#### **Preface**

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

James Murry, 20 Apr 1804 Will: Wife Frances; dau Patty, wife of Edward House; Children of my dau Sarah Lewis; Dau Jane Hiall; sons James & William Murry; Lau Elizabeth Yarbrough; deceased dau Frances Richards; son-in-law Major Fichards. Wits: Wiley Gressom & Burch B. House.

23 Mar 1805 — David Yarbrough to Archibald Yarbrough under authority of Will of Henry Yarbrough "Whereas by the 10th sec. of ... will .. of Henry Yarbrough late of Franklin County, dec'd, it is willed ... to wit: My will & desire is that after the death of my wife the lands may be sold by my executors giving years credit taking a good bond ... and the money ... equally divided between my six sons aforenamed and whereas the aforesaid David & Archibald are 2 of the sons of said dec'd Henry Yarbrough ... land sold. Wit: Henry Yarbrough.

22 Dec 1807 - Estate sale of Henry Yarbrough. Purchasers included: Charles Yarbrough, Archibald Yarbrough, James Yarbrough Sr., James Yarbrough Jr., Thomas, Amelia & David Yarbrough; Charles A. Hill; James Murry.

22 Dec 1807 - sale of estate of Elizabeth Yarbrough, Deceased. Purchasers included David Yarbrough, James Yarbrough and John Houze.

Apparently Elizabeth died in 1807 as the estate sale for both she and Henry were on the same day and Henry had directed that his property not be sold until after his wife's death.

6 Dec 1819 - Will of James Sherrod: Wife, Rebecca; dau Elizabeth Yarbrough. Executors, Friends Archibald Yarbrough and David S. Goodloe.

10 Dec 1823 Will of Rebecca "Serror". Proved June 1824. Names Granddaus Emely Ann, Elizabeth Mary and Rebecca Yarbrough; grandsons James, and Thomas Edward Yarbrough, "land which I purchased of my brother, Jeremiah Perry."

20 Mar 1828 - Will of James Yarbrough. Proved Sep 1832. Names Children of my brother Thomas Yarbrough; heirs of sister Martha Howze, dec'd; brothers Archibald, David and Henry Y., Sister Nancy Legon; heirs of sister Frances Cook. Executor was brother in law John Ligon and Friend David M. Lewis.

(Karen's note - David M. Lewis m. Mary Yarbrough 13 Feb 1815 in Franklin Co. NC)

20 Jul 1842 - Will of Archibald Yarbrough. Proved Dec 1842. Names Wife Elizabeth and lists all his children. Oldest son James S. Y. is to be guardian for the

23 Mar 1807 - "To Frances Cook, dau of deceased Henry Yarbrough"

23 Mar 1805 - Settlement between David & Archibald, sons of Henry Y. Deceased.

25 Dec 1807 - to Nancy Murry, a negro - signed Claiborn Cook; Jordan House; Thomas, James Jr., Archibald, David & Henry Yarbrough.

Karen's Note: You see James Y. Sr., and James Y. Jr. This is not father and son. James Y. Sr. was the son of Henry and Martha (Robinson) Yarbrough. Henry Y. Jr. and wife Betsy had a son they named after James Y. Sr. This James was called James Jr. to distinguish him from his Uncle James Y. Sr.

HOW TO USE THIS FORM:

The upper left-hand corner should be a common ancestor. Then place the descendants in order with one family line across the top of the form and another family line down the left side of the form in the blanks provided.

The reverse of this form can be used to show the marriages of either line of descent and the back of Form SF-2 to show the marriages of the other line. For the marriages, start with the common ancestor on Line #1 and work down to the person being traced.






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
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


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
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BASE MAP SOURCE: "Hall's Original County Map of Georgia Showing Present and Original Counties and Land Districts, 1695"



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


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

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




This map of Franklin County was drafted from a recent highway map.

It is interesting to note that the boundary lines were changed again for both Hart and Franklin, by the Act of March 8, 1868.

Section III of this act applies to Franklin County as follows:

And be it further enacted, That the line between Hart and Franklin, be so altered and changed as to run from the Cross Roads, West of and near Job Bowers, to the former residence of Jeptha A. Bowers on the Carnesville road, thence to the western corners of William R. Poole's land known as Poole's and Burroughs' corner, thence a straight line to the Negro's old store, as described in the act laying out the county of Hart. (Acts General Assembly of Georgia, 1855-56, page 129.)

Banks County was created by the Act of December 1858 from Franklin County and Habersham County (formerly Franklin County) (Lamar's Compilation, p. 416 and 429) as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Jackson County where said corner touches Hall county; thence direct to Crow's Mill; thence direct to where the Athens and Clarkesville road crosses Hall and Habersham line; thence with said road toward Clarkesville to where Wofford's old trail leaves said road; thence with said old trail to where it crosses Jeney's ford road, and thence direct to where the road leading up east of Middle River and Leatherwood Creek; thence along said road to Habersham and Franklin line, thence direct to Kesler's Bridge on Middle River, thence direct to McEntire's bridge, including the same; thence along the Athens road to Strickland's old mill; thence along the Madison line to the corner of Jackson County; thence along the Jackson County line to Hall line; thence with said line to the beginning.

An excerpt from the Franklin County Grand Jury presentments of May 1866 indicates that cutting off land from Franklin County was not always entirely satisfactory. The names of the grand jurors were as follows: James M. Bagwell, foreman; James M. Alexander, James M. McFarland, Asa W. Brawner, Tarpley A.T. Phillips, Jesse M. Payne, William Cawthon, Green B. Sewell, Talmon Harbor, Morgan Guest, Ephraim O. Finch, Benjamin F. Willis, Dennis O. Osborn, Benjamin P. Vandiver, Thomas W. Smith, James A. Moseley, James W. Payne, George Kesler, William W. Bagwell, Lewis Farrow. The presentment follows:

We also recommend that whereas there was a distinct understanding between the citizens of Franklin and Banks Counties that Banks County would keep up Mc-Entire's Bridge, on condition that Franklin County would consent to give up a large portion of her territory for the formation of Banks County, and whereas the Inferior Court of Banks County refuses to have said bridge built, therefore we recommend that if Banks County does not build the bridge before the next session of the Legislature, our Senator and Representative be instructed and required to endeavor to secure the passage of a bill to so alter the line between this county and the county of Banks as to include in Franklin County all the territory belonging to Franklin previous to the passage of the act organizing the county of Banks.

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Third - A. The president of the Executive Council would then issue to the petitioner a numbered warrant, directed to the county surveyor of the county selected, directing him to admeasure and lay out the stated number of acres as a bounty.

Third - B. For those who desired land in any of the eight old counties the procedure was substantially the same, except that the land court of that county exercised the same functions in steps 1, 2 and 3 - A as exercised by the governor, president and Executive Council with respect to Franklin and Washington counties.

Fourth. The county surveyor, or one of his deputies, would survey the land chosen by the applicant, make three plats thereof, record one copy in a book in his office, and forward two copies, together with the executed warrant, to the surveyor-general; one to be recorded and filed in the latter's office and the other to be attached to the grant.

Fifth. Upon transmission of one copy of the plat of survey and the executed warrant by the surveyor-general to the secretary of state, a grant would be issued by the latter in the name of the governor after the payment of nominal office fees. Both the surveyor-general and the secretary of state would enter on the survey book and on the grant book the notation Bounty, but in no case was the actual classification of the grantee shown.

There was nothing on the governor's numbered certificate to indicate whether the grant was made to a civilian or a soldier. In the 1920's some authorized person created additional confusion by writing the word bounty on many pages of the survey books and grant books because he thought the early clerks failed to do so, even though the dates indicated the grant could not lawfully have been a bounty.

- According to the records there is no doubt that many irregularities and abuses occurred in the issuance of bounties. Many warrants were signed by former officers who then bought the warrants and had grants issued to themselves. There are on file in the Georgia Department of Archives and History, petitions containing the names of 20 or more men, all in the same handwriting, alleged by the certifying officer to have been entitled to a bounty, praying that their bounties be granted to that officer. Several well-known officers were among the worst offenders which included Peter Carnes, Elijah Clarke, Leonard Marbury, Horatio Marbury, John Gorham, Edward Telfair, Ignatius Few, Zachariah Phillips, Micajah Williamson, Richard Call.

It is difficult for a person in 1984 to understand the happenings that occurred 200 years ago or during the following century. Our forefathers were a restless breed. They had come through a bloody war. Perhaps they were dreaming of a permanent home where they could have peace and quiet apart from fear and hunger. No doubt they wanted land as indicated by an incident which occurred on May 29, 1784 only 3 months after Franklin County was created and the land was opened for settlement. The incident is recorded in a letter on file with the Georgia Historical Society at Savannah, from the Secretary of the Executive Council to Governor John Houston as follows.

. . . there occurred in the office of the secretary of the Executive Council, on May 29, 1784, the day appointed for the numbering and distribution of warrants

for survey, such riotous and disorderly conduct that the clerks were overrun and the warrants were forcibly removed and scattered outside. Many duplicate warrants were signed to replace those so removed, and afterwards grants were made to the same man on both original and duplicate. Under such confusion, it would not be surprising that the fearful clerks should put through many unauthorized warrants for the most aggressive of the rioters. Read the words of the man who actually received the petitions and distributed the warrants: "Speculation, as I hinted before, has certainly extinguished in many men, passing for gentlemen, every spark of probity and integrity. Many have sworn that instead of 2871/2 acres of land, for which their warrants were made, they were entitled to 575 acres, and others, on second thought, have deposed that they petitioned or meant to petition for the other Bounty, in both of which cases the warrants were taken up and new ones made out accordingly."

The information about bounty grants is given because the list of grants from Franklin County in Lucien Lamar Knight's book listed as veterans all persons for whom land was surveyed without recognizing any distinction between the various classes of grants. All these grants were made during 1784-1786 before original Franklin County gave land to create other counties. Among the men who received these grants were land speculators and there is some question about the legality of some of the land transactions that were made.

These lists include Revolutionary soldiers recorded as residing in Franklin County when land grants were obtained for service in the Revolution. The source of each list is given as indicated,

The 1934 edition of the Lavonia Times carried the following statement by Editor, Rush Burton:

You will find many familiar names in this list. The Littles, the Pulliams, the Paynes, the Chandlers, the Kings, the Harrisons, the Stonecyphers, the Carnes', the Clarkes, the Jarrets, the Echols, the Shannons, the Waltons, and Walkers and many other names are familiar to our people today in the county can trace their ancestry back to those who fought in the Revolution and who were the recipients of bounties named below:

course of said line until the same strikes the Hog Mountain road; thence down the same to the southern line of said county; thence along the same to the Appalachee river, shall be added to and made a part of the county of Walton: and all that part of said county which lies above the above prescribed line; and thence along the road which passes Thompson's mill, to the Mulberry fork of the Oconee river; thence a direct line to the corner of Gwinnett county on the top the Chatahoochee ridge, shall be added to, and become a part of Gwinnett county: and all that part of Jackson county, which lies north-west of a line, to begin at the house of William Clements, and running parallel with a line commonly called Hawkin's line, to the present line of Franklin County, be added to and become a part of the county of Hall: and all that part of Franklin county, which lies north-west of a line beginning on the Tugalo river at the mouth of Walton's creek, and running up said creek to the Unacoy road; thence till Blair's road crossed the same; thence along said road to Tate's bridge; thence along the road to the Silver Shoals on the Hudson fork of Broad river; thence to the south-west corner of Habersham county, be added to, and become a part of Habersham county: and all that part of the county of Franklin, which lies northwest of a line running thence direct to the place where the dividing line between Jackson and Hall strikes the Franklin County line, shall be added to the county of

Hart County was created from Franklin and Elbert counties in 1853 (Georgia Laws 1853-54, page 302). The boundaries of the new county were as follows:

Section I. Beginning at Stower's Ferry on the Savannah river, formerly known as Brown's Ferry, and running in a straight line to the residence of Middleton G. Hickman in Elbert County, including said residence in the new county, thence in a straight line to the corner of Madison County nearest to the Little Holly Springs, thence along the boundary line of Madison County nearest to the corner of Elbert, Franklin, and Madison counties, near the residence of Angus Johnson, thence in a straight line to the nearest cross roads to the residence of Job Bowers, not including the residence of Moses and Joseph Manley in Franklin County, between said residence and Carnesville, on the road leading from Carnesville to Ruckersville, thence in a straight line to a place sometimes called Negro's old store place, now owned by Leonard Bonds, Franklin County, thence in a straight line to the mouth of Gum Log Creek, on Tugalo River, thence along the eastern boundary of the State of Georgia.

This act was one of the "unkindest cuts of all." It not only cut off part of the most productive land in Franklin County, it cut off citizens, among whom were leading people of the county. This cut-off also took some of the best schools, churches, and business establishments, such as those along Shoal Creek and the Tugalo River.

At this time when Hart County was created, William R. Poole was a member of the Franklin County Board of Education. He was also the member of the legislature from Franklin County. The minutes of the school commissioner's of Franklin County for 1852 list William R. Poole as Chairman through August 27, 1853, when he was reported absent and on May 19, 1854, Thomas R. Yarbrough was appointed to fill the vacancy of William R. Poole, cut off to Hart County. No doubt, other leaders and valuable land owners were lost from Franklin County when other land and citizens were cut off to create new counties.

of the children of the county and, no doubt, did as much as was possible at that time, with the confused situation at the state level and the inability to raise funds on the local level. A copy of the original minutes of the school reports of the Board of Commissioners of the poor/free school fund of Franklin County for the decade 1852-1862, which include, in the last section, reports from the ordinary of the county to the Governor, reflect the situation during those years. Of special significance is the certification of the competencies of teachers by the Board of Education, the increase in funds from the state in the late 1850's and the decline in all areas with the tension and apprehension relative to secession which in 1861 became the Civil War that left Franklin County devastated, economically, educationally, and culturally.

The following information is taken from the reports of the poor/free school commissioners of Franklin County, 1852-1862.

The board of commissioners met May 31, 1852, at the courthouse in Carnesville with Temple F. Cooper, William R. Pool, William R. Wilbourn, William F. Bowers, members present, with William R. Pool presiding.

It was decided that the board meet four times a year on the first Tuesday in October 1852, and in 1853, meet the first Tuesday in January, April, July, and October.

The following resolutions were passed by the Board:

- 1. Resolved that the examination of the teachers of said county be public.
- 2. Resolved that the examination be conducted with the utmost regard for the feelings of applicant teachers.
- Resolved that trustees be appointed in pursuance of the law for every school in the county.
- 4. Resolved that this board deeply regrets the loss of the competency and energy of such men as Calvin Weld, but for the sake of harmony, general satisfaction, and the advancement of a great common cause, this board deems it inexpedient that any person be a teacher and a commissioner at the same time, therefore we recommend that Calvin L. Weld resign and that we tender the said office of commissioner caused by his resignation to John M. Freeman.

On motion the board adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock June 1 in the reading for examination class.

The board met again at Carnesville on June 1, 1852, according to adjournment and adopted the following order of examination.

- 1. Each applicant to furnish the board in writing all the branches he teaches. the part of the county in which he teaches with his name thereto.
- 2. Every applicant will form in one class when under examination in spelling reading, writing, and arithmetic. When this is through, those professing to teach the above only will be relieved and all the others are to be examined in the first named branches together with English, Grammar, and Geography and they will be discharged and all teaching the above named five branches together with Albegra, Natural Philosophy, and Astronomy.

The Board described the Manner of Examination as follows:

- 1. One of the board will (with the prompting of all) examine how they teach, whether silent or open schools, on the letters of the alphabet, their use, nature, and division.
- 2. On spelling, words and whether derivative or primitive, simple or compound.
- 3. On reading, cadence, emphasis, keys and right modulation of the voice.
- 4. The arithmetic, its meaning, the signs, the first five rules.
- 5. On all the higher branches as specified above in classes 2nd, 3rd, and 4th.

On that same day, June 1st, 1852, the following persons presented to the Board their names, location of schools and branches taught by them, who were classed as follows and examined.

The Board then adjourned until July 5.

The next meeting of the Board was July 5, 1852, at Carnesville. Certificates of competency were given to each applicant of June 1, 1852, except C.D. Crymes who had withdrawn on account of indisposition.

The Board met again at Carnesville, October 7, 1852, with Wm. R. Wilbourn, Wm. F. Bowers, and Jno. M. Freeman present. Wm. R. Wilbourn was appointed chairman protem of the Board. The Secreatary was ordered by the Board to give Susan Arundell a certificate of competency to teach orthography, writing, arithmetic, and English Grammar.

The trustees for John Johnson's school were listed: Edward W. Mayfield, Alexander Langston, Leonard Shannon. The teachers to be examined on that day were John B. Estes, J.A. Bowers, and J. Hall.

The next meeting of the Board for which minutes were available was at Carnesville, August 27, 1853. Present were Wm. F. Bowers, Joshua N. Glenn, Temple F. Cooper. Chairman Wm. R. Poole was absent and Wm. F. Bowers acted as Chariman Protem. The following teachers were examined in Orthography, Reading, and Arithmetic: Wm. J. Laird, Wm. Poole, S.L. Poole, J.J. Bowers, Wm. Garner, Joseph N. Sewell, Robt T. Pulliam, Francis M. Cheek, and Thos. H. Yarborough.

The following teachers were examined for the teaching for which they were entitled pay from the public money for poor children: Wm. M. Laird, J.J. Bowers, Francis M. Cheek.

The following teachers were examined in English Grammar: Wm. Garner, S.L. Poole, Joseph N. Sewell, Francis M. Cheek, Robert Pulliam, Thomas H. Yarborough.

The Board directed the Secretary to give certificate of competency to all applicants that were examined at this and the former meeting.

The following persons were handed in as trustees by J.A. Bowers: Wm. Bennett, John Hall, John V. Cheek. Francis M. Cheek handed in John McFarlan, J.A. Grant, George Stevenson. Wm. Garner handed in Thomas Bryan, Wm. Baldwin, Robert Bryan.

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The next meeting of the Board was May 19, 1854, at Carnesville. Present were William R. Wilbourn and Temple F. Cooper. Thomas H. Yarborough was appointed to fill the vacancy of Wm. R. Poole cut off to Hart County. There was no record of minutes written for this meeting.

Some time after the May 19, 1854 meeting, the legislature recommended that the Justices of the Inferior Court take charge of the poor school fund. Four years passed before another meeting was recorded in the minutes available. Evidently, in the interim, the justices of the Inferior Court handled school affairs.

The Board met the 8th of October 1859 to organize under the Act of the Legislature of Georgia approved 21st December 1858. Present were Wm. T. Crow, JIC; Henry Freeman, JIC; Levi Sewell, JIC; James A. Harrison, ordinary. It was ordered that General William T. Millican be appointed on the Board of Education, and that the ordinary notify the teachers of Franklin County to attend a meeting at the courthouse in Carnesville on Saturday, December 20, for the purpose of being examined on their competency to teach the elementary branches of an English education. There were no minutes of the Dec. 20 meeting.

A report from Franklin County was made September 27, 1859, signed by John G. York, ordinary, to Joseph E. Brown, Governor, stating that the information was given in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 11th December, 1858, to provide for the education of the children of the state between certain ages according to the circular letter of March 2, 1859, addressed to the ordinary requesting information for the present year 1859. The report follows:

- 1. The number of free white children between ages 8 and 18 is 1419.
- 2. Free white children between 8 and 18 who have been taught the elementary branches of an English Education is males 624, females 455, both sexes 1079.
- 3. The number of free white children between ages of 8 and 18 who have been taught higher branches of Enlgish education is males 59, females 48, both sexes 107, all 1186 (1079 + 107).
- 4. Tuition The rates of tuition in Elementary branches is \$8 to \$13.00 average for session of 200 days \$10.50; tuition for higher branches is \$8.33 to \$28.00, average \$17.67 per session of 200 days.
- 5. The grand jury and inferior court have assessed 30 percent upon state tax for school purposes which will probably raise \$620.00.
  - 6. The total number attending school in county within present year is 1330.
  - 7. The number of school houses is 29. (None owned by county.)
  - 8. Number of schools taught this year is 25.
- 9. There is one county academy in this county located in Carnesville and school taught for term of 200 days. Number of scholars taught males 59, females 52, total 111.
- 10. No college or high school in county.
- 11. The Inferior Court of this county has appointed a board of five examiners viz. John B. Estes, Wm. T. Millican, Temple F. Cooper, Groves H. Cartledge, and William R. The Board then adjourned until July 5.

The next meeting of the Board was July 5, 1852, at Carnesville. Certificates of competency were given to each applicant of June 1, 1852, except C.D. Crymes who had withdrawn on account of indisposition.

The Board met again at Carnesville, October 7, 1852, with Wm. R. Wilbourn, Wm. F. Bowers, and Jno. M. Freeman present. Wm. R. Wilbourn was appointed chairman protem of the Board. The Secreatary was ordered by the Board to give Susan Arundell a certificate of competency to teach orthography, writing, arithmetic, and English Grammar.

The trustees for John Johnson's school were listed: Edward W. Mayfield, Alexander Langston, Leonard Shannon. The teachers to be examined on that day were John B. Estes, J.A. Bowers, and J. Hall.

The next meeting of the Board for which minutes were available was at Carnesville, August 27, 1853. Present were Wm. F. Bowers, Joshua N. Glenn, Temple F. Cooper. Chairman Wm. R. Poole was absent and Wm. F. Bowers acted as Chariman Protem. The following teachers were examined in Orthography, Reading, and Arithmetic: Wm. J. Laird, Wm. Poole, S.L. Poole, J.J. Bowers, Wm. Garner, Joseph N. Sewell, Robt T. Pulliam, Francis M. Cheek, and Thos. H. Yarborough.

The following teachers were examined for the teaching for which they were entitled pay from the public money for poor children: Wm. M. Laird, J.J. Bowers, Francis M. Cheek.

The following teachers were examined in English Grammar: Wm. Garner, S.L. Poole, Joseph N. Sewell, Francis M. Cheek, Robert Pulliam, Thomas H. Yarborough.

The Board directed the Secretary to give certificate of competency to all applicants that were examined at this and the former meeting.

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#### Broad River Baptist Church (Black)

Broad River was founded in 1898 on land donated by the J.G.W. Sewell family. It is located on Fairview Road about 6 miles southwest of Lavonia. Next to the wood frame church was a one-room public schoolhouse. The first pastor was C.B. Johnson who served the church until 1913. The following served as pastors: Green Griffin 1913, B.A.F. Teasley 1915, J.C. Maxwell 1916, A.L. Lowe 1917, W.M. Dansby 1923, C.L. Borders 1934, J.B. Maxwell 1935, C. Clayton 1937, B.H. O'Bryant: 1939, J.W. Evans 1940, V.S. Hughey 1951, J.B. Maxwell 1974, Cliff Burch 1978 who is still serving (1984).

The foundation for the new concrete block church was laid May 15, 1967 and it is a beautiful modern building.

There are approximately 300 members and six auxiliaries. The list of deacons who have served the church are: Joe Hogrove, L.R. Taylor, S. Cherry, A.H. Brock, Banks Montgomery, Marcus Burns, Joe Scott, Douglas Tribble, T.R. Brock, M.C. Scott, Ben Simpson, Horace Christian, Owens Thornton and Clarence Thornton.

#### Canon Baptist Church

Canon Baptist Church was organized in 1894 under the leadership of Rev. D.B. Wait, a teacher at the Canon School. In August 1895 the present property was purchased from Mr. W.F. Bowers for \$50. The building was completed in the spring of 1896. Earliest records, dating back to 1903, show a membership of 35 people. The electric lights were installed in 1910. The church complex has had major additions including a pastorium, a Sunday school building and other improvements. A full-time pastor, Rev. Stanley Cole, now serves 392 members.

#### Canon United Methodist Church

The name of Reverend John F. Yarborough marks the beginning of the Methodist Church in Canon, Georgia. A petition was presented to the quarterly conference at Providence on Feb. 5, 1905, and the application was approved to establish a Methodist Church in Canon.

Later in the year the Canon Mission which consisted of Canon, Carroll's and Pennington Chapel, was organized with W.A. Cooper of Avalon, as preacher. This group appointed a committee to secure a lot on which to construct a church. The following men were appointed: George Jordan, Dr. J.H Bowen, Edd P. Burton, W.P. Turman and J.T. Stovall. A lot at the corner of Broad Street and Central Avenue was purchased from Mr. B.C. Jordan for \$75 and a building committee of Edd P. Burton, George Jordan, J.T. Starr, Sr., W.P. Turman, B.H. Burton, J.T. Stovall and L.E. Osborn was appointed. The new church was completed in the summer of 1907.

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Reverend Maxwell preached the first sermon and received 35 charter members into the church. Among them were Mr. and Mrs. C.A. Bagwell, Mr. and Mrs. J.R. Johnson, Mrs. L.M. Burton, Mr. George Jordan, Mr. E.P. Burton, Dr. and Mrs. J.H. Bowen, Mrs. E.J. Brown, Mrs. Maggie Dove, Mrs. J.W. Fleming, Mrs. Nannie Fleming, Mr. L.E. Osborn, Miss Bell Starr, Miss Lucy Starr, Mr. Fletcher Starr, Mr. W.D. Fleming, Mrs. M.P. Fleming, Miss Lavie Kelly, Mr. J.T. Starr, Sr., Mrs. J.T. Starr, Sr., Mrs. J.T. Starr, Sr., Mrs. J.T. Stovall, Mr. and Mrs. A.F. Strickland, Mr. and Mrs. W.M. Turman, Mr. and Mrs. W.P. Turman, Miss Eunice Fleming, Miss Myrtle Fleming and Miss Florence Turman. Of the 35 charter members received into the church, only one survives (in 1984), Miss Eunice Fleming, now Mrs. Eunice Fleming Phillips, at Brown Memorial Convalescent Center, Royston, Georgia.

The church was placed on the Royston circuit in 1908. Pastors who have served include W.W. Gaines, W.A. Simmons, F.D. Cantrell, T.M. Sullivan, Irby Henderson, M.B. Whitaker, S.T. Sherrill, Charles Johnson, Phillip Banner, James—Howell and Terry F. DeLand.

#### Canon Universalist Church

William F. Bowers, who was born in the year of 1825 and at the age of 25 was a very active Baptist minister, was very much interested in the youth of that day and constantly admonished them to study the Bible. He held a weekly lesson in his home every Friday night where the youth of the entire community were invited to attend. On the first meeting in January he would begin with the first chapter of the Bible, and arrange the lessons so that they would be through the Bible by the last meeting in December.

During the War Between the States, Marion Cheek, Stephen P. Bond, John M. Bowers, John Manley, Albert J. Owens and many others became very much interested in the Bible and were regular students of Uncle Billy's meetings until they were married and settled in and around West Bowersville, Ga., now Canon, Ga. Here they organized a weekly Bible school and continued to study the Bible. Strange as it may seem, they all began to have doubts as to the destiny of mankind, but were reluctant to mention it for sometime until John Bowers, by this time an active Baptist preacher, and Marion Cheek, who had been a Baptist preacher for many years, began to confide in each other expressing a doubt in the belief of endless torment. Finding themselves very much in accord, they approached Stephen Bond and, to their surprise, found him of the same opinion. In the meantime they, with other members of the old Canon church, which now stands about 3 miles east of Canon, Ga., had built a church house in Canon a few feet from the present church and were holding regular services as a Baptist church.

After prayerful consideration of their version of the Bible they decided to go in a body and consult their old leader and teacher "Old Uncle Billy," who very readily warned them of the dangers of such a step. This slowed them up for a little while; but they continued holding their meeting every week, which

#### Fairview Baptist Church - Established 1897

Under the leadership of Deacon Sam Slone, Rev. Mid Cleveland and Brothers Dave Gordon, Juber Merritt, Will Earls, O.W. Frazer, Ben Scott, Crof Norman, Sisters Glara Merritt, Georgia Teasley, Ellen Earls, Francie Sadler, Lucy Bowers, and Laura Allen rented a one-room cabin just below where the church now stands, as a place to worship. Mr. Free Cleveland gave the land and deeds where the present church is located. The Robinson, Scott, Clark and Burke families moved to Lavonia and they all worked together to help organize the church. Rev. George Norris presided at the organization and served as minister for a while. Others who have served were Rev. Buck Johnson, Rev. Will Burrus, Rev. James Long, Rev. W.L. Johnson, Rev. W.L. The 80th anniversary of the Fairview Baptist Church was observed on June 19, 1977.

#### Fairview United Methodist Church

Fairview United Methodist Church was organized with 34 members in May 1894 under a brush arbor near the site of the church. This was used until the present church was built in 1895. Dedicated in 1898.

On April 19, 1895 Mrs. E.J. Sewell gave the land to be used for the building of Fairview Church and cemetery. The deed for three and six-tenths acres was signed by Mr. E.J. Sewell, J.R.P. Sewell and Mrs. Lon D. Jackson. The land was deeded to T.A. Norris, C.B. Sewell, J. Rutherford, Oscar Cannon, and J.M. Thomason, the first trustees of the church.

Mr. T.A. Norris was the first Sunday school superintendent. Others have been S.K. Cannon, J.M. Thomason, T.A. Norris, Ben McWhorter, Ford McWhorter, M.P. Sewell, John McFarland, W.J. Bond, John Ledbetter, Morris Cheek, Grady Haley, Thurston Whitfield, Lee McWhorter, Marvin Chitwood and Coy Haley.

The following preachers have served as pastors from 1895 to 1984: F.D. Cantrell, W.A. Simmons, S.H. Dimon, John T. Lowe, John T. Yarborough, Walter Milligan, Walter King, M.B. Sams, C.A. Norton, J.C. Adams, C.D. Read, W.A. Woodruff, W.W. Cash, J.H. Couch, L.P. Webb, Sewell Dixon, A.P. Watkins, A.T. Hinds, J.R. Phillips, J.R. Rollins, H.B. Simms, E.W. Dunagan, Dean Milford, Marion Dunn, Marion Conway, Jack Wood, B.B. Berry, P.B. Barnhart, Jack Gillespie, Douglas Harmon, Cecil Dudley and Z. Walton McNeal.

Some of the faithful and loyal workers of the U.M.W. were Mesdames Tom Bailey, W.J. Bond, Frank Cannon, John Ledbetter, E.E. McWhorter, Farris Parker, C.A. Turner, Oscar White and others.

From 1895 until 1957 Fairview was on the Lavonia circuit. At present the church is on the Allens-Carnesville charge. This church building was struck by lightning July 1985 and completely destroyed by fire.

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#### Gaines' Chapel United Methodist Church

Gaines' Chapel church is the outgrowth of a Sunday school conducted in the Dawkins schoolhouse where Andrew Reynolds, Warren Allen, Jeff Addison and George Jordan have served as superintendents.

Early in the fall of 1909, W.W Gaines who served the church occasionally conducted a revival at the school. O.L. Kelley, pastor of Hartwell, was invited to do the preaching. It proved to be a great revival. Soon after, necessary action was taken toward organization of a church, and with the organization of the church many members of Old Carroll's moved their membership to the new church.

W.A. Simmons succeeded Brother Gaines as pastor in 1912. It fell his lot to steer the building of the church which was finished in 1913 and dedicated by T.J. Christian, the presiding elder. It was given the name Gaines' Chapel after the former pastor. Other pastors who have served are Brother Simmons, F.D. Cantrell, T.M. Sullvan, Irby Henderson, M.B. Whitaker, J.G. Davis, F.E. Crutcher, O.E. Smith, G.G. Ramsey, J.V. Jones, Z.V. Hawks, Carl Stanley, G.T. Shell, Hoyt Gurley, J.W. Coffman, W.E. Brown, S.T. Sherrill, O.E. Green, Frank Jenkins, J.W. Woodruff, Jesse Warwiek, Turner Taylor, Foster Smith, B.C. Madson (supply), W.L. Martin, Kenneth Deitle, Dean Milford, Larry McIntosh and Terry DeLand.

In January 1941 it was decided to tear down the old church and build a new one. The new church building was completed and dedicated in the late summer of 1941 with the Rev. S.T. Sherrill as pastor.

Complete renovation was completed in September 1963 and the rededication held on Sunday, September 22, 1963. The building committee for this renovation was Nelson Casey, chairman; Hubert Casey, C.L. Vaughn, James Hall, R.C. Hart, Edward Stratton, Lewis Dawkins, Dean Cochran, Delmar Ayers, Jack Graham, Dwight Massey.

#### Franklin Springs Baptist Church

The Franklin Springs Baptist Church was organized in 1866. The first pastor was Rev. Billy Bowers of Cannon, Ga. The church, made of logs, burned and was replaced by a wood-framed church where about 1925, the church held its first Homecoming. The Governor of Georgia, Mr. Hardman, was guest speaker.

It seems that during many years the church just drifted along and did not accomplish much. In 1944 the church was completely destroyed by a tornado. Friends and members worked together and the building began to rise again. For a while services were held in an unfurnished building. Later, money was raised to finish the building. Finally in 1968 the church was completely remodeled into a modern, well-equipped church.

At this time, we have a great pastor, the Reverend Durell Anderson. The church, Fellowship Hall, and a new organ have all been paid for in full. The Lord has been good to us!

#### Lavonia Presbyterian Church

The Reverend Henry F. Hoyt organized 11 members into the Lavonia Presbyterian Church in 1889. Early members listed include S.K. Dendy, R.T. Poole, Jesse LeCroy, Charles A. Allison, J.H. Pullen, Mrs. R.T. Poole, Miss Rosa Poole, Miss Rosa Poole's mother, H.C. Verner, T.W. McAllister, and Mrs. McAllister. Services were held alternately in the Methodist and Baptist churches once a month until the Presbyterian church building was completed in September 1890.

From the time the church was organized in 1889, until the present (1977), the church has had 15 ordained ministers and approximately 25 students serving it well. The 15 ordained ministers are: Henry F. Hoyt, L.A. Simpson, M.E. Peabody, G.N. Howerton, Fritz Rauschenburg, James Bradley, J.B. Nelson, J.M. Waggett, C.E. Bell, Miles C. Wood, James Coad, Eugene M. Musselwhite, James Coad, Joseph D. Renfro.

The first elders were T.W. McAllister and Mr. C.A. Allison. McAllister served as Clerk of the Session until 1912, when he moved from Lavonia. Nineteen others have served the church: H.C. Verner, E.R. McMurry, H.B. Bible, W.J. Freeman, O.L. Freeman, J.N. Telford, R.T. Poole, Dr. J.M. Freeman, R.A. Wilbanks, James McDaniel, C.B. Shirley, W.M. McMurry, H.T. Long, H.H. Broome, Charles Wilbanks, E.M. Foster, Hoke Miller, Louie Reed, E.E. Purcell.

Deacons include: James McDaniel, A. Mason McDaniel, S.A. Verner, J.M. Broome, J.G. Siler, J.G. Siler, Jr., J.H. Pullen, F.P. Ferguson, H.H. Broome, C.B. Shirley, J.A. Matheson, Charles Wilbanks, Same Carnes, Douglas F. Williamson, James F. Little, E.E. Purcell, Hoke Miller, Sam A. Verner, Jr., Pope Yow, Jones Beasley, R.C. Holstun, Bobby McMurry.

Early in the year 1959, the church withdrew from the Franklin County group of churches and joined with the Sharon Church of Hart County. In May of that year, a manse was bought in Lavonia.

The Reverend Claude Andrews became the first full-time pastor of Lavonia Presbyterian Church where he was installed in 1970.

With the installation of the current pastor, the Reverend Joseph D. Renfro, the Lavonia Church became one of the pioneering churches in the new Presbyterian program of "tent-making ministries," wherein the minister is both a full-time pastor and a full-time employee in a secular position. Current membership is forty-seven.

#### Lavonia United Methodist Church

The Lavonia Methodist Episcopal Church South was organized in 1880. The first services were held in the upper story of the Joe Vickery store. Charter members were: Mrs. Gertrude Bost Allison, Mr. & Mrs. Tom Joe Blackwell.

On May 14, 1879, one acre was deeded from John H. Jones, T.J. Bowman, J.H. Grogan to Trustees of the Methodist Church — T.J. Blackwell, G.W. Sewell, S.J. Walters, G.W. Canady, W.O. Sayer, O.P. Ledbetter, C.T. Campbell, for consideration of \$5.00 for the sole and exclusive use of church and religious purposes.

The first church was constructed about 1883. This building was a small frame structure. The building committee was G.W. Sewell, O.P. Ledbetter, W.O. Sayer, and T.J. Blackwell. The first pastor was I.H. Parks.

The present building was completed in the late 1940's. The Lavonia Methodist Church has had five members who have gone into the ministry: John Boyd Stephenson, dec'd; Hoke Sewell, retired; Barrett Smith, David Agnew (active). Darby Cannon, III, Professor of Religion, Rutgers University, Camden, N.J.

#### Melvin Hill C.M.E. Church

One day a group of friends got together and built a brush arbor which was the first Melvin Hill Church. It was in 1871 and the church was organized in 1872. The first building consisted of logs and was on land originally owned by the Mayfield family and donated to the church.

There have been three churches built on this site. Between the years of 1908 and 1911, a lovely white structure was built at the end of the road off Highway 164, on the original site. This was in Bold Springs Community, near Carnesville. Rev. David Teasley was pastor. The building committee was J.C. Goss, and T.M. Haley, The secretary was R.P. Bush.

The pastors have been as follows: White, Pendergrass 1908, Chiles 1911, David Teasley, Mose Jones 1912, Pitts, Bailey, G.E. Murray, Wilcox 1920, J.H. Johnson 1924, Wheeler 1926, E.L. Green 1928, C.A. Wise 1933, S.S. Brewer 1937, Counter 1941, J.A. Glaze 1944, Plummer 1945, F.N. Rushing 1946, J.D. McLaughtin 1950, David Horne 1954, F.N. Rushing 1959, W.R. Jenkins 1960, T.J. Jackson 1962, J.A. Jordon 1982.

Trustees have been: C.H. McWhorter, J.M. Wilhite, J.M. Gunnels, P.J. Mayfield, H.J. Bush, S.W. Haley, A.L. Goss, G.M. Mayfield, R.H. Morris, S.M. Bush and Fred Stowers.

Samuel B. Sanders preached at a brush arbor not far from where the meeting house now stands, during the summer months for two years before the church was constituted.

The minutes show that they held their first conference on the 17th day of May, 1856, the day following their organization. Lemuel N. Tribble was elected church clerk and Samuel B. Sanders was elected pastor. The church joined the Baptist State Convention of August 15, 1857.

A notation found in the minute book of 1888-1896 shows "Pleasant Grove Baptist Church rebuilt 1895 and sealed in 1897. . ." The present church building was completed in 1949 and additions have since been made.

## Pleasant Hill Baptist Church

The Pleasant Hill Baptist Church is situated about 2 miles north of Lavonia. Lt was constituted October 18, 1872 by the following Presbytery: Rev. Jesse Brown, and Deacons: R.C. Burgess of Clarks Creek; L.A. Tribble and Hezekiah Hughs of Pleasant Grove; B.P. Vandiver of Broad River; A.J. York of Poplar Springs; and W.M. Baldwin from Corinth.

The charter members were Solomon Gillespie, Elizabeth G. Gillespie, Mary E. Gillespie, Nancy L. Gillespie, Louise Cassann Gillespie, Henry Pierce and wife, John and Nancy Pierce, Sarah Ann Thomas, W.W. Thomas and Mary F. Thomas. Rev. Jesse Brown was elected pastor. The same day those joining were: Rev. Jesse Brown and wife, Alford Gunyon, wife and daughter, Ann and Sabre Guinn, A.L. Stephenson, Margarette Crawford and others.

About 1860 Billy Smith donated a lot for a cemetery and it was on this lot the first church was built. It was built of hewn logs and was about  $20 \times 30$  feet. It was completed in 1881. In 1931 a building committee was appointed to plan for a larger building, as follows: Rev. E.R. Broadwell, chairman; B.L. Price. G.D. Crawford, Levis Thomas, Ivan Thomas and N.L. Smith, G.L. McConnell was treasurer. The first service in the new building took place March 3, 1932. Many improvements and additions have been made since then. The present building is valued at \$44,000.

The following have gone out from this church as ministers: J.W. Wilson 1875; W.J. Pearman in 1897; Homer Littleton 1940. The Littleton family went to the

mission field in Nigeria. The following have served as deacons: T.A. Gunyon (the only deacon when the church was organized in 1872), J.Y. Burgess, W.W. Thomas, W.C. Wilson. REA DONOHUE

#### Poplar Springs Baptist Church

Poplar Springs Baptist Church was established in 1805 and is the mother church of the Tugalo Baptist Association. Many land owners and slaves were members. The slave cemetery is to the right of the church on the Yow Estate. On September 12, 1818 delegates from 13 churches met there to form the Tugalo Baptist Association of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Some early members were Joseph Chandler, Thomas Wilkins, John Nail, John Mullins, James Jackson, Henry Stovall, James Randall, Jimmy Allen, Sarah E. Allen, Susan P. Allen, Elijah Griffin, Thomas Farmer, Nancy Stovall, Elizabeth Stovall, Heaty Caroline Stovall, G.N. Stovall, Charles W. Randal, A.C. Richie, John T. Whitworth, Cynthia T. Yow.

The church was given a plot of ground adjoining the church on June 10, 1889 by Henry Garner. The congregation voted to build a new "Meeting House." M.A. Adams was appointed to see if he could get a sawmill to locate on the site to saw the lumber for the new "Meeting House." The building committee elected was H.S. Whitworth, G.D. Thomas, F.T. Whitworth, W.J. Patterson, J.M. Morgan, M.A. Adams, J.W. Harrison, W.M. Stovall, A.P. Davile, T.B. Harrison, G.F. Gilbert, J.W. Robertson. The new church building was dedicated May 1897 and Rev. W.J. Purcell preached the dedication sermon.

The ministers who have served Poplar Springs Church have been Lewis Ballard and James Smith in 1822, John Cleveland, Thomas Gilbert and Francis Calloway Jr., supplied the church until 1826. From 1826 until 1855 the church was supplied by David Simmons, Matthew Vandiver, Andrew Cobb, John F. York and Jacob Burruss. The following ministers served: Reverends Isbell, D.H. #### SPELLING AND PUNCTUATION

The abstractor has made every effort to copy names as they appear to be written by the recorder, with particular attention given to the names and signatures of grantors, grantees and witnesses.

In copying the names of places, etc., variations have been shown with the exception of Tugalo River and Eastanolle Creek. There are almost as many spellings of these two names as there are entries.

In early deeds the lack of punctuation often causes ambiguities and uncertainties as to the exact intent of the instrument. Without the use of the comma a list of adjoining land owners might be shown as, "Richardson Johnson Randle Wyly Thompson Hardy," all of which are common sir-names, and all, of which are used as given names among Franklin Co. families. To make a thorough search for all entries of a particular name, the researcher should check the index for all entries showing it as a given name.

The apostrophe was also seldom used to denote the plural or possessive use of a name in the earlier deeds. In this case the name Hay becomes Hayes, May becomes Mayes, Jones-Joneses, Mullins - Mullinses, etc.

#### SIGNATURES

The use of <u>Signed "....."</u> will be found only in those cases where the signature varies from the spelling or use of the name within the body of the instrument.

The use of (x) following the signature or name of a granton of witness shows that he

The use of (x) following the signature or name of a grantor of witness shows that he signed by a mark. After studying these deeds, it is the opinion of the abstractor that the fact that a person signed by mark does not necessarily mean that he could not write his name.

#### MICROFILM

References in notes and footnotes to photographing or microfilming are to the Franklin County deeds as they appear on microfilm. The early Franklin County deed books are stored in the waults of the Georgia Archives, and are no longer available to the researcher. These books were turned over to the Archives in 1928 by the Clerk of the Superior Count of Franklin County. In 1957 these books were microfilmed by the Genealogical Society of Salt Lake. Preparing this material for filming must have been a difficult task, since many of the books had tome apart at the seams, and numerous pages were torn or frayed and the link faded almost beyond reading. After examining abstracts made by others in the past from the original pages, it appears that badly faded portions may actually be more easily read from the microfilm.

#### THE GENERAL INDEX

References to "The General Index" have been made to those pages which appear to be missing, but which were apparently still available when indexes were made.

There is a microfilm copy of three indexes made to the Franklin County Deed Books. The first index is designated "Book Y", and was apparently made about 1872, and covers all deed books up to that time. It is a grantor-grantee index only, with names grouped by letter, and then chronologically by deed book. The second index is to Deed Books 0, 00, 000, P, PP, R, RR, RRR, T, TT, TTT, MY, MMM, HH, HHH, E, only, with the same format as the first index. The third index is a typescript index to "Personal and Proper names" found in Book Y. None of these indexes is completely accurate. Because so many pages have been renumbered, and other page numbers obliterated or torn away, many entries in these indexes are impossible, or difficult to find.

#### DEED BOOK LETTERING

The abstractor has no explanation for the manner of lettering used in the Franklin County Beed Books. There is little doubt that the first book is "C". There is no book lettered "PPP", and no books lettered "S". There are many pages of deeds missing, but there is no evidence of any missing books.

#### LEGAL DEFINITIONS

The researcher should consult Black's Law <u>Dictionary</u> or other legal dictionary for definitions of legal terms and phraseology found in these early deeds. The commentaries on Release of Dower, release in general, joint tenants, tenants in common, messuage, mojety, mortgage, quit claim, warranty deeds, etc., are are well worth reading.

# APPENDIX II Franklin County Line changes

The following items were copied from the Franklin County file in the Surveyor General's Sifice at the Georgia Archives. They pertain to the creation of Franklin Co., subsequent counties created out of Franklin Co., and various line changes. The researcher who is interested in families who lived along these lines should also check county line changes made in those counties created from Franklin.

The most northern branch or stream of the River Savannah from the sea, or mouth of such stream, to the fork or confluence of the Rivers now called Tugoloo and Keowee, and from thence the northern branch or stream of the said River Tugoloo till it intersects the northern boundary line of South Carolina \*\*\*, reserving all the islands in the said Rivers Savannah and Tugoloo to Georgia, \*\*\* shall forever hereafter form the separation limit and boundary between the States of South Carolina and Georgia.

#### Article Fourth

The State of Georgia shall not hereafter claim any lands to the northward or northeastward of the boundary above established, but hereby relinquishes and cedes to the State of South Carolina all the right, title and claim which the said State of Georgia hath to the government, sovereignty and jurisdiction in and over the, and also the right of pre-emption of the soil from the native Indians, and all other the estate, property and claim which the State of Georgia hath in and to the said lands.

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





Enjoyed seeing both of you at the Conference in Decatur, but wish we could have spent more time together.

Am sending you an Index for 1870 Alabama Census for Yarbroughs. I don't think this index is available in many libraries at this time.

After we left you we went to Clay County, AL for some "on the spot researching". At the Clay County Library I looked at their cemetery books for Clay County and found my Pleasant J. Yarbrough was not listed! I hotfooted it to County Line Cemetery and found his grave right away. It is the only above ground grave in the whole cemetery with a small marker at the foot with his name. Beside him was a small marker for his wife, Margaret Yarbrough. Went to another Clay County Gemetery, "Mt Gilead Methodist Church Cemetery" where another ancestor, is buried, and quite by accident found the graves of Benjamin B. Stephens and his wife Mary T. Yarbrough Stephens. She was the daughter of Allen's and my John Yarbrough. Here are some dates if you want to add them to their page: Benjamin B. Stephens b. 8 Jan 1804 d. 14 Jan 1885. Mary T. Yarbrough b. 3 May 1810 d. 9 Nov 1883 - both in Clay Co., AL They had been in Census of Troup Co, GA 1840; Randolph Co, AL 1850, Tallapoosa Co, AL 1860

From there we went to Anniston, AL to a wonderful library (that's where I copied the Census Index I am sending) P. J. Y. is not listed in the 1870 Index, and is incorrectly listed as "Robert" for Pleasant in the 1880 Soundex! Several years ago I got the 1880 Soundex info and copied it. After the librarian checked the M/F, she corrected their records.

Ophelia, would you be so kind as to fill out a 5-generation chart on Allen for me? I have records on Henry S and Stokes Allen, brothers of PJY, but cannot bring it up to Allen. I don't know for sure which is his ancestor. Henry or Stokes Allen. I'd really appreciate it if you'd take the time to give me this information.

I also want to call your attention to this: Article on Drewery Allen which I copied in the Decatur Public Library which says this Drewery Allen was the son of Young Allen & Martha Coleman Allen. Our records show him as the son of Robert Allen, Jr. What's correct?


Since Rea is the new treasurer, I will send my membership dues to her, and save Arline the trouble of forwarding. I will complete the interest statement and send it to her.

Look forward to hearing what you have to say about the Allens, and also the info I need on Allen Yarbrough.



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



Hilley's Corner Grocery was opened January 1960. It was located on the corner of Main Street, Highway 19, and Concord Street at the red light. The store was a general mercantile and meat market. It was owned and operated by Huie P. and Vivian C. Hilley with their children Rodney and Gary Hilley.

It was open for nine years at which time they moved the store to Molena, Ga. The name was changed to Hilley's Finer Foods. This was the first self service and meat market with a walk in cooler to ever be in Molena. They also put out the first sale paper ever in Molena.

## HOLLONVILLE CANNING COMPANY ABOUT 1922-1923

The Hollonville Cannery was located under a shelter adjoining a cotton gin, owned and operated by Mr. Jim Yarbrough and his sons. The gin house, facing the Hollonville-Brooks Roed, was behind the old school house in the triangle, formed by the meeting of the Sullivan Mill Road and Brooks Road in Hollonville. Donald and Vivian Scott

Connell are now (1987) living in the house nearby which at that time was the home of Mr. Jim and Mrs. Ada Yarbrough.

Mr. Ed H. Scott was manager of the cannery. I believe Mr. Tom Patton had an interest in it. Those of us who prepared the tomatoes were seated on a long bench, on each side of a trough-like table. The tomatoes were scalded until the skins cracked; then they were brought by buckets full, poured into the trough, where they were cored and peeled and put into an individual bucket. When full, the bucket was picked up by an attendant and emptied into a large cooking container. A "fake coin" dropped into the bucket was exchanged for money (10 to 15¢), when a whistle told us to stop for the day. The buckets were furnished, but we brought our own knives and aprons.

The tomatoes were hand-packed (as the labels stated) into tin cans of 1 lb. 3 oz. Mr. Ed Scott's son, Edgar, operated the sealing machine, which he pedaled with his foot. The sealed cans were dumped into a tank of boiling water and cooked, cooled and the special label glued on. Some of these were sold in a Hollonville store. Juice from preparing the tomatoes was also canned.

Boxes of old, well-preserved, unused labels have been found in Mr. Tom Patton's old barn in Hollonville. There is no doubt they were left over from the tomato cannery because, printed on the label is a big, red tomato, a bi-plane and words "Flint River and "Hollonville Canning Company". The bi-plane is similar to the plane Doug Davis flew in World War I and then flew home to Pike County after the war. I remember seeing Doug and his plane at the Spalding County Fair Grounds, where he took people up for a ride. Also, Doug was a good friend of Mr. Ed Scott's son, Berner. This might explain the bi-plane picture on the tomato label.

# HOME NURSERY HISTORY

The Home Nursery was organized as a partnership between W. Herbert Bottoms and John W. Oxford in 1938. Herbert worked for the H.G. Hastings firm for several years prior to starting this nursery. It has been an integral part of the Concord community since. The first crops to be grown were roses and fruit trees. This was before the time of the patented varieties of roses. Everything was grown in the fields. Container growing is relatively new on the scene. The first shrubs that were grown were Gardenias, Hollies, and Flowering Shrubs. These were sold and dug in the field while the customer waited.


In 1950 a severe freeze devastated the entire crop. So, in essence, the entire business had to begin again. In the mid-1950's garden centers began appearing on the scene. The Bottoms's and the Oxford's decided to follow this concept in order to be better able to serve their community. The business also carried on a complementary wholesale business at the same time which supplied garden centers and landscape firms in the Atlanta area.

In 1966, Herbert and Gambyss bought John Oxford's share of the nursery and became the sole owners. In 1976, upon retirement, they in turn sold the nursery to their daughter and son-in-law, Marjorie and Wayne Harrison. The nursery continues under their management today — making this a nursery that has been one family for a period of 50 years.

Abraham's second marriage was to Elizabeth Steger, a spinster who was nearing her 50th year at the time.

Abraham was universally liked. He was a strong man of likes and dislikes, sometimes feuding with brother-in-law and son-in-law. Abraham and Martha's home was at the junction of present day Reidsboro and Midway roads. Abraham and Elizabeth's home was between Zebulon and Williamson, it has been moved from its original site and is now being used as a storage house. Abraham first joined Smith's Chapel Methodist Church (now a colored church) however, he transferred to Red Oak Methodist in Williamson, where he was very active. The Methodist church in that day required their leaders to live above reproach so at one time Abraham was called before the church and was reprimanded for his conduct, he apologized and was forgiven.

Abraham was not a wealthy man but he owned many acres of land and as early as 1840, when he was 27 yrs. old he had 12 slaves according to 1840 census. Abraham died July 3, 1893 and is buried in family plot at Reidsboro, across railroad tracks where he and Martha lived.

Drewery Allen, son of Young and Martha Coleman Allen, one of the early settlers of Pike County was born in Orange County, N.C. in 1749. Drewery married Elizabeth Yarbrough who was born May 9, 1752. In 1776 Drewery enlisted in the Continental Army, N.C. and served throughout the War. He left his wife Elizabeth and did not see her again for seven years. He was often within forty miles of home but he was never able to visit her. These years had wrought great changes in him and his wife did not know him when he finally returned. He served under Washington at the battle of Brandywine and was in on the kill at Yorktown, Va. He was also with Greene in Carolinas at the battle of Cowpens and Guilford Court House.

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

The inscription on his tombstone states that, "He was one of the first settlers in Pike County, 1822, lived 54 years on the same lot of land which he drew". This inscription further states, "To do justice, have mercy and walk humbly before God was my motto". His first wife Frances is listed as my motto". His first wife Frances is listed as the first member of the Red Oak Methodist Church in 1823 transferring by letter. This is now the First United Methodist Church in Williamson, Ga.

Young D. Allen was born between 1790 and 1800. He married, Dec. 21, 1812 Jane (Jincey) Moore, born in Person Co., N.C. in 1796. Young Allen died in 1848.
Young Allen was one of the early settlers of Pike County, Georgia, coming here with his father in 1824 or just prior to that date. In 1820 he was living in Greene County, Georgia with his wife and two small children and was listed as a planter in the 1820 census.
By 1830 Young was well on his way toward establishing a successful life in the newly formed county of Pike. In 1836 his land holdings had increased to over 1600 acres in Pike County alone; his will mentions additional land in Lee County.

BOOK A pg 81 ORIGINAL INDEX which he was born. With the coming of Autumn every year, I become homesick for my birthplace—Pike County, and the sight of my old plantation home.

"There is one particular place where memory returns when Jack Frost comes—a lone chimney in a cotton field near Griffin, Georgia. When I was small, I used to ride in the buggy with my grandfather by this place.

Invariably grandfather would stop "Kit", his old gray mare, by this lone mud chimney that stood on hallowed ground—the spot that marked his early ancestor's *Drewery Allen's* home. Then he would tell me again that following a bloody war, that this man migrated from North Carolina to Pike County, to begin life anew. Proudly grandfather told me that all the land lying before our eyes had been in the Allen family for more than fifty years.

"Impatiently I listened, but I was not interested in ancient history at the age of ten. Wars and family background meant little to me then, but now—silver-haired and mellowed I say

"Age is a funny thing.
Cherished in trees, and recipes—and cheese—and laces
And furniture—and wine—
Everything but me."

Family Names and War Records

Many descendants have been honored to bear *Drewery Allen's* first name. This name has been handed down from one generation to the next for over two hundred years. However, it has been shortened to *Drew*.

The pioneer, Drewery Allen, born December 1, 1749, married Elizabeth Yarbrough (called Betty) in 1814, named a son and a grandson Drewery.

John Ray and Sarah Frances Sanders named a son Drew. Sarah Frances' eldest son, Edgar, named one of his sons for Drewery Allen. Drew Camp Sanders who loves family history, lives at 110 Olive Street, Texarkana, Texas. Young six-year-old Drew Atkinson of 10 Iris Circle, Longview, Texas, grandson of Drew Camp Sanders, carries on the family name.

## Courage-War Record

Although not named Drew, Ex-Governor Sidney Sanders McMath of Little Rock, Arkansas inherited some of his great-grandmother's courage. Grandson of Edgar Sanders, Sidney served Arkansas as Governor at the age of 32 during the years 1948-1952.

Lieutenant Colonel Sidney Sanders McMath of the Marines led his men through the Battle of the "Cibek Ridge," during which the Marines experienced some of their fiercest fighting in the Bougainville campaign in 1943. During World War II, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel on the field of battle by Secretary of the Navy Knox, who visited the Pacific in November, 1943.

BAD date: 1814-impossible there is no doubt but we will fight the Federals as they come out but I have my doubt of them leaving their gunboats. I suppose that Kirby Smith looks for a fight as he is at Little Rock in person.

Sunday, August 16th.

Our Regt. is in three files. One in Camp near Brownsville at a place near Ashley Station on Grand Prairie, the others a few miles from Clarendon. Colonel Newton is near the river with the main force. This is a half-way place commanded by the major and serves as a recruiting post and courier post. Three boats, two guns and one transport, passed up the river, stopped at Des Arc and burnt the business of a Stewart & Brothers, broke their safe, took sixteen thousand dollars and ransacked others and some say all over town and got in all money about twenty-five thousand dollars. They passed on but I have not heard how high they passed up the river. I heard they could not get far above Des Arc. They passed down yesterday. Our scouts and the Federals scouts got within three hundred yards of each other vesterday and it is thought the Feds took fright and crossed the river as our scouts could not find them afterwards.

The Feds are at Clarendon with their principal force, variously estimated, some as high as ten thousand. Yesterday transports passed up to Clarendon with artillery. I reckon the Feds are preparing to give us a fight, or trying to scare us. If the former they will have a sweet time of it. If the latter, they will get their labor for their pains. There has been two desertions from our company: Bailey Woods and Jean Yarborough. Bailey Woods wore off my boots. I had got him to change with me on account of my leg. The shoes he left are worn out. I think he will send my boots home. Send to him for them and send them to Elbert Smith to mend as they are ripped. I fortunately bought me a good pair of shoes yesterday. I don't know why the boys left only they got

tired and had not been paid off. I think all will be paid off as soon as matters quiet a little so that the Regt. can get together.

I loaned James Yarborough five dollars the day I left home. His note is there. I don't know whether he will ever pay it or not. I can't collect his wages in his absence. Captain Johnson brings word that matters up there are in an awful condition, that the people are nearly all scared to death, that all that can possibly move are preparing to get off. Charles Plant came down same day and says matters about as quiet as usual; that the people are not at all alarmed and that matters in general are doing well. I hope the latter is true. I don't see any special cause for alarm. \* \* \*

\* \* \* \*

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August 18th.

Mr. John M. Hicks got into camp yesterday and delivered me your very kind favor of tenth and eleventh inclosing forty dollars for which please accept my thanks. It would have come in good time but I borrowed the day before fifty dollars from Charley Plant, gave him my due bill and instructed him to call upon you for the money. It does seem that I am getting through with money rapidly but our boys are so needy and they call on me for it, and I hate to deny when I know they will pay as soon as they draw their money. \* \* \* I am glad that you have got your turnips sown. I do hope they may do well. I hope that you will not have to give up George. I think that running negroes to Texas is played out. If you have to give up George try to buy you a boy or a man. At the present prices for wages you will soon pay out the worth of a negro. Try to get a good one and if he runs off let him go. A negro is as certain as Confederate money. If I have a chance I will buy a negro. I could have bought one while in Jackson County but could not get leave of absence as we thought we were closely pressed. \* \* \* If Matt wants to go into the Cavalry service he had better buy him a horse as soon as possible; and make him fat. Tell

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#### INTRODUCTION

The Southern Christian Advocate began publication in Charleston in 1837. The place of publication was changed to Augusta, Georgia, April 10, 1862. Publication was suspended April 13, 1865 until June 20, 1865, when it resumed in Macon, Georgia. A complete or near complete file of this newspaper is extant and housed at the South Caroliniana Library, Columbia, South Carolina. It was the Methodist newspaper for the Southeast, but occasional notices of unchurched persons and persons of other denominations appear as well. The Lutheran clergy apparently used this paper to some degree, possibly because the Lutheran Observer in Baltimore was the closets publication of that denomination until the Southern Lutheran commenced at Charleston in 1861. Southern Lutheran commenced at Charleston in 1861

This volume will be a good tool for anyone doing genealogi-This volume will be a good tool for anyone doing genealogical research in the South, especially for doing a surname study, and for determining migration routes. The detail of the obituaries is surprising for the period, often giving dates of birth and marriage, as well as various places of residence. It is especially important for the many burned counties of South Carolina and Georgia. Many notices from Orangeburg, Colleton and Beaufort Districts., S. C., are found here.

As this volume progressed, it became apparent that the size would be unwieldy if much detail were included. For that reason, the abstracts are necessarily shorter after about 1850. I have tried to include all vital dates, and any mention of a denomina-

In a work this large, mistakes are not only possible, they are likely. Check any entry vital to your search. #### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

# THE YARBROUGH NATIONAL GENEALOGICAL & HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION, INC.

The undersigned incorporator hereby forms a nonstock, notfor-profit corporation under the Virginia Nonstock Corporation Act, Chapter 10 of Title 13.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, and to that end sets forth the following:

- 1. Name. The name of the Corporation is THE YARBROUGH NATIONAL GENEALOGICAL & HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION, INC. (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation").
- 2. <u>Purposes</u>. The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:
- (a) To discover and memorialize the genealogy and history of the Yarbrough family and the history of the times and places in which the members of such family lived; to discover, purchase, commission, or otherwise procure, and to publish or otherwise preserve, writings, newspapers, journals, and the like, which shed light on the genealogy and history of the Yarbrough family; to discover, procure, and preserve physical objects that may relate to the genealogy and history of the Yarbrough family; and to hold regular meetings and other activities for the education of the members of the Corporation;
- (b) To promote and encourage historical research; to collect and preserve records, relics, and other things of historical interest; and to foster and promote public knowledge of, and interest in, local, national, and world history;
- (c) For charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax law; and
- (d) The transaction of any and all lawful business not required to be specifically stated in these Articles of Incorporation for which corporations may be incorporated under the Virginia Nonstock Corporation Act.
- 3. <u>Powers</u>. The Corporation shall have all of the powers granted to nonstock corporations by the Virginia Nonstock Corporation Act.

- 4. Restriction on Activities and Earnings. No part of the assets or net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 2 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. standing any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under § 501(c)(3) of the Code, or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax law, or (ii) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under § 170(c)(2) of the Code, or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax law.
- 5. <u>Membership</u>. The Corporation shall have members. The bylaws of the Corporation may designate one or more classes of members, and may set forth the qualifications and rights (including voting rights) of each such designated class.
- 6. Registered Office and Agent. The initial registered office is located in the County of Fairfax, Virginia, and the address is 1320 Old Chain Bridge Road, Third Floor, McLean, Virginia, 22101. The name of the initial registered agent at such address is David M. Davenport, who is a resident of the Commonwealth of Virginia and a member of the Virginia State Bar.

#### 7. Number and Selection of Directors.

- (a) All directors shall be members of the Corporation, but a director need not be a resident of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- (b) The size of the Board of Directors shall be fixed by the bylaws.
- (c) The initial directors shall be elected by the incorporator of the Corporation. At the first annual meeting of members and thereafter, directors shall be elected by the members entitled to vote for directors. The bylaws of the Corporation shall set forth the procedure by which directors are elected, including a provision that one or more groups of

directors shall be elected by a designated class or classes of members.

- (d) The term of office for all directors shall be three (3) years. The terms of directors shall be staggered by dividing the number of directors into three (3) groups, with each group containing one-third (1/3) of the total, as near as may be, with the initial terms of directors in the first group to expire at the first annual meeting of members after their second annual meeting of members after their election, and the initial term of the third group to expire at the third annual meeting of members after their election. Thereafter, each group of such directors shall serve a term of three (3) years as established above.
- (e) The Board of Directors may have  $\underline{\text{ex}}$  officionembers, in accordance with the bylaws.
- 8. <u>Limitation on Liability of Officers and Directors</u>. An officer or director of the Corporation who serves without compensation for his services shall not be liable for damages in any proceeding brought by or in the right of the Corporation, or brought by or on behalf of the members of the Corporation; provided, however, that the liability of an officer or director shall not be limited as provided in this Section 8 if the officer or director engaged in (i) willful misconduct or (ii) a knowing violation of criminal law.
- 9. <u>Indemnification of Directors, Officers, Employees and Agents</u>. The Corporation shall indemnify an individual who is made a party to a proceeding because he is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, against liability incurred in the proceeding, to the extent provided for in the Corporation's bylaws.
- 10. Distribution of Assets Upon Dissolution. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, distribute all of the remaining assets of the Corporation (i) for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of § 501(c)(3) of the Code, or the corresponding provisions of any future federal tax law, (ii) to the federal government, or (iii) to a state or local government, for a public purpose, as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or

organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

11. <u>Duration</u>. The Corporation shall have perpetual duration.



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

MJohn S. Yarbrough was born in Central Europe, the son of Dutch parents. During his childhood his family moved to the southern United States. Yarbrough grew into manhood in Georgia and Alabama. After he had been married for several years, he journeyed to Texas and landed at Indianola during the middle 1850's. In 1858 he moved into McMullen County [Texas] and was one of the pioneer settlers of Yarbrough Bend, the first settlement to be established within the county. He immediately began capturing wild cattle and horses and entered the livestock industry. The date of his death is not known. \*\*

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





Drewery Allen, son of Young and Martha Coleman Allen, one of the early settlers of Pike County was born in Orange County, N.C. in 1749. Drewery married Elizabeth Yarbrough who was born May 9, 1752. In 1776 Drewery enlisted in the Continental Army, N.C. and served throughout the War. He left his wife Elizabeth and did not see her again for seven years. He was often within forty miles of home but he was never able to visit her. These years had wrought great changes in him and his wife did not know him when he finally returned. He served under Washington at the battle of Brandywine and was in on the kill at Yorktown, Va. He was also with Greene in Carolinas at the battle of Cowpens and Guilford Court House.

After the war, Drewery Allen, with his family, moved to Green County, Ga. settling near Pullian's Factory or Scull Shoals on the Oconee River. In 1824 he moved further west into Pike County that had been organized two years before, He settled near what in later years was known as Reidsboro and died there and is buried in an old family burial lot located near his old home on what was then Feyetteville road and is now Pines Golf course. His grave is marked by a marble tablet placed by the DAR and carries the following inscription: Drewery Allen Born in Orange County, N.C. 1749 N.C. Mil Rev. War Died Dec. 1, 1828. His will is recorded in Book 1, Page 59 Pike County, July 1826. His name is inscribed on the monument that is located in the Memorial Cemetery in Griffin where all the Revolutionary War soldiers that died in Pike County are listed.

## **Searching for Indexed Terms<sup>1</sup>**

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched<sup>2</sup>. First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.

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
