NATIONAL YARBHOUGH CONFERENCE HELD IN NORTH CAROLINA, HONORS CHARLES DAVID YARBOROUGH

The 1987 National Yarbrough Conference was held in Charlotte, North Carolina, on the week-end of September 26, 27 and 28. The conference was held as a memorial to Charles David Yarborough of Bedford, Texas, who died unexpectedly in September, 1985.

Charles David Yarborough was founder, editor and publisher of the "Yarborough Family Magazine" and one of the founders of the National Yarbrough Conference. He was sulogized at the conference Family Banquet on Saturday night by Charles Henry Yarbro.

His uncle, former U.S. Senator Halph W. Yarborough of Austin, Texas, continued the tribute commenting on the success of the four national meetings, Petersburg, Virginia, Nashville, Tennessee, Fort Worth, Texas, and Charlotte. Senator Yarborough, principal speaker at all four of the sessions, told of the origins and lives of early English family members and the myths and legends of American ancestors.

Bob and Jane Yarbrough of Charlotte arranged and conducted the conference and had charge of the banquet program. Coordinated table covers, flower arrangements and programs provided a beautiful cetting for the delicious banquet buffet. The podlum was graced with a large colored portrait of Charles David Yarborough and the Family Crest. Ann Dugger, a young Charlotte historian and librarian told the gathering of the early days of "Queen Charlotte's Town."

Besides his uncle, members of Charles David Yarborough"s family present were his father, Bonald Yarborough, and Mrs. Yarborough of Tyler, Texas; and his brother and wife, Mr. and Mrs. Bill H. Yarborough of Bedford, Texas.

Coming from all over the United States, with several from California, family members and related family members total of 105 registered for the conference. Ninety four attended the banquet. Many of the delegate arrived on Thursday and spent days and evenings in workshops and group gatherings, exchanging family information and history. A copying machine was provided. Dinner and dining groups enjoyed good conversation and fellowship, Several made sightseeing tours of the historic city.

The 1987 National Yarbrough Conference will be held in St. Leuis, Missouri, with tentatives dates of August 7 and 8, 1987, Ms. Arlene Weldinger, and her mother, Mrs. May Sidney, of St. Louis, both of whom have attended all the conferences, will serve as hostesses.

NATIONAL YARBROUGH CONFERENCE NAMES BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO PULFILL DREAMS

An ad hoc committee of the National Yarbrough Conference, seeting at Holiday Inn Woodlawn, Charlotte, N.C., in September, 1986, selected a board of directors for the family organization to fulfill the dreams of founders. A governoring board was deemed necessary for the continuancy of bringing family mumbers, all spallings and all branches from all over the United States, together.

Selected as voting members of the board of directors are Allen S. Yarbrough of Virginia, chairman; R.P. Yarbrough of North Carolina; Ms. Arlane Weidinger, Missouri; Phillip Yarbrough, Loyd T. Yarbrough and Charles H. Yarbro, all of Tennesses; and Ms. Karen Magock, Virginia.

Accepting honorary board of director memberships in advisory capacities were Senator Rulph W. Yarborough , Donald Yerborough, and Bill H. Yarborough, all Texas attorneys.

The new board named Charles M. Yarbro as editor of an interim family news sheet until resumption of the "Yarborough Family Magazine" publication could be worked out. 





BE IT KNOWN THAT I, JAS. H. SAVAGE, RAISED AND EQUIPPED A COMPANY OF CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS, AT GOSHEN, CHEROKEE CO., ALA., WHICH WAS MUSTERED INTO SERVICE AT HUNTSVILLE, ALA., THE TENTH DAY OF AUGUST 1861. AND BECAME CO. 1. OF THE 19th. REGIMENT OF ALA., VOLUNTEERS, UPON THE ORGANIZATION OF THAT REGIMENT.

THAT LINDSEY YARBROUGH ENLISTED IN SAID COMPANY AT THE AGE OF SEXTEEN (sic) YEARS AND SIX MONTHS. HE WAS TRUE TO HIS DUTIES AND FAITHFUL AS THE TRUEST AND FAITHFUL SOLDIERS OR OFFICERS IN THE CONFEDERATE ARMY. ALWAYS PRESENT FOR DUTY AT ROLL CALL, ON THE MARCH AND IN BATTLE.



20th (RUSSELL'S) TENNESSEE CAVALRY REGIMENT Also called 15th Tennessee Cavalry Regiment

Organized February 5, 1864; consolidated March, 1865 with 18th, also called 19th (Newsom's) Regiment and paroled as 19th and 20th Consolidated Tennessee Cavalry Regiment at Gainesville, Alabama, May, 1865.

This regiment was organized on order of Major General N. B. Forrest in the reorganization and consolidation of his forces after he was appointed to the command of the cavalry forces in West Tennessee and North Mississippi. Many of the men, including the lieutenant colonel and major, were members of Greer's Tennessee Cavalry (q.v.), which had been raised within the Federal lines in West Tennessee during the fall of 1863, but which never received recognition from the Adjutant and Inspector General's Office.



19th (BIFFLE'S) TENNESSEE CAVALRY REGIMENT Known in field, mustered as, and paroled as 9th Tennessee Cavalry Regiment

Organized October 3, 1862; officially designated 19th; paroled at Gainesville, Alabama Alay 1885.

Colonel Jacob B. Biffle was originally lieutenant colonel, 2nd (Biffle's) Battalion; then colonel of 6th (1st) Tennessee Cavalry Regiment; into which his battalion was merged in May, 1862. When this regiment was reorganned June 12, 1862, with James T. Wheeler elected as colonel, Biffle set out to raise a new regiment, which had no connection with the other two organizations except for the fact that Biffle was at different times commanding officer of all three. He completed organization of the regiment, and was commissioned as its colonel, as of October 3, 1802

On November 27, 1862, General Bragg ordered Colonels Biflle and Napier to report, with their commands, to General Joseph Wheeler for duty at LaVergne, Tennessee. However, on December 11, Federal reports placed Biffle and Cox on Indian Creek, 20 miles east of Savannah, from which place they moved with General Forrest on his raid into West Tennessee the last half of December. General Forrest reported that Biffle, with about 400 men, was with him in the attack on Jackson, December 19, and Colonel Dibrell reported Biffle's regiment engaged at Parker's Crossroads, December 31, 1862.

On January 25, 1863, General Gideon J. Pillow, Chief of the Conscript Bureau, reported Biffle's regiment was engaged in making a sweep of Bedford County, rounding up stragglers and conscripts. On March 5, Biffle's regiment was in Forrest's Brigade in the capture of Thompson Station, and was again with Forrest as a part of Starnes' Brigade at Brentwood, March 25, although it did not take part in the actual assault and capture of that position. It was engaged in skirmishes at Chapel Hill, April 10, and near Savannah, May 29.

For the next several months, the regiment was in West Tennessee, enforcing the conscript act, and engaging in frequent skirmishes with the Federal forces. During this time it was reported as part of a brigade commanded at times by Colonel Cox, at other times by Colonel Dibrell, in Forrest's Division, consisting of Starnes' 4th, Cox's 10th, Holman's 11th, Dibrell's 8th, and Biffle's Regiments.

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LYNWOOD YARBROUGH EXPLAINS WHAT HAPPEN TO LEE'S SUPPLIES

Appeared in THE COMMERICIAL APPEAL, Danville, VA, April 12, 1971

To the editor:

Upon the 106th anniversary of Lee's surrender at Appointation, may I reveal an event that I have recently discovered concerning the last days of the Confederacy? This should be of particular interest to those who call "The Last Capital of the Confederacy" their dom-

There has always been much mystery concerning the supply train that departed from Danville, bound for a rendezvous with the army of Northern Virginia at Amelia Court House. Recently, while engaged in tracing the activities relating to the regiment of which my grandfather served, I stumbled upon some facts revealing thy these desperately needed supplies never reached Lee's starving army.

Near the turn of this century, the Gen-

eral Assembly of North Carolina author-ized the printing of "Histories of the Reg-iments in the Great War 1861-1865." This endeavourment contains personal autheutic knowledge written by members of their respective commands and edited

by Walter Clark, Lieut. Colonel in 1901. Col. W. H. Cheek of the 9th Regiment, Henderson, North Carolina, states that upon April 5, 1865, he was captured at Jetersville by Yankee scouts of Sheridan, disguised in Confederate uniforms. Major Young was in charge of the scouts. We quote verbalim from Col. Cheek:
"He told me a circumstance that ex-

plains a piece of history which no historian of the closing days of the war has ex-plained that I have seen. It has been an unexplained mustery why the seventyfive thousands rations which General Lee had ordered from Danville to be sent to Amelia Court House were not there upon the arrival of his army. Some say it was the fault of the Superintendent of the Richmond & Danville Railroad; others put the blame on the commissary at Danville, and there are some who say it was the fault of President Davis. I suppose that I am the only person in the Confederate Army of Northern Virginia at that time who knew the true reason, and I got my information direct from first hands. The lack of these rations was a most disastrous blow to General Lee's plans. For the want of them he lost one day at Amelia Court House in the vain effort to impress food from the surrounding country to feed his famished army. During this day Sheridan with ten thousand cavairy and two corps

of infantry troops, was pushing rapidly forward to get between him and Danville and thereby prevent his junction with the army of General Johnston in North Carolina. Now, when Petersburg was evacuated, General Lee had to move across the country, away from railroad and telegraph lines. To send a telegram he must needs forward it by a mounted he must needs forward it by a mounted courier through the country to a telegraph office. This message to the commissary at Danville was thus sent, Major Young told me that it had not left General Lee's headquarters two hours befor he

had it in his yest-pocket, and it was promptly forwarded to Gineral Grant instead of to Deaville. So, neither the instant of the transition of the super-intendent of the rathroad, nor President Davis, was to blame for this disaster, so fatal to our army."

May I thank you for permitting me this insertion in "The Commercial Appeal," May this narrative be beneficial to young Southerners as they study Virginia before.

Brigade loss: Killed, 116; W, 567; M, 68- 751.

Children: James William Y b. 1860; John Y. b. 1863; Joe Duncan b. 1862; Alfred F. b. 1865; Thomas Lorenzo Y b. 1868. Parents of Alfred Lorenzo Y. were John Swanson and Elizabeth (Gailbrath) Y. John Swanson Y b. 25 Dec 1777-England. Children: Joseph Randolph Y, b. 31 Jan 1817, TN; John Swanson Y. Jr. b. 27 Mar 1819, AR; Lucinda Jane Y. b. 1 Jun 1821-AR; Mariah F. Y. b. 10 Jan 1825, AR; Alfred Alonzo Y. b. 14 Oct 1828, Ar. William B. Y. b. 1837, TX. John Swanson may have married 2-3 times. Does anyone have the names of the children of Richard Yarbrough and birthdates? Richard b. 1615, England, d. 1702 in Prince George Co. Wife: Frances Proctor. Wilva Y. Blue, 998 Sheckler Cutoff, Fallon NV 89406.

b. 25 Dec 1777, NC. Family tradition and birthplaces of some of JOHN SWANSON Y. the known children place him in TN, LA and AR. Found on 1820 Census of Hempstead Co, Arkansas Territory. On 17 Jun 1831 he sold his farm in Arkansas Territory, Township of Mine Creek, near town of Ozan to Matthew Gray of Town of Washington, Hempstead Co. AR. Swanson entered Texas Feb. 1832, at San Augustine as shown on his entrance certificate on file at the General Land Office in Austin. The entrance certificate lists him as a native of NC, a married man with a family of ten persons. Land Office also holds entrance certificates for his two sons, Joseph Randolp Yarbrough & John Swanson Yarbrough, Jr., both single. Have numerous land records for him and I believe he may have been more of a land speculator than a farmer-rancher. A Dallas Morning News article, September 20, 1835, stated Swanson was the operator of the first hotel at Crockett, TX. His grandchildren (children of Joseph Randolph Y) made the statement. Exact number of wives of Swanson is unknown .. family tradition says his first wife was Elizabeth Gailbraith but no proof of this. Second wife is unknown but believed to be a Coker and sister to his third wife, Frances Coker Moore Tope who he married in Houston Co., TX Who were the parents of John Swanson Y? Where were they from? about 1845. In Oct 1862 John Swanson Y was shot and killed in his corral by a horse trader, believed to be Engate or Wingate, in a dispute over a horse. He was buried at Yarbrough's Bend, a few hundred yars from the bend of the river that was named for him. U.S. Department of Reclamation, when building Choke Canyon Dam over the Frio River, removed the graves from Yarbrough's Bend Cemetery to Hilltop Cemetery in Tilden, TX. The extent of my knowledge is that Rebecca Yarbrough/Yarobrough/Yarberry/Yarbrey b. ca 1760 in "Carolina" m. Nathan Perry ca 1789 in Carolina. We think that this was NC. The various spellings come from biographies in a Brown Co (Ill) history which also lists SC in one place. The family moved to Claiborne Co, TN about 1800 ... or did they already live there when TN was a part of NC (Statehood in 1796)? The first 4 children were b in Carolina and the last five in TN. They were: Edmond, Luke, Melvina, William (my gg gf), Sarah, Irwin, Edward, Benjamin, and John (all Perrys, of course). Most of the descendants were members of the Baptist Church. I am stuck with a Thomas Y. that I know nothing about. The one census I found my gm in (1880 Lee Co, MS) showed her father Thomas and mother Adoline b. in GA and she b. in AL. The same census shows David Thomas Alexander and his father and mother b. in MS. My father, b. 1778 (Ed note - should this be gf?) said his "family" came from TN. My husband's g g gm was Wincy Adaline Y, b. 5 Mar 1818 according to TN census; m. 18 Jul 1839 to Elijah Lowry in Henry Co., TN, d. 21 Feb 1891 and bur in Henry Co, TN. Law in this time period required marriages to take place in county of the brides' residences. The only two Y's in Henry Co. old enough to be Wincy's father are a John, b. 1780-90, and a William S. Y. b 1750-1800. The only one who has a dau Wincy's age on the 1830 census is John Y. By the 1850 census William S. Yarbrough has removed to Ouachita Co, AR (see YFM Vol 2, No 4, Feb 1968) and John has either died or left TN. Need all data regarding parents of Wincy. Elijah and Wincy Y. Lowry had 11 children.
