Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".





Peggy Plott, sister of George, married Ezekiel Brown and moved to Georgia; Caroline Plott, the youngest daughter of Henry Plott and granddaughter of Johannes, married Hugh Brown and the following children were reared: Killis, Rebecca, Dick, J. Hugh, Frances, and Margaret. This family remained in Haywood County.

LI. THE HERRENS

It was near the beginning of the nineteenth century that Jonathan Herren, the first of the name to come to this part of Western North Carolina, purchased a tract of land near the present site of the negro school house in Waynesville, probably the same that is now known as the Will Herren place on the edge of Waynesville on the left hand side of Highway No. 284 as one goes east. His purchase was some years before Haywood County was erected and the record of it is in the office of the register of deeds of Buncombe County.

Jonathan Herren's life in Haywood County must have been a very quiet one as there are no traces of his activities except records of the purchase of other lands at a later date. The inference is that his purchases were by State grants and that he began to sell off some of his holdings at a later date. At least that is the information that may be gathered from the scanty records that are available. He married Elizabeth Osborne.

It is known that Jonathan Herren reared two sons. Green Herren married Cordelia Johnson and the names of two sons are recorded, as follows: Lester, an orchardist of some reputation who lived in Buncombe County, and Eli Barker, who married Jane Yarborough, of Raleigh, lived and died in Haywood County.

Eli Barker Herren was a man well known in this county. He was a citizen of much influence, a merchant

ener al merchant and had a store in the house known as the stendenhall dwelling on Main Street torn down in 1935. He was also a large land owner and had forty slaves. He had a tannery on the tract of land that his father had bought and that was afterwards owned by W. A. Herren, a son. He was a charter member of the First Baptist church of Waynesville, which was organized in 1823. He was one of the largest contributors in the building of the first house of worship of that denomination in Waynesville. The old building stood for many years on the right bank of Richland Creek about two hundred yards west of the present site of the passenger and freight depot of the Southern Railway. He was also active in the establishment of schools and churches in other places in Western North Carolina.

Eli Barker Herren and Jane Yarborough Herren reared a family of seven children. Archibald L. Herren married Tola Jones, of South Carolina. He was a merchant in Waynesville for a number of years before going to Seattle, Washington, to live where he became a man of much in-Auence. Adoniram Judson Herren, who married Jennie Moore, of Macon County, was a farmer here for a long time before moving in 1886 to the State of Washington. Louisa Josephine married Thomas S. Siler, of Macon County, who later became a resident of Haywood. Sarah Jane married W. E. Miller, of Waynesville, and lived all of her life here. James Pinkney married Mary (Mollie) Smathers and spent his life in Haywood County. William A. Herren did not marry, but remained as a citizen of Havwood County until his death. Samuel Carey married Laura Teague, of Crabtree township. He lived for a while in Asheville, where he practiced law and edited a newspaper. Later, he moved first to the State of Washington and then to Idaho. He became a distinguished lawyer in his western home. Later, he moved to Chicago, where before his death some years ago he became the city prosecuting attorney. There were three other children of Eli Barker Herren, Ann Haseltine, Ann Amelia, and Ellen, but all three of them died in early life.

Archibald L. Herren and Iola Jones Herren reared the following children, all of whom located in the Great West: Jennie, Elizabeth, Ellen, Archibald, Jr., Lidie, Mattie Siler, Iola, and Maude.

Children of Adoniram Judson Herren and Jennie Moore Herren likewise located in the west. They are as follows: Harry, who died in boyhood; Hugh, Benjamin, Adoniram Judson, Jr., Susie, and Sam.

The record of the children of Louisa Josephine Herren and Thomas S. Siler is given in the story of the Siler family in this volume. Sarah Jane Herren, who married W. E. Miller, lived all of her life in Haywood County. Her children are recorded as follows: Annie, who married E. B. Atkinson, of Asheville; Frank W., who is now (1935) a member of the North Carolina Highway and Public Works Commission; Charles U., who married Mary Kline of Ohio; Samuel, of Waynesville; Mary Josephine, who married W. C. Garrison, lives in Canton; and J. Clarence, who married Virginia Cooper.

James Pinkney Herren and Mary (Mollie) Smathers Herren reared a family of three daughters and one son, as follows: Jessie Josephine, Flora, Lucile, who married Henry Foy, of Wilmington; and A. Luncan, who married Allie Phillips and located in Washington City.

Samuel C. Herren and Laura Teague Herren reared the following children: York, a lawyer in Chicago; Edna, who lives in the State of Washington; Sam, who also lives in Washington; Wilson, Eli B., and Virginia.

FRANK W. MILLER, a son of W. E. Miller and Sarah Jane Herren Miller, was born in Waynesville. He was educated in the Waynesville schools and at Trinity College, which later received the name of Duke University.

His public services have been various. He was for some years deputy clerk of the Haywood County Superior Court; for several terms alderman of the town of Waynesville; and membership on the North Carolina Highway and Public Works Commission. In these various positions, he has been capable and efficient.

Oscar M. Hampton was educated in the public schools and at the Greeneville-Tusculum College, Tennessee, and at the Richmond Business College. He became connected with the Bank of Waynesville, where he served for two years and later was cashier of the Champion Bank and Trust Company. He was also in the mercantile business in Canton with his brother, Charles V.

In 1927, he was appointed by the Legislature of North Carolina to membership on the Board of County Commissioners and served two years, retiring at the end of his term.

THE UNDERWOODS. Fielding Underwood and his wife, Elizabeth Land Underwood, were the first of the name to come to Haywood County. They came about 1820 from Towns County, Georgia, and settled in what has since been called East Waynesville.

Six children were reared, as follows: Jasper, who returned to Towns County, Georgia, where he lived and died; D. Melvin married Mahala Hood; Elijah married Sallie Bryson; Nancy married George Yarboro; Polly married Richard Robinson; and Madely married Alonzo Allen.

D. Melvin Underwood and Mahala Hood Underwood reared the following children: Robert T. Underwood, who married Lou Davis; James P., who married Cenie Bramlett; Martha, who married James Williams; Elizabeth, who married Marion Davis; Samuel Leonidas, who married Rachel Lucinda Roberts; Matthew Hale, who married Sallie Gaddy; and William Pinkney, who married Laura Gaddy.

Elijah Underwood and Sallie Bryson Underwood reared two children, James and Melvin, both of whom left the county. James settled in Jackson County, North Carolina, and Melvin located in Georgia.

James P. Underwood and Genie Bramlett reared a family of three boys, as follows: Robert L., John C., and Edward. Samuel Leonidas Underwood and Rachel Lucinda Roberts Underwood reared four children, as follows: William, Annie, who married H. C. Robinson; Margaret,

who married first J. H. Lilly, and second William Bramlett; and David, who married Clara Corder.



THE THOMAS FAMILY. More than a century and a quarter ago, a young couple, who had married a short time before in Virginia, came to the fertile and scenically beautiful Pigeon valley in what is now Haywood County. There they purchased lands and began the building of a home for themselves. They lived together in that new country for about two years when their brief union was tragically broken by the drowning in Pigeon river of the young husband.

The actors in this tragic drama were Richard Thomas, who was born in Virginia, and Temperance Calvert, a descendant of one of the brothers of Lord Baltimore who had settled the Maryland colony in 1634. Only a few

EZEKIEL AND NANCY (RABORN) HERREN

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Ezekiel Herren was born on September 3, 1811 in the Pole Creek Section of Haywood County, N.C., the son of Berry and Edith Barker Herren.

Ezekiel married Nancy Raborn (or Rayborn), the daughter of Hodge and Ariminta Martin Raborn who had come from Montgomery County, Virginia. Nancy was born February 7, 1813 in Buncombe County. They settled down to a life together here in this

county, and raised a large family. Nancy died on May 7, 1881 and Ezekiel died September 10, 1893. Both are buried in the Zion Hill Baptist Church Cemetery near Leicester, N.C.

Their children were: Arimenta Jane, born November 15, 1836, died December 2, 1911 ar uried in Snow Hill Methodist Cemetery; mary Ann, born October 1, 1840, died February 1, 1892;

Edith, born October 1, 1838, died December 5, 1915, and buried near her parents; Sadie; Nehoma; Archibald; William Martin, born July 5, 1850, died April 12, 1920, buried in Crescent, Oklahoma with his wife, Rachel Penland Herren. William had a large farm there and he and his wife had eleven children.

John Mark Herren, born December 17, 1851, married Lucinda Flipps and had six children. At one time the family were the proud owners of one of the only two "surreys with the fringe on the top" in town. It was once said of John and Lucinda — "there weren't finer folk than John and Lucinda... they made a good living, were well well fixed, but more important, they were respected! They were hard-working people. She swept her house, her yard and her outhouse everyday. She filled her cellar with canned fruits and vegetables!"

Another handed-down 'John Mark Herren Story': There were no banks nearby in those days. John Mark kept from \$100 to \$1,000 in a trunk in his bedroom. One evening Mark had gone to bed. Lucinda was still weaving in the living room (Woman's work is never done!) As sh ally started into the bedroom, she saw a man on his knees crawling toward the trunk. At Lucinda's scream, Mark came out of the bed with loaded gun, which always stood beside it. The man went out the window with Mark and gun on his heels and down through the brichard. He never came back.

John Mark Herren's orchard seemed to be the place the intruders always headed for. His Smoke Hose held around ten hogs. As a man was trying to saw the through the chain on the door, Mark shot through the kitchen window and knocked his hat off. Not waiting for his hat, again the intruder took off through the brichard.

John Mark Herren died September 29, 1909 and was buried in Bethel Cemetery. in Denton, Arkansas.

Greenberry Herron was ninth child of Ezekiel and Nancy Herren. He was born January 9, 1854 in Buncombe Co. and died July 7, 1900 n Denton, Arkansas, but was buried in old Lebanon Cemetery, Powhatan, Ark. He was wice married. His first wife was Nellie Morris whom he married on March 27, 1784 and they lad one son William A. Herren. His second vife was Margaret J. Matthews. They owned be good acreage in Lawrence County, Ark. named five children.

The fortunes of most of the descendants of his Herren family led them to other states there they have expended their energies in uilding up the communities where they lived, ut one of the hobbies of Opal Udella Herren

SAMUEL CARY HERREN AND LAURA ANN TEAGUE HERREN

Samuel Cary Herren, (1856-1929) youngest child of Eli Barker and Jane Yarborough Herren, was born in Waynesville, N.C., in 1856. He attended Wake Forest College, and was admitted to the practice of law in 1880.

He married Laura Ann Teague, daughter of Wilson and Adeline Kirkpatrick Teague, in 1882.

In 1885 Sam and Laura, (1863-1942) with their infant son Yorke, journeyed west to Washington Territory. Sam became very active in the forming of the new state. Many of the early documents are in his handwriting. When Washington became a state in 1889, he was the member from Lewis County of the first legislature. His picture is one taken from "The First General Assembly of 1889", hanging in the Capitol in Olympia.

Sam's two brothers, Jud and Arch, and their families, joined him in Washington. They were followed by Sam's sister Josephine's sons Judd and Weimar Siler, and their cousin Rufe Siler. On Sam's mother's side, Pir Yarborough and family also settled there.

Laura's sisters Mattie and Lizzie Teaque and their brother Pinkney Albert followed th others.

Sam's good friend from N.C., Jame Hamilton Lewis was also in Washington, bu later went to Chicago, Ill., where he became City Attorney of Chicago. Sam was invited t join him, and was made Assistant City Attorney in 1907. Later he became Corporation Counsel of Chicago.

Sam and Laura had two girls and four boys The youngest son, Eli Barker Herren, became Assistant States Attorney of Chicago in 1927.

In September, 1928, Sam and Laura visited in Waynesville with their relatives and friends. The surviving children of Eli Barker and Jane Herren were photographed together. They were Sallie (Mrs. Everett Miller), Will, and Sam. Five months later in February of 1929, Sam died at age 73. Sallie and Will had both preceded him in death.



The following children were reared: Margaret Caroline, Mary Malydia, Sarah A., Celinda Josephine, Lucinda Haseltin, and Henry Plott. One of her daughters, Margaret Caroline, was the mother of Elias Milton Ammons, Governor of the State of Colorado.

George Plott, the eighth son of Henry Plott and grandson of Johannes, moved to Georgia, married, and reared a family of ten children. Peggy Plott, sister of George, married Ezekiel Brown and moved to Georgia; Caroline Plott, the youngest daughter of Henry Plott and granddaughter of Johannes, married Hugh Brown and the following children were reared: Killis, Rebecca, Dick, J. Hugh, Frances, and Margaret. This family remained in Haywood County.

Elias Plott, third son of Johannes Plott and brother of John and Henry, did not come to Haywood County but re-

mained in Cabarrus County, or that part of Cabarrus now included in Iredell. He married twice, first Charity Conard, and second Peggy Kelly. Their offspring is quite numerous in the counties of Cabarrus, Iredell, Catawba, and other counties in the west central section of North Carolina. For the complete genealogy of this branch of the Plott family, the reader is referred to the records in Cabarrus and Iredell counties, and the genealogy of the Plott Family by Grace Plott now in the hands of Mrs. Robert Henry Plott, of Ivy Hill township.

LI. THE HERRENS

It was near the beginning of the nineteenth century that Jonathan Herren, the first of the name to come to this part of Western North Carolina, purchased a tract of land near the present site of the negro school house in Waynesville, probably the same that is now known as the Will Herren place on the edge of Waynesville on the left hand side of Highway No. 284 as one goes east. His purchase was some years before Haywood County was erected and the record of it is in the office of the register of deeds of Buncombe County.

Jonathan Herren's life in Haywood County must have been a very quiet one as there are no traces of his activities except records of the purchase of other lands at a later date. The inference is that his purchases were by State grants and that he began to sell off some of his holdings at a later date. At least that is the information that may be gathered from the scanty records that are available. He married Elizabeth Osborne.

It is known that Jonathan Herren reared two sons. Green Herren married Cordelia Johnson and the names of two sons are recorded, as follows: Lester, an orchardist of some reputation who lived in Buncombe County, and Eli Barker, who married Jane Yarborough, of Raleigh, lived and died in Haywood County.

Eli Barker Herren was a man well known in this county. He was a citizen of much influence, a merchant

Oscar M. Hampton was educated in the public schools and at the Greeneville-Tusculum College, Tennessee, and at the Richmond Business College. He became connected with the Bank of Waynesville, where he served for two years and later was cashier of the Champion Bank and Trust Company. He was also in the mercantile business in Canton with his brother, Charles V.

In 1927, he was appointed by the Legislature of North Carolina to membership on the Board of County Commissioners and served two years, retiring at the end of his term.

THE UNDERWOODS. Fielding Underwood and his wife, Elizabeth Land Underwood, were the first of the name to come to Haywood County. They came about 1820 from Towns County, Georgia, and settled in what has since been called East Waynesville.

Six children were reared, as follows: Jasper, who returned to Towns County, Georgia, where he lived and died; D. Melvin married Mahala Hood; Elijah married Sallie Bryson; Nancy married George Yarboro; Polly married Richard Robinson; and Madely married Alonzo Allen.

D. Melvin Underwood and Mahala Hood Underwood reared the following children: Robert T. Underwood, who married Lou Davis; James P., who married Cenie Bramlett; Martha, who married James Williams; Elizabeth, who married Marion Davis; Samuel Leonidas, who married Rachel Lucinda Roberts; Matthew Hale, who married Sallie Gaddy; and William Pinkney, who married Laura Gaddy.

Elijah Underwood and Sallie Bryson Underwood reared two children, James and Melvin, both of whom left the county. James settled in Jackson County, North Carolina, and Melvin located in Georgia.

James P. Underwood and Genie Bramlett reared a family of three boys, as follows: Robert L., John C., and Edward. Samuel Leonidas Underwood and Rachel Lucinda Roberts Underwood reared four children, as follows: William, Annie, who married H. C. Robinson; Margaret,

who married first J. H. Lilly, and second William Bramlett; and David, who married Clara Corder.

Robert T. Underwood and Lou Davis reared a large family, as follows: Lillie, who married John Armstrong; James Pinkney, who married Della Rose and lives in Memphis, Tennessee; Mary, who became Mrs. Edward Lanier; Mahala, who became the wife of Dr. J. M. Parker, of Asheville; Thomas W., who married Ella Holcombe; Iola, who married Byron Reeves; Fannie Lou, who married Stralie Jones; Arch, who married Hazel Graham; Robert, who married Bertha Graham; Lucius, who lives in Boston; Beatrice, who became Mrs. Joseph Hawkins; Inez, who married Doc Foster; and Allene, who became Mrs. Thomas Pascal. Ross lives in Asheville.

Matthew Hale Underwood and Sallie Gaddy Underwood reared a family of seven children, as follows: Almeda married Nathan West, Pinkney married Annie Underwood, Joseph died before reaching maturity, Cleveland moved to Tennessee, Rufus married Myrtle Phillips, Ellis married Evelyn Curtis, and Maggie.

William Pinkney Underwood and Laura Gaddy Underwood reared a family of five daughters and two sons, as follows: Annie married Pinkney Underwood, Martha married Fred Medford, Fannie married Ray Francis, Lizzie married Elmer Palmer; and Johnson, Fred, and Lula.

THE THOMAS FAMILY. More than a century and a quarter ago, a young couple, who had married a short time before in Virginia, came to the fertile and scenically beautiful Pigeon valley in what is now Haywood County. There they purchased lands and began the building of a home for themselves. They lived together in that new country for about two years when their brief union was tragically broken by the drowning in Pigeon river of the young husband.

The actors in this tragic drama were Richard Thomas, who was born in Virginia, and Temperance Calvert, a descendant of one of the brothers of Lord Baltimore who had settled the Maryland colony in 1634. Only a few



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
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

WIENEAS I Elisha Yarbrough of the County of Hanover and State of Virginia now aged seventy five years having been a souldier of the Revolutionary War did on the twenty fourth day of October last make my Declaration in Hanover County Count in order to entitle myself to the pension allowed by the provisions of the act of Congress of the United States passed on the seventh day of June last and finding from my age and infirmities that I cannot attend in person to receive the gratuity which either the gratitude or benevolence of my Country as accorded me, I the said Elisha Yarbrough for and in consideration of the premises and for other good causes and considerations me thereunto mooving have made, ordained, nominated. constituted and appointed and by these presents to make, ordain, nominate, constitute and appoint my friend Hubert Allinbocac of the City of Richmond and State of Virginia my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name and to my use and benefit to receive of and from every person or persons who are authorized to pay the same all and every sum or sums of money which I now am or hereafter shall be entitled to receive by operation of my Declaration aforesaid and under the provisions of the act of Congress aforesaid and on receiving such sum or sums of money for re and in my name, good and sufficient receipts or acquittances or other discharges to make, execute and deliver and generally to do and perform all and every other act or acts, thing or things concerning the premises which I might or could do were I personally present at the doing thereof hereby ratifying and confirming and by these presents allowing whatever my said attorney may lawfully do or cause to be done in my name touching the premises I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this 28th day of November 1832.

AFFIDAVIT OF ELISHA YARBROUGH

Personally appeared before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace for the City of Richmond Elisha Yarbrough who being duly sworn deposes and saith that by reason of old age and the consequent loss of Memory he cannot answer positively as to the precise length of his services but according to the best of his recollection he served not less than the periods mentioned below as a private during the war of the Revolution and was in the following services. That in April of 1781 two companies of the Militia of Caroline County, the one commanded by Captain Anthony New and the other by Capth Jameson whose first name is not recollected, met at the place called White Chimneys in said county, Captn Presley Thornton who was a recruiting officer in the regular service either in the Continental or State service he does not recollect which, was there and this Afficiant enlisted under him and with his consent on the same day agreed to march with the aforesaid militia companies as a substitute for one Watthew Petros, Captain Thornton giving him orders to return to him as soon æ he has performed his tour of militia service. The next day this affiant marched for Richmond under the command of Capth Anthony New and when he arrived there his company was attached to the regiment commanded by Capth Matthews called the fifth as well as he recollects. From Richmond he went to the City of Williamsburg and was quartered in the old magazine in that place for some days he was then marched up the James River to Richmond and when he got there the enemy were on the opposite side of the river burning the tobacco in the town of Manchester - He recollects distinctly that our troops fired some cannon at them, his brother Joel Yarbrough who died about three years ago being one of the artillery — Leing taken sick at Richword he went home on furlouse his term of service in this expedition being two months, the whole of which time time (sic) he was in active service except the few days that he was at home on furlough as aforesaid. Immediately after the two months were out he went to Capth Thorntons rendezvous at the brick Church in Caroline County and remained there till the news of peace came to them when he was discharged in July 1782 or 1783 as he has said in his declaration made in Hanover County Court on the 2nd day of October. After the most careful reflection on the subject as far as his memory serves he feels positive that his service in the Militia and under the command of Capta Thornton as aforesaid was not less than fifteen months and for which service he claims a pension. It is out of the power of this affiant to obtain any other witnesses as to his said enlistment and services except Thomas Tiller whose affidavit is attached to this said Declaration made in Hanover County Court they being all dead or moved away.

Given from & under my hand at the City of Richmond in the State of Virginia this 25th day of June 1833.

New Poquoson's name was changed in 1692 to Charles Parish.

York Parish—there is no record establishing a parish, but it had an inducted minister in 1638.

Chiskiack Parish was established in 1640 and its name was changed to Hampton Parish in 1643.


Marston Parish, including the upper part of York County, was created a parish in 1654.

Middle Plantation combined with Harrop Parish in James City County to form Middletown Parish. In 1674 Middletown and Marston Parishes were united to form the present Bruton Parish. In 1706 York and Hampton Parishes were combined into Yorkhampton Parish, with which Martin's Hundred Parish, in James City County, was united in 1712.

The Colony was growing and the population was pressing northward and northwestward, and settlements were being established on the north side of the York River. From York County came first Gloucester County in 1651, in which county we find Abingdon, Petsworth, Ware, and Kingston Parishes. The latter parish was to become the parish in Mathews County in 1791.

In the same year the northern part of York County was taken to form the southern portion of Lancaster County along the south side of the Rappahannock River.

Since that portion of Lancaster County lying south of the Rappahannock River was taken from York County in 1651, we will first follow the creation of the parishes along the southern

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

Thomas J. Yarbrough was listed on Henrico tax lists and Census records as a farmer. **He served as Constable for District #1 of Henrico County continuously from July 1, 1860 to June 30, 1864. He served as Justice of the Peace from August 1,1864 until the fall of the Confederacy on April 2, 1865.

In 1863 two Henrico Justices went to see Governor John Letcher and

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informed him that Thomas J. Yarbrough, one of only two constables in Henrico, had been conscripted by Confederate authorities, greatly to the injury of police regulations of the county, and requested him to

use his authority to have Yarbrough discharged.

Thomas J. Yarbrough had a store in the county and on Thursday, October 6, 1864 he asked permission from Henrico County for his 'merchant license" to include selling of retail wine, ardent spirits or a mixture thereof. The court certified that he was a person of good character and saw no objection to such permission being granted.

Mary Ann Thomas Salmon Yarbrough was the daughter of Thomas Salmon and Sarah B. Smith Salmon, who were married January 5, 1821. (Thomas Salmon had previously been married to Elizabeth Sharp on December 3, 1811). Both marriages took place in Henrico County. Thomas Salmon died in 1827 and his wife Sarah was pregnant when he died. She was apparently pregnant with Mary Ann Thomas Salmon, as Mary Ann was born in 1828.

By 1813 Thomas Salmon had bought 56 acres near New Market; however by 1814 he had disposed of this 56 acres.

Thomas Salmon was a son of George Salmon. George Salmon married Mary Throgmorton of Henrico County on December 12, 1786. (She was the daughter of Richard Throgmorton who lived in the Varina-New Market area).***

George Salmon first appeared on Henrico Tax Lists in 1789.

February 14, 1798 he had purchased 50 acres on north side of Kingsland Road from Mary and Robert Cary Pleasants. At the same time he purchased 5 acres from them that was on the south side of Kingsland Road.

On March 21, 1798 he purchased an additional 51½ acres adjoining the 5 purchased earlier. This 51½ acres was purchased from property "devised to Mary by her brother Jonathan Pleasants". This brought his total acreage on the south side of Kingsland Road to 56½ acres. In 1800 he was taxed as sole owner of 55 acres and taxed for 51½ acres which he then owned jointly with Josiah Throgmorton***.

In 1804 George Salmon was credited with only 55 acres and Josiah Throgmorton was credited with the 51½ acres previously owned jointly by Throgmorton and Salmon. 50 of these acres were on the north side of Kingsland Road and 1½ acres were on the south side.

The Throgmortons mentioned here may have been ancestors of Emma Frances Johnson who married James Elisha Yarbrough, as her mother was a ''Throckmorton'' from that same area.

Josiah Throgmorton mentioned above operated the Deep Bottom Ferry. He died in 1813.

May 1814 George Salmon acquired 25 acres from Elizabeth Powell, this being part of what he had conveyed to Josiah Throgmorton earlier. In 1816 he conveyed the 55 acres on the south side of Kingsland Road to his son Thomas Salmon. George Salmon died about 1819. At his death the 25 acres on north side of Kingsland Road passed to Thomas Salmon. Thomas Salmon built a new house on this 25 acre tract in 1820 or 1821, about the time he married Sarah Smith. In 1826 he acquired 25 acres on the north side of Kingsland Road adjoining the 25 acres on which he had built his house. After Thomas Salmon died in 1827 it appears that his son George (George was by his previous marriage) moved in with Thomas' wife and baby.

George Salmon's house was on the south side of Kingsland Road on the 55 acre tract. However, this house was abandoned (either demolished or used as slave quarters) after Thomas Salmon built his new house on the north side of the road.

On May 6, 1852, Thomas J. Yarbrough purchased from the estate of Thomas Salmon the land on both sides of Kingsland Road. It was recorded as 110 acres, for which he paid a total of \$332.67 to William and George Salmon, heirs of Thomas Salmon. Thus the first residence of the Yarbroughs in this area was the house on north side of Kingsland Road – the house built in 1820 or 1821 by Thomas Salmon, father of Mary Ann Thomas Salmon Yarbrough.

That Yarbrough house was destroyed by Union troops in 1864 during the Civil War. Tax records do not indicate where the Thomas J. Yarbrough family lived after their home was destroyed, but speculate that they lived in a shack or cabin on the south side of the road. Thomas J. Yarbrough built a new house on the south side of Kingsland Road in 1870 or 1871.

Thomas J. Yarbrough died March 31, 1893, Mary Ann Thomas Salmon Yarbrough died five years later, on August 14, 1898. She left the house and 8 acres of land, one calf, all her poultry, a feather bed and stead, complete with pillows and quilts, to her youngest son, James Elisha Yarbrough. The remainder of her land and estate she bequeathed equally to sons Thomas H. and George W, daughters Florence Gathright and Rebecca Whitlock, and granddaughter, Mary B. Fussell.

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When the tax assessment was made in 1900, <u>James Elisha Yarbrough</u> was living on $56\frac{1}{2}$ acres on Kingsland Road, including the 8 acres inherited from his mother, this property being on the south side of the road. It was listed as being twelve miles from the County Courthouse.

This property including Yarbrough House fronted Kingsland Road on the south side. It extended from Deep Bottom Road to what is now known as WRVA Road, with a small parcel being on the east side of Deep Bottom Road. This small parcel on east side of Deep Bottom Road was sold to William Johnson probably about 1925 to 1930. Perhaps about this same time three acres on the corner of Kingsland Road and WRVA Road was deeded to James Elisha Yarbrough's son, James. In the early 1940's eight acres adjoining the parcel deeded to son James and facing on Kingsland Road was sold to Melvin McCabe. In 1946 James Elisha Yarbrough died.

In 1948 Emma Frances Johnson Yarbrough died and the remaining property passed to her two youngest sons, William Wilson and Joseph Waverly Yarbrough. Shortly thereafter they divided the property, Wilson owning a parcel adjoining the parcel previously deeded to McCabe and Waverly owning a parcel containing Yarbrough House and adjoining Wilson's parcel. The remaining parcel, on the corner of Kingsland Road and Deep Bottom Road, was owned jointly by them. In the 1970's Waverly sold the parcel containing Yarbrough House to Calvin Arnold.

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Late in the 1970's the property owned by William Wilson Yarbrough and the parcel he owned jointly with Joseph Waverly Yarbrough were acquired by Henrico County for construction of the Henrico Regional Wastewater Treatment System. Henrico County also acquired the parcels which had previously been deeded to James Yarbrough, Melvin McCabe and Calvin Arnold. (Some of these properties had been sold to others after their original purchase from the Yarbroughs).

Yarbrough House was demolished in 1979 or 1980 in preparation for the construction of the wastewater treatment facility.

Thus came the end of ownership of property which had been in the family since 1798, when it was purchased by George Salmon, great-great-grand-father of William Wilson Yarbrough and Joseph Waverly Yarbrough, who were the last owners prior to acquisition by Henrico County.

The 1860 Census in Henrico County listed an elderly man, ELISHA YARBROUGH, as residing with Thomas J. Yarbrough. It was speculated that perhaps he was the father of Thomas J. Yarbrough. However, Henrico County had no records for Elisha Yarbrough for years prior to 1860, but Hanover County records did list an Elisha Yarbrough. Perhaps earlier years about the Yarbroughs could be traced through Hanover County records.

Some records show Yarbrough spelled "Yarborough"; an even earlier spelling may have been Yarborow.

"Men of Matadequin", a publication by June Banks Evans, relates to early households in the lower end of Hanover County southeast of Matadequin Creek along the New Kent County line. The following appears in that publication:

A report made to the Virginia House of Burgess in 1699 indicates that eight English settlers, including RICHARD YARBOROW, received parcels of land from the Pamunkey Indians. This land appears to have been leased from the Indians for 99 years, with "priority and first grant thereof when the land came into the hands of the King of England".

In 1727 WILLIAM and CHARLES YARBROUGH had land near Polecat Swamp, St. Margaret's Parish, King William County. The article states that this is an area directly across the Pamunkey River from present day New Kent County.

Reference made in the publication indicates that Hanover County was formerly an upper portion of New Kent County.

"My grandfather Yarbrough had a brother, James E. who managed on his own a music store in Norfolk, and two sisters, Unity who married a James in Hanover Co. and Margaret who married Miles Gathright.

William J. Yarbrough was my grandfather's first cousin. He married his cousin, Ophelia Garthright, and they became the parents of Ophelia Garthright Yarbrough who married George G. Minor. So this Mrs. Minor was my grandfather's cousin on her father's side and her niece on her mother's side.

Margaret (Yarbrough) and Miles Garthright had a very large family, and my grandfather's son, my Uncle George Yarbrough, married one of them - his first cousin, Mollie Garthright. Another daughter of Margaret and Miles Garthright was married to a Ratcliffe, and they became the parents of Alice (who taught school in Richmond for a lifetime) and Harold A. Ratcliffe who was Commonwealths Attorney for Henrico, and others including the florist, I think. They were the progenitors of a large number of today's Ratcliffes. Alice and Harold were therefore my mother's first cousins, as well as cousins of Mrs. Minor, one of whose children was Mrs. Hill Montague, Jr.

I talked with Miss Alice Ratcliffe at one time and she - or someone - told me that one of the Larus brothers probably has the Yarbrough family history though what his connection is with the family I do not know. These are all distant relatives - yours and mine, and while, as in most families, there may be a black sheep or two, there are so many prominent people in our background, I think the family history should be traced and handed down thru posterity. I understand it goes back to William the Conqueror, who knighted one William J. (?) Yarbrough - and it must go back beyond that. Annie had done a lot of geneological searching, but she turned all of the material over to her daughter, Ann - the one I wanted you to see while in N.Y. and who lives at Creskill, N.J. I do know she said one of the Yarbrough forebears purchased land near Petersburg from the Indians in the early 1600s. This would be interesting work for your retirement years!

I have a lot more material here, but I don't know whether it's enough for D.A.R. membership though it would undoubtedly serve as a nucleus. Mother"

WHEREAS I Elisha Yarbrough of the County of Hanover and Stategof Virginia now aged seventy five years having been a souldier of the Revolutionary War did on the twenty fourth day of October last make my Declaration in Hanover County Court in order to entitle myself to the pension allowed by the provisions of the act of Congress of the United States passed on the seventh day of June last and finding from my age and infirmities that I cannot attend in person to receive the gratuity which either the gratitude or benevolence of my Country as accorded me, I the said Elisha Yarbrough for and in consideration of the premises and for other good causes and considerations me thereunte mooving have made, ordained, nominated, constituted and appointed and by these presents to make, ordain, nominate. constitute and appoint my friend Hubert Allinbocac of the City of Richmond and State of Virginia my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name and to my use and benefit to receive of and from every person or persons who are authorized to pay the same all and every sum or sums of money which I now am or hereafter shall be entitled to receive by operation of my Declaration aforesaid and under the provisions of the act of Congress aforesaid and on receiving such sum or sums of money for me and in my name, good and sufficient receipts or acquittances or other discharges to make, execute and deliver and generally to do and perform all and every other act or acts, thing or things concerning the premises which I might or could do were I personally present at the doing thereof hereby ratifying and confirming and by these presents allowing whatever my said attorney may lawfully do or cause to be done in my name touching the premises I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this 28th day of November 1832.

AFFIDAVIT OF ELISHA YARBROUGH

Personally appeared before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace for the City of Richmond Elisha Yarbrough who being duly sworn deposes and saith that by reason of old age and the consequent loss of Memory he cannot answer positively as to the precise length of his services but according to the best of his recollection he served not less than the periods mentioned below as a private during the War of the Revolution and was in the following services That in April of 1781 two companies of the Militia of Caroline County, the one commanded by Captain Anthony New and the other by Captn Jameson whose first name is not recollected, met at the place called White Chimneys in said county, Captn Presley Thornton who was a recruiting officer in the regular service either in the Continental or State service he does not recollect which, was there and this Affiant enlisted under him and with his consent on the same day agreed to march with the aforesaid militia companies as a substitute for one Matthew Petros, Captain Thornton giving him orders to return to him as soon as he has performed his tour of militia service. The next day this affiant marched for Richmond under the command of Captn Anthony New and when he arrived there his company was attached to the regiment commanded by Captn Matthews called the fifth as well as he recollects. From Richmond he went to the City of Williamsburg and was quartered in the old magazine in that place for some days he was then marched up the James River to Richmond and when he got there the enemy were on the opposite side of the river burning the tobacco in the town of Manchester --- He recollects distinctly that our troops fired some cannon at them, his brother Joel Yarbrough who died about three years ago being one of the artillery -- Being taken sick at Richmond he went home on furlough his term of service in this expedition being two months, the whole of which time time (sic) he was in active service except the few days that he was at home on furlough as aforesaid. Immediately after the two months were out he went to Captn Thorntons rendezvous at the brick Church in Caroline County and remained there till the news of peace came to them when he was discharged in July 1782 or 1783 as he has said in his declaration made in Hanover County Court on the 2nd day of October. After the most careful reflection on the subject as far as his memory serves he feels positive that his service in the Militia and under the command of Captn Thornton as aforesaid was not less than fifteen months and for which service he claims a pension. It is out of the power of this affiant to obtain any other witnesses as to his said enlistment and services except Thomas Tiller whose affidavit is attached to this said Declaration made in Hanover County Court they being all dead or moved away.

PIONEER MINISTER DIES SUDDENLY

Rev. John Pinkney Yarboro, a resident of this city for the past three years and of this vicinity for 22 years, passed away very suddenly about 4:30 p. m. last Friday, death having resulted from a heart attack. (Friday, Dec. 3, 1926.)

Mr. Yarboro had been preparing his sermon from Nehemiah 2:17-20 for the services at Agate the following Sunday and life left him when Mrs. Yarboro reached his side a few seconds later. Up until his death, Mr. Yarboro was in good health and his death is a great shock to his family and friends.

John Pinkney Yarboro was born in Waynesville, N. C. November 5, 1852. He grew to manhood in Waynesville and October 15, 1874, he was married to Margaret Kilbie. They came west with their family in 1904, where Mr. Yarboro continued active work as a Baptist minister in the various churches of that denomination - - - (two or three illegible words.)

Two years ago Mr. and Mrs. Yarboro celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. Seven children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Yarboro, two of whom have passed beyond, an infant and a son, Samuel. Besides the grief stricken widow the surviving children are Mrs. B. M. Brown, Sylva; N. C.; Mrs. Carl Miller, Waynesville, N. C; Marion Yarboro, Olympia; Mrs. Addie Aldrich, Roseburg, (Oregon) Mrs. Margaret Sweaney, Winlock; and Mrs. Ed Boardman, Hoquiam(Wash.).

Funeral services were held in the Baptist church at Winlock Sunday afternoon with Rev. Godwin officiating. Burial was made in the Winlock Cemetery. A large number of friends were in attendance at the funeral. Mrs. Yarboro will make her home with her children.

(The other local paper, The Chehalis Bee-Nugget, gave much the same information, with these differences: Margaret M. Kilby, Sweeney, and two more ministers: Rev. A. J. Pierce, Winlock, and Rev. J. Thos. Cowley of Napavine.



Deed of Gift from Elisha Yarbrough to his three infant children "in consideration of the natural love and affection": Thomas J. Yarbrough, Margaret E. Yarbrough and Unity H. Yarbrough. Dated October 1, 1826. Acknowledged in court by maker, Elisha Yarbrough, Jr. 24 Feb 1827. Hanover Co., Va.

Elisha Yarbrough, Jr. must have died by 23 July 1828 as Joseph Hooper qualified as their Guardian on that date.

In his deed of gift, Elisha Yarbrough, Jr. mentions his reversionary right title and interest in the Estateof Edmund Hooper, dee'd which he also gave his three children. Some research will probably show that Elisha married the daughter of this Edmund Hooper — or that his wife's maiden name was Hooper — Edmund Hooper could have been the wife's brother.

By 1856 Margaret E. Yarbrough was married to Miles Gathright and Unity H. Yarbrough was married to Thomas C. Jones.

There seems to be a third Elisha Y. Elisha Yarbrough Sr. was a Revoluctionary War Solider as is proven by his affidavit for pension. His obituary appears in the RICHMOND WHIG in 1835. Elisha Yarbrough, Jr. was apparently dead by 1828 when Joseph Hooper qualified as their Guardian. On the 1850 census Index is another Elisha Yarbrough.

WILL OF HENRY YARBROUGH³

In the Name of God Amen. I Henry Yarbrough of the County of Caroline and Saint Maryes Parrish being of sound and perfect mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of life do make this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following to wit. First my Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid. Secondly I lend to my loving wife Sarah Yarbrough during her natural life the following slaves viz. Bob, John, Frank, Rachel, Clary and their Increase, also all my stock of Horses Cattle Sheep and Hogs Together with my household and kitchen furniture, and Plantation utensils of every kind and at the death of my said wife I desire that part of my estate lent her be equally divided among my children here named Viz, Ann Susanna, William Jeremiah, Jane, Mildred and Sarah to them and their heirs forever- 3rdly I lend to my loving wife Sarah Yarbrough the land and plantation I now live on during her natural life and at her death I give the said land and plantation to my son Jeremiah to him and his heirs for[ever] on condition that he pay his brother William one half the valuation thereof to be ascertained by two disinterested persons either at the death of my wife or when he shall attain to twenty one years of age. 4thly I give to my daughter Ann Yarbrough one Negro named Gilbert to her and her heirs forever. 5thly I give to my Daughter Susanna Yarbrough one negroe named Phillis to her and her heirs forever and her increase. 6thly I give to my daughter Jane Yarbrough one negroe named Fanney and her increse to her and her heirs forever. 7thly I give to my daughter Mildred Yarbrough one Negroe named Armistead to her and her heirs forever. 8thly I give to my Daughter Sarah Yarbrough one Negroe named George to her and her heirs forever. 9thly I give to my son William Yarbrough one negroe named Sampson to him and his heirs forever. 10thly I give to my son Jeremiah Yarbrough one Negroe named Harry to him and his heirs forever. 11thly my will and desire is that if any of my children should die before they come of lawful age or marry that their part or parts of my estate given them be equally divided amongst the survivors and their heirs forever. 12thly all the remainder of my estate not heretofore given away I desire may be equally divided amongst all my children before mentioned and their heirs forever. 13thly and lastly I do appoint my loving wife my executrix and friend John Chiles Executor of this my last will and testament and do utterly revoke and disannul all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made and this and no others to be taken for my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of April 1784.

Dear Barbara:

I laughed out loud when I read your letter and you asked if I remembered when "all I wanted was to find the father of my William T." It reminded me of someone I knew ... a bright-eyed 20 year old who decided she could write her family history in three months. Twenty years later I am still digging.

Another of those coincidences? Last weekend I was transcribing some Revolutionary War pension records I just received on Elisha Yarbrough of Hanover County. At the time I wondered if this might be part of your line and had planned to send you copies when I finished. I was wishing I had some of the Hanover County census records and ... here came your letter with the census records and questions about Elisha.

As you can see, I am enclosing a hodge-podge of records and, after you glance through them, you may strike me off your mailing list forever. After pulling the enclosed records together, it seems to me that Elisha Sr. has to be the father of your Thomas. However, after looking at all these things, I ended up with a lot of questions.

Looking at the 1810 Census record you send - I think this would have to be Elisha Y. Sr. Elisha Jr. was 57 on the 1850 census which made his year of birth about 1792-3. He would have been about 18 years of age in 1810, a little too young to have had 4 sons and a daughter. However, he is probably one of the sons age 16-26.

This brings up the next question. Looking at the index for the 1830 census (I don't have the census record -- just the index), William, Elisha, Jesse G. and Thomas Y seem to be living very near each other. William is shown on page 211 while Elisha and Thomas are on pages 212 of the census. Jesse couldn't have lived far from them as he is shown listed on page 209. I am guessing that William is probably a son of Elisha Sr. If that works out, then the four sons shown on the 1810 census would be William, Elisha Jr., Jesse G. and Thomas. Who was the daughter?

On the 1820 census, the youngest son and the daughter seem to still be living at home. As to where the other three sons are in 1820 ... if they were living and working in another home, they could easily be listed under another head of household simply as males 26-45. Or, they could be heads of households in another county. As Elisha came from Caroline County, maybe he still held land or property there and the sons were in Caroline County. As Elisha was a Rev. Soldier, I wondered if his sons might have joined the service. They would have all been the right age to have been in the war of 1812.

In checking my military records for the War of 1812, I found an Elisha, Jesse and Thomas, all privates, in the same Virginia Militia regiment. I've listed these on a separate page. You may want to order the records for these three as if any of them applied for a pension, their affidavits may give you the proof you need that they were the sons of Elisha Y. Sr.

Still another question. In 1826 Elisha Yarbrough Jr. made a deed of gift of all his personal property to his three minor children. The gift included his reversionary rights in the Estate of Edmund Hooper. Then in July 1828, Joseph Hooper qualified as the guardian to these three children. They had to have been minors if a guardian was appointed.

I had assumed that Elisha Jr. had died ... the usual reason for a guardian being appointed. Yet, when you sent the 1850 census, there is Elisha Jr. living in the home of his daughter. So, why dip he give all his person property to his children in 1826 and why was a guardian appointed for them in 1828?

If he had been ill, it seems like he would have prepared a will rather than a deed of gift. I wondered if maybe his wife died about 1826 and Elisha gave the raising of his children to someone because he couldn't do it ... and maybe gave whoever was raising them everything he owned for their care.

He mentioned his reversionary rights to the estate of Edmund Hooper. Was Elisha's wife the daughter of Edmund Hooper? Who was the Joseph Hooper who was appointed their guardian? It might be worthwhile to find the estate records of Edmund Hooper and see who he named.

Or, could there have been a divorce and Elisha was providing for his children under a court order?

This is the first time I've seen a gift of all the personal property to minor children and I can't help but wonder why he made it.

I wonder if there are any estate papers for Elisha Y. Sr. If there are, I don't have them. According to the obituary in The Richmond Whig, Elisha Y. Sr. died in January 1835. I don't have a copy of the obituary ... just an abstract. I wonder if the obituary gives any more information?

My records for Hanover County after 1800 are very sketchy. Elisha Sr. applied for his pension in 1832. The pensions were given to the elderly and destitute people first. Elisha may have given away his property in the years before he applied for the pension in order to be eligible. There could be some deeds of gift from him to his children in the years prior to this.

I wonder what the G in Jesse G.'s name stands for. There are records of Thomas Griggs Y. being in Caroline County in the 1730's and 1740's.

Another thing that puzzled me ... why was the will of Jonathan Y. who died in 1811 in Anson County, NC recorded in Hanover County? Apparently Jonathan had other children, but William is the only one named in his will. I wonder if his other children might have been in Hanover County? If so, this is a new "discovery."

I have started some family groupsheets on this family and am enclosing them. If you can add to them, please do so. It looks like we need to really search the records of Hanover County from 1800 to 1900. And, you are now back to the Caroline County Y's who link up to the Amelia County Y's.

You mentioned that Jesse Y. was shown on the 1850 census and was in the same age group as Thomas and Elisha. He died in 1758 ... his will listed only a wife, Anne, son William N. Yarbrough, Grandson Jesse G. Yarbrough, daughter Mary C. Bradley (she m. Robert A. Bradley) and a daughter in law Harriet J. Yarbrough. Does the census show any other children? What other Y's are on the 1850 census?

In my groupsheets, I had a record for a Joel Yarbrough that I copied from a DAR abstract. Mrs. Watson gave his birth as about 1742. On an abstracted list of pension records, I have his age as 71 in 1819 which would make his birth about 1748. Ms. Watson lists his birthplace as Caroline County, Virginia. I wonder if this Joel could be the brother that Elisha mentions in his affidavit?

Also in the Rev. War from the Caroline Co. area were James, Jeremiah and Charles Y. If these Y's are related, I don't have the records to prove it. I am getting the urge to go to the National Archives and do some digging in the pension affidavits!

I have hurriedly pulled these records togther and have not had the time to really study or digest them. After you look them over, let me know what you think. Keep me posted and I'll send along anything else I find that may hold a clue.

Don't you love this ... for every "answer" a dozen questions crop up!

ELISHA YARBROUGH, SR.

From the Pension Affidavit of Elisha Yarbrough, we know he was born in Caroline County, Virginia 14 February 1758. He also had a brother named Joel Yarbrough. Elisha moved from Caroline County, Virginia to Hanover County, Virginia the first of December 1800.

Some Yarbroughs in the Caroline County records in the time frame of Elisha's birth:

- 26 Aug. Lazarus Yarborough a witness in the trial of "James, the prisoner" (no last name given and it is assumed James was probably a slave).
- 1748/49 Charles Yarbrough and others to view out a convenient way for a road to go over Richard Murry's mill dam.
- William Yarbrough sued David Griffin. (This is William Yarbrough who married Dianna Smith. We have a list of their children and Elisha was not one of their children).
- 1749 William Gray sued Lazarus Yarbrough.
- John Townsend sued Lazarus Yarborough.
- 1750 Charles Yarborough named as one of the appraisers of the Estate of John Owin.
- 1750

 14 Dec. On motion of William Weller by Barthomew Durrett his guardian and by consent of Richard Yarborough who married the widow of William Weller (Sarah Weller), it is ordered William Tyler, Chr. Thompkins, Jos. Stevens and Daniel Tompkins set apart Weller's estate between his widow and child and lay off the widow's dower in the land. (name is shown in other records as Waller)

Jeremiah Y. was shown in Henry Y's 1784 will to have been a son. Could the 1755 Jeremiah Y. have been a father of Henry? If the daughters of Henry married at an average age of 20, then Ann was b. ca 1776; Jane ca 1777 and Sally ca 1782. Elisha Y. Sr. was b. 1758 - a generation older than these daughters. It would put him in the age group to have been a brother of Henry, or perhaps a cousin, but probably makes him too old to have been a son of Henry.

Both Ellerson Station and the old Ellerson Post Office were named for the Ellerson family. Andrew R. Ellerson was the son of Dr. John H. Ellerson and his wife, Laura. Andrew was born about 1845 and married Rebecca Storrs whose family once owned Meadowbridge located near by. Dr. John H. Ellerson, his father, lived at Laurel Springs located on Cold Harbor Road near Mechanicsville and owned Ellerson's Mill on Beaverdam Creek, the site of the bloody battle by that name, and it was here that Andrew Ellerson grew up.

There have been many owners of Fountain Inn since the Ellerson's ownership. George F. Carneal and his wife, Maybell Carneal, purchased the house tract which was a part of a larger tract around 1915 and made it their home for many years: until 1973 when their granddaughter, Dorothea (Carneal) Stephens and her husband, Edward Stephens, were deeded the house tract of 6.86 acres. The Stephens are in the process of restoring and remodeling the home. What is now the front, was once the side. The present side of the house faced the old stage road.

The Garthright House

There is no authentic information as to the early construction of this old home. It was built in two sections, one of brick and one of frame. It was used for a hospital during one of the bloodiest battles of the Civil War, as it was located at, or very near, the Cold Harbor battlefield. The national cemetery is located across the road. These two landmarks are on the battlefield tour of the Civil War around Richmond. In May 1970 the house was heavily damaged by fire which originated at ground level in the back of the house and burned upward in a two foot wide area until it reached the second floor and roof. However, it was not damaged beyond repair and the National Park Service has restored the house to its original appearance.

The first known occupants of this old home were Miles Garthright and his wife, Margaret E., who were living here at the time of the Civil War. He was deceased by 1896 when deeds were given for several tracts of land "at Cold Harbor National Cemetery" to settle his estate. One tract was for 55 acres, and the other was for 120 acres, joining the lands of loseph T. Martin, south by lands of Patsy Boze and McGhee, West by William H. Grubbs. The second named tract (120 acres) included an enclosed graveyard and a "strip of 20-ft. on every side of the enclosure is reserved as a family burying ground for the use of all parties to this deed and their families." The bricked-in graveyard can still be seen today, but there are no tombstones.

This tract was deeded to Margaret E. Yarbrough and Alice F. Ratcliffe, daughters of Miles Garthright, who were to take and hold as co-partners for their portion of Miles Garthright's estate, thus becoming the next owners of this old home. Walter C. Garthright, Miles' son, received the land located on the north side of the county road (the 55 acres) joining the National Cemetery. Miles and Margaret Garthright had three children: Walter C. of Richmond: Margaret

E., wife of George Yarbrough; and Alice F., wife of Hampden F. Ratcliff.

The daughter of George and Margaret (Garthright) Yarbrough, Maggie E. McGhee and her husband, C.L. McGhee, came into possession of this old home in 1925 and in 1932 they sold the property to the Richmond Battlefield Park Corporation "... same property conveyed to Maggie E. McGhee in 1925 ... and hereby agree that the old dwelling house, now situated on the property known as the Garthright Home, and which was used as a hospital during the Civil War, will not be moved off the property, but will remain on its present site as evidenced by their accepting and recording this deed."


And thus we have this old historic home, preserved by the Richmond Battlefield Parks to visit, and which is another "monument" to all the wounded and dying men who took part in this bloody campaign of Cold Harbor.



Ginger Bread

This pre-Revolutionary War home was for many years a part of the "Old Church" tract. It is situated on one of the four corners of what was once a thriving intersection. These roads lead to Newcastle, Pamunkey River, and into King William; also to New Kent, Studley, and Hanover Courthouse. Tradition has it that this house was erected at Hanovertown, taken down, and re-erected at its present location. It is a cottage-type home, frame, with eight-inch heart pine beaded weatherboarding. The eastern chimney is five feet wide at base, beautifully constructed. The doors are of heavy heart pine and cypress, six-panel cross type with original wrought-iron locks and H and L hinges.

In 1857 Lewis Johnson purchased the "Old Church" tract and "Ginger Bread" tract, the latter consisting of 91½ acres, "transferred from Peter Crutchfield's estate." The tax list identifies the land owner, but not who lives on it, so it is not clear whether or not Peter Crutchfield lived at Ginger Bread or at the dwelling called "Old Church." He may not have lived at either location, but only owned this property, as he in-

Chiskiack Parish was established in 1640 and its name was changed to Hampton Parish in 1643.


. Marston Parish, including the upper part of York County,

Middle Plantation combined with Harrop Parish in James City County to form Middletown Parish. In 1674 Middletown and Marston Parishes were united to form the present Bruton Parish. In 1706 York and Hampton Parishes were combined into Yorkhampton Parish, with which Martin's Hundred Parish, in James City County, was united in 1712.

The Colony was growing and the population was pressing northward and northwestward, and settlements were being established on the north side of the York River. From York County came first Gloucester County in 1651, in which county we find Abingdon, Petsworth, Ware, and Kingston Parishes. The latter parish was to become the parish in Mathews County in 1791.

In the same year the northern part of York County was taken to form the southern portion of Lancaster County along the south side of the Rappahannock River.

Since that portion of Lancaster County lying south of the Rappahannock River was taken from York County in 1651, we will first follow the creation of the parishes along the southern

If the said William should die before he gets married or shall arrive to the age of twenty one or die without an heir The fifty shares or the money arrising from them shall be divided amongst my relations agreeable to law as all the rest of my estate will of course be. Sorry it has taken so long to get the pictures to you.

As I told you, I did not order the coat of arms from an advertisement, or coat of arms factory as I call them - I spent considerable time and YMM money having it thoroughly researched by authorities - it iscorrect in every detail. Recently Jane and I visited the N.C. State Archivesand examined the Yarbrough coat of arms on file there - theirs is identical to the one we have.

About Richard Yarbrough's grave stone: I have communicated with Dr. James Bailey of Blandford Church and have found him to be enthusiastic about our efforts to correct it for he is aware that the stone is now in error. Dr. Bailey secured permission for our correction of the stone from the superintendent of Blandford Cemetery and the Petersburg Dept. of Tourism. Then I asked Arlie Andrews a Petersburg stone engraver to proceed with the work - then the roof fell in. Andrews examined the fragile 278 year old sandstone marker and told Dr. Bailey that he was so afraid to work on it he would'nt touch it with a forty foot pole. Now Andrews and Dr. Bailey suggest that we purchase a new and correct stone and mount it behind the old stone. I cant buy that idea - it would detract and compete with the old stone. I suggest that we put our message on a modest bronze plaque, mount it on a granite slab, and place it flush with the ground in front of the old stone. I know Dr. Bailey will go along with this suggestion. What do you think? I would like to have your opinion.

Did I tell you that I commissioned the College of Arms to search their files and prepare a family chart of the Yarbroughs? I finally received the chart and found that the given name EDMUND appeared five times among the descendents of Eustacious de Yarburg. And according to the College of Arms Eustacious was the daddy rabbit of all us Yarbroughs (all spellings).

Edmund Yarburg, Esquire, born ca. 1545 -- married Hargaret, daughter of Sir. Vincent Grantham.

Edmund Yarburgh of Balore Hall. County York, born ca. 1571 -- married Sarah, daughter and coheir of Thomas Wormeley.

Edmund Yarburgh of Doncaster, County York, Doctor of Physics, born 1625 -- married Anne, daughter of Thomas Stanhope, County York, son of Sir. John Stanhope.

Edmund YARBROUGH, born ca. 1660. The chart does nt say who Edmund married or when he died. The chart does reveal a startling fact; Edmund and his brothers Richard and Sir Thomas were the first men of our line to

spell the name YARBROUGH. One nephew, Thomas Yarbrough continued with the new spelling, others held to the Yarburgh spelling. I have strong reasons to believe that this Richard Yarbrough (Edmund's brother) was the Richard who came to the Virginia Colony and was buried on Well's Hill at Blandford.

YORK COUNTY

First named Charles River, York County was one of Virginia's eight original shires formed in 1634. The present name was given in 1643, probably in honor of James, duke of York, second son of King Charles I. The county seat is Yorktown.




BRUTON PARISH POORHOUSE ARCHAEOLOGI-CAL SITE, Williamsburg vicinity. This archaeological site consists of the remains of an 18th-century workhouse for the poor built by Bruton Parish Church of Williamsburg. A 1735 act of the General Assembly empowered all of the colony's parishes to erect poorhouses; the Bruton Parish poorhouse is one of the few known to have been built. A survey of the site, conducted by the Virginia Division of Historic Landmarks in 1978, located the foundations of one of the four buildings identified by the French cartographer Desandrouin in 1781-82 as the poorhouse complex. Shown is a sampling of the variety of 18th-century artifacts associated with daily life found in the surface investigation. A full-scale scientific investigation of the site could produce unique data about the architecture of the complex as well as the lives of a predominately inarticulate portion of the colonial population. Archaeological research also could provide new insights into the Virginia government's first attempt to provide institutional care for the colony's poor, who by the mid-18th century constituted a significant social problem. 99-70 (11/18/80).

BRYAN MANOR ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE, Williamsburg vicinity. Frederick Bryan, deputy sheriff of York County, purchased a 500-acre plantation near Wiliamsburg in 1757 from John Fergason and Lewis Hansford and established his residence here. According to the Desandrouin map of 1781-82, the plantation complex then consisted of five buildings. Bryan had other landholdings and received considerable income from the sale of tobacco, pork, veal, and other products produced on his properties. Preserved in the York County records is a highly detailed househould inventory made at Bryan's death in 1771, documentation which would be interesting to compare with artifactual findings. A 1976 survey of the house site revealed an unusual footing made of sections of bog iron bonded together with shell mortar. Also at the site is a stone slab over the grave of Bryan's one-year-old son, John, who died in 1760. 99-65 (6/21/77).

GOOCH TOMB AND YORK VILLAGE ARCHAEO-LOGICAL SITE, U.S. Coast Guard Reserve Training Center, Yorktown vicinity. The village of York, the first English settlement on the York River, was established on an elevated point near the west branch of Wormeley Creek before 1635 and remained the area's principal community until the 4690s when the present community of Yorktown was established two miles west. A church was built at York ca. 1638 and within its walls in 1655 was buried Maj. William Gooch, a burgess from York County and uncle of Sir William Gooch, acting governor of the colony from 1727 to 1749. Gooch's armorial slab is the second oldest legible tombstone in Virginia. The village and the church were abandoned in the 18th century, and the village buildings fell into ruin. The church site is marked by a small park maintained by the U.S. Coast Guard with the tombstone protected by a special cover. The village site remains undisturbed and no doubt holds artifacts and architectural remains of a village dating from the first period of America's European settlement. 99–60 (10/16/73).


GRACE CHURCH, Yorktown. Grace Church, originally known as York-Hampton Parish Church, was built ca. 1697. It seems to be the state's only remaining colonial structure built of marl, a soft material composed largely of shell matter which hardens almost to stone when exposed to air. The marl was taken directly from the Yorktown cliffs. The tenacity of these walls is remarkable given the church's history. The building was used as a magazine by Lord Cornwallis during the Revolution and lost its windows and pews. It was accidentally burned in 1814 and stood as a ruin until rebuilt in 1848. Further damage was done in the Civil War when Union troops put a signal tower on the roof and used the interior for a hospital. The church was returned to service in 1870 and received a thorough renovation in 1926 when the belfry, western door frame, and circular window were added. In its churchyard is the magnificent 1745 English table tomb of Thomas Nelson, as well as the grave of his grandson. Thomas Nelson, Jr., a signer of the Declaration of Independence. 99–10 (6/2/70).














KISKIACK, Yorktown Naval Weapons Station, Yorktown vicinity Named for a local Indian tribe, Kiskiack is an important example of Virginia's early vernacular architecture, one of the state's oldest illustrations of the regularity that was to become a hallmark of 18th-century colonial design. Although claims have been made for a 17th-century construction date, the house more likely was built in the early decades of the succeeding century as the home of William Lee, who owned the property from 1696 to 1728. Lee was the grandson of the immigrant Henry Lee who patented the land in 1641. Of the original fabric, only the Flemish bond brick walls and the T-shaped interior end chimneys remain. All wood members were destroyed by fire in 1915. Rebuilt within the walls, the house remained in the ownership of the Lees until 1918 when the property was acquired by the U.S. Navy for a high-security military installation, off-limits to the public. The house has been sealed up by the navy for long-term preservation. 99-12 (9/9/69).

PORTO BELLO, Camp Peary, Williamsburg vicinity. During his short term as Virginia's last royal governor, Lord Dunmore acquired a plantation called Porto Bello six miles from Williamsburg, between Queens Creek and the York River, where he maintained a country home. Here Dunmore sought refuge in 1775 when the hostility of the patriots forced him to leave the Governor's Palace. It is known through early descriptions that Dunmore maintained at Porto Bello two dwelling houses and some ten outbuildings and farm buildings. None of these remains. The one extant early structure, a much-altered small, brick house, was probably built ca. 1800 when the property was owned by the Bright family. The site of Dunmore's complex apparently remains undisturbed and could be of significent archaeological interest. The property was acquired by the federal government at the beginning of World War II and is now maintained as a high-security facility for experimental training: 99-50 (11/9/72).

YORKTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT, including the village of Yorktown, the Yorktown Battlefield, and the Moore House. York town was established by the Virginia Port Act in 1691 and for much of the 18th century reigned as a busy commercial center, its excellent harbor used primarily by ships involved in the tobacco trade. Despite its prosperity, its population has never exceeded 3,000. Yorktown is chiefly remembered as the scene of the final battle of the Revolution and the surrender to George Washington of British forces under Lord Cornwallis. The terms of surrender were drafted on October 18, 1781, at the Moore house, on the edge of the battlefield, and were accepted the following day, bringing an end to America's colonial era. Yorktown declined after the victory, and much of the lower part of the town was destroyed in a fire in 1814. The community was the scene of a minor engagement during the Civil

War, and some of the fortifications remain from that period. In spite of wars and economic failing, some colonial buildings survive, including the two-story Nelson house with its pedimented gables, built between 1725 and 1740 either by Thomas Nelson or his son William. It was later the home of Thomas Nelson, Jr., a signer of the Declaration of Independence. Other early structures include Grace Church of ca. 1697, the early 18th-century Sessions-Shield house, and the Dudley Digges house of ca. 1744. At a street intersection, facing one another, are the tiny early 18th-century Pate house and the two-story brick store built in the first half of the 18th century by Richard Ambler, the customs collector. A focal point of the district is the Yorktown monument, a heroic column designed by Richard Morris Hunt and erected in 1881-84. The battlefield, the Moore house, the Nelson house, and several other properties in the district are owned and exhibited by the National Park Service as part of the Colonial National Historical Park. 99-57 (4/17/73).

YORKTOWN SHIPWRECKS MARITIME ARCHAEO-LOGICAL SITE, York River off Yorktown. In October 1781 General Earl Cornwallis, his army blocked by the Americans under Washington and the French under Rochambeau, scuttled the majority of the British fleet, as many as twenty-six vessels, off Yorktown to prevent a landing by the French fleet. Cornwallis then attempted on the night of October 16 to transfer his troops across the York in small boats, but a violent squall prevented the evacuation. A British flag of truce was flown the next day; and on October 19, 1781, the articles of capitulation were signed, bringing the Revolutionary War to a close. The wrecks have remained undisturbed for the most part on the bottom of the York. Research conducted by the Virginia Division of Historic Landmarks has located nine ships believed to be part of the fleet, making them the largest fleet of associated shipwrecks yet discovered in the world. One of the ships has been positively identified as the 44-gun HMS Charon, Cornwallis's largest vessel. Because of the comparatively good state of preservation and documented date of demise, the wrecks are likely to yield much information on 18th-century British naval ships and their accoutrements. In 1982 a cofferdam was erected under the direction of the Virginia Division of Historic Landmarks around one of the best preserved wrecks, a yet unidentified supply ship. The dam, shown in the aerial photograph, provides filtered water for greater clarity in the salvage of the wreck. 99-58 (2/20/73).

Searching for Indexed Terms¹

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.

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² This may take quite some time, depending on the size of files contained therein.

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
