#### **Preface**

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

Henry Yarborough of Virginia married Hartha Robinson of the same state, and afterwards moved to North Carolina. They had ten (10) children - Charles, Clement, Thomas, Archie, James, Edward, Nathaniel, Nannie, Betsy, and Henry.

- (1) Charles was an old bachelor, and like a father to his nieces and nephews.
- (2) Clement was in the Revolutionary war came home in a very emaciated condition and died soon after of the disease known at that time as bloody flux. His mother died soon after of the same disease. He was of a poetical temperment and devoted to his mother. After his death several original poems were found among his effects, dedicated to her.
- (3) Thomas was killed during the Revolutionary war by the Tories, who caught him while at home on a furlough and murdered him barbarously, beginning at his feet and disjointing him, in the presence of his wife. After his death his brother Charles went out to Alabama for them, i.e., his wife and their children, but her parents wished her to remain with them. His son James visited this state when grandma was a young lady.
- (4) Archie's children were Emily Glen, Betty Hunter, Rebecca Whittaker, Kate Nicks, James, Henry and Archie. They owned the old Henry Yarborough homestead about five miles from Franklinton.
- (5) James married and moved to Arkansas. His children were Henry, Elam, Nathaniel and Nancy. Henry married a Miss Duke and Nancy a Mr. Withers.
- (6) Edward died single.
- (7) Nathaniel married Mildred Fuller of Franklin children Clement, Betsy, Sarah, Richard, Martha and Mary. He moved to a place ten miles this side of Petersburg, Virginia, thinking to do a large commission business, but soon after the move he died from an apoplectic stroke. His brother Charles, knowing that he had been unfortunate in business, insisted, when he went to Virginia that he should make over his property here to him, thinking to save something for the children should his brother fail in Virginia. This was exceedingly unfortunate, for Charles died soon after Nathaniel and his legatees required an equal division of everything. Clement, who was a very dutiful son and a father to his younger brothers and sisters died in his 22nd year. Betsy married a Mr. Clements and finally moved to Texas.
- (8) Nancy married Charles Parrish of Orange.
- (9) Eetty, older than Nathaniel, married a Mr. Allen of Georgia. Grandma used to tell some very amusing anecdotes of a visit that Betty Allen's son made to this state when she was a young lady how he dressed and how he addressed her.

- (10) Henry married Betty Murray of Franklin. Children were Thomas, David, Archie, Henry, Fannie, Patty and Mancy. Tom married Mary Green of Warren. David moved to Hillsboro and married Eleanor Dorriby (?) who lived with her half sister Hiss Burke, who was old governor Burke's daughter. He afterwards moved to Marion, Alabama, where his only son Henry died a young man. Fannie married Mr. Alston, and Eliza (married) Jimmy House from North Carolina. Fannie married Claiborne Cooke. Patty married John House of Louisburg, who died and left her a widow with eight children Henry, Issac, Duke, Thomas, Patsy, Mary, Mancy, Francis.
  - 1. Henry House Yarborough, who married Kekoe Mitchell, was David Yarborough's brother, and managed the Branch House in Louisburg. They had several children Caroline, who married and went to Florida; Patty who married in Marion and went to New Orleans. She has a son who is now a conspicious man in Marion, so Mr. McL tells me.
  - 2. Isaac died young.
  - 3. Duke died young.
  - 4. Patsy married Lt. Dick Plummer, U.S.A., lived in Alabama. I had a photo of young Dick Plummer, who was killed in the War, but it was burned up.
  - 5. Francis, for whom my mother was named, married Mr. Tharrington of Hillsboro, afterwards of Alabama.
  - 6. Nancy married John Ligon. You probably know all about this branch. I only copied the part referred to the Yarboroughs and only the main points of that, as I am exceedingly busy.

Karen's note: The above was sent to Pauline Gray by V. Nan Yarbrough of Oklahoma.

Pauline sent this to me February 1986. There is no indication
as to the date of the 100 year old letter mentioned.

V. Nan Yarbrough's note on this paper says: "Re: Item (10), son Thomas: He may, indeed, have been the Thomas who married Mary Green of Warren Co., N.C. However, if that be true, then the writer omitted Mary Green's last name which was Davis. This Thomas was the great, great-grandfather of my husband. He married Mary G. Davis in 1812. She was the daughter of Jonathan Davis."

This Bill of Complaint of Simon Clement, and wife Elizabeth A. Clement, Simon Jeffreys and Sally R. Jeffreys, by themsleves, Fenner Yarbrough an infant under the age of twenty-one years (to wit) of about the age of sixteen years, Martha Yarbrough and infant under the age of twenty-one years, (to wit) of about the age of fourteen years, Polly Yarbrough an infant under the age of twenty-one years, (to wit) of about the age of twelve years, by their next friend Simon Jeffreys, heirs of Nathaniel Yarbrough, deceased:

AGAINST James Yarbrough, senior, Patsey Yarbrough of Franklin county, Nency Parrish, widow of John Parris of Orange County, in this State, Elizabeth Allen.wife of Drury Allen, of the State of Georgia, Martha Houze, widow of John Houze of Franklin N.C. Fanny Cook wife of Claibon Cook of Granville, County, Thomas Yarbrough, Archibald Yarbrough, James Yarbrough, Junr. Henry Yarbrough, John Legan and wife Anne M. Legan, of Wake County, David Yarbrough, of Hillsborough, the children of Henry Yarbrough dec'd. John M. Parnelle and wife Keziah, James Hoore and wife Maria Moore, both of Matchez of Mississippi Territory, children of Thomas Yarbrough, dec'd. all heirs at Law of Charles Tarbrough dec'd. Humbly complaning, sheweth unto your Honor that Hathaniel Yarbrough, deceased, of the County and State aforesaid, intending and being about to remove himself and family from the County of Franklin, in the State aforesaid, into the State of Virginia, and being the owner of a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres, situate in the said County of Franklin, adjoining the lands of James Yarbrough, and others, bounded as follows: by the lands of James Yarbrough, William Conyers, Anne Hester, Henry Yarbrough, deceased, and Nicholas White; and the said Nathaniel being a man of habits so intemperate and conduct so incautious and unguarded, as frequently to expose himself to the artifice and impositions of knavish and designing men, to the great injury of his estate, and tending to the ruin of his family, previous to his removal, a conversation was had between the said Charles and his brother Nathaniel, the Father and Father in law of your Orators and Oratrixes, in which the said Charles represented to him the said Natheniel, that he was notoriously unfit at all times to guard himself against the advantages, frauds, and circumventions which might be practised upon him, especially when out of the reach and protection of him, his said brother Charles, and amongst strangers who might seize with avidity every opportunity to take in any one, and that as he the said Nathaniel was not indebted to any person the said Charles recommended to the said Nathaniel that he should make him a conveyance in fee simple for the aforesaid tract of land, that he might hold the same for him or his wife and children; upon which persuasion and upon no other consideration whatever, the same Nathaniel did on the 26th day of March 1802, make and execute a conveyance in fee simple to the said Charles, deceased. Your Orators and Oratrixes further charge, that on or about the 16th day of January, 1803, as they believe, the said Nathaniel removed himself and family into the state of Virginia (Dinwiddie county) --- that on or about the 21st of May following, the said Nathaniel departed this life, intestate, in the said county of Dinwiddie: that the said Charles shortly after went into the state of Virginia, (county of Dinwiddie) for the empress purpose of removing the widow and family of the said Nathaniel back to the county of Franklin, from whence they had removed to Virginia, and accordingly accomplished the said intent, and put them into possession of the aforesaid tract of land on the first day of July, 1803; and the widow end her children have remained in possession ever since and are now living thereon, and until very lately have held the same quietly and undisturbed -- a period of time above nine years.

Your Orators further charge, that the said Charles departed this life on the 2d day of May, 1812, leaving the said Deed anongst the valuable papers and title deeds of his estate, and that the same, as your Orators and Oratrixes are informed, is duly proved and registered in the Register's Office of the County of Franklin; and having died intestate as to his real estate, the said land, the legal title being in him at the time of his death, descends in fee simple to the heirs at law of the said Charles, according to the rules regulating descent of real estate in this State---and they, the said heirs, or some of them, have obtained an Order on a Petition for that purpose, for the division of all the lands of the said Charles Yarbrough, deceased, and have lately proceeded to the division of the same, including the tract of land of the said Nathaniel above mentioned, your Orators' and Oratrixes' Father; and those of the heirs to whom the same has fallen in the said division, threatening to turn the widow and your Orators and Oratrixes out of possession, whereby they will be deprived of their inheritance without any consideration whatsoever.

Your Orators and Oratrixes further shew, that they are advised that the said Charles could be considered in no other light than that of a Trustee to the use of their deceased father, or his heirs, who your Orators and Oratrixes are. But now so it is, may it please your Honor, that the said James Yerorough, senior, one of the heirs and witnesses to the deed aforesaid, Patsey Yarbrough, Anne Farrish, widow of John Parrish; Elizabeth Allen, Martha Houze, Fanny Cook, wife of Claibon Cook; Thomas Yarbrough, Archibald Yarbrough, James Yarbrough, junior, Henry Yarbrough, John Legan and Anne M. Legan, his wife, David Yarbrough, John M. Parnelle and wife Keziah, and James Moore and wife Maria, both of Natchez, Mississippi Territory, combining and confederating with divers other persons unknown to your Orators and Oratrixes, who, when discovered, they pray may be made defendants to this bill with apt words to charge them how they might defraud your Orators in the premises, give out in speeches, that the said Charles was a purchaser for a valuable and real consideration; andmnot as above stated; and pretend that the same has descended to them in due form of law, and that they are entitled to hold the same both in law and equity, whereas in truth and fact the contrary is the case --- and that they utterly refuse to deliver up the said Deed to be cancelled, or to reconvey the premises to your Orators and Oratrixes, the heirs of the said Nathaniel. All which actings and doings of the said Defendants, the heirs of the said Charles, are contrary to equity and good conscience, and menifestly tend to the great wrong and injury of your Orators and Oratrixes; and for as much as your Orators are remediless in the premises by the rules of the common law, and are only relievable in this honourable Court, where frauds and matters of this kind are properly and strictly cognizable.

To this End, therefore, that the said James Yarbrough Sr, one of the heirs and a witness to the Daed, and the others of the heirs defendants to this bill, upon their corporal oaths, true, full and perfect answer make, to all and singular the premises contained in this bill, as if the same were herein again repeated and particularly interrogated, and more especially that they may set forth and discover whether the said Deed was not executed by the said Kathaniel to the said Charles for the purpose above stated and no other; whether the said Was not done at the instance and recommentation of said Charles; whether the said Nathaniel was not at the time of the execution, of the said Deed out of debt? Whether the said estate is not free from any incumbrances at this time? Whether the same was intended to defraud any person whatever? Whether the said deed was for any valuable consideration whatever moving from the said Charles? Whether the same was not in trust, as above stated, for the benefit of the said Nathaniel, his wife and children?

Whether the said James hath not the said deed now in his possession? and if not, what hath become of the same? And your Orators and Oratrixes pray that the same may be decreed to be delivered up, to be cancelled, and be null and void as if the same had never been executed, and that your Orators and Oratrixes, the heirs of the said Nathaniel, be vested in their right of descent, or otherwise that the heirs defendants to the bill be decreed to reconvey the said premises by good and sufficient Deed in law, to the heirs of the said Nathaniel, the Plaintiffs, and that your Orators and Oratrixes may have such other and further relief in the premises as the nature of the case requires, and unto your Honour may seem meet and agreeable to equity and good conscience.

Will your Honour be pleased to grant unto your Orators one or more Writ or Writs of Subpoena directed, &c. commanding, &c. and your Orators will ever pray.



#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

#### DR. A.S. YARBROUGH

"Connected with his practice, which he has made a complete success, Dr. A.S. Yarbrough, Como, Miss., is also engaged in farming, and is possessed of those advanced ideas and principles which can not fail to place him in the front ranks as an agriculturist. He was born in Marshall county, Miss., on the 12th of October, 1840, and is the son of Charles and Sallie B. (Anderson) Yarbrough, the father a native of Franklin county, N.C., and the mother of Lunenburg district, Va. The Yarbrough family is of English extraction, and the first immigrants to this country made their appearance here prior to the Revolution. Many descendants now reside in North Carolina. Charles Yarbrough was reared in North Carolina, was married in Tennessee to Miss Anderson, and in 1839 he moved to Marshall county, Miss., where he followed the occupation of a farmer. He became quite wealthy, and died in Marshall county in 1873. The mother

then paroled, and returned to the peaceful pursuits of farm life. In 1865 he wedded Miss Texana J. Wilbourn, daughter of Elijah and Eliza Wilbourn, and them were born three children. all daughters: Mattie B., wife of J.B. Davis, of Nashville, Tenn.; May B., wife of J.B. Wardlaw, of Como, Miss; Minnie L., at home, single. Or. Yarbrough lost his estimable wife in 1873. His second marriage was to Miss Emma McGee, daughter of Edward and Sarah (McGee) McGee, a very prominent pioneer family of Panola county [Mississippi]. By his last union the Doctor became the father of one son, Archie. Dr. Yarbrough has been resident of Panola county since 1865, and of his farm for abou ten years. He was elected to the state legislature by the democratic party in 1889. He has one of the largest and best improved plantations in the county--two thousand three hundres acres, with one thousand five hundred acres under cultivation and has all the latest improved machinery for conducting the same. He stands high in the estimation of all who know  $h_{1m}$ ingrated and caken to mound tity,

ill, where he was left with the wounded of his command. Subsequently, fearing that he should be taken father north. ### CHAPTER XII

### WASHINGTON COMES TO SALISBURY

Hardly had North Carolina entered into the new Union than e President of the United States paid her a visit early in 1791. ne Federalists, who were then in control of the country, deed the grand old patriot, General Washington, to tour the uth in order to strengthen their party in territory that was stile to their policies. A storm of protest was arising against deralist measures in that section of the Union and the storm is the genesis of an opposition party. The Federalist leaders, whom Alexander Hamilton, the Secretary of the Treasury, is the foremost, found Washington's enormous popularity a luable asset. The precise effect that Washington had on the d North State is not known, but it did afford an opportunity r patriotic demonstrations such as had never before been witssed in the state.

After Washington had traversed the eastern seaboard as far Savannah he returned through Augusta, Columbia, and Camn. He then stopped at the home of Major Richard Crawford tht miles from North Carolina. Maj. Crawford had reared adrew Jackson and taught him the rudiments of military ence. On May 27 he arrived at the southern border of Meckaburg County, where he was met by a detachment of Salisbury ght Dragoons under Captain Charles Caldwell, a young medi-I student then studying in a physician's home in Salisbury. is group of 13 young men was a part of a larger company reuited in Salisbury to escort the famous general to their town. ney had left the company 15 miles from Salisbury and jouryed to the South Carolina line to await the President. There e young captain, who was scarcely more than a boy, gave e distinguished Washington his first reception into North irolina. Caldwell was frightened at first, but the gentle manr with which Washington received him soon put the captain ease, and the two of them enjoyed a pleasant chat along the ad to Charlotte. While conversing, Washington inquired of

young Caldwell whether anyone was still alive who had signed the famous Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence. He was told that a few remained but would probably not appear in the village as they were too scattered throughout the countryside and their age would not permit them to attend the ceremonies in Charlotte. Upon reaching Mecklenburg, Caldwell and the other Salisbury dragoons delivered Washington to the Mecklenburg Light Horse.

The presidential party proceeded towards Salisbury on May 29. That night was spent at the home of Major Martin Phifer (Pheiffer) at "Red Hill" in Cabarrus County, three miles west of present Concord. The party got an early start the next morning and after traveling about ten miles were met at the dividing line between Mecklenburg and Rowan by a party of light dragoons of which Charles Caldwell's group had been a part, and proceeded into town under the command of Captain John Beard, who had served in the Revolution. As Washington proceeded on to Salisbury they were met by other companies, one of which was composed of little boys all wearing buck tails from their cap as a symbol of independence. According to Mangum's account this was "the nicest thing he had seen".

As Washington entered the town and pushed his way through the crowd to the court house that stood in the public square where he was to be officially received, a cannon fired fifteen salutes in his honor. After the reception the party moved down Corbin Street to the Yarborough House, located in the middle of the west side of Main between Innes and Council, where they breakfasted.

That afternoon the honorable visitor was waited upon by Judge Spruce Macay, Charles Harris, Montfort Stokes, and Lewis Beard, who presented him with an address:

Sir,

We have the honour to signify to you the joy which your presence, after a tedious journey undertaken at an advanced age in life, affords to the inhabitants of this place. Words are wanting to express our gratitude to heaven for continuing your life, on which our national glory and domestic tranquility, are even at this day, depending.

Situated at a remote distance from the scat of government, deriving no advantage from the establishment of post roads, and destitute of regular information, we are sometimes at a loss to form proper opinions of national measures; but we, nevertheless, boast, that we have been and still are zealously attached to order, and effective government. And having been ranked with those who suffered in the late war, we pledge ourselves to be amongst the foremost to maintain and perpetuate the federal government.

That your life, justly dear to the people of this country, a life precious, an ornament to human nature, and a blessing to the United States of America, may long be preserved, is the fervent and unanimous prayer of the people of this village.

Even at this early date the leaders of this town expressed to the President in a subtle way their want of better roads and by implication these Federalists hinted that they desired the federal government to take over the post roads of the country.

In the reply, the original of which is mounted in a case in the Rowan Public Library as a donation by Irvin Oestricher, Washington alluded to the roads in the third paragraph:

### Gentlemen:

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and

Your expressions of satisfaction on my arrival in Salisbury, are received with pleasure, and thanked with sincerity.

The interest which you are pleased to take in my personal welfare, excites a sensibility proportioned to your goodness. While I make the most grateful acknowledgment for that goodness, allow me to observe that your own determination, cooperating with that of your fellow-citizens throughout the union, to maintain and perpetuate the federal government, affords a better assurance of order and effective government, with their concomitants private and public prosperity, than the best meant endeavors of any individual could give.

Our national glory, and our domestic tranquility, can never be tarnished or disturbed, while they are guarded by wise laws found in public virtue. Among the measures which an enlight-

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which he was born. With the coming of Autumn every year, I become homesick for my birthplace—Pike County, and the sight of my old plantation home.

"There is one particular place where memory returns when Jack Frost comes—a lone chimney in a cotton field near Griffin, Georgia. When I was small, I used to ride in the buggy with my grandfather by this place.

Invariably grandfather would stop "Kit", his old gray mare, by this lone mud chimney that stood on hallowed ground—the spot that marked his early ancestor's *Drewery Allen's* home. Then he would tell me again that following a bloody war, that this man migrated from North Carolina to Pike County, to begin life anew. Proudly grandfather told me that all the land lying before our eyes had been in the Allen family for more than fifty years.

Family Names and War Records

Many descendants have been honored to bear *Drewery* Allen's first name. This name has been handed down from one generation to the next for over two hundred years. However, it has been shortened to *Drew*.

The pioneer, Drewery Allen, born December 1, 1749, married Elizabeth Yarbrough (called Betty) in 1814, named a son and a grandson Drewery.

John Ray and Sarah Frances Sanders named a son Drew. Sarah Frances' eldest son, Edgar, named one of his sons for Drewery Allen. Drew Camp Sanders who loves family history, lives at 110 Olive Street, Texarkana, Texas. Young six-year-old Drew Atkinson of 10 Iris Circle, Longview, Texas, grandson of Drew Camp Sanders, carries on the family name.

### Courage-War Record

Although not named Drew, Ex-Governor Sidney Sanders McMath of Little Rock, Arkansas inherited some of his great-grandmother's courage. Grandson of Edgar Sanders, Sidney served Arkansas as Governor at the age of 32 during the years 1948-1952.

Lieutenant Colonel Sidney Sanders McMath of the Marines led his men through the Battle of the "Cibek Ridge," during which the Marines experienced some of their fiercest fighting in the Bougainville campaign in 1943. During World War II, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel on the field of battle by Secretary of the Navy Knox, who visited the Pacific in November, 1943.

Sunday, August 16th.

Our Regt. is in three files. One in Camp near Brownsville at a place near Ashley Station on Grand Prairie, the others a few miles from Clarendon. Colonel Newton is near the river with the main force. This is a half-way place commanded by the major and serves as a recruiting post and courier post. Three boats, two guns and one transport, passed up the river, stopped at Des Arc and burnt the business of a Stewart & Brothers, broke their safe, took sixteen thousand dollars and ransacked others and some say all over town and got in all money about twenty-five thousand dollars. They passed on but I have not heard how high they passed up the river. I heard they could not get far above Des Arc. They passed down yesterday. Our scouts and the Federals scouts got within three hundred yards of each other yesterday and it is thought the Feds took fright and crossed the river as our scouts could not find them after-

The Feds are at Clarendon with their principal force, variously estimated, some as high as ten thousand. Yesterday transports passed up to Clarendon with artillery. I reckon the Feds are preparing to give us a fight, or trying to scare us. If the former they will have a sweet time of it. If the latter, they will get their labor for their pains. There has been two desertions from our company: Bailey Woods and Jean Yarborough. Bailey Woods wore off my boots. I had got him to change with me on account of my leg. The shoes he left are worn out. I think he will send my boots home. Send to him for them and send them to Elbert Smith to mend as they are ripped. I fortunately bought me a good pair of shoes yesterday. I don't know why the boys left only they got

tired and had not been paid off. I think all will be paid off as soon as matters quiet a little so that the Regt. can get together.

I loaned James Yarborough five dollars the day I left home. His note is there. I don't know whether he will ever pay it or not. I can't collect his wages in his absence. Captain Johnson brings word that matters up there are in an awful condition, that the people are nearly all scared to death, that all that can possibly move are preparing to get off. Charles Plant came down same day and says matters about as quiet as usual; that the people are not at all alarmed and that matters in general are doing well. I hope the latter is true. I don't see any special cause for alarm. \* \* \*

### August 18th.

Mr. John M. Hicks got into camp yesterday and delivered me your very kind favor of tenth and eleventh inclosing forty dollars for which please accept my thanks. It would have come in good time but I borrowed the day before fifty dollars from Charley Plant, gave him my due bill and instructed him to call upon you for the money. It does seem that I am getting through with money rapidly but our boys are so needy and they call on me for it, and I hate to deny when I know they will pay as soon as they draw their money. \* \* \* I am glad that you have got your turnips sown. I do hope they may do well. I hope that you will not have to give up George. I think that running negroes to Texas is played out. If you have to give up George try to buy you a boy or a man. At the present prices for wages you will soon pay out the worth of a negro. Try to get a good one and if he runs off let him go. A negro is as certain as Confederate money. If I have a chance I will buy a negro. I could have bought one while in Jackson County but could not get leave of absence as we thought we were closely pressed. \* \* \* If Matt wants to go into the Cavalry service he had better buy him a horse as soon as possible; and make him fat. 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### INTRODUCTION

The Southern Christian Advocate began publication in Charles-The Southern Christian Advocate began publication in Charles ton in 1837. The place of publication was changed to Augusta, Georgia, April 10, 1862. Publication was suspended April 13, 1865 until June 20, 1865, when it resumed in Macon, Georgia. A complete or near complete file of this newspaper is extant and housed at the South Caroliniana Library, Columbia, South Carolina. It was the Methodist newspaper for the Southeast, but occasional notices of unchurched persons and persons of other denominations. notices of unchurched persons and persons of other denominations appear as well. The Lutheran clergy apparently used this paper to some degree, possibly because the Lutheran Observer in Balti-more was the closets publication of that denomination until the Southern Lutheran commenced at Charleston in 1861

This volume will be a good tool for anyone doing genealogical research in the South, especially for doing a surname study, and for determining migration routes. The detail of the obituaries is surprising for the period, often giving dates of birth and marriage, as well as various places of residence. It is especially important for the many burned counties of South Carolina and Georgia. Many notices from Orangeburg, Colleton and Beaufort Districts., S. C., are found here.

CAPT. E. YARPOROUGH TO GEHERAL SUMMER.

Charlotte, 12th May, 1781

Sir

I was at General Butler's Camp a few days after your letter was received ordering Capt. Read and myself to take command of the Troops, that was sent out under Col. Linton. I set out inmediately for Head Quarters with my baggage that came from Virginia and by the Tories residing in Randolph County and on Deep River I was obliged to make my rought by Guilford Court House and Salisbury and Charlotte. I had got as far as the lines of South Carolina when I was taken very sick and obliged to return to this place to the Hospital and am not able to judge when I shall be able for the field. Capt. Read was sent to Salisbury on some business from General Greene and there is no Officers at camp with the North Carolina Troops but Major Eaton and Lieutenant Campbell.

I should be very happy if I could obtain leave of absence for a few weeks for to recover my health and some other business that would be something very considerable to me by the death of my brother, since I march from home last August. ## CLAYTON-REEVES-SUTHERLAND.

### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

#### DR. A.S. YARBROUGH

"Connected with his practice, which he has made a complete success, Dr. A.S. Yarbrough, Como, Miss., is also engaged in farming, and is possessed of those advanced ideas and principles which can not fail to place him in the front ranks as an agriculturist. He was born in Marshall county, Miss., on the 12th of October, 1840, and is the son of Charles and Sallie B. (Anderson) Yarbrough, the father a native of Franklin county, N.C., and the mother of Lunenburg district, Va. The Yarbrough family is of English extraction, and the first immigrants to this country made their appearance here prior to the Revolution. Many descendants now reside in North Carolina. Charles Yarbrough was reared in North Carolina, was married in Tennessee to Miss Anderson, and in 1839 he moved to Marshall county, Miss., where he followed the occupation of a farmer. He became quite wealthy, and died in Marshall county in 1873. The mother

is still living, and is seventy-eight years of age. Seven of the eleven children born to this union grew to mature years. and are named as follows: Martha G., wife of James Sims of Holly Springs; Beatrice (deceased), was the wife of the late or. W.M. Compton; Charles G., a farmer of Marshall county; or. A.S.; G.W. and J. Henry, both farmers of Marshall county, and John W. (deceased). Dr. A.S. Yarbrough spent his howhood days on his father's farm in Marshall county, and when eighteen years of age, owing to ill health, he went to Texas, where he spent a year with the cow boys [vic]. He then returned to Mississippi, studied medicine under the late Dr. William M. compton, and took a course of lectures in the medical college at Nashville, Tenn. At the commencement of the late war he entered the Confederate army as a private in company 1. First Mississippi infantry, commanded by Captain Milams. Soon after. on making an application to be examined in medicine and surdery, he was appointed surgeon in 1862. He was in the engagement at Fort Donelson, was captured and taken to Mound City. ill., where he was left with the wounded of his command. Subsequently, fearing that he should be taken father north, Dr. varbrough made his escape, crossing the Ohio river when it was eight miles in width, (this was before it was agreed upon that nhysicians should not be considered prisoners of war), and then reported to his colonel, who was at Shannon, Miss. He was aranted a furlough. He joined his regiment as soon [as] it was enchanged, was a participant of the siege of Port Hudson, and was again captured. Upon being released he reported to Gen. Joseph E. Johnston, who was near Jackson, Miss. His regiment was soon exchanged, and his command joined the army of Tennessee, taking part in all fights around Atlanta, Ga., and being with Hood in the Tennessee campaign. He was in the battles of franklin and Nashville, and after retreating from the latter place to Vernon, Miss., he was given a furlough. He was on the way to join his command when he met Jefferson Davis on his retreat from Richmond, near Washington, Ga. Dr. Yarbrough was

then paroled, and returned to the peaceful pursuits of farm life. In 1865 he wedded Miss Texana J. Wilbourn, daughter of Elijah and Eliza Wilbourn, and them were born three children, all daughters: Mattie B., wife of J.B. Davis, of Nashville, Tenn.; May B., wife of J.B. Wardlaw, of Como, Miss; Minnig L. at home, single. Dr. Yarbrough lost his estimable wife in 1873. His second marriage was to Miss Emma McGee, daughter of Edward and Sarah (McGee) McGee, a very prominent pioneer family, of Panola county [Mississippi]. By his last union the Doctor became the father of one son, Archie. Dr. Yarbrough has been, resident of Panola county since 1865, and of his farm for about ten years. He was elected to the state legislature by the democratic party in 1889. He has one of the largest and best improved plantations in the county--two thousand three hundred acres, with one thousand five hundred acres under cultivation, and has all the latest improved machinery for conducting the same. He stands high in the estimation of all who know him.

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# Searching for Indexed Terms<sup>1</sup>

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched<sup>2</sup>. First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.

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
