### **Preface**

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

The rents to be paid until Mar. 25, 1760 and at that time the remaining lands not settled in the proportion of one white person on every 200 acres in the grant is to be surrendered to the Lord Granville and thenceforth the rate of 4 shls. proclamation money or 3 shls. sterling to be paid for every 100 acres. 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### TO THE READERS

Although much more research needs to be done, I feel that after ten years of using all the bits and pieces of time left over from working and living, it is time to insure the fruits of my labor do not mold away in some stored files should something unforeseen happen to me. Then, too, my older brothers and sisters have been urging me to get the history completed while they are still around to enjoy it. Three have already passed on since I began the project.

I have found genealogy very interesting and rewarding, similar to prospecting for gold. You know what you are looking for, but know only in a general way where to look. An obscure book in a library, a wornout family Bible, a yellowed letter, or a query in a genealogical magazine may give the clue that leads to the genealogist's bonanza--a real break through. But again, like the prospector, the genealogist has more disappointments than happy surprises.

The search was made more difficult by the errors in records. Census records, given by persons who happened to be home when the census taker came, are full of inconsistencies. One year's census may give the person's birthplace as Tennessee, and the next one will give his place of birth and age completely different. Also the names were spelled in different ways. Then finding so much material without documentation was so frustrating, I have gone to great lengths to document as much of my information as was possible and reasonable by placing footnotes, not at the bottom of each page, but at the end of each part. The worst problem I encountered, however, was finding that the documents I needed had been lost by careless office workers or destroyed in a courthouse fire or by the Union soldiers when they took over the courthouses during the Civil War.

When I began this research, my mother had been dead nearly 20 years and my father 40. How I've regretted I wasn't interested in genealogy while they lived. They could have been so much help and would have enjoyed learning of their heritage. I never knew my grandparents, only one was living when I was born, and she died before I reached the age of two.

The research has been fun, especially making trips to the court houses, cemeteries, archives, and finding the home places. Reading reel after reel of microfilm was sometimes tedious and tiring, but even that was more enjoyable than trying to put the material compiled into acceptable book form-rewording and retyping page after page. I have tried to eliminate errors, but I'm sure some will be found. Please know that they were unintentional. If your family's records are not included, I'm sorry. I did my best. I had trouble locating some relatives and others failed to respond.

Since I'm not a very creative person, I have found wording the material so that you, the readers, will get a mental picture of these ancestors as they lived their lives to be the most difficult job of all. How much easier it would have been just to have given the bare essentials—names, dates, and the places—but then they would have been mere names on printed pages. I wanted you to see them as real people who lived and to get a glimpse of the times in which they lived. If I've succeeded in a small degree, I will be satisfied.

### TO OUR ANCESTORS

This family history has been done as a tribute to you, our ancestors, for the part you played in shaping the destiny of our great country and the influence you have had and will continue to have on the lives of your descendants.

I found no royalty or men of fame among you. Wealth was not the heritage you left us--most of you were poor dirt farmers--yet you were the salt of the earth. You did your part in rolling back the frontiers and civilizing the wilderness.

Some of you gave your lives in defense of the country you loved; others gave up precious sons in the conflicts. You made sure our nation was founded on Christian, as well as democratic principles.

I wasn't privileged to know any of you personally except my mother and father, Martha Epps (Effie) Howell and James (Jimmy) Brown Devin, but their lives and teachings were a reflection of you, their ancestors. It was your training and example that molded them into honest upright citizens who became parents worthy of our love and respect.

The rest of you I have come to love as I traced your steps through the pages of time. At first you were merely a name on a pedigree chart, but then as I found through research the places you lived, the land you bought and sold, the battles in which you fought, and the children you bore, you came alive to me, and I had such a yearning to know more about you—to see the homes in which you lived, to walk on the soil you had tilled, and to find your final resting places.

My desire was realized with many of you. What an awesome feeling to stand by graves where you were laid to rest two hundred years ago, and viewing one ancestral home, still standing after nearly three hundred years, was a sacred time for me.

There were disappointments, however, for some cemeteries had been leveled for the advancement of civilization. Forgive us for not holding your final resting places so sacred this couldn't have ever happened.

You are not going to be portrayed as perfect. You were human, making mistakes as we do today; however, not a single incident has been found which caused me to hang my head in shame. I am proud to claim all of you as my own and to present you through the pages of this book to your other present and future descendants. May they come to know that you are more than names on printed pages. May they come to love and respect you as I have.

### THE YARBROUGH FAMILY

#### Its Origin

The Yarbrough family is regarded as one of the oldest families in England, going back to as early as 853 A.D. when authenticated historic references are made to Germund, who owned land in Fermethorpe, County Lincoln. He is the first of the line recorded. In the old Monastary records which were unearthed in World War II bombings, the English Yarburgh family can be traced in an unbroken chain to this Germund.

The family was of Danish origin and it is assumed they came into England (then known as Angle-land) during the Danish Viking invasions which began about 800 A.D. The patriarch of the Yarbrough family, along with hundreds of his fellow Danes settled in the area now known as Lincolnshire, and they continued to war with the West Saxons for many years. Finally Alfred the Great became king in 871 and after several defeats, he won a great military victory, the conquest of London in 886. The Danes withdrew to the eastern third of England called Danelaw where Danish laws, customs, and language prevailed.

In 1066 William of Normandy invaded England, and the Danes, being enemies of the Anglo-Saxons, sided with William and helped him destroy the Anglo-Saxon army in the battle of Hastings on Christmas Day, 1066 A.D. The war was won and William, now known as William the Conquerer, became king of England and in the same year knighted Eustacius, who was a descendant of Germund. This was before surnames were used.

King William, the Conquerer, had an extensive survey made of the land, listing the principal landholders, the farm population, and the material and financial resources of his realm which is now contained in the DOMEDAY BOOK. This book gives the name "Gereburg" and early documents mention the name Yerdsburg or Jerdsburg. The present pronunciation of Yarbrough comes from the Danish "Jard" and "Jerda" and the Norse word "Jardborg". The English meaning of the word is "earth fortification."

King William ordered the territory be taken from the nobility and large landowners and divided among his followers. Eustacius was made Lord of Yarburgh and became known as Eustacius de Yarburgh. (Yarburgh was the name of a place in Lincolnshire.) At present two places called Yarburgh are there, one a parish in the union of Louth, and the other a hamlet in the parish of Croxton.


The Yarburgh estate received a charter from the king and was allowed a representative in Parliament. Eustacius de Yarburgh, Lord of Yarburgh, had a son named Robert de Yarburgh. He in turn named his son Lambert de Yarburgh; however after the fifth generation the de was dropped and Yarburgh became a surname.

Burke in his HISTORY OF THE COMMONERS, Vol. III, page 661, states: "The family of Yarburgh can be traced in authenticated male succession from the time of the Norman Conquest at which time Eustacius de Yarburgh was Lord of Yarburgh, in the County of Lincoln, which manor, together with

the patronage of the living, still remain vested in his lineal representation, the present Major Yarburgh of Heslington. For many centuries they were chiefly settled in various parts of Lincolnshire, but more than two hundred years ago they removed their residence to Snaith Hall in the West Riding of the County of York and subsequently, Snaith Hall being destroyed to Helsington Hall, near York."

The spelling "Yarburgh" continued unchanged in England for almost five hundred years. The first appearance of the spelling "Yarbrough" on the family chart prepared by F. S. Andrus of the College of Arms was the entry concerning Sir Nicholas Yarburgh, Snaith Hall, Yorkshire, a knight. Two of his sons, Sir Thomas and Richard, adopted the spelling "Yarbrough" while other sons continued with the old spelling.

Several researchers have spent considerable time trying to connect the colonial Yarbroughs to the English line, and a few are convinced that Richard, son of Sir Nicholas, mentioned above, is the same Richard found in the Virginia Colony in 1642; however, parish records show Nicholas Yarburgh was born in 1612 and his son Richard was baptized 1 Oct. 1640. So he is a generation too late to be Richard, the Immigrant. Richard, the Immigrant was born in 1615 according to his tombstone inscription.

#### EARLY YARBROUGHS IN AMERICA

In early American records, as well as in old English documents, the Yarbrough name occurs with various spelling such as: Yerbury, Yarburgh, Yarboro, Yerborow, Yarbrow, Yarberry, Yarberough, Yarborough, Yarbrough, and others. Even today in current telephone directories the name may be spelled Yarber, Yarbro, Yarboro, Yarberry, Yarbough, Yarborough, and Yarbrough.

Genealogists agree all spellings are of the same original family. The varied spellings came about because most pioneers were unable to read or write. They signed their documents with an "X" and the clerk spelled the name as it sounded to him, and since distinct dialects were spoken in different parts of the country, names had various pronunciations. Later descendants who learned to read and write adopted the spelling they found on family documents or the way their teachers spelled the name for them. In my own line of Yarbroughs, I have found the name spelled seven different ways in county records. Sometimes it is spelled two or three ways in the same instrument, so evidently the recorders were, also, unsure of the spelling.

Until recently I along with other Yarbrough researchers believed there were only two early Yarbrough immigrants to America--Richard, who came to the Virginia Colony from Lincolnshire, Eng., before 1642, and Ambrose, who came to the same area from Yorkshire, England, in 1732-- and that anyone who could trace his line to a time before 1732 could be assured he had descended from Richard the Immigrant. However a couple years ago while doing research on my Gibbons line in the records of York Co., VA, I happened on proof there was an Edward Yarbrough in York Co, VA, before 1645. The records are as follows:

EDWARD YARBROUGH OF YORK COUNTY, VA.

From Microfilm Reel No. 1A, Record 2, Deeds, Wills, Orders, Etc., 1645-1649, page 132, was extracted this deed of gift.

Be it knowne unto all men by ye sd presents that I Richard Pasmuch for and in consideration of ye naturall love and affection which I doe bear unto Edward Yarborrough sone of Edward Yarborrough late of York I doe give unto Edw: Yarborrough, Jun. and his heires and assignes, one pide black and white Cowe Calfe being marked as followes Viz Cross on ye Right Eare, a hole in ye right & soe slit out and ye fore part of ye left eare cut out to have & to hold ye Cawe Calfe with all her female increase unto ye sd Edward Yarborrough jun or his heires or assignes forever from and against all men shall and will warrant and forever defend by ye sd presents ye male increase decending backe unto me ye s Richard Pasmuch or my heires or assignes. In wittness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal on ye 25th day of May 1646 and in ye twoe & twentyeth year of ye Raigne of our soverigne lord Charles by ye grace of God King of England.

From page 95 of the same record is found a bill of sale whereby Richard Lee sold Edward Yarrow, son of Edward Yarrow, dec'd a brown cow and calf in Jan. 1645. The mutilated record was next to impossible to read, but it was evident that it had a provision that if Edward died before becoming twenty-one, something (I couldn't make out what) should take place. This proves Edward was a young boy.

Another record found on Reel 1A, Record 3, Wills, Orders, Deeds, Etc., 1657-1662, p. 28, was a court order dated 25 June 1658, stating:

It is ordered that the sherrif convey Edward Yarbrough, soine of Edward Yarbrough, dec'd, to the next court to be delivered to the constable and from that constable to another constable until he be delivered to Col. Robert Abrall, who is desired by this Court to dispose of him to his Mother or other ways which are fitting. Next Court to be 24 Aug. 1658.

A thorough search of other records of York County turned up nothing else on this Edward or any other Yarbrough. Perhaps Edward was taken to another county to live with his mother. Evidently he had been serving an apprenticeship as was customary in those days to teach children a trade.

CHRISTIAN YARBLOW, AN IMMIGRANT TO YORK CO., VIRGINIA

To confuse matters worse there seems to be another Yarbrough immigrant to York Co., VA. In Greer's EARLY VIRGINIA IMMIGRANTS 1623-1666, page 374, we find: In 1653 Christian Yarblow immigrated to York Co., Virginia. Thomas Willis was the patentee or party bringing him over.


For a time I completely ignored him because of the spelling of his surname. In fact when I first started my research, I ignored all spellings except two--Yarbrough and Yarborough--until I found my own Yarbrough ancestors spelled Yarbrow and Yarber.

Nell Morris Jenkins in her Yarbrough Quarterly stated that she believed this Christian to be Richard Yarbrough, Jr., son of Richard the Immigrant, his middle name being used to distinguish him from his father. When you examine the facts, however, this doesn't seem likely, for according to a New Kent County Court record, which will be quoted later, Richard Yarbrough, Jr., was born about 1652. A year old child wouldn't likely be coming to America without his mother or father, unless, of course, the mother had died in England and Mr. Willis was bringing him to his father. While searching the York County records, I found no mention of Christian, and I've not seen his name in any other county records.

## AMBROSE YARBROUGH, AN IMMIGRANT TO VIRGINIA COLONY

Ambrose Yarbrough was born into the Yarbrough - de Bateson family of Yorkshire, England, in the year 1710. At age 22 he immigrated to the Virginia Colony. He went to Prince George County, VA, and joined his cousins, the descendants of Richard Yarbrough, in 1732. He later went to Culpepper County, Virginia, where a 68 acre tract of land was granted him in 1758. In 1776 Ambrose and wife Mary sold their 68 acres and moved to South Carolina. He died in Union County, South Carolina, in 1788. Known children of Ambrose and Mary are: Jonathan, Ambrose, Jr., Humphrey, Ann, Jeremiah, Mary, and John.







Above: The Old Blandford Church built in 1735 on what was then known as Wells Hill in the town of Blandford. Today it is on U. S. Routes 301 & 460; Crater Road, Petersburg, Virginia.

Richard Yarbrough's grave is inside the walls of the church-yard some 15 or 20 feet from the second window from the left. His is the oldest grave in the cemetery. He was buried there over 30 years before the church was built. During the Civil War Confederate soldiers were buried on the gentle slopes just outside the churchyard so it has become a memorial chapel and Confederate Shrine.

DISPERSEMENT OF THE FAMILY OF RICHARD YARBROUGH from Mr. George W. Yarbrough of Wedowee, Alabama

Richard Yarbrough (1615 - 1704) married Frances Proctor (1637) in London England-came to Virginia 1643. Located King & Queen Co. Property records in King & Queen Co, King William Co., and Accomac County. Deeded Property 1696 King William Co to sons Richard Jr. and John, and established residence near present day Petersburg. He died in either 1702 or 1704 and is buried at old Blandford Church. His known sons Richard Jr., John, Thomas, William, Charles & Edward or Edmund. The minutes of House of Burgesses show the following:

- 1. Paid Richard Yarbrough (1650-'53) 600 lbs tab. for locating S coas
- 2. Paid Richard Yarbrough (1656) 1200 lb Tobaco acting as \_\_\_\_\_?
- 3. Paid Richard Yarbrough (1684) 6000 lib tob. for N. Y. Cruise

Richard Yarbrough, Jr. born 1652 Va - death information not known - married Elizabeth Mason 1678. Resided King William and New Kent Counties 1680-1717. Known children Charles, Richard, Edward, Thomas, Joseph and three daughters. No record of will or estate settlement found. Virginia records 1700-1760 show descendants of Richard Yarbrough Sr. as follows: King William Co - John & Richard, Jr. (1690-1720); New Kent County - John, son of Thomas (1717); Amelia County - William, Henry, & Richard Jr. (1700-1730); Crozier Co - Edward Yarbrough (1720-1730).

By 1760 the recorded wills of Yarbroughs are found in these counties:
Amelia, Louisa, King & Queen, Dinwiddie, King William, New Kent, Accomac,
Prince Edward, Cumberland & Hanover. Research has connected all to Richard
Yarbrough, Sr. The dispersion of Yarbroughs from the above location
viz: Henry Yarbrough (son of Edward) to Franklin Co., N.C. with wife Martha
Robinson about 1760; he died in Franklin Co., NG about 1790-93 (testate).
His descendants are there today. His line spreads into Orange, Rowan,
Anson & Mecklenberg Co. & Alabama. This line has gone from Alabama into
Miss., La., and into Texas.

Samuel Yarbrough, son of William Yarbrough of Amelia Co., Va to Grange Co, NC 1760. He died in Grange Co (Testate) before 1790. His descendants spread into Anson, Rowan & Wake Co NC and into Fairfield Co., S C. Other descendants went into Tenn and on into Texas.

John Yarbrough, son of Thomas Yarbrough, migrated to Anson Co., NC about 1735. He married Bethsheba Harris in New Kent Co., Va and died in N.C. intestate about 1781 -- His son John Yarbrough, Jr. located in Henry Co., Ga. He died there, testate in 1840. His son, William, located in Randolph Co., Alabama 1858 and died there in 1896 intestate. The descendants are in Ala., Tex., Ga., and Oklahoma.

Moses Yarbrough, son of William Yarbrough of Amelia Co., Va. located in S C in 1763 and died there 1772 testate. He had 3 sets of children. His descendants are found today in S C, Florida, Texas & California. His third wife, Frances Foote, married Piece Butler after his death. Butler later became Gov. of S. C.

Manosh, Zachariah, Thomas & Alexander Yarbrough all appear in Anson Co., MC 1750-1770 as brothers from Amelia Co., Va. There were the sons of Edward Yarbrough and brothers of Henry in Franklin Co., NC. They reared large families in Anson and adjoining Cos and the descendants are found in Tenn., Texas, Ark., Ala (St. Clair & Sumpter Cos). These lines are very difficult to definitely trace.

Thomas Yarbrough, son of John Yarbrough of King William, Amelia Co., Va. located in Union Co S C, before 1765 and died there. His son Thomas Jr. married Martha Harris in 1798 and later located in Moscow Co, Ga. Ambrose Yarbrough of Amelia Go., Va also located in Union Co. before 1775. Ambrose stated he was born in England and came to Va after his father's death. He died in Union Co. circa 1789 testate. His line is found in Anson Co, NC, White Co., Tenn, Coosa and Sumter and Fayette Counties, Ala. Family tradition names one of his wives as the sister of Thomas Jur.

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The line of Charles Yarbrough, son of Richard, spread across Va into Ky and up into Indiana. Some of his line is now in Ill. The two older lines come from Peter & John. Peter died in 1786 near Roanoke and John died 1798 near Frankfort, Ky.

New Poquoson's name was changed in 1692 to Charles Parish.

York Parish—there is no record establishing a parish, but it had an inducted minister in 1638.

Chiskiack Parish was established in 1640 and its name was changed to Hampton Parish in 1643.


Marston Parish, including the upper part of York County, was created a parish in 1654.

Middle Plantation combined with Harrop Parish in James City County to form Middletown Parish. In 1674 Middletown and Marston Parishes were united to form the present Bruton Parish. In 1706 York and Hampton Parishes were combined into Yorkhampton Parish, with which Martin's Hundred Parish, in James City County, was united in 1712.

The Colony was growing and the population was pressing northward and northwestward, and settlements were being established on the north side of the York River. From York County came first Gloucester County in 1651, in which county we find Abingdon, Petsworth, Ware, and Kingston Parishes. The latter parish was to become the parish in Mathews County in 1791.

In the same year the northern part of York County was taken to form the southern portion of Lancaster County along the south side of the Rappahannock River.

Since that portion of Lancaster County lying south of the Rappahannock River was taken from York County in 1651, we will first follow the creation of the parishes along the southern



# RICHARD YARBROUGH, THE IMMIGRANT TO VIRGINIA COLONY

Richard Yarbrough, the Immigrant, has been left until last because more information is available on this line, and because I feel he is the immigrant from which our line descended.

A number of Yarbrough researchers have traced their lines to Richard Yarbrough, very few with documented proof. Most, like me, have arrived at their conclusions because of proximity and close association of their Yarbroughs and the previous assumption that all Yarbroughs found in the records before 1732 were from the immigrant Richard.

According to his tombstone inscription, Richard Yarbrough was born in 1615. He came to America as a young man. Researchers do not agree on the time nor the place of his arrival; however, since records show he was one of the founders of Bristol Parish in 1642, we can assume he came to that area sometime before that date.

Some researchers say Richard the Immigrant was married to Frances Proctor, to Elizabeth Williams, and perhaps to others. George W. Yarbrough, a former senator of Alabama who did years of Yarbrough research stated in one of his papers that Richard Yarbrough, Jr., swore in court that his mother was Frances Yarbrough; however, I have not been able to find this court record.

A record of marriage for a Richard Yarbrough and Frances Proctor has been found in the English records dated 1635, but there is, also, a record of the death of a Frances Yarbrough in the same parish dated 1680, which seems to indicate that this Richard and Frances remained in England and were not our immigrant ancestors.

Richard, the Immigrant, died in 1702, at age 87, and was buried on Wells Hill inside the original enclosure of the old Blandford Church-yard. The church is presently located inside the city limits of Petersburg, Virginia, on Carter Road.

On my first visit to Petersburg, I was disturbed to find the tombstone read "Richard Scarbrough, 1702, aged 87." I wondered if the notation I had read in the William and Mary Quarterly about Richard Yarbrough being buried in Blandford Churchyard was an error. However at the Blandford Church Interpretation Center I was informed that the sandstone marker had slowly worn away over the 275 years, requiring repairs to be made and in doing so the engraver mistakenly etched an "SC" instead of a "Y". They assured me they knew of the error. Later when I heard their audio-visual presentation relate how Richard Yarbrough and a few other settlers had ventured up the James River into the wilderness, I was satisfied.

Not long after this, Bob Yarbrough led Yarbrough descendants in raising money to have a corrective slab marker placed direcly in front of the original tombstone, which by then was too crumbly to be reengraved. When I returned to Petersburg in 1985 and revisited the grave, I experienced a deep feeling of pride when the guide at Blandford church pointed

out Richard Yarbrough's grave as the oldest in the cemetery and explained how the Yarbrough descendants had placed the second marker to correct the error. I was glad I'd had a small part in having it done.

According to the guide, the original church had been a wooden frame structure and for a time the cemetery had been confined to the church-yard; however, when that filled, graves were placed outside the walls as well. Then during the Civil War, heroic men who died in defense of the city of Petersburg against the Union army were buried on the gentle slopes back of the church.

The present brick church building, which was built in 1735, is now used as a memorial chapel and Confederate shrine in memory of these 30,000 Confederate soldiers buried there.

Children of Richard, according to the late Nelle Jenkins, were: William W., whose wife was Ellinor; Edmund; Henry; James; Charles; John, who married Abigail Whitehead in Gloucester Co., VA, 2 Feb. 1695; Richard, Jr., who was said to have married Elizabeth Mason and also a Miss Whitehead; and three girls. Some researchers, however, believe some of these are his grandchildren instead of his children.

A deed dated 20 May 1704 and recorded in both King William Co. and King and Queen Co., VA, proves that at least Richard and John were his sons. Extracts of the deed follow:

John Yarbrough of King William Co., planter, to William Aylett for 20 lbs. sterling and 5000 lb. tobacco, 200 acres in King William Co. Said land part of land formerly sold by the Chickahominy Indians to Arnold and by said Arnold then of King and Queen Co. to John Hurt, and by John Hurt sold to Richard Yarbrough, father of the said John, as by deed acknowledged in King and Queen County court 12 Feb. 1695 and is now in the possession of the said John Yarbrough, one half by virtue of a deed from his brother, Richard Yarbrough, and the other half as an heir to his father. Abigail Yarbrough relinquished her right of Dower in King William Court.

I, in cooperation with a group of Yarbrough researchers, have searched the early records of Virginia in an unsuccessful attempt to prove the parentage of these other Yarbroughs--William W., Edmund, Henry, James and Charles.

From SKETCHES OF VIRGINIA by Foote and from ENGLISH DUPLICATES OF LOST VIRGINIA RECORDS by Louis Cognets, Jr., we find the following early records for Richard Yarbrough and his sons, Richard, Jr., and John: (Note the spelling of Yarbrough.)

. . . And whereas severall parcells of Land were by the Pamunkey Indians for good and valuable consideration leased for 99 yeares to these severall persons hereafter named which Lands by the Order of Assembly at James City the 25th of April 1679 was granted to be confirmed unto them and that they should have the priority and first grant thereof when the same came to the King's hands. . .

Richard Yarborow, a tract, quantity not mentioned; John Yarborow for himselfe and the children and the devisees of

Henry Dilling in behalf of George Douglas, orphan and heir of

Either this land was in the area which became New Kent Co., VA, or Richard Yarbrough, Jr., moved to New Kent Co. for in the records of the House of Burgesses, the first representative body in America, we find the following on Richard Yarbrough of New Kent Co., VA.

At a Grand Assembly began at Green Spring, the 20th of Feb. 1676, these following Orders of Public charge were made and allowed viz. . . To Richard Yarberry 6,000 pounds of Tobacco. . .

Att a Generall Assembly begun att James Citty the 16th day of Apr. in the Thirty sixth yeare of His majties Raigne and in the yeare of our Lord 1684. These following Orders of Publique Charge and Levy were made. . New Kent County. . . To Richard Yarburg for his service. . . severall tymes in discovering the Senerca Indians and other publique service with Coll Byrd 1620 pounds of tobacco. 10

Xber 7th 1685. . .The report has come from ye committee of Claimes, relating to ye New York and Albany charge is by ye house allowed and Mr. Augitor Bacon is desired to pay. . . To Richard Yarborough, Interpreter, for his voyage and services, 20 pounds. !!

At a Grand Assemblie held att James Cittie by prorogation from the one and twentieth day of September, in the year of our Lord 1674, to the Seaventh day of March in the eight and twentieth yeare of the reigne of our Soveraigne Lord Charles the second . . . An Act for the safeguard and defence of the country against the Indians. . . and forty one men out of the lower parts of New Kent County to be garrisoned at one fort or place of defence between Yerburyes house and Chickahominy Indian Towne Landing on Mattapony River. . .

In "Jacobitism in Virginia" taken from the Virginia Magazine of History and Biography, Vol. VI, No. 4 (1899) pp. 389-96, is found a court action held in New Kent Co. Court, 9 Oct. 1690, in which Richard Yarbrough, Jr., and wife Elizabeth were witnesses against Capt. Jacob Lumpkin who had been reported by Ben Arnold for "expressing and publickly declaring divers Seditious turbulent and unlawfull words in contempt of their maj<sup>ties</sup> and their present Governour. . "

According to the testimony of Ben Arnold, Lumpkin had not only refused to drink to their Majesties' health but had swore "God dam him if he were here I would fight him." Richard and his wife's testimonies were as follows:

Richard Yarbrough, Aged 38 years or thereabouts, Sworne, Saith: That your Depont being att ye house of Benjamin Arnold about ye beginning of September last, in company with Severall p'sons of ye neighbourhood & drinking their maj<sup>ties</sup> health, King William and Queen Mary, ye said Capt. Lumpkin refused to name them. . . & in like manner refused to name the Govern<sup>rs</sup> health being named by severall of ye Company Govern<sup>r</sup> Nicholson's health, or move his hat, but he mounted his horse & yo<sup>r</sup> Depont being att some distance heard ye said Capt. Lumpkin say with a loud voyce he would fight ye Govern<sup>r</sup>. Whereupon ye said Joseph Clarke tooke him up & threatened to beat him & alsoe pulled him off his horse. And I heard noe more from him afterwards, and further Saith not.

RICHARD YARBROUGH, his mark.

Elizabeth Yarbrough, wife of Richard Yarbrough, aged 34 years or thereabouts, Sworne, Saith that your Depont being att ye house of ye said Benjamin Arnold in ye Company afore mentioned did hear Capt. Jacob Lumpkin say with a loud voice as he satt upon his horse that he would fight ye Govern. And further Saith not.

ELIZABETH YARBROUGH, her mark.

Hath Sworne to in Court, New Kent, October ye 9th, 1690.

Test Job. Howes, Cl. Cur.

Pamunkey Neck, Mattapony River, Pamunkey River and Reedy Swamp are common landmarks regarding property of the early Yarbroughs. These land marks were in that part of New Kent County that was used to form King and Queen County, VA, in 1691. Following are some land grants in King and Queen Co., which bear this out: 12

On 29 Oct. 1695, Edward Jennings, Esq. 570 acres in King and Queen Co. on south side Mattapony River on the line of Peter White and Rich'd Yarbrough. (Patent Book 9, p. 76.)

Andrew MacCallester 86 acres King and Queen Co. in Pamunkey Neck beginning on Mattapony River--corner of old Richard Yarbrough's whole tract leased of Pamunkey Indians.

Morris Floyd 100 acres King and Queen Co. in Pamunkey Neck; 1 April 1702. . . to Peter Whites corner and Rich'd Yarbrough's new ground. (Patent Book 9, p. 452.)

In 1702 part of King and Queen County was used to form King William County, VA, and the Mattapony River became the boundary between the two counties. A number of land grants and tax records show that the Yarbrough land lay in this area and that the Yarbroughs operated a ferry on the Mattapony River.

On Oct. 28, 1702, M. Rawlins, 933 acres in King William Co., St. John's Parish in Pamunkey Neck, adjacent Yarbrough's line. (Patent Book 9, page 505.)

In 1702, William Bird, 1200 acres from Yarbrough-Arnold Ferry up the Mattapony River.

From Smith's QUIT RENTS OF VIRGINIA 1704, we have the following Yarbroughs paying quit rents on land in King William Co., Virginia.

John Yarbrough, 150 acres. Richard Yarbrough, 300 acres.

Other King William records involving Yarbroughs:

May 30, 1704, John Yarbrough sold 200 acres in King William Co., to William Aylett. (Deed Book 1, p. 170.)

Nov. 8, 1704, Richard & Sarah his wife, sold to Robert Abbott 80 acres of land in King William Co. (Deed Book 1, page 231.)

May 2, 1705, Samuel Williams and William Lee received 400 acres in King William Co. on the south side run of Herring Creek. . .a little below the mouth of a branch that heads at Edward Yarbrough's plantation. (Patent Book 9, p. 649.)

May 2, 1706, John Hurt was granted 546 acres in King William Co., in Pamunkey Neck. . . down the Mattapony River by Rich'd Yarbrough's tobacco ground. (Patent Book 9, p. 733.)

A record which has puzzled me is a land grant to James Terry for 400 acres in King William County on the north side of Pamunkey River. . .16 June 1714 for the importation of eight persons including a Richard Yarbrough. (Patent Book 10) Is this another immigrant or did Richard Yarbrough, Jr., make a trip back to England?

During the 1720's we find the following Yarbroughs obtaining land grants in King William County, Virginia:

William Yarbrough, 400 acres of New Land in St. John's Parish on branches of Reedy Swamp of Mattapony River and the North Anna River adjacent Rober Baber, his own, Edward and William Yarbrough, Thomas Evans and land of Mr. English, 9 July 1724 for 40 shillings. (Patent Book 12, p. 56.) Also 250 acres new land in King William Co. in St. Margaret's Parish on north side of South Fork of South River on Frances Durrat's line, 31 Apr. 1726 for 25 shillings. (Patent Book 13, p. 27)

Edward and William, 400 acres new land in St. John's Parish on west side of Long Branch on Robert Baber and Cocecham's line, 20 Feb. 1723 for 40 shillings. (Patent Book 11, p. 330.)

Richard Yarbrough, 400 acres on north side of North Creek and on north side of South River in Richard Maulin's line in St. Margaret's Parish, 9 July 1724. (Patent Book 12, p. 57.) Also 400 acres on branch of Reedy Swamp issueing out of the Mattapony River and the branches of the North Anna in St. John's Parish adjacent to Edward Claybrook, Charles Evans,

and William and Edward Yarbrough's line, 3 October 1727, 40 shillings. (Patent Book 13,, page 283.)

Charles Yarbrough, 400 acres new land in St. Margaret's Parish on south side South River adjacent Richard Malden, 17 Aug. 1725, 40 shillings. (Patent Book 12, page 257.)

John Yarbrough, 400 acres new land in King William Co., in St. John's Parish, on north side of Reedy Swamp. . .adjacent John Sutton's line and Capt. Christopher Smith. . .17 Aug. 1725. (Patent Book 12, p. 259.)

Caroline County, VA, was formed from parts of King William, King and Queen, and Essex Counties in 1727/28. (1727 by the old style calendar in which the new year started in March and 1728 by the more modern calendar whereby the year began in January.) As a result the Reedy Swamp and the North Anna and South Rivers where part of the above mentioned Yarbrough land grants were located were now in Caroline County. The following grant for Edward Yarbrough proves this:

September 27, 1729, Edward Yarbrough, 200 acres new land in Caroline Co. between the south fork and middle fork of Reedy Swamp in St. Margaret's Parish. (Patent Book 13, page 300.)

Early records of New Kent, King and Queen, King William and Caroline Counties have been destroyed except the land grants, which are in the State Archives, and a few other records including the Caroline Co. Court Order Books. This loss of records makes it virtually impossible to prove Yarbrough lineages.

From one of the court records of Caroline Co., it is learned that a Richard Yarbrough of Caroline Co., VA, married Sarah Weller, widow of William Weller about 1747. 13 However it hasn't been proven which Richard Yarbrough this is. Another obstacle to overcome is the fact that almost every Yarbrough line has a Richard, John, Edward, Henry, William, Thomas, etc. With so many Yarbroughs with the same given name, it is difficult to sort them out.

Other Yarbroughs found in the Caroline Co., Virginia, Court Order Books from 1728 to 1752 were: Richard, Jr., John, William and wife Diana, Charles, Edward and wife Eliza, Griggs, Thomas Griggs, Abraham, Thomas, Henry, James, Lazarius, Jeremiah, and Joshua Yarbrough. The last of these, Joshua Yarbrough, is the earliest Yarbrough ancestor of which I am reasonably sure.

In spite of the fact I have spent more time and effort on the Yarbrough line than all my other lines and have gathered a wealth of information, I have found no documentation or even convincing evidence determining the relationship of Joshua to the other Yarbroughs found with him in Caroline County, Virginia; however, researchers tend to agree they are all descendants of Richard I. All the previous information has been given to show that these Yarbroughs living in Caroline county are living in the same area as John, Richard, Jr., and other early Yarbroughs, the counties have just changed names. We have proof that both John and Richard, Jr. are sons of Richard I, so we feel sure our Joshua was a descendant of this line of Yarbroughs.

The last record found for Joshua Yarbrough, Sr., was 1780 in Franklin Co., NC, which was formed from part of Bute Co. in 1778. Joshua was living by his son Micajah. He probably lived on there until his death which must have been before 1790 as he isn't in the 1790 Franklin Co., NC, census. Information on other Yarbroughs living with Joshua in Granville and Bute Counties follows:

Henry Yarbrough, Sr., and wife Martha Robinson, found in Amelia County, VA, by 1739; bought land in Granville Co., NC, in 1760 while still living in Virginia. He died intestate in Franklin Co., NC, between 1790 and 1800. He is said to have children: James, Henry, Charles, Edward, Thomas, Clement and two daughters.

Henry Yarbrough, Jr., and wife Elizabeth Murray, Henry, son of Henry, Sr., and Martha Yarbrough, left a will in Franklin Co., NC, probated June 1794. (WB A, p. 123) Children: Archibald, Charles, David, Henry, James, Thomas, Nancy, Frances, and Martha.

James Yarbrough, son of Henry Yarbrough, Sr. in Franklin Co. until 1800.

Manoah Yarbrough, was in Granville Co., NC, by July 1756; moved to Georgia in 1769 according to a petition he filed requesting a land grant in St. George's Parish in May 1770. Littleton and Thomas were in the same parish by 1790. They are possibly his sons.

Zachariah Yarbrough, listed in Amelia Co. tax list in 1747 and 1749 as a titheable of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr.; came to Bute Co. before 1771; then to Rowan Co. and finally to Randolph Co., NC, where he made entry for a land grant in 1795 which he received in 1802. He is said to have married Elizabeth Dowd and had children: Zachariah, Jr., Henry, Thomas, Alexander, Manoah, Julia, Elizabeth, Archibald, and John.

John and wife Elizabeth Yarbrough, moved from Amelia Co., VA, before 1755. John was son of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. According to George W. Yarbrough, a descendant, they moved to Fairfield Co., SC, where he died in 1816. Children: Jesse, Moses, Arthur, Thomas, Martha, Joseph, Richard and Nancy.

Micajah Yarbrough, son of Joshua and Sarah, received a warrant for 100 acres by improvement on branches of Mill Stone in Bute Co., NC, adjacent to his own line and his father Joshua Yarbrough's line on 24 Jan. 1778. On 10 Oct. 1783 he received a grant for 100 acres in Franklin Co., NC, on the waters of Sandy Creek. (Grant Book 52, p. 179) He was found in Franklin Co. as late as 1810. He had sons: Micajah, Jr., Joshua, Shadrick and perhaps others.

James Yarbrough, son of Joshua and Sarah, was last found in Bute Co. records in 1770. Evidence leads me to believe he is the James Yarbrough who in 1784 received a grant of 287% acres in Franklin Co., Georgia, for Revolutionary War services. This James and his eldest son were killed by Indians not long after settling in Georgia. Heirs to his land, which we assume are his children, were: Groves, Joshua, Susanna, Mary, John, Jeremiah, Elizabeth and the wives of Anderson Berry and Jesse Bowden. The fact that one of his sonswas named Joshua and that three Yarbroughs thought to be James's brother, Joshua, Jrs.'s sons—Gideon, Jeptha, and Benjamin joined the family in Franklin Co., GA, by 1804 convinces me that this James is indeed James, son of Joshua and Sarah.

Joshua III died 1844 in Campbell Co., GA. By then he had married again for he names his wife Nancy Yarborough; sons: James, Joshua T., Thomas J., Uriah, Greenberry, George, Charles. Daughters: Elizabeth, Sarah, Elender, and ? (illegible).

It is not known if Joshua II remained in Mecklenburg until his death or if he went with Joshua III to Chester Co., SC. In the 1810 census of Chester Co. a Jos. Yarbrough, Sr., and Jos. Yarbrough, Jr., were listed. The age groups were right to be Joshua II and Joshua III, but Jos. usually stands for Joseph; however, on checking the deed index I found no Joseph buying or selling land. Only one Joshua was listed in the 1820 Chester Co. Census, so what happened to Joshua II is a mystery.

Shadrack Yarbrough was not in the 1800 census, but he appeared on the 1799 Tax List. Since Joshua, Sr., had a boy at home between 16 and 26 in 1800 and also two boys and two girls below 10, it could be that Shadrack had lost his wife and was living with his parents. However he could have been a bachelor.

Shadrack made entry for land in Mecklenburg Co. 22 Feb. 1792 and received 200 acres on 12 Apr. 1798. (Grant Book 98, p. 68) The land was located on the waters of Richardsons Creek. He made another entry 2 Jan. 1793 and received 72 acres on waters of Cain Creek on 9 Mar. 1799. He received a third grant from the state for 200 acres on Richardson Creek on Dec. 22, 1800. On June 21, 1802 Shadrack sold 72 acres on Waxhaw Creek to Peter Presly.


Shadrack remained in Mecklenburg until after 1840. He undoubtedly died there, for the court records show Ezekiel and Micogen were appointed administrators of his estate in Mecklenburg Co.

Shem Yarbrough was first found in Mecklenburg Co. in 1798 when he witnessed a deed for Joshua, Sr., when he sold land to Gideon Yarbrough. For some reason Shem was also left off the 1800 census, but in 1810 he was listed as between 26 and 45 with one son and three daughters below ten years old. His wife was also between 26 and 45.

In 1810 Joshua Yarbrough made entry for 150 acres on Richardson Creek and received it 4 Dec. 1811. The land was described as "lying on the south side of Beaverdam Creek where Shem Yarborow now lives.

This is the last entry for Joshua Yarbrough and we wonder if this land was given to Shem, for Shem lived on in Mecklenburg County until after 1840. In 1850 he is listed in the Washington Co., TN, census with a wife Nelly. She is 76 and Shem is 75. Children listed are Eulin, 15; Polly, 12; Clinton, 11; Dicy, 8. Perhaps they are grandchildren since they are too old to have such young children. Listed next door is a Jeptha Yarborough, age 52, who was listed with Shem in the 1840 Mecklenburg Co. census. He has wife Elizabeth, 36; children, Alonza, 18; Francis M. 16; Talbot C., 14; Lucinda, 11; Middleton M., 6; Burt R., 3. Also listed with him is a William Yarbrough, 39, who was also in the 1840 Mecklenburg census.

REUBEN YARBROUGH, our ancestor, will be discussed in the next part.

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### THE YARBROUGH FAMILY

The information which follows consists of forward lineage data of Ogie and Fannie Yarbrough. Much of the information is preliminary and incomplete and no doubt contains many errors. It is hoped that with the participation of interested family members a complete and accurate forward lineage and family history can be written. Much of the information included in this report came from "The History of the Yarbrough Clan" by Minnie Imogene Clanton, information provided by Vivian Christopher, and information obtained from other family members. However, this compiler accepts full responsibility for all errors and omissions contained herein--Eric P. Yarborough.

Ogie Yarbrough was also known as S.O. Yarbrough. The 1860 U.S. Census lists him as Shadrick A. Yarbrough. The "A" was probably for Augie. The spelling on his grave marker, however, is Ogie. He was born in 1858 (according to his grave marker at Salem Church) although the 1860 census indicates his birth to be in 1854 or 1855. He died in 1918 from a train accident in Lincolnton, North Carolina. He was married to Fannie Carpenter who was born in 1856 and died in 1938. The following is a list of their 11 children:

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Joshua III died 1844 in Campbell Co., GA. By then he had married again for he names his wife Nancy Yarborough; sons: James, Joshua T., Thomas J., Uriah, Greenberry, George, Charles. Daughters: Elizabeth, Sarah, Elender, and \_?\_\_(illegible).

It is not known if Joshua II remained in Mecklenburg until his death or if he went with Joshua III to Chester Co., SC. In the 1810 census of Chester Co. a Jos. Yarbrough, Sr., and Jos. Yarbrough, Jr., were listed. The age groups were right to be Joshua II and Joshua III, but Jos. usually stands for Joseph; however, on checking the deed index I found no Joseph buying or selling land. Only one Joshua was listed in the 1820 Chester Co. Census, so what happened to Joshua II is a mystery.

Shadrack Yarbrough was not in the 1800 census, but he appeared on the 1799 Tax List. Since Joshua, Sr., had a boy at home between 16 and 26 in 1800 and also two boys and two girls below 10, it could be that Shadrack had lost his wife and was living with his parents. However he could have been a bachelor.

Shadrack made entry for land in Mecklenburg Co. 22 Feb. 1792 and received 200 acres on 12 Apr. 1798. (Grant Book 98, p. 68) The land was located on the waters of Richardsons Creek. He made another entry 2 Jan. 1793 and received 72 acres on waters of Cain Creek on 9 Mar. 1799. He received a third grant from the state for 200 acres on Richardson Creek on Dec. 22, 1800. On June 21, 1802 Shadrack sold 72 acres on Waxhaw Creek to Peter Presly.

Shadrack remained in Mecklenburg until after 1840. He undoubtedly died there, for the court records show Ezekiel and Micogen were appointed administrators of his estate in Mecklenburg Co.

Shem Yarbrough was first found in Mecklenburg Co. in 1798 when he witnessed a deed for Joshua, Sr., when he sold land to Gideon Yarbrough. For some reason Shem was also left off the 1800 census, but in 1810 he was listed as between 26 and 45 with one son and three daughters below ten years old. His wife was also between 26 and 45.

In 1810 Joshua Yarbrough made entry for 150 acres on Richardson . Creek and received it 4 Dec. 1811. The land was described as "lying on the south side of Beaverdam Creek where Shem Yarborow now lives.

This is the last entry for Joshua Yarbrough and we wonder if this land was given to Shem, for Shem lived on in Mecklenburg County until after 1840. In 1850 he is listed in the Washington Co., TN, census with a wife Nelly. She is 76 and Shem is 75. Children listed are Eulin, 15; Polly, 12; Clinton, 11; Dicy, 8. Perhaps they are grandchildren since they are too old to have such young children. Listed next door is a Jeptha Yarborough, age 52, who was listed with Shem in the 1840 Mecklenburg Co. census. He has wife Elizabeth, 36; children, Alonza, 18; Francis M. 16; Talbot C., 14; Lucinda, 11; Middleton M., 6; Burt R., 3. Also listed with him is a William Yarbrough, 39, who was also in the 1840 Mecklenburg census.

REUBEN YARBROUGH, our ancestor, will be discussed in the next part.

the manner of vandals (not less present in 1814 than in the 1860's) applied the torch to everything in the city that would burn.

Fortunately, not all of the schedules were stored in one place, and only a few of the records of a few of the States and all of the records of the censuses of 1800 and 1810 were destroyed. Several disastrous fires occured in the years that followed, and the record of the census of New Jersey for 1820 became ashes. Again a fire visited a government building after the census of 1890 had been taken and the volumes of all the States were destroyed.

Fire and public records seem ever to have an affinity for each other! Many of the court houses of North Carolina have suffered from fires, incendiary or accidental, as may be seen from the following. This is up to and includes 1862.

and several others, the dates of which are unknown.

In addition to the foregoing there were countless instances where libraries, museums and private homes containing almost priceless records of the days when the land was young, were deliberately set on fire and destroyed at the hands of Union soldiers during the War between the States.

All of the foregoing is here written that the difficulties met with in the preparation of a paper of this kind may be more clearly understood. Despite all the calamities that have befallen many records during the last two centuries, there are still some sources of information from which may be obtained information relating to the early fathers and their manner of living in the new lands.

In the decade preceding 1790, in the tidewater counties of the Carolinas, where the Episcopal Church was in the ascendancy, the rectors of the various parishes kept "Parish Registers," in which births, marriages and deaths of their parishioners were recorded. The same is true of Presbyterian ministers who set down with considerable fidelity in the "Session Books" of their particular congregation detailed information covering the members of their congregation. Their custom was in a manner followed by the Methodist Circuit Riders, though in the main, these records were kept for their own use, for they were the "Troubadors" of that age and as they stopped at the frontier cabins or at the wilderness churches, they were besought by settlers for news of the outside world. This information was readily obtainable from these private journals.

Some of them are yet to be found and are verily worth almost a King's ransom.

Another source of authentic information is to be found in the tax books of the different original colonies. In some states these early tax-payers' names have been listed.

So far, the lists for citizens of North Carolina have not been found, if indeed any such lists are now in existence. In a number of the counties of Virginia they are to be found but in the greater part the same answer is met with — "All our early records were destroyed by fire many years ago."

In 1940 Augusta B. Fothergill completed, from existing records in the several counties of Virginia, a list of taxpayers in 1782, the year that tax assessments were first made.

The Yarboroughs, whose names are written below, were not included in the "Heads of Families" listed in the first census 1790 — but were taxpayers in Virginia in the years 1782-1787.

The name Yarborough does not appear in the index to "Heads of Families" in the 1790 Census for Virginia. The presumption is that those of that name have removed from the State. The tide of immigration had just begun to flow about this time — 7 years after Independence — and the Virginia branch members had served in the Carolinas under Gen. Greene. Having viewed the fair hills, valleys and lowlands of the Carolinas, and drawing a mental comparison with the worn Virginia fields, when their tour of duty was ended, roped their few possessions on the faithful pack animals, saddled the family horses, and mounting, father, mother and children thereon, struck out for new homes beyond the Dansay

Here ends the Government record of the Yarborough families at the dawn of the last century. Just what prompted the British to wish to destroy the only authentic Government records is hard to determine. Was it the same savage spirit that prompted the red-coated soldiers to fire on the farmers at Lexington; the same spirit that moved them to plunge bayonets in the wounded prostrate Warren at Bunker Hill? The massacre by the infamous Buford? Perhaps they wished to reduce to ashes the participants' story of Kings Mountain and its Heroes; the rout of Tarleton at the Battle of Cowpens; the memories of the Battle of Guilford Court House, where, as Cornwallis himself said, "I have won a battle, but lost an army" — or the humiliation — the bitter memories of Yorktown, where their arms were laid down as the bands played "The World Turned Upside Down."

They were destroying the written story of the accomplishments of their own kind; throwing the torch into the buildings which housed the history of the Yarboroughs and their fellow Americans, doing their J. and



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# RICHARD YARBROUGH, THE IMMIGRANT TO VIRGINIA COLONY

Richard Yarbrough, the Immigrant, has been left until last because more information is available on this line, and because I feel he is the immigrant from which our line descended.

A number of Yarbrough researchers have traced their lines to Richard Yarbrough, very few with documented proof. Most, like me, have arrived at their conclusions because of proximity and close association of their Yarbroughs and the previous assumption that all Yarbroughs found in the records before 1732 were from the immigrant Richard.

According to his tombstone inscription, Richard Yarbrough was born in 1615. He came to America as a young man. Researchers do not agree on the time nor the place of his arrival; however, since records show he was one of the founders of Bristol Parish in 1642, we can assume he came to that area sometime before that date.

Some researchers say Richard the Immigrant was married to Frances Proctor, to Elizabeth Williams, and perhaps to others. George W. Yarbrough, a former senator of Alabama who did years of Yarbrough research stated in one of his papers that Richard Yarbrough, Jr., swore in court that his mother was Frances Yarbrough; however, I have not been able to find this court record.

A record of marriage for a Richard Yarbrough and Frances Proctor has been found in the English records dated 1635, but there is, also, a record of the death of a Frances Yarbrough in the same parish dated 1680, which seems to indicate that this Richard and Frances remained in England and were not our immigrant ancestors. 9

Richard, the Immigrant, died in 1702, at age 87, and was buried on Wells Hill inside the original enclosure of the old Blandford Church-yard. The church is presently located inside the city limits of Petersburg, Virginia, on Carter Road.

On my first visit to Petersburg, I was disturbed to find the tombstone read "Richard Scarbrough, 1702, aged 87." I wondered if the notation I had read in the William and Mary Quarterly about Richard Yarbrough being buried in Blandford Churchyard was an error. However at the Blandford Church Interpretation Center I was informed that the sandstone marker had slowly worn away over the 275 years, requiring repairs to be made and in doing so the engraver mistakenly etched an "SC" instead of a "Y". They assured me they knew of the error. Later when I heard their audio-visual presentation relate how Richard Yarbrough and a few other settlers had ventured up the James River into the wilderness, I was satisfied.

Not long after this, Bob Yarbrough led Yarbrough descendants in raising money to have a corrective slab marker placed directly in front of the original tombstone, which by then was too crumbly to be reengraved. When I returned to Petersburg in 1985 and revisited the grave, I experienced a deep feeling of pride when the guide at Blandford church pointed

out Richard Yarbrough's grave as the oldest in the cemetery and explained how the Yarbrough descendants had placed the second marker to correct the error. I was glad I'd had a small part in having it done.

According to the guide, the original church had been a wooden frame structure and for a time the cemetery had been confined to the church-yard; however, when that filled, graves were placed outside the walls as well. Then during the Civil War, heroic men who died in defense of the city of Petersburg against the Union army were buried on the gentle slopes back of the church.

The present brick church building, which was built in 1735, is now used as a memorial chapel and Confederate shrine in memory of these 30,000 Confederate soldiers buried there.

Children of Richard, according to the late Nelle Jenkins, were: William W., whose wife was Ellinor; Edmund; Henry; James; Charles; John, who married Abigail Whitehead in Gloucester Co., VA, 2 Feb. 1695; Richard, Jr., who was said to have married Elizabeth Mason and also a Miss Whitehead; and three girls. Some researchers, however, believe some of these are his grandchildren instead of his children.

A deed dated 20 May 1704 and recorded in both King William Co. and King and Queen Co., VA, proves that at least Richard and John were his sons. Extracts of the deed follow:

John Yarbrough of King William Co., planter, to William Aylett for 20 lbs. sterling and 5000 lb. tobacco, 200 acres in King William Co. Said land part of land formerly sold by the Chickahominy Indians to Arnold and by said Arnold then of King and Queen Co. to John Hurt, and by John Hurt sold to Richard Yarbrough, father of the said John, as by deed acknowledged in King and Queen County court 12 Feb. 1695 and is now in the possession of the said John Yarbrough, one half by virtue of a deed from his brother, Richard Yarbrough, and the other half as an heir to his father. Abigail Yarbrough relinquished her right of Dower in King William Court.

I, in cooperation with a group of Yarbrough researchers, have searched the early records of Virginia in an unsuccessful attempt to prove the parentage of these other Yarbroughs--William W., Edmund, Henry, James and Charles.

From SKETCHES OF VIRGINIA by Foote and from ENGLISH DUPLICATES OF LOST VIRGINIA RECORDS by Louis Cognets, Jr., we find the following early records for Richard Yarbrough and his sons, Richard, Jr., and John: (Note the spelling of Yarbrough.)

... And whereas severall parcells of Land were by the Pamunkey Indians for good and valuable consideration leased for 99 yeares to these severall persons hereafter named which Lands by the Order of Assembly at James City the 25th of April 1679 was granted to be confirmed unto them and that they should have the priority and first grant thereof when the same came to the King's hands. . .

Richard Yarborow, a tract, quantity not mentioned; John Yarborow for himselfe and the children and the devisees of Richard Yarborow;

James Edwards, Lewis Davis and Stephen Terry 1300 acres conveyed Richard Yarborow;

Henry Dilling in behalf of George Douglas, orphan and heir of Robert Douglas, dec'd, 200 acres purchased of Rich'd Yarbrow; Wm. Rawlins 800 acres purchased of Richard Yarbrow; John Oakes 550 acres conveyed from Richard Yarbrow; Wm Morris 300 acres from Rich'd Yarborow; Thomas Henreck 300 acres purchased of Richard Yarborow and John Ascough;

Peter White 300 acres from Richard Yarbrow; Mackallaster 100 acres from Richard Yarbrough.

Either this land was in the area which became New Kent Co., VA, or Richard Yarbrough, Jr., moved to New Kent Co. for in the records of the House of Burgesses, the first representative body in America, we find the following on Richard Yarbrough of New Kent Co., VA.

At a Grand Assembly began at Green Spring, the 20th of Feb. 1676, these following Orders of Public charge were made and allowed viz. . . To Richard Yarberry 6,000 pounds of Tobacco. . .

Att a Generall Assembly begun att James Citty the 16th day of Apr. in the Thirty sixth yeare of His majties Raigne and in the yeare of our Lord 1684. These following Orders of Publique Charge and Levy were made. . New Kent County. . . To Richard Yarburg for his service. . . severall tymes in discovering the Senerca Indians and other publique service with Coll Byrd 1620 pounds of tobacco. 10

Xber 7th 1685. . . The report has come from ye committee of Claimes, relating to ye New York and Albany charge is by ye house allowed and Mr. Augitor Bacon is desired to pay. . . To Richard Yarborough, Interpreter, for his voyage and services, 20 pounds. !!

At a Grand Assemblie held att James Cittie by prorogation from the one and twentieth day of September, in the year of our Lord 1674, to the Seaventh day of March in the eight and twentieth yeare of the reigne of our Soveraigne Lord Charles the second . . . An Act for the safeguard and defence of the country against the Indians. . . and forty one men out of the lower parts of New Kent County to be garrisoned at one fort or place of defence between Yerburyes house and Chickahominy Indian Towne Landing on Mattapony River. . .

In "Jacobitism in Virginia" taken from the <u>Virginia Magazine of History and Biography</u>, Vol. VI, No. 4 (1899) pp. 389-96, is found a court action held in New Kent Co. Court, 9 Oct. 1690, in which Richard Yarbrough, Jr., and wife Elizabeth were witnesses against Capt. Jacob Lumpkin who had been reported by Ben Arnold for "expressing and publickly declaring divers Seditious turbulent and unlawfull words in contempt of their maj<sup>ties</sup> and their present Governour. . "

According to the testimony of Ben Arnold, Lumpkin had not only refused to drink to their Majesties' health but had swore "God dam him if he were here I would fight him." Richard and his wife's testimonies were as follows:

Richard Yarbrough, Aged 38 years or thereabouts, Sworne, Saith:
That your Depont being att ye house of Benjamin Arnold about ye
beginning of September last, in company with Severall p'sons
of ye neighbourhood & drinking their maj<sup>ties</sup> health, King William
and Queen Mary, ye said Capt. Lumpkin refused to name them. . .
& in like manner refused to name the Govern<sup>rs</sup> health being named
by severall of ye Company Govern<sup>r</sup> Nicholson's health, or move
his hat, but he mounted his horse & yo<sup>r</sup> Depont being att some
distance heard ye said Capt. Lumpkin say with a loud voyce he
would fight ye Govern<sup>r</sup>. Whereupon ye said Joseph Clarke tooke
him up & threatened to beat him & alsoe pulled him off his
horse. And I heard noe more from him afterwards, and further
Saith not.

RICHARD YARBROUGH, his mark.

Elizabeth Yarbrough, wife of Richard Yarbrough, aged 34 years or thereabouts, Sworne, Saith that your Depont being att ye house of ye said Benjamin Arnold in ye Company afore mentioned did hear Capt. Jacob Lumpkin say with a loud voice as he satt upon his horse that he would fight ye Govern. And further Saith not.

ELIZABETH YARBROUGH, her mark.

Hath Sworne to in Court, New Kent, October ye 9th, 1690.

Test Job. Howes, Cl. Cur.

Pamunkey Neck, Mattapony River, Pamunkey River and Reedy Swamp are common landmarks regarding property of the early Yarbroughs. These land marks were in that part of New Kent County that was used to form King and Queen County, VA, in 1691. Following are some land grants in King and Queen Co., which bear this out: 12

On 29 Oct. 1695, Edward Jennings, Esq. 570 acres in King and Queen Co. on south side Mattapony River on the line of Peter White and Rich'd Yarbrough. (Patent Book 9, p. 76.)

Andrew MacCallester 86 acres King and Queen Co. in Pamunkey Neck beginning on Mattapony River--corner of old Richard Yarbrough's whole tract leased of Pamunkey Indians.

Morris Floyd 100 acres King and Queen Co. in Pamunkey Neck; 1 April 1702. . . to Peter Whites corner and Rich'd Yarbrough's new ground. (Patent Book 9, p. 452.)

In 1702 part of King and Queen County was used to form King William County, VA, and the Mattapony River became the boundary between the two counties. A number of land grants and tax records show that the Yarbrough land lay in this area and that the Yarbroughs operated a ferry on the Mattapony River.

On Oct. 28, 1702, M. Rawlins, 933 acres in King William Co., St. John's Parish in Famunkey Neck, adjacent Yarbrough's line. (Patent Book 9, page 505.)

In 1702, William Bird, 1200 acres from Yarbrough-Arnold Ferry up the Mattapony River.

From Smith's QUIT RENTS OF VIRGINIA 1704, we have the following Yarbroughs paying quit rents on land in King William Co., Virginia.

John Yarbrough, 150 acres. Richard Yarbrough, 300 acres.

Other King William records involving Yarbroughs:

May 30, 1704, John Yarbrough sold 200 acres in King William Co., to William Aylett. (Deed Book 1, p. 170.)

Nov. 8, 1704, Richard & Sarah his wife, sold to Robert Abbott 80 acres of land in King William Co. (Deed Book 1, page 231.)

May 2, 1705, Samuel Williams and William Lee received 400 acres in King William Co. on the south side run of Herring Creek. . . a little below the mouth of a branch that heads at Edward Yarbrough's plantation. (Patent Book 9, p. 649.)

May 2, 1706, John Hurt was granted 546 acres in King William Co., in Pamunkey Neck. . .down the Mattapony River by Rich'd Yarbrough's tobacco ground. (Patent Book 9, p. 733.)

A record which has puzzled me is a land grant to James Terry for 400 acres in King William County on the north side of Pamunkey River. . .16 June 1714 for the importation of eight persons including a Richard Yarbrough. (Patent Book 10) Is this another immigrant or did Richard Yarbrough, Jr., make a trip back to England?

During the 1720's we find the following Yarbroughs obtaining land grants in King William County, Virginia:

William Yarbrough, 400 acres of New Land in St. John's Parish on branches of Reedy Swamp of Mattapony River and the North Anna River adjacent Rober Baber, his own, Edward and William Yarbrough, Thomas Evans and land of Mr. English, 9 July 1724 for 40 shillings. (Patent Book 12, p. 56.) Also 250 acres new land in King William Co. in St. Margaret's Parish on north side of South Fork of South River on Frances Durrat's line, 31 Apr. 1726 for 25 shillings. (Patent Book 13, p. 27)

Edward and William, 400 acres new land in St. John's Parish on west side of Long Branch on Robert Baber and Cocecham's line, 20 Feb. 1723 for 40 shillings. (Patent Book 11, p. 330.)

Richard Yarbrough, 400 acres on north side of North Creek and on north side of South River in Richard Maulin's line in St. Margaret's Parish, 9 July 1724. (Patent Book 12, p. 57.) Also 400 acres on branch of Reedy Swamp issueing out of the Mattapony River and the branches of the North Anna in St. John's Parish adjacent to Edward Claybrook, Charles Evans

and William and Edward Yarbrough's line, 3 October 1727, 40 shillings. (Patent Book 13,, page 283.)

Charles Yarbrough, 400 acres new land in St. Margaret's Parish on south side South River adjacent Richard Malden, 17 Aug. 1725, 40 shillings. (Patent Book 12, page 257.)

John Yarbrough, 400 acres new land in King William Co., in St. John's Parish, on north side of Reedy Swamp. . .adjacent John Sutton's line and Capt. Christopher Smith. . .17 Aug. 1725. (Patent Book 12, p. 259.)

Caroline County, VA, was formed from parts of King William, King and Queen, and Essex Counties in 1727/28. (1727 by the old style calendar in which the new year started in March and 1728 by the more modern calendar whereby the year began in January.) As a result the Reedy Swamp and the North Anna and South Rivers where part of the above mentioned Yarbrough land grants were located were now in Caroline County. The following grant for Edward Yarbrough proves this:

September 27, 1729, Edward Yarbrough, 200 acres new land in Caroline Co. between the south fork and middle fork of Reedy Swamp in St. Margaret's Parish. (Patent Book 13, page 300.)

Early records of New Kent, King and Queen, King William and Caroline Counties have been destroyed except the land grants, which are in the State Archives, and a few other records including the Caroline Co. Court Order Books. This loss of records makes it virtually impossible to prove Yarbrough lineages.

From one of the court records of Caroline Co., it is learned that a Richard Yarbrough of Caroline Co., VA, married Sarah Weller, widow of William Weller about 1747. 13 However it hasn't been proven which Richard Yarbrough this is. Another obstacle to overcome is the fact that almost every Yarbrough line has a Richard, John, Edward, Henry, William, Thomas, etc. With so many Yarbroughs with the same given name, it is difficult to sort them out.

Other Yarbroughs found in the Caroline Co., Virginia, Court Order Books from 1728 to 1752 were: Richard, Jr., John, William and wife Diana, Charles, Edward and wife Eliza, Griggs, Thomas Griggs, Abraham, Thomas, Henry, James, Lazarius, Jeremiah, and Joshua Yarbrough. The last of these, Joshua Yarbrough, is the earliest Yarbrough ancestor of which I am reasonably sure.

In spite of the fact I have spent more time and effort on the Yarbrough line than all my other lines and have gathered a wealth of information, I have found no documentation or even convincing evidence determining the relationship of Joshua to the other Yarbroughs found with him in Caroline County, Virginia; however, researchers tend to agree they are all descendants of Richard I. All the previous information has been given to show that these Yarbroughs living in Caroline county are living in the same area as John, Richard, Jr., and other early Yarbroughs, the counties have just changed names. We have proof that both John and Richard, Jr. are sons of Richard I, so we feel sure our Joshua was a descendant of this line of Yarbroughs.

Joshua III died 1844 in Campbell Co., GA. By then he had married again for he names his wife Nancy Yarborough; sons: James, Joshua T., Thomas J., Uriah, Greenberry, George, Charles. Daughters: Elizabeth, Sarah, Elender, and ? (illegible).

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Shadrack Yarbrough was not in the 1800 census, but he appeared on the 1799 Tax List. Since Joshua, Sr., had a boy at home between 16 and 26 in 1800 and also two boys and two girls below 10, it could be that Shadrack had lost his wife and was living with his parents. However he could have been a bachelor.

Shadrack made entry for land in Mecklenburg Co. 22 Feb. 1792 and received 200 acres on 12 Apr. 1798. (Grant Book 98, p. 68) The land was located on the waters of Richardsons Creek. He made another entry 2 Jan. 1793 and received 72 acres on waters of Cain Creek on 9 Mar. 1799. He received a third grant from the state for 200 acres on Richardson Creek on Dec. 22, 1800. On June 21, 1802 Shadrack sold 72 acres on Waxhaw Creek to Peter Presly.

Shadrack remained in Mecklenburg until after 1840. He undoubtedly died there, for the court records show Ezekiel and Micogen were appointed administrators of his estate in Mecklenburg Co.

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This is the last entry for Joshua Yarbrough and we wonder if this land was given to Shem, for Shem lived on in Mecklenburg County until after 1840. In 1850 he is listed in the Washington Co., TN, census with a wife Nelly. She is 76 and Shem is 75. Children listed are Eulin, 15; Polly, 12; Clinton, 11; Dicy, 8. Perhaps they are grandchildren since they are too old to have such young children. Listed next door is a Jeptha Yarborough, age 52, who was listed with Shem in the 1840 Mecklenburg Co. census. He has wife Elizabeth, 36; children, Alonza, 18; Francis M. 16; Talbot C., 14; Lucinda, 11; Middleton M., 6; Burt R., 3. Also listed with him is a William Yarbrough, 39, who was also in the 1840 Mecklenburg census.

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Priscilla and his brother Moses Yarbrough; however, Moses died leaving a will recorded 22 Apr. 1756, Amelia Co., VA, giving all his estate to his sister Priscilla Yarbrough, so evidently these two brothers were unmarried when they died. Henry Yarbrough witnessed both these wills.

Samuel, another son of William, moved to Orange Co., NC, where he left a will probated 5 Nov. 1770, naming his wife, Sarah; children: William, Samuel, John, Elizabeth, Sarah, and Lewcey Yarbrough. Another son, William, Jr., remained in Amelia Co. and later lived in Prince Edward County which was formed from Amelia County in 1754. His will, recorded there in 1771, names sons: James Smith, Oswell, Joseph, Richard, and William; and daughter, Elizabeth Yarbrough. No wife is named, but from Bristol Parish register and Caroline Co., VA, Order Books we learn his wife was Diana Smith and that she died 18 May 1767.

The last son of William Yarbrough, Sr., Micajah, is a mystery. A few researchers have suggested that he was probably father of my Joshua because Joshua named a son Micajah. During this time children were named for their parents, grandparents, and other relatives; however, I have abandoned this theory after thoroughly searching Amelia County records for this period without finding his name mentioned except in his father's will by which he inherited 400 acres. No record was found where he disposed of the land which is a puzzle for Amelia County records are well preserved.

Another will found in Amelia County, Virginia, is for Thomas Yarbrough recorded 23 Mar. 1769, naming his wife Hannah; children: Jordon, Archibald, Hannah, Mary, Jane, and Catherine Yarbrough and grandson Thomas Yarbrough. The son Jordon left a will recorded 25 Oct. 1770 in Amelia County, leaving all his property to his brothers and sisters, so he, too, died unmarried. (WB 2, p. 332) Thomas's other son Archibald lived on in Amelia and Prince Edward Counties with his wife Ann.

From Amelia County court records we learn that the father of Thomas's wife, Hannah, was Samuel Jordon and the father of Thomas Yarbrough was another Thomas Yarbrough. From Amelia County tax records we learn that Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., also, had sons, John and Zachariah. They were listed as his titheables in the tax lists of 1747 and 1749. Our Joshua Yarbrough was, also, listed in these same tax lists as head of a household, and since he earlier received land grants lying next to Thomas, Sr., and Thomas, Jr.'s, land, I am inclined to believe Joshua is an older son of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., which would possibly make him a great grandson of Richard, the immigrant, because most researchers believe that Thomas, Sr., was son of Richard Yarbrough, Jr., and grandson of Richard Yarbrough, the immigrant. No proof, however, has been found.

on 20 Oct. 1749 Joshua sold the 400 acres he had received as a land grant in Amelia County to Richard Stone for the sum of 20 pounds current money of Virginia. Joshua's wife Sarah "being examined privately relinquished her right of dower. (Deed Book 3, p. 295)

The next record found for Joshua Yarbrough was in 1754 when he was listed in Captain Surgar Jones's Company of Granville Co., NC, Militia. A year later both Joshua and John Yarbrough are listed on the Granville Co. tax list. In 1758 Joshua is again listed on the tax list and paid



## INTRODUCTION

We have attempted in these two books to set forth the essential data on all early East Tennessee marriages for which records have survived. The area included is outlined on the map on the next page; records published here are for 20 shaded counties. Official ante-bellum marriage records do not exist for the rest of them.

All pre-1861 marriages are set forth here. Where feasible and convenient (primarily because of cutoff dates of the original books) we have also included many later records as well.

The information in the brides book is a duplication of that in the grooms, the difference being in the order in which they appear. Each book is a single area-wide alphabetical listing of the records.

Where two dates appear on an entry, the first one is the date license was issued, the second (in parentheses) the date marriage was solemnized. If only one date, it usually means that the date of execution was the same as the date of license issuance.

It should be remembered that the entries are, in most cases, far from complete; they show names of the celebrants, county and dates, and no more, whereas the original books and the books from which this information was extracted usually contained additional data, much of which can be of inestimable importance to the genealogist. Such data as names of bondsmen, ministers, justices of the peace, churches, etc. is omitted. In some cases age, names of parents, occupations and similar information are to be found with the source material cited in the Bibliography (at end of second volume), or in the original marriage books.

At the end of each entry is a county symbol. Key to the county symbols is on the following page. Immediately before the county symbol may be a B or an \* or both. The B is for black or colored; the \* means that the source material included additional information of sufficient importance that we urge the researcher to obtain a copy of the source book or microfilm if possible.

Almost all the original marriage books are available on microfilm at The Tennessee State Library and Archives in Nashville. This, of course, is the nearest we can come to "truth" in the records. But it should be remembered that the clerks who entered the data were fallable; glaring errors appear frequently. As in all genealogical quests, certainty or something near it is best obtained through other records that corroborate these.

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

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tithes on his sons, Joshua, Jr., and Micajah. In 1766 he lists James as his son on the tax list. Tithes had to be paid on sons beginning at age 16. We know from the tax lists that Joshua had at least three sons.

Joshua, Sr., received two land grants in Granville County in 1761. Grant #116 was issued 29 July 1761 for 700 acres on the south side of Shocco Creek. (Book 14, p. 109) Grant #156 was issued 5 Dec. 1761 for 700 acres on both sides of Mill Stone run. (Book 14, p. 109) Samuel Yarbrough, also, received a land grant for 260 acres in 1760. John, Manoah, and Henry Yarbrough bought land in Granville Co. before 1760. Manoah was, also, listed in the tax list as son of Thomas Yarbrough.

Soon after getting his grants, Joshua began selling tracts of land from it. Sept. 5, 1761, he sold Thomas Davis 379 acres on Shocco Creek. March 28, 1763, he sold Joshua Nelms 250 acres on Millstone River. On 23 Jan. 1764 he sold his son Micajah Yarbrough 150 acres on Sliding Rock Branch on John Yarbrough's line. Joshua, Jr., witnessed this deed.

In 1764 Bute Co. was formed from that part of Granville County where the Yarbroughs lived and in 1766 Joshua sold 280 acres more of his land to Eley Eley with Green Hill, Manoah Yarbrough and James Yarbrough as witnesses. Then on 3 Aug. 1766 he sold 120 acres where the lived to Green Hill. Eley Eley and Micajah Yarbrough were witnesses. I feel that these to whom he sold land were his sons-in-law or grandsons.

In the 1771 tax list of Bute Co., NC, the following were listed: James Yarbrough, 1 poll; Henry Yarbrough, Jr., 1; Richard Yarbrough, 1; Henry Yarbrough, 6; Midajah Yarbrough, 1; James Yarbrough, 1; Joshua, 2; Zachariah, 1. Yarbroughs found in other records of Granville and Bute Counties which haven't been mentioned were: Littleton Yarbrough, John and Wife Elizabeth, Martha wife of Henry Yarbrough, Thomas and Charles.

Except for the three children already mentioned--Joshua, Jr., James, and Micajah--we aren't sure how Joshua is related to the others. Some may, also, be his children; others may be brothers; at least, they must all be closely related, so we've tried to learn something about each of them.

An article on the Yarbrough family, printed in the Lexington, NC, Dispatch, January 5, 1898 states: "Between the years 1729 and 1775, seven brothers of Yarbroughs (from Amelia Co., VA) moved to Louisburg, Franklin Co., North Carolina. Their names were Zachariah, Archibald, Manoah, Alexander, Thomas, Henry, and John." Since over a hundred years had passed between the migration of Yarbroughs and the publication of the article, we must view the story as family legend and probably not completely accurate.

True we have convincing evidence that Zachariah, Manoah, John and Thomas are brothers and all four names are found in Granville and Bute County records; however, the Thomas found in Granville Co. wasn't the brother Thomas. As mentioned before their brother Thomas left a will in Amelia County. Furthermore tax records list Thomas Yarbrough of Granville County as father of Manoah, so that proves an error. Also Granville County as father of Manoah, so that proves an error of neither Alexander nor Archibald have been found in the early records of these counties, but Joshua was there and I can't help believing he was one of the brothers.

The last record found for Joshua Yarbrough, Sr., was 1780 in Franklin Co., NC, which was formed from part of Bute Co. in 1778. Joshua was living by his son Micajah. He probably lived on there until his death which must have been before 1790 as he isn't in the 1790 Franklin Co., NC, census. Information on other Yarbroughs living with Joshua in Granville and Bute Counties follows:

Henry Yarbrough, Sr., and wife Martha Robinson, found in Amelia County, VA, by 1739; bought land in Granville Co., NC, in 1760 while still living in Virginia. He died intestate in Franklin Co., NC, between 1790 and 1800. He is said to have children: James, Henry, Charles, Edward, Thomas, Clement and two daughters.

Henry Yarbrough, Jr., and wife Elizabeth Murray, Henry, son of Henry, Sr., and Martha Yarbrough, left a will in Franklin Co., NC, probated June 1794. (WB A, p. 123) Children: Archibald, Charles, David, Henry, James, Thomas, Nancy, Frances, and Martha.

James Yarbrough, son of Henry Yarbrough, Sr. in Franklin Co. until 1800.

Manoah Yarbrough, was in Granville Co., NC, by July 1756; moved to Georgia in 1769 according to a petition he filed requesting a land grant in St. George's Parish in May 1770. Littleton and Thomas were in the same parish by 1790. They are possibly his sons.

Zachariah Yarbrough, listed in Amelia Co. tax list in 1747 and 1749 as a titheable of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr.; came to Bute Co. before 1771; then to Rowan Co. and finally to Randolph Co., NC, where he made entry for a land grant in 1795 which he received in 1802. He is said to have married Elizabeth Dowd and had children: Zachariah, Jr., Henry, Thomas, Alexander, Manoah, Julia, Elizabeth, Archibald, and John.

John and wife Elizabeth Yarbrough, moved from Amelia Co., VA, before 1755. John was son of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. According to George W. Yarbrough, a descendant, they moved to Fairfield Co., SC, where he died in 1816. Children: Jesse, Moses, Arthur, Thomas, Martha, Joseph, Richard and Nancy.

Micajah Yarbrough, son of Joshua and Sarah, received a warrant for 100 acres by improvement on branches of Mill Stone in Bute Co., NC, adjacent to his own line and his father Joshua Yarbrough's line on 24 Jan. 1778. On 10 Oct. 1783 he received a grant for 100 acres in Franklin Co., NC, on the waters of Sandy Creek. (Grant Book 52, p. 179) He was found in Franklin Co. as late as 1810. He had sons: Micajah, Jr., Joshua, Shadrick and perhaps others.

James Yarbrough, son of Joshua and Sarah, was last found in Bute Co. records in 1770. Evidence leads me to believe he is the James Yarbrough who in 1784 received a grant of 287½ acres in Franklin Co., Georgia, for Revolutionary War services. This James and his eldest son were killed by Indians not long after settling in Georgia. Heirs to his land, which we assume are his children, were: Groves, Joshua, Susanna, Mary, John, Jeremiah, Elizabeth and the wives of Anderson Berry and Jesse Bowden. The fact that one of his sonswas named Joshua and that three Yarbroughs thought to be James's brother, Joshua, Jrs.'s sons—Gideon, Jeptha, and Benjamin joined the family in Franklin Co., GA, by 1804 convinces me that this James is indeed James, son of Joshua and Sarah.

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

Chang-Eng (commonly known as the Siamese twins) reprisent to this Honourable Court, that they are natives of the Kingdom of Siam in Asia - That they arrived in Boston in the State of Massachusetts (U.S.) on the 16th of August 1829...In October of that year they went to England and returned to the United States in March 1831 & resided therin without leaving ..until the Fall of 1835 when they went to Lower Canada- Soon after went to the Continent of Europe and were absent about 12 months - After their return in 1836 they went to the Province of Lower Canada where they remained until October 1836 when they returned to the United States & have continued therein without leaving. & since the 1st day of June 1839 have continued within the state of North Carolina. They further represent that during their continuance within the United States they have behaved as men of good moral character, that they are attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States...and...they declare their intention to become citizens of the United States and to renounce...allegiance to the King of Siam..." 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Ophelia Kessler Box 261 Neuxastle, Tex. 76372 Joshua III died 1844 in Campbell Co., GA. By then he had married again for he names his wife Nancy Yarborough; sons: James, Joshua T., Thomas J., Uriah, Greenberry, George, Charles. Daughters: Elizabeth, Sarah, Elender, and \_\_\_? (illegible).

It is not known if Joshua II remained in Mecklenburg until his death or if he went with Joshua III to Chester Co., SC. In the 1810 census of Chester Co. a Jos. Yarbrough, Sr., and Jos. Yarbrough, Jr., were listed. The age groups were right to be Joshua II and Joshua III, but Jos. usually stands for Joseph; however, on checking the deed index I found no Joseph buying or selling land. Only one Joshua was listed in the 1820 Chester Co. Census, so what happened to Joshua II is a mystery.

Shadrack Yarbrough was not in the 1800 census, but he appeared on the 1799 Tax List. Since Joshua, Sr., had a boy at home between 16 and 26 in 1800 and also two boys and two girls below 10, it could be that Shadrack had lost his wife and was living with his parents. However he could have been a bachelor.

Shadrack made entry for land in Mecklenburg Co. 22 Feb. 1792 and received 200 acres on 12 Apr. 1798. (Grant Book 98, p. 68) The land was located on the waters of Richardsons Creek. He made another entry 2 Jan. 1793 and received 72 acres on waters of Cain Creek on 9 Mar. 1799. He received a third grant from the state for 200 acres on Richardson Creek on Dec. 22, 1800. On June 21, 1802 Shadrack sold 72 acres on Waxhaw Creek to Peter Presly.

Shadrack remained in Mecklenburg until after 1840. He undoubtedly died there, for the court records show Ezekiel and Micogen were appointed administrators of his estate in Mecklenburg Co.

Shem Yarbrough was first found in Mecklenburg Co. in 1798 when he witnessed a deed for Joshua, Sr., when he sold land to Gideon Yarbrough. For some reason Shem was also left off the 1800 census, but in 1810 he was listed as between 26 and 45 with one son and three daughters below ten years old. His wife was also between 26 and 45.

In 1810 Joshua Yarbrough made entry for 150 acres on Richardson Creek and received it 4 Dec. 1811. The land was described as "lying on the south side of Beaverdam Creek where Shem Yarborow now lives.

This is the last entry for Joshua Yarbrough and we wonder if this land was given to Shem, for Shem lived on in Mecklenburg County until after 1840. In 1850 he is listed in the Washington Co., TN, census with a wife Nelly. She is 76 and Shem is 75. Children listed are Eulin, 15; Polly, 12; Clinton, 11; Dicy, 8. Perhaps they are grandchildren since they are too old to have such young children. Listed next door is a Jeptha Yarborough, age 52, who was listed with Shem in the 1840 Mecklenburg Co. census. He has wife Elizabeth, 36; children, Alonza, 18; Francis M. 16; Talbot C., 14; Lucinda, 11; Middleton M., 6; Burt R., 3. Also listed with him is a William Yarbrough, 39, who was also in the 1840 Mecklenburg census.

REUBEN YARBROUGH, our ancestor, will be discussed in the next part.

Broad River in 1814. Evidence indicates Charlotte was a daughter of our Reuben instead of Joshua as suggested by the author of FISHER SCRAPBOOK. He gave her birth date as 1785, making her 15 in 1800. Reuben had a daughter in that age group in the 1800 census of Mecklenburg Co., while Joshua didn't. He had two females under 10 and one over 45 years of age.

Perhaps Reuben and family came to Tennessee on the flat boat with the Fisher family. On the other hand they may have come by ox-cart. In the Marysville, Kansas, Advocate, dated 11 June 1908, we find the obituary of Williamson F. Boyakin, whose mother was Millie Yarbrough. It states that the 100-year-old Boyakin had moved, at age one, with his parents from Anson Co., NC, to Maury Co., TN, in a caravan consisting of "100 two-wheeled carts of primitive construction, not a pound of iron being used in the whole outfit." The trip was made in 1807, so since Reuben was still in Mecklenburg County (which lies next to Anson Co.) until after 1810, he couldn't have gone on that trip, but perhaps there were other ox-cart caravans which made the same trip later.

Reuben Yarber was the only Yarbrough in the 1820 Maury Co., TN, census, but in 1830 he was listed in Bedford Co. census along with Joel, Sampson, and Jacob Yarbrough. In 1836 Marshall Co. was formed, taking in that part of Bedford County where the Yarbroughs lived, so in that county's first census of 1840, D. H. Yarboro, George Yarboro, Joel Yarboro, Ruben Yarboro and Sampson Yarboro were listed. This Ruben, however, wasn't Reuben, Sr. This Ruben was listed in the 20-30 age group. Reuben, Sr., is not listed. He is thought to be living in the household of D. H. Yarbrough for he has an elderly man living in his household. All the above mentioned Yarbroughs are thought to be sons of Reuben, Sr. By the census we know he had at least seven sons.

In the 1850 census (the first one in which wives and children are named) we find the families of George, Joel, Rheuben, Jr., and Doctor H. In this census the spelling was Yarbrow. Reuben, Sr., is living with the George Yarbrough family and is listed as age 83 and born in North Carolina. George, Joel, Rheuben, Jr., and Doctor H. were, also born in North Carolina.

Reuben, Sr., wasn't found in the 1860 census, so evidently he died between 1850 and 1860. No will or estate records have been found, probably because he had already disposed of all his property; therefore, we have no proof of the names of his children; however, in the biography of George Yarbrough's son, Jasper, found in Goodspeed's HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, TENNESSEE, we learn George's father had 14 children. Since census records show Reuben had at least 13 children (in 1820 there were 14, but he had a new wife so some of them may have been hers) and is the only Yarbrough living in the area who had that many children and the fact he was living in the household of George Yarbrough seems to be adequate proof he is the father of George Yarbrough, our great grandfather, and, also, the others listed with him in the census. Children of Reuben and Rebecca of which we are reasonably sure are:

I. CHARLOTTE YARBROUGH, born 1785 in North Carolina; married to Jacob Fisher about 1805, Mecklenburg Co., NC. They moved to Tennessee in 1814 and lived neighbors to Reuben Yarbrough in Maury and Bedford Counties. She died in 1822 in childbirth. Their children were:

## REUBEN AND REBECCA YARBROUGH

The earliest record found so far for Reuben Yarbrough, our great great grandfather, was July 1788 when he witnessed a deed by which Joshua Yarbrough sold Thomas Vinson land in Mecklenburg Co., North Carolina.

In 1791 Reuben made an entry at the land office for a state land grant in Mecklenburg County. Two grants were issued--#1406 issued 12 April 1798 for 250 acres on both sides of Beaver Dam Fork of Richardson Creek. (Book 98, page 76.) The second grant was #1404 issued 12 April 1798 for 100 acres on the waters of Richardson Creek. (Book 98, page 74.)

A note dated 25 July 1797 was with the grant. It states, "Joshua Yarbrough and James Doster appeared in open court and made oath that they paid the purchase money for 350 acres of land into the Entry Takers office on behalf of Reuben Yarbrough." This convinced me that Joshua is indeed Reuben's father. Perhaps James Doster is his father-in-law.

Besides the 350 acres Reuben received in land grants, he purchased 250 acres from John Hodges. All this land lay on Richardson Creek in Mecklenburg Co., North Carolina.

From deeds we know Reuben's wife was Rebecca, but since no marriage record has been found, her last name is unknown. Reuben wasn't listed in the 1790 census which is a puzzle because he was undoubtedly married before then, for the 1800 census shows him with two daughters over 10; three daughters under 10 and three sons under 10. Both Reuben and wife, Rebecca were listed as being between 26 and 45.

On 21 June 1802 both Reuben and Rebecca Yarbrough signed a deed selling Jacob Broom the 250 acres on Beaver Dam Fork of Richardson Creek which he had gotten as a land grant. Rebecca must have died sometime between the date of this deed and the 1810 census because there is not a female listed in her age group. Since there were five children under 10, we can assume she died of child birth as many women of those days did. The fact she didn't sign two other deeds Reuben made selling land in Mecklenburg Co. bears out the fact that she died. With the five children born between 1800 and 1810 added to the eight shown in the 1800 census makes thirteen children born to Reuben and wife.

In 1820 Rubin Yarber is found in Maury Co., TN, census. Either he had remarried or some of his married children or a housekeeper with children was living in the household for now there is a female over 45, three females 26-45, three females 16-25, one female 10-16, one male over 45, one male 26-45, two males 18-25, one male 16-18, two males 10-16, and one male under 10--a total of 16 in the household. That same year Reuben bought two tracts of land in Bedford Co., TN, where he was living when he sold the rest of his land in Mecklenburg Co., NC. Both deeds refer to him as Reuben Yarbrough of Bedford Co., TN, proving it is the same Reuben Yarbrough who formerly lived in Mecklenburg Co., NC.

It hasn't been determined the time nor mode of transportation Reuben used in moving from Mecklenburg Co., NC, to Maury Co., TN; however, according to FISHER SCRAPBOOK, Jacob Fisher who married Charlotte Yarbrough in Mecklenburg Co. came to Maury Co., TN, on a flat boat down the French

- VII. REUBEN YARBROUGH, born 1810, North Carolina; married Jonah. Children listed in the 1850 Marshall County, Tennessee, census:

It should be re-emphasized that no actual proof has been found that the above are Reuben Yarbrough's children; however, there is enough evidence to convince me they are. The following may, also, be his children, but there is less evidence to support that theory.

- VIII. James Yarbrough, married Elizabeth Fisher 9 June 1833. During the settlement of Fredrick Fisher's estate in 1934, James Yarbrough and wife received one bed and furniture valued at \$20.00; one saddle at 17 dollars; and \$10 cash. No further information.
  - IX. Polly Yarbrough, married Henry Thompson, 6 July 1820, Maury Co., TN. No further information found on this couple.
    - X. Rebecca Yarbrough, married Josiah Luallen, 24 Mar. 1813, Maury Co., TN. No further information.
  - XI. Chloe Yarbrough, married Benjamin Wright, 2 Dec. 1830. The fact that these last four Yarbroughs married in Maury County during the period that Reuben Yarbrough was living in that area is the only reason to think they might be his children; also, the fact that he had several grown daughters and sons in the 1820 census who were gone in 1830.

Below is the biography of Jasper Yarbrough found on page 1232 of the Goodspeed History of Marshall County, Tennessee, which is one of the reasons I feel sure that Reuben is the father of George Yarbrough.

JASPER A. YARBROUGH, register of Marshall County, is a son of George and Nancy E. (Gibbons) Yarbrough. The father was born in North Carolina and the mother in Tennessee. They were married in Tennessee, and their family consisted of ten children, Jasper's maternal grandparents had twenty six children and his paternal had fourteen. Both our subject's parents were members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. The father was a well-to-do farmer and had the honor of furnishing three brave boys for the war, one of whom was killed. The father lived to be about seventy-six and the mother about seventy-four. Our subject, who was born November 7, 1839, in Marshall County, is a man three feet and nine and a half inches in height. He was reared on the farm and received a practical education in the common schools. Having picked up the shoe-maker's trade he worked at it for about eight years, besides teaching school. He was always a very handy workman and could make a suit of clothes, knit a pair of socks, or almost anything he turned his hand to. In 1874 he was elected register, and has held that position ever since with ability and to the satisfaction of the people. In 1881 he wedded Lizzie McKee. The fruits of this union were three children, two of whom are living. Mr. and Mrs. Yar. brough are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He has been a citizen of Marshall County for forty-six years. In politics he is a warm Democrat.

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#### GEORGE W. YARBROUGH AND NANCY E. GIBBONS

George Yarbrough, born 15 Feb. 1807, NC; married Nancy E. Gibbons, daughter of Thomas Gibbons, 24 July 1828; died 1878, at age 71, Marshall County, Tennessee. Nancy was born 20 Apr. 1808, TN; died 1880, at age 72. (See Gibbons section.) They are both buried in the Ligget-Andrews Cemetery, Franklin Road, near Lewisburg, Marshall Co., TN.

The first time George's name appears in county records was when he witnessed a deed for his brother in 1826. Joel Yarbrough of Bedford Co., TN, was buying 50 acres from Fredrick Fisher of Maury Co. The land was described as being on the Sinking Branch of Rock Creek, on the south side of Duck River in Bedford County, Tennessee. (Book Y, page 253)


Two years later George and Nancy were married probably in Bedford County where the Yarbroughs lived or White County where the Gibbons lived at that time. Since both county's early marriage records have been destroyed, the only record found of their marriage was the family Bible records. Because of the loss of records it is difficult to document much of the Yarbrough information. No actual proof has been found that George was son of Reuben, but there seems little doubt for the following reasons:

The biography of George's son Jasper which appears in Goodspeed's HISTORY OF MARSHALL COUNTY, TENNESSEE states that Jasper's father was one of 14 children, and as stated previously, census records show Reuben as the only Yarbrough in the area with that many children. Then, too, a son was shown in Reuben's household in the age group in which George would be in every census until the time of George's marriage, then he was gone, but was listed as head of his own household in the same census with Reuben. The fact that Reuben was living with George's family in 1850, and both men were born in North Carolina seems to be conclusive evidence.


The first record we have of George buying land was in Marshall Co. when he bought 95 acres from his father-in-law, Thomas Gibbons, 18 Aug 1838. Both men were of Marshall Co., and the land was described as being on Rich Creek in Marshall County. D. H. Yarbrough was one of the witnesses. (Book B, page 301

From that date until his death in 1878, George had 15 land transactions in Marshall County. He was engaged in farming all his life; however, in the 1860 Marshall Co. census he was listed as a "common school teacher," so evidently he taught school some too. The Yarbrough family was a close neighbor to the Devin family, and James (Jimmy) Devin, when just a young boy, worked on the farm for George Yarbrough.

Three of George and Nancy's boys--John Fletcher, Rufus, and George W., Jr.--fought for the Confederacy. Rufus died in the conflict; yet if it caused the family to feel any bitterness toward the North, it wasn't passed on to their descendants. Perhaps it was because George and Nancy were devout Christians. They belonged to the Methodist Church. It is said that George wouldn't own slaves. He always said a person couldn't make any money on them if they were treated as they should be treated, and he wasn't about to treat them any other way.

In 1891 John, his wife, and eight children moved to Madison Co., AR, by covered wagons. Elvira's mother, brothers and sister came along with them in their own wagon. John's sister Martha Howell and husband were already living in Arkansas, so the Yarbrough family stayed with them until they could get settled in a home of their own. They traded the Howells a team for some land on which a log house was built and the two families lived neighbors for a number of years. Since both the Yarbroughs and Howells were good singers, they spent many hours singing gospel songs together.

John died 29 Dec. 1893 leaving his wife Elvira with several small children; however some of the boys were old enough to farm the land. Elvira died 4 Mar. 1914 with tuberculosis. Both she and John were buried in Big Sandy Cemetery, Madison Co., AR: Children born to John and Elvira:





#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

JASPER A. YARBROUGH

"JASPER A. YARBROUGH, register of Marshall County [Tennessee], is a son of George and Nancy E. (Gibbons) Yarbrough. The father was born in North Carolina and the mother in Tennessee. They were married in Tennessee, and their family consisted of ten children. Jasper's maternal grandparents had twenty-six children and his paternal had fourteen. Both our subject's parents were members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. The father was a well-to-do farmer and had the honor of furnishing three brave boys for the war, one of whom was killed. The father lived to be about seventy-six and the mother about seventy-four. Our subject, who was born November 7, 1839, in Marshall County, is a man three feet and nine and a half inches in height. He was reared on the farm and received a practical education in the common schools. Having picked up the shoemaker's trade he worked at it for about eight years, besides teaching school. He was always a very handy workman and could make a suit of clothes, knit a pair of socks, or almost anything he turned his hand to. In 1874 he was elected register, and has held that position ever since with ability and to the satisfaction of the people. In 1881 he wedded Lizzie McKee. The fruits of this union were three children, two of whom are living. Mr. & Mrs. Yarbrough are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He has been a citizen of Marshall County for forty-six years. In politics he is a warm  $\mathsf{Democrat}$ ."



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


Our name took its initial formation between the 11th and 13th centuries and was first recorded as a descriptive identification to distinguish one person from another. By 1490 it had become a recognized surname and was passed on to others in the family. Changing through the centuries it has mutated to its present form.


At the time when your name evolved the Crusades began in the year 1095 under the direction of Pope Arban 11, the need for identifying symbols arose and these took the form of roats-of-Meralds recorded these armorial bearings and it is from these records that we have confirmed the coat of arms for your The tinctures and charges represented on the coatfamily name. of-arms offer a link with the honors of the past to the present bearer of the name. Ancient warriors and statesmen of the same name, if not of the same family lineage, were responsible for the emergence of civilization and society from the era which we now call the 'dark ages' to the new dawn of the twentieth century. It is unlikely that you will find a coat-of-arms exactly the same as your own because in the middle ages when Heraldry was a functional science records of arms grants existed in great numbers and were under the control of the Meralds. of the shield on which your coat-of-arms has been drawn dates back to the 13th century. Its function then was to ward off

arrows shot from the cross-bow, blows from mases and protection

from battle-axes and swords.

### (FROM WHAT I HAVE FOUND)

Since the Yarbrough (Yarbro) family's were individuals and some moved around quite often, I have found it very difficult. They were very independent people. They were people with high honor.

I have traced the surname back to France and England. I have received the Coat of Arms for the surname and I am very proud to be a descendant of the Yarbrough (Yarbro) name.

## An outline of the family name (YARBROUGH, YARBRO)

The Family name is descended from William Yarbrough, who was one of 60,000 Normans who embarked as vassals to the Duke of Normandy in the year 1046 to conquer England, for his valiancy, William the Conquerer of England gave to William the Earldom of Yorkshire County, England which still exists.

Some of the descendants of the Earl came from England and settled in Virginia in Amelia County. Because of feelings between the two countries at the time, the family tried to lose their identity as soon as possible - among the methods used was the changing of the spelling of the name.

In 1729, seven brothers moved to Louisburg, Franklin County, North Carolina. Their names were Zacharia, Archibald, Monah, William, Ambros, Thomas and Henry.

Before the war for Independence, Zacharian and Ambros left Louisburg and settled in Rowan, now Davidson County, North Carolina. Here Ambros married and his son William was born in 1752. William had four brothers and two sisters.

In 1774 Thomas was born to the above William Yarbro, Yarbrough. Our great-grandfather, Joseph D. Yarbro was born in 1836, was married to Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbro about 1856-1857. She was half Cherokee Indian and was born 8 September, 1839 in Alabama and died 7 May 1878 in Runnels County, Texas. She was buried in the old Fort Chaburn Cemetery, Coke County, Texas. The family lived most of their lives in the State of Texas. Our grandfather, William Dock Yarbro was born 20 September 1860 in Hill County, Texas, died 25 June in San Bernardino, California and is buried in the same. He married Eliza Jane (Caraway) Yarbro, 22 February 1886 in San Angelo, Tom Green County, Texas.

Our father, Jeff Davis Yarbro, son of the above William Dock Yarbro was born 9 March 1890 in Coke County, Texas, in a small place called Panther Gapp near Robert Lee, Coke County, Texas. Jeff Davis Yarbro died 1st September 1969, Post, Garza County, Texas. Buried 3rd September 1969 in Terrance Cemetery, Post, Garza County, Texas.

Who were the parents of William Yarbro, and what were the names of the other four brothers of William? What were the names of the children of Thomas? Son of William Yarbro, Yarbrough? The family is decended from William Yarbrough, who was one of 60,000 Normans who embarked as vassale to the Duke of Normandy in the year 1046 to conquer England, for his valiancy William the Conquerer of England gave to William the Earldom of Yorkshire County, England which still exists.

Some of the decendents of the earl, came from England and settled in Virginia in Amelia County, Because of feelings between the two countries at that time the family tried to lose their identity as soon as possible. Among the methods used was the change of the spelling of the name: Yarbrough, Yarbro, Yarber, appear. In Mexico they spell it Barye, and Ybare.

In 1729 seven brothers moved from Virginia, to Louisville, Franklin County North Carolina, their names were, Zachariah, Archibald, Monoah, William, Ambros, Thomas, and Henry, (our forbearer may be Thomas, Henry, or Ambros.)

Before the war for Independance, Zachariah and Ambros, left Louisberg and settled in Rowan, now Davidson County, N.C. Here Ambros married and his son William was born in 1752. William had four brothers and two sisters.

In 1774 Thomas Yarbrough was born to William. Thomas has the following children, Thomas, Alexander, Ambros, William, and John, of these five men only three are known by our family: William, Ambros, and Thomas traveled west into the new country, often together but finally settled in sep rate places. Thomas in Mississippi, William in Alabama, and Ambros in Lawrencebure Tennesse.

Ambros was born in 1800. His wife in 1804 at Lewisburg, Tennessee. It seems that he met Mary Murdock at Lewisburg on his way from N.C. to Lawrenceburg. They married and he continued to Lawrenceburg in 1826. Mry had a brother Samuel Murdock. They had seven children: Nathan, Hamilton, Samuel, Laura, Cliopatra, Narcissus, and Penelope.

From the three brothers who came west. William, Ambros, and Thomas, from one of these three, our great-grand father Joseph D. Yarbrough (Yabre) was born I rather think it would be Ambros, as he is the one who went to Tennesse Joseph D. our great-grand father was born in Tennessee about the year of 1835-1836.

Now I have to find the one out of the three who lived in Tennessee, and had a son named Joseph D. to fill in the middle gap.

In my openion from talking with my Father ( B.A. Modrall) that E.M.W. and Eudora Lived near the Nolan CO. and Runnels CO. line at(Nipples Peak ) around 1890-1895 or 98, I think E.M.W. and Eudora live'd in Colorado City, in 1906 but in 1907 E.M.W. was living with my Father (B.A. near Blackwell, Tex. this is only my understanding it may not be correct. Hoping this will be of some help to you.

Joseph D. Yarbrough (1860), Yarbro (1880) Born about 1835-1836 in Tennessee. Parents unknown. Married Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbrough. Date about 1857.

Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbrough (1860), Yarbro (1880) Parents unknown.

Born in Alabama, September 8th, 1839.

Died May 7th, 1878.

Buried in Fort Chadborn Cemetery, Coke County, Texas, located about 10 miles north east of Bronte, Texas on Highway 277, on the hill on the right side of road going east. There were 11-12 children born to this union - 3 or 4 died in infancy. The last infant was buried in same grave with mother, Thurza. She was 39 years old at the time of her death.

Joseph D. Yarbrough and Thurza Ann lived in Hillsboro, Hill County, Texas when most of the children were born in 1875. They moved to Runnels County when twins (boys) were very young. The oldest son, Charles Henry, being about twenty when his mother, Thurza died, and the twins about three years old.

Joseph D. Yarbro owned a hundred and sixty acres of land located near Fort Chadborn. Land deed records show he sold the land to J. M. Lindey in June of 1883 or some seem to think the oldest son, Charles Henry, sold the land and signed his father's name on the deed. Children of the family are:

- Son, Charles Henry. Born May 24, 1858. Hillsboro, Hill County, Texas.
- Daughter, Mary Etta Catherine. Born October 5th, 1859. Died March 24, 1961. Married William S. Williams in 1889 and later married Reuben Edwards. She had one son, Jack, by her first marriage.
- 3. Son, William Doc. Born September 20, 1860. Married February 22nd, 1886 to Miss Eliza Jane Caraway in Tom Green County, Texas. Died June 25, 1946 while visiting a daughter in San Bernadino, California and is buried in Mt. View Cemetery, San Bernadino, California.
- 4. Daughter, Cora J. Born March 17, 1866, Hillsboro, Hill County, Texas. Married a Mr. Dunn. Died April 1954.
- 5. Daughter, Emma Aslee. Born January 14, 1869. First married J.M. Lindley. Then married a Mr. McLain. Died October 2, 1949 and is buried in a cemetery near Roswell, New Mexico.

## FAMILY RECORD OF JOSEPH D. YARBROUGH (Yarbro)

Some are Tradition, and some are true records taken from census film between the year of 1860 to 1880. Tradition: two brothers, Joseph D. and Jerry Yarbrough went to Texas. The 1860 film of census denoted that Joseph Yarbrough was born in the State of Tennessee, about the year of 1835-36. County and town unknown. The 1860 census shows he was living in Hill County near Hillsboro, Texas. He was married to Thurza Ann (Weaver) tradition. She was half Cherokee Indian. I have no record of her parents, nor information about the Yarbrough brothers Joseph and Jerry. Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbrough was born in Alabama, September 8th, 1839.

The 1880 census film shows that between 1860-1880 Joseph D. Yarbrough, changed the spelling of the family name to Yarbro. Joseph and Thurza Yarbro had eight children living to be adult age and lost four as infants. Most of these children were born six miles west of Hillsboro, Hill County, Texas in a log cabin.

The first was a son, Charles Henry, born the 24th of May 1858. No record of the date of the marriage of Joseph and Thurza - probably sometime in 1857. Mary Ellen a daughter was born the 5th of October 1859. William Doc a son was born September 20th, 1860. Cora Jane, a daughter, was born, according to 1880 census film, the 17th of March 1866. Tradition says she was born later - that the next daughter Emma Azlee was older than Cora Jane - that the census taker just had them missed placed on the census. The census film shows Emma Azlee to be born on January 14th, 1869.

A son, James Luther was born on the 11th of October 1870. Another son, John Dennis was born on the 7th of July 1873. Next were the twin boys, Willie and Thomas, born on the 4th of November 1875.

B-4 NOVEMBER 1875, HILLED, TEXAS.

The twins could have been born in Ranks County, Texas near Fort Chadbourn, as a land deed shows that there was a land grant by the State of Texas - 160 acres of land to J. D. Yarbro described on Waters of Oak Creek, filed for record the 13th day of December A.D. 1888. Joseph made his affidavit for the land, June 11th, 1883. This land was later sold to J. M. Lindley for the amount of \$4.50. J.M. LIndley is thought to be the son-in-law of Joseph D. Yarbro.

Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbro, wife of Joseph D. Yarbro died on this land during child birth - both the mother and child died May 7th, 1878. Both are buried in the same grave in the Fort Chadbourne cemetery. There is a rock cribt around the grave abour four feet high and a large stone extends above for the head stone and is inscribed "IN MEMORY OF T. A. YARBRO, BORN SEPTEMBER 8th, 1839. DIED MAY 1878."

After the death of Thurza Ann, Joseph never married again and the older children helped raise the younger children. They would stay with first one and then another, and mostly raised themselves.

Tradition, none of them ever went to school as their father, Joseph, died just a few years after the death of Thurza. There is no record of the date of his death or where he is buried. As of this date, December 15th, 1969, some say he went to Oklahoma looking for work, took sick and died and was buried in a potters grave. Others say he is buried in Denton, or Dennison, Texas. One of his great grand-daughters (Fay Yarbro McLain) says he is buried in Oklahoma, another grand-daughter says he was buried some place in New Mexiso. But, there is no proof of where he is buried or when he died.

A grand-daughter said when he went to Oklahoma to work and took sick and died, none of his children had the money to send for his body and that is why he is supposed to be buried in a potters grave some place in Oklahoma. No one knows for sure.

#### YARBRO, CHARLES HENRY

Charles Henry Yarbro, first son of Joseph D. Yarbro and Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbro. Charles Henry Yarbro, born May 24, 1858 never was legally married as far as anyone knew. He worked on ranches for first one rancher and another, mostly in west Texas. When he was past 30 years of age, he left Texas and went to Arizona, not far from Bisbee, Arizona. He worked for a rancher by the name of Lindley. Tradition is that Mr. Lindley was sterile and he and his wife wanted children and they made an agreement that Charley become the father to their children, but the children were to carry the Lindley name. There were two sons born - Alfred and George - when Mr. Lindley took sick and died. Charles Henry Yarbro stayed on and ran the ranch. There were three more children born - two girls and a boy. The girls were named Mattie and Mollie and a Dick or Richard was the name of the youngest boy. The children all grew up thinking their father was Mr. Lindley.

Charley stayed on and helped to raise the children and did the work on the ranch until he died. 2 SEPT. 1932, DUBLAS PRIZONA

About every 5 to 10 years, Charley would take a trip to see some of his brothers and sisters. Some lived in New Mexico and some still lived in Texas, but never did he take the widow or any of the children. He told his folks he was married but there is no such record of a marriage. Charles Henry was a very pleasant fellow, very jolly. Seemed everyone that ever knew him, loved him.

When he was a young man, soon after the death of his father, tradition says he sold some land that his father owned in Hill County and signed his fathers name in order to sell the land, but he never told the other children about selling the land at the time he sold it. Somehow the children found out about it. They wanted their part of the money for the sale of the land. Charles had already spent the money. Some of the children were quite mad about it and had said they were going to the law about it and send Charles to prison for forging his father's name and selling the land, and not giving the other children their part for the land, but nothing was ever done about it. I suppose they all loved Charles too much.

Charles Henry Yarbro was a tall thin man. Had gray hair when quite young.

Mary Ellen Yarbro, the oldest daughter of Joseph and Thurza Yarbro. Married William S. Williams in Coleman, Coleman County, Texas on the 9th of April 1877. Tradition says he was a trapper and buffalo hunter. Their first son was born about the year of 1878. He was named Will, the only name ever known. A second son was born September 11th, 1883. His name was Jack Henry Williams. About the time Jack was born, Mary Ellen and William S. Williams separated. Mr. Williams took the oldest boy Will and left. They were living in Colorado City, Texas at the time Jack was born. After Mr. Williams took the older boy, Will, and left no one ever heard from either of them since that day.

Was in April on the 22nd day 1891, Mary Ellen (Yarbro) Williams married Mr. Reuben Edwards in Abeline, Texas. Her name was given on the application for the marriage license as Miss Ellen Smith when she married Mr. Williams and no one knows why, and no one knows of her being married to any Mr. Smith. No record can be found of any divorce from Mr. Williams before Mary Ellen married Mr. Edwards or no information of the death of Mr. Williams. Mary Ellen never told anyone, not even her family, as to why she and Mr. Williams separated and never talked about her past. But when she married Reuben Edwards, she gave her name as Ette Catherine. Not even her son Jack, and his wife Ethel, ever knew her real name was Mary Ellen. Soon after Mr. Edwards and Mary Ellen were married they moved 16 miles north of Dalhart, Texas and owned a ranch at that location. After Mr. Edwards died Mary Ellen moved in to Dalhart, Texas, close to her son Jack Henry Williams. She lived to the age of 102 years and passed away on March 24th, 1961. She is buried in the Dalhart Celemetery and on the head stone is the name Edwards. Catherine)

Her son, Jack, lived about 65 years in Dalhart. He went to Dalhart, Texas in 1902. He served as secretary for the Lions Club for 27 years. In 1902 Jack helped his stepfather drive their cattle from the Crowell area, past Dalhart - founded the year before - to their ranch 16 miles north of Dalhart, in what was then the Andy James area and since has been re-named the Hillcrest Community. He and Miss Ethel Denman were married in 1909. Ethel Denman was living in Guymon, Oklahoma at the time they were married.

Jack Williams mother, Ettie Edwards, as she was known in that area, was the first person to live to one hundred years of age in Dalhart or Dallam County, and one of the few persons in the entire High plains to reach the century mark. She became 100 in October 1959 and died in 1961, just a few months before she reached 102.

Jack's survivors include his wife Ethel, two daughters, Mrs. Harold (Lois) Grupe of Portland, Oregan and Mrs. Gary (Nell) Barnhill of Carendon. One son, Thomas Jack of Ft. Myers, Florida. Six grand-children and seven great grandchildren. Jack Henry Williams died at the age of 83 in Dalhart, Texas and is buried in Memorial Park Cemetery at Dalhart, Texas. The date of his death is January 15, 1967. Cokketter, NO ONE KNOWS WHO SHOKTEND THE VARBE - NAME. It will always remain a mystery as to why Mary Ellen (Yarbro) Williams, Edwards preferred to use other names, rather than her real name. As well as the mystery of why her father, Joseph D. Yarbrough changed the spelling of the family name to Yarbro.

#### YARBRO, WILLIAM DOC, III

William Doc Yarbro III, son of Joseph D. and Thurza Yarbro was born September 20, 1860 in Hill County, Texas, six miles west of Hillsboro. Like his brother Charles Henry, worked on cow ranches for ranchers. He was working on a ranch near or in Coke County, Texas when he and Eliza Jane Caraway from Hayrick Community were married (February 22, 1886) in Tom Green County, San Angelo, Texas.

William Doc and his wife Eliza Jane (Caraway) Yarbro established their first home on 80 acres of land in Coke County, Texas, near Robert Lee. They lived in a half dug-out for a time of about three years. Things went bad for them . . . they lost their land, so once again William Doc had to go to work doing ranch work for first one rancher, then another, but it seems as though William Doc was always looking for something better so never stayed in one place very long at a time. They moved all over west Texas for years, then to New Mexico and back to Texas. They raised quite a family. Had nine children; eight lived to adult age. One son, 11 years old, died in Tell, Childress County, and is buried in a small cemetery at Tell. Eliza Jane had six miscarriages. This couple never had anything much in the way of a home or money.

After all the children were grown and married, they moved to Post, Texas and lived there until June of 1946. Then they went to California to live near their daughters. They arrived in California on June 24th, 1946. William Doc died June 26th, 1946. He had some heart trouble. He is buried in the Mt. View Cemetery at San Bernadino, California. Eliza lived on with her daughter in California until she passed away June 5th, 1948. She is buried beside her husband in the Mt. View Cemetery, near San Bernadino, California. (The daughter's name was Nannie Ophelia (Yarbro) Brazeal. Eliza Jane had been in bed for a long time with a broken hip and just never recovered enough to be up and around.)

The fourth child, a son named Jeff Davis Yarbro, born March 9th, 1890 in Coke County, Texas at a location called Panther Gap (no longer on the map.) Jeff Davis Yarbro is my father.

## YARBRO, CORA JANE

Cora Jane, the second daughter, was born 17th March 1866 in Hill County, Texas. She moved with her parents to Runnels County, Texas when she was quite young. She was ten or twelve years old when her mother, Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbro died. After Cora Jane grew up she married a Mr. John Dunn.

She and John Dunn had three children - two sons and one daughter. Cora Jane (Yarbro) Dunn died April 26, 1954 in San Angelo, Texas, Tom Green County.

# YARBRO, EMMA AZLEE (Lee)

Emma Azlee (Lee), daughter. Born January 14, 1869 in Hill County, Texas. Her marriage was to J. M. Lindly, date and place unknown. She had one son by this marriage. He was named Joe, or Joseph. Lindly separated at an unknown date. Her marriage was to her first cousin, Don Modril or Modrial. Her third marriage was to George Washington McLain, date unknown. The date and place of his death are unknown; possibly in New Mexico.

Three children were born to Emma Azlee Yarbro. Her first born son, Joe, passed away in 1969.

Her first daughter, Ivey, by her second marriage, married Arthur Rowland. Next a son, Hector Bert, who married his first cousin Fay Aveline Yarbro on April 26, 1929. Fay's father, Tom Yarbro, was Bert's mothers brother (Emma Azlee). Have no dates of birth for these children.

Emma Azlee must have taken after her mother, Thurza Ann (Weaver) Yarbro, being half Cherokee Indian, as I can remember Aunt Lee very well. She used to visit my parents when I was a small child. She would spend the whole day and never had a word to say and no comments one way or the other. When she would get ready to go home, she would say what a nice visit she had, and leave.

She lived to be 80 years old. Died October 2nd, 1949 in Roswell, New Mexido and is buried in the Rowell, New Mexico cemetery in Chaves County. Mr. George Washington McLain died many years ago, before Aunt Emma Azlee.

#### YARBRO, JAMES LUTHER

James Luther was born October 11, 1870 in Hill County, Texas. Moved with his parents when he was a small boy to Runnels County, Texas near Ft. Chadburn. He married Sally Hinkaid, date and place unknown. They never had any children. They lived in Presidio County; he is buried in Marathon, Brewster County, Texas.

James Luther had quite an imagination in telling stories to children. He was a kind and good man and all those who knew him loved him.

He told his nephew, Hubert Yarbro, Uncle John's boy, that when he was a small boy that the Indians stole him and kept him for about three years. But, one day he had a chance to take one of the Indian's fast horses, and he got away from the Indians and returned to his family. This story was never heard of before, till Hubert told me in July 1969. I am quite sure it was just a story Uncle Luke made up just to entertain a little boy, but he never did tell the boy that was just a story, and Hubert grew up believing all that Uncle Luke had told him.

Uncle Luther's wife was last known to be living in Ft. Stockton, Texas.

# YARBRO, JOHN D.

John Dennis, son, was born July 7th, 1873 in Hill County, Texas, six miles south of Hillsboro. Married December 23rd, 1906 to Miss Marie Martin (Roxie). They had one son, Hubert Bryan Yarbro, born December 22, 1907. His mother, Aunt Roxie, was the only girl born out of triplets.

Uncle John passed away August 6th, 1958. He was living in Marathon, Brewster County, Texas, where he had made his home for many years, and was known to everyone as Uncle John. He is buried in the cemetery in Marathon, Brewster County, Texas. His wife, Marie, is known to everyone as Aunt Roxie.

Soon after they were married John took his bride to Brewster County, Texas and filed a claim on land for a homestead near Marathon, Texas. They lived out the homestead and then John sold the homestead, and took out a second claim for a homestead of one hundred and sixty acres of land. Living out the second homestead again, John sold the homestead and moved into Marathon and lived in town till he died. John did ranch work most of his life, and his son grew up on a ranch, and lives on a ranch now. He works for ranchers in the south part of Texas. His father John did not leave his son Hubert any finances of any kind nor for his wife, Aunt Marie (Roxie).

Back in the early 1900's in South Texas, to get a deed to the land of a homestead was to file for the hundred and sixty acres, live on the land, and make the required improvements. The time limit was only two years.

Uncle John's son Hubert did not get married till he was forty years old. He and his wife, Frieda, have one daughter, Ina Jo. They were living near Sabnile, Texas on the Ray Woods Ranch doing the work on the ranch for Mr. Woods in the year of 1969. I was there to visit them July 10th, 1969.

### YARBRO, WILL

Uncle Will is the twin brother to Tom.

Will (Will) Yarbro was born November 4th, 1875, a twin son of Joseph D. and Thurza Ann Yarbro. Born in Hill County, or possibly Runnels County, Texas, as there is no date given as to just when the family moved from Hill County, Texas to Runnels County, Texas. There Willis married Doris Dunbar.

Willie and Doris had four children - three boys and one girl. In about 1912 Doris left Uncle Will and the four children and no one seems to know why, or whatever happened to Doris. The youngest child, a boy, was about ten months old at the time she left. The other children were too young to take care of the baby so Uncle Will took the baby, Robert Lee (Jack) to his brother John and his wife, Aunt Roxie, to raise for him. They raised him as one of their own along with their own son, Hubert.

The daughter named Willie after her father, lived to be about 14 years old. She went on a school picnic one day near Alpine, Texas and fell from a mountain and was killed.

Tom the oldest son married Patricia (Pat) Adams and they live in Marathon, Brewster County, Texas. Tom has lived near Marathon most of his life and is the Postmaster of Marathon, Brewster County, Texas as of this date, 1969.

Robert Lee (Jack) married, is now living in San Antonio, Texas.

Buster, the brother of these children. No information on these children.

Uncle Will is now 94 years old and lives with his son Tom in Marathon, Texas.

They had four children. First a daughter, Fay Avanell, born January 1st, 1909 in Alpine, Texas. Second a son, Carl Joe, born August 28th, 1911 in Marathon, Brewster County, Texas on the M. Ranch. Third Bessie Lou, a daughter born February 15th, 1915 in Alpine, Texas. Fourth a daughter, Dorothy May, born August 11th 1918 in Health, Arkansas.

Thomas (Tom) died May 1st, 1958 in El Paso, Texas and is buried in a cemetery near El Paso, Texas.

His son, Carl Joe, died December 24th, 1956 in Tombstone, Arizona, or it could be he was married on December 24th, 1956 in Tombstone, Arizona. The spelling of the family name was changed some time between the time of 1860-1880. (TRADITION) The following information was given by the grandson's of Joseph D. Yarbro. Hubert Byron Yarbro, son of John Dennis Yarbro, and Tom Yarbro, son of Will Yarbro. Hubert B. Yarbro living 17 miles south of Sabinal, Texas on the  $\mathcal{R}$ -Bay Weeds Ranch - July 9th, 1969.

Tom Yarbro living at this same date in Marathon, Brewster County, Texas is the postmaster there. He was in business at a service station and garage there for twenty five years before becoming the Postmaster. Tom is the oldest child of Will Yarbro. were three other children. A daughter, Willie. A son, Buster and the youngest son, Robert Lee (Jack) was born in Robert Lee, Texas in Coke County and was named for the town where he was born. When Jack was ten months old, and Tom being the oldest at the age of eight years old, Uncle Will's wife, name unknown, left Uncle Will and the four young children. No one seemed to know what happened to her. Uncle Will took Robert Lee (Jack) being just ten months old, to his brother John and his wife Aunt Marie (Roxie) for them to raise. Aunt Roxie wanted Uncle Will to sign papers for them to adopt the baby, as John and Marie only had one child, a son Hubert B. Uncle Will would not sign any papers for his son to be adopted, but drove away and left the baby for his brother and his wife to raise, and they did so.

The girl, Willie, when 14, went on a school picnic near Alpine, Texas ... fell from a mountain and was killed. She is buried in a cemetery near Alpine, Texas. I have no information about the son, Buster, at this date. Robert Lee Yarbro is married and living at this date in San Antonio, Texas.

Hubert Byron Yarbro, son of John and Marie (Roxie) Yarbro, was born December 22nd, 1907 in Brewster County, Texas. His father, John, filed and lived out three different homesteads in Brewster County, Texas and sold all three of them before he died. He was a good man and was well liked by all who knew him. He was known as Uncle John to everyone in the area in which he lived.

To get a homestead in parts of Texas back in those days, all a man had to do was to find land unclaimed ... file a claim, live on the land for two years with certain improvements, and at the end of the two years a man was able to get a clear deed and title to the one hundred and sixty acres of land.

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
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

# The Jeff Davis Yarbro Family

By: Francis O. (Yarbro) Murphy, daughter. 1969.

Yarbro, Jeff Davis, born the 9th of March 1890 in Panther Gap, Coke County, Texas. This place being near Robert Lee, Texas. Married the 17th of November 1909 at Lamesa, Dawson County, Texas to Miss Ida Glover (Caraway) Yarbro. They were first cousins - their mothers were sisters. His mother was Eliza Jane (Caraway) Yarbro, and Ada Examers (Caraway) who married her first cousin, Robert Allen Caraway, and their fathers were brothers.

After Jeff and Ida were married they lived the first three weeks in Lamesa, Texas with Jeff's parents. Then they all moved to Paducha, Cottle County, Texas.

Mother and Daddy drove a milk cow all the way from Lamesa, Texas to Paducha, Texas to paducha, Texas to grandparents and the small children drove the wagon and team. The milk cow belonged to my grandparents, William Dock Yarbro and Eliza Jane Yarbro.

After they arrived in Paducha, Texas, my parents started farming on the sheers for a Mr. Wesley. Just before the crop was ready to harvest, my father sold his part of the crop to someone, and moved to or near Crosbyton, Crosby County, Texas. They went to mother's parents who were living in Old Emma, in Crosby County, where on the 16th of August 1910, their first child, a son, Hawley Bettis was born. Soon after this my parents moved near Crosbyton, Texas. My father went to work as a ranch hand for a cattle rancher. In about sixteen months, a second child was expected. My mother returned to Old Emma, Crosby County, where on the 11th of October 1911, a daughter, Francis Ophelia, was born in an old ranch house. Most of the town by that date had moved to Crosbyton. The baby was born before the doctor arrived, as the Doctor had to drive horse and buggy from Crosbyton, where my father was working.

After a short time, in 1912, my parents moved to Tell, Childress County, Texas. It was on November 17th that my sister, Tennie Syble was born. My father was working as a cook in a restaurant at this time, and for a while after. It was some time in 1913 that he went to work as a ranch hand. They moved into an old ranch house sixteen miles north and a little east of the town of Childress, Childress County, where the fourth child was born, a son Dennis Conneor on the 22nd of February 1914. In 1915 we moved to Gloge, New Mexico where my father worked in the plaster mill for a few months, but then went back to working as a cowboy again. Mother and we children were living in Lake Wood, New Mexico. We lived there quite some time. My father would come in to town to spend a day or two with his family once every two or three months. My father was then working for George Williams.

On the 25th of August 1916 in Lake Wood, New Mexico, my sister Viola was born. All this I well remember.

We went to church one night with one of my father's sisters, Aunt Nannie. I remember my mother was expecting and wore a pink fase komona trimmed with lace and ribbon. I was a little girl about five years old. I sure thought my mother looked so pretty.

We lived on the east side of town in a small two room house. We had to walk to church, and any place we went. My sister was about three months old when we moved out on the ranch. It was called the "little ranch." It was all of that ... one room, and a back shed. Mr. George Williams was the owner. In the early spring of 1917 I was trying to be helpful to my mother. While she was down at the cow lott milking the cows, I was going to get the breakfast dishes washed. On cow ranches the cow lotts are always quite a ways from the houses.

My father had a coffee can sitting behind the stove with chips and gasoline in it for starting a quick fire in the mornings. Being too young to know, I thought there had to be a blaze to heat the dish water. I had put the dish pan on the stove with water and dishes in it. I picked up the can, turned it toward the hot coals in the stove and the can caught fire. Burned my hand some, blew the stove pipes and stove caps all over the room, including all the dishes went flying everywhere. The house caught fire and by the time my mother got to the house she could not get in to save one thing.

I did get my little sister out before she was burned, and got my brother Dennis and sister Tennie out of the house. My brother Hawley had gone to the cow lott for my mother, so we were lucky no one was burned, escept for one of my hands. My father and Mr. Williams had gone out very early in the morning to feed some cattle in a pasture about three miles from the ranch house. They saw the smoke from the burning house and came as fast as the wagon and team could be driven. Of course, they arrived too late to do anything about saving a thing.

Mr. Williams had come out to the ranch in his car from Carlsbad, New Mexico to help with the cattle as it was the spring of the year when there were new cal es. Somehow they were separating some of the cattle from one pasture to another, and Mr. Williams having his car there, was the reason why there was gasoline around a cattle ranch. He had a fifty gallon drum sitting at one end of the house. Thank goodness it was almost empty at the time of the fire.

After the fire was all out and everything we had owned was gone, about the only thing we could do was go to my grandparents house, which was about twelve miles south of where we had lived. The ranch my grandparents were living at was called Dagger Draw. We started out in Mr. Williams car. It broke down just a short

distance from where our house had burned. My father had taken the wagon and team back to finish taking care of the cattle so we had to walk through pastures of wild white faced cattle and rattle snakes. My sister kept crying saying her legs hurt and wanted mother to carry her. The next day she was broken out with red measles, so we had to stay with my grandparents for a few weeks till all five of us had the measles. After that was over, we moved to a ranch called the Gushaway Place, about five miles north of where we had lived at the little ranch that had burned. This Gushaway place, someone had homesteaded and put some improvements on the land. Some of the land was fenced. My father took out a homestead claim for the place. We lived there for quite awhile, and my father worked for Mr. Williams and bought some cattle for his own ranch at the same time.

In February 1918 mother and we children moved back into Lake Wood, New Mexico, as my mother was expecting another baby. On the 20th of March 1918 my brother Carl Preston was born. When Carl was just a baby, my father sold what cattle he had accumulated, gave up the homestead and took his family and what belongings that could be hauled in a covered wagon from Eddy County, New Mexico to Slaton, Lubbock County, Texas. Here he went to work for the Santa Fe Railroad in the round house. I remember he worked shift work, and mostly the night shift, and had to sleep in the daytime with six children around the house and I remember we had to play very quietly and away from the house.

In the summer of 1919 we moved to a farm. Mr. Ed Richerson was the owner. We lived in a big round army tent and did farm work for Mr. Richerson. In the fall of that year we all went to the cotton fields and picked cotton. I was very small, but, how well I remember that fall and winter. It was while we were living in this big round tent, December 17th, 1919 that my sister Winnie Mable was born.

After all the cotton was picked, we moved back to Slaton, Texas again ... just for a short time. Early in the year of 1920 we moved about ten miles north of Tahoka, Lynn County, Texas on the Lynn West farm. My father worked for Mr. West for a dollar a day as a farm laborer. We had a nice two story house to live in. This is where we were living when my brother Ebert A. was born on the 4th of February 1921. He is buried in the Tahoka Cemetery, Lynn County, Texas. In 1922 we moved to another farm called the Beaver Place. We worked for Mr. Beaver as farm laborer's till the spring of 1923 when we moved to Lubbock County, Texas shear farming for Mr. T. L. Morris. This is where brother Hubert Aldon was born. We lived in a two room, old house. This is where my sister Tennie lost the end of her middle finger when we children were drawing water from a well with a pullie and bucket. Hubert A. was born the 17th of April 1923.

The spring of 1924 we moved to another farm, not over two miles from the T. L. Morris farm. This was called the Dr's place. We farmed on the sheers here for two years and we did make some good cotton crops on this farm. We older children did most of the farm work, so my father did not have to get anyone to help him run the farm. While we were here on this place, my sister was born the 19th of October 1925. NOME EUNICE NOVA,

My father decided, that fall after all the crops were gathered, that he would go to Dawson County, Texas, where there was some new land being offered for sale for farming, and buy himself some farm land. We had some money saved up from owning our own livestock, chickens, etc., and owned enough farming equipment that we could afford to move to this new land and settle down on a place of our own. Father had two brothers who had moved to this new settlement. This land was located a few miles west of a little town called Patricia, Dawson County, Texas.

It seemed like from the time we moved to this new land, all we had was bad luck. We had enough money to live and to make the first We had crop failure due to cotton weivels. The next year father had to mortgage our farm equipment and livestock for money to make another crop the next year. No rain that year. managed to get a loan to try and make the third crop. The third year grasshoppers ate up everything ... so everything we had was lost, except three horses, one milk cow, a few bannie chickens, and an old broken down wagon my father had fixed up the best he We loaded up what belongings we had and moved back to New This was in 1927. By this time the depression was getting well underway and it was very hard to find enough work just to buy food for the family. We older children walked all the way from Patricia, Texas to Carlsbad, New Mexico. We had no shoes on our I will never forget how sore my feet were before we arrived just north of Carlsbad. I could hardly walk, and the others that walked had feet just as sore. It was a dirt road and some rocks.

I remember how we children would chase rabbits under culberts. One of us would stay at one end and the other would chase the rabbit on through the culbert. We caught the rabbits and that was our supper for the evening ... along with some water biscuits and gravy, and we were very grateful to have that much to eat.

We arrived just north of Carlsbad, moved into an old adobe that was vacant just across the Pecos River. We found a little cotton to chop through the rest of the summer. In the fall of the same year we moved south of Carlsbad, near a little town called Ottis, Eddy County, New Mexico. There we moved into a two room shack and picked cotton for a Mr. Baker.

My older brother, Hawley, had left home to make his own way of life before we moved back to New Mexico. He was quite young when he went out in the world to try to make his own life. He did not get to attend school very much.

It was this same year, 1927, that I, Frances Ophelia Yarbro, married Gentry, Jesse James. Then in the year of 1929 my sister, Tennie Syble, ran away from home. The family was living on Black River, still in New Mexico.

The second son, Dennis C. left home. All of we children had very little chance to attend school, as we were kept in the fields to work. My father was uneducated and did not see any use for us to have any education, except to read and write our names. So, as a

result, all the children left home one way or another as soon as possible. After the four older children were gone from home, my parents just moved around here and there ... all over the state of New Mexico and Texas, just trying to find work enough to keep themselves and the small children that were still at home, from starving to death. They moved around like this until about 1933-1934, when they settled on a farm three miles south of Loveing, Eddy County, New Mexico. By this time some of the other children had left home, and some had married. There were only three left at home ... the youngest Eunice Nova, who was born on the Dr's place in Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas was age 11 to 13. Eunice came and lived with me some, then she went to Sealy, Texas and lived with our sister Tennie till she quit school just before finishing, and married Alton Pope.

When Mother was age 43, our brother Willard A. was born. the 30th of April 1937 in Loveing, Eddy County, New Mexico. When Willard was just over a year old, they moved to Arizona and picked cotton that fall. Then they moved back to New Mexico and my father worked for a Mr. Gossett about ten miles south of Carlsbad, New Mexico. In the fall of 1941 mother, father, Willard (Billy) and brother Hubert settled on a farm in Garza County, Texas, 28 miles north of Post, Texas. They worked for Mr. Dooley and Mr. Penell for a while, then they moved to the Askines place in 1942 and engaged in farming cotton and peanuts till 1945. Then they moved to the old Brooks place. They farmed till 1950. Mother and Daddy were getting along in age and by now had lived a pretty hard life. They gave up farming and bought a lot in Post, Garza County, Texas at 314 South Avenue H., built a house and lived there till they passed away. Daddy passed away the 1st of September, a Monday at 10:PM in Memorial Hospital in Post, Texas. Mother passed away the 6th of December 1970 at 2:00 P.M., Sunday. They both are buried in the Terrance Cemetery, Post, Garza County, Texas. AT REST, In God We Trust.

Mother being of sound mind, the 25th of September 1969, told me about the very first events. Being the second child, I do remember so many things, and so many of these events with our family. This information I have written up is all true. There have not been any flowers added any place.

Now they sent out to find a minister to perform the marriage ceremony as it was my mothers request that they be married by a minister. It was about twelve noon time when they finally located one and he was on top of a new house helping to put the roof on, but he came down, performed the ceremony with the young couple sitting in the buggy. Both my parents tried to separate them, but they lived out their lifetime together. (My father died the first of September, 1969,

This information was given to me by my mother, Ida Glover (CARAWAY)
Yarbro. My brother was about sixteen months old and I was the way old. Our parents were living in Crosbyton, Texas.

My father, Jeff Davis YARBRO was working for a man just west of where the town of Old Emma had once stood. In December my father came home and decided he would take his young wife and two young children to spend Christmas with his parents in Childress, Texas.

Our transportation was a hack and a small team of mules. Of course the hack bowes and a cover, like they used on what was called a covered wagon. My parents loaded the hack with bedding, clothes and the camping equipment that they would need for their trip.

The first day we were a few miles east of Matador, Texas. It was about sundown at the location of Kroten brakes; the weather being cold and snow on the ground, my father decided it would be the best place to camp for the night. There was a wild plum thicket that would make a wind break. He unhitched the team, tied them to the wheels of the hack and went back near the plum thicket looking for wood to build a camp fire. There he saw what he thought was a big collie dog. He said "hello, fellow." This fellow happened to be a big lion ... he stood and shook himself ... showed his teeth ... and started toward my father. My father made time getting back into the hack and getting all the ropes drawn as tight as possible.

My father had no gun. All he had to fight the lion with was his pocket knife. Mother put my brother, Hawley, and I on the floor of the hack and placed some boxes, chairs and some quilts over us. After she had rolled us in quilts, she thought if the lion did get in and killed her and my father, perhaps my brother and I would be found by someone, if we had a chance to live.

The lion stayed most of the night and tried off and on to get in to get them. They had taken along a little family dog and every time the lion would put his paws into the hack, the little dog would bite the lion on the back legs. The lion would take after the dog ... the dog being small, he could get into places under the hack where the lion couldn't go. When he put his paws in the hack, my father would rip the paws of the lion. Sometime after midnight, mother said she thought it was about 4 A.M. the lion went a few feet from the hack and laid down in the snow for awhile, then before day break he got up and shook himself, let out a big roar, and left.

The team had broken away from the hack when the lion was noticed and almost turned the hack over trying to get away. My father spent most of the next day hunting the team of mules. It was dark when he returned to the hack with them, but they traveled all night anyway, trying to get out of range of the lion.

My parents learned later the cattle ranchers in several counties had out a reward to anyone who killed the lion, as the lion was killing the ranchers cattle and young calves. I feel we owe our thanks to God, and the little dog.

# IN MEMORY OF OUR DEAR BELOVED BROTHER HAWLEY BETTIS YARBRO

At the time, I felt Hawley Bettis, died unnecessarily. I am his sister, just sixteen months younger than he. We were very close.

Due to the part of his new bride of only 3 or 4 weeks, at the time he took sick ... she did nothing to try and get him into a hospital, or even to a doctor after he became too ill to drive himself to see his doctor. Our brother was a veteran of World War II, a disabled veteran. He had emphysema, but was a manager of a Shamrock Gas Station. He took a cold due to the cool damp weather and this went into pneumonia. His new lonely heart club bride thought he had a life in usrance policy so she let him lay and suffer and die. She did not even let any of his family knew just how ill he was. She did not notify us until she could not find any insurance policy for him.

He had died at 11:PM on October 28, 1980. She called me at 8:AM on the 29th to ask me what to do as she could not find any insurance policy. That was the first I knew about how he was. I was so hurt after finding out how long he had been so ill, and she did nothing to even let us know. I will always be hurt over the way she did him and the way she did his brothers and sisters by not letting us know how bad he was.

Our Dear Brother was a good man. Worked hard most of his life. He was neat and clean and kind of soft spoken. He was very tender hearted and easily hurt, but he never let a person know if they did anything to hurt him.

He was well liked by anyone who knew him. He loved children, but unfortunately never had any. He had been married twice before, but there were no issues by any of his marriages.

I loved my brother very much. I miss him so much, and his letters, as he was so good to write to me.

His residence at the time of his death was: 1806 Avenue O, Lubbock, Texas. The station he managed was at 601 Fourth Street, Lubbock, Texas 79401. He died unattended.

He is buried in Post, Texas in Terrace Cemetery, Garza County, Texas near our brother, Hubert A. Yarbro.

These children and the two at home by Bonnie's first marriage were left orphans. (Son, Charles age 16, and a daughter Cherlene (Barker) age  $13\frac{1}{2}$ ). Had the parents not left the children at home that morning, they would all have been killed by the tragic train and truck accident that happened six miles south of Blackfoot, Idaho at the Broncho Road crossing, a blind crossing.

Carl P. Yarbro never had a very happy life here on earth. I feel sure he is happy with his God in Heaven. Carl was a good boy, and a good man. He liked everyone he knew. I never heard him say an unkind word about anyone, or even a cross word to a child. He was a member of the Baptist Church while a young man.

When he was age 16, he had a bad accident while riding a horse in a farming area of Loving, New Mexico. There was a bad thunderstorm coming up and Carl was running the horse pretty fast to try to get home before the storm got there. His horse headed down the side of a barbed wire fence, and Carl's right leg was so badly damaged it had to be amputated above the knee. He had to go through three operations before he could be fitted with an artificial limb. He was small for his age and the doctors advised his parents to wait until Carl grew to his normal size before getting him an artificial limb. That was back in the 1930's when times were very hard. His parents had spent all the money they had or could borrow for all the surgeries he had to have, so Carl was out of school for a long time. When he was able to go back to school, after losing his leg, he just used a piece of a 2x4 for a leg and made a belt to put it on around his waist.

When he returned to school with the makeshift leg, the children made fun and called him names. They did not realize they were being cruel. Carl tried to make the best of it, but after so long his nerves gave away and he would not return to school. After losing his leg and the children making fun of him, he just gave up and would not finish his education.

He went through life just having to do odds and ends for jobs, trying anything he could to make himself a living. He lived a good life and was doing very well. As anyone would realize, he did not have a girlfriend. After he was grown he was fitted with an artificial leg and had a foot where he could wear a pair of shoes like any normal person. He wanted a home life, just like any man would that loved children, and he married the first woman who would look at him, not ever going with anyone. He thought all women were good and decent.

After Carl was married, he did mostly farm work, which was very hard work for him. His wife Mildred would not help Carl. He loved her and her children and he would never complain regardless of how tired he may be. He did everything he knew to make her happy. After the children grew up, big enough to help with some work, their mother, Mildred, would not let them help Carl in any way. She would say, she never had to work and her children were not going to work. Our family did help as much as we could, especially the first few years they were married. We soon saw she would not even try to help herself. Always wanted to be on the go and on the move. They hardly stayed in one place long enough for his family to correspond with them. Half of the time we did not know where they were or how they were. Even though she made a bum out of our brother Carl, we still never mistreated her.

Of course, it sure did hurt all of us to know what a hard life our brother Carl was living. Mildred even made bums and tramps out of all their children.

When Carl and his second wife Bonnie were killed we could not locate two of the boys to attend the funerals of Carl and his wife Bonnie.

Carl P. Yarbro's youngest son, Carl Edward Yarbro, married Bonnie's oldest daughter, Debbie. We could not locate the children to notify them of their parents death as they had left with a son that was being hunted by the F.B.I. for being A.W.O.L. from the Army, and no one knew of their whereabouts.

Thank God, our brother will not have to suffer anymore, or be mistreated by anyone. I loved my brother, Carl. I helped to raise him as he was a few years younger than myself. That is why I can tell his life, or part of it. Being the oldest girl, I helped my mother with the younger children.

Carl's last wife was of no help to him either. Of course, I hated to give my brother up. I loved him very much. I feel very sad, but at the same time, I think of the awful hardships he had gone through in trying to have a home like all normal men want; and how he must have suffered trying to have that kind of a life.

I hope and pray to God his little children will have a better chance in their life than their father Carl had.

This is not a very good thing to write about a brother I loved very much and has passed on, but I believe in telling the truth, and some day there may be some of his descendants wonder about the situation, as there are half brothers and sisters, step brothers and sisters, and one step brother, Call Edward Yarbro.

The fin-like shape near the rear of the truck is the top of the tank, blown into that shape by the explosion. The hatch cover that went over the round hole in the cover was blown soveral hundred feet. Yarbro was working on the other side of the tank, standing between the heater just at the rear of the cab and the tank.

An autopsy was ordered by the attending physician to determine the exact cause of death, but the results of the autopsy had not been reported late yesterday, The Dispatch was informed.

> Warren and others heard the blast from the VFW building across the highway and ran outside to see what had happened. A woman employe of the VFW said she heard what sounded liked a 'sonic boom' and then, after rushing to the front of the VFW building saw "dust gushing out of the building all along the east side of Rocker 'A'.

Bugby arrived at the well service immediately after the explosion and a crowd of onlookers had already gathered, he said. Residents for several blocks in all directions reported hearing the blast from inside their homes.

There was no evidence of a fire following the explosion.

The large steel building received structural damage, mainly inside the 50 by 60-foot garage where the roof was blown off and the walls bulged out by the force of the explosion.

Roof tiles were hanging from the ceiling of the office of J. C. (Joyce) Steel, manager, just north of the garage, and debris was scattered over the floor in the main office and the office of W. Earl Chapman Jr., superintendent of the firm.

Chapman told The Dispatch Tuesday that the explosion damaged the truck to the extent of about \$2,000, but that it would be "a while yet" before an estimate could be made on damage to the building.

Chapman said the dampe was not extensive enough to halt operations at the firm, but that repairs are being made.

The hatch cover of the truck's tank door was blown several hundred feet away, into the yard of the Hill & Hill oil service firm, Chapman said.

The firm's superintendent said Yarbro had been houling water and soap in the truck's tank for two days before the biast, but that a small pocket of gas evidently had accumulated "somewhere."

Yarbro, a unit operator, had been employed by Rocker "A" for about three years.

His funeral services were held at 10 a.m. Wednesday in the Calvary Baptist Church, of which he was a member.

Officiating were the Rev. Graydon Howell of Flatonia, assisted by the Rev. Leon Smith, paster of the Calvary Baptist Church.

Burial was in Terrace Cemetery under the direction of Hudman Funeral Home. Pallbearers were Billy McKamie, Sam Bevers, James Dooley, Charles Huffman, Roy Brannon and Bill Criswell.
