P. Clark and his wife Bettie Houston Hartenstein. They had four children: Edwin Lacy Clark, Jr., born July 1, 1899, died March 3, 1905; James Fredrick Clark, born March 29, 1901, died July 3, 1901; Frank Ferguson Clark, born March 5, 1903, married Lottie Olin of Wake County and had no children; and Rev. Eugene Houstontein Clark, born Dec. 1, 1900, married Ruth Abbott of Greensboro and had no children.

Richard Henry Ferguson, married Dec. 7, 1904, Elizabeth Ennis. She was born December 7, 1904, the daughter of George B. Ennis and his wife Hannah, daughter of Edward and Hannah Yarborough Ennis.

They had three children: Richard Henry Ferguson, Jr., born March 24, 1906, married Aug. 10, 1935, Frances Allen Walton, and had no children; James Marshall Ferguson, born June 27, 1911, married Dec. 22, 1938, Betsy Wall of Orange County, (more later); and Kathryn Elizabeth Ferguson, born June 6, 1915, married William Gerald Hartenstein of Akron, Ohio, and had no children.

James Marshall Ferguson and his wife Bessie Wall had four children: James Marshall Ferguson, Jr., born Jan. 6, 1941, married Dorothy Jean Tucker, of whom later Richard Bryan Ferguson, born April 3, 1946, married June 6, 1973, Karen Lea Kampson; and William Henry Ferguson, born July 15, 1951, married May, 1975, Deborah Godfrey.

James Marshall Ferguson, Jr. and his wife Jean Tucker had four children: James Neil Ferguson, born Nov. 19, 1961; Edith Lynn Ferguson, born September 27, 1965; Kimberly Jean Ferguson, born Feb. 9, 1967; and Todd Marshall Ferguson, born June 19, 1968.

I Edward Yarborough of the City of Raleigh being'ill in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory and mindful of the uncertainty of human life do make and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by

Firstly. I desire my executor hereafter named to pay my just debts and funeral expenses.

Secondly. I devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Hanna H. all my Hotel property in the City of Raleigh, commonly called "Yara on borough's" or Yarborough's Hotel, including all the houses and lands which they are situate, together with all the furniture, household and kitchen, and all the stores of whatever kind in said houses from cellar to garret, to my said wife and her heirs and assigns forever. and assigns forever.

Thirdly. I desire all the residue of my property, including debts due me and money or deposits or on hand, shall be divided between my children, or their representatives, so that the children of a deceased child of mine, shall stand in the place of their parent, and take a child's part equally with my other children.

I desire that my friend, William R. Pool, shall act as Fourthly. I desire that m the executor this my will.

And it is further agreed that until the real Estate hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say the property Known as the Yarborough House in the City of Raleigh, and Such of the Furniture thereof as may not be necessary for the payment of debts aforesaid, and may be necessary for use in said Hotel, shall be sold as hereinbefore provided, the Said Hotel property shall be rented by William R. Poole Thomas Bragg and H.A.Badham Esquires of the City of Raleigh as the Counsel and Agents and in behalf of the respective parties in interest to this agreement for such times and on such terms and conditions as to them shall appear best for the interests of all parties in interest hereto, and the said William R. Poole Thomas Bragg and H.A. Should any of the children of my said grandson predecease him, leaving issue, such issue to take the share of said land to which such pre-deceased children would have been entitled had they survived their said father taking per stirpes.





YARBORO HOUSE of Raliegh, North Carolina, had a history of outstanding hostelry service to national, state and military leaders of the country. Owned and operated by a Yarboro family associated with publis houses and inns in Colonial Days, the Raliegh house was built before the War Between the Statea and was in continuous operations until 1928 when it was destroyed by fire. The House was host to many Confederate States

of America military and statemen. One report says the wife and children of a Confederate General took up permanent residence there to wait the General's return at the end of the war.For many years Yarboro House was the official residence of North Carolina Governors and government while mansions and other quarters were not available. A tile dressing room floor in a Belk's store is said to be all that's left of the Grand Hotel.

Nelson and John Hansell. This Elizabeth Nelson was the widow of a large landholder of Montgo-Elizabeth Nelson, who is shown as deceased in Montgomery Co., Robert Nelson, who is shown as deceased in Montgomery Co. records beginning in 1814 (Book I, p. 563). The names of Edward and Edmond Yarborough appear in Stewart Co. tax rolls thru agents, which indicates to me that they did not actually live in Stewart Co., but had received the land for Revolutionary War service. From a study of the county's deed records it appears to me that the rame "Edmond" is a mis-transcription of Edward's name. Humphrey Yarborough's name also appears in tax rolls, and one reference shows "no poll," which likewise indicates to me that he did not actually reside in Stewart Co. (YFM 2/83).

Edward Yarborough was a captain in the American Revolution and was a resident of Rowan Co., N.C. and received land in Stewart Co. for his services (Edward will be covered in a later issue.). The "Edmond" Yarborough appearing in the 1809 Stewart Co. tax roll probably should have been listed as "Edward," as was the 1810 entry.

Humphrey Yarborough was a resident of Anson CO: N.C., who received North Carolina Revolutionary war Voucher \$1897, and his tax roll property in Stewart Co. Way have been awarded for his services. I think that it is likely that the 1809 tax enumerator (the same one who listed "Edmond") inadvertently crossmerator (the same one who listed "Edmond") inadvertently crosslisted the poll for Humphrey (shown as "1 poll") and Davis (shown as "no poll"), but that the roll was corrected in 1810 and

What all this means to me: I think that George Y., who married Elizabeth Norwood and died in Halifax Co., N.C. in about 1798, was the father of George, Moses, William and James of Montgomery Co. and may have been the father of Samuel of Stewart Co. of course, George died in Montgomery Co. in about 1847, Moses in Montgomery Co. in about 1840, and Samuel in Stewart Co. in about 1832. And I believe that sons William and James are the ones who later appeared in Cooşa and Marengo Cos., Alabama. But as of now I have no definite proof that Samuel of Stewart Co. is the son of George of Halifax Co. and brother of George, Moses, William and George of Montgomery Co. More discussion of these interesting western Tennessee Yarboroughs in the next issue.

## **Searching for Indexed Terms¹**

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.
