Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

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We welcome the <u>submission</u> of any Yarbrough family information that can be added to our growing data base. 

Notes made from conversation with County Clerk at the King William Virginia County Courthouse on 14 August 1985:

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The courthouse was burned during the civil war with nearly all the county records destroyed. The deed books survived in a fashion --- they were burned and many of the pages have little left beyond a small corner with perhaps five words.

In the 1880's four commissioners were appointed to transcribe and reconstruct the records. Using the fragments and having the people in the area bring in whatever documents they had or swearing to their properties and the descriptions before the cormissioners, some of the deeds were transcribed. These commissioners took all they gathered to Richmond and reviewed each case. They then ratified or confirmed the deeds -- nearly all the deeds were confirmed. A very few were not. Genealogy Digest, Vol 10, #2, Dec 1, 1979, Page 17, "Yarbrough Family"

"Richard Yarborough ... married Frances Proctor in 1635 and had several children when they came (to America) Their home was Lincolnshire in England and they came to Amelia, County, Virginia.

"Their son, Thomas Yarbrough, 1674-1758, of King William County, Virginia stated in court that he was born in Lincolnshire, England. He married Sara Lewis in Virginia (the place and date have not been ascertained). Thomas had the following children:

The foregoing land abstracts mentioning Yarbrough, reveal the location of lands or well by kickard Yarbrough, that of his sons, their neighbors, and descriptions such as: Yarbrough's plantation, his tobacco field, land leased of the Pamunkey -Indians, his new ground, and in 1703, Yarbrough's ferry on the North side of the Nattaponi Kiver.

Additional clups are found in Andrew MacCallister's grant of 86 acros in which a branch of the fort is described; the 1200 acre grant to William Byrd between Yarbrough's ferry and Bird's Quarter; and James Terry's grant in King Williem County 4 little below the falls.

The words fort, "dyrd's Warehouss; and the falls are used in the history of the founding of the city of Richmond, which was surveyed and latd out in plots in April 1737 by Themas Mayo for William Byrd II. Byrd owned all the land around the falls that were the head of tidewarer and navigation in the James River, and there he had a water-owered mill and a warehouse at the spot which was known as "Byrd's Marchouse" for some years. In earlier times, the locality has been known as None-Such, Powhatan, and Fort Charles. William Byrd's holdings eventually reached 180,000 acres, and the cities of Petersburg and Rich and founded by him were but a part of his estate.

King & Queen County was created 1691, King William County was formed 1701/2 from sing & Queen, and both originated out of land from New New County. As can be seen on maps today; the Mattaponi River must the dividing line between King & Queen, and King William counties. Careline County, also hendloned in the land grants, was established 1727/28 from parts of King & Queen, and Esser County.

Richard Yarbrough's plantation was in Panunkey Neek, along the Mattepond River, Letween die Upper and Middle Branches of Herring Creek, on Gravelly Hun. If we add the Clues of the fort, the falls, and Byra's guarter, it would seem the exact location was very near the present Gay city of Richmond. Note that Panunkey Neck is later described as being in King William County when that county was created in 1701/2. A map of the waterways in this section of Virginia might pinpoint Panunkey Neck.

In 1695, Richard Yarbrough's neighbors were Peter White," who lived on Middle Herring Creck; John Burty and a han named Ford who owned a comfield which later, became Hance Hedrich's field. In October 1701, Andrew MacCallister received a grant of 86 acres in Panunkey Neck, at the corner of "old" Richard Yarberough's tract leased of the Pamunkey Indians, to a branch of the fort, southwest.

Data from Yarborough Family Magazine, Volume 4, Indicates that Richard Yarborough, the innigrant, had ten children. They were: William W; Fdmund; John; Henry; Richard Jr; James Charles; Thomas; and three girls.

"Be it known unto all men by these presents that I richard Pasmuck for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I doe bear unto Edward Geanborrough (??) some of Edward Geanborough late of York, I doe give unto Edward Yarrborrough, Jun. and his heirs and assigns one pide black and white cow calfe being marked as followeth Viz cropped the right ear, a hole in the right and some slit out and the fore part of the left ear cut out, to have and to hold the said cow calf with all her female increase unto the said "dward Yarrborrough, Jun. and his heirs and assigns forever from and egainst all more shall and will warrent and forever defend by these presents the male increase docending back unto me Richard Pasmuck and my heirs and assigns as wittnes wheref I have set my hand and seal this 25th day of May 1646 and in twos and twentysth years of the Raigne of our Soovorgne lord Charles by the Grace of God King of England. Sealed and delivered in the presence of

"It is ordered that ye Sherr deliver Edward Yarbrough, soine of Edwar Yarbrough doc'd to ye next constable and that from thence hee be caryed from constable to constable till he be delivered to Coll Robert Abrale who is desgued by this court to dispose of him to his mother or other wayes as hee findeth fitting."

MOTE: Bob feels that the "natural love and affection" indicates the giver was a close relative -- perhaps a grandfather. Also, the court order indicates Edw Jun to be a minor - making him a fairly young child when he received the calf.

"The Lost State of Franklin" Page 50

The lost State of Franklin was actually in existence for about four years from 1784 to 1788 (the approximate term of one governor) and its boundaries were conceded to be at the western borders of North Carolina, eastern Tennesse and the Vallies of that area. An excellent book pertaining to this lost state has been written by Samuel Cole Williams in 1933 under the title, History of the Lost State of Franklin.

Strangely enough, this disputed area contributed greatly to the genealogy and history of the expanding southwest U.S. It was a "Grand Central Station" area for hundreds of thousands of migrating settlers. Later when these settlers were picked up in the decinneal federal census of the public domain states, they might have stated their place of birth to have been N.C. when it was actually, and later, the State of Tennessee; Virginia when it was later Kentucky, etc.

HENRY YARBOPOUGH

Henry Yarborough of Vinginia married Martha Robinson of the same state, and afterwards moved to North Carolina. They had ten (10) children - Charles, Clement, Thomas, Archie, James, Edward, Nathaniel, Nannie, Betsy, and Henry.

- Charles was an old bachelor, and like a father to his nieces and nephews.
- (2) Clement was in the Revolutionary war came home in a very emaciated condition and died soon after of the disease known at that time as bloody flux. His mother died soon after of the same disease. He was of a poetical temperment and devoted to his mother. After his death several original poems were found among his effects, dedicated to her.
- (3) Thomas was killed during the Revolutionary war by the Tories, who caught him while at home on a furlough and murdered him barbarously, beginning at his feet and disjointing him, in the presence of his wife. After his death his brother Charles went out to Alabama for them, i.e., his wife and their children, but her parents wished her to remain with them. His son James visited this state when grandma was a young lady.
- (4) Archie's children were Emily Glen, Betty Hunter, Rebecca Whittaker, Kate Micks, James, Henry and Archie. They owned the old Henry Yarborough homestead about five Miles from Franklinton.
- (5) James married and moved to Arkansas. His children were Penny, Elam, Nathaniel and Nancy. Henry married a Miss Duke and Nancy a Hr. Withers.
- (6) Edward died single.
- (7) Nathaniel married Mildred Fuller of Franklin children Clement, Betsy, Sarah, Richard, Martha and Mary. He moved to a place ten miles this side of Petersburg, Virginia, thinking to do a large commission business, but soon after the move he died from an apoplectic stroke. His brother Charles, knowing that he had been unfortunate in business, insisted, when he went to Virginia that he should make over his property here to him, thinking to save something for the children should his brother fail in Virginia. This was exceedingly unfortunate, for Charles died soon after Nathaniel and his legatees required an equal division of everything. Clement, who was a very dutiful son and a father to his younger brothers and sisters died in his 22nd year. Betsy married a Hr. Clements and finally moved to Texas.
- (8) Eancy married Charles Parrish of Crange.
- (9) Betty, older than Nathaniel, married a Nr. Allen of Georgia. Grandma used to tell some very amusing anecdotes of a visit that Betty Allen's son made to this state when she was a young lady - how he dressed and how he addressed her.

- (10) Henry married Betty Murray of Franklin. Children were Thomas, Bavid, Archie, Henry, Fannie, Patty and Nancy. Tom married Nary Green of Warren. David moved to Hillsboro and married Eleanor Dorriby (?) who lived with her half sister Hiss Burke, who was old governor Eurke's daughter. He afterwards moved to Narion, Alabama, where his only son Henry died a young man. Fannie married Nr. Alston, and Eliza (married) Jimmy House from North Carolina. Fannie married Claiborne Cooke. Patty married John House of Louisburg, who died and left her a widow with eight children ~ Henry, Issac, Duke, Thomas, Patsy, Hary, Nancy, Francis.
 - Henry House Yarborough, who married Kekoe Mitchell, was David Yarborough's brother, and managed the Branch House in Louisburg. They had several children - Caroline, who married and went to Florida; Fatty who married in Marion and went to New Orleans. She has a son who is now a conspicious man in Marion, so Kr. Nct tells me.
 - 2. Isaac died young.
 - 3. Duke died young.





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NORTH CAROLINA, 1700-1912


Showing Approximate County Divisions within Present State Boundaries





CAPT. E. YAREOROUGH TO GENERAL SUMMER.

Charlotte, 12th May, 1781

Sir:

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I was at General Dutler's Camp a few days after your letter was received ordering Capt. Read and myself to take command of the Troops, that was sent out under Col. Linton. I set out immediately for Head Quarters with my baggage that came from Virginia and by the Tories residing in Randolph County and on Deep River I was obliged to make my rought by Guilford Court House and Salisbury and Charlotte. I had got as far as the lines of South Carolina whon I was taken very sick and obliged to return to this place to the Hospital and am not able to judge when I shall be able for the field. Capt. Read was sent to Salisbury on some busines's from General Greene and there is no Officers at camp with the North Carolina Troops but Major Eaton and Lieutenant Campbell.

I should be very happy if I could obtain leave of absence for a few waeks for to recover my health and some other business that would be something very considerable to me by the death of my brother, since I march from home last August. I hope you will grant my request, as you are sensible that I am the only officer belonging to the State that has been in service until lately for the last ten months past. I should be happy to hear that you and your family are all well. So conclude with my compliments to all friends.

This Bill of Complaint of Simon Clement, and wife Elizabeth A. Clement, Simon Joffreys and Sally R. Jeffreys, by themsleves, Fenner Yarbrough an infant under the age of twenty-one years (to wit) of about the age of sixteen years, Martha Yarbrough and infant under the age of twenty-one years, (to wit) of about the age of fourteen years, Polly Yarbrough an infant under the age of twenty-one years, (to wit) of about the age of twelve years, by their next friend Simon Jeffreys, heirs of Nathaniel Yarbrough, deccased:

AGAINST James Yarbrough, senior, Patsey Yarbrough of Franklin county, Nency Parrish, widow of John Parris of Orange County, in this State, Elizabeth Aller, wife of Drury Allen, of the State of Georgia, Martha Houze, widow of John House of Franklin N.C. Fanny Cook wife of Claibon Cook of Granville, County, Thomas Yarbrough, Archibald Yarbrough, James Yarbrough, Junr. Henry Yarbrough, John Legan and wife Anne M. Legan, of Wake County, David Yarbrough, of Hillsborough, the children of Henry Yarbrough dec'd, John M. Parnelle and wife Koziah, James Moore and wife Maria Moore, both of Matchez of Mississippi Territory, children of Thomas Yarbrough, dec'd. all heirs at Law of Charles Yarbrough dec'd. Humbly complaning, sheweth unto your Honor that Hathaniel Tarbrough, deceased, of the County and State aforesaid, intending and being about to remove himself and family from the County of Franklin, in the State aforesaid, into the State of Virginia, and being the owner of a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres, situate in the said County of Franklin, adjoining the lands of James Yarbrough, and others, bounded as follows: by the lands of James Yarbrough, William Convers, Anne Hester, Henry Yarbrough, deceased, and Nicholas White; and the said Nathaniel being a man of habits so intemperate and conduct so incautious and unguarded, as frequently to expose himself to the artifica and impositions of knavish and designing men, to the great injury of his estate, and tending to the ruin of his family, previous to his removal, a conversation was had between the said Charles and his brother Nathaniel, the Father and Father in lew of your Orators and Oratrixes, in which the said Charles represented to him the said Mathaniel, that he was notoriously unfit at all times to guard himself against the advantages, frauds, and circumventions which might be practised upon him, especially whon out of the reach and protection of him, his said brother Charles, and amongst strangers who might seize with avidity every opportunity to take in any one, and that as he the said Nathaniel was not indebted to any person the said Charles recommended to the said Nathaniel that he should make him a conveyance in fee simple for the aforesaid tract of land, that he might hold the same for him or his wife and children; upon which persuasion and upon no other consideration whatever, the same Nathaniel did on the 26th day of March 1802, make and execute a conveyance in fee simple to the said Charles, deceased. Your Orators and Oratrixes further charge, that on or about the 16th day of January, 1803, as they believe, the said Nathaniel removed himself and family into the state of Virginia (Dinwiddie county) --- that on or about the 21st of May following, the said Mathaniel departed this life, intestate, in the said county of Dinwiddie: that the said Charles shortly after went into the state of Virginia, (county of Dinwiddie) for the empress purpose of removing the widow and family of the said Mathaniel back to the county of Franklin, from whence they had removed to Virginia, and accordingly accomplished the said intent, and put them into possession of the eforesaid tract of land on the first day of July, 1803; and the widow and her children have remained in possession ever since and are now living thereon, and until very lately have held the same quietly and undisturbed -- a period of time above nine years.

Your Orators further charge, that the said Cherles departed this life on the 2d day of May, 1812, leaving the said Deed amongst the valuable papers and title deeds of his estate, and that the same, as your Orators and Oratrixes are informed, is duly proved and registered in the Register's Office of the County of Franklin; and having died intestate as to his real estate, the said land, the legal title being in him at the time of his death, descends in fee simple to the heirs at law of the said Charles, according to the rules regulating descent of real estate in this State---and they, the said heirs, or some of them, have obtained an Order on a Petition for that purpose, for the division of all the lands of the said Charles Tarbrough, deceased, and have lately proceeded to the division of the same, including the tract of lend of the said Natheniel above mentioned, your Orators' and Oratrixes' Fother; and those of the heirs to whom the same has fallen in the said division, threatening to turn the widow and your Orators and Oratrixes out of possession, whereby they will be deprived of their inheritance without any consideration whatsoever.

Your Orators and Oratrixes further shew, that they are advised that the seid Charles could be considered in no other light than that of a Trustee to the use of their deceased father, or his heirs, who your Orators and Oratrixes are. But now so it is, may it please your Honor, that the said James Yarbrough, senior, one of the heirs and witnesses to the deed aforesaid, Patsey Yarbrough, Anne Farrish, widow of John Parrish; Elizabeth Allen, Martha Houze, Fanny Cook, wife of Claibon Cook; Thomas Yarbrough, Archibald Yarbrough, James Yerbrough, junior, Henry Yarbrough, John Legan and Anne M. Legan, his vife, David Yerbrough, John H. Pernelle and wife Keziah, and James Mooro and wife Maria, both of Natchez, Mississippi Territory, combining and confederating with divers other persons unknown to your Orators and Oratrixes, who, when discovered, they pray may be made defendants to this bill with apt words to charge them how they might defraud your Orators in the premises, give out in speeches, that the said Charles was a purchaser for a valuable and real consideration, and not as above stated; and pretend that the same has descended to them in due form of law, and that they are catitled to hold the same both in law and equity, whereas in truth and fact the contrary is the case---and that they utterly refuse to deliver up the said Deed to be cancelled. or to reconvey the premises to your Orators and Oratrixes, the heirs of the soid Nathaniel. All which actings and doings of the said Defendants, the heirs of the said Charles, are contrary to equity and good conscience, and manifestly tend to the great wrong and injury of your Orators and Oratrixes; and for as much as your Orators are remediless in the premises by the rules of the common law, and are only relievable in this honourable Court, where frauds and matters of this kind are properly and strictly cognizable.

To this End, therefore, that the said James Yarbrough Sr, one of the heirs and a witness to the Daed, and the others of the heirs defendants to this bill, upon their corporal oaths, true, full and perfect answer make, to all and singular the premises contained in this bill, as if the same were herein again repeated and particularly interrogated, and more especially that they may set forth and discover whether the said Deed was not executed by the said Nathaniel to the said Charles for the purpose above stated and no other: whether the said Nathaniel was not at tha time of the execution of the said Deed out of debt? Whether the said estate is not free from any incumbrances at this time? Whether the same was for any valuable consideration whatever? Whether the caid deed was for any valuable consideration whatever moving from the said Charles? Unether the same was not in trust, as above stated, for the benefit of the said Nathaniel, his wife and children?

Whether the said James bath not the said deed now in his possession? and if not, what hath become of the same? And your Orators and Oratrixes pray that the same may be decreed to be delivered up, to be cancelled, and be null and void as if the same had never been executed, and that your Orators and Oratrixes, the heirs of the said Nathaniel, be vested in their right of descent, or otherwise that the heirs defendants to the bill be decreed to reconvey the said premises by good and sufficient Deed in law, to the heirs of the said Nathaniel, the Plaintiffs, and that your Orators and Oratrixes may have such other and further rolief in the premises as the nature of the case requires, and unto your Honour may seem meet and agreeable to equity and good conscience.

Will your Honour be pleased to grant unto your Orators one or more Writ or Writs of Subpoena directed, &c. commanding, &c. and your Orators will ever pray.

Thank you for the new information on the Yarboroughs. I had often wondered how James Smith Yarborough managed to get from North Caroline, to the banks of the Mississippi in Louisiana. You information would make Kentucky (then part of Virginia) a stepping-stone on that route.

The one law suit sited on page 314 is most interesting. It indicated that the property of James Smith Yarborough was in the hands of Joseph Martin. Genevieve Yarborogh, daughter of James Smith Yarborough married a Joseph Martin in 1796. There just might be a connection. Perhaps Martin, from Louisiana met Yarborough in Kentucky and pursuaded him to go to Louisiana.

As you requested I am enclosing my Yarborough Family Group Sheets. The list of James Smith Yarborough's children is limited to those born in Pristol Parish Pringe George Co. Va. If others were born later, after he moved west. I have no record of them.

Also, I have no idea what Eleanor's maiden name was; I wish I Knew.

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
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

Richard Yarbrough, immigrant, one of the founders, 1642, of Bristol Parish, Prince George County, Virginia, rests in his grave inside the church yard enclosure. The slab in front of the old headstone is the result of a project started in 1980 by R.P. Yarbrough of Charlotte, North Carolina. With the support of other Yarb(o)roughs, this new marker became a reality and was dedicated at The National Yarbrough Confrence held 1982 at Old Blandford Church, Petersburg, Va.

Richard Yarbrough was buried in this spot when it was known as Well's Hill in the town of Blandford. The brick church was erected in 1735 within a few feet of Richard Yarbrough's grave which is the oldest grave in the cemetery. Old Blanford Church and cemetery is located on US Routes 301 - 460; Crater Road.

First Yarborough Immigrants to America

In all I have seen of research done on the family of YARBOROUGH in the United States, there seems to be a unanimous decision that anyone who can trace their ancestors as having been here before the Revolutionary War were all descendants of Richard Yarborough I. Although it is evident that they were of the same line of origin, it is also evident that there were other Yarborough immigrants in the early settlement of this country.

RICHARD YARBOROUGH I & II, 1615-1652

Records of English passage lists shows Richard Yarborough booked passage to Virginia in 1635. If the records ars accurate (Wm. and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 5, p. 233), he died at age 87 in 1702. This means he was born in 1615 and was 20 years old when he first come to Virginia. We know that Richard Yarborough I. had a son, Richard II, who was also born in England, (from Court case in 1690). This Richard stated that in 1690 he was 38 years old and was born in England (1652). It is obvious that Richard I made the voyage between England and Virginia more than the one time in 1635. While we do not have the record of the exact place Richard I landed on this continent, it is possible he landed in the vicinity of Yorktown. Some of the earliest records show him present in Counties of Northhampton, King and Queen and King William. It is obvious that his course of migration was up the York River, It has been established that Richard I was of the branch from Yarborough in Lincoln, England, referred to as the "Lincolnshire" branch. About 1600, several members of the "Lincolnshire Yarboroughs" settled in other Counties: William Yarborough settled in Yorkshire, Charles in Nottinghamshire, and Francis in Northamptonshire. One Edmund Yarbrough made his home at Balne Hall, in Yorkshire, and married Sarah, daughter of Thomas Wormeley, of that county.

EDMUND or EDWARD I & II, c 1630-1650

It would appear, from the following record, that this Edmund was also an immigrant to the colonies. Found in the records of York County, Virginia, Book III - Wills, Deeds and Orders, p. 28: "It is ordered that the Sheriff convey Edward Yarbrough, son of Edward Yarbrough, deceased, to the next court to be delivered to constable and from that constable to another constable until he be delivered to Col. Robert Abrall, who is desired by this Court to dispose of him to his Mother (nee Wormely) or other ways which are fitting. Next Court to be 24 August, 1658."

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YARBOROUGH

While researching the different families, I always found the material more interesting if there were some description of the people and how and where they lived. Occasionally a gentleman kept a diary or "Day Book," but we of the Yarborough family have no such record of our very early immigrant ancestors. Our records are dependent on the deeds of property and wills, and once in a while, a court record. There are times when the will of a man other than a family member can cast some light on the location and neighbors of our kin, and can also tell us at what date the family member sold his land and moved on to a new location. It is from the wills and records of Old New Kent County, Virginia, that we find records of our forefather, Richard, and some of his children.

In 1691 New Kent Co., Va. was divided to make King and Queen Co., and on April 11, 1702, King William Co. was created from King and Queen Co., the dividing line being the Mattapony River. In 1704 there were 216 Land-owners in King William Co. The lines of division between St. John's Parish and St. David's Parish is the same that were drawn to separate St. Margaret's and St. John's at the time of its creation, beginning at Arnold's and Yarborough's Ferry below Ayletts and running across the County to the mouth of Monruen Creek. There were a number of large land grants in the upper portion of King William Co, which lay within St. David's Parish. These tracts have been located with some success, despite the loss of many County records. These large tracts of land lay along the Pamunkey River and along the Mattapony River.

On Oct. 25, 1699, Col. Edmund Jennings, a member of the Council of State, was granted 570 A. of land lying on the south side of the Mattapony River in Pamunkey Neck, beginning at the mouth of Lower Herring Creek and thence along Gravelley branch, the lines of Peter White, Richard Yarborough's land, Foards cornfield in King and Queen Co. The same year he was granted 200 A. on Deep Bottom Run and Pamunkey Neck, and Col. Jennings was again granted 3,490 A. in 1703, and again in 1704, another grant adjourning his previously owned land, 1,900 A.

Col. Jennings' large tract of land covered an area of nearly ten square miles, one of the largest tracts in the county of King William. It is not known when Col. Jennings disposed of all of this land, but when he died in 1727, his estate was sold by his executors. There is only one deed in the old records of King William which shows that a small tract of land purchased by John Yarborough was later purchased by Co. William Aylett and became a part of the Aylett Plantation "Fairfield." The origin of the Aylett family has not been established by records, but Col. Aylett was the first clerk of King William County and a land owner before the county was formed. He was appointed the first clerk in 1702 and served until his death. (Will of William Aylett made No. 18, 1730 - probated, Mar. 17, 1733). It is certain that he purchased his land, for the earlier landowners are named in his will:

> Item: I give and devise to my well beloved son Philip Aylett and to his heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever the tract of land where I now dwell, bounded according to my deeds for the same from Benjamin Arnold as likewise one hundred acres of land thereto adjoining to the bounds in my deed for the same from Benjamin Arnold. I likewise give and devise to my said son Philip Aylett his heirs and assigns forever seven hundred acres of land out of the tract of land I hold by deeds from Mann Page Esq: deceased. to be laid off contiguous beginning to the lower end of the said tract taking the whole breadth and coming upwards till it included seven hundred acres.

Item. Give and bequeth unto my beloved son, John Aylett and to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever the several parcels of land I (*Ref: "Early Virginia Immigrants 1623-1666 - George Cabel Greer, Baltimore Genealogical Publishing Co., 1960, p. 374)

Christian Yarblow is shown among the arrivals in Virginia in 1653 sponsored by Thomas Willis. Some researchers (Nelle Morris Jenkins) have stated this Christian Yarblow was the same as Richard II and was so called to distinguish him from his Father, Richard I. I believe this not to be so as I feel Richard Yarborough I would have sponsored his own son if it were so.

AMBROSE YARBROUGH b. c 1710

The Yarborough "cousins" in England did have communication with those who came to Virginia in the colonial days and according to researcher Senator George Washington Yarborough (D. Alabama - probably the foremost authority on the Yarborough Family in America since 1930) another immigrant ancestor of the family was Ambrose Yarbrough who left England in 1732.

Following will be some brief history of these early immigrants:

IMMIGRANT RICHARD YARBOROUGH

Found in the records of the House of Burgesses, the first representative legislative body in America, there are references to Richard Yarburgh, Yarberry (Yarborough).

"At a Grand Assembly began at Green Spring, the 20th day of February 1676, these following Orders of Public charge were made and allowed, viz. *** To Richard Yarberry (sic) 6,000 lbs. of Tobacco ***

Between 1750 and 1780 there was a wave of migration toward the Carolina. Many reasons for this have been sighted by other genealogists, such as, the land no longer produced the tobacco crops or other crops as abundantly as in the past. History shows there was an epidemic of smallpox which wiped out some families. Fear of this urged the people to seek the virgin soil and unpopulated areas of that part of North Carolina which the Federal Government opened, Indian lands, to the white settlers. North Carolina did not become a state until 1789.

Just who and how many of the Yarboroughs left Virginia for the Carolinas is not certain, but the story of of one such group was told to Yarbrough kin of Lexington, N. C. in 1898. The story was retold by George Yarborough, who was a descendant of Manoha and Littleton Yarbrough; hold by deeds from John Yarborough, John Donner, Jr., John Donner, George Clements, John Hawkins and his wife, Jos. Hall and Abraham Spencer. I likewise give and devise to my said son, John Aylett and to his heirs and assigns forever seven hundred acres of land out of the tract aforementioned, which formerly belonged to Edmund Jennings, Esq., to be laid off contiguous beginning at the upper end of the seven hundred acres given my son Philip and running upwards taken the whole breadth 'til it includes the said quantity of seven hundred acres.

The names of the landowners mentioned in this will are the friends, neighbors and some of those to which the children of Richard Yarborough, immigrant, were married. From Gloucester Co., Va. records we find that Richard Yarborough owned land in King William Co Nov. 1691; Richard conveyed by deed Feb. 12, 1695, in King William Co., to John Yarborough, son of Richard. May 30, 1704, John Yarborough sold 200 A. of land in King William Co. to William Aylett. The deed was recorded in King William Co. and signed by John Yarborough and wife, Abagail.

John Yarborough married Feb., 1695 to Abagail Whitehead, daughter of Philip Whitehead of Gloucester Co., Va. In Gloucester Co., Va. - April 4, 1703, Philip Whitehead gave to Richard Yarborough, through his Will, 200 A. of land, patented by Philip Whitehead of Gloucester Co. Those who witnessed the will were John Yarborough, Richard Yarborough and Abagail Yarborough.

Another landowner of the area was the Brokenborough family, as one of the Aylett sons married a Brokenborough. This name is also found used as a given name of a Yarborough in later years.

These records concern Richard Yarborough, son of the earlier Richard Yarborough. As the records of the court case listed while this area was yet in Old-New Kent County, Va. From this case we know that Richard Yarborough and Benjamin Arnold were neighbors in 1690.

1690 - New Kent Court - Richard Yarborough 38 (1652) and wife Elizabeth 34 (1656)

At the home of Benjamin Arnold several persons gathered for a party. They were having drinks, as was the custom and were toasting the King, Queen and Governors. A Capt. Lumpkin, present, got a little stubborn and refused to take his hat off and raise his glass or cup to the aforesaid dignitaries. Everyone urged him to conform, but he refused. He jumped on his horse and cursed the Governor (Stuart), "God Dam the Governor, I'm as good a man as he is." It was the duty of the host to report such behavior to the High Sheriff, Richard Johnson. All present at the gathering were summoned to court to testify.

Justices, Capt. John Land and Robert Bird were there to swear in and hear testimony of: Richard Yarborough (38) wife Elizabeth Yarborough (34), Ann Browne (31), Benj. Arnold, wife Ann Arnold and Ellinor Thompson (22).

While this preceeding case refers to Richard Yarborough, Jr., some of the records probably refer to the first Richard Yarborough; however, Richard (I) lived in the area of Petersburg, Va. for it is written in the records of Old Blanford Church that Richard Yarborough was a founder of the parish. His tombstone, enclosed in the cemetery of the church, reads: Richard Yarborough, died 1702, age 87. (Wm. and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 5, p. 233) "Richard Yarborough, an Englishman, was founder of Bristol Parish - formed in 1642."

Will of William Yarborough - 1771

In the name of God, Amen. I William Yarbrough, of the County of Prince Edward being now sick and weak in body but of a perfect sense and memory Do make and ordain this my last will and testament First I bequeth my soul to God who gave it hoping through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full pardon and remission of my sins and my body to the earth from whence it came to be burried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named my desire is that all my just debts be first paid out of my estate and the Remainder I dispose of in form and manner following

Towit: I lend to my son James Smith Yarbrough my negro girl Silva and her increase until my son Ossweld Yarbrough comes of age and the said wench and increase to be returned into the estate again. I give to my son Richard Yarbrough my bed and furniture whereon I commonly lie. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Yarbrough one feather bed and furniture as she calls hers. Sukey I also lend to my daughter Elizabeth with her increase during her life and after her death I give the said negro and her increase to be equally divided amongst her said brothers or their heirs I give to my son William Yarbrough one feather bed and furniture also one gun My desire is that my son Ossweld Yarborough should have five pounds raised out of my estate also one gun My desire is that my son Joseph Yarbrough should have five pounds raised out of my estate and also one gun and the remainder part of my estate be it of what nature seever I leave to my executors hereafter named to dispose of as they think proper Towards paying my debts then my desire is that the remainder part of my estate should be kept together in the most regular form about upon some rented land where my executor things most proper untill such times my son Ossweld comes of age and till such time my youngest son comes of age to inherit his equal part. Then I desire my estate should be equally divided between my five sons James Smith, Richard, William, Ossweld, and Joseph Yar-brough and my daughter Elizabeth Yarbrough and I do appoint my two sons James Smith Yarbrough and Richard Yarbrough executors of this my last will and testament revoking and disannulling all other will or wills by me heretofore made As Wittness my hand and seal this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and seventy one

Records of the birth of James Smith Yarborough are found in the old Vestry Book of St. Paul's Parish, Petersburg, Virginia. He was the son of

> William Yarborough (1722-1771) m. March 10, 1743 to Diana Smith (No. 18, 1724 - May 18, 1763) daughter of James Smith and Ann Cary. William and Diana lived in Caroline Co., Va., and there are records there showing that William Yarborough, in behalf of his wife, brought suit aginst the estate of John Smith, Uncle of said wife, because she was overlooked as an heir to the estate which named all other of the 10 children in her family. This suit was in progress as late as 1743. William & Mary Quarterly, Vol. 10, (2) p. 217. Children listed in the Vestry Book and also in the Will of William Yarborough, 1771, Prince Edward Co., Va., are as follows:

James Smith Yarborough - Sept. 2, 1745 Richard Yarborough - March 18, 1748 Elizabeth Yarborough - Oct. 23, 1750 William Yarborough - April 7, 1753 Oswell Yarborough - April 26, 1756 Joseph Yarborough - Nov. 6, 1758

We know that at least three of these children went to what is now the southern part of the United States. Oswell Yarborough was the witness to a Will in the Natchez Dist.

The Louisiana Genealogical Register, Vol. 20, p. 7, states that James Smith Yarborough arrived in the area May of 1773, with his wife Mary, five children and his brother.

The first land grant to James Smith Yarborough #363, 400 A. on the Mississippi River, was land which was originally granted to Charles Percy, bearing date of patent for James Smith Yarborough, June 2, 1777. It is not clear whether this was a British or Spanish Land Grant. The legal representatives of Charles Percy took this land.

April 26, 1805, #22, Vol. 1, p. 42, of U. S. Land Grants shows that James Smith Yarborough, "a West Florida Yoeman," received land in Orleans Territory. His son Jordan also received land adjoining. The National Archives Documents show James Smith Yarborough #4735, no. 365 (Rec V 14, p. 448-450.

By 1808 there are several deeds recorded in Iberville Parish, La., which involve James Smith Yarborough, William Yarborough, Joseph Yarborough and Richard Yarborough. (This being in the District of Manchac.) The records of the area are not complete, possibly because those in control of that district were never sure who was the power over them. England? Spain? or France? Records are found in Alabama, West Florida, New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Natchez Dist. and in the U.S. after 1803. The first Census of the area shows James Smith Yarborough and his sons and daughters were residents of Galvez Town, a fortified settlement that enjoyed a brief existence from 1775 to 1789 during the Spanish domination, settled during the administration of Governor Bernardo de Galves. At it's peak, there were 400 residents; in the 1810 Census there were 65 listed.

Some historians intimate that those people of the West Florida-Louisiana Parishes were in the most part, loyal Britons who moved their families away from the Atlantic States to avoid a fight against their Mother Country during the Revolutionary War. We do not know this to be true of James Smith Yarborough. His sons were soldiers in the War of 1812 against England. We also know that James S. Yarborough did not leave the area but chose to stay in spite of extreme hardships. Records show that James Smith Yarborough applied for beef, corn and provisions in April 22, 1784. Records also show that on March 20, 1804, Anna Smith was married. She was the daughter of Maria Yarborough and Santiago Smith. This record also states that Ann Smith was a native of Galvez Town, indication that her Mother, Maria Yarborough, was born c 1769 and no doubt was one of the five children who arrived with James Smith Yarborough.

It is helpful to read the history written about the area where these people lived. I have always thought that one of these sons of James Smith Yarborough was the hero of the Battle of San Jacinto in Texas history. (John Swanson Yarborough). The sad thing is that even though James Smith Yarborough was a "yoeman" and could read and write, his younger sons learned to be trappers for survival and had no schooling. Thus they could not read or write. Is it any wonder there are so few records that concern them? The following is a brief history about Manchac where this family made their home.

"Lower Mississippi," by Hodding Carter, in his series, "Rivers of America," writes that the English had hopes of dredging out Manchac so that their ships could enter the Mississippi River without the hazards of entering the mouth of the river. Their engineering attempts to clear the channel were a failure, but they went on with their plans to build a fort. Fort Bute, as it was called, was a little backwoods fortification, garrisoned by a few officers who were soon replaced with Scots Fusiliers and English Colonials and veterans of the Seven Years' War.

Below the Iberville River, the Spanish watched with envy the trade which the English controlled. By 1777 the En-. glish had wrought a miracle of colonization. Along the river, scores of comfortable, solid homes gave proof of the prosperity under England. These homes were of brick and mortar and nestled, white and cool, under oak and magnolia trees, back some forty feet from the river bank. A straight road ran the nine miles from the Mississippi to Manchac to the bayou's conjunction with the Amite.

The people of this stretch were at peace with their Spanish neighbors. From the small Spanish Fort, Galvez Town, below the Iberville it was only a bowshot to Manchac, where the warehouses of Monsieur Swanson and Co., Indian traders, emphasized England's merchantile dominance. The two small forts were joined by a wooden bridge.

The peace that had been apparent soon began to fade when the colonists had word that the Spain-England War had begun. Galvez had become Governor in 1777 and had heard of the war and of the British plan to reinforce the Manchac district, so he planned to strike first and take Manchac. His plan was interrupted by a very severe hurricane on August 17, 1779, but he did not give up his plan and gathered troops from the Indians, Negroes, Acadians, farmers, trappers, 330 poor recruits from the Canary Islands and 170 Spanish veterans.

At dawn of September 21st, artillery battle began and by 3:30 the English Fort was in ruins. Galvez demanded surrender of Baton Rouge and Fort Panmure at Natchez. The Spanish had no interest in Manchac except to destroy its threat to New Orleans. With the departure of the English, Manchac dwindled and became a dying settlement. Today there is no Manchac at all. Galvez Town was not important or necessary to the Spanish who had conquered all of west Florida, and without government support, it too became deserted.

The last deeds that can be found which can be connected to this family of James Smith Yarborough were recorded in 1836. Where did these and their descendants go?

Dear Mr. Harbrough:

My name is Thomas Jack Hockett, living in Richmond, Virginia, and a descendant of Ann Yarbrough through her father, William Yarbrough d. Amelia County, VA, says "d. testate in Amelia Cty. VA 10 Aug 1739 (will date 19 Jul 1748)."

I want to tell you how much I appreciate the fine work you have done on this family. I first became aware of my Yarbrough/Yarbrough ancestors through the work of Mrs. Bert Harter of Key West, Florida who has done equally fine work on the DURETT family of Caroline County, VA. The DURETTs intermarried with the OLIVERS who were also later found in Amelia County, VA (moving even later to Halifax Cty., VA).

Your research seems so thorough that I hesitate to send the enclosures which you probably already have: The transcribed will of William Yarbrough (Amelia County). Mrs. Harter had already mentioned that William's wife was "Elinor" or "Elliner". It was very curious for me to see the testamony of "Ellinor" Thompson which she swore in New Kent County on 9 Oct 1690. Do you know of any connection? I have not been able to find Elinor's family name so far!

From your work, it appears 1 am from the Richard line. You mentioned Richard Yarbrough as being the earliest and coming to VA ca 1642. Perhaps you know that in the YORK County Records, No. 2, p. 142, there is a "Deed of Gift" in which Richard Pasmuck gave a cow to his friend Edward Yarborrough, Jr. He asked for any male increase of the cow to come back to him!

Ann Yarbrough was the dau. of William Yarbrough. I do not have her date of birth or death, but she was married twice - once to William Durett and secondly to William Higgins. They lived in Caroline County, VA, formed from King and Queen County ca 1720. If I recall, they lived in St. Margaret's Parish (Caroline had five Anglican Parishes then; today it has only three (St. Margaret's, St. Mary's, and St. Asaph's). On p. 310 of Campbell's COLONIAL CAROLINE, it states that William Yarbrough 400 acres on w. side of L. Branch adj. Robert Balies & Wm. Cockran; on p. 311, 400 acres forest between Reedy Creek & North Anna (River jh); on p. 313 - 250 acres n. side of S. Fork of So. River adj. Francis Durett; p. 354 - 1732-45 Caroline Jurors mentions: Charles Yarbrough, William Yarbrough, Griggs Yarbrough, and Charles Yarbrough. In 1750 it is stated, "Ward: William Yarbrough; Guardian: Mathew Peatross". The Bull Church, a very old church in St. Margaret's Parish was on property formerly belonging to Charles Yarbrough (near present day Ladysmith).

This Caroline, King and Queen, Prince George, Amelia, New Kent Counties connection of the Yarbroughs is curious. It seems several of them may have owned land in more than one county.

I also enclose some information - mention of John and Abigail Yarborough. Perhaps these tidbits will contribute a mite to your storehouse.

From your manuscript, it appears you know much more about the Richard Y. line than is stated since the Ambrose line is an "intersecting line" on the original Y. establishment (90 years earlier).

I would be most grateful and beholding to you if you could give me any information at all on:

William Yarbrough - lived Caroline County; d. Amelia County

his day. Ann Yarbrough m. William Durett and William Higgins

his wife "Elinor" or "Elliner"

and any of their ancestors or descendants.

Thank you so much for considering my request. I am building a file on the DURETT/GOODLOW/YARBROUGH/OLIVER/SNEED family. It is tedious, as you know and I am very grateful for each piece of help. I am enclosing a stamped envelope for you and I would be glad to help you with any request should you have one.

(1) The above document is contained in the Ruth Yarbrough Horne collection of Yarbrough papers and documents. "Cousin Ruth", as she liked to be called, upent over 50 years researching her line. She collected every Yarbrough record she could find in the hopes of one day doing a book to aid all researchers. Nor untimely death prevented the publication of her book. Howaver, her daughters, Mrs. Lucile Kurfirst and Mrs. Coleste Holmes, have paid their mother a great tribute by arranging for their mother's massive collection to go on helping researchers. The collection will eventually be housed in the NC State Archives.

As the old Chancery Papers of Richmond have been closed to the public for many years, this document is a rare find. Mrs. Borne came into possession of it in this way. Margaret H. Morton mailed it to her with a latter that stated: "It is a wonderful find to have this family listed as it is in those papers. I came by them in this manner: my late husband, who was a genealogist, had a cousin near here, Mrs. Emily Watkins Dupuy who has since died. Mrs. Dupuy was the daughter of a lawyer, Richard Watkins, and he was a son of a lawyer, Henry E. Watkins. In Mrs. Dupuy's attic were quantities of old papers which had belonged to these two lawyers ... Hrs. Dupuy had a cousin visiting her and together they looked over these old papers and books. Hany of them Hrs. Dupuy destroyed, but she, knowing my husband might find some of them useful in his research work, gave him two corrugated boxes full of the papers and among them was this Knight-Yarbrough case. This case seemed to have been tried in Richmond and I understand ... that the old Chancery papers there are not open to the public. So, you may consider yourself fortunate to have run across these that I now have."
