Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".



Cato, son of Peter Lee (born Isle of Wight Co., Va; d. 1804. Will is recorded in Sampson Co., N.C.), was born in Prince George Co., Va, which later became Brunswick Co., Virginia.

Peter's children: David, Cato, Jane, Rebecca, Burchett, Batt, PeterII, Mary, Betsy, Penny, Lundy. He was married to Mary Cato in 1752 in Brunswick Co. Ba.

Cato and Nancy Holland Lee lived in Johnson Co., N.C. during the Revolutionary War. (See 1790 census for Johnson Co., N.C. 1830 census of Wilcox Co., Alabama.)

Land warrants for Revolutionary service were in Washington Co., Georgia where Cato removed in 1817.

Eaton Lee was the youngest son of Cato and Nancy Lee. He was born 3 Sept. 1801 and was married to Dorcas Sheppard Stokes. There were 14 children: Leonard Budd, John Allen, Sterling Cato, Elizabeth Jane, Frances Ann, Nancy Holly, Mary, William Cleaton, Eaton Jefferson, George Martin, Rufus Lundy, Henry Clay, Sarah Caroline, Silvanus.

John Allen Lee, b. 1824--married Patience Caroline Purifoy, and was the son of Eaton Lee. There were 11 children: Martha Jane, William Eaton, John Francis, Henry Marshall, Clarence Leroy, Julius Jefferson, Julia Dorcas, Andrew Milliard, Judge Martin, Joseph Lloyd, Wesley Cato.

Joseph Lloyd Lee, b. 1860 removed to Arkansas in 1888. He married Sarah Olivia Bibby and there were four children: Mary Eunice, Inez Olivia, John Fitzhugh, Wilford Marshall.

John Fitzhugh Lee, b. 1898, married Lois Williams. There were two children: Sara Ann, Libby Sue.

Jane Yarberry was a relative, sister perhaps, of Aquilla Yarberry, who was a daughter of William R. Yarberry and Elizabeth Nicholson. This family was living in Gilmer County, Georgia in 1850, two years before Jane's marriage there, but Jane is not listed in their household.

In 1860 Jane and Henry were living on Ballplay, Monroe County, next door to Phillip and Nancy Roberts. The grandson of Henry and Jane, Edward Eugene Partain, married Bertie Elizabeth Mills, who was the great-granddaughter of Phillip and Nancy Roberts, through their son John R. Roberts and his wife, Aquilla Yarberry.

While in the Confederate Army in 1861, Henry became ill, and Jane went to Loudon, Tennessee, hauled him home and nursed him back to health.

On May 9, 1865, Jane and Aquilla Yarberry Roberts, along with several others, were involved in a court trial resulting from an assault on Matilda S. Gardner. They were indicted, accused of stealing a black horse belonging to J.M.N. Gardner, May 4, 1865. Jane was not found guilty.

December 4, 1865, Jane Parton Noland filed for legal guardianship of Catherine and Henry, the \$800 bond being signed by James Bivens and Elias Kerby.

CREATION OF HOUSTON COUNTY

By 1837, leaders of this area, a part of Nacogdoches, felt strong and secure enough to petition the First Congress assembled to make them a county. Their petition was written from Mustang Prairie and dated April 22, 1837. (6) It reads: "To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives when in Congress Assembled:

"We, the undersigned, your petitioners, citizens of said republic do most respectfully pray that your honorable body make for us a county on the East side of Trinity River, beginning at Robbins Ferry on said Trinity; Thence running fifteen miles each side of the old San Antonio Road and East far enough to make a constitutional county, and we do further pray that your Honorable Body appoint three disinterested commissioners out of the bounds of said county to locate the seat of justice for said county in granting the aforesaid petition, we, your petitioners as duty bound will ever pray, etc."



The mob crowded the depot platform and overflowed into the streets. Some waved revolvers, some waved nooses, and others waved bottles. Some just stood and stared.


"He's on his way!" a man shouted as he ran from the telegraph office.

"If the sheriff doesn't do the job, we will!" muttered a leatherfaced prospector.

Milt Yarbery, ex-marshal of Albuquerque, was headed for a hanging. They had loaded him on the special train at 6:30 that morning with sixteen of the Covernor's Rifles and sheriffs Martinez of Santa Fe and Bowman of Colfax County.

Yarbery glared at his guards and growled like a cornered wolf. He had no fear of death, but he had always reacted to any menace to his status with a snarling attack. Still, he had a fierce dog's pride and craving for friendship.

He looked something like the popular idea of a frontier marshal: tall, lean, tough, somewhat handsome, brown mustached, sharp gray eyes. He was born of traditional "poor but honest" parents in Arkansas, but ran off to Texas as

a young man. A land feud, a shooting, and the sheriff w

Uneducated, he couldn't read more than the back of deck of cards, but he did have some ingenuity. He usua managed to offset this animal cunning by doing the rig thing at exactly the wrong time. He had been many thin in his life — cowboy, gambler, brothel-keeper, bandit— ar a failure at all of them. There was one exception — he was a fairly successful murderer.

He opened a bar and brothel in Las Vegas, N.M. At the time all his customers were following the railroad to A buquerque. He made up his losses by killing and robbin a freighter before he left town.

He made the mistake of trying handitry in the bailiwic of "Hanging Judge" Isaac Parker in Arkansas. At the end of his Arkansas stay, he shot a man in the back in Tex arkana, then got drunk and boasted about it. He was lucky and the citizens were lenient. They just ran him out of town.

It's amazing he hadn't been hanged long before.

While the mob screamed in Albuquerque, Yarbery sawed a mournful tune off a borrowed fiddle and sang in his cracked voice:

"It matters little now, Lorena.

The past is in eternal past.

Our heads will soon lie low, Lorena,

Life's tide is ebbing out so fast.'

The guard shuddered, more at the quality of the music than the choice of songs.

Engine 245 gasped into Lamy Junction and laid panting on the tracks while the Atlantic Express roared past, spitting cinders from the funnel.

"Got a drink?" Yarbery asked Sheriff Bowman. The sheriff was a convivial sort. He hauled out a bottle and handed it to the prisoner, then passed it around. It was empty before it got halfway through the coach.

Everyone but the prisoner was relaxed. No worry with the sheriff around. He was the only man in the territory who could outdraw and outshoot that happy killer, Clay Allison.

In the single special coach, Yarbery nervously wiped his mouth and plucked at the sleeve of his seedy brown coat, the same one he had worn to prison twenty months before. His new white shirt had no collar, but it was the only sign of respectability about him. He sighed as the train jerked forward again.

He'd never been very respectable. In Canon City, Colorado, he had owned a good saloon until a customer took a dislike to the quality of the whiskey and shot him. The joint was so far in debt when he'd recovered there was nothing left to do but tap the till and get out of town.

He'd killed men, at least four of them, before he got the badge. He arrived in the bustling, out-feeling Albaquerque in 1850, just when they needed a city marshal. Yarbery shrugged and took the job.

He was never a popular lawman. Crude and slovenly, he could never be mistaken for a gentleman. These traits, plus immoral tendencies, made him the wrong kind of friends. Unfortunately for him, he was a sucker for his friends. They would rather suggest, "Let's go rob a stage-coach," than "Let's go to church."

On the other side of the badge for once, he began to long for the more stable life of honest, affluent people.

He met a widow named Sadie Preston and fell in love. At least, it was a close resemblance. Again misfortune dogged him. Yarbery was only 35, but he lost out to the youth and good looks of Harry Brown. Harry was his natural enemy. First, he was gently reared, the son and nephew of two ex-governors of Colorado. Also, he was really tough. As a guard for the Adams Express Company, he had held off Dave Rudabaugh's gang with his rifle when they tried to rob the train at Kinsley, Kansas. Rudabaugh escaped to partner with Milt in the holdup business and, later, to ride with a buck-toothed killer named Billy the Kid.

Toward the end of the affair with Sadie, Yarbery began to look upon Brown as arival dog that wanted his favorite bone. Sadie Preston and Brown were eating supper in a restaurant one night in March, 1881. When they finished, Brown stepped outside to fire up a cigar, since no gentleman smoked in the presence of a lady, especially at the table. Milt passed with a surely glare, then stopped as Brown pointed his cigar.

"Milt," he said to Yarberry, "I want a talk with you."
Yarbery jerked his head to one side and they moved away from the door.

'Stay away from Sadie. She doesn't want anything to do with riffraff like you."

"Who's riffraff?" snarled Yarbery, his eyes gleaming dangerously in the darkness. "Don't tell me anything you'll be sorry for."

Brown stared contemptuously at him and spoke his final, fatal words.

"I wouldn't be afraid of you if you were marshal of the United States!"

Yarbery reacted, sending a quick bullet into Brown's chest. After he dropped, the marshal stepped forward to put three more shots into the body.

Yarbery surrendered to Sheriff Perfecto Armijo. The sheriff brought him before the mayor for a preliminary hearing the next day and Yarbery claimed self-defense. Brown had tried to draw a pistol, he said. No gun was ever found on or near the body, but Yarbery won acquittal by buying witnesses who testified Brown had made some threats toward Marshal Yarbery.

After this the citizens were careful to stay away from his girls. They also made no quick motions with their hands while he was around.

In June, he made his next mistake. He and "Monte Frank" Boyd were playing stud in the Maden Hotel one

"Let's see what's going on, Yarbery grinned, pusning back his chair. They walked outside and looked around. Boyd stepped over to an old man sitting on the warped wood sidewalk, a sombrero over his eyes.

"Who fired that shot?" he asked.

The old man looked up, seeing only a curious gringo. He didn't know who had shot, but this gringo obviously wanted an answer, any answer.

'That man," he mumbled, waving his hand at the street. Boyd drew his gun and they stared at the back of Charles Campbell, an unarmed railroad carpenter who had the bad luck to be crossing the street at the time. Yarbery shouted, "Hold up your hands!"

Campbell looked back and saw only two tough-looking

It was the wrong answer for the marshal. He drew and fired while Boyd was still cocking his gun, but they both put a bullet into the carpenter's back at about the same

"I've downed the son-of-a-bitch!" Yarbery shouted as he and the gambler emptied their pistols at Campbell.

Yarbery goofed again. He surrendered and claimed selfdefense again, but this time there was talk of a necktie


While he was in jail, hundreds of men attended protest meetings. When someone waved a rope, Sheriff Armijo would show up to talk them out of it. The sheriff was a respected man. Soft speaking and sandy haired, he didn't carry a gun. His silver tongue was backed by two hamlike fists. Many a roistering cowboy who had expected to hurrah this "dumb greaser" had awakened in jail the next morning with a swollen jaw.

Boyd was smart enough to realize his mistake and headed west in a fast gallop. Near Grants he came upon two unarmed Navajos, one with a good horse. He shot that one, but the other got away and raised forty tribesmen. When the war party caught up, they all fired at once and left the bullet-shredded body to rot on the desert.

Yarbery was shipped to the Santa Fe jail, duly tried, and sentenced to hang. He whiled away the time by playing incompetently, naturally, on the fiddle. This annoyed the other prisoners.

In September, 1882, he and three others were waiting when a guard unlocked their common cell. They knocked him out and leaped into the hall and out through a window. Other guards took a few pot shots in the dark, all near whistles. Yarbery was gone for three days while armed parties scouted the countryside.

Perfecto Armijo, who could be sherif judge, hidalgo or auctioneer as the occasion demanded

The guards formed a box, open at the end, and escorte Yarbery through the crowd. His lank figure, shambling i leg chains, towered head and shoulders above his guards

Halfway across Railroad Avenue he stopped and looke around, dumbly surprised at the crowd's hoots. His escor had led him directly over the spot where he'd killed Camp bell.

His luck continued as usual and Sheriff Martinez notices his handiwork about noon. Yarbery could only shrug "Wouldn't you have done the same?"

There had been some argument about where to hold the hanging. Sheriff Armijo wanted the ceremonies to have some decorum. He planned to use the new exposition building at the State Fair grounds until thirty-two prominent stockholders signed a protest petition.

The sheriff decided on a new course. He erected the scaffold near the main plaza in Old Albuquerque, in front of the jail. But, as a final touch, he built an eight-foot picket fence around the yard, then issued a hundred engraved tickets to those privileged to watch on the inside.

"This entitles Mr. . . . to witness the execution of Mil-

ton J. Yarbery, February 9th, 1883.

Those who could wrangle an extra ticket or didn't want to attend could sell their ducats for any price they asked.

The low adobe roofs around the jail were packed with people, some of whom had paid a dollar a head for standing room. Others sat on cottonwood limbs. Many had brought their lunches and bottles, although small boys peddled buckets of tamales, wrapped in cornhusks.

A trapped Yarbery squatted on a stool in the jail, glaring

at his guards. Armijo stuck his head in the door.

"Got a visitor, Milt."

"Another damned reporter?" he spat. "I'll kill the bastard if I get my hands on him!"

"It's Elwood Malden."

Yarbery's head jerked up. "Wouldn't josh me, would

you, sheriff? I'd sure like to see a friend.

Maden brought Milt some new clothes. He could now go to glory wearing a fine suit of broadcloth. Black, naturally.

He complained that his shirt was too tight, making the prophetic gesture of running his fingure around his neck

to loosen the collar.

Yarbery decided to tell Maden some secrets. Maden told none of these secrets, except that the prisoner's name was really not Yarbery, and that he asked that letters be written to his relatives in Arkansas.

Between visitors, Yarbery had lunch: a piece of cranberry

pie, a bottle of ale, and a pint of whiskey.

His only possessions were the clothes he wore, and he gave them to some of the few friends he had left. Maden got the old brown coat, Frank Fagely the vest, and Matt Bradley the pants.


Stripped of possessions and honor, the only thing left for him was death with courage and dignity. Considering

his past career, no one expected that.

The first indication came with one of the last visitors. Yarbery looked down to see a revolver butt held at the tips of his fingers as the friend crouched beside him.



A large crowd of Albuquerque citizens gathered at the adobe jailhouse east of the Old Town Plaza 83 years ago tomorrow to witness the execution of Milton J. Yarberry, constable of Precinct 12.

About 160 of the citizens' had received special invitations or "tickets," admitting them to the jail yard, surrounded by a high board fence, where the gailows had been erected.

These invitations read: "This entitles Mr. to witness the execution of Milton J. Yarberry, February 9th, 1883. By order of Lt. Col. Perfecto Armijo. Capt. Jno. Borrodaile, A.A."

The remainder, about 1,000 persons, watched from nearby vantage points in trees and on the flat roofs of homes some home owners charging \$1 a head for the rooftop vie:vs.

The Albuquerque policeman was being executed for the crime of murder.

During his brief career as constable of New Albuquerque in 1881 he had shot down two men in the streets. The officer claimed that both killings were justifiable, and in self defense. The jury believed him the first time, but not the second.

Yarberry and his lawyers had used every means to set aside the conviction or prevent the execution. An appeal to the Territorial Supreme Court had been denied, executive pardon was not forthcoming, and even a brief prison break had been in vain.

Now, at 3 p.m. on Feb. 9, 1883, the time had run out.

MILTON YARDERRY, who had been kept in jail in Santa Fe while his appeal was pending, was brought to Al-·buquerque on a special onecoach train on the morning of his execution,

Yarberry, a native of Ar-kansas, drifted into Alouquerque early in 1381 with the reputation of a cowboy, gambler, saloon keeper and desperado.

Because he was handy with a gum Yarberry was appointed town constable and given the job of preserving law and order in the boisterous young village.

Rivals in Romance Allegedly in pursuit of his official duties, Yarberry shot and killed 24-year-old Harry

Brown in Charlie Zeiger's Milton J. Yarberry, Albu- Restaurant on March 27, 1881.

_Yarberry_was_exoperated_ on his contention that he shot in self delense, but it was known that he and Brown were rivals for the affections of a local girl.

On June 18, 1831, Yarberry shot and killed Charles D. Campbell, a 32-year-old carpenter, in front of a First St. saloon. Campbell apparently was cuilty of little more than disturbing the peace.

Albuquerque citizens, be-lieving that Yarberry was hiding behind his badge to settle personal differences ina rather permanent way, demanded immediate action, and the constable was charged with murder.

Tried and convicted of murder, Yarberry was lodged in the Santa Fe jail during his various appeals of the verdict, which were in vain. He escaped ouce, but was captured three days later. Old Town Scaffold

Brought to Albuquerque on Feb. 9, 1883, Yarberry was taken to the scaffold which had been prepared for him in the yard of an adobe jail just east of the Old Town Plaza.

There, at 3 p.m., still protesting his innocence, Yarberry paid the supreme penalty before a crowd of about 150 persons. He lies buried today in a cemetery in Martineztown.

Shortly before he was hanged in Albuquerque S3 years ago this week, Constable Milton J. Yarberry confided his life story to a close personal friend, Elwood Maden.

Mr. Maden was sworn to secrecy, however, and the details of Milt Yarberry's career are little known to this

The doomed man admitted that his real name was not. Milton J. Yarberry — which did not surprise anybody — but Maden did not reveal the constable's true name as revealed to him.

Maden did reveal that Yar-, berry's original home was at Walnut Ridge in northeastern. Arkansas, and that he had three courins living there at the time of his execution on Feb. 9, 1883.

Yarberry said that he was the son of respectable parents, that he did not know whether or not they were yet living, but that he had changed; his name to protect them.

Yarberry admitted that he had been involved in some shooting scrapes over the years, but denied that he had killed anybody other than the two men he shot down in Albuquerque in the spring of 1931.

NEWSPAPERS in Albuquerque, at the time of Y a rberry's execution, gave some of the details of the officer's life and career, but based mostly on hearsay and speculation.

After leaving Arkansas, it was said, he wandered through Texas, to Dailas, Housewand Orange, and then went on to Fort Smith, Ark. 





Searching for Indexed Terms¹

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.
