Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

We have had since the organization, thirty-one pastors. It appears from the records that some of the years that the church was without a regular pastor, as in the year 1866, when Elders Manning, Cross and Miller preached at times for the church.

The membership at present numbers one hundred and two. An increase of 100 per cent since moving to Winona.

The church has two record books. The first from the organization until December, 1876. From November, 1874 to December 1876 the records have been torn and mutilated, and there is no record for about two years. With this little gap of two years in it, we have the records of the church for nearly 54 years. We find names of members on these old rolls who once filled their seats regularly, who have gone to join the great reunion on the other shore. There is not a living member today who was in the church in '49.

Sister Margaret Marsh was the last one of the charter members. She died on April 18, 1901. She was a member in the organization, and at her death, a little over fifty-one years.

I will not go into details naming these old members. Most of them were buried in Harris Creek grave yard and surrounding grave yards in the county.

We find from the records that the church disciplined her members closer than at present. The members were dealt with for using profane language, intemperance, not paying their just debts, having labor performed on Sunday, etc. We notice one brother who was arraigned for picking cotton on Sunday, and another for hiring and making contracts on Sunday with laborers.


We find on the rolls of forty and fifty years ago the names of servants who were members until their emancipation in 1865. The colored population who were members were slaves, and were members in the church with the whites. They had no separate organization or church. They were received as members in all of the churches. There was a portion of the church house assigned to the colored members, and colored part of the congregation. After they were emancipated they organized colored churches, and the white churches granted letters when called for that they might unite with their churches. The writer knows of but one living who was a member of Harris Creek church, and was lettered out after emancipation. His name is Anthony Watts living near Winona.

Will state that at present old Harris Creek church presents a bright future. Our beloved pastor, Rev. W. T. Rouse, is a true minister and pastor indeed, and the church is in fine working order under his care.

We have a fine Sabbath school, superintended by brother Henry Bronch. We can say of him, that he is the right man in the right place.

In concluding this sketch, will state that these grand old pioneer Baptist ministers of thirty, forty and fifty years ago, laid broad and deep the foundations of this great state. And also of later, but equally as worthy, characters who by their self-sacrifice for the cause of our Redeemer, have continued to carry on these foundations.

I will not at any time say anything individually of these great and good men found on our church rolls. Nearly all of these old pioneer preachers and church members have died, and their spirits have gone to greet the Master, and to receive that great declaration from Him, "welcome thou good and faithful servants; enter thou into the joy of the Lord."

Public education has always been one of the aims of the State of Texas as evidenced by its first state constitution in 1845 which called for the setting aside of not less than one-tenth of its annual revenue from taxation for a permanent school fund. This slowly growing fund was supplemented by legislation passed in January 1854 which was strongly supported by the Governor, Elisha E. Pease. A special school fund of two million dollars was set aside from the state treasury with the interest to be apportioned to the various counties based on their school age population. Furthermore, each county's school board was to consist of the chief justice (county judge) and the county commissioners. Though the 1854 law did not bring immediate results of statewide school systems, it was the first of a series of legislation to bring about the Texas public school system of today.

To further comply with the 1854 law, Jonathan Lewter of Smith County joined eighty-eight other tax assessors and collectors to compile a scholastic census of their respective counties. This list was transmitted to the county clerk, R.W. Chapman, and then sent to the state treasurer. For qualifying districts, appropriations amounted to sixty-two cents per child.

A photostatic copy of this first scholastic census of Smith County is part of the collection of Texas history of the Dallas Public Library. The census is divided into nine districts which strongly correspond to the Smith County Commissioners Court districts of that day:

1. Tyler 4. Starrville 7. Whitehouse 10. Garden Valley

2. Mt. Vernon 5. Jamestown 8. Mt. Carmel

3. Flora 6. Canton 9. Seven Leagues with the exception that District 10 is combined with District 3 on the scholastic census. The census lists the head of the household with the names of all school age children living there. For purposes of this publication, each district has been alphabetized.

The reader, especially a family researcher, should be aware of possible sources of errors in this list. Census takers often spelled names as they heard them and may have used unique spellings for even common names. The transcriber for this publication has, to the best of his ability, copied the list with the same spellings, even when errors are known to exist, but the penmanship of the original rolls often is difficult to decipher. Some names presented here are "best guesses", or, checked as closely as possible with the 1850 and 1860 United States population schedules. A final source of error is the fact that even though the children in a household may have a different surname, (stepchildren, for example), this fact was not noted on this census.

Donald, youngest son of the Charles Richard Yarborough's, a Dallas attorney, graduate of SMU Law School, married Nina McClain, niece of Congressman Nat Patton, now deceased. Their three sons, Charles (graduate of U.T. Law School) and Bill are attorneys of Bedford, and John, in public service, lives at Irving, Texas. Both Charles and John have children.

Janette Yarborough served a term as postmaster at Chandler, by designation of Congressman Nat Patton, married Dr. Oren Murphy, a Tyler podiatrist, scion of a pioneer Van Zandt County family. Their two children, Kay of Houston and Mike of Austin, each have children. Mike has an earned doctorate degree in English from The University of Texas, has taught in Saudi Arabia, was Chairman of the English Department in the American University in Beirut, Lebanon, and now teaches English in The University of Texas at Austin.

Ralph Webster Yarborough, seventh child in the Yarborough family, born in 1903, finished high school at Chandler and Tyler, was a cadet at the U. S. M. A. at West Point for a year, taught school at Delta and Martin Springs, near Chandler, for a total of three terms, attended Sam Houston State University at Huntsville a semester, worked his way to Europe on a ship, spent a year as a student and worker in Europe (1921 - 22), principally in Germany, graduated with highest

honors from The University of Texas Law School, taught briefly in U.T. Law School, practiced law in El Paso three and one-half years.


In 1928, Ralph Yarborough married Opal Warren of the Chandler Warrens. She graduated from Tyler High School and Texas Woman's University with high honors and was chairman of the Home Economics Department of Pine Bluff, Arkansas, High School at the time of marriage.

Ralph served as Assistant Attorney General under James V. Allred three years and nine months, winning for the Texas school fund an oil and gas bonus and rental in 3,901,000 acres of land in one of the largest land suits ever tried in Texas, appointed to four offices by Governor Allred, served five years as a Texas District Judge in Austin, volunteered and commissioned a Captain in the Army in World War II, served three and one-half years (two years, and nine months of that on the staff of the 97th Infantry Division), in General Eisenhower's Crusade in Europe, in General George Patton's Third Army when Germany surrendered, redeployed and served a year in Japan under General Douglas MacArthur in military government (in charge of military government over 1/7 of area and population of Japan when that duty ended) awarded eight military citations and medals, practiced law in Austin 1946 - 57, ran for Governor 1952, '54, '56, elected to U.S. Senate in 1957 and elected to two more terms, serving 13 years and eight months, Chairman of a major Senate Committee and on Senate Appropriations Committee at same time, author of bills creating Guadalupe Mountains and Padre Island National Parks, led fight for Big Thicket National Preserve, author of Cold War GI Bill under which seven million veterans have been to school and college, and other

bills, where eight million more students have been to college, called "Mr. Education of the Senate," passed more national legislation than any other Senator from Texas, received many awards, medals, citations, honorary citizenships of counties and cities, and two honorary degrees, served on the Board of Trustees of Gallaudet College for the Deaf in Washington.

TALLAPOOSA COUNTY.

Established by act December 18, 1832. Takes its name from the Tallapoosa river, which flows through the county. Lies in the east centre of the State, near the Georgia line. The location was about three miles from the river. This is beautiful rolling prairie country. The lovely old mansion of Rosemount is not far from where they lived.

Phoebe died between this date and 1842 as George married Ada Amason 1 August 1842. His first wife was Phoebe Wyatt, the daughter of Zachariah Wyatt of Henry County, Tennessee, (will give proof for this statement later).

Richard and Leanna Yarborough sold land in Greene County, Alabama, to Richard Inge 30 June 1832 - Deed Book E-2h6.

William and Bethsheba Yarbrough patented land in T21 R3E Sec 21. If you will examine a highway map of alabama you will see Hiway #h3 from Eutaw to Demopolis. "The Erie Gazette" a newspaper printed in Greene County in 1830 gave a list of unclaimed letters as of July 1830. William C. Yarbrough's name was among those listed.

The following notice was in the "Erie Gazette": Notice to carpenters - Meeing House Contract to be let on 15 January 1832 at the home of Mr. Yarbrough's, signed James F. May, Simon Ashford, George Yarborough and Thomas Williams."

I made the statement that Phoebe Yarbrough died between 1839 and 1842. I can pinpoint the time of her death better than that. George and Phoebe Yarborough witnessed the signature of Elizabeth Chambers on 9 August 1841, this was in Sumter County. I have never been able to find where Phoebe is buried. I have been to all the known cemeteries in the area where he lived, and have found many

cemeteris unknown to present day citizens. George married Ada Amason on l August 1842. The Amasons were from Edgecombe County, N.C. They (Georges family) were still living in Greene County in 1840, or the census taker failed to get them if the had moved to Sumter. I believe they moved to Sumter County right after the death of his father, William Yarborough which occurred soon after the 1840 census was taken. The 1840 census is very hard to read due to the fact that the writing is dim and is said to have been patched, etc. We do find the following Yarbroughs in Sumter County census which was completed in October 1840:

of 1840 but only William signed a deed to Temperance Watkins in the late summer of 1840. It is my opinion that Bethsheba died between these dates. It is also my opinion that William died at the home of his daughter, Temperance Watkins. . She was living, at that time, just north of "Yarbrough Field" which I have marked on the Sumter County map which is enclosed. She lived exactly 12 miles north of Sumterville, or two townships north, both in sections 13 of their twps. If this is true, and I think it is, he is buried and probably Bathsheba) at old Providence Cemetery - Baptist, and the only Baptist church in that part of the county. There used to be several acres in this cemetery, but today there are only ten or 15 stones left. The cemetery is in pasture, with a very few stones fenced in. The old church as been torn down 60 or more years. I made a trip to this old cemetery looking for the Yarbrough graves. A negro told me he knew where there was a Yarbrough marker and took me to the sopt where he thought it was; there was no marker there. He said he remembered the name Yarbrough because he had a colored friend named Yarbrough, and it was an odd name. I did find a stone or two half buried in the pasture soil near where he thought the Yarbrough marker was.

I am working on the idea that William Yarborough and his wife Bethsheba were cousins. It will only confuse you to tell you my reasons but sometime in the future I hope to give you some details about why I think so.

William and Bethsheba Yarborough had eight (8) children whom he named in his —no not his will — but were named in the settlement of his estate; he died intestate. The widow was not named, nor did she ever petition for dower, as way thecustom in those days when the head of the house died intestate. I feel sure that Bethsheba died sometime during the summer of 18hC, after the census was taken in her section of the county. The children named in the settlement were: Richard (named administratro to begin with), George, William C., Harvey, Margaret wife of David Jackson, Susan wife of John May, Mary wife of Walter May and Temperance Watkins widow of Charles H. Watkins. (To be continued.)

In September 1840 these administrators reported estate insolvent. On 4 November 1843, they were discharged from administration and JAMES HAIR was appointed, who in May, 1845 reported the estate insolvent.

Between the years 1847 and 1854 three Yarbrough brothers and some cousins moved to Smith (ounty, Texas, from Sumter (o., Mabama. (oming with a wagon-train of a dozen families, William (. and Harvey A. brought their families but Richard's wife was ailing and could not travel, so after a few months he had to return home to Alabama. These brothers were sons of William and Bathsheba Yarborough, ca 1760-70, from North (arolina. About 1808-10 they joined the Western movement into Tennessee, establishing residence in Stewart (ounty. By 18183 they moved on into Alabama where they received a land grand in 1818, in St. (lain (ounty, then on to Green (ounty where several of their children married. Richafd married Leannah Braziel April 6, 1824. They finally settled in Sumter (ounty, Ala. in 1832 where William and Bathsheba died ca 1840. Their other known children were George, Mary, Margaret, Susan and Temperance.

William (. age 4), a vetern of the Mexican War, arrived in Texas with his two teen-age sons and second wife, (atherine Boyd. He settled first in Smith (o. but by 1850 had found Land more to his Liking and moved just across the County line to Wood, settling there where he reared a Large family.

Harvey A, age 35, vetern of the Mexican War, also came in 1847 with his young wife, Margaret Miller and three young children. Descendants Live in the area to this day.

Richard, age 47, had intended to return to Texas as soon as his wife's health improved, but instead gave in to her pleas and moved from Sumter (of Choctaw Co. Mabama, to be near her French-speaking relatives. Finally, in Late 1851 he was able to bring his family to Texas and he settled near his brother, Harvey, in the Garden Valley area of Smith County. His childten, nearly all grown, eventually found mates in Smith County: Columbus Perry m. M.N. Speer in 1859, then in 1879 Mrs. Emily Hill. Margaret m. D. A. Wilson in 1857; William B. m. Mary Jane Parsey in 1865, Stephen M. m. Lucinda Hitt in 1866, then Nancy Jane Arthur in 1876. Pauline H. m. James Anders in 1857 and when she died Anders married her sister Martha Ann in 1865. They resided in Marlin, Texas. Richard W. married Mrs. Martha A. Rasberry, widow of John Rasberry in 1863. Richard, Sr. 's wife, Learnah Bruzile Y., Lived seven years after moving to Texas, and the next year, 1859, his married Mrs. Frances E. Darsey, age 39, a widow with six children, the oldest not yet 18 and the youngest age three. (Her daughter, Mary Jane became the wife of William Bruziel Y. her step-son).

By September 1858 the community had grown so that residents decided to organize and build a place of worship nearer to them. Many had been attending the Baptisk (hurch at Antioch or holding services in A Brush Arbor on Harvey Y's Land. So it was that Harvey Yarborough donated 10 acres of his land for the (hurch and Graveyard space. With 23 Letters presented and approved by the Elders, the Hopewell Baptist (hurch was born and built at the Swann community and it is still in existence, housing regular services.

By 1861 the threat of war between the Stites erusted into a call to arms, and Harvey, having served in the Mexicin War, was asked to organize a company of Local enlistees. He became the Captain of the 4th Sub-Division of the 5th Military District, Smith & Wood Counties, 12th Brigade, Texas State Troops. This Company Later merged with others and tecame the famous "Douglas" Texas Battery". This Battery saw action at Murfreesboro, (hickamauga, Kennesaw Mountain, Atlanta, Franklin, Nashville and Mobile, and other engagements enforcing the famous Hood's Brigade, wirning Lusting fame and honor for Texas and the Confederacy. It was commanded by James P. Dauglas of Tyler, Texas. Three of Richard Yarborough, Sr. 15. Sons: Wm. B., Stephen M., and Richard W., served in this Battery. Uso three of Richard, Sr. s. step-sons served: Ben (. Darsey in (o. K, 3d Texas (avalry, James H. in (apt. Harvey Yarborough's Company, and Henry (. age only 16, in (o. (. 14th Texas Infantry. Ill six of these men served and fought many bloody battles and returned home at the end of the War.

Richard Yarborough, Sr. was engaged in farming after his move to Texas. He also worked with his brother Harvey in his Ginning business. During the War he worked in the Gun and Amunition Plant in Tyler. After the was he joined his son Perry in the Blacksmity trude. He died in 1868 and is buried in the Hopewell (hurch Cemetery.

Richard's son, William Braziel married his young step-sister, Mary Jane Barsey at the end of the War, on Nov. 7, 1865. They had five children: Eliz. Leanna, Richard Young, William Ambrose, Eudora Temperance - called "Daisey" and Mary Pauline, who died in infancy. Wm. B. died Nov. 24, 1878, and is buried in Mansfield, Texas. Mary Jane died Nov. 7, 1887, and is buried at Morgan, Bosque (o. Tex. "Daisey" Yarborough murried Daniel F. Hubbard, Sept. 13, 1900 in Hillsboro, Texas, and died Mug. 14, 1948, and he, May 26, 1954. Both are buried in Cleburne Memorial Cometery. These two were my parents.

Before moving to Texas, Richard, Sr. had served as School Trustee and Justice of the Peace in Sumter (o. Ala. He ran a Ginning business, a Mill and Overated a Ferry with his brother, Harvey. All of these Farburoughs were educated, respected citizens, serving their country and communities and churches to the best of their abilities.

This Fruit Cake Recipe was brought into Texas by the YARBOROUGHS, who came to Texas originally from the Carolinas by way, and stops, Jerny in Alabama and Mississippi. The first Yarboroughs came to East Texas in the 1830s and continued to come until the mid-1850s and just before Civil War. "Cousin Tempie" was TEMPERANCE YARBOROUGH of Smith County, Texas. She was Aunt of Senator Ralph Yarborough. Maybe he can assist you in preparing this fruit cake.

Knowing South Carolina as I do I am sure this was called a FRUIT CAKE RECEIPT. Charleston does not have RECIPES; they have RECEIPTS.



married in Alabama, and moved to Louisianain 1846. There his father was engaged in farming until 1857, when he moved to Austin county, Texas. Since locating in this State he has been engaged in farming and stock-raising. During the late war he served in the Confederate army. In 1862 his family moved from Austin county to Washington county, his wife having died at the former place just previous to their removal. After the war Mr. Wood was married in 1865, to Mrs. Ann McGregor, widow of Dr. McGregor, brother of Dr. L. C. McGregor. He moved to Salado, Bell county, in 1882, and there he still resides. By his first wife he had six children, four of whom lived to be grown, viz.: J. Carson, the oldest; Ann, wife of John L. Lockett, of Brenham; Francis A., wife of C. C. Lockett, also of Brenham; and Jennie, wife of A. M. Caskie, of Salado. The children by his last wife are Thomas A., Jr.; Allie, wife of M. Robinson; and Mamie. Mr. Wood is connected with the Masouic fraternity, and is a prominent member of the Methodist Church, to which he has been attached for forty-five years.

Dr. J. Carson Wood received his literary education in the common schools of the county and in the LaGrange schools. At the age of twenty-two he commenced reading medicine under Dr. R. W. Thompson, of Nelsonville, Austin county, and continued with him for eighteen months. He then entered the University of Louisiana (now Tulane University,) New Orleans, where he completed his medical course, graduating with the class of 1874-'75. Returning to Texas he began the practice of his profession in Washington county, continuing there two or three years. He then moved to Welcome, Austin county, and from there, in 1884, came to McLennan county, locating where he now resides. He has a handsome home and is surrounded with all the comforts of life. He has an extensive and lucrative practice, and stands high in the community, both as a skillful physician and as an honored citizen. He is a member of the State Central

Medical Association. Dr. Wood is prominently connected with the Masonic order, being a member of the G. W. Foster Lodge, No. 306, of Austin county. He is a member of the Missionary Baptist Church. He owns valuable real estate, from which he derives considerable revenue, having a farm of 250 acres in Wichita county.


The Doctor was married in 1872, to Miss Belle Eldridge, of Washington county, Texas, daughter of C. B. and Ann (Daniel) Eldridge. To them were born ten children, four of whom died when small. The others are Edna E., Irene I., John L., Gertrude, Goldie and Frank. Mrs. Wood departed this life February 24, 1891, in the thirty-fifth year of her age. She was a member of the Baptist Church for three years previous to her death, and was an active church worker.

H. ANDERS, a farmer and stock-raiser of Falls county, was born in Monroe county, Alabama, April 28, 1833, the sixth of thirteen children born to Stephen R. and Sarah (Hammett) Anders, natives of Georgia. In 1818 the parents emigrated to Monroe county, Alabama, and in 1849 to Clarke county, Mississippi, where the father died in 1864, and the mother in 1851.

J. H. Anders, our subject, remained in Monroe county, Alabama, until fifteen years of age, when he went to Clarke county, Mississippi. When twenty-two years of age he came to Falls county, Texas, and improved a farm for W. L. Long, on the Brazos river, and was engaged as overseer on that plantation during the war. Mr. Anders had two brothers in the service from Mississippi. Stephen went from near Charles-ron, served throughout the struggle, and had the misfortune to lose an eye. John went from Clarke county, and was killed at the battle of Atlanta. After his marriage our subject settled on a farm in the northern part of Falls county, but later sold this place and bought land near

Marlin, in the Brazos bottom, where he now has 475 acres in a good state of cultivation. In 1869 he moved to this city, where he has since resided, and is devoting his time to his farming interests. He is independent in his political views, and is a charter member of Marlin Lodge, No. 152, A. F. & A. M.

Mr. Anders was married, in Smith county, Texas, in 1857, to Miss Pauline Yarborough, a native of Alabama, and a daughter of Richard and Leana Yarborough, natives of South Carolina. In an early day the parents moved to Alabama, and in 1854 to Smith county, Texas, where the mother died in 1858, and the father in 1868. Mr. and Mrs. Anders have had four children: Ida, widow of L. B. Chilton; Leana, wife of W. J. De Bardelen, a merchant of Amarilla, Potter county, Texas; Emma, wife of C. T. Hunter, also a merchant of Amarilla; and Willis Lang, who died in 1867, aged five years. Mr. Anders has witnessed the full development of Falls county, and has taken an active interest in everything for the good of his city and county.



ITTLE BERNY BARTON, an honored pioneer of Marlin, Texas, was born in Wilson county, Tennessee, February 27, 1819, and was the son of David and Sarah (Borum) Barton, both natives of Virginia. The paternal grandfather of the subject of this sketch was also David Baaton, who was likewise a native of the Old Dominion, and of English descent. He was a brave soldier in the Revolutionary war, and survived until the advanced age of ninety-six years, dying at his home on Stone river, in Tennessee. His wife continued to reside on the same place until her death, at the age of ninety-seven. David, their son, and father of the subject of this notice, served efficiently in the war of 1812. Sarah Borum's father, Richard, was for many years a resident of Virginia, but was born in England and died in Wilson county, Tennessee, aged ninety-six.

His wife lived to the great age of ninety-seven years.

In an early day, the parents of the subject of this notice removed to Tennessee, at a time when that country was a wilderness. They settled on Stone river, in Rutherford county, where they pursued agriculture. Thence they removed to Fayette county, Alabama, where the father served many years as a magistrate, in connection with his farming interests. In 1837, Richard Albert, a brother of Mr. Barton of this biography, emigrated to Texas, locating first in Houston, later going to Falls county, whence his parents, in 1844, followed him, passing there the remainder of their days. The father was elected a magistrate soon after his arrival, in which capacity he continued to serve until his death in 1853, at the age of sixty-four years. His devoted wife died in 1848, aged sixty years. They had nine children, seven of whom attained maturity; of these the subject of this sketch, who was the fifth son and fifth child, in the sole survivor.

Mr. Barton, of this biography, passed his youth on a farm, receiving but limited educational advantages. In 1844, he assumed his father's position of Magistrate in Alabama, made vacant by the latter's removal to Texas, and continued to act in this capacity until December 1, 1848, when he also removed to the Lone Star State, settling February 7, 1849, within a mile and a half of the present site of Marlin. Upon the organization of the county in 1850, Mr. Barton was elected County Clerk, serving in that capacity two terms. He then resumed his farming pursuits until the beginning of the war. Although he was opposed to secession, yet after the struggle had-commenced he served until its close in the Quartermaster's Department, after which he once more commenced farming, in which occupation he has ever since continued.

Mr. Barton was first married in Mississippi, December 31, 1840, to Miss Jane Davis, a native of Alabama, and daughter of John L. and Elizabeth (Lolla) Davis. They had six children, all of whom attained maturity, and all now do-

PAULINE JONES GANDRUD

The late Pauline Jones Gandrud was born May 9, 1904, in Huntsville, Alabama, the daughter of George Walter and Elvalena (Moore) Jones. Both paternal and maternal ancestors from Virginia were some of the earliest settlers of Madison County, Alabama, dating from about 1803 to 1809. After graduating from Wills Prep School in Huntsville, Alabama, in 1921, she studied two years at the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore as a piano pupil of Pasquale Tallarico and subsequently taught music for several years.

In Huntsville, Alabama, on November 29, 1830, Pauline Jones married Bennie William Gandrud, a mining engineer with the U.S. Bureau of Mines on the university campus at Tuscaloosa. They had one son, William Bentley Gandrud, born August 18, 1939, in Birmingham. A graduate of the University of Alabama with a Ph.D. in Physics from Johns Hopkins University, he is currently a physicist and supervising engineer at the Bell Telephone Laboratory in Atlanta, Georgia.

After becoming interested in the subject of genealogy at the early age of 17, she was encouraged to continue this interest by her sister-in-law, Kathleen Paul Jones. Together they collaborated in the researching and typing of Alabama county records until Kathleen's death in December, 1967.

With the help of her sister-in-law, the late Kathleen Paul Jones, she copies records from 40 counties to compile 245 volumes of rare information. Mrs. Gandrud dutifully typed up her findings, arranged them in books of at least 100 pages, made 10 carbon copies on onionskin, and set about selling her records to libraries and interested individuals. Over the years, the Birmingham Public Library and the Library of Congress have availed themselves of her work. When a library would notify her that a copy had worn out from overuse, she would sell another, and when the 10 copies of each volume were gone, she would type up the volume again. She loved adding notations about the people in the records, such as where they lived during a given census, where buried, etc., and these notes are a gold mine in themselves.





Searching for Indexed Terms¹

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears.
