Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland “Cy” Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarbrough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrate from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard – John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarbrough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The “Old Country” referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from “the old country”; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is “Yarbrough”.

Mrs. Graf of Washinton says that she is descended from Alexander Seale, the son of Jarvis Seale. He livadin Greene County, Alabama. We know that Jarvis Seale had a brother Thomas whose widow, Loucretia (Oneal) Seale, married Jarvis Seale after the death of Nancy Ann Yarborough Seale. There is a Seale family in Sumter County now but Mr. Seale knows nothing about his forebears. His father, Mr. Thomas Seale, was collecting data and was in the process of writing a history of the Seale family when he was killed in an automobile accident. His widow burned all the information. He was a very brilliant man, a lawyer in Livingston. I will give more about this family from time to time.

There is a query in the Department of Archives and History, Montgomery, Ala., from Nora Anderson, Little Rock, Ark. She wants to know about her forebears. She said she knew that James Yarborough, Revolutionary soldier, killed in action 1777 was the grandfather of William S. Yarborough (See Henry County, Tenn. record above); William S. was born in ~~Montgomery~~ Montgomery County, N.C. 1797, married Lydia Morris (b 1792) in 1809; moved to Henry County, Tenn., where he stayed until 1849 and moved to Onachita, County, Ark., - had 9 children but I know the names of only 4 of them: Martha, Elbert S. (my grandfather), Ann who married a cousin, Thomas A. Yarborough. Lydia Morris' father was Jephtha Morris, Rev. War Soldier.

tion. Here he could easily do so by giving true colors to the garlands of roses rather than using the named metal and color. Besides livening up the color scheme, this would make the shield quite a bit more appealing to the eye.

In review, the following are the various parts of the shield of the Yarbrough coat-of-arms:

the field: *per pale, counter-changed*;
 the metal: *argent*;
 the color: *azure*;
 the principal charge: *a chevron*;
 the lesser charge: *three chaplets of roses*.

 of Ouachita County, Arkansas

Of the two sons and ten daughters of James Yarbrough, a Primitive Baptist preacher of Marengo Co., Alabama, one was William Yarbrough.¹ William was born 1798 in one of the Carolinas,² and died at Elliott, Ouachita Co., Arkansas 14 October 1871.³ His first marriage was to Martha Sample on 15 October 1826 in Marengo Co., Alabama.⁴ He subsequently married Susan Morris,⁵ and later Elisebeth W. (Jordan) Smith, a widow, 1848-49 in Ouachita Co., Arkansas.⁶ Elisebeth was born in 1812 in Western Tennessee--near Dyersburg, and died 7 September 1889 in Ouachita Co., Arkansas. Both William and Elisebeth are buried in Bethesda Cemetery at Elliott, Arkansas.⁷

William Yarbrough went to Arkansas in the early 1840's with his brother, Nathan.⁸ Although Nathan settled in Union County,¹⁰ William settled in Ouachita. At that time, 1844, William had with him two children by his early marriages, a son, James, born ca. 1830 in Alabama,¹¹ and a daughter, Elizabeth Nell Yarbrough, born 1840, died 1864.¹²

William Yarbrough's children by his wife Elisebeth were:¹³

Octavia Yarbrough was born ca. 1850 in Arkansas.¹⁴ After her marriage to Jack Butler in 1873, they moved to Texas, where she met with an early death near Waco.¹⁵

Richard and Alfraid Yarbrough died when they were six and ten years of age, respectively, ca. 1865 and 1866.¹⁶

Charles Franklin Yarbrough was born 25 August 1856 in Elliott, Ouachita Co., Arkansas, and died 8 September 1944 in Atlanta, Cass Co., Texas.¹⁷ He married Martha Georgia (Thompson) Smith, a widow, on 24 January 1875 at Alto, Cherokee Co., Texas.¹⁸ She was born 28 May 1840.¹⁹ After her death, 21

young lawyer, and a Lieutenant-Colonel in the Confederate service, was killed near Atlanta, Georgia; Benjamin R., a Captain in the Confederate ranks, was killed in a skirmish at Pine Mountain, Tennessee; Malissa A., wife of W. J. Harper, is deceased; Mariam K., wife of J. H. West, is deceased; and I. W., a young physician, was taken prisoner from the Confederate army and sent to Rock Island, where he was retained until the close of the war. He contracted a disease while there from which he never recovered. Mr. Kendrick died in 1887, at the age of eighty-six. Mrs. Kendrick passed away some years before, her death having occurred in 1874, at the age of seventy-two. Mr. Kendrick was for many years a minister of the Missionary Baptist Church, of which they both were members.

B. J. Kendrick received his education in the subscription schools, and attended an academy four months. At the age of twenty-one he began life for himself as a farmer, and continued to farm till the breaking out of the late war. In January, 1862, he raised Company F, Fifty-first Georgia Infantry, of which he was Captain for the organization. He participated in a number of important engagements, always acting the part of a true and brave soldier, and at the surrender came out of the ranks as Captain.

After the war Captain Kendrick returned to his home in Georgia, arriving there May 17, 1865. The following October, on the twelfth day, he started for Texas. He then made his home in Washington county, this State, till 1870. In the fall of 1869 he purchased his present farm of 320 acres, unimproved, and in 1870 erected his residence, hauling the most of the lumber for it from Calvert, a distance of fifty-five miles. He has disposed of portions of this land and now has only seventy-five acres under cultivation.

Captain Kendrick was married in 1845, December 28, to Miss Margrett D. Bond, daughter of J. M. D. and Lucy A. Bond, of Georgia, and to them the following children have been

born: J. D. and James M., of McLennan county; W. C., deceased; Mollie K., wife of W. G. Bester, of Weatherford; Lucy K., wife of G. W. Bolger, of McLennan county; Meredith, same county; Alice K., wife of John Buster; Maggie Lee, wife of J. I. Kendrick, of Comanche, Texas. Captain Kendrick and his wife are members of the Baptist Church, and he is a member of Waco Lodge, No. 92, A. F. & A. M., of which he is Master, and is also a member of the Grand Lodge of R. A. M.



NATHAN J. BUCHANNAN, one of the early settlers and a leading farmer of McLennan county, Texas, was born in North Carolina, February 19, 1826.

His parents, Noah and Martha (Yarbrough) Buchanan, were natives of North Carolina. The Buchanan family are of Scotch descent, the grandmother on the paternal side being a native of Scotland. Grandfather Buchanan was born and reared in North Carolina. The Yarbrough family come of English parentage. Both the paternal and maternal grandfathers of our subject took part in the Revolutionary war, and the latter was wounded while in the service and was a pensioner. The maternal grandfather, Nathan Yarbrough, reared two children, a son and daughter. The son, William, a military man, participated in the war of 1812, and afterward was a member of the Light Horse Guard. He also served with distinction in a number of the Indian wars, being under General Gaines.

Noah Buchanan was a wealthy planter and slave-holder. He was a Deacon in the Baptist Church, and a prominent man in the community in which he resided. His chief delight was being with his family and making home pleasant. Of the nine children born to him and his wife, all lived to be grown. Their names are as follows: William J., Alvin G., Joseph R., Mary J., all deceased; Nathan Jefferson, the subject of our sketch; Martha A., widow of James Brown, and Ambrose G., John A. and Cornelius

B. deceased. The father died in 1854, at the age of fifty-five years, and the mother passed away in 1869, at the age of fifty-eight.

Nathan J. Buchanan was educated in the subscription schools of his native county (Oumberland), and at the age of twenty-one commenced life for himself. He has been engaged in farming all his life. He began in North Carolina and continued there until 1853, being successful in his agricultural pursuits. In 1853 he came to Texas, leaving all his possessions at home, except \$500 or \$600, which he brought with him, and located in Wharton county. It was not his intention to remain permanently when he came there; being pleased with the country, however, he decided to stay, and accepted a position as agent for a farmer who had extensive interests there. He was thus employed until the breaking out of the late war.

In the early part of 1862, he joined Company A of Colonel Tate's regiment. He was never engaged in any important battles, as he was employed most of the time in detailed work.

After the surrender, in 1865, Mr. Buchanan returned to Wharton county and rented a large farm, hiring negroes to work it for three years. In the fall of 1868, he moved to McLennan county and purchased 160 acres, three miles from Waco, for which he paid ten dollars an acre. In 1889, he sold this property for \$200 an acre, and purchased his present farm, 120 acres, for \$40 per acre. This place is located three miles from the city limits of Waco. Mr. Buchanan also owns some timber lands and two other farms near his home farm. His son, Olive M., has a fine farm lying between the homestead farm and Waco. This land was a present to him from his father. Mr. Buchanan is eminently a self-made man, his beautiful home and fine farm being the result of his own industry.

He has been twice married. In 1861, he wedded Miss Olivia Mercer, of Texas, daughter of Colonel H. G. Mercer, of Wharton, one of the early settlers of Wharton county. Her mother was of German parentage, and was reared in Louisiana. Mrs. Buchanan died May

5, 1868, leaving a son, Olive M., then only ten days old. In 1870, Mr. Buchanan was united in marriage with Miss Mary L. Harvey, a native of North Carolina and reared in Georgia. Her parents having died, she came to Texas with her brothers.

Mr. Buchanan is associated with the Masonic fraternity, having his membership at Wharton Lodge, No. 99, and for many years he has been a member of the Baptist Church. Mrs. Buchanan is a member of the Old School Presbyterian Church.

PETER McCLELLAND, deceased, was for many years one of the most progressive business men of Waco, and a history of McLennan county would be incomplete without extended mention of this worthy man. He was born at Abingdon, Washington county, Virginia, August 15, 1809, and was a son of Peter McClelland, Sr., a native of Scotland, who emigrated to America, and engaged in planting in Virginia until his death, which occurred in 1826; his wife's maiden name was McDonald. Peter McClelland, Jr., acquired only an ordinary education, as the opportunities offered him were very limited. Believing that he might better his condition in the West, he emigrated to Illinois, in 1832, and settled at Paris, in Edgar county, Illinois, where he opened a wagon shop which he conducted fifteen years. In 1847, he removed to Oskaloosa, Iowa, where he remained until 1853, coming in that year to the Lone Star State; he located in Waco where he was engaged in the grocery business for two years. He next turned his attention to selling goods on the road and for two years traveled in Missouri and Mexico engaged in the stock trade. Agriculture and stock-raising were the next industries to which he devoted himself, and he carried on this business successfully for four years in McLennan county. After locating permanently in Waco he became one of the important factors in her development and growth. With a prophetic eye he looked into the future

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NOTES on THE WILLIAM NEALY YARBROUGH LINE

"William Nealy Yarbrough was born in Alabama about 1830. His father was from Tennessee and his mother from South Carolina. His wife, Mary E. Lewis, was born in Alabama about 1835. She was the daughter of Bennie Lewis of Tennessee. Her mother was also born in Tennessee, but we do not know her name.¹

"William and Mary apparently married in Alabama² and came to Texas by way of Arkansas.³ Their oldest child, William B., was born there about 1855. By about 1857 they were somewhere in Texas because their next child,⁴ Sarah, was born in Texas; as were the remainder of their children, including Amanda, Joseph, Nathan, Robert, and Osscelan.⁵

"They traveled by covered wagon to Texas. They possibly lived in Milam County around Cameron when they first came to Texas. They settled in Limestone County between 1870 and 1880 according to the census. They later went back to Cameron for a visit, and on the return trip Nealy became ill from an apparent heart attack. The family tried to get a doctor, but he died almost instantly.

"The kind people found a vacant house for Nealy's family and set up beds for them to stay. Nealy was buried there. This possibly took place around 1880 to 1883.

"The family then came back to the community of Old Union in Limestone County. They stayed with Mary Yarbrough's brother, Macadja (Cade) Lewis on the old Reeves place until they could get settled on their property which is still known today as 'The Yarbrough Field.' They bought this property which is located southeast of the Union school house adjacent to the property now owned by M.P. (Babe) Yarbrough.

"After a few short years they moved to Buffalo Gap in Taylor County near Abilene, Texas. Joseph, being the eldest, assumed the responsibilities as head of the household. They herded sheep for a living.

William Nealy Yarbrough was born in Alabama about 1830. His father was from Tennessee and his mother from South Carolina. His wife, Mary E Lewis, was born in Alabama about 1835. She was the daughter of Bennie Lewis of Tennessee. Her mother was also born in Tennessee, but we do not know her name.

William and Mary apparently married in Alabama and came to Texas by way of Arkansas. Their oldest child, William B., was born there about 1855. By about 1857 they were somewhere in Texas because their next child, Sarah, was born in Texas; as were the remainder of their children, including, Amanda, Joseph, Nathan, Robert, and Osscelan.

They traveled by covered wagon to Texas. They possibly lived in Milam County around Cameron when they first came to Texas. They settled in Limestone County between 1870 and 1880 according to the census. They later went back to Cameron for a visit, and on the return trip Nealy became ill from an apparent heart attack. The family tried to get a doctor, but he died almost instantly.

The kind people found a vacant house for Nealy's family and set up beds for them to stay. Nealy was buried there. This possibly took place around 1880 to 1883.

The family then came back to the community of Old Union in Limestone County. They stayed with Mary Yarbrough's brother, Macadja (Cade) Lewis on the old Reeves place until they could get settled on their property, which is still known today as "The Yarbrough Field". They bought this property which is located southeast of the Union school house adjoining the property now owned by M. P. (Babe) Yarbrough.

After a few short years they moved to Buffalo Gap in Taylor County near Abilene, Texas. Joseph, being the oldest, assumed the responsibilities as head of the household. They herded sheep for a living.

We do not know anything else about their travels after that; however, they eventually came back to Old Union. Mary died there from blood poisoning in the foot caused from stepping on a tack. She is buried in the Union cemetery along with at least three of her children - Bill, Ellie, & Sally.

Nathan Earl Yarbrough, fifth child of Mary & Nealy Yarbrough, was born in Milam County, Texas, September 18, 1873. At the age of six he was in Limestone County as listed on the 1880 census.

He was apparently a happy, lively, inquisitive person, even though the family suffered many trials and hardships. An example of this was an incident that occurred after his father's death when the family lived on "The Yarbrough Field". They lived in a house with a dirt floor. One night some of their pigs broke out of the pen and tried to root under the kitchen door. Nathan picked up a piece of stove wood, and threw it in the darkness, striking a pig and killing it. Fearing the consequences, he dragged the pig deep into the woods and hid it. He never told of the incident until he was a grown man.

Another example of his ability to love and appreciate life was shown by the fact that he found pleasure even in work. While herding sheep at Buffalo Gap, he found time to chase rabbits and prairie dogs.

Another time, during his teenage years, he was hunting with several friends. Their dogs treed a small wildcat. The others climbed the tree to scare the cat out. They told Nathan to put his hat over the cat when it jumped to the ground. Instead, the cat landed in his arms. He covered it with his hat as he was told. The dogs were running and barking around him. When he realized that he actually had the cat in his arms, he removed the hat. The cat was so scared he was staring wide-eyed and meek and gentle as a kitten. He took it home and raised it as a pet.

Nathan had very little formal education. He attended school in the community of Independence in Limestone County. He estimated that he attained the equivalent of the sixth or seventh grade because he studied Texas History; however, his thirst for knowledge was never ended, and he continued always to study and educate himself. He seemed to be blessed with natural wisdom. He was reared as a member of the Church of Christ and lived for some time during his teenage years with Malcolm Smith, and they did church work together. At some time during the time that he lived in Limestone County, he met the girl he would someday marry.

He moved to Navarro County during his late teens. At the age of twenty he returned to Limestone County and married Delilah Angeline Cox, granddaughter of Thomas and Patsy Cox.

We know nothing about Thomas and Patsy Cox except that he was born in Missouri in approximately 1808. She was born in Tennessee. Aunt Tex Cox remembers Patsy telling about going to the spring for water and worrying about Indians attacking her. She said they held the reins of their horses through the windows at night to keep the Indians from stealing them.

Thomas and Patsy had at least eight children - James, Martha, Sarah, Elizabeth, Lisaline, Eli, Alford, and Obadiah.

Obadiah Cox was born February 17, 1841, in Arkansas. He was a Mason and of Methodist faith. His first wife, Angeline Glover, was born February 4, 1842, in Tennessee, the daughter of a wagon maker, William Glover and his wife, Frances, also from Tennessee. She bore him three children and died February 12, 1870, at the age of 28.

Obadiah then married the sister of his first wife, Eliza E. Glover, who was born December 17, 1847. She also bore Obadiah several children. Obadiah served in the Civil War, but we do not know where. His wife, Eliza, received a pension after he died on June 9, 1914, from cancer of the throat.

Eliza died November 18, 1926, from a heart attack. She had been a widow for twelve years at the time of her death and was living with her son, Bass Obadiah Cox.

Obadiah is buried in the Cox Cemetery between the graves of his two wives. The graves of an infant son and nineteen year old son are there also. The inscription on the tomb of Obadiah reads, "Farewell my wife and children, all. Your father, Christ doth call. Mourn not for me; it is in vain to call me to your sight again." The inscription on Eliza's tomb reads, "Dear Mother, tho we miss you much, we know you rest with God."

Obadiah and Eliza owned several acres of land around the old Cox home place. Obadiah donated the land for the Cox Cemetery where they are buried. He sold most of the remainder of his land to various people. He sold the land now known as the Nathan Yarbrough home place to his son, Cale T.

Obadiah's other children were James, John, Jessie, William (Lee), B. Obadiah, Mary J., Maggie, Rosie, Edie, and Delilah Angeline.

Delilah Angeline Cox (usually called Annie) was born September 9, 1878, in Limestone County, Texas, in the Old Union community on the Old Cox home place. She was the eighth child of Obadiah Cox and the fifth child born to Eliza and Obadiah. She lived in the Old Union community until the time of her marriage. Nothing much is known of her life until that time.

Nathan Earl Yarbrough and Delilah Angeline were married August 17, 1894. Nathan was twenty years old, and Annie was fifteen. Nathan lived in Navarro County at the time. He came to Old Union to get Annie in a covered wagon. His brother, Bill, a widower, came with him. Bill was getting married for the second time to Elizabeth Cox (Obadiah's sister). The Justice of the Peace came out and married both couples in the wagon.

They stayed with Obadiah and Eliza Cox for a while, then they returned to Powell, Texas, in Navarro County. Their first three children were born there. Alva Elma was born May 14, 1896. Orien Gertrude was born January 25, 1899. The weather was very cold and snow was everywhere when she was born. They had no wood for the fire, so Nathan went to hunt some. He found someone else's wood already cut and stacked and took a wagon load. This was very unusual for a man of Nathan's character.

Their third child, Cecil Wade, was born November 16, 1901. When Cecil (Bud) was two years old, which would be about 1903, Nathan moved his family to Oklahoma. Nathan's brothers, Bill and Joe Yarbrough, and their families and Nathan's brother-in-law, Sid Clark, and his family all traveled in three or four wagons on the trip to Oklahoma. They traveled in the fall of the year, and it was very cold.

Cecil (Bud) was only two years old, but he drove the family wagon all the way from Navarro County to Ravig, Oklahoma, near Chickasha. Ravig was a very small place. Nathan farmed there for about a year and worked at the sawmill some. They had some Indian neighbors who came to visit quite often. The Indians spoke both English and their native tongue. Annie was never at ease with them because she thought they were plotting to kill her when they were speaking in Indian.

Nathan and Annie had two children born in Oklahoma. Melvin Percy was born March 2, 1904. He later became known as Baby Percy and then later just Babe, which he is still called today. Once when Cecil was thinning corn, Melvin stuck his head under Cecil's hoe, and was practically beheaded.

Nathan and Annie's fifth child, Clifford Eugene, was born September 17, 1907. He lived less than a month and died October 3, 1907. He was buried there in Oklahoma.

In approximately 1908 the Yarbrough family returned to Limestone County by train. They moved to the old Preacher Reeves place where their sixth child, Mary Edith Lavelle, was born on July 8, 1909. She said that the only thing she could remember about her childhood was that she was a very pretty child. Gertrude was ten years old at the time Edith was born and had to wash her diapers - a chore Gertrude greatly detested and never let Edith forget.

The family then moved to the Uncle Jim Cox place across Dooley Creek. Their seventh child, Vivian Odena, was born there on January 11, 1912. She was later nicknamed Pad because of the way she padded so loud across the floor in her bare feet.

They then moved to the Uncle Hughes Henderson place about one fourth mile from the church house. Here, Inith Emaline, their eighth child, was born on July 27, 1914. Inith had very bad leg aches as a child, and her mother had to rub them for her every night so that she could sleep.

When Millicent Hazel, their ninth child, was born, Nathan and Annie were living with Obadiah and Eliza on the Old Cox home place. She was born on April 10, 1913, during World War I.

They purchased the property now known as the Nathan Yarbrough home place on October 9, 1917, from Cale T. and Jennie Cox (Annie's brother and sister-in-law). Cale had purchased the property from his father, Obadiah Cox, for the sum of \$325 in 1910. The deed was signed by Obadiah Cox and Eliza Cox, who could only sign with an X, as she could neither read nor write. Nathan and Annie bought the seventy-five acres for \$1125 (\$15 per acre). They paid \$225 deposit. Edith has possession of the original deed,

They lived with Eliza for a while after they bought the property. After Hazel was born, they moved to their house they had built just below the present Cecil Yarbrough home. They lived there until they built the house now known as the Yarbrough home place in 1936.

The family spent many happy years as the children all grew to be young men and women. There are some very interesting and humorous stories told by various ones. Edith said she was so mean that she stunk. She also told of hoeing watermelons while Vivian held an umbrella over her head. She was very sensitive about her slip showing. When they started anywhere, if her slip showed the least bit, she threw a fit and would get so upset that her mother would get upset, and everybody had to stay home.

Once Edith and Cleo Cox (Aunt Tex's daughter) climbed a barn with a steep roof. It had been raining, and the roof was slick. They slipped and tried to hold on. Cleo grabbed the top of the roof, and Edith held on to Cleo's foot. As if that was not enough, along came a scorpion. They started screaming, and Nathan heard them. He said if they had been boys, he would have left them up there, but he had a soft touch for the girls and got them a ladder.

Hazel, being the youngest of the family, was left to play alone because the other children had other interests. She played in the corn field and called all the corn stalks different people.

Nathan was very active in civic and church affairs. He was a trustee of the Old Union school and then of the Oletha school after they consolidated. He had gone to singing schools held by various teachers that came to the community during his younger years. He became an excellent singer and leader in the Church of Christ. He traveled to various communities singing for church meetings. He also conducted many singing schools. On a number of occasions he had to break up fights between the boys who came.

He was loved and praised by everyone who knew him as a wise and fair-minded man. An example of his attitude toward mankind was the occasion when some young men stole some of his chickens. He found out who they were and went to talk to them. He told the boys if they would just pay him for the chickens, that would be the end of it. They paid him and never stole another chicken from him.

On another occasion he saw some boys going into his watermelon patch to steal some watermelons. He went down to the patch and found the boys with a green melon burst on the ground. He told them that he knew where there was a ripe one. He cut the ripe melon, and they all had a feast. He told them if they ever wanted a watermelon again, just to ask, and he would give all they could eat. Needless to say, they did not rob his patch again.

There always seemed to be something exciting or humorous going on when he was around. One night there was a bright moon, and a skunk got into his chickens. He chased the skunk with a hoe, and it turned and started after him. He had on his longhandles. He jumped upon a gate post and lay on his stomach with his arms and legs outstretched. He really was a sight in the moonlight.

One night he was eating supper before going to church. He was in a hurry. He was eating a piece of pie and complained of the crust being very tough. Annie noticed that he was eating the paper pie plate as well as the pie.

Nathan was a farmer by trade, and also had an orchard of beautiful peach and pear trees. These trees grew and flourished until the summer before his death when the heat and dry weather killed them. His orchard was profitable to him, as well as delight to his children and grandchildren.

Annie Yarbrough was a very kind and gentle lady. She reared her family with a firm but loving hand. She loved flowers and had one of the prettiest yards in the community at the time of her death. Her favorite was roses, and she had a beautiful rose garden. She would go to the woods and bring back leaves for her flower beds. She was a very quiet, reserved person in contrast to the lively nature of Nathan.

Nathan and Annie lived very happily until August 8, 1943, when Annie departed this life. She had a heart attack about a week before her death. She seemed to be doing better on the morning she died, but had another attack. She was 65 years of age. Nathan lived alone for a while, and on _____, he married Annie's sister, Mary. She was also the widow of Nathan's brother, Joe Yarbrough.

Mary and Nathan had a gratifying and comforting companionship in their aging years. On _____ at the age of _____ Mary also died of a heart attack. Nathan stayed on at the home place, even though he had suffered a stroke that had partially paralyzed him. His daughter, Edith, and her family came to live with him and take care of him. He later suffered another stroke which almost completely paralyzed him. He was never able to talk again. He could, however, pick up a song book and sing from it until a third stroke took his life on November 5, 1952.

The Yarbrough property was divided among the children. Edith bought the property surrounding the home place from the rest of the children, and Cecil bought all the cultivated land.

As of this date, August 28, 1962, the living decedents of Nathan and Annie Yarbrough are as follows:

Six children, thirty grandchildren, thirty great-grandchildren, and _____ great, great, grandchildren.

Lucretia Yeldell Wooton was born February 27, 1898 at Yeldell, Texas, Freestone County. The family moved to Mexia when she was eight years old. The first Yeldell home was on Milam Street. When she was twelve the family moved to 621 North Red River, the present Wooton home. This was the first house in Mexia to have a landscaped yard. The house has also received a Texas Historical Marker.

Howard and Lucretia were married July 31, 1917. They had five daughters; twin daughters, Theresa Elmore Wooton Coleman and Sophia Lucretia Wooton Gaffron, Jacqueline Jane Wooton Willbanks, Joan Fay Wooton Hill, and Betty Louise Wooton Longbotham (deceased).

Lucretia is active in the Mexia Presbyterian Church. She enjoys ceramics, needlework, bridge, and traveling. She is a member of the Garden Club, the Sewing Club, the Friday Club, the Daughters of the American Revolution, the United Daughters of the Confederacy. *Lucretia Wooton*

James Andrew Wright

James Andrew Wright was the third child of George C. and Mary McClurkin Wright, born 7-9-1844 in Benton County, Alabama. At age 18, he enlisted in the Alabama Thirty-first Infantry and participated in the fighting at Tazewell and Cumberland Gap in Tennessee then at Port Gibson and in the battle of Champion Hill in Mississippi where he was captured. After being paroled he rejoined the army at Demopolis, Alabama and fought in the battles of Lookout Mountain, Missionary Ridge, Chicamauga in Tennessee, then was engaged in the fighting around Atlanta, Dalton and Kennesaw Mountain, Georgia where he was again taken prisoner. In June 1865 he was released from the prison on Johnson's Island, Ohio and returned to his Alabama home to find the physical and social conditions radically changed. As soon as he could, he moved westward into Texas and settled at Prairie Grove in Limestone County on 400 acres of raw land that he developed and farmed.

On December 23, 1869 he married Mattie Louisa Waller, daughter of Thomas Flint Waller, a pioneer Texan, having come from Mississippi to Limestone County in 1852. There were twelve children born to them, the oldest being William Waller Wright followed by Oscar Clinton, Thomas Emmett, James Ernest, Samuel Howard, George Dana, Herbert Emil, Helen Eloise, James Lilburn, Earl Flint, Nellie Myrtle and Prudie Zelene.

Mr. Wright found time to devote to public service having served as Commissioner of the third precinct, Justice of the Peace for twelve years and on the district school board many times. He was identified with the Missionary Baptist Church many years serving as church clerk and Moderator of the Association. He was a member of the Joseph E. Johnson Camp of Confederate Veterans Reunion.

Mr. Wright died January 19, 1934. Mrs. Wright died August 9, 1921; both are buried in the Prairie Grove Cemetery along with five of their children only one mile from their old family farm and home. *J.R. Wright*

Thomas Emmett Wright

Thomas Emmett Wright was the third child of James Andrew and Mattie Louisa Wright, born March 26, 1874 at Prairie Grove in Limestone County, Texas. He married Josephine Steele, daughter of Robert E. and Josephine Williams Steele of Freestone County on November 27, 1901 in Mexia by a Presbyterian minister, The Reverend Frank McKinzie.

Mr. and Mrs. Wright lived near Prairie Grove for six years before moving to Mexia to take advantage of the schools there. Mrs. Wright had taught school several years in Limestone County including those at Prairie Grove and Point Enterprise. Mr. Wright was a farmer, and after moving to Mexia, managed the farm properties of the R.E. Steele family until his death on March 17, 1941. Mrs. Wright was born January 25, 1878 in Cotton Gin of Freestone County, Texas. Her father, an orphan, came to Texas in 1854 with an uncle from Eutaw, Alabama. He served in the Civil War in the Seventh Texas Infantry formed in Freestone County. After the war he returned to Cotton Gin, married and raised a family of six children. In 1882 he was elected in his county as representative in eighteenth, nineteenth and twentieth Texas legislatures; in 1882 he was elected senator from the twelfth senatorial district and served two terms. He was a regular participant in all of the Confederate Veterans reunions of the Joseph E. Johnston Camp until his death on August 17, 1920 at Mexia.

Mr. and Mrs. Wright were the parents of six children: William Steele Wright, born 9-23-03, died 4-23-75, married Vivian F. Hart and have one son, Billy Brooks Wright and wife Catherine, two grandsons, Douglas and Keith Wright, all of Houston. Oscar Harold Wright, born 9-15-05, died 9-15-33, single, buried at Mexia. James R. born 8-24-08, married Paula Thurston 6-18-39 in Overton, Texas, now living in Odessa and have one daughter, Katherine Ann Flowers, and a granddaughter, Angela Sherree Deason of Odessa. Thomas E., Jr., born 10-14-12, died 10-16-74. Buried in Mexia. Nathan Earl Yarbrough

Nathan Earl Yarbrough, fifth child of Mary and William Nealy Yarbrough, was born in Milam County Texas, September 18, 1873. At the age of six he was listed on the 1880 Limestone County census.

He was reared as a member of the Church of Christ and lived for some time during his teenage years with the Malcolm Smith family. They did church work together.

He moved to Navarro County during his late teens. At the age of twenty he returned to Limestone County and married Delilah Angeline Cox, granddaughter of Thomas and Patsy Cox.

Delilah Angeline Cox (Annie) was born September 9, 1878, in Limestone County in the Old Union community. She was the eighth child of Obadiah Cox and the fifth child born to Eliza and Obadiah.

Nathan and Annie were married August 17, 1894. Nathan was 20 years old and Annie was 15. To this union were born nine children: Alva Emma, May 14, 1896; Orien Gertrude, January 25, 1899; Cecil Wade, November 16, 1901; Melvin Percy, March 2, 1904; Clifford Eugene, September 17, 1907, died in infancy; Mary Edith Lavelle, July 8, 1909; Vivian Odena, January 11, 1912; Inith Emaline, July 27, 1914 and Millicent Hazel, April 10, 1918.

GRIFFIN BAYNE KENNEDY, of Limestone County, is of Irish descent, and the son of GEORGE W. KENNEDY. The latter's father, JOHN KENNEDY, was a native of North Carolina, moved to Kentucky, and was an early settler of Maury County, Tennessee, where GEORGE was born. GEORGE W. KENNEDY married LAURA A. BAYNE, daughter of GRIFFIN BAYNE of Franklin County, Tennessee. He lived in that county until he came to Limestone County in 1856. He was a farmer and stock raiser, and died in March 1885, at the age of seventy-three years.

The maternal grandfather, GRIFFIN BAYNE, was a native of Virginia, a pioneer settler of Tennessee and a distinguished Texas, serving as a colonel in the Texas War for Independence. NATHAN EARL YARBROUGH FAMILY REUNION

On Sunday, September 4th, 1966, on the grounds of the Old Union Church in Limestone County, Texas, near Grosebeck, the descendants of Nathan Earl Yarbrough held their annual reunion. Your editors attended as guests of Virgil Yarbrough.

Following an outdoor buffet style lunch, Family Chairman B.L. Henderson called the business meeting to order. The first order of business was family reports. Each of these represented a branch of the family through a son or daughter of Nathan Earl Yarbrough (b.1873, d.1952). The first was given by Virgil Yarbrough (grandson) of LaVergne, Tenn., formerly of Mt. Calm, Tex., representing the Alva Elmer Yarbrough family. The second was given by Travis Thomason (grandson) of Ft. Worth, Tex., representing the Gertrude (Yarbrough) Thomason branch. Another was given by Cecil Yarbrough (son) of Thornton, Tex., representing his branch. Mrs. Vivian (Yar-

brough) Jones (daughter) of Lake Jackson, Tex. gave the report for her branch. She was followed by her sister, Mrs. Inith (Yarbrough) Mays (daughter) of Ft. Worth, speaking for her family. The concluding report was given by Hazel (Yarbrough) Calhoun (daughter) of Houston, Tex., representing her branch.

Following the family reports, Chairman Henderson called on one of your editors, Charles Yarborough, to present a brief history of the Yarbrough family. Following his presentation, he was asked several questions about the family. These included questions about the deviations in spellings of the name, about the meanings of the name, and about former slaves who had taken the Yarbrough name.

The next order of business was the reading of the minutes of the previous reunion by the reunion secretary, Mrs. Mary Stevens of Spring, Tex.

An election followed. Buddy Koontz of Houston, Tex. was elected as reunion chairman for the 1967 reunion; Mary Stevens of Spring, Tex. as secretary, and also, along with Kathy Jones of Lake Jackson, Tex., to work on the family tree; Doug Jones of Houston, Tex. as treasurer; Jo Ann Koontz of Houston, Tex. as recording secretary; Luther Yarbrough of Mt. Calm, Tex. as drink chairman; Inith Mays of Ft. Worth, Tex. as barbecue chairman, and also as publisher of the family newsletter.

The final order of business was a motion that the 1967 reunion be held at the same time--first Sunday before Labor Day--and in the same place--the Old Union Church Grounds--as is traditional. The measure passed unanimously.

A total of 73 persons were in attendance. The meeting had begun early in the day with Leon Morgan of Ft. Worth, Tex. bringing the Sunday School lesson there in the Old Union Church--the church in which his grandfather, Nathan Earl Yarbrough, had been an active member as early as 58 years before.

had no wood for fire, so Nathan went to hunt some. He found someone else's wood already cut and stacked and took a wagon load. This was very unusual for a man of Nathan's character.

"Their third child, Cecil Wade, was born November 16, 1901. When Cecil (Bud) was two years old, which would be about 1903, Nathan moved his family to Oklahoma. Nathan's brothers, Bill and Joe Yarbrough, and their families and Nathan's brother-in-law, Sid Clark, and his family all traveled in three or four wagons on the trip to Oklahoma. They traveled in the fall of the year, and it was very cold.

"Cecil (Bud) was only two years old, but he drove the family wagon all the way from Navarro County to Ravig, Oklahoma, near Chickasha. Ravig was a very small place. Nathan farmed there for about a year and worked at the sawmill some. They had some Indian neighbors who came to visit quite often. The Indians spoke both English and their native tongue. Annie was never at ease with them because she thought they were plotting to kill her when they were speaking in Indian.

"Nathan and Annie had two children born in Oklahoma. Melvin Percy was born March 2, 1904. He later became known as Baby Percy and then later just Babe, which he is still called today. Once when Cecil was thinning corn, Melvin stuck his head under Cecil's hoe, and was practically beheaded.

"Nathan and Annie's fifth child, Clifford Eugene, was born September 17, 1907. He lived less than a month and died October 3, 1907. He was buried in Oklahoma.

"In approximately 1908 the Yarbrough family returned to Limestone County by train. They moved to the old Preacher Reeves place where their sixth child, Mary Edith Lavelle, was born on July 8, 1909. She said that the only thing she could remember about her childhood was that she was a very pretty child. Gertrude was ten years old at the time Edith was born and had to wash her diapers--a chore Gertrude greatly detested

and never let Edith forget.

"The family then moved to the Uncle Jim Cox place across Dooley Creek. Their seventh child, Vivian Odena, was born there on January 11, 1912. She was later nicknamed Pad because of the way she padded so loudly across the floor in her bare feet.

"They then moved to the Uncle Hughes Henderson place about one fourth mile from the church house. Here, Inith Emaline, their eighth child, was born on July 27, 1914. Inith had very bad leg aches as a child, and her mother had to rub them for her every night so that she could sleep.

"When Millicent Hazel, their ninth child, was born, Nathan and Annie were living with Obadiah and Eliza on the old Cox home place. She was born on April 10, 1918, during World War I.

"They purchased the property now known as the Nathan Yarbrough home place on October 9, 1917, from Cale T. and Jennie Cox (Annie's brother and sister-in-law). Cale had purchased the property from his father, Obadiah Cox for the sum of \$325 in 1910. The deed was signed by Obadiah Cox and Eliza Cox, who could only sign with an X, as she could neither read nor write. Nathan and Annie bought the seventy-five acres for \$1125 (\$15 per acre). They paid \$225 deposit. Edith has possession of the original deed.

"They lived with Eliza for a while after they bought the property. After Hazel was born, they moved to their house they had built just below the present Cecil Yarbrough home. They lived there until they built the house now known as the Yarbrough home place in 1936.

"The family spent many happy hours as the children all grew to be young men and women. There are some very interesting and humorous stories told by various ones. Edith said she was so mean that she stunk. She also told of hoeing watermelons while Vivian held an umbrella over her head. She was

very sensitive about her slip showing. When they started anywhere, if her slip showed the least bit, she threw a fit and would get so upset that her mother would get upset, and everybody had to stay home.

"Once Edith and Cleo Cox (Aunt Tex's daughter) climbed a barn with a steep roof. It had been raining, and the roof was slick. They slipped and tried to hold on. Cleo grabbed the top of the roof, and Edith held on to Cleo's foot. As if that was not enough, along came a scorpion. They started screaming, and Nathan heard them. He said if they had been boys, he would have left them up there, but he had a soft touch for the girls and got them a ladder.

"Hazel, being the youngest of the family, was left to play alone because the other children had other interests. She played in the corn field and called all the corn stalks different people.

"Nathan was very active in civic and church affairs. He was a trustee of the Old Union school and then of the Oleta school after they consolidated. He had gone to singing schools held by various teachers that came to the community during his younger years. He became an excellent singer and leader in the Church of Christ. He traveled to various communities singing for church meetings. He also conducted many singing schools. On a number of occasions he had to break up fights between the boys who came.

"He was loved and praised by everyone who knew him as a wise and fair-minded man. An example of his attitude toward mankind was the occasion when some young men stole some of his chickens. He found out who they were and went to talk to them. He told the boys that if they would just pay him for the chickens, that would be the end of it. They paid him and never stole another chicken from him.

"On another occasion he saw some boys going into his watermelon patch to steal some watermelons. He went down to

the patch and found the boys with a green melon burst on the ground. He told them that he knew where there was a ripe one. He cut the ripe melon, and they all had a feast. He told them if they ever wanted a watermelon again, just to ask, and he would give them all they could eat. Needless to say, they did not rob his patch again.

"There always seemed to be something exciting or humorous going on where he was around. One night there was a bright moon, and a skunk got into his chickens. He chased the skunk with a hoe, and it turned and started after him. He had on his longhandles. He jumped upon a gate post and lay on his stomach with his arms and legs outstretched. He really was a sight in the moonlight.

"One night he was eating supper before going to church. He was in a hurry. He was eating a piece of pie and complained of the crust being very tough. Annie noticed that he was eating the paper pie plate as well as the pie.

"Nathan was a farmer by trade, and also had an orchard of beautiful peach and pear trees. These trees grew and flourished until the summer before his death when the heat and dry weather killed them. His orchard was profitable to him as well as a delight to his children and grandchildren.

"Annie Yarbrough was a very kind and gentle lady. She reared her family with a firm but loving hand. She loved flowers and had one of the prettiest yards in the community at the time of her death. Her favorite was roses, and she had a beautiful rose garden. She would go to the woods and bring back leaves for her flower beds. She was a very quiet, reserved person in contrast to the lively nature of Nathan.

"Nathan and Annie lived very happily until August 8, 1943, when Annie departed this life. She had a heart attack about a week before her death. She seemed to be doing better on the morning she died, but had another attack. She was 65 years of

age. Nathan lived alone for a while, ...[later marrying] Annie's sister, Mary. She was also the widow of Nathan's brother, Joe Yarbrough.

"Mary and Nathan had a gratifying and comforting companionship in their aging years. ...[In her later years,] Mary also died of a heart attack. Nathan stayed on at the home place, even though he had suffered a stroke that had partially paralyzed him. His daughter, Edith, and her family came to live with him and take care of him. He later suffered another stroke which almost completely paralyzed him. He was never able to talk again. He could, however, pick up a song book and sing from it until a third stroke took his life on November 5, 1952.

"The Yarbrough property was divided among the children. Edith bought the property surrounding the home place from the rest of the children, and Cecil bought all the cultivated land.

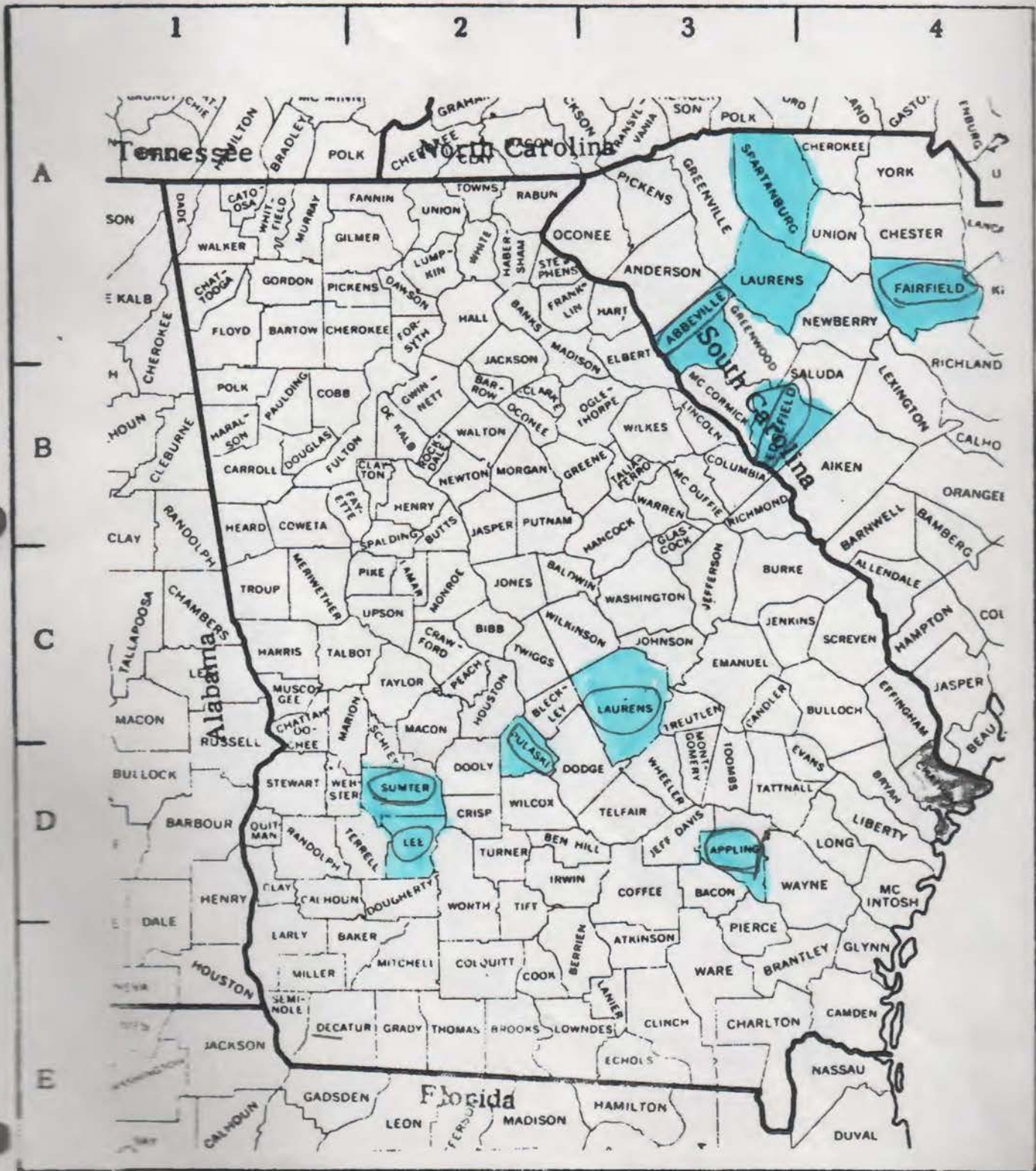

MORE WASHINGTON CO., GA, REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS

Mrs. Nora B. Elder, 740 South Davis, Tampa, FL 33606 found three more men who should have been included in the list of Revolutionary Soldiers compiled by genealogists in that county - WILLIAM HICKLIN, WILLIAM KINMAN and BLAND BLAKELY or BLAKELEY.

Mr. Lloyd Hicks found records of Revolutionary service for JAMES OLIVER in the Inferior Court Minutes of Pulaski Co., GA 1824-30. His testimony of service was made 5-15-1828, recorded 3-1-1830, and was found at the very end of the microfilm.

JOHN ARMSTRONG FAMILY ARTICLE

Mr. Fred W. Field, 1516 Avenida Selva, Fullerton, CA 92633 offers to send a copy to anyone interested in his recent article on the family of JOHN ARMSTRONG whose will was recorded in original Randolph (now Jasper) Co., GA 1810. The article deals with the large segment of John's family who migrated to Lowndes and Montgomery Cos., AL about 1820.

INDIAN BOOKS AND COUNCIL JOURNAL

Miss Hazel Beatrous, 2755 Orchard Oaks Dr., Sarasota, FL 33579 wonders what is included in these books, mentioned from time to time in PUZZLERS. She is particularly interested in names of Indian traders for she has reason to believe that the father of JOSEPH YARBROUGH, b. SC, d. Decatur Co., GA in 1846, might have been an Indian trader.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Both Georgia and South Carolina's governors had Councils, and thus Council Journals, which have been microfilmed by the Library of Congress as part of the RECORDS OF THE STATES OF THE UNITED STATES (RSUS).

The South Carolina records series called the Indian Books have been published by the SC Archives, and can be borrowed through inter-library loan from the South Caroliniana Library, U.S.C., Columbia, SC 29208. These books contained reports of negotiations with the Indians, traders and scouts' reports, depredations, gifts, and the like. Since the books are transcriptions, and are indexed, one can search for an individual easily.

The Georgia Council Journals have not been indexed, though Gov. Allen D. Candler did publish extensive abstracts in COLONIAL RECORDS OF GEORGIA series. The men who were unpaid Indian traders petitioned the Georgia Governor, first just before the Revolution, and later the British government after the close of the war. Some of the wiser, unpaid traders turned over their claims to their British creditors to pursue.

DEVISE

The gift of REAL PROPERTY by the last will and testament of the donor (the testator, the devisor). The recipient was the DEVISEE.

The gift can be classified as either VESTED, or CONTINGENT or CONDITIONAL. Each gift took effect only after the death of the testator.

A VESTED devise provided that the gift would take place, i.e. "I give to my son John and his heirs forever, the plantation on which I now dwell."

Even the gift of the plantation "when my son John becomes 21" was a vested gift, for there is certainty that the plantation became John's and not another's when John reached his majority.

You have frequently seen the CONTINGENT or CONDITIONAL devise in wills. The testator used this method to redistribute his estate if a devisee died, or failed to perform some specified action.

This conditional devise appeared in the will of MRS. FRANCES DAVENPORT, Will Book B, p. 197, Oglethorpe Co., GA, 1820:

"My son Jesse is to have the tract of land I now live on provided he moves to this state, if not to be divided equally among them (her children) all."

THOMAS M. JOHNSON wrote this conditional devise into his will (*Ibid*, p. 213) "But in case my wife JANE M. JOHNSON should hereafter be the mother of a child or children the lawful heir or heirs of my own body, then it is my will that an equal division take place between my said wife and child or children above alluded to, in which case all that is willed to my brothers or executors is withdrawn."

JOSEPH GARLINGTON (*Ibid* p. 231) loaned his real and personal estate to his wife NANCY F. GARLINGTON during her lifetime.
