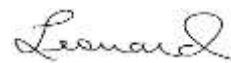
To paraphrase Robert Kincaid¹, “The dreams they had were good ones. They didn’t all come true, but they were worth having, all the same.”

Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland “Cy” Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrate from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard – John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The “Old Country” referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from “the old country”; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is “Yarbrough”.

General Sessions/ Choose McDowell, 3 incumbents

The Commercial Appeal judges have selected three incumbent judges and one new judge to serve on the General Sessions bench for the next year.

The judges are: **McDowell**, who has been a judge since 1974; **Montesi**, who has been a judge since 1974; **Johnson**, who has been a judge since 1974; and **Bugh**, who has been a judge since 1974.

Louis J. Montesi Jr., 42, became a police legal adviser soon after receiving his law degree in 1976, was made a City Court prosecutor the next year and has been an assistant district attorney general for the last eight years.

The Commercial Appeal recommends McDowell for the new General Sessions bench for a number of reasons, including his broader experience and his proven judicial ability.

Three of the other six General Sessions criminal divisions have contested races, and The Commercial Appeal recommends incumbents in each case: Ann Pugh in Division 7, Anthony Johnson in Division 10 and Charles B. Gallagher III in Division 11. Challengers are Joyce Broffitt and Larry A. Diamond in Division 7; Joe Patterson in Division 10 and Patricia Nozich and Tarik B. Sugarmon in Division 11.

General Sessions criminal courts, operated by the county, conduct nonjury trials on misdemeanor charges, and preliminary hearings on more serious charges to determine if the accused should be held for grand jury consideration. It is not unusual for several hundred cases to come before one of these courts in a single day.

McDowell is aware of the problems that can come from such a pressure atmosphere. "If a judge is not careful he easily can trample on people's rights by treating the court like some kind of mill to grind out cases," he said.

A law graduate from the University of Tennessee, McDowell has had postgraduate study in criminal law at Northwestern University. He was appointed to a vacancy in General Sessions Division 3 in 1986, but lost a close race that year to Judge John A. Donald.

Judge Ann Pugh, 44, has done a creditable job on the General Ses-

misdemeanor responsibility was shifted to General Sessions. Before taking the city bench she was an assistant public defender and a city prosecutor.

Division 10

Judge C. Anthony Johnson, 42, also was a City Court judge elected to General Sessions after the jurisdictional switch in 1982. A 1972 law graduate of the University of Tennessee, he had practiced law six years before appointment to a City Court vacancy. While a practicing attorney he worked for the city legal department and as a public defender. He currently serves as administrative judge of the General Sessions criminal division.

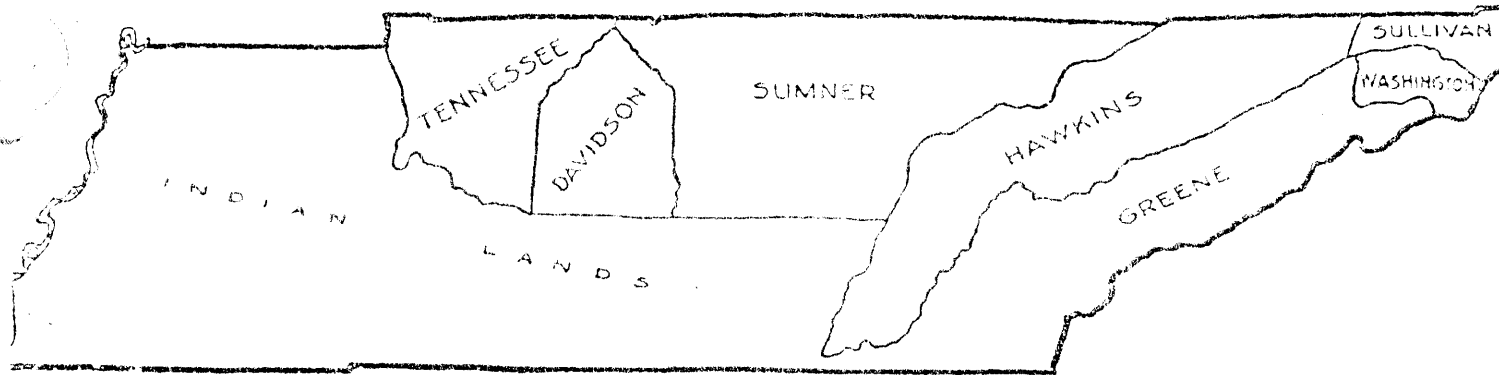
Charles Gallagher, 44, is another who made the move from City Court to General Sessions. He served as administrative city judge, and earlier had been a city prosecutor. Gallagher received his law degree from Memphis State University.

ALL THREE of these incumbents have worked hard to handle a caseload that has grown tremendously during the last couple of years, in part because of a heavy influx of drug-related cases. Judges Pugh, Johnson and Gallagher are noted for attentive diligence on the bench and deserve new eight-year terms.

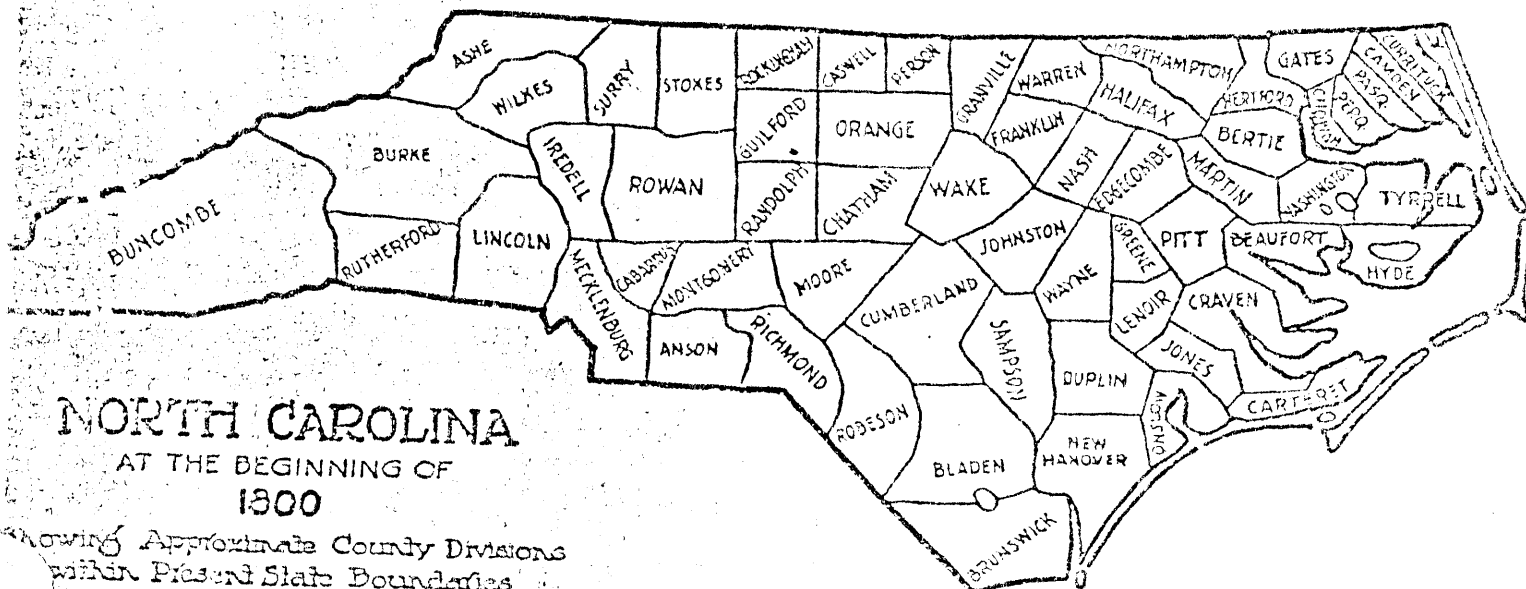


TENNESSEE

CHAPTER II

YARBOROUGH-YARBROUGH IMMIGRANTS

and

RECORDS OF THEIR FAMILIES
BEFORE 1800

First Yarborough Immigrants to America

In all I have seen of research done on the family of YARBOROUGH in the United States, there seems to be a unanimous decision that anyone who can trace their ancestors as having been here before the Revolutionary War were all descendants of Richard Yarborough I. Although it is evident that they were of the same line of origin, it is also evident that there were other Yarborough immigrants in the early settlement of this country.

RICHARD YARBOROUGH I & II, 1615-1652

Records of English passage lists shows Richard Yarborough booked passage to Virginia in 1635. If the records are accurate (Wm. and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 5, p. 233), he died at age 87 in 1702. This means he was born in 1615 and was 20 years old when he first came to Virginia. We know that Richard Yarborough I. had a son, Richard II, who was also born in England, (from Court case in 1690). This Richard stated that in 1690 he was 38 years old and was born in England (1652). It is obvious that Richard I made the voyage between England and Virginia more than the one time in 1635. While we do not have the record of the exact place Richard I landed on this continent, it is possible he landed in the vicinity of Yorktown. Some of the earliest records show him present in Counties of Northhampton, King and Queen and King William. It is obvious that his course of migration was up the York River. It has been established that Richard I was of the branch from Yarborough in Lincoln, England, referred to as the "Lincolnshire" branch. About 1600, several members of the "Lincolnshire Yarboroughs" settled in other Counties: William Yarborough settled in Yorkshire, Charles in Nottinghamshire, and Francis in Northamptonshire. One Edmund Yarbrough made his home at Balne Hall, in Yorkshire, and married Sarah, daughter of Thomas Wormeley, of that county.

Robert Abrall, who is desired by this Court to dispose of him to his Mother (nee Wormely) or other ways which are fitting. Next Court to be 24 August, 1658."

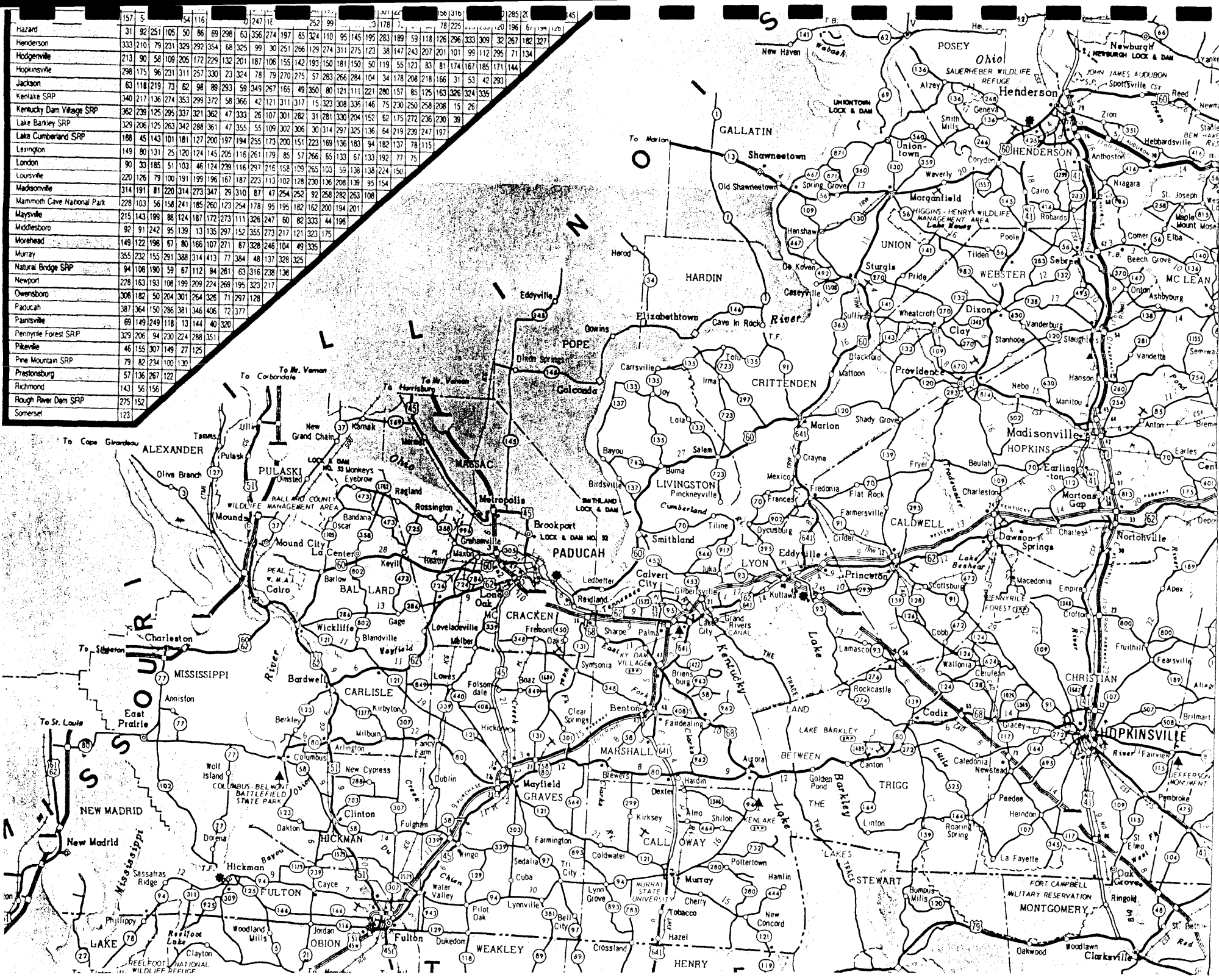

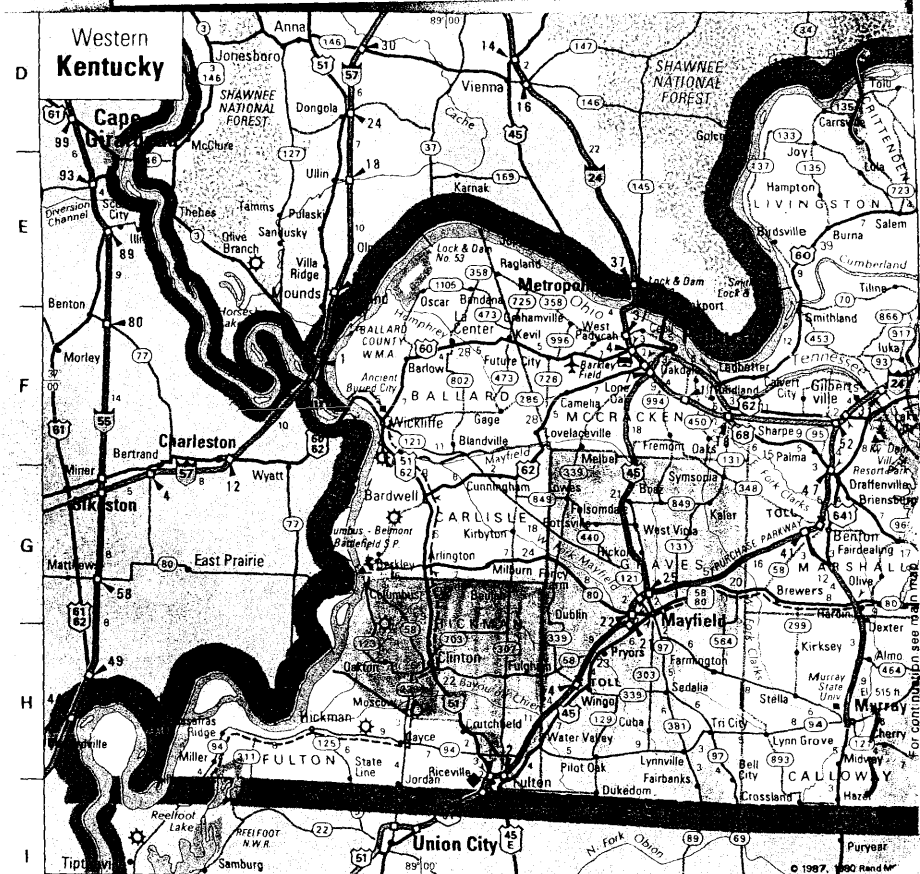
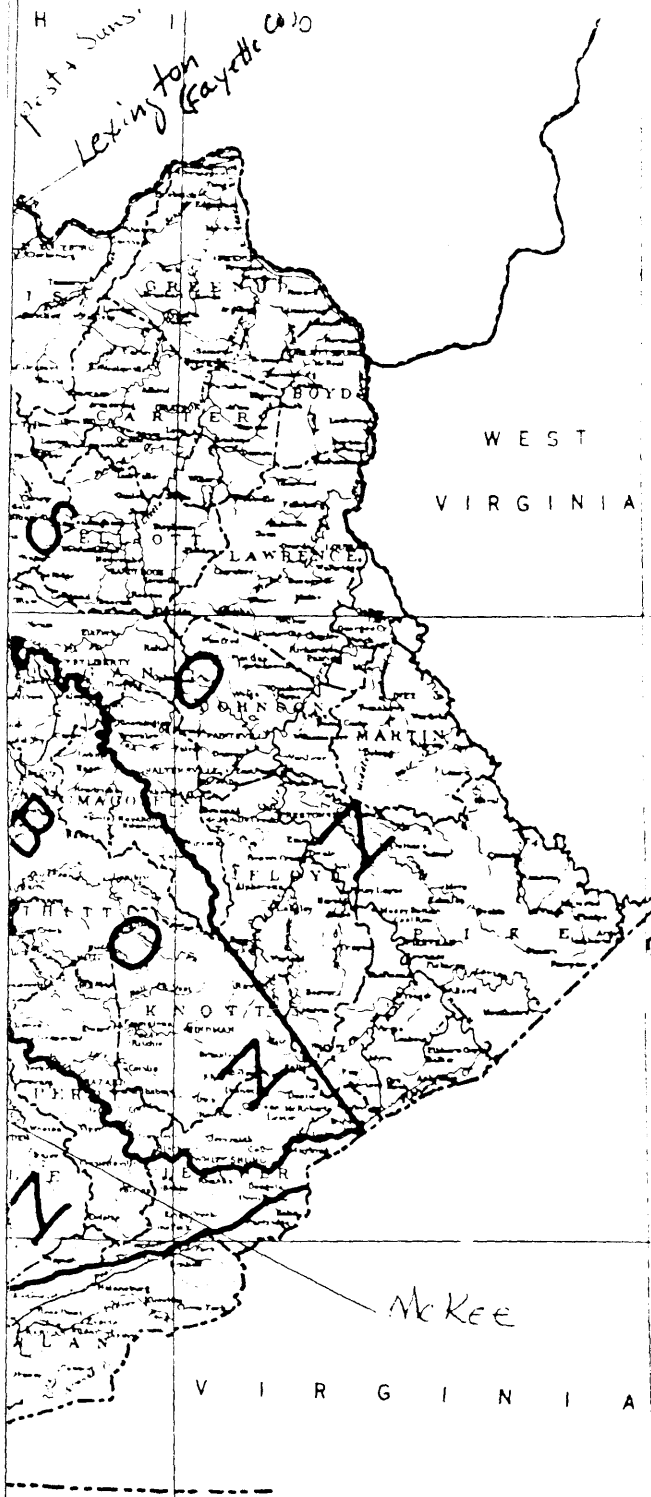

Preface

This volume of abstracts supplements the compiler's Orange County, Virginia, Will Book I, 1735-1743. The deeds give evidence of some of the earliest settlers in the transmontane portions of Virginia, in the area which became Augusta, Frederick, Page, Rockbridge and Shenandoah counties, in addition to revealing residents of Culpeper, Greene, Orange and Rappahannock counties. In this period Orange embraced all of the land from the Rappahannock River, beginning at its fork, across the Blue Ridge, down the Valley and west to include all of West Virginia and Kentucky.

Of particular interest to the genealogist are the leases for lives granted by Governor Spotswood and Colonel Beverley.

The judgments and other papers of the county court form a body of information about the daily affairs of Orange County residents which cannot be duplicated from any other source. Since there is no adequate index to these records and since, because their fragile condition has made it necessary for the Clerk of the Court to restrict examination of the papers, we believe the abstracts printed herein to be of especial value. The permission to make the abstracts granted to the compiler by H. C. DeJarnette, Clerk of the Orange County Court, is acknowledged with appreciation.

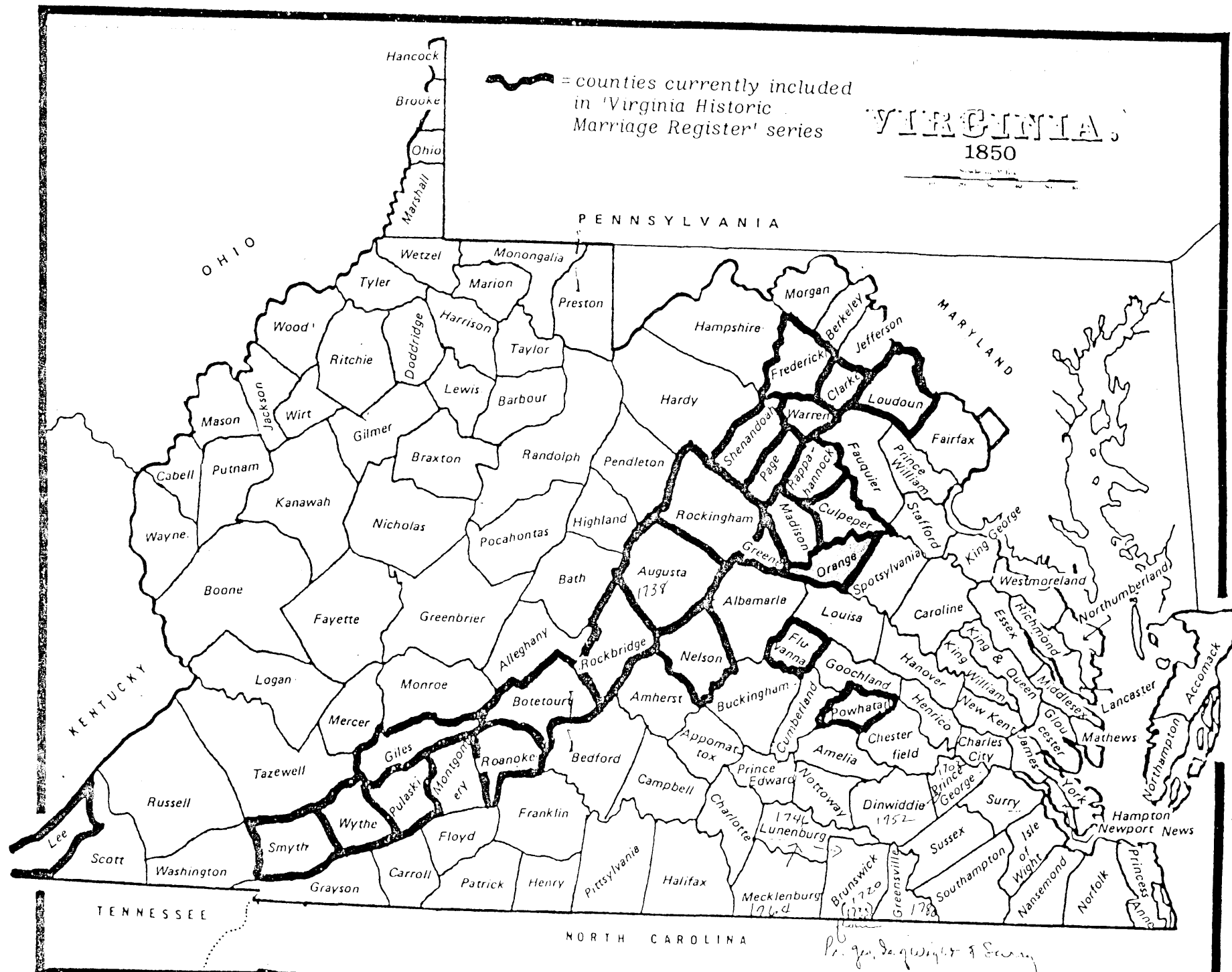

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INTRODUCTION.

NEW KENT COUNTY, which was formed from York in 1654, included not only the present county of the name, but also the section of country now embraced in King William, King and Queen, Hanover, and all upwards to the heads of the Pamunkey and Mattaponi rivers. Bishop Meade states (*Old Churches and Families of Virginia*, I, 383), that there were originally in the county two parishes, St. John's, north of York and Pamunkey, and St. Peter's, south of those streams. It appears, however, that in 1655, the district, beginning at Poropotank creek, on the north side of York river and extending up the Mattaponi, was organized into a parish called Stratton Major.

There appears to be no record to show when St. Peter's was formed, but the vestry book begins in 1682.

In 1704, St. Paul's parish, afterwards in Hanover county, was formed from St. Peter's. All persons, therefore, who trace their ancestry to Hanover, as well as those of New Kent descent, may find information of interest in the St. Peter's Register.

As the Virginia Society of Colonial Dames will follow the Register with the publication of the Vestry Book of St. Peter's, a more detailed history of the parish is deferred.

The copy from which this volume is printed was made, by permission of the trustees of the Virginia Theological Seminary, Alexandria county, Va., from the original register now in the library of the Seminary.

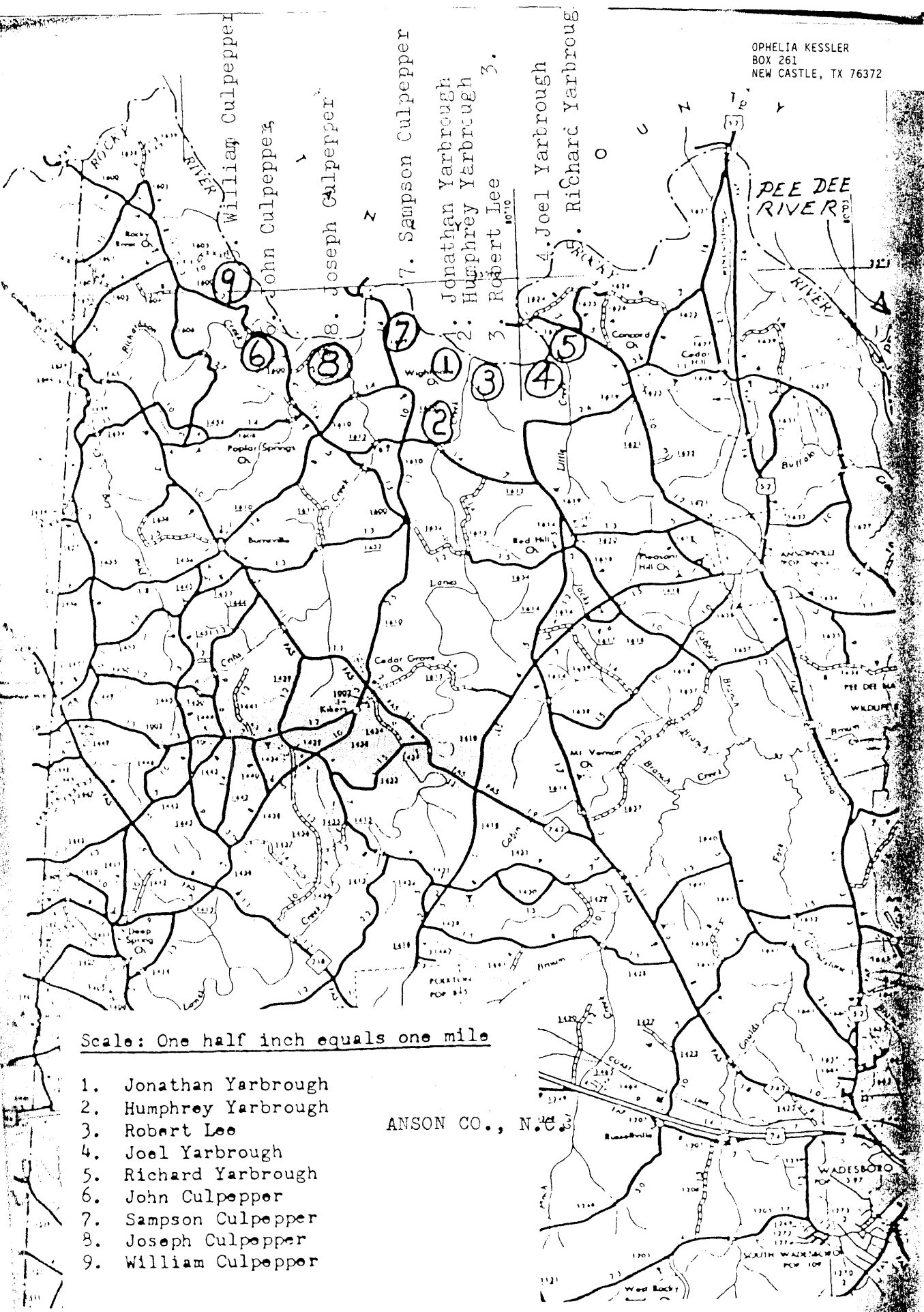

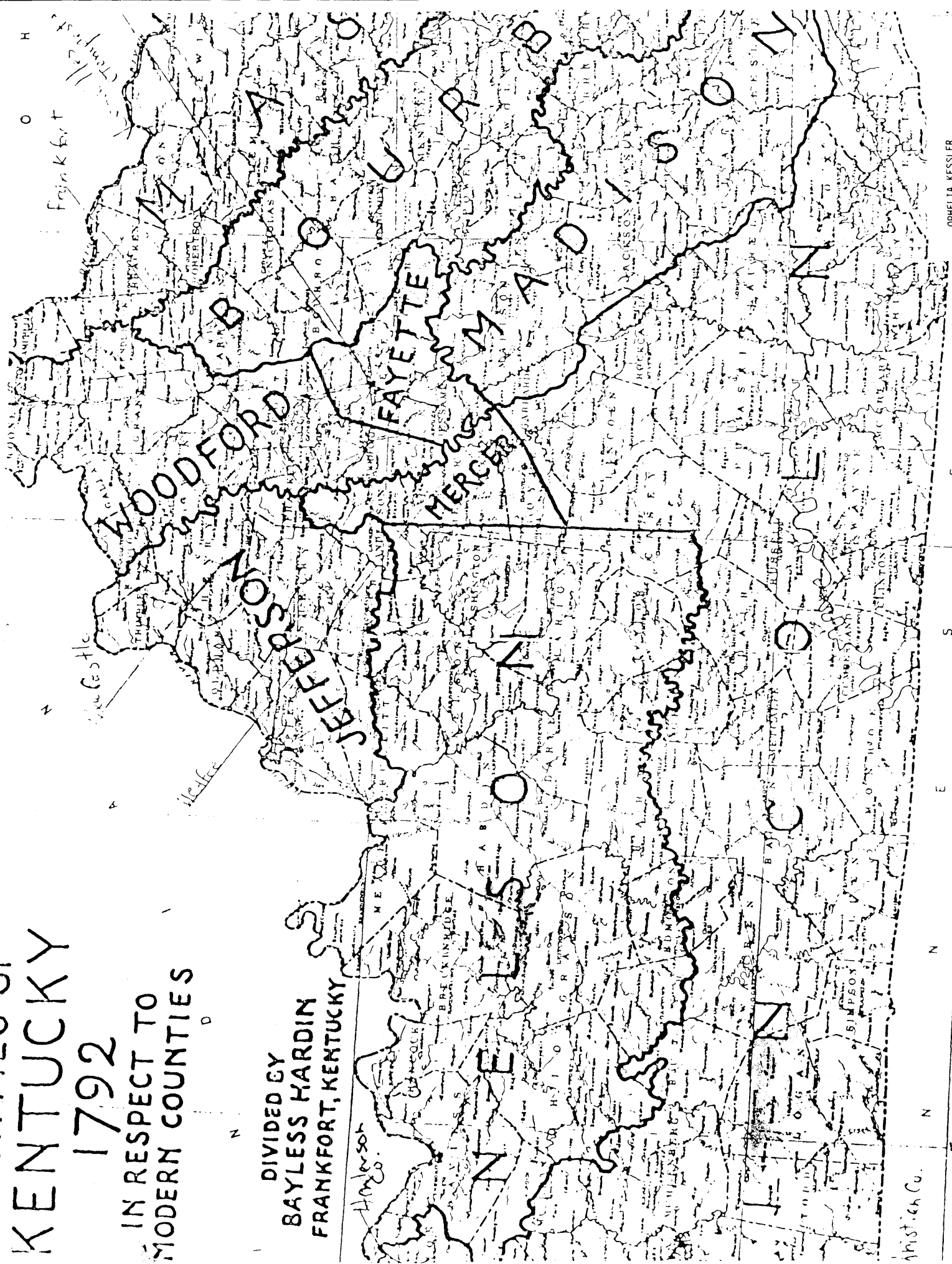

the story was printed in the Lexington, N. C. Dispatch, January 5, 1898. As the story related to men who came to North Carolina more than one hundred years before the article was printed, we must view it as legend. The article states: "Between the years of 1729 and 1775, seven brothers of Yarbroughs went (from Amelia Co., Va.) over to Louisburg, Franklin Co., North Carolina. Their names were Zachariah, Archibald, Manoha, Alexander, Thomas, Henry and John."

While some of the above named do appear on the State Census 1764-1779, Dept. of Archives, Raleigh, N. C., it is doubtful that the Yarboroughs mentioned in the article were sons of the same Father. Perhaps, "brothers of Yarbroughs" meant they left brothers in Amelia Co. or elsewhere, but came as a group of Yarbrough kin.

In a record such as this, it would be impossible to trace each man of the generation mentioned in the above article. By the 1790 Census, most of the Yarbrough - Yarborough families were gone to another locality. There are many records to be found in North Carolina which pertain to those Yarboroughs mentioned in the following Censuses.

THE EARLY YEARS

The early happenings of Stewart County may be found in the early court records, due in part to the wide powers of the county court.

In 1805 John Scott was indicted by the court for petty larceny. He was found guilty and fined 6/4 cents.¹ In May 1806, William Rasco "departed this life" leaving Jesse Rasco, Jesse Fort (in right of his wife Freline, formerly Freline Rasco), Laban Rasco, Dudley Williams (in right of his wife Elizabeth, formerly Elizabeth Rasco), all of "full age", and William Rasco, Polly Rasco, and John Rasco, minors, as his children and heirs. His wife Rachel Rasco and Williams were appointed guardians for the minor children.² Nathan Thomas, who lived on Guices Creek, paid tax on three black polls.³

In 1808 William Bogard was indicted and tried for larceny and acquitted.⁴ This same year Mary Buchanan, formerly Mary Brinson, deeded a negro girl Jane and other property to her three children Benjamin, Arissa, and Dewey Brinson.⁵

In 1810, Richard Yarborough sold his still, stillhouse, and "vessels" to Thomas White for \$110. Witnesses for this transaction were Samuel Yarborough and Phil Hornberger.⁶

Guice's Creek was named for Christopher Guice, who had been granted land on this creek by North Carolina. In 1811 Guice was living in the Mississippi Territory, the section now Adams County, and was disposing of his Stewart County lands.

The courts usually concerned themselves with clearing the county of wolves. The court was authorized to pay for each wolf's scalp. In February 1811, John Bird brought two wolves scalps to court to receive payment. At this same term, Phil Hall registered his stock mark.⁷ Jesse Denson was the coroner of Stewart for this year and Joel Williams served as register.⁸

In 1812 assault and battery charges were brought against Reuben Elliott by the court. James Lane purchased 150 acres on White Oak Creek from John Robbins of Humphreys County and Thomas Lane was appointed a constable.⁹ Edmond Taylor was indicted by the court for assault and battery on the person of Samuel Yarbrough. One of the unusual land calls given for road work at the May term of court was the Old Hay Stack.¹¹

In 1813 Thomas C. Turnbull was given permission to practice law in Stewart.¹² Yancey Thornton was the register for the county for this year.¹³ George Boyd was ordered to support a bastard child, reportedly his child.¹⁴ John Fletcher was indicted for assault and battery; like charges were brought against Benjamin Spencer.¹⁵ Tapley Maddox was the Stewart County trustee and Nathan Peoples was the coroner.¹⁶ John Aaron was the county's pauper for 1813, and mention was made of John Williams, insane son of Edith Williams.¹⁷ Stephen O'Guin bought two wolves scalps to court in November.¹⁸

Thomas Buckingham, sheriff of Stewart County, registered his protests against the county's jail facilities at the November 1813 term.¹⁹ Obviously Stewart County was without a jail at this period because William Curl was paid by the court for taking a prisoner to the jail at Clarksville, and William Ezell was paid for taking James Haynes to jail and Clarksville and guarding John Dare (?) to Clarksville.²⁰ In 1814 court minutes reveal that Abraham Clark was paid for guarding the prisoners Stephen Stanley and John Frost to the Clarksville jail.²¹

Rufus Cato, orphan, 15 years old, was bound to Alsey Bradford in 1814 to serve

One of the earliest marriages of which there is any record was that of Reuben Elliott to Fannie Yarbrough on July 24, 1804. William Hornberger was bondsman, and he also married on November 12, 1804, to Polly Yarbrough, daughter of Davis Yarbrough, a Revolutionary soldier who settled in Stewart County. There is record later of William Hornberger being declared insane and Yarbrough, his father in law, was appointed by the court to look after Polly Hornberger and report to the court.³²

The aged, indigent, the insane, and the orphans were wards of the court and as such were protected. Orphans were usually apprenticed to some responsible citizens. The others were provided for by their support being paid to their caretakers. On October 19, 1807, one Nathan Ross, age 11, orphan, was bound out to Archibald Cook, who was to furnish him with a new suit of clothes when he reached the age of twenty-one. (Note: this child's name has also been found as Nathan McFaden in the court minutes.)³³ In this same year, Lydia Campbell, an orphan of eight years, was bound to William Pearce until her eighteenth birthday. In January 1808 one Jeremiah Smith, age 16, orphan, was apprenticed to John Williams, who was to teach him to read and write and cipher as far as to the rule of three. One year later, Sollomon Smith, 20, was apprenticed to James Gatlin to learn farming.³⁴

On February 15, 1812, John Williams, the insane son of Edith Williams, was let out by the court to the lowest bidder.³⁵

Charges of bastardy were not unheard of in the early days of settlement and the courts noted these cases and took steps, when necessary, to provide for the hapless victims. In May 1815 the court ordered Richard Fossett (also found as Faucette) to support the bastard child of Sarah Turner as he was the "reputed" father of said child.³⁶ The court also noted that year that Richard Faucet (possibly another variation in spelling) was to pay for the bastard child sworn to him by Lucy Davidson.³⁷

George Boyd had been ordered in February 1813 to support and maintain a certain bastard child sworn to him by Marian Williams.³⁸ In August 1814, Henry Atkins was ordered to come to court. He did so and made bond and said that the bastard child of Lucinda Williams shall not become a county charge.³⁹ In February 1817 Reed Lutten was charged with bastardy by the court.⁴⁰

Criminal cases were also brought before the county court. In 1816 Richard Cooley came before the court and made a statement that "in a combat in his presence" between Oltman Yearkins and William Webster, Yearkins lost a piece of his ear.⁴¹

In 1815 William Jones was indicted by the court for petit larceny and was found guilty. His punishment was to be ten lashes upon the naked back, which punishment was administered forthwith before a large crowd of curious onlookers. For sending a challenge to fight a duel, Alexander Turner was fined \$50 and sent to jail for sixty days and deprived of his citizenship for twelve months.⁴²

In 1823 William McKinney was found guilty of petit larceny by the county court and received as punishment ten lashes on the naked back. For the same offense in 1824 Lemuel Williams, a negro, received the same punishment, but in addition was branded infamous. In 1825 John Smith was given ten lashes for larceny, and Henry Cato, a negro, for stabbing a white man was whipped, branded and cropped. Branding was done by pouring hot wine of some particular brand and color on the hand or arm of the criminal, which would leave a red blotch for life. Cropping was the cutting of a piece of the ear. In 1828, after an exciting trial, Iriscilla Jugg, colored, was emancipated by the court, and Richard Rose was whipped and branded for larceny.⁴³

Wynns married 1876 to Mary A. Sexton and they had four children. He owned a farm on the Tennessee River, part of which was on Sandy Island. (Goodspeed, 1328.)

SAMUEL CUNNINGHAM -- soldier of the War of 1812 living in Stewart County in 1828; served in Clark's 3rd Regiment of U. S. Infantry; drew pension for his services. (Soldiers of the War of 1812 Buried in Tennessee, 28.)

JAMES LANCASTER -- was 80 years in July 1922; son of Arnold Lancaster, born in North Carolina and Rebecca Peal, daughter of Lawrence Peal and Hattie Peal. He served in Company I, 50th Tennessee; was captured at Fort Donelson and recalled he received fair treatment while in prison. (John Trotwood Moore Questionnaire, 1922, State Archives.)

MARRIAGE RECORDS of STEWART COUNTY, TENN.

1-02-1849 thru 12-31-1866

These were copied from photocopies of the original thru the courtesy of the County Court Clerk, Eddie Earhart.

As these old books are being put to considerable use by genealogists, there is a danger of their being slowly destroyed thru the constant use and it is our aim to prevent this by having a typed copy available for the public.

As some of the writing is practically illegible, you will find question marks after some of the names indicating doubt as to correctness. The grooms are listed with surname first, then the given name, date of license, bride's surname and her given name. There was no index at the Court House, so an index will be found at the rear of this book with first group representing the grooms and the second group the brides.

Even today a number of people marry in a county other than the one in which they live. A number of these names are familiar and can be found in Ky., Caldwell, Calloway, Christian, Trigg and other counties. The same will probably apply to the nearby counties in Tenn. If the couples were from Ky. and married between 1852 and 1859 and sometimes in 1861 they will probably also be found in the Vital Statistics Records of Ky. These are not the ones found in the local court house but were kept locally and forwarded to Frankfort. They often go into much detail. For instance, Thos. W. Shemwell m. 1-11-1853 to Milly E. Armstrong and they were listed in the V.S. of Trigg Co., Ky.

DR. G. P. YARBROUGH⁹

DR. G. P. YARBROUGH was born July 21, 1851, in Golden Pond Precinct [Christian Co., Kentucky]. He is a son of Asa and Tempérance (McGregor) Yarbrough. The parents were natives of Stewart Co., Tenn. The father died May 19, 1872, aged fifty-eight years. The mother died in August, 1883, aged fifty-nine. Our subject was reared on his father's farm. At the age of twenty he engaged in school teaching, and during this time he studied medicine. After teaching about ten months he studied under the preceptorship of Dr. Benj. Franklin three years. In the winter of 1872 and 1873 he took a course of lectures at the Medical Department of the University of Tennessee, after which he returned home and raised a crop on his father's farm. In June, 1874, he received a certificate from the Judicial Medical Board at Hopkinsville, and since that time has been actively engaged in the practice of the profession at this point. He was married, in 1876, to Sarah H. Malone. She was born in Ferguson Springs Precinct, a daughter of W.B. Malone, now engaged in the tobacco business at Canton.





Searching for Indexed Terms¹

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select “Edit”, and then “Find” or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.
