Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland “Cy” Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrate from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard – John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The “Old Country” referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from “the old country”; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is “Yarbrough”.

First I give & bequeath to my Bro. Charles, all my personal property & herein give & bequeath to him all of the money due me from my Mothers Estate some in Denton Co. Ala, land, and also my interest im two lots of land in Ga. And give him full power to receive the same by laws or otherwise, as I would have if living. The reason of my giving & bequeathing to my Bro. Charles Yar. All my personal effects & all my mothers estate in Ala. After my just debt is paid, in that I have 5 chil. For him to raise, & he will need it for that purpose. In witness where of I have herewith set my hand & seal, this the 7th day of July, 1857.

WILL of WILLIAM YARBROUGH⁷

In the name of God Amen I William Yarbrough of the County of Logan and State of Kentucky, being of perfect mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament. And as touching such worldly estates wherewith it has pleased god to bless me in this life, I give, demise, and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

First my will and desire is that all my just debts and funeral expences [sic] be paid.

Secondly I leave to my brother Jeremiah Yarbrough the labour of my negro man Ben dureing [sic] of his life, and at his death, I give and bequeathe [sic] the said negro Ben to all my brother Jeremiah Yarbroughs children that may then be a live [sic] to them and there [sic] heirs for ever.

Thirdly I give and bequeathe [sic] to my nephew Benjamin Yarbrough my shot gun, and my saddle and bridle to him and his heirs for ever.

Fourthly and lastly, I give and bequeathe [sic] to my Brother Jeremiah Yarbrough, whom I constitute, make and ordain, the sole Executor of this my last will and testament all the rest and ressidue [sic] of my estate both real and personal by him freely to be posses'd and enjoy'd. And I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests and Executons [sic] by me in any wise before named, Will'd and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other, to be my last will and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Eleven.

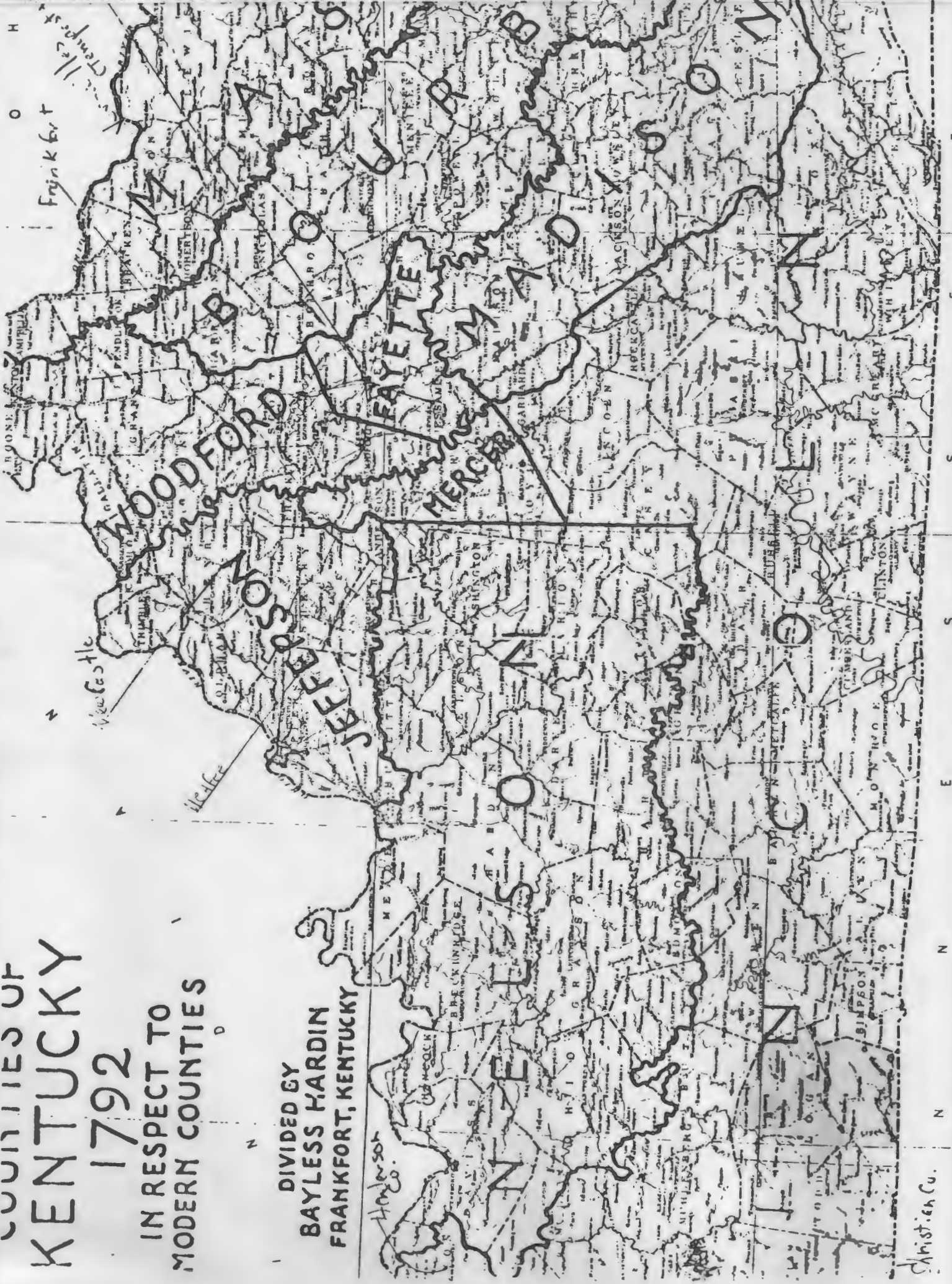

After graduating with honor he settled in the city where he has acquired a large and lucrative practice when just entering his majority. He has been honored by being chosen one of the surgeons on the C.H.V. & T.R.R., and Medical Examiner for three insurance companies.

Another young man, Mr. George Murray, of Logan county, will graduate at Starling College next spring and will become Taylors partner.

Is it Self-Murder?

Mr. Alfred T. Evans, who lives out on the Greenville road several miles, brought a flat stone into our office early Monday morning which has created no end of surmise, not to say excitement, in his neighborhood. One side of the stone is flat and perfectly smooth and bears the inscription, written in lead Pencil:

"Notice, THE Finder of this, if he will go 100 yards on opposite side of railroad from house on hill will find a dead man. Over."

Then on the other side are the words; "I will be dead in five minutes."

The writing is in a large, round bold hand, and seems freshly written.

Mr. Evans says the stone was found by Master George Murphey, son of Mr. George W. Murphey, who carried it at once to his father. It was shown to a number of farmers in the vicinity, and, after consultation, it was decided to make a thorough search for the suicide. All efforts to find a corpse prove futile, however, and the alarmed residents returned to their respective homes empty-handed.

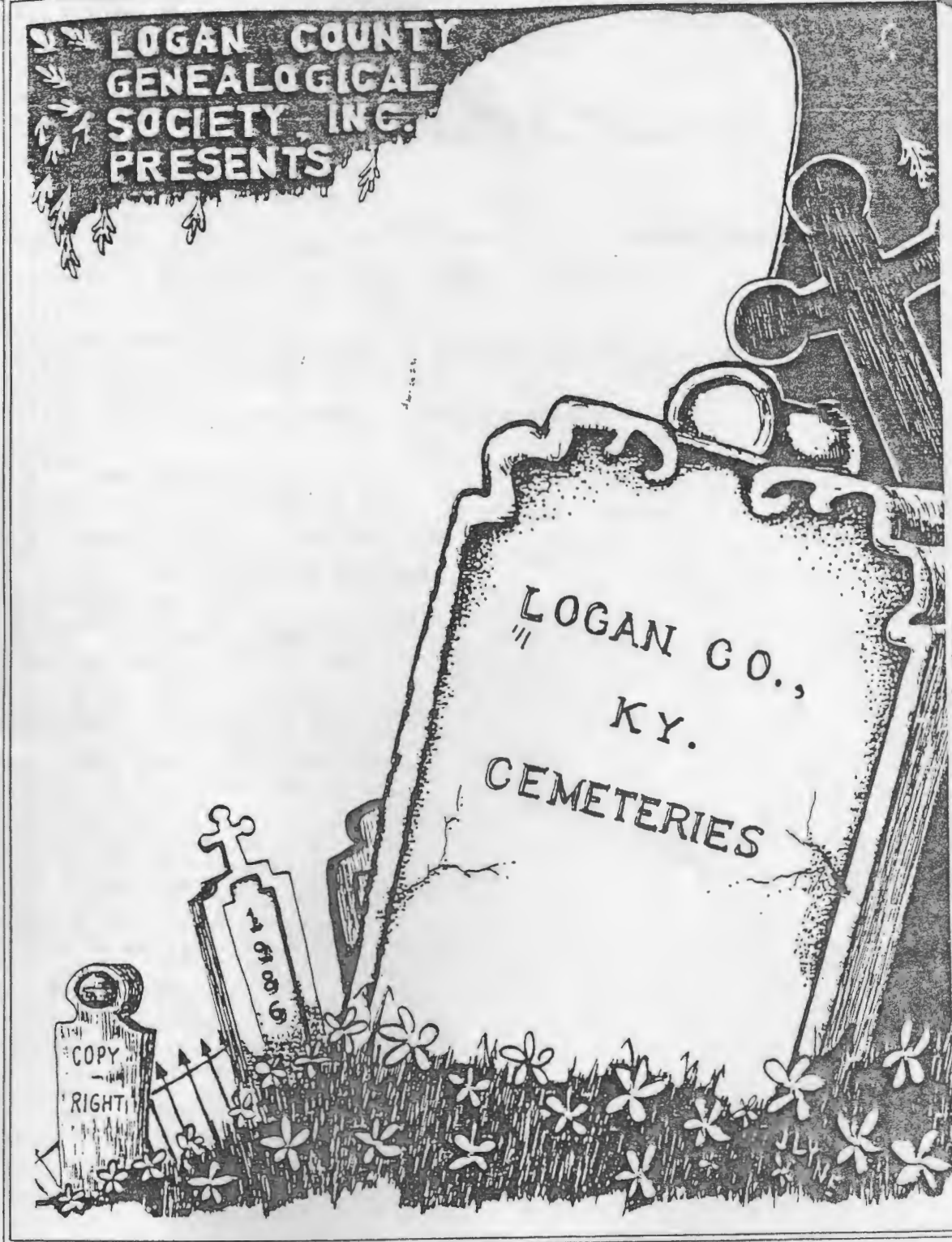

OLD TRYON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

Family researchers should be aware of boundary line changes that were made between North Carolina and Virginia, between North and South Carolina, and especially, in old Tryon County, N. C.

Briefly, the Caroline Grant was divided into North and South Carolina in 1729. Tryon County, N. C. - was established 1768/69 - from Anson County which in turn had been formed 1749 from Bladen County, N. C. Later, Tryon County was dissolved, with a part of it becoming Lincoln County, N. C.

Meanwhile, both North and South Carolina had been granting land along their mutual border since 1752, with Tryon County's southern boundary left open and which, included the present day counties of Greenville, Laurens, Spartanburg, Cherokee, Union, York and Chester, South Carolina - all or in part.

On June 4, 1772 a survey was made to establish the boundary between the two states. Soon thereafter the people petitioned the King in an attempt to save their land because of the tangled state of affairs. Two strips of land eleven miles wide were exchanged to settle the boundary dispute. Anson and Mecklenburg County's in North Carolina lost a portion of their land which became a part of York County, South Carolina. To the north, along the line between North Carolina and Virginia, the people in the Virginia counties of Washington and Grayson were part-time residents of North Carolina until a new boundary line was established.

The witness to the deed Peter Harris died, the widow Harris nee Susannah Hartgrove married Samuel Kuykendall on 12 Feb 1791 in Lincoln County, N.C. Her second husband, Samuel Kuykendall died 16 Nov 1810 in York County, S.C.

These records in various places yet Yarborough and Kuykendall, each married to a Hartgrove woman, may have lived as neighbors and continuous owners of acreage in the area known as old Tryon County, N.C. Boundaries were changed, new counties formed, but the location may have remained the same.

Yarbrough - Logan County, Kentucky (1)

Benjamin B. Yarbrough of Virginia, and wife Nancy Graham Yarbrough of Logan County, were residents of Russellville, Ky. Both were early settlers of Logan County. In January 1868, their daughter Amy N. Yarbrough married John Adsit, who was born 1842.

See William Yarbrough 1811 Will probated in Logan County, Ky.- He named brother Jeremiah Yarbrough as executor, and devised to "nephew Benjamin Yarbrough." (2)

and was found in Washington Parish by 1830. Gideon fought in the War of 1812, being discharged in Mar. 1815 at New Orleans. On 6 June 1833 Gideon, at age 73, applied in Orleans Parish, LA, for bounty land. He died between then and 18 Sept. 1856, for on that date his wife Nancy of Washington Parish, LA, aged 66 years, applied for bounty land under the Act of 14 May 1856, as the widow of Gideon Yarbrough for his service in the war. In her application we learn the date of their marriage and that her maiden name was Nancy Scarbrough.

Benjamin Yarbrough was first found in Mecklenburg Co., NC, in 1794 when he made entry for a land grant for 50 acres which he received in 1802. He received another grant for 230 acres in 1799. Both tracts of land lay on the waters of Richardson Creek. (Bk. 100, p. 407)

As mentioned before Benjamin Yarbrough was in Franklin Co., GA, with Jephtha and Gideon. He was found in Washington Co., GA, in the 1820 census, and in 1830 he was listed as between 70 and 80 in Telfair Co., GA. This means he was born before 1760, so he may be the son of Joshua I and a brother to Joshua II. Evidently Benjamin married a daughter of William Vinson before 1797, for in his will Vinson named Benjamin Yarbrough's three children, Vinson Yarbrough, Susannah Yarbrough, and Eliza Mary Yarbrough. The will was dated 26 Sept. 1797. On 3 Oct. 1797 Benjamin married Miss Hartgrave (first name not given) in Mecklenburg Co.

Edmond Yarbrough made entry for a land grant of 188 acres on Adder branch of Waxhaw Creek, Mecklenburg Co., NC, in Aug. 1789. He received it 22 Nov. 1792. (Grant 991, Book 14, p. 342) He received another grant 8 May 1823. (Grant 2352, Book 17, p. 349) He moved to Perry Co., TN, before 1830. Later he was found in Decatur Co. which was made from Perry Co. His known children were: Aquila, Henry, James, William, Nancy, Joseph, and John H. Yarbrough. Wife was Sophia Goswick.

William Yarbrough witnessed two deeds for Joshua II--one when Joshua sold land to Reuben Yarbrough, and then when he sold land to Thomas Vincent. According to a descendant, the late Ida Walling, William was born about 1766 and married Rachael Shelby 1793, Mecklenburg Co. (No record found in the courthouse) and moved first to White Co., TN, and then to Hardeman Co., TN. Their known children: Sarah, Benjamin, Hampton, Jephtha, William, George, Hulda, John, Susanna, and Reuben.

Joshua III was found in the 1797 and 1798 Mecklenburg Co. Tax List. On 5 Dec. 1799 he purchased 200 acres of land "lying at the head of Joshua Yarborough, Seniors, Spring Branch and Meeting House Spring Branch which includes the plantation on which said Gedion Yarborough now lives." In the 1800 census Joshua, Jr. is listed as between 16 and 26, and his wife is in the same age group. Their son is under 10 years of age.

Joshua III left Mecklenburg Co., NC, and is found buying land in Chester Co., SC, in 1811. A deed dated Feb. 1812 proves his wife's name was Elizabeth. In 1824 Joshua sold the remainder of his land to his son Uriah and moved to Georgia. On 25 Jan. 1825 he bought land in Fayette Co., GA. Jephthah Yarbrough, J.P., was one of the witnesses. We know this is the same Joshua for it says Joshua Yarbrough of Chester Co., SC. (Fayette Co., GA, Deed Book A, page 316).

WASHINGTON PARISH HEADQUARTERS

Louisiana is indeed fortunate in that most of the State's original parish records are still in existence. This state has suffered very few courthouse fires, a small number in comparison to other states. Louisiana has had ten such fires, as compared to forty-three in Georgia. Even though ten courthouses were destroyed, only very few early records were totally lost. Catastrophe is probably the hardest hit, since the fire was in the present century. With the system that was adopted in creating the later parishes in the state, only original state papers were transferred. Copies of records were made and were then sent for the part of the parish being set away by the new boundary. Since it was done in November, while many families lived, the original papers were never transferred, so possibly could still be in existence, even though the later created parish records were destroyed.

Several parishes have been hard hit, such as Washington, (two fires—1854 and 1897), records lost for a 43 year period, Calcasieu (fire in 1940), 70 year period, Rapides (fire in 1870) a 38 year interval, and the Marshall (fire in 1883), a 74 year gap. Other courthouse fires listed in the June, 1937 issue of The Register.

Washington Parish salvaged a few records from the last fire, so with the charred remains and a few records brought in to be re-recorded, the present files and books were created. The records are fairly good, but with many of the records for the 1830-39 period, being on file in the state land office, only the records for 1840-60 period are completely non-existent. The re-recorded books will be for the late sixties on. Some will be dated during the Civil War.

This feature will try to add to the few records existing for the parish. It is a list of "landrights" granted by an Act of Congress, 1820. Most of these records had taken the form before 1810, and not later than 1815.

INTRODUCTION

The section of Louisiana known today as the "Florida Parishes" -- consisting of the eight parishes of East and West Feliciana, East Baton Rouge, St. Helena, Livingston, Tangipahoa, Washington, and St. Tammany -- was included in the area known as the province of "Louisiana" claimed by France until 1763. Under the terms of the Treaty of Paris which in that year ended the Seven Years War, or the French and Indian War, this territory became English along with all the territory east of the Mississippi River except the Isle of Orleans*. Even the Spanish province of "Florida" (approximately the present state of Florida) became English at that time.

The British, in the Proclamation of 1763, gave "West Florida" a name and a northern boundary, the thirty-first parallel between the Mississippi and Appalachian Rivers. Four years later the British wished to include all white settlers below the junction of the Yazoo with the Mississippi River in the new province, thereby more than doubling the area and raising the northern boundary to just above the site of the present city of Vicksburg, Mississippi. This action embraced the southern half of the present states of Mississippi and Alabama in West Florida.

During the American Revolution Spain (which had acquired Louisiana west of the Mississippi River and the Isle of Orleans at the time the British had acquired Louisiana east of the Mississippi River in 1763) conquered the English settlements in West Florida. These Spain retained under the Treaty of Paris which ended that war in 1783. However, the

*The Isle of Orleans included that land area surrounding the City of New Orleans, bounded by Bayou Manchac, Lake Pontchartrain, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Mississippi River.

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area between the two northern boundaries which the English had established was in dispute between the United States and Spain, who again owned the rest of Florida - both East and West - as a result of the 1763 Treaty of Paris. This dispute continued until 1798, when the United States was finally put in possession of the area to the thirty-first parallel (the lower boundary line), which was re-established as the northern boundary of West Florida.

When the United States purchased from France in 1803 the real estate west of the Mississippi River known as the "Louisiana Purchase," the United States made feeble claims on the area of West Florida remaining to Spain.

Meantime, several abortive attempts at rebellion against Spain were made within the area. On 23 September 1810 a successful armed revolt occurred, and for a short time the "Republic of West Florida" was an established fact. Independent West Florida included the territory from the Mississippi River to the Perdido River. Actual possession, however, was taken to a point just west of Mobile.

By presidential proclamation James Madison on 7 December 1810 declared West Florida to be a part of the United States based on the Louisiana Purchase. Only that part of West Florida presently incorporated in the state of Louisiana was seized in 1810. The next year that portion now included in the state of Mississippi was taken; the area around Mobile was gradually taken, and Mobile itself in April of 1813. The remainder of West Florida, now a part of the state of Florida, was purchased by the United States along with the rest of Florida in 1819 and actually transferred to the United States in 1821.

Almost as soon as the territory was taken, in 1811, the County of Feliciana was organized as the thirteenth county* of the Territory of Orleans. This

*The Territory of Orleans (organized shortly after the Louisiana Purchase) was in 1805 divided into twelve counties. Two years later these were subdivided into parishes. This dual county-parish system continued for about four decades.

included all the area to the Perdido River, the present boundary between Florida and Alabama. The County of Feliciana as originally organized contained six parishes: Feliciana, East Baton Rouge, St. Helena, and St. Tammany (in present-day Louisiana), Villoxi (from the Pearl River to the Bay of Biloxi), and Pascagoula. The latter two were detached from Feliciana County when Orleans Territory became the state of Louisiana in 1812 and annexed to the Mississippi Territory, ultimately to become the Gulf Coast sections of the states of Mississippi and Alabama.

Washington Parish was created from St. Tammany in 1819. Feliciana Parish was divided into East and West Feliciana Parishes in 1824. Livingston Parish was created from St. Helena in 1832 and Tangipahoa in 1869 from the four parishes of St. Helena, Livingston, Washington, and St. Tammany, each contributing a corner-section to the new parish.

It is interesting to note that according to the federal census of 1820, by far the most heavily populated sections of Louisiana's Florida Parishes were the two western-most parishes - those bordering the Mississippi River. Of approximately 2400 householders (figures given are approximate) listed in the 1820 census for the area, some 1500 were concentrated in Feliciana (975) and East Baton Rouge (600). The three eastern parishes boasted only approximately 865 householders: St. Helena - 375, Washington - 300, and St. Tammany - 190.

The 1812 Tax List for St. Tammany Parish is published here for the first time. This list is housed in the office of the Clerk of Court of St. Tammany Parish, Covington, Louisiana. There are thirteen columns for information shown on the list. Due to lack of space, only the first four columns are reproduced herein: number of men included in the household, number of women, number of children, and number of slaves. Other columns show improvements, cotton gins, schooners, retailers of spiritous liquor above one quart, stud horses, wagons, using (work) horses, stock cattle, and tax paid. Also in the Clerk's office in Covington is a short list of persons who had left the Parish of St. Tammany or where no property had been found to satisfy taxes for 1820. This list includes: Pleasant Burton - residence not known to Collector of Taxes; Thomas Gibson - removed to New Orleans; George Robertson - removed to New Orleans; Thomas Shields - "Nulla Bona" - resident of New Orleans; William Davidson - removed to the state of Mississippi; Henry Henry - deceased; Mrs. Penny - "Nulla Bona" resident of St. Tammany Parish; Duke Manette - resident of New Orleans with his 5 slaves assessed for 1820; and Ann Ervin - residence, Madisonville. These names have a double asterick (**) in the Index following.

Both of these lists are reproduced through the courtesy of Mr. Robert Fitzmorris, Clerk of Court for St. Tammany Parish, and my thanks are extended to him for his interest and cooperation.

Where more than one individual with the same name appears in more than one parish in the Index, the different parishes are shown by the name; hence, a Robert Anderson was listed in St. Helena and also in Washington Parishes. A number in parenthesis () following a parish indicates that number of individuals with that particular name in that parish; hence, there are two John Baileys listed in St. Helena Parish in this census.

A single asterick (*) following a name or parish in the Index indicates that particular name is also found on the 1812 St. Tammany Tax List. Where the name is followed only by an asterick with no parish indicated, the name is listed only on the Tax List and not in the census. Hence, Aaron Adams is listed on the St. Tammany 1812 Tax List as well as the 1820 Washington Parish census; whereas, Joseph Ard is found only on the 1812 Tax List for St. Tammany Parish, indicating he had either died or moved from the West Florida area by 1820. Other names showing more than one asterick appear on the Tax List the number of times the asterick appears; hence, the name of John

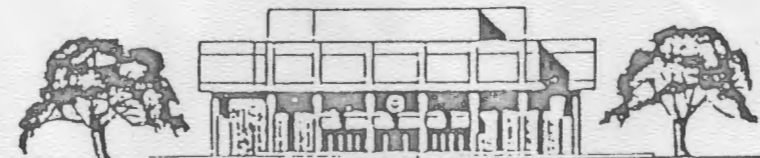

into 6 parishes in April of 1811, St. Tammany being the fourth to be formed. Not until April 14, 1813 were the Florida Parishes made a part of Louisiana. The settlers before 1808 were granted headrights by the Spanish Colonial Power and under the headline of the Greensburg District.

In 1813, St. Tammany and St. Helena parishes were exposed to bands of Choctaw Indians. Farms were abandoned and the settlers fled to the interior for safety. Life was very hard and even dangerous for the few that remained.

March 6, 1819, Washington Parish was formed out of part of St. Tammany Parish. Later, Tangipahoa Parish was formed out of the Western part of these two parishes. The other parishes to make up our district are the Felicianas, East Baton Rouge, Livingston and St. Helena.

On a Spanish map by Don Vicente Sebastian Pintado in 1808 and what is now St. Tammany Parish - part of the "Distrito de chifoncte" extends 31' latitude on the n to Lake Ponchatrain and Borne on the s from the Pearl on the e to the Chifoncte on the West. With 915 square miles in 1811, the Louisiana State Legislature, under the direction of Governor C. C. Claiborne, began dividing the various counties and parishes of the former said state of West Florida, which had survived 74 days from Spain to the United States rule at St. Francisville.

Tammany is derived from Delaware Tamanend, name of the noted Chief of the 17th century. His name was conferred on St. Tammany because of the large number of Indians who formerly resided there. No white man settled here before the middle of the 18th century.

Earliest settlers were John Castonquart (1795), John Spell (1798), Joseph Slatten (1799), Coopers (1800-1801), William Wilson (1802), William W. Collins (1803), Mathew Robertson, Joe Cutterer (1804), Wiley Robertson, Mary C. Loyd, John Vernon, David Robertson, Renez Baham, Gronow Floyd, Floyd Dyche, Lott Ridgdell, Leonard L. Marbury (1806), Allen Hader, William Berry, John Sordin, David Gaines, Abner Junkins, Issac Evans, James Bennett, Collins Sanders, Jemima Smith, Mose Jordan, Peter Baden, Henry Day, John Charles, William Galloway, Jesse Barker, Lawrence Stecker, Peter Bankson, Charles Roberts, Gideon Yarbrough and Z. Barrow shortly afterwards.

The religion of the country until its aquisition by the U S was Roman Catholic and no other was tolerated. In 1811 the first Baptist and Methodist Churches appeared. Ezra Courtney of Amite County was the first Baptist minister to come to this district and was often run off. In 1818 there were only 6 Baptist and 2 Methodist Churches in Louisiana. These were Union Churches and

the different Faiths held services in the few buildings erected with a special place for the slaves to hear services.

It wasn't until 1838 that schools began, consisting of 6 and 8 week classes held in the churches.

In Feb. 1822, an act was passed to keep in repair The Great National Road, leading from Nashville to Madisonville, that General Andrew Jackson had used to lead his army to New Orleans for the War of 1812. Residents living within 5 miles of the road were compelled to give 12 days a year to keep up the road. This is now the Military Road, northeast of Covington. The original Choctaw Trail was made into a road and later became what is now Hackley Road.

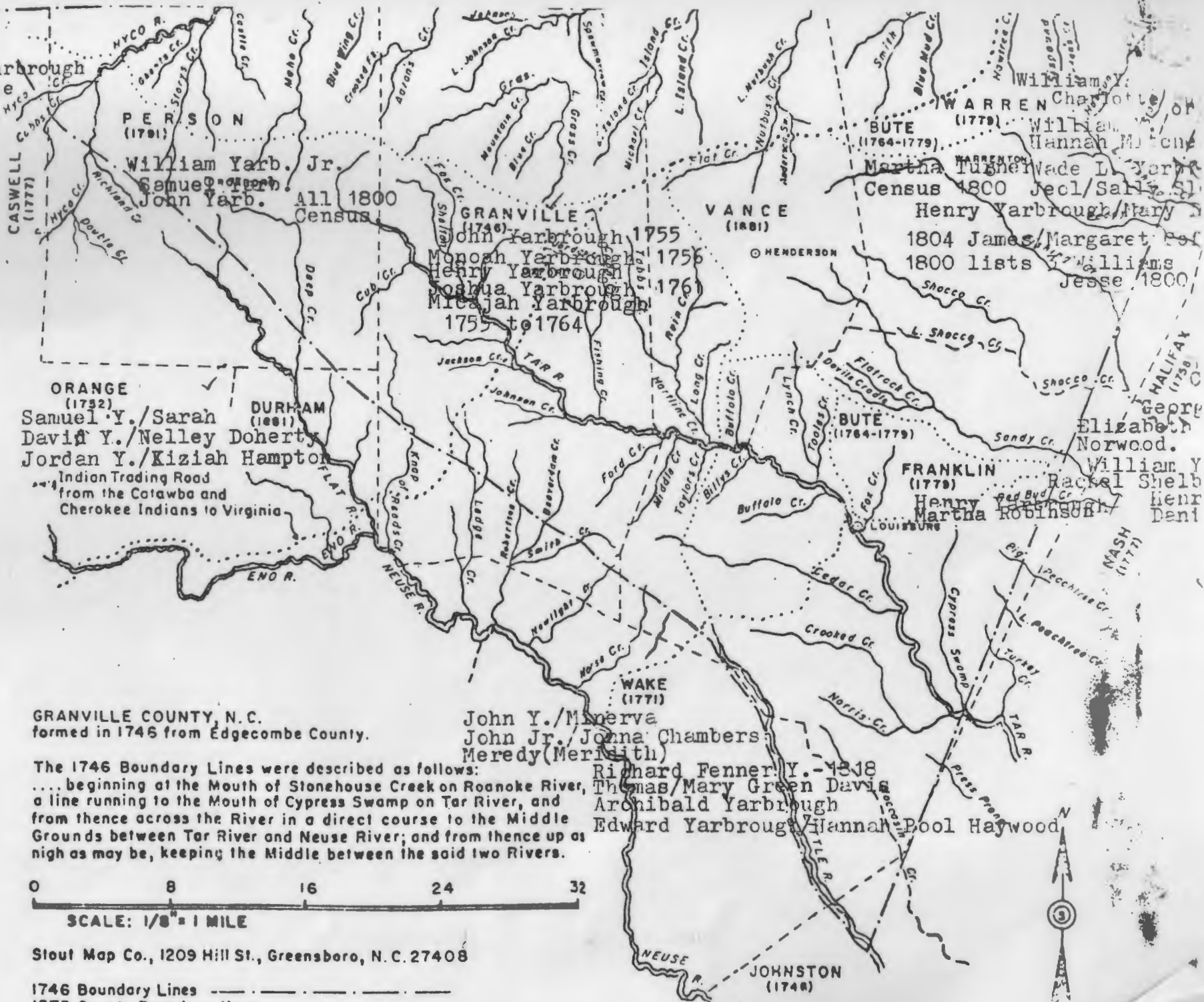

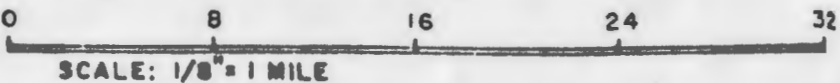

THOMAS B. YARBOROUGH¹

Thomas B. Yarborough, a prosperous merchant of Honey Grove, Fannin County, Texas, was born in Washington Parish, Louisiana on May 20, 1841, and is the son of JOSHUA and LOURANEY (BICKHAM) YARBOROUGH. His father was a surveyor and planter, born in Kentucky on March 2, 1801 and died in Washington Parish January 29, 1845 at age forty-four; he was a son of GIDFON YARBOROUGH. Mrs. Louraney Yarborough, daughter of Benjamin Bickham of Edisto District, S.C., was born in Washington Parish, Louisiana in 1812, and died January 26, 1845, three days before her husband. Three of her children are living: BENJAMIN F., DAVID W., and THOMAS B., a daughter Sarah M. is dead.

Thomas B. Yarborough removed to Texas in 1859 settling in Marion County. In the fall of 1861 he enlisted in Company D, 19th Texas Volunteer Company as a private, and the next year was elected 2nd Lieutenant of his company before he was 21 years of age, and held that rank until the war ended, serving in the Trans-Mississippi Department. At the close of the war, Mr. Yarborough returned to his home. In the fall of 1865 he removed to Honey Grove which has since been his home. For about five months he was a clerk in the store of O. D. Cosner and at the end of that time bought out his employer, paying \$200 (all he had) in cash, and becoming indebted for the remainder. He has been engaged in merchandising in Honey Grove ever since, except during 1871 and 1872, when he served as a magistrate, county commissioner and tax assessor.

In 1869, Mr. Yarborough was married to Sallie, daughter of Solomon Waggoner, who bore him four children, three of whom are living: EDGAR B., THOMAS B., and MARY A. Mrs. Yarborough died in 1880, and in 1881 Mr. Yarborough married Mrs. Sue S. Smith, daughter of Dr. M. W. Moody, by whom one child living, SUE S., named after her mother.

Mr. Yarborough is an enthusiastic Mason, has taken all the degrees of the York Rite, Royal Arch and appendant degrees, also, the orders of the Knights Templar. He, his wife and children are active and consistent members of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

- In 1874 he founded the Independence, the first newspaper permanently established at Honey Grove, and for two years was editor and proprietor....(as such) promoted a High School for the town, which culminated in the founding of Honey Grove High School in 1875. ...

- In 1878 he built a business house, a two-story stone structure, it was the first solid stone building erected in the city from native stone, and believed to be the first built in North Texas. ... Mr. Yarborough was known for his fair and upright dealing, and was highly esteemed throughout Fannin County.

IRRA O. WYSE, merchant, was born in Canton, Mississippi, November 27, 1856, and is a son of Ira O. and Margaret (McMellon) Wyse. The father was a native of Massachusetts, was a merchant, and died in Canton, Mississippi, in 1873, at the age of fifty-three, at which place also his wife died in 1866. Six children born to these parents are still living—Charles H., John T., Ira O., William R., James W. and Alonzo A.

Ira O. Wyse began an apprenticeship at the tinner's trade in his native town, and in 1870 went to Memphis, Tennessee, to perfect himself in the business, and there worked two years as a journeyman. In 1873 he went to Vaiden, Mississippi, ran a tin shop a year and a half, in the meantime learning telegraphy. He then went to Bussey, Iowa, and acted as telegrapher for the A. K. & D.-R. R., while the road was being built. He then resumed his trade and worked in Chicago, Illinois; Denison, Texas, Sherman and Paris, and in 1877 opened his shop in Greenville, to the tin department of which he has added hardware, stoves, farm implements, buggies, wagons and farm supplies. Mr. Wyse is also interested in a hardware store at Rockwall, Texas, under the firm name of Patty & Wyse.

Mr. Wyse was married, in 1884, to Jennie Dyer, of Mississippi, and is now the father of two children—Jennie and Ira O. Mr. Wyse is a most active and enterprising, as well as popular gentleman; he is president of the Greenville City Railroad Company, treasurer of the Greenville Building and Loan Association, is a Knight Templar, and member of De Molay commandery, No. 20, and is also a member of the Methodist Episcopal church.

CHARLES H. WYSONG, one of the early settlers of Texas and now a leading farmer, was born in Franklin county, Virginia, May 19, 1820. Jacob Wyson, his father, also a native of Virginia, was a tanner by trade, and died in Missouri in 1863. He married Mary Hopkins, a daughter of Charles Hopkins, of Virginia, and four children were the result of this union.

Charles H. Wyson, the third in the above family of four, was reared on a farm, as well as in a tannery, and also learned the wheelwright's trade, and is now known in Texas as the "Bodark" wagon-maker. In 1846 he moved from Virginia to Missouri, and in 1849 came to Texas. He was first married, in Missouri, in June, 1847, to Miss Sarah M. Foster, daughter of James Foster, of Virginia, and to this union

were born four children, two of which are young; the names of the two still living are Theresa H. and James H. Mrs. Wyson died in Texas April 29, 1850, and Mr. Wyson, remaining a widower until September 27, 1851, married Miss Elizabeth R. Slaughter, daughter of James Slaughter, formerly of Kentucky, and this second marriage has been blessed with the following children—Anna M., Charles J., Louis W. (died in infancy), Mary J. (who died when about sixteen years of age), Hampt S., Alice M. and Walter S.

At the opening of the late war Mr. Wyson was a member of the State militia, and was detailed to manage a shop for the repairing machinery for agricultural purposes in raising crops for the support of war widows and for the army; the conscript act, however, was so amended that it reached men of forty-five years of age, when Mr. Wyson became one of its victims and was attached to Burnett's battalion, was mostly employed in guard duty, and was near Houston at the close of the war.

When Mr. Wyson first came to Texas, he was in somewhat limited circumstances, and consequently endured many hardships and privations, but he "came to stay," and is now well pleased that he did stay, owning as he now does a fine farm convenient to market. Mr. Wyson is a chapter Mason, is district deputy grand master and is a member of the Baptist church

In the sixteen months that the company has been handling Guaranteed Value properties it has made a very rapid growth, and the company has practically completed arrangements for a very substantial increase in its capital stock and enlargement of its field of operations, taking in properties in Fort Worth, Dallas, Houston and San Antonio to be sold under the Guaranteed Value Contract.

TOM B. YARBROUGH.—Prominently identified with financial and industrial interests in his native state and known as one of the liberal and progressive citizens who have contributed materially to the progress and upbuilding of the city of Fort Worth, Mr. Yarbrough is here incumbent of the office of vice-president and manager of the Waggoner Bank & Trust Company and is one of the substantial capitalists and representative stockmen of this part of the fine old Lone Star commonwealth. In both the paternal and maternal lines he is a scion of honored pioneer families of Texas, and thus there is special consistency in according to him specific recognition in this history.

Tom B. Yarbrough was born in Fannin county, Texas, on the 4th of June, 1873, and is a son of Thomas B. and Sallie (Waggoner) Yarbrough. The father of the subject of this review was born in Louisiana and became one of the successful business men of western Texas. He died in 1896. His wife was a member of the well known and influential Waggoner family whose name has been prominently linked with the history of Texas since the early pioneer days, when the Indians still disputed dominion of the soil and when this section was on the very border of civilization. The family was early founded in Wise county, where it acquired extensive landed and cattle interests, which have been retained by its representatives to the present day, the Waggoner estate being one of the largest and richest in Texas. Daniel Waggoner, the noted stockman, was a brother of the mother of him whose name initiates this article, and the mother died in 1880, being held in affectionate regard by all who knew her and being a native of Texas, which ever represented her home.

Tom B. Yarbrough was reared and educated in Fannin county, this state, and his initial business training was secured in connection with banking interests at Honey Grove, where he was identified with this line of enterprise for a number of years. In 1907 he removed to Fort Worth, where he acquired a substantial interest in the Hunter-Phelan Bank, which was then reorganized under the title of the Waggoner Bank & Trust Company, and which is incorporated with a capital stock of

Elder J. C. Foster, of this city, who returned from Idabel, Okla., where he conducted a funeral, reported a sad case of suicide which occurred at Garvin (McCurtain county, Oklahoma) last Saturday evening. The victim of the tragedy was Mrs. Earl, a young married woman about twenty-two years old, whose home was at Idabel, but, at the time of the tragedy she was engaged in teaching in the public school at Garvin. She had been married only a few weeks and her husband lives at Idabel.

The scene of the unfortunate occurrence was in the lobby of the hotel. She stepped up to a mirror and was looking at herself in it when she placed a pistol to her right temple and pulled the trigger, fatally wounding herself. Death ensued at 10 o'clock that night. A guest of the hotel was sitting in the lobby and saw her when she walked up to the mirror and pulled the pistol from a place of concealment in her dress, but he could not divine her intention until it was too late to stop her. The body was shipped to Idabel Sunday evening and the funeral was held on Monday.

She was the daughter of a prominent physician, Dr. Black, formerly of Idabel, who is now living in Arkansas. The people of Idabel were very much grieved over the occurrence. She was a fine young lady, highly esteemed by everybody. The cause of the deed was not known. She did not leave any note behind or intimate to anybody that she contemplated taking her life. She and her husband were not living together. (Paris News - January 8, 1915)



Friday evening last a telegram was received in this city that brought sadness to the hearts of all. The dispatch was from the hunting party that left for the Territory a few days before and announced that Mr. J. W. Huffman, one of our best citizens, had been accidentally shot and killed by N. F. Miller, while turkey hunting that morning. The terrible news spread rapidly, and in a few minutes people were gathered in groups throughout the city discussing the sad tragedy and expressing deepest sympathy for all concerned.

From one of the hunters was obtained the following particulars of this deplorable accident:

A party composed of Jno. A. Pierce, J. W. Rutherford, N. F. Miller, J. T. Boswell, T. F. Williamson, G. M. McGlasson, C. C. Lovelace, Edgar Yarbrough, C. F. Koehler, W. H. Saffarans, J. W. Huffman, and E. B. Baker were on a fishing and hunting expedition in the Kiamitia mountains twenty-five miles northeast of Antlers, I. T. On Friday morning, May 8th, C. F. Koehler, J. W. Huffman, and N. F. Miller left the camp and went about 1½ miles east for a turkey hunt. It was a very early hour in the morning just after break of day. The three started up a canyon abreast, Huffman to the right, Koehler to the left, and Miller in the center. They advanced a short distance in the direction turkeys were heard gobbling. Miller was doing the calling and told Huffman and Koehler to keep a sharp lookout and he would call the turkeys toward them. Huffman advanced further in the direction of the turkeys than Miller thought and stooped down beside a tree between Miller and the turkeys. The turkeys had quit gobbling and Miller supposing they were coming toward him, sat down on a rock eager for sight of the fowls. About this time Huffman made some movement of the arm and shoulder which Miller saw, and seeing only the shoulder thought it was a turkey and fired. The ball struck behind Huffman's right arm and passed through and lodged against the skin of the left arm. Huffman screamed, jumped straight up, then walked about ten steps and fell dead.

The body was carried to Antler, a coffin ordered from Paris, and the remains shipped to Honey Grove, reaching here on the 11:30 Santa Fe Saturday.

Sunday morning the body, accompanied by the Knights of Honor, the family, and a large number of friends was taken to Oakwood cemetery and after burial service by the Knights of Honor, and prayer by Rev. J. R. Allen, was laid to rest.

The heart-broken wife, little children and other relatives and friends have the sincere sympathy of the entire community. May He, "Who tempereth the winds to the shorn lambs," comfort the widow and orphans in this sad time of affliction. (Honey Grove Citizen - undated clipping - death date May 8, 1891)

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HISTORICAL DATA--HONEY GROVE, TEXAS

In the year 1836, when the western limit of civilization in this area was marked by a small settlement near where the City of Paris now stands, Davy Crockett started with a company of men to reach the Texian Army at San Antonio by this western route. This locality was then an unknown wilderness of grass, the home of the Indian and buffalo. Reaching this place a day or two after leaving the settlement near Paris, Crockett and his men pitched their camp in the grove now a little north of the public square. In the grove of trees was a spring of fine water, about which the company spread their blankets and built their fires. They remained in this camp for several days in consultation, being divided in opinion whether or not it was best to pursue this unknown route through the wilderness or return and travel a more easterly course.

While in camp here they discovered an unusual number of trees containing swarms of bees with honey. The men feasted on venison and honey while in this camp.

Some of the party seeing the danger of this route had already abandoned the expedition in this direction, and Crockett, with only a few men left, was compelled to abandon the expedition in this direction and travel another route to San Antonio and the Alamo. While camped here, and after he left, Crockett always spoke of the SPOT as "Honey Grove". In a letter to his children, before he reached San Antonio to die in the Alamo, Crockett describes this area accurately, "with bees and honey plenty". This name was passed on to others and when the town finally sprang up the name remained.

The first settler in Honey Grove was Samuel Erwin, whose wedding ceremony back in Tennessee had been performed by one Davey Crockett, then a minor Justice of Peace. Mr. Erwin reached Texas in 1837, lived for a few years near Red River and in 1842 moved and built a home in what is now Honey Grove, a short distance

west of the present square. For three years the Erwins were the only residents of the locality. The next settler was Dr. Nicholson, who settled in the locality in 1845, and was quickly followed by John McKenzie, J. T. Allen, James Gilmer and others.

Mr. Gilmer bought most of the land within the present limits of the city. He died in 1846 and was the first person buried in what is now Oakwood Cemetery.

B. S. Walcott came to Honey Grove in 1848 and some time later married the widow of James Gilmer. In 1849 Mr. Walcott laid off the town of Honey Grove and sold building lots, and soon thereafter buildings began to rise here and there.

In 1856 the several religious groups united in building the old union church, which was the first public building in the town, with the exception of a small school house. About the same time the old Smith Hotel was erected on the present site of the Pierce-Wood buildings on the west side of the square. In 1858 a mill was erected by B. S. Walcott in the grove of trees in which Crockett capped north of the square.

The town of Honey Grove was incorporated in 1873, J. H. Smith being the first Mayor. During the same year the T & P railroad was built into the town, and the first newspaper, "The Independent", made its appearance with T. B. Yarbrought as Editor.

Here are some of the firsts in Honey Grove as taken from the records of the late Mrs. J. F. Black.

The first sawing machine was owned and operated by Mrs. Wilson, wife of Martin Wilson. It was a Howe machine and was purchased about 1870.

The first bathtub was owned by B. O. Walcott. It was purchased in New Orleans, brought by barge to Jefferson and transported by ox-cart to Honey Grove. Since there were no water pipes in those days the tub had to be

filled by carrying water in buckets.

The first preachers in Honey Grove were Rev. Provine and Rev. Robert Rudolph, both presbyterians. They preached in the old Union Church which stood near the ~~six~~ site of the present Elementary school.

The first person born in Honey Grove was James P. Gilmer. The date of his birth was April 25, 1846.

The first school was taught by Judge Rutherford beginning in 1853.

The first bank was conducted by A. G. Stobaugh & Company. The institution was organized in 1877. It was owned by A. G. Stobaugh and U. T. Cole
