Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

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

5• Between 1770 and 1790 Thomas Griggs Yarborough, James, John and John, Jr, Richard and Owen (who was either a son of Thomas or Richard) were in Fairfield Co., South Carolina.

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Culpepper Co. (Grant by Lord Fairfax to Ambrose Yar-brough of 68 A. of land along the Robinson River on Doubletop Mountain in the Northern Neck of Virginia (Culpepper Co.) Dated Dec. 12, 1769. Ambrose Yarborough and wife, Mary, Dated Dec. 12, 170%. Ambrose farborougn and wife, Mary, sold this 68 A. to Henry Lewis, Oct. 9, 1776. He left Cul-pepper Co. and does not appear in records until he was wit-ness to Will of William Wofford of Union Co., S.C. He had applied for a land grant, which was granted, shortly after his death, by Gov. Pinkney, of 877 A. along the Tyger River in Union Co., S.C., dated Feb. 28, 1789. This grant was made to Stephen Layton, executor of Ambrose's estate in made to Stephen Layton, executor of Ambrose's estate, in trust for Jerimiah, lawful heir.

The Layton family and Yarborough family must have been close or kin. It was about this time that the name of Stephen was used as the given name of Yarboroughs.

Francis Layton received a land grant in Craven Co., S.C. on branches of Wateree River and Taylors Creek. (From University of South Carolina Library) June 2, 1771 (Book FFF p. 485) July 4, 1771: Francis Layton of Graven Co., Province of South Carolina, to John Yarborough of same county, land granted to Francis Layton in Craven Co. on brance of Watree River and Taylor Creek laid out by Ambrose Mills, for the sum of L 162 to him paid by John Yarborough. Signed by Francis Layton and wife Mary; withessed by James Yarborough and Richard Yarborough and Ruben Ball.

The same land was conveyed from John Yarborough to Thomas Gregg Yarborough Oc. of 1788 (Book FFF, p. 405) and a part, 374 A., of this same land was sold by Thomas Gregg

Yarborough and wife Rachel in Oct. 1794 to denry Rugeley (Es. 241, U.S.C. Library). Thomas G. Yarborough listed as resident of fairfield Co. Records show that John Yarborough, Sr. (who, I presume) was the same as the one who conveyed the land on Watree River to Thomas G. Yarborough) also had land in Chester Co., S.C. (Ms. 168, U.S.C. Library, Deed Release proceeded by Lease, April 7, 1788) John Yarborough to Littleton Randolph Isabel, Chester Co., both of S.C. for the consideration of 100 1 Sterling, 50 A. of land on N. side of Rocky Creek in Chester Co., "beginning at Lewis . Yarborough's line at a box oak marked R.S., part of Land conveyed to John Land, and by in to John Yarborough, Sr. Signed John Yarborough; witnessed by Jonathan Hemphill, Daniel Muse and William Yarborough. The following indent shows that in the year 1785, Richard Yarborough was mented land on Watree Creek: Richard Yarborough of Fairfield Co., S.C. and Wm. Goggin of same county and state. Yeo. 20, 1790, for sum of 20 L, Richard Yarborough doth bar-gain and sell to Wn. Goggin 20 A. of land granted to Richard Yarborough in Dist. of Camden on Wateree Creek Sept. 4, 1785. Wit: Owen Yarborough. This means that Richard and John Yarborough, Sr. were on neighboring lands on Wateree River. and since John Yarborough had his as early as 1771, it looks as though John Yarborough, Sr. was the father of Richard, John, Jr., James, Lewis, William and Owen and Thomas Grigg Yarborough. I think that Owen was son of Richard, grandson of John, Sr.

It was 1777 that Ambrose Yarborough went to Union Co., S.C., and because he made Stephen Layton the executor of his Will, I wonder if it was the Laytons which brought the families to the same area. There were several mariages between Laytons and the children of Ambrose Yarborough. Humphry Yarborough m. Layton, Stephen Yarborough m. Susan Layton (their daughter, Sarah m. Humphries Young), Hirum Yarborough m. Martha Layton (Susan Layton's parents were James Layton and Mary Williamson. The Spencers, Bobo and Yarboroughs of Ambrose went to Spartanburg, S.C. and many went to Fayette, Alabama.

The 1790 Census of S.C. shows the above Yarboroughs.





The names of the landowners mentioned in this will are the friends, neighbors and some of those to which the children of Richard Yarborough, immigrant, were married. From Gloucester Co., Va. records we find that Richard Yarborough owned land in King William Co Nov. 1691; Richard conveyed by deed Feb. 12, 1695, in King William Co., to John Yarborough, son of Richard. May 30, 1704, John Yarborough sold 200 A. of land in King William Co. to William Aylett. The deed was recorded in King William Co. and signed by John Yarborough and wife, Abagail.

John Yarborough married Feb., 1695 to Abagail Whitehead, daughter of Philip Whitehead of Gloucester Co., Va. In Gloucester Co., Va. - April 4, 1703, Philip Whitehead gave to Richard Yarborough, through his Will, 200 A. of land, patented by Philip Whitehead of Gloucester Co. Those who witnessed the will were John Yarborough, Richard Yarborough and Abagail Yarborough.

Another landowner of the area was the Brokenborough family, as one of the Aylett sons married a Brokenborough. This name is also found used as a given name of a Yarborough in later years.

These records concern Richard Yarborough, son of the earlier Richard Yarborough. As the records of the court case listed while this area was yet in Old-New Kent County, Va. From this case we know that Richard Yarborough and Benjamin Arnold were neighbors in 1690.

1690 - New Kent Court - Richard Yarborough 38 (1652) and wife Elizabeth 34 (1656)

At the home of Benjamin Arnold several persons gathered for a party. They were having drinks, as was the custom and were toasting the King, Queen and Governors. A Capt. Lumpkin, present, got a little stubborn and refused to take his hat off and raise his glass or cup to the aforesaid dignitaries. Everyone urged him to conform, but he refused. He jumped on his horse and cursed the Governor (Stuart), "God Dam the Governor, I'm as good a man as he is."

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It was the duty of the host to report such behavior to the High Sheriff, Richard Johnson. All present at the gathering were summoned to court to testify.

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Justices, Capt. John Land and Robert Bird were there to swear in and hear testimony of: Richard Yarborough (38) wife Elizabeth Yarborough (34), Ann Browne (31), Benj. Arnold, wife Ann Arnold and Ellinor Thompson (22).

While this preceeding case refers to Richard Yarborough, Jr., some of the records probably refer to the first Richard Yarborough; however, Richard (I) lived in the area of Petersburg, Va. for it is written in the records of Old Blanford Church that Richard Yarborough was a founder of the parish. His tombstone, enclosed in the cemetery of the church, reads: Richard Yarborough, died 1702, age 87. Christian Yarblow is shown among the arrivals in Virginia in 1653 sponsored by Thomas Willis. Some researchers (Nelle Morris Jenkins) have stated this Christian Yarblow was the same as Richard II and was so called to distinguish him from his Father, Richard I. I believe this not to be so as I feel Richard Yarborough I would have sponsored his own son if it were so.

AMBROSE YARBROUGH b. c 1710

The Yarborough "cousins" in England did have communication with those who came to Virginia in the colonial days and according to researcher Senator George Washington Yarborough (D. Alabama - probably the foremost authority on the Yarborough Family in America since 1930) another immigrant ancestor of the family was Ambrose Yarbrough who left England in 1732.

Following will be some brief history of these early immigrants:

IMMIGRANT RICHARD YARBOROUGH

Found in the records of the House of Burgesses, the first representative legislative body in America, there are references to Richard Yarburgh, Yarberry (Yarborough).

While researching the different families, I always found the material more interesting if there were some description of the people and how and where they lived. Occasionally a gentleman kept a diary or "Day Book," but we of the Yarborough family have no such record of our very early immigrant ancestors. Our records are dependent on the deeds of property and wills, and once in a while, a court record. There are times when the will of a man other than a family member can cast some light on the location and neighbors of our kin, and can also tell us at what date the family member sold his land and moved on to a new location. It is from the wills and records of Old New Kent County, Virginia, that we find records of our forefather, Richard, and some of his children.

In 1691 New Kent Co., Va. was divided to make King and Queen Co., and on April 11, 1702, King William Co. was created from King and Queen Co., the dividing line being the Mattapony River. In 1704 there were 216 land-owners in King William Co. The lines of division between St. John's Parish and St. David's Parish is the same that were drawn to separate St. Margaret's and St. John's at the time of its creation, beginning at Arnold's and Yar-borough's Ferry below Ayletts and munning across the borough's Ferry below Ayletts and running across the County to the mouth of Monruen Creek. ber of large land grants in the upper portion of King William Co. which lay within St. David's Parish. On Oct. 25, 1699, Col. Edmund Jennings, a member of the Council of State, was granted 570 A. of land lying on the south side of the Mattapony River in Pamunkey Neck, beginning at the mouth of Lower Herring Creek and thence along Gravelley branch, the lines of Peter White, Richard Yarborough's land, Foards cornfield in King and Queen Co. The same year he was granted 200 A. on Deep Bottom Run and Pamunkey Neck, and Col. Jennings was again granted 3,490 A. in 1703, and again in 1704, another grant adjourning his previously owned land, 1,900 A.

Col. Jennings' large tract of land covered an area of nearly ten square miles, one of the largest tracts in the county of King William. It is not known when Col. Jennings disposed of all of this land, but when he died in 1727, his estate was sold by his executors. There is only one deed in the old records of King William which shows that a small tract of land purchased by John Yarborough was later purchased by Co. William Aylett and became a part of the Aylett Plantation "Fairfield." The origin of the Aylett family has not been established by records, but Col. Aylett was the first clerk of King William County and a land owner before the county was formed. He was appointed the first clerk in 1702 and served until his death. (Will of William Aylett made No. 18, 1730 - probated, Mar. 17, 1733). It is certain that he purchased his land, for the earlier landowners are named in his will:

> Item: I give and devise to my well beloved son Philip Aylett and to his heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever the tract of land where I now dwell, bounded according to my deeds for the same from Benjamin Arnold as likewise one hundred acres of land thereto adjoining to the bounds in my deed for the same from Benjamin Arnold. I likewise give and devise to my said son Philip Aylett his heirs and assigns forever seven hundred acres of land out of the tract of land I hold by deeds from Mann Page Esq: deceased, to be laid off contiguous beginning to the lower end of the said tract taking the whole breadth and coming upwards till it included seven hundred acres.

Item. Give and bequeth unto my beloved son, John Aylett and to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever the several parcels of land I

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privately removed himself out of this county or so absconded so that process cannot be served on him for three pounds current money due from said Joshua to the said William Waller. This day come the plaintiff who proved his demand to be just by his own oath; therefore, it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said sum of three pounds and his costs. . . and Edward Spenser, Gent., appeared and being sworn saith that he is endebted to Joshua Yarbrough in the amount of three pounds seven shillings and three pence half penny which he is ordered to pay to the plaintiff in discharge of this judgment and to restore the residue if any to the defendant.

Since Joshua had sold his last tract of land in 1743 and the last entry for him in the order books prior to the one above was, also, in 1743, Joshua appears to have simply moved rather than absconded to avoid a debt as implied in the entry above.

With Joshua and Richard so closely connected and the only Yarbroughs mentioned in Orange 'Co., VA, records until 1750, I naturally felt that perhaps Richard was Joshua's father and tried unsuccessfully to find the proof. I still feel it is a possibility; at least they were close kin.

From Orange Co., VA, Joshua moved to Amelia Co., VA. Amelia Co. was created from Brunswick and Prince George Counties in 1732. Prince George was the county in which Richard, the immigrant, had lived and died.

On 12 Jan. 1747 Joshua received a land grant of 400 acres which "lay on the head of Whetstone Creek in the fork of Nottoway River in Amelia County bordering the land of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., and Thomas Yarbrough, Jr.²⁰ Several other Yarbroughs, also, received land grants in Amelia Co., VA, during this period: William, 1739, 1740, and 1755; Henry and Thomas (a partnership) 1740; Samuel, Moses, William, and Hezekiah, 1746; Henry, 1745; and Thomas, 1745. All these tracts lay on Nottoway River.

Other Yarbroughs found in Amelia Co. deeds and court records for these years were: Charles, Ellinor wife of William, Richard, Richard, Jr., Sarah wife of Samuel, John and wife Betty, Joseph, Jordon, and Priscilla. Through wills and court records of Amelia County we are able to identify a number of these Yarbroughs.

William Yarbrough left a will which was recorded 16 Dec. 1748 in Amelia County Will Book I, p. 50. In it he names his wife Elliner and his children, Samuel Yarbrough, Ann Higgons, Carymhaporah Anderson, William Yarbrough, Hezekiah Yarbrough, Moses Yarbrough, Micajah Yarbrough, and Priscilla Yarbrough. Richard Yarbrough and Richard Yarbrough, Jr., witnessed the will.

We have no proof that either of these Richard Yarbroughs is the same as Richard Yarbrough of Orange Co., VA; however, we know William, Sr., is the same one found in King William Co., VA, earlier because in 1722 William Yarbrough sold Martin Chandler land in King William Co., and Elliner his wife relinquished her right to dower.²¹ Hezekiah, named as son in William's will, also, left a will in Amelia Co., recorded for probate 27 June 1754, leaving everything to his sister Priscilla and his brother Moses Yarbrough; however, Moses died leaving a will recorded 22 Apr. 1756, Amelia Co., VA, giving all his estate to his sister Priscilla Yarbrough, so evidently these two brothers were unmarried when they died. Henry Yarbrough witnessed both these wills.²²

Samuel, another son of William, moved to Orange Co., NC, where he left a will probated 5 Nov. 1770, naming his wife, Sarah; children: William, Samuel, John, Elizabeth, Sarah, and Lewcey Yarbrough. Another son, William, Jr., remained in Amelia Co. and later lived in Prince Edward County which was formed from Amelia County in 1754. His will, recorded there in 1771, names sons: James Smith, Oswell, Joseph, Richard, and William; and daughter, Elizabeth Yarbrough. No wife is named, but from Bristol Parish register and Caroline Co., VA, Order Books we learn his wife was Diana Smith and that she died 18 May 1767.


The last son of William Yarbrough, Sr., Micajah, is a mystery. A few researchers have suggested that he was probably father of my Joshua because Joshua named a son Micajah. During this time children were named for their parents, grandparents, and other relatives; however, I have abandoned this theory after thoroughly searching Amelia County records for this period without finding his name mentioned except in his father's will by which he inherited 400 acres. No record was found where he disposed of the land which is a puzzle for Amelia County records are well preserved.

Another will found in Amelia County, Virginia, is for Thomas Yarbrough recorded 23 Mar. 1769, naming his wife Hannah; children: Jordon, Archibald, Hannah, Mary, Jane, and Catherine Yarbrough and grandson Thomas Yarbrough. The son Jordon left a will recorded 25 Oct. 1770 in Amelia County, leaving all his property to his brothers and sisters, so he, too, died unmarried. (WB 2, p. 332) Thomas's other son Archibald lived on in Amelia and Prince Edward Counties with his wife Ann.

From Amelia County court records we learn that the father of Thomas's wife, Hannah, was Samuel Jordon and the father of Thomas Yarbrough was another Thomas Yarbrough. From Amelia County tax records we learn that Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., also, had sons, John and Zachariah. They were listed as his titheables in the tax lists of 1747 and 1749. Our Joshua Yarbrough was, also, listed in these same tax lists as head of a household, and since he earlier received land grants lying next to Thomas, Sr., and Thomas, Jr.'s, land, I am inclined to believe Joshua is an older son of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., which would possibly make him a great grandson of Richard, the immigrant, because most researchers believe that Thomas, Sr., was son of Richard Yarbrough, Jr., and grandson of Richard Yarbrough, the immigrant. No proof, however, has been found.

On 20 Oct. 1749 Joshua sold the 400 acres he had received as a land grant in Amelia County to Richard Stone for the sum of 20 pounds current money of Virginia. Joshua's wife Sarah "being examined privately relinquished her right of dower. (Deed Book 3, p. 295)

The next record found for Joshua Yarbrough was in 1754 when he was listed in Captain Surgar Jones's Company of Granville Co., NC, Militia. A year later both Joshua and John Yarbrough are listed on the Granville Co. tax list. In 1758 Joshua is again listed on the tax list and paid

RANDLE-RANDOLPH of SURRY and SUSSEX

There was a Randolph family in Kent, England, which was connected with Virginia. An account of that family is given in Berry's Kent, page 27, as follows:

Bernard Randolph of Beddenden Co., Kent, was buried in the chancel May 6, 1628, aged 72. He married Jane, daughter of William and sister of Sir William Beddenden. She died April 3, 1619, aged 48.

A John Randle was a headright of Edward Prince in 1639. (C.P. 117). He was probably then a young man and could have been the John Randle who was living on the south side of the Chickahominy adjacent Gregory Well's land in 1692. (W 12 (1) 109) A John Randle or Randolph is said to have been the father of the two brothers, John and Josias Randle of whom later. This seems impossible to prove on account of the destruction of the county records. It is possible that after the Land Grants of Virginia, since 1666, are published, additional information about John Randle (Randall) may be found. A John Randall's inventory was filed in York County, 1701.

John Randle of King William married Mary, daughter of Richard Johns of King William, and Josias, said to be his brother, married her sister Jane Johns.

Margaret Jennings, widow of Isaac Hill, married secondly a Randle. (See Jennings-Hill chart). He was possibly Nicholas Randle of Spottsylvania. Isaac Hill died before June 13, 1734, as Clement Read was appointed his administrator on that date. (40 V-89) Nicholas Randle died in 1748 in Spottsylvania and his wife Margaret was appointed his administratrix (Id). Was she the mother of a Josias Randle, who was closely associated with Clement Read? (See F. L. Morris' account) (Id.)

George Randall, who may have been related to the Randle family of King Williams, was the first of the name from whom the Surry-Sussex family is descended and nothing apparently is known of him prior to the making of his will in Surry in 1710. He was seemingly a new comer to Surry as he does not show in the Quit Rent rolls of 1704, or in any of the lists of Tithables. His wife, Elizabeth, may have been the widow of James Cain.

His will was dated Feb. 18, 1710, and probated Nov.25, 1711, as follows (abstract):

"To son Peter, gun, sword, live stock, and furniture from his mother when 21 years of age. William Rainey to have my son Peter and his estate to keep till said Peter comes to age of 21 years, but to have part of his time to 18 years old. To my youngest son (not named) two cows, hogs and my flock. To daughter Mary two cows, etc. Wife Elizabeth to be executrix and have rest of estate." Wits: Mary Simon, Francis Maybury, Robert Wynne. Elizabeth Randall, widow, married Marmaduke Brown. On March 18, 1723, they made a deed of gift to Peter Randall of 100 acres on north side of Nottoway at Rocky Run. (W&D 1715-30, p.520). Dear Ophelia:

I am enclosing your groupsheet on Wade L. Yarborough. By accident, I discovered that the marriage date on this was incorrect. A lady in NC wrote to me about a Wilson Y. in Georgia. Living very near him was a Wade L. Yarborough. I checked my groupsheets to see if I had anything on either of these men and found your Wade L. Y. We considered this a great find as it was a clue that perhaps her Wilson came from Warren Co ... perhaps he and Wade L. were related. With a marriage date of 1802, this Wade L. in Warren Co. was the right age to be the father of her Wilson.

I wrote to this lady and asked her if she had any clue at all about where in NC her Y's came from. She was excited at the Warren Co., Clue and immediately was going to plan a trip there for research.

I got out the Warren County records this weekend and discovered that Wade L. was actually married in 1835 ... and is more than likely the same Wade L. Y. that is in GA in 1842. I was searching the records to see if I could find the father of this Wade L. Y. I have records only to about 1814 for Warren Co. As I was working on my own line, I copied only the years I knew my line was in the area.

Anyway, in looking at the marriage records to see who married about the right time to have been Wade L. Y's father, I discovered that a Joel Y. married Sally Sledge 12 June 1803. What interested me about this is that when Wade L. Y married Martha J. Turner on 24 Dec 1835, the witness was E. D. Drake and the bondsman was William P. Sledge. I wondered if this Wm. Sledge was any relation

to the Sally Sledge that Joel married.

> Joel died in 1840 in Warren County. I have the book and page where his probate is recorded, but no copy of the record itself.

Do you have anything on this Joel? If he is the father of Wade L. in Warren Co., and this Wade is the same as the one in Georgia ... and Wilson is actually his brother as we suspect ... I can give this woman her line back to the immigrant Richard. I just do not have anything on this Joel's family. The only record I found for Wade L. in Warren County was his marriage. While Joel is in the minute books at least through 1814, no where does it give any hint as to his children. Nor is there any other Y mentioned from 1785 except William (Joel's father) & family (will/probate records) and William Y Jr. (will) who was the brother of Joel.

Can you help?

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With this additional information we see that William, Samuel and James Y. in Stewart Co. were from another family or other families than that of George of Halifax Co.

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Now, let's direct our attention to that 1800 Warren Co., blina Federal Census (YPM 3/22). Three William Y.'s North Carolina Federal Census (YFM 3/22). are listed. I identify them as follows:

William/45-up: died in 1803 in Warren Co. (YFM 2/94), wife, Patsy, son, John C., son of James Y., who died in Brunswick Co., Va. in 1777.

son of William Y., who died William/26-45/no children: in 1793 in Warren Co. (YPM 3/14).

William/26-45/2 male children: no history, cannot iden-tify at this time.

The 1810 Warren Co., North Carolina Pederal Census, which will be given in a later issue, lists only Jesse and Martha (probably widow "Patsy" of William who died in 1803).

This brings us to the question of the identity of the third William in the 1800 Warren Co. census and the identity of his father, questions I cannot answer at this time, but, which I surmise will be answered by the early records of Edgecombe and Halifax and Warren Cos., North Carolina, and Brunswick, Dinwiddie and Prince George Cos., Virginia.

On the following page is a chart, compiled by me, using composite data from my files, some of which I have not yet published, which accounts for the 6 William Yarboroughs listed in the 1790 Federal Census.

In the next issue I'll try to give some Y. records from Edgecombe, Halifax and Warren Counties. In the meanwhile, if you have any such records, please send them so they can be included. Also, if you have any additions to the above information, please send it. Thanks.

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I received a copy of the estate records from Warren County. I am sorry to say it really does not give us the information I was looking for. However, a Sally Yarborough was mentioned on the inventory, so this was probably his wife, Sally Sledge.

As soon as I can get to Warren County and check the deed records and I will try to tie them in to Wade and Wilson through Joel and William Y.. Maybe that will give me some concrete evidence.

At any rate, I am enclosing a copy of Joel's Inventory for your information.

I'll keep you posted on my progress.

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Warren County was formed in 1779. The earliest marriage record I have is 1789 and that was an Elizabeth Yarborough who married Peterson Person. She was a daughter of William Yarborough. He does not name her in his 1793 will, but names a granddaughter Nancy Persons. Possibly Elizabeth had died before 1793. I have her sister's marriage in 1802, but the male marriages would be more what we need to find the father of Wade.

An Edward Yarbrough married Polly Mabry 29 Dec 1802. I have no history on this Edward and he doesn't seem to be in the Warren County records (deed or probate).

A Henry Yarbrough married Mary Parham Duke on 24 October 1812. This Henry died young. He had only two children at his death, a son William and a daughter Elizabeth. I believe a researcher of this line told me that Mary took the children and lived with her father, William Parham Duke, who died in Henry County, Tennessee. That is off the top of my head and I'd need to search the records to tell you the children were in Tennessee for sure.

The next marriage I have after Henry is that of James Yarbrough and Margaret Coffman who married in 1823.

I've skipped one as I wanted to discuss it in more detail. Joel Yarbrough married Sally Sledge 12 Jun 1803. Wyatt Williams was the Bondsman and M. D. Johnson was the witness. This Joel is in the right age group to have been Wade Y's father. Notice that the Security for Wade L. Y's marriage bond was William P. Sledge. It makes me wonder if perhaps William Sledge was some relation to the Sally Sledge who married Joel?

As I mentioned, most of my Warren County records are earlier than the 1830's. I don't know if Wade is mentioned in later deed records. If there are records of him in NC past the 1840's, then he could not be the Wade L. Y. in Georgia. But, if he isn't in the records for those years ... he could well be the same Wade L. that appears in Georgia.

I do not have a list of Joel Y's children. My records only go to about 1814 and he is mentioned up to that date. A copy of his will or probate records might be worth ordering.

Joel's father was William Yarborough. Joel is mentioned in the Will. If you can prove that Wade L. was a son of Joel, I can take you back with verifying records at least three generations beyond William and have clues for you to follow to connect with Richard Yarborough, the immigrant Yarbrough who came to this country about 1635-40.

I spent about 6 hours yesterday abstracting Warren County records trying to find clues to the 1802 (GROAN) marriage of Wade. Because many of these include Joel, I am going to type them up for you. It will at least give you a starting place in Warren County. You need later records on Joel Y. than I have. I am still betting that the Wilson Y. and Wade Y. in Georgia are closely related. Wouldn't it be a find if Joel's will named them both as sons?

Of course, you may not think this a good lead to follow up. However, if you do any research on the records in Warren County for later years than I have, I'd appreciate having copies for my files. At the time I was searching, my time was so limited that I stuck only to the years when I knew my direct line was there.

Regarding the Elam Y you found in Carroll County, Tennessee ... He married 20 August 1819 in Wake County, NC to Jane Barham. Wake County is in the same NC area as Warren and Franklin County. I am guessing, but if Elam and Jane were married in Wake County, that is probably where their children were born.

I checked the Harrison History I have and none of the names you listed are given in it. It deals primarily with the line of Andrew Harrison/ Thomas Harrison. It is a fairly short history (about 10 legal sized pages) and doesn't go into the branches.

I've been pondering the name "Wilson" Yarbrough. It isn't one of the "common" given Y names. I am wondering if perhaps it came from a maternal side of the family. The Wilson family lived near the Y's in Virginia and in NC. I have a Wilson line and I've found the Y's & Wilsons seemed to travel together from Virginia to NC, NC to Tennessee and from Tennessee to Missouri. It seems that half my lines married into the Wilson family. I've noticed that there are dozens of cases where the wife's maiden name became the first name of one of the sons. Just a random thought.

I am going to stop now and type of the abstracts of Warren County for you. Again, I apologize for the wild goose chase I've sent you on. Maybe it will lead to something yet.

The Will of William Yarborough is very lengthy, but because of the land descriptions, I am going to type it off for you. If you found a deed from Joel to Wade, or a deed from Wade to someone that seemed to be selling the land described from William to Joel, then you'd certainly have a pretty positive lead.

I do know that Y's from that area of NC went to Georgia. One of my umpteen great uncles left Franklin Co and went to Georgia in the 1770's. It is just possible that the Wade L. in Warren County and the Wade L. in Georgia are the same person. Wade is another name not "common" in the Y lines.

Keep me posted!

Will of William Yarbrough

In the name of God Amen this Twenty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three I William Yarbrough of the County of Warren being at this time weak of body but of sound and disposing memory thanks be to almight God for the same but Calling to mind it being appointed for Man to die and not knowing how soon my change may come do Ordain this my last Will and Testament first resigning my soul into the hands of God that first gave it me Humbling hoping for Mercy and to be Received into the number of the blessed through Merrits and Intercessions of Jesus Christ the righteous and our redeemer and for my mortal Body I desire may be Committed to the Earth and Buried in Christian and decent manner at the discression of my Exers. hereafter to be named and as for my Worldly Estate the Elessed lord has been pleased to bestow upon me I will and desire in manner and form following first that my Just debts be honourable paid and funeral Expenses discharged.

I will that my Negroes with all my other Estate of every Kind Except such things as I shall hereafter particularly give away be kept together and remain as it now stands on my lands and plantations I now live on for the use of supporting maintaining and Educating my four children namely William, Joel, Rebecca & Huldah Yarbrough under the Care and direction of my Executors untill my son William shall arive to the age of Twenty one years then I Will that my Executors or either of them Chuse three good Reputable freeholders them thus Chosen shall value and appraise my Negroes and their Increase and all my other Estate and profits arrisieing which shall then be and my Exers. or either of them with the said freeholders shall alott one Equall sheare thereof in a fair manner to my son William with my other three Children Namely Joel, Rebecca & Hulda Yarbrough & such negroe or negroes and Other Estate thus allotted to my said son William. I then Give to him and his heirs - after my son William Receives his

share thus laid off to him I will that the Residue then remaining be still continued on together on my lands and plantation aforesaid for the use of supporting etc. on my three children namely Joel, Rebecca & Hulda Yarbrough in manner before mentioned untill my son Joel shall attain to the age of Twenty One then I give the whole residue Estate of Negroes and their Increase 8 other Estate and proffits arriseing which shall then be to be Equally divided Between them my son Joel, Rebecca & Hulda Yarbrough in the same manner as the division made for my son William such Estate thus divided & alloted them then I give each one of them such allotted negros and other Estate to them & their heirs in Case either of my before mentioned Children die before they arrive to the age of Twenty one years or have Lawfull Issue of their body then I will the surviving ones or one of them divide Equally amongst them such Estate of such one or ones of them so dieing. I give unto my beloved son William Yarbrough (when my Son Joel amount to the age of twenty one years) all my lands including my Plantation which I hold and possess on the north side of Mettons Creek Together with all that part of my lands on the south side of the said Creek including the following bounds to Wit -- Beginning on the said South side of Mettons Creek beginning at my bridge where my Path Crosses the same leading to Halifax road then runing along where the said Path as it directs to the said road untill it forks; thence along the left hand fork through Houses old field to the said road then a direct line Crossing the said road to the head of the lick Branch To a black Jack on corner between myself Joseph J. Williams then along the said William's line to Mettons Creek thence up to the Meadow of the said Creek to the beginning I give to my said son William my large gun to him and his heirs. In case my son William dies before he arrives to the age of twenty one years or Lawfull Issue of his body then in that Case I give my son Williams Lands devised to him to my son Joel

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and his heirs. I give unto my beloved son Joel Yarbrough (when he shall attain to the age of twenty one years) all the residue of land which I hold in Warren County on the south side Mettons Creek & not given to my son William. I also give my son Joel my small gun to him & his heirs. In case my son Joel dies before he arrives to the age of twenty one years or have Lawfull Isue of his then in that Case I give my son William the lands devised to my son Joel to him and his heirs. I give unto my beloved son Samuel Yarbrough my Negro whech Patt with her Increase at Present & future Increase (what Negroes I herebefore Possessed my said son Samuel with) to him and his heirs. I give unto my beloved Daughter Rhoda Yarbrough my Negroe girl Sarah with her future Increase one feather bed & furniture one side Saddle with one Cow & Calf to her and her heirs. I give unto my well beloved Grandson Edmond Harper my Negro girl Lucy and her Increase to him and his heirs. In case my said Grand son Edmond Harper should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one or have lawful isue of his body then I give the said Negroe Lucy and her Increase to be Equally amongst my then living Children and their heirs. I give unto my beloved Grand Daughter Nancy Persons my negroe Girl Winnah andher increase to her & her heirs. If my said Grand Daughter should die before she arrives to the age of Twenty one years or have Lawfull Isue of her body then I will the said Negroe Winnah & her Increase be Equally divided to and Amongst my then living Children & their heirs. (Karen's note - I have read this from a copy of the original entry in the deed book. The original entry in the Will Book where William bequests this land gives the name of the Creek in what looks like Metton's Creek. However, in the deed it is clearly Melton's Creek.)

Dear Brenda:

Charles Yarbro recently sent me your letter with the request that I assist you if I could. I am very short on time today, and hope you will forgive a very hastily written letter.

The best assistance I can give you is the address of Saundra Patterson. When you were checking the 1850 Census of Lumpkin Co., GA, you may have noticed that the other Y listed in Lumpkin Co. was a Wilson Yarbrough. Saundra is researching this Wilson Y. Working on the assumption that Y's who lived near each other were often related, we have done some work on Wade Yarbrough. By copy of this letter, I am requesting that Saundra share with you some of our findings. She is wonderfully organized, a thorough researcher and has her information on a computer and will not have to type you jumbled notes in the fashion that I will.

First a brief comment on the old style handwriting. Capital letters were written above the line and the letters "I", "J", L, T and S are often misread for each other. So far in the records we have found what looks like Wade S. Yarbrough, Wade J. Yarbrough and Wade L. Yarbrough. My personal opinion is that it is Wade J. Yarbrough and that he was named after a possible grandfather, Joel Yarbrough. Please note that this is my theory ... not a verified statement.

Saundra and I both believe that the Wade Y. in Lumpkin County, Ga is the same Wade Y. found in the Warren County, NC records a few years earlier. Saundra found two records that seem to prove this conclusively: Brenda Hall Page 2

North Carolina I Court of Pleas & Quarter Sess. Warren County I Feb Sess. 1846

Wade J. Yarborough having exhibited in this Court an authenticated copy of his appointment as guardian of Joel J. Yarborough (an infant residing in the State of Georgia) by the proper Court for that purpose in the said State of Georgia, and it further being shown to the Court that said guardian has given security in a sum sufficient to cover all the estate belonging to the said infant, it is thereupon ordered that the said Wade J. Yarborough be permitted to file the said copy of his appointment in this Court, and to take into his possession the property belonging to his said ward and remove it to the State of Georgia.

I have used the middle initial "J" in typing this document. In the old handwriting, it looks like S in some places, I in others and possibly J.

Riley are held and firmly bound unto the Honourable the Inferior Court seting as a Court of Ordinary for said County and their successors in office in the just and full sum of six hundred and ninty Six dollars and thirty four cents for the payment of which sum to the said justices as aforesaid and their successors in office We Bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severaly and firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this third day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty five the conditions of the above obligations is sutch that whereas the said Wade L. Yearborough is this day appointed guardian of Joel S Yarbrough infant. 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Note that the name Yarborough is spelled several different ways in this document. Also, it looks like Harison W. Riley the first time it is used but the signature looks more like Havison W. Ryley. This is copied exactly and doesn't make sense in a couple of places ... I think words have been missed .. it should said "unto the Honourable Justices of the Inferior

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Court, for example.

Joel does not appear on the 1850 census with Wade. I am wondering if the Joel J. Yarbrough was actually Joel Joseph Y ... Joseph Joel Y. was a common and given name in this family.

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So, here you can see that there is a definite connection of the Made Y. mentioned in the Warren County, NC records and the Wade Y. in the Lumpkin County records. It appears to be the same man in both records.

It appears that Wade Y. married first in Warren County, NC in 1835. His wife, Martha, must have died about the time of son Joseph's birth .. around 1840. Wade married the second time in Georgia.

Saundra and I have been trying to link Wade Y. up to his family in Warren County. I am going to mail you a copy of a letter I sent Saundra in August 1990 which contains about all the information I have. Saundra has continued the work in Warren County and I hope she will share with you. Maybe the two of you can help each other.

Please keep me posted on your research and let me know your results. Also, let me know if I can help.

Afterthought:

I note that I did not comment on D. W. Yarbrough and his wife Cynthia Blackstock. I do not have anything listed on either of them in my files. I note that he died in 1926 and she died in 1928. According to my Handy Book for Genealogists, Georgia has on file birth and death records since 1 January 1919. If I were you, I would write for the death certificates of D. W. and Cynthia. The death certificate should give you the names of the parents of each one. The address:

Division of Vital Statistics State Department of Public Health 1 Hunter St., S.W. Atlanta, GA 30303

Be sure you give them the county of death and the year of death for each.

I would also check the 1900 Census records for D. W. Yarbrough. The 1900 census is more detailed than earlier census records. It gives the month and year of birth for each person listed, how many years the people have been married, how many children were born to the couple and how many of them were living in 1900. You might find information there that will lead you to a descendant of your line who might have the family bible.

As for people naming their seventh son Doctor --- I have never heard that before and out of thousands of family groupsheets I have on file, do not have any 7th son named Doctor. I think this is probably an old wive's tale.

I am sending a copy of your letter and my reply to Ophelia Kessler who has a large collection of Y records. She may have something more to help you.

After looking through my records, I note that I do have a Dactor Yarbrough. His year of birth is too far off to be your man.

When I receive your groupsheets, I'll check the records again. It is possible that I have information on your line under the name of one of the children of this couple.

19: August 1990

Dear Saundra:

I am almost too embarrassed to write to you again. I often make typing errors, but I seldom send out an error as glaring as the one I sent you. I spent 6 hours yesterday reading NC documents looking for the Wade L. who married in 1802 in Warren County. I looked in all the counties around Warren County for Wade. I read wills and deeds trying to find any clue to his parents. Nothing.

Today I looked back at the marriage records ... only to find that I gave you the wrong date entirely. This Wade L. Yarborough married Martha J. Turner on 24 December 1835 ... not 1802. In scribbling to figure out what his age might have been if he was around 21 when he married, I came out with a birth era of around 1814. He could have been over 21, of course ... I used 21 as an average age. I then looked back through the marriage records to see who married early enough to have possibly have been Wade's parents and the first male Y in Warren County that I have a marriage date for is 1802.

I must have taken leave of my senses as for some reason I wrote down Wade's marriage as 1802 and sent us both on a wild goose chase! I really do apologize. Please throw that letter away and let's start over. I get so frustrated when I receive incorrect information like that and the level of frustration grows even higher when I discover I've mailed it out.

New discussion.

Wade L. Yarborough married Martha J. Turner 24 December 1835 in Warren County, N.C. William P. Sledge was the bondsman and E. D. Drake was the witness. I have now checked this date three times!

Now I wonder if the Warren County NC Wade might have been the Georgia Wade Y? I show Wade L. Yarborough marrying Elizabeth Ann Takersley in 1842 in Lumpkin County, Georgia. If the Warren County, NC Wade was about 21 when he married, and if he is the same Wade in Georgia, it would make him about 28 when he married in Georgia. This at least puts these two Wade Y's in the same generation.

Again looking at the marriage records ... if NC Wade was about 21 when he married and born ca 1814, it seems like his parents could have married anywhere from the late 1700's to the 1815 era as women seemed to have children for about 20 years.

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Page 2

Warren County was formed in 1779. The earliest marriage record I have is 1789 and that was an Elizabeth Yarborough who married Peterson Person. She was a daughter of William Yarborough. He does not name her in his 1793 will, but names a granddaughter Nancy Persons. Possibly Elizabeth had died before 1793. I have her sister's marriage in 1802, but the male marriages would be more what we need to find the father of Wade.

An Edward Yarbrough married Polly Mabry 29 Dec 1802. I have no history on this Edward and he doesn't seem to be in the Warren County records (deed or probate).

A Henry Yarbrough married Mary Parham Duke on 24 October 1812. This Henry died young. He had only two children at his death, a son William and a daughter Elizabeth. I believe a researcher of this line told me that Mary took the children and lived with her father, William Parham Duke, who died in Henry County, Tennessee. That is off the top of my head and I'd need to search the records to tell you the children were in Tennessee for sure.

The next: marriage I have after Henry is that of James Yarbrough and Margaret Coffman who married in 1823.

I've skipped one as I wanted to discuss it in more detail. Joel Yarbrough married Sally Sledge 12 Jun 1803. Wyatt Williams was the Bondsman and M. D. Johnson was the witness. This Joel is in the right age group to have been Wade Y's father. Notice that the Security for Wade L. Y's marriage bond was William P. Sledge. It makes me wonder if perhaps William Sledge was some relation to the Sally Sledge who married Joel?

As I mentioned, most of my Warren County records are earlier than the 1830's. I don't know if Wade is mentioned in later deed records. If there are records of him in NC past the 1840's, then he could not be the Wade L. Y. in Georgia. But, if he isn't in the records for those years ... he could well be the same Wade L. that appears in Georgia.

I do not have a list of Joel Y's children. My records only go to about 1814 and he is mentioned up to that date. A copy of his will or probate records might be worth ordering.

Joel's father was William Yarborough. Joel is mentioned in the Will. If you can prove that Wade L. was a son of Joel, I can take you back with verifying records at least three generations beyond William and have clues for you to follow to connect with Richard Yarborough, the immigrant Yarbrough who came to this country about 1635-40.

I spent about 6 hours yesterday abstracting Warren County records trying to find clues to the 1802 (GROAN) marriage of Wade. Because many of these include Joel, I am going to type them up for you. It will at least give you a starting place in Warren County. You need later records on Joel Y. than I have.

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Page 3

I am still betting that the Wilson Y. and Wade Y. in Georgia are closely related. Wouldn't it be a find if Joel's will named them both as sons?

Of course, you may not think this a good lead to follow up. However, if you do any research on the records in Warren County for later years than I have, I'd appreciate having copies for my files. At the time I was searching, my time was so limited that I stuck only to the years when I knew my direct line was there.

Regarding the Elam Y you found in Carroll County, Tennessee ... He married 20 August 1819 in Wake County, NC to Jane Barham. Wake County is in the same NC area as Warren and Franklin County. I am guessing, but if Elam and Jane were married in Wake County, that is probably where their children were born.

I checked the Harrison History I have and none of the names you listed are given in it. It deals primarily with the line of Andrew Harrison/ Thomas Harrison. It is a fairly short history (about 10 legal sized pages) and doesn't go into the branches.

I've been pondering the name "Wilson" Yarbrough. It isn't one of the "common" given Y names. I am wondering if perhaps it came from a maternal side of the family. The Wilson family lived near the Y's in Virginia and in NC. I have a Wilson line and I've found the Y's & Wilsons seemed to travel together from Virginia to NC, NC to Tennessee and from Tennessee to Missouri. It seems that half my lines married into the Wilson family. I've noticed that there are dozens of cases where the wife's maiden name became the first name of one of the sons. Just a random thought.

I am going to stop now and type of the abstracts of Warren County for you. Again, I apologize for the wild goose chase I've sent you on. Maybe it will lead to something yet.

The Will of William Yarborough is very lengthy, but because of the land descriptions, I am going to type it off for you. If you found a deed from Joel to Wade, or a deed from Wade to someone that seemed to be selling the land described from William to Joel, then you'd certainly have a pretty positive lead.

I do know that Y's from that area of NC went to Georgia. One of my umpteen great uncles left Franklin Co and went to Georgia in the 1770's. It is just possible that the Wade L. in Warren County and the Wade L. in Georgia are the same person. Wade is another name not "common" in the Y lines.

Keep me posted!

William Yarbrough Sr. was born on 4 January 1774 in North Carolina. He was in Greenville, South Carolina for the 1800 and 1810 censuses¹. Family records² of Wade Hampton Yarbrough, b. 1809, give his mother's name as Martha³, so Martha was the wife in the 1810 census. Martha was born in South Carolina on 22 March 1780, so she could also be the wife in the 1800 census⁴. The last location we have for William and Martha Yarbrough is in the 1850 census of Gibson County, Tennessee where they are living next to William Lewis and Mahulda Yarbrough Sanders, between the towns of Milan and Trenton, not far from the Rutherford Fork of the Obion River.

The children of this William Yarbrough Sr. have been enumerated, (with errors) by Mrs. Ida Walling, dcd., of McMinnville, TN. Some independent proof exists for three sons of William Yarbrough Sr.: In a Power-of-Attorney, William Yarbrough named his son James of Hardeman County. Then, in a letter from James' son Newton to Benjamin, Hampton and Benjamin are referred to as uncles of his. Newton also mentioned Reuben Yarbrough, but did not indicate his relationship. There is circumstantial evidence that Jephtha, William Jr., Susanna Jane, Mahulda and George P. were children of William Sr.. Sarah Yarbrough Howard has been taken as a daughter of William because of Ida Walling's descent from her. There are no known public records connecting Sarah to the family, but the Greenville SC connection can be taken as evidence.

Numbering of generations is by Roman numeral, and family group placement is by Arabic numeral, except unknown family group placement is a question mark. The earliest known ancestors of the Yarbrough-Davis researchers are Conrad and Sarah Davis. Three children of William Yarbrough Sr. married great grandchildren of Conrad and Sarah Davis. These great-grandchildren are in the fourth generation, so William and Martha are placed in the third generation.

2. The family bible of Felix Grundy Yarbrough was copied by several of his children and passed on to his grandchildren, some of whom are living in 1992. The bible itself may have been lost, but might yet turn up.

4. Mrs Ida Walling, a descendant of Sarah Yarbrough Howard, claimed that William Yarbrough, Sr. married only Rachel Shelby. There is no supporting evidence that he married her at all, but it has not been disproven. Genealogists of the Shelby family have decided to drop this claim from their records, as it was only supplied by Mrs. Walling. Mrs. Walling also claimed that Rachel was buried next to William Yarbrough, Sr. in a cemetery near Toone, Hardeman County, Tennessee. However, William Yarbrough's wife was Martha from before 1810 and up to 1850, so it is unbelievable that Rachel Shelby could be buried next to William. Mrs. Walling claimed she received this information from Franklin Pierce Yarbrough, a grandson of William Yarbrough, Sr. She may have misconstrued the given information.

The following list is in close agreement with the census information.

The William and Martha Yarbrough family left Greenville, South Carolina, around 1818, going first to Overton County, Tennessee where on 15 April 1820, William Yarbrough sold two Negro girls to Sterling Harris of Jackson Co. Tennessee⁵. A William Yarbro is in the 1820 Census of Overton County, TN⁶, with a family listing corresponding to known ages of most children, except that Hampton is listed as under 10, when he would become 11 that year, but may have been 10 at the time of the census.

A William Yarbrough purchased a land grant in White County in 1812, but there is no tax list evidence that he occupied that land. William Yarbrough Sr. first appears on tax lists in 1824, and he bought and sold real estate in White County between 1824 and 1848. He had several properties on Calfkiller Creek and elsewhere near Sparta, and lived in White County from about 1823 through 1835. On 26 Feb 1828 William Yarbrough sold 90 Acres in White County to Reuben Yarbrough, witnessed by George Yarbrough⁷. In 1836 William Yarbrough Sr. gave Power of Attorney to Jeptha Yarbrough to sell property to Thomas Gibbons. Then in 1837 William Yarbrough Sr. gave Power of Attorney to his son Hampton to sell further land. His sons Jephtha, William Jr., James and Hampton also held land in White County. William Sr.'s last land transaction in White County was to legally transfer 12 acres to John Porter Howard. Susanna Jane Yarbrough married John Porter Howard in 1829, and they lived out their lives in White County. The oldest daughter of William Yarbrough Sr., Sarah Yarbrough, married Robert Charles Howard in Greenville, South Carolina, but came

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to White County Tennessee in what was apparently a large migration which included this Yarbrough family, J. Pennington's family, several Wallings and other Howards.

By letter, Brother William Yarbrough and Sister Martha Yarbrough were received into the Church at Mill Creek, Hardeman County, in August of 1842. They are believed to be the Wm Yarbough family on page 211 of the 1840 census of Gibson County⁸, where the census taker has slipped one column in the female tally. On the same page is a Wm Yarbey family, which is thought to be that of William Yarbrough Jr.. In the 1850's William Yarbrough Sr. sold land in White County to sons William Jr. and George P. Yarbrough, but we don't know when William Sr. obtained these lands or if he ever lived in Hardeman County. In 1846 William Yarbrough Sr. bought 133 3/4 acres near Rutherford along the Rutherford Fork of the Obion River in Gibson County. He sold this land to his son James in 1854, the year that Martha died. In the 1850 census of Gibson County William and Martha Yarbrough are living next to Lewis and Mahulda Sanders⁹, their youngest daughter, between Trent and Milan. It is not known where William and Martha died. Lewis Sanders died in 1851 and Mahulda remarried, James died soon after Martha, so the nearest remaining relative that William could have lived with would have been son Benjamin, who is listed as living in the town of Gibson, not far from the Sanders' place. There is a possibility that both William Yarbrough Sr. and Martha Yarbrough are buried in the Sanders Cemetery in Gibson County, perhaps in the part that is now covered by a pond.

IV.1. SARAH YARBROUGH HOWARD PENNINGTON

Sarah Yarbrough's descendant Ida G. Walling of McMinnville, TN (deceased) claimed that William Yarbrough Sr. and his wife Rachel Shelby Yarbrough are buried in the William Yarbrough Jr. cemetery near the town of Toone in Hardeman County, TN, and that William Yarbrough Sr. ended his days living with William Yarbrough Jr.'s family. We Know that Ida Walling is wrong about Rachel Shelby being William Yarbrough Sr.'s wife in Tennessee, and there is no other confirmation that William Yarbrough Sr. is buried in that cemetery, so Ida Walling may have been mistaken in that fact as well. She claimed that Franklin Pierce Yarbrough gave her that information, but she didn't make it public until after he had died. Ida Walling had obtained D.A.R. membership on the basis of Revolutionary War Service of William Yarbrough Sr., who was born in 1774 and certainly did not serve in a war that ended when he was 6 years old. The D.A.R. has disallowed this service, as it belongs to a different William Yarbrough (d. 1793). da Walling had a Revolutionary War headstone placed in the cemetery near Topne, with Williams birth listed as in 1766. This headstone should be removed, as it was obtained and placed there under false claims.

Mrs. Ida G. Walling disseminated information concerning her Yarbrough ancestors containing many errors. All claims by her must be verified by independent sources. The following is a compilation of Ida Walling's published information. Verified errors are underlined. Other probable errors can be

Letters, Ida G. (Mrs Alonzo Nelson) Walling, "Rebel Hill," McMinnville, Warren County, Tennessee, to C.K. Shelby.

(a) Aug. 2, 1932,-

My great-grandmother was Sarah Yarbrough, born in North Carolina about 1793 and died in 1882, Her mother was a Shelby. Sarah married Robert Charles Howard (b. Charleston, S.C.) about 1812. Their oldest daughter Minerva was born in 1813. My grandmother, Mahala Howard, another daughter was born in Greenville, South Carolina, December 1815. She married a Walling.

There were Yarbroughs in Charlotte, North Carolina, also. A Raleigh genealogist told me that Moses's sixth child, Margaret, was born in 1772. I found a William Yarbrough and Robert C. Howard were granted land in White County, Tennessee, in 1824. I know that my Shelby-Yarbrough lived in Sparta in that county in the early twenties and that they moved to what was then called the "Western Districts" about 1830. South Carolina had no marriage license law until 1911. I am trying to find out the identity of the parents of the above Sarah Yarbrough.

(b) Jun. 5, 1933

I have at last found my Shelby connection. Goodspeed's History of Obion County, Tennessee, mentions a Jepsy (Jeptha) Yarbrough, son of William, a pioneer of Hardeman County, and on inquiry I learned of a Mr. F.P. Yarbrough at Toone, an undertaker, now eighty-six years old. He is a grandson of William Yarbrough, Sr., and wife Rachel Shelby, daughter of Moses Shelby. They died in the home of his father, who was William Yarbrough Jr., she in 1855 (ae abt. 81) and he in 1859 (ar 93).

The children of William and Rachel (Shelby) Yarbrough, the first five born on Dutch Buffalo creek in North Carolina, were: Sarah, b. 1792 (my gt-grandmother), m. Robert Charles Howard; Benjamin (killed in battle?); Hulda, m. ---- Sanders; Jeptha, m. Lavina Isham; William Jr. b. 1804m m. 1. Gibbons, m2. Hannah Davis; George, m. Celia Davis, Hannah's sister; Hampton; Susannah, b. 1812, m. Jack Howard.

William Yarbrough, Sr., was from Halifax County and served from that district in the Revolution under Captain Brinkley and was a captain in the War of 1812, living then in Nashville, Tennessee. He removed in 1824 to White County.

It was in White county that my grandmother, Mahala Howard, married Hiram Kilgore Walling. After 1830 the Yarbroughs lived in Hardin County.

William and Rachel are buried two and a half miles north of Toone, Hardeman County, in the Yarbrough graveyard. I happen to be Presbyterian.

(c) July 3, 1933,-

When I was ten years old (am now forty-five) a young lady in Evansville, Indiana, where I lived, married a man (from Ohio, I

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think) named Frank Chapline. I was then living with my Father's sister, Mother having died when I was fifteen months old. Father often came to see me and I remember my auntie telling me on one occasion about Sadie Bennett's marriage, at which he remarked, "Some of Mother's people were Chaplines." Now, do you suppose that Moses's wife was Isabella Chapline, either a daughter or sister of Joseph?

I am waiting for a blank to fill in requesting a government marker for the Revolutionary soldier, William Yarbrough. Neither his nor Rachel's grave is marked, but old Mr. Yarbrough knows exactly where they lie, for he "cleans off the graves" every year. The old gentleman wrote that Rachel had dark eyes and hair; but that the Yarbroughs were fair.

note: The following is quoted from a booklet on the Yarbroughs that Pauline Gray found in the Mormon Library in Salt Lake City. Unfortunately she did not copy the title page. However, by comparing ages of Mrs. Walling to other information, it appears to have been written about 1954.

(This from Mrs. Ida G. Walling of "Rebel Hill" McMinnville, Tennessee.)

"I do not have a great deal of Yarbrough data. Some years ago a woman from Iowa came to see me, got from me the Yarbrough Coat-of-Arms, and went on to N.C. to visit some Yarboroughs, and came back with most fantastic deductions. Somewhere in the attic I may still have her letters, but while she had lots of odds and ends, there was no proof of lines. I have only a few dates and got them from an old man at Toone, Hardeman Co., Tennessee, where William is buried.

South Carolina had no marriage license records until 1911, so wills are the only proof, and the Yarboroughs must have all been poor. I do not leave my D.A.R. ancestor papers open to the public, because I like to know who wants to use them and why. I will, however, give you an outline.

"I am a daughter of Felix Grundy Walling, born in 1839. I was a Walling before I married a distant cousin, Alonzo Nelson Walling, who died in 1947. I am 66 years old and teaching my last year. Felix Grundy Walling's mother was Mahala Howard, who married Hiram Kilgore Walling. She was the daughter of Sarah Yarbrough and Robert Charles Howard, who was born in 1796 and died in 1883. Mahala was borne in Greenville, Green Co., S.C., Dec 24, 1815, died March 21, 1876. (This is an error, as there is no Greene Co., in S.C.)

Sarah Yarborough, born 1796, was daughter of Rachel Shelby, born 1776, died 1855. She married William Yarbrough in 1792. Rachel was a daughter of Moses and wife, Isabella. William Yarbrough was the son of Manoah Yarbrough, born 1766 and died March 20, 1859. William Yarborough, born in N.C. 1766, died Hardeman Co., Tenn., March 20, 1859. Residence during Revolution was Halifax Co., N.C. (from affidavits of Henry Jones Cabitt, Wisconsin, and Franklin P. Yarbrough, Toome, Tennessee.) Service - Pvt. soldier Wm. Brinkley's Co., N.C. Col. Samuel Jarvis, 1st. N.C. Regiment, Halifax District. (N.C. Roster, p. 623)

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Children of William Yarborough and Rachel Shelby: Sarah m. Robert C. Howard and Joshua Pennington; Benjamin, Hampton, Jeptha m. Lavinia Isham, William m. Gibbons and Hannah Davis, George, Hulda m. Sanders, John m. Cath Davis, Susanna, b. 1/9/1812, m. Jack Howard 1/1/1829, Reuben.

William Yarborough moved to White Co., Tenn., then to what was called Western District, and is now Hardeman Co., Tenn. I suppose he got land for Revolutionary service.

note: The following is from Yarbrough-Yarborough and Allied Families, a Quarterly by Nelle Morris Jenkins, Volume 1 pages 82 and 83. The direct author is Mrs. Jenkins. The year of publication is 1961, so Mrs. Walling would be then about 73 years old. RBY

There is another mention of the name Jeptha Yarborough. A letter to me from Mrs. Walling of McMinnville, Tenn., states that hi she is the daughter of Mahala Howard Walling, whose mother was daughter of Sarah Yarborough and Robert C. Howard. This Sarah was born in 1796, was the daughter of Rachel Shelby born 1776. Rachel Shelby married William Yarborough born 1766, died 20 March 1859 the son of Manoah Yarborough. (This Manoah was the brother of Zachariah who was the father of my Manoah and of the Henry Yarbrough who went to Tipton, Co., Tenn.)Mrs. Walling said that her William Yarborcugh lived in Halifax District County, N.C. during the Revolution and upon the affidavit of several, among whom was Franklin P. Yarborough., he was given a pension. William Yarborough moved to White County, Tenn., then to Hardeman County, (then called Western Dist. William and Rachel (Shelby) had 10 children: Sarah, Benjamin, Hampton, Jeptha, William, George, Hulda, John, Susanna, Reuben. Mrs. Walling said that William Yarborough is buried in Toome, Hardeman County, Tenn. (To Dorothy Svec:) Mrs. Walling is an ex-school teacher and paints. She does nice work painting the Yarborough Coat of Arms, in case you would like to contact her, her address is Mrs. Ida Walling, Rebel Hill, McMinnville, Tenn. I have not heard from her for several years, but I presume she is yet living.

... William Yarbrough who married Rachel Shelby (both born 1766) and he died in Hardeman County, Tenn., 1859 was a son of Manoah who went to Georgia so he was a first cousin of my Manoah. This William was a Rev. soldier and lived in Halifax County, N.C. during the Revolution. He received his pension on affidavit of Franklin P. Yarborough of Toome, Tenn. William and Rachel Yarborough had a son Reuben who was perhaps the youngest. Other children were Benjamin, Hampton, Jeptha who married Lavinia Isham, William who married (1) a Gibbons and (2) a Davis, George, Hulda, John, Susannah and the (hte above) Reuben. Mrs. Walling of McMinnville, Tenn. Sent this to me - she is descended from ...

Shelby genealogical researchers have disallowed the claim that William Yarbrough married Rachel Shelby until independent verification can be ob-

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tained. Ida Walling is their only source of that information. They are aware that William Yarbrough was married to Martha throughout his life in Tennessee.

A Helen W. Tomlinson of Brunsville, MN compiled an undated Family Group sheet which Karen Mazock sent to Melba Tullos and Karen Lambert. This deals with the family of Robert Charles Howard and Sarah Yarbrough. It says Howard b. 1789 in Charleston SC., married Sarah in Greenville, Greenville Co, SC in 1812, died 19 May 1867 in Mineral Point, Iowa Co, MN. Sarah and Robert Charles Howard were divorced and he went to Wisconsin, changing his name to Hoard. Sarah Yarbrough Howard married Joshua Pennington after the 1840 census, and they moved to Warren County, Tennessee before 1860.

The information on Sarah is obviously tainted by Ida Walling, indicating birth in NC ca 1893 with parents of William Yarbrough and Rachel Shelby. Under places of residence are NC, Greenville SC, Sparta TN, Spencer TN, MO. Her death place is listed as Sedalia, Pettis Co MO in Apr 1883. It has the two oldest daughters born in Greenville in 1813 and 1815, and showing the eldest, Minerva, going to Minnesota with Hoard after marrying Warrington Jones in 1830, probably in Sparta TN. In a note: Hoard was in Mineral Point Wisconsin by 1828. Sarah divorced Robert Charles Howard and lived with daughter Mahala Walling on the Daniel Walling Estate on Spencer Mt. in Van Buren Co TN. There are 5 children listed on the sheet, and another sheet has a sixth. The children of Robert Charles Howard and Sarah Yarbrough are:

The fact that Martha's son is named Shelby Walling may have been the source of Ida Walling's notion that she was descended from a Shelby. Perhaps the Wallings were so descended.

IV.3. JEPTHA YARBROUGH

Jephtha Yarbrough first appears in White County, TN in the 1828 Tax List 85 1/2 acres of school land and 30 acres of other land. The same are listed for him in 1829. In the 1830 census of White County, TN he is listed with another adult male in his age range, a female in the same range, and a daughter under 5 years old. From later censuses Jeptha was born in 1800/1801, his wife is Levinia (Isham) and they have eight listed children¹⁰. As Jeptha acted as attorney in White County for William Yarbrough and James Yarbrough in 1835, and is listed in the 1840 Hardeman County Census, he came to Hardeman County

He appears to be the second of this Yarbrough family to settle in Hardeman County, and he remained there the rest of his life. Jeptha Yarbrough sold land in Hardeman Co. in 1849 and 1850, and a Jeptha Yarbrough¹¹ bought property in 1853 and 1858 in Hardeman County. The Estate of Jeptha Yarbrough sold land in 1872 to W.H. Yarbrough, so our Jeptha Yarbrough died shortly before then. A J.W. Yarbrough bought and sold 109 acres in 1859, and a W.J. Yarbrough bought property in 1873.

HARDEMAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE FAMILY OF JEPTHA AND LAVENIA ISHAM YARBROUGH By Karen Lambert

William Yarbrough I and Rachel Shelby had several children who lived in Hardeman County, Tennessee, where William I is buried. Jeptha Yarbrough and William A Yarbrough (II) settled in that county and their descendants remain there today. Jeptha was born around 1801 in North Carolina. He is found in White County in Capt. Malory's Company or District in 1828, and Bradford's Company in 1835 on tax lists. Jeptha Yarbrough sold property in Hardeman County Tennessee in 1849 and 1850. There is no record of the acquisition of this property in Hardeman County's Deed Books. He bought land in 1853 and 1858 in Hardeman County. His heirs sold land in 1872.

Jeptha Yarbrough married Lavenia Isham who was born in 1805. Jeptha and Lavenia are buried in an old cemetery on the farm of A.E. Smith Jr. near Toone, Tennessee. Her headstone is broken into several pieces but the date of birth is readable. Only a footstone remains for J.Y.. Lavenia and Jeptha had eight children (U.S. Census, 1860):

W.I. Yarbrough is buried in the cemetery with Jeptha and Lavenia, and this may be their son William. William Ira Yarbrough is listed on the Hardeman County Tenn. Confederate Pension List, naming his wife as Lucretia. A William H. Yarbrough married Catherine Davis in the Hardeman County Marriage Records, and W. H. Yarbrough purchased the land from the Jeptha Yarbrough heirs in 1872. Probably Wm. H. is not Jeptha's son William Ira Yarbrough, but could be another relative of Jeptha's.

Gibson County and various information from researchers have been used to construct the family of Jeptha and Lavinia Yarbrough. Neither the name Horace nor the information on twins is in the 1860 Census Index, and most of the marriages are uncertain. If Hampton's name is Wade Hampton, after his uncle, then he would be the person who bought the property after Jeptha died.

IV.4. WILLIAM YARBROUGH, Jr.

William Yarbrough Jr. is first found in the White County Tax lists in 1828, but has not been found in the 1830 census there. The William Yarbrough Jr. family was probably in the Gibson County, Tennessee, census in 1840, and first appear in the Hardeman County census in 1850. They settled near Toone. William had married Hannah Davis, a daughter of Augustus Parks Davis, who was listed with the William Yarbrough Jr. family along with his youngest children in the 1850 census¹². Augustus' property was East and next to that of William Yarbrough Jr..

HARDEMAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE FAMILY OF WILLIAM YARBROUGH AND HANNAH ADA DAVIS by Karen Lambert

William Yarbrough I had another son, William (II), who lived in Hardeman County. There is a Wm Yarbro in Overton County TN in the 1820 Census and on the tax list of that county in 1823. He was in White County TN in the later 1820's and in the 1830 Census. There were two William Yarbroughs listed in the 1840 census in Gibson county TN that fit the ages and family ages for William I and William II. William II bought 175 acres in Hardeman County from his father in 1852. There was no record of this land through 1874.

According to a bible record transcribed by Rebecca Watson, a descendant of William Yarbrough II (this bible was in the possession of another descendant and has since been destroyed). William Yarbrough married Hannah Ada Davis on 2/25/1836. Hannah was born 6/18/1814 and died 5/15/1864. However Mrs. Watkins says the page this was on was very hard to read and this may have been 1884. Hannah was living in the later census records, so probably the correct date is 6/16/1884. Another transcription of the same bible record listed Martha Martella as one of the children, but this child was not included on Mrs. Watson's bible record. William and

IV.5. JAMES YARBROUGH

Several children of William Yarbrough Sr. settled in Hardeman County, Tennessee. James Yarbrough, whom William identified as his son and as living in Hardeman County in a letter granting James Power of Attorney on 27 Oct 1835, was probably the first of this Yarbrough family to settle there. James bought the property of Peter Howard at a Sheriffs' Sale in White County in 1829. On 9 Nov 1835 James gave Jeptha Yarbrough Power of Attorney to convey 53 1/2 acres to Thomas Gibbons in White County, which indicates he preceded Jeptha to Hardeman County. James Yarbrough received a land grant in Hardeman County in 1836. He sold Hardeman property in 1838 to John L. Weed and in 1847 to H.L. Doyle, and he moved to Gibson County, Tennessee, before the 1850 census. In Gibson County in 1838 James bought 640 acres from Lewis Sander, which he later sold to East Tennessee College¹³. In 1854 James purchased 1333/4 Acres in Gibson County from William Yarbrough. James was the original executor of Lewis Sanders' estate, and had guaranteed Benjamin Yarbrough's guardianship of the minor children of Lewis and Mahulda Sanders. James moved to Henry County, Tennessee about 1855, and died there in early 1856. In his letter of 12 Feb 1855 to uncle Benjamin Yarbrough, James' son Newton mentions his father's health and urges Ben to come visit him in the spring. Newton says to send his letters to massadonia, (Macedonia?) Carroll County, which must be the nearest post office. In this same letter he mentions a letter from uncle Hampton saying they have bought land in Missouri. Wade Hampton Yarbrough is known to have purchased 120 acres near Columbus, Jackson Township of Johnson County, Missouri on 1 Dec 1854.

Newton R. Yarbrough signed an affidavit on 11 July 1852 attesting Rebecca A. Yarbrough was resident in Gibson County, and so eligible to marry James Davis in that county. Rebecca Armstrong is in the James Yarbrough family in the 1850 Gibson County census. Possibly this James Davis is a son of Augustus Parks Davis. James Yarbrough had another son, William who was 14 in the 1850 census. It is possible that this is the William H. Yarbrough who married Catherine Davis, youngest daughter of Augustus Parks Davis. A William H. Yarbrough witnessed the sale of property by William Yarbrough Sr. to William Yarbrough Jr. in 1851, and it is questionable that a 15 year old boy could witness a deed. In the 1840 Hardeman County census of James Yarbrough lists

JAMES YARBROUGH (W. James Yarbrough) by Wanda Johnson

James Yarbrough was born around 1806 in South Carolina. He was a son of William and Martha Yarbrough and a brother to Benjamin Yarbrough. His wife was Martha who was born around 1801 in Virginia.

James Yarbrough, Benjamin Yarbrough and several other men were named as administrators of the Lewis Sanders estate in 1852. James served in that capacity until 1854 when Benjamin took over the duties.

Probably in January of 1855 James, Martha, N.R. and Eurilda moved from Gibson County to Henry County, TN. (N.R., R.N. and Newton R. are used at various times. I believe these all refer to the same person). At least two older children remained in Gibson County¹⁴: Rebecca Yarbrough Davis who married James Davis, and possibly an older son.

James Yarbrough purchased 124 3/4 acres on 14 March 1855 in Henry County, TN. which was recorded 24 July 1855. On March 14, 1856, an inventory of the estate of James Yarbrough was submitted to the clerk. Administrator was N.R. Yarbrough. None of the names at the sale were familiar except Martha, N.R. and William Yarbrough (possibly the older child). An inventory of notes held by James Yarbrough was also submitted. Some of these date to 1835, but no county is given, and the names are very unclear.

Newton R. Yarbrough married Mary F. Anderson 12 December 1865 in Carroll County, TN. Eurilda Yarbrough married Lafayette Young on 22 November 1860 in Henry County. According the 1880 census of Henry County TN, 9th Civil District, Eurilda is listed as Childers, obviously a second marriage.

N.R./R.N. Yarbrough's will was dated 15 November 1911 and recorded in Henry County court Minutes 31 March 1925. "I give, devise, bequeath unto my son, James N. Yarbrough his heirs and assigns of State and County above said who now resides with me my entire farm on which I live." This being the same 124 3/4 acres purchased by James Yarbrough in 1855. He named one Grandson, William Gilbert Yarbrough, to whom he gave \$10.00. The remainder was given to James N. No other children or heirs were listed.

James N. Yarbrough, 2/29/1876 - 3/3/1933, is buried in the Shiloh Church Cemetery in Carroll County, TN, just a few miles from the Henry County line. No other Yarbroughs are listed as buried there, but it is an old cemetery with many unmarked graves. The Yarbrough stone appears to not be in the correct position according to the stones around it.

No other descendants have been found at this point.

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IV.6. WADE HAMPTON YARBROUGH

Wade Hampton Yarbrough was born April 21, 1809 in Greeneville County, South Carolina. His parents were William and Martha Yarbrough¹⁵. Wade Hampton Yarbrough married Mary M. Davis in Sparta Tennessee about 1830, and carried on the business of farming several pieces of property there until about 1841¹⁶.

Mary M. Davis was a daughter of Jonathan C. Davis. She was born in Sparta, White County, Tennessee on 28 August 1814¹⁷. In 1840 they were living next to Jonathan C. Davis¹⁸ near Rock Island. In 1841 Hampton Yarbrough and Owen Bates sold their (jointly owned) land, originally a grant to Jonathan C. Davis. Then these Yarbroughs and some relatives of Mary M. Davis Yarbrough went to Dade County, Missouri, where Wade Hampton Yarbrough pursued the trade of shoemaker and Saddler. In the 1850 census of Dade Co MO we find Owen Bates¹⁹ who was probably Mary's brother-in-law. They were in Lawrence Co MO for the 1850 census²⁰.

Lawrence County was organized from parts of Dade and Barry Counties on Feb 14, 1845, so this Yarbrough family and that of Mary's cousin Maxwell Davis²¹ were among the earliest inhabitants of the newly established town of Mount Vernon, which was laid out also in 1845. In 1848 Wade Hampton Yarbrough was in a partnership with Rufus M. Elsey, a saddler, in purchasing a shop on a small lot in Mount Vernon²². The next year Wade Hampton Yarbrough bought Rufus out²³ and in 1850 sold it to John S. Williams²⁴.

Wade Hampton and Mary M.Yarbrough went to Johnson County, Missouri, purchasing property near the town of Columbus in Jackson township to take up farming, just over the LaFayette County line, from where Rufus M. Elsey is

found in the 1850 census. Hampton's property had two parcels, one of 40 and the other 80 acres. It was purchased for \$200 from Samuel and Lucretia Cornett on 1 Dec 1854²⁵.

Wade Hampton Yarbrough's family is in Johnson County MO for the 1860 census²⁶.

In January of 1862 the worst in Johnson County of the violence of the war between the states took place. Union soldiers from Kansas (Jayhawkers) who had lost some of their number in an ambush in western Johnson County returned to wreak vengeance on South sympathizers. This Jayhawk regiment robbed and burned about forty homes in the south-west part of the county. Jayhawk troops were then sent to the Columbus area, but were tricked by the towns people into an ambush where 5 Kansans were killed and many more wounded. In retaliation, Columbus was burned along with surrounding area homes of some 50 Southern sympathizers²⁷. Two of Wade Hampton Yarbrough's sons and two future sons-inlaw somehow ended up in Union uniforms, in spite of the fact that they were all Southerners by birth.

In 1864 Wade Hampton and Mary M. Yarbrough sold their Johnson County property to son Felix Grundy for 700^{28} , but they remained on the tax lists through 1867. They are found in the 1870 census of Bourbon County²⁹, where they remained for about two years, moving on to Cowley County around 1871. They are in Richland Township of Cowley County in the 1880 census.Crockett, their oldest son had gone to Sonoma County, California, but the three remaining sons and two daughters are also in Cowley Co, KS at that time. Their oldest daughter has settled in Labette Co, KS.

IV.7. SUSANNA JANE YARBROUGH HOWARD

Susanna Jane Yarbrough was born in South Carolina, presumably in Greenville, on 19 January 1812, and died 16 Dec 1853 in Sparta, White County, TN. She married John Porter Howard on 1 January 1829. Robert J. Howard of Morrison TN in 1989 wrote that John Porter Howard and Susanna Jane Yarbrough were both born in Greenville SC, and that in White county they obtained a land grant³⁰ of 640 acres. William Yarbrough Sr.'s last land transaction in White County was on 10 Oct 1848 to legally transfer 12 acres to John Porter Howard.

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IV.8. MAHULDA YARBROUGH SANDERS MATHIS

Mahulda Yarbrough probably met William Lewis Sanders in Gibson County after the Yarbroughs moved there from White County. There is no record of Sanders in White County. The first recorded contact of a Yarbrough with Lewis Sanders is in 1838 in Gibson County TN, when James Yarbrough purchased 640 acres from a Lewis Sander. However, the oldest son of Lewis and Mahulda is William Lewis Sanders Jr., who was born about 1836, so Mahulda and Lewis Sanders were married in 1835 or earlier. As William Yarbrough Sr. is still on the tax lists in White County as late as 1832, it is unlikely that the Yarbroughs went to Gibson County before about 1833. Both William Yarbrough Sr. and James Yarbrough gave Power-of-attorney to Jeptha in 1835, indicating they were already gone from White County at that time. So, in all likelihood,

30. A Land Grant was the initial establishment of property ownership and was available by application to settlers in new territory. Land grants associated with military service were usually issued to cover arrears in pay to the serviceman. Land Grants may have involved some cost, but in many cases they were free to encourage people to settle new territories. William Lewis Sanders and Mahulda Yarbrough were married in 1834 or 1835. In the 1840 census, William and Martha Yarbrough are near the town of Rutherford, which is about 10 miles north-west of the Sanders place. In the 1850 census they are in the next dwelling from the Sanders.

Wanda Johnson wrote that William Lewis Sanders was born 1 January 1772 in South Carolina, where he was appointed constable for Union County in 1796; that he is in the 1800 Union Co SC census and in the 1810 and 1820 censuses of Chester Co SC.; that there is an L. Saunders in the 1830 census of Chester Co SC who may be Lewis Sanders; and that Lewis Sanders first appears on the Tax List of Gibson Co TN in 1836. Note that in the 1850 Gibson Co TN Census, his name is Lewis Saunders. As Lewis Sanders died on 1 September 1852, the 1850 census shows all of the known children of Lewis and Mahulda Sanders³¹.

After Lewis Sanders' death, both James Yarbrough and Benjamin Yarbrough served as executor of Lewis Sanders' estate. In the inventory of notes and accounts of Lewis Sanders (4 Feb 1853?) there are two notes of particular interest. One is a note for payment of articles purchased at the estate sale which is for \$55.50 cosigned by William Yarbrough and Mahulda Sanders. The other is an old note on Joseph H? Yarbrough, due 5 Jan 1845, for twelve dollars, with the words in solvent and dead. This may be James Yarbrough's missing son who was in the same age range as Newton in the 1840 Hardeman Co TN census. There is almost overwhelming circumstantial evidence that Mahulda is a sister of James and Benjamin and a daughter of William and Martha Yarbrough.

Mahulda married Elisha Mathis in 1853, and is not found in Gibson County until on 24 Feb 1880 she signed a Quit-Claim in favor of Lafayette Sanders, her son.

Mahulda Yarbrough was born 17 September 1817. She probably married William Lewis Sanders in 1831. Actual date and location are unknown. She is probably the daughter of William and Martha Yarbrough. They were living next door, or very close to, Mahulda in both the 1840 and 1850 Gibson Co TN Censuses. James and Benjamin were administrators of the estate of her husband, Lewis Sanders.

Four children were born to Mahulda Sanders: William Lewis, George Washington, Martha H., Pernelia, and James Lafayette.

The census records say Mahulda was born in SC, but the <u>family</u> says "9 miles from Sparta, White County, TN". Larry Morris has this figured out:

Census Taker: "Mrs. Sanders, where were you born?"

Mahulda: "I was born in SC."

Grandchild: "Grandmaw, where were you raised?"

Mahulda: "White County, 9 miles from Sparta, TN."

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Probably any variation of this scenario will produce the same results, especially if Mahulda was born in SC and moved soon afterward to TN. There is another remote possibility, but for now I am going with SC.

The census records say she cold not read or write, yet the family has a small handbook of poems that belonged to her. This book also contains the name "John Pennington", and Mahulda's and Lewis Sanders' birthdates. The letter that accompanied her application for widow's pension is signed, but not with an X.

In 1853, Mahulda married Elisha Mathis. It has not been established where she spent the next 20 years. As far as we know, there were no children from this marriage. On 20 March 1878, Mathis applied for a pension on service during the war of 1812. It was rejected. He was 80 years old and a resident of Henderson, Texas.

Elisha Mathis died in Texas on 7 September 1883. Mahulda applied for a widow's pension on 18 March 1893. She believed that Mathis received a pension. Her application was rejected. She obviously did not know he had been rejected, which leads me to believe that she was not living with him at the time and probably did not live with him very long at all.

In later years, I think Mahulda lived with both children and grandchildren. My grandmother always said the "Grandmaw raised me" meaning Mahulda.

Mahulda Yarbrough Sanders Mathis died 10 September 1891 in Gibson County, TN. She is buried next to William Lewis Sanders in the old Sanders Cemetery in Gibson County.

George P. Yarbrough was born in Tennessee about 1820. If the was born in Overton County, then he was born before the census of that year, as he is a necessary member to make the census fit the family. He first appears in the White Co TN Marriage Book, where he married on 15 Sept 1839 Celia Davis, a daughter of Augustus Parks Davis. It is presumed that they are with William Yarbrough Sr. in the 1840 Gibson Co TN census, and that the census taker slipped a column in the female tally, so that both Celia and Martha are actually there.

George Yarbrough received a Hardeman Co TN land Grant of 189 1/2 acres in 1848. George P. and Celia Yarbrough appear in only one known census, in

George P. and Celia Yarbrough appear in only one known census, in 1850³² in Hardeman Co TN. They settled near Toone, having property facing that of William Yarbrough Jr.. George purchased 25 acres from William Yarbrough (Sr?) in 1850, and 206 acres from E.S. Legget in 1852. He sold 100 Acres to Benjamin W. Yarbrough in 1855 and sold 106 acres and 40 acres to B.N. Jones in 1859. George moved away, but may have sold 25 acres to William Yarbrough Jr. in 1870. At least one of George's children remained in Hardeman County.

BENJAMIN YARBROUGH c1824 - 1861

Benjamin W. Yarbrough was born about 1824, probably near Sparta TN. His marriage in Gibson Co TN on 5 Mar 1845 to Mary Jane McAllilly is the first record of them. Mary Jane was born 1 Oct 1826 in TN and died 3 Mar 1891, she is buried with Mahulda Yarbrough in the Lewis Cemetery in Gibson Co TN. Her mother was probably a Delashment. She and her sisters were represented by George P. McAllilly in litigation over Elijah Delashment's estate³³:

Benjamin Yarbrough and Mary Jane Yarbrough, formerly Mary Jane McAllilly; Job and Elizabeth Hicks, Formerly Elizabeth McAllilly, James and Margaret Cook, formerly Margaret Mc Allilly, appoint George P. McAllilly, attorney (Power of attorney). Ligation of Elijah Delashment, dec'd. Signed by Benjamin Yarbrough, Job Hicks, James Cook, Mary Jane Yarbrough, Margaret Cook, Elizabeth (X) Hicks.

When Lewis Sanders died, Benjamin became guardian of Lewis and Mahulda Sanders' minor children. When James Yarbrough could no longer carry out the duties of Administrator of Lewis Sanders' estate, Benjamin was appointed to carry on. These legal arrangements provide further evidence of the close relationship between these Yarbroughs and Mahulda Sanders.

Ben Yarbrough died in the War between the states probably in 1861. Benjamin apparently was with his parents until he married, and he appears in two Gibson Co TN censuses³⁴, and Mary Jane remained in Gibson County for the rest of her life.

Benjamin Yarbrough was the son of William and Martha Yarbrough. He was born in Tennessee probably 1825. In 1852, Benjamin Yarbrough, James Yarbrough and several other men were appointed as administrators of the Lewis Sanders' estate. James Yarbrough served in that position until 1854 when Benjamin took over.

Benjamin married Mary Jane McAliley, 3/6/46, in Gibson County. George P. Yarbrough was the bondsman. She was probably the daughter of James or Samuel McAliley of Chester County SC. Both James and Samuel died early, and Mary Jane and Margaret were made wards of Richard McAliley. Mary Jane Yarbrough is buried in the old Sanders Cemetery in Gibson County.

Benjamin Yarbrough joined the 22 Tennessee Infantry (State Troops) mid-1861 and survived the Battle of Belmont. By mid-1862 signed vouchers by the administrator of his estate can be found. In all probability, he was a casualty of the Battle of Shiloh. It's just a matter of checking CSA records to be sure. 1 April 1992

We know that at least three of these children went to what is now the southern part of the Unites States. Oswell Yarborough was the witness to a Will in the Natchez Dist.

The Louisiana Genealogical Register , Vol.20 p.7. states that James Smith Yarborough arrived in the area May of 1773, with his wife, five children and (J.S.Y.'s wife Mary)

The first land grant to James Smith Yarborough #363, 400 A. on the Miss. River - Land which was originally granted to Charles Percy, bearing date . of patent for J.S.Y., June 2,1777. It is not clear wheather this was a British or Spanish Land Grant. The legal represenatives of Charles Percy

April 26,1805 , #22, VolI, pu2 of U.S. Land Grants shows that James Smith Yarborough "a West Florida Yoeman" received land in Orleans Territory. His son Jordan also received land adjoining.

The National Archives - Documents show James Smith Yarborough #4735 no.365

By 1808 there are several deeds recorded in Iberville Parish, La. which involve James Smith Yarborough, William Yarborough, Joseph Yarborough, & Richard Yarborough.(This being in the District of Manchac) The records of the area are not complete, possibly because those in control of that district were never sure who was the power over them. England? Spain? or France? Records are found in Alabama, West Florida, New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Natchez Dist & in the U.S. after 1803. The first Census of the area shows James Smith Yarborough and his sons and daughters were residents of Galvez Town, a fortified settlement that enjoyed a brief existance from 1775 to 1789 during the Spanish domination,; settled during the administration of Governor Bernardo de Galvez. At it's peak, there were 400 residents, in the 1810 Census there were 65 listed.

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Priscilla and his brother Moses Yarbrough; however, Moses died leaving a will recorded 22 Apr. 1756, Amelia Co., VA, giving all his estate to his sister Priscilla Yarbrough, so evidently these two brothers were unmarried when they died. Henry Yarbrough witnessed both these wills.²²

Samuel, another son of William, moved to Orange Co., NC, where he left a will probated 5 Nov. 1770, naming his wife, Sarah; children: William, Samuel, John, Elizabeth, Sarah, and Lewcey Yarbrough. Another son, William, Jr., remained in Amelia Co. and later lived in Prince Edward County which was formed from Amelia County in 1754. His will, recorded there in 1771, names sons: James Smith, Oswell, Joseph, Richard, and William; and daughter, Elizabeth Yarbrough. No wife is named, but from Bristol Parish register and Caroline Co., VA, Order Books we learn his wife was Diana Smith and that she died 18 May 1767.


The last son of William Yarbrough, Sr., Micajah, is a mystery. A few researchers have suggested that he was probably father of my Joshua because Joshua named a son Micajah. During this time children were named for their parents, grandparents, and other relatives; however, I have abandoned this theory after thoroughly searching Amelia County records for this period without finding his name mentioned except in his father's will by which he inherited 400 acres. No record was found where he disposed of the land which is a puzzle for Amelia County records are well preserved.

Another will found in Amelia County, Virginia, is for Thomas Yarbrough recorded 23 Mar. 1769, naming his wife Hannah; children: Jordon, Archibald, Hannah, Mary, Jane, and Catherine Yarbrough and grandson Thomas Yarbrough. The son Jordon left a will recorded 25 Oct. 1770 in Amelia County, leaving all his property to his brothers and sisters, so he, too, died unmarried. (WB 2, p. 332) Thomas's other son Archibald lived on in Amelia and Prince Edward Counties with his wife Ann.

From Amelia County court records we learn that the father of Thomas's wife, Hannah, was Samuel Jordon and the father of Thomas Yarbrough was another Thomas Yarbrough. From Amelia County tax records we learn that Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., also, had sons, John and Zachariah. They were listed as his titheables in the tax lists of 1747 and 1749. Our Joshua Yarbrough was, also, listed in these same tax lists as head of a household, and since he earlier received land grants lying next to Thomas, Sr., and Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., which would possibly make him a great grandson of Richard, the immigrant, because most researchers believe that Thomas, Sr., was son of Richard Yarbrough, Jr., and grandson of Richard Yarbrough, the immigrant. No proof, however, has been found.

On 20 Oct. 1749 Joshua sold the 400 acres he had received as a land grant in Amelia County to Richard Stone for the sum of 20 pounds current money of Virginia. Joshua's wife Sarah "being examined privately relinquished her right of dower. (Deed Book 3, p. 295)

The next record found for Joshua Yarbrough was in 1754 when he was listed in Captain Surgar Jones's Company of Granville Co., NC, Militia. A year later both Joshua and John Yarbrough are listed on the Granville Co. tax list. In 1758 Joshua is again listed on the tax list and paid

In April 1761 the court ordered that the deposition of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. "an infirm witness in this cause who is about to depart this colony" be taken. At this time, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., was already a resident of North Carolina as is proven by the tax lists of Granville, presently Franklin Co., NC. Thomas was apparently visiting Virginia at the time of his deposition.

The original deposition was found by Greg Yarbrough among the loose original documents at Richmond, Virginia, where the old country records are stored. The deposition was typed ver batim by Karen Mazock from a copy of the original deposition. Found and typed September, 1983. The original documents of Amelia County are closed to the public and can be searched only with special permission which Greg Yarbrough obtained.

Here lie the remains of Richard E. Hardaway, who was born on the 3 of January, 1796, and died on the 22nd of September, 1830. This stone is erected to his memory by the direction of his bereaved widow, Mary Hardaway.

1. The remains of John Archer and Elizabeth, his wife, bere repose. They lived to a mature age in unbroken conjugal affection and happiness, estimable and esteemed in every relation of life. He died March, 1812. She died March, 1826. Their children placed this tablet over their graves, the memorial of enduring affection and reverence for their best of parents.

2. This monument is erected to the memory of William S. Archer by his affectionate sisters to whom he stood almost throughout their lives in the double relation of father and brother. He was born March 5th, 1789, died March 28th, 1855.

To mark their devoted affection, veneration and love, this humble inscription and inadequate tribute to his worth is from the hand of one who knew and loved him from his cradle to his grave. The kindliness of his disposition, the generosity of his character and his high and refined sense of moral right endeared him to his friends. His highly cultivated literary taste, his mind well stored with ornamental and useful knowledge, his calm and profound judgment, and his noble chivalry of character placed him in the councils of the nation in the proud rank of the distinguished men of his time. He lived and died without fear and without reproach.

3. Francis Key Gwynn, infant son of Thos. P. and Mildred A. Gwynn, died the 8th of May, 1841, aged two years and seventy eight days.

4. Sacred to the Memory of Joseph E. Archer, son of John and Elizabeth Archer, who died March, 1812, aged 18 years.

ELBERT S. YARBROUGH

"Elbert S. Yarbrough is another of the old settlers of Marion Township, having been a resident of this county since 1849. He was born May 30, 1830, in Henry County, Tenn., a son of William and Lydia (Morris) Yarbrough, natives of North Carolina. William S. Yarbrough was born in September, 1797, in Montgomery County, N.C., a son of James Yarbrough, of Irish descent. He was a fifer in the Revolutionary War. William S. Yarbrough was reared on a farm in North Carolina, and followed farming all his life. In 1820 he emigrated from Montgomery County, N.C., to Tennessee with his family and household goods in a one-horse wagon, and settled first in Montgomery County. Tenn., where he remained for about one year, then went to Henry County, Tenn., where he remained until 1849, at which time he again emigrated west, coming to this State [Arkansas] and locating in Ocuahita County, where he bought a claim of eighty acres of land, about sixty acres of which were cleared. He afterward entered 400 acres, on which he resided until his death in 1863. He and wife were both members of the Primitive Baptist Church. He was a Democrat in his political views. He was married to Miss Lydia Morris, who was born in 1798. a daughter of Jeptha Morris. Hr. Morris was a native of Scotland; his parents died while he was still quite young, and while yet a boy he was brought to this country by a colony of his countrymen and grew up in North Carolina, and served in the Revolutionary War. His wife died in 1865. She was the mother of nine children, four of whom are still living, viz: Martha (unmarried and living in Columbia County), Elbert S. (the subject of this sketch), Nathan (a minister of the Primitive Baptist Church), and Ann (who married Mr. Thomas W.A. Yarbrough, a third cousin, and now lives in Columbia County). Mr. Yarbrough came to this county when he was nineteen years of , age, and has always taken an active interest in the settlement of this county. He commenced working for himself in 1852 at farm labor. In 1854 he was elected bailiff of Marion Township,

and served in that capacity for four years, until 1858, when he was appointed deputy sheriff and moved to Camden, and filled that office until 1863. He then moved back on the old homestead, where he remained until the death of his mother. On account of ill health Mr. Yarbrough did not take part in the late war. In 1865 he purchased a farm of 610 acres, which he occupied until 1887, when he sold off part of that place and purchased his present farm on which he now lives. He now owns 530 acres of land, of which loo are under cultivation, and devotes his attention chiefly to the raising of cotton. He was married, October 27, 1859, to Prudence W. Ross, a native of this county, born in 1841, a daughter of Israel Ross, of this township, and by her was the father of five children, three of whom are still living, viz: Annie E., Ida V. and Asa E., all living at home. Both Mr. and Mrs. Yarbrough are members of the Primitive Baptist Church. Mr. Yarbrough is actively interested in politics and affiliates with the Democratic party, and takes a deep interest in all work for the good of the county."2

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

I am sorry not to have answered & thanked you for the cosies you sent me. I do have all the Jenkins Quarterlies and YFM's - actually I helped put them together early on.' I collected Y-data and sent Nelle Jenkins cosies a couple of years before she wrote them. She hadn't even written her "Pioneers of Sumter (o. Ala" yet. However, I do appreciate the data you send me - sometimes I don't have it - like you Swanson Y. data, and an sure much, much more. I also have the marriages and Deeds list from the St. Louis Genea. Soc. - some of the pages you sent, are from this. You can keep all the copies I sent you.

The Wm. H. Y. obit I sent you was Wm. Henry Y. My uncle was Wm. A. Lon Ambrose, he had two sons only, Harry and Thomas - both deceased.

The Wm-Rachael Shelby T. wound up in Tipton Co. Tnn. (no Shelby - without looking I)

George Washington Yarbrough, Senator from Alabama, the recognized (?) guru of early Y-research, felt our ancestor was Zachariah. This might lead to son Manoah who Tenkins also thought was ours. I haven't found the connection - still lookin'!

I certainly overlooked the dates I have for Pauline 9. Anders. I just copied off what my cousin, Jacie Hyatt, sent me and didn't notice it. Pauline was born March 10, 1831 according to Jacie's records. Pauline was her grgrmother. However the 1850 census of Choctaw (o. Ala. gives her age us 16, making it 1834. 





The now Jackson family is first found in Tn. in 1827 in Henry Co. "Willis an assignce of 215 A next to Allen and Henry Jackson".

They are listed on 1830 census in Henry Co.

In 1849 Willis Jackson received 100A valued at \$200 in Dist. 80 of Carroll Co., Tn.

In 1850, the family with Willis now 46 and Martha 45 is listed on the census and farming 250A. The family of James Yarborough, age 54, with wife, Roenna, age 34, and young children John T., William J., George H., and Thomas A., all born in Th. However James and Roenna were born in Va.

The other Yarborough family in Carroll C. in 1850 is Elam, age 52, born N. C.; wife, Jane, 50, born Va; Nathaniel, 20, born N.C.; Charles E., 18, born N.C.; Wilson, 16, bornN.C.; Elam F., 10, born TN; Mary A, 24 born N.C.

Willis Jackson died in Mar. of 1860 leaving Martha as head of household with four children and living in Carroll Co. in the 1860 census.

Martha Yarborough Jackson died 9 July 1878.

Letters written by W.W. Yarborough of Nashville, Howard Co. Ark, in 1882 and 1890 to Mr. James Arnett (husband of Lucinda Parilee Jackson) describe life in western Ark. He signs himself "your dear cousin". He mentions a James Yarborough in Hope, Hempstead Co., Ark. W. W. Yarborough was an agent for DUNGAN'S FUNNEL CLOTHES WASHER.

Another cousin who wrote to the Arnetts was L. A. Atchinson but he may not have been of the Yarborough side of the family.

Elam Yarbrough is son of James and Temperence Yarb. Grandson of Henry and Martha Robinson Yarbrough.

I have two houses to put up if crops are good. Corn by(?) 100 and 150 per bushel, flour 4.50 to 5 ct(?). I bought () at 4.25. Jones fummers (?) me in some flour, (wer Weasses) coffee and so on and (we''') I will put him a house up this summer if crops are good. If we all take up land we will form a neighborhood and I would love to have you in the ring. I cant tell you how that will be till we go out in the mountains this summer and then I will write more about it. I could do mighty well if I could go out to New Hope Every Sunday. I always loved to go to ole New Hope but I hope. I will live right. Remember me when you are a pray meeting at Ole New Hope. Your dear cousin.

Conclusions: Carolan Bible

Although-Carolan Bible states John Yarbrough Sr. was married to Flizabeth, one record show's that she was Mary Havis, daughter of John Havis, Sr. She is mentioned as Mary Yarbery in John Havis' will signed 4 March 1807, and probated 15 Aug 1807 in Fairfield Co., S.C.

John Yarbrough Sr. of Fairfield Co. S.C. signed his Will-on 25 Feb 1816-and it was probated 22 June 1816. He does not name his wife but does name the following children: son, Jesse; "dau. Martha; son; Thomas; son, Arthur; son-in-law Fergüson and Jesse Havis to be executors of his will. Witnesses to the will were John Graham, Obedeah Havis, and Jonathon Havis. According to Leonardo Andrea, Genealogist, Jesse Havis was a brother-in-law to John Yarbrough.

From the Will we can see that we have the right family, except if Sarah Clement Yarbrough was a daughter, why was she omitted? It is possible that her father gave her all he intended for her to receive at the time of her marriage, which was common practice in early times. (YES)

The Bible record mentions an "lizabeth Burk (Birk) who was born 23 Feb 1793-and died 12 July 1811 = could this be John Yarbrough's wife Flizabeth? This is far-fetched but the data is so vague in the Bible record. No! Not if Sarah Clement Y. born in 1777.

We do know this: John Yarbrough's children are said to be: current

Jesse Wesley Yarbrough, parents John & Highbeth, and who was b. 4 Aug 1795. Jesse W. Yarbrough married Mary Ann Freedows-

(This according to Mrs. M.L. Talpert Jr. on file card in the South Flains Genealogical Society, Lubbock, Texas) (She is a descendant of Jesse d Mary Ann through their son John Hilliard Yarbrough) If not, she is seeking info on them.

Sarah Clement Yarbrough, dau of John & "Lizabeth Yarbrough, she was b. 19 Jan 1777 - died 11 Nov 1835. According to the Bible record above she m.1 Mr. Carolan, had a son Wm. P. Carolan who was b. 28 Mar 1800; she m.2 Mr. Dansby, and had a son named Jonathon W. Dansby 5. 8 Nov 1802; m.3 John Jaggars on July 20, 1821. There seems to be a long stratch between the birth of Jonathon W. Dansby and her third marriage, which causes one to wonder if there might not be other Dansby children.


According to John Yarbrough's 1816 Will he had a Son Arthur, dau. Martha Ferguson, son, Thomas, as well as the above Jesse W. Yarbrough. The will names son-in-law Ferguson, which may or not be the James Ferguson named in the Carolan Bible record who d. Aug 1, 1839. — Note that Arthur Yarbrough, Sr. died 4 June 1831 according to the Bible, and that John Yarbrough Sr. died 20 June 1816 which matches the probate for John Yarbrough of Fairfield Co, S.C. in 1810.

In research of census records in Alabama, the 1830 Morgan County lists Arthur-Yarbrough; J.H. Yarbrough; Saccariah Yarbrough -1850 Lawrence County, Ala lists: Jesse, and X. A. Yarbrough in the 453rd_District_of that county.

I have seen deeds to and from Jaggars in Georgia, a-will for Dan'l Jaggars in Limestone Co, Ala which gives their pattern of migration. The question remains - who was Flizabeth?

At his earliest recollection on currency of North Carolina the currency of N.C. was never better than 10 shillings to the dollar and in some parts of N.C. 12 shillings to the dollar. That bonds and judgments for so much money of the state of N.C. were always discharged by 2 silver dollars to the pound, which was the value thereof. This was the case in the year 1786.

Deposition of William C. Anderson -20 Oct. 1837- He knew Mrs. Mary Dougherty in North Carolina as the wife of Dr. Burke about 1776 to 1780.



This is regarded as one of the oldest families in England, the name being derived from the parish of Yarburgh or Yarborough in Lincolnshire, where they have held lands continuously in the direct line from Saxon times till the present day. Eustachius de Yarburgh was Lord of Yarburgh at the Norman Conquest, and from him descended Edmund Yarburgh, died 1631, father of Sir Nicholas Yarburgh, knighted by King Charles the First, and died 1655, having by Faith Dawnay his wife, a son Sir Thomas Yarburgh. M.P., High Sheriff of Yorkshire 1676, who had ten children, including Colonel James Yarburgh, Godson and Page of Honour to King James II, from the fourth of whose ten children descends the present Baron Deramore.

A branch of this family is found at an early time in Virginia, as in 1699 (1) John Yarborow "for himself and the children and devisees of Richard Yarborow" and (2) Richard Yarborow are found among claimants to land in Pamankey Neck and the south side of Blackwater Swamp, whilst James Edwards, Lewis Davis and Stephen Terry appear to have claimed 1,300 acres conveyed from Richard Yarborow in the same year. The Quit Rent Roll of King William County, Va., in 1704 shows John Yarborough holding 150 acres and Richard Yarborough 300 acres, and the Gloucester Rent Roll in that year gives Robert Yarborough occupying 100 acres in Abbington Parish.¹





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the story was printed in the Lexington, N. C. Dispatch, January 5, 1398. As the story related to men who came to North Carolina more than one hundred years before the article was printed, we must view it as legend. The article states: "Between the years of 1729 and 1775, seven brothers of Yarbroughs went (from Amelia Co., Va.) over to Louisburg, Franklin Co., North Carolina. Their names were Zachariah, Archibald, Manoha, Alexander, Thomas, Henry and John."

While some of the above named do appear on the State Census 1764-1779, Dept. of Archives, Raleigh, N. C., it is doubtful that the Yarboroughs mentioned in the article were sons of the same Father. Perhaps, "brothers of Yarbroughs" meant they left brothers in Amelia Co. or elsewhere, but came as a group of Yarbrough kin.

In a record such as this, it would be impossible to trace each man of the generation mentioned in the above article. By the 1790 Census, most of the Yarbrough -Yarborough families were gone to another locality. There are many records to be found in North Carolina which pertain to those Yarboroughs mentioned in the following Censuses.

Be it known that I, Jas. H. Savage, raised and equipped a company of confederal soldiers, at Goshen, Cherokee Co., Alabama which was mustered into service at Huntsville, Ala., the tenth day of August 1861, and became Co. I of the 19th Regiment of Ala. Volunteers upon the organization of that Regiment.

That Lindsey Yarbrough enlisted in said Company at the age of sixteen years and six months. He was true to his duties and faithful as the truest and faithful soldiers or officers in the Confederate Army, always present for duty at roll call, on the march and in battle.

At Shiloh Battle, April the 6th, 1862, he fell from a wound that carried away his right shoulder and shattered the upper bone in his right shoulder and shattered the upper bone in his right arm; after a long struggle in the hospital in Mobile, to hold on to life by heroic will power, he recovered and returned to his Company and refused a discharge and was placed upon parole duty. And when on the 26th day of April 1862, the Confederate Army surrended, Lindsey Yarbrough, Private Co. I, 19th Reg. Ala. volunteers surrendered and was paroled.

Greetings were given by one of the Sons of Confederate Veterans, Gayden Latture, the Alabama division Commander. The history of the 19th Alabama Infantry of Co. I was read by Brig. Gen. Bill Smart, Alabama Division of Reenactors. The military and person life history of Lindsey Yarbrough was given by his great grandson, Ray Odell Yarbrough. A Military Salute was given by the 4th Alabama Calvary, Co. B. They were: Phil Robinson, Steve Thompson, Billy Wilson, Carl Linderholm, Gerry Grimer, Ronnie Fletcher and Mike Vetke, led by Lt. Col. Bobby Holloway. The benediction was given by Lt. Col. Bobby Holloway.

Immediately after this reverent service, we all went to the old post office building at the Confederal Memorial Park for a reception. The ladies that are in the chapter of Mrs. Dennis had prepared a nice luncheon. This old building is the one our great grandfather had used while a resident at the soldier's Home.

The ladies taking part in the service were all dressed in hoop skirts with complete attire of the Civil War era. One lady, dressed in black, wore a veil covering her face through the entire ceremony. The gentlemen all wore complete Civil War Confederate uniforms, and the 21 gun salute was conducted with the old powder muskets.

On this unforgettable day, we witnessed a memorial, conducted with reverence and complete sincereity from the heart, for our great grandfather, Noble Lindsey Yarbrough, who died and was put to rest without dignity, 84 years ago. We can now close our final chapter on our courageous ancestor as he will not be forgotten. His memory rests in a peaceful place in his home state of Alabama.

MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR PVT. NOBLE LINDSEY YARBROUGH1 29 Feb 1844 - 13 Oct 1909

The memorial service for Pvt. Noble Lindsey Yarbrough was held on October 30, 1993, in the cemetery of Mountain Creek Baptist Church, located just outside the entry to the Confederal Memorial Park, Mountain Creek, Alabama. The church was formed at the Soldier's Home in the Confederal Park many years ago.

Lindsey Yarbrough was killed on October 15, 1909, in an accident while gathering hay for someone near Ketona, Alabama. Although his death certificate stated that he was buried at Village Springs, Alabama, no record has been found to verify this, or that he even had a funeral.

We ordered a stone for our great grandfather, and Lt. Col. Bobby Holloway and his wife, Belinda,

graciously accepted it and the responsibility of having a memorial service for Lindsey. After the stone was obtained, efforts were made to locate Lindsey's place of burial by several people, especially Belinda. No information could be found in cemeteries, newspapers, funeral home records, and the older residents of the community who were asked had no answers.


Mrs. Erma Dennis of Verbena, Alabama, purchased eight spaces in the Mountain Creek Baptist Church Cemetery to be used for Civil War Veterans. She is a member of the church and wanted to do something in the memory of her great grandfather who was killed in battle during the Civil war. After we told her we had a stone without a proper place to put it, she so graciously offered us one of the spaces, for whch we will be forever grateful. Our great grandfather's stone is the first to be put there.

Lindsey Yarbrough had spent some time living at the Soldier's Home, near this cemetery. He evidently loved the outdoors as he always worked outside, and we feel he would be pleased with this cemetery, surrounded by colorful trees.

Saturday, October 30, 1993 was a cold, cloudy day, with a bone chilling breeze, as my brother, Ray Yarbrough, and his wife, Louise, my husband, Glenn Patterson, and I attended the ceremony. It was described by one of the speakers

The only records found that tend to identify our early Lowe family are the census records of Orangeburgh County, a State land Grant and a State Indent issued in payment for supplies to the military during the Revolutionary War.

Thomas Lowe was issued a land grant along the Edisto River in Orangeburgh District in 1768.

On December 19th, 1783, there began a series of claims and indents for one John Lowe of Orangeburgh County, South Cerolina, that continued through January 14th, 1788 when this letter from John Lowe seems to have closed the file on his claims -The 14th January 1788

Dear Sir:

Will you be so obliging as to call at the Treasurer's office for an indent as I supplied our troops with three head of cattle and some other provisions in the time of the War. Don't fail and I will amply satisfy you for any trouble you may be at because I am in want of indent to pay tax.

I am as ever, your sincere friend,

JOHN LOWE

On February 2nd, 1788 - John Low Acct....Rec'd 2 February 1788 from the State a full satisfaction for the within account in an indent #3318 X.

Photostats of these papers were obtained from the Archives of South Carolina.

There appears in the 1790 Census of Orangeburgh County, one John Lowe as head of a household; no Lowes appear after this date in the census records for Orangeburgh County.

In Newberry County was one Samuel Cannon who died there in 1791 and in whose will are named his wife, Lydia, daughter of Isaac Pennington, and his children - one of whom was Lydia (unmarried). Could this Lydia Cannon be the same Lydia Cannon who married John Lowe?

In Spartanburg County there was one John Cannon who died in 1788 when his will was probated; he named his wife, Sarah, and one daughter, Lydia (also unmarried). Could this be our Lydia who OPHELIA KESSLER BOX 261 NEW CASTLE, TX 76372

married John Lowe?

In Hickman County, Tennessee, on February 10th, 1836, a land grant was issued to Lydia Lowe - Grant #13361.

In Bedford County, Tennessee, Deed Book "FF", Page 113 -Gabriel Low buys of William B. Jordan, land on Alexander's Creek, 9th December 1836. Page 478 -

Deed Book "JJ", Page 145 -Trust Deed from Littleberry Still to Gabriel Low, to secure a debt, both of Bedford County, 6 January 1840.

Deed Book "KK", Page 133-4 - Two deeds, 123 acres, from Evan Wallace to Gabriel Low - land on Alexander's Creek, 12 January 1841.

There is a Will in Orange County, North Carolina, probated September 1768, for Isaac Greason, Teste who identifies Margaret Greason as the wife of ..... Lowe.

Family tradition has it that Lydia Cannon Lowe came across the mountains with her family who considered her a woman of courage. Since no mention that any one could recall was ever made to her husband, it was presumed that she was a widow when she came into Tennessee.

No public or family record substantiates this tradition unless at some future date, a researcher will identify the Lydia Lowe who received the land Grant in Hickman County as being the same Lydia Lowe who was buried under a tree in the orchard of her son, Gabriel Lowe, in Williamson County.

The grave was unmarked but a granddaughter remembers playing around the grave and feeling sorry for the little old lady lying below.

John Lowe and Lydia Cannon had, among probable others -Gabriel A. Low, born 8 March 1808, Springfield, Orangeburgh District, South Carolina, died 7 March 1882 in Williamson County, Tennessee, where his obituary reads as follows -Al "A well known citizen of Williamson County, Tennesse, was born March 8, 1808 in South Carolina. From there he moved to White Oak Springs in East Tennessee, and from there to Bedford County and later to Williamson County. After a long life of energy, industry, sobriety and fair dealings, he died. He was buried last Tuesday in his own Cemetery among the members of his family who had preceded him. In 1842, he professed religion and joined the church; he was a Methodist and lived a consistent member always, ready for every good work and word. The Rev. W. R. Peebles on this sad occasion delivered a very acceptable sermon and accounted the many virtures and excellencies of this good man's life and character. Thus, one by one, the pioneer fathers are being torn from us by the rude hand of death. The men of this stamp are getting too scarce in our County and State. In the busy field of Official Life he never entered, he was satisfied to remain in the quiet vale of life and discharge to the full all the duties exacted of him in amassing property and rearing a large and refined family of children. His example is a bright one to be followed by the present generation of young man. To

with the life at OPHELIA KESSLER BOX 261 NEW CASTLE, TX 76372 his bereaved family we send words of condolence, earnestly we say 'imitate his example'." We first see Gabriel Low when he appeared in the 1830 Williamson County, Tennessee, Census, as a married man between 20-30, wife between 20-30, one male and one female, both under 5. Next we find him in the 1840 Bedford County, Tennessee, Census; also in the 1850 Bedford County Census; by 1860, he has moved back into Williamson County where he appeared in the 1880 Census. Gabriel Lowe married let in South Carolina, 23 Sectember 1827, Louvenia Still who died between 1838-1839 - by her he had -William Horatio Low, b 5 July 1828, died at Whitesboro, Texas; **B1** married 12 July 1849, Violet Kimmons; their issue, according to the will of Gabriel Low -G. 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#### PINKSTON

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The first knowledge we have of the Pinkston family appears in Rowan County, North Carolina, where the will of William Pinkston, Sr., dated 27 July 1815, was probated November 1815 (Book G, P. 695) and in which he named his wife, Ann, and the following children: Al Meshack Pinkston who appears in the 1820 Census of Davidson County, Tennessee, as being 45 years old, wife 45 years, three sons under 10 years and two daughters under 16 years. Peter Pinkston appears in the 1820 Census of Davidson County, A2 Tennessee, as being over 45 years of age, as was his wife; his will, dated 1838, was probated March Term of Court 1840, in Williamson County; married Frances . . . . whose will was dated 18 June 1858 and probated April Term of Court 1860, in Williamson County (Will Book 13, P. 177) and in this will, Frances Pinkston named as her only legatee, Sarah Angelina Jamison, her daughter, who appeared in Court and was given \$4000.00 with Thomas N. Pinkston and George W. Pollard as Securities. Her will was witnessed - B. C. Barnes and S. M. Jamison (presumably her son-in-law). The will of Peter Pinkston names -"My beloved wife, Frances Pinkston, all stock, farming utensils and furniture, 1/2 tract of land I hold by deed" Daughters - Sarah Angelina Pinkston - Tennessee Anthony Pinkston - Anna Catherine Sampkins (Lampkins) - Fanny Howard - Rebecca Reeves ) heirs to share & share alike - Polly Woods Sons - Hugh Pinkston's heirs - Mathew, William and Turner Pinkston, \$1.00. Executor - Richard M. Robinson. Witnesses - William Griggs Signed - Peter Pinkston - Benj. Stevens Their issue -Bl Anna Catherine Pinkston married ..... Sampkins (Lampkins). B2 Hugh Pinkston died prior to date of his father's will, December 1838: married . . . Frances . . . 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Matthew Pinkston married and had at least one son as is shown by a deed of gift dated 9 January 1821, and registered 20 May 1822 (Book G, P. 145, Williamson County) when "for natural love and affection he beareth toward James F.
