## **Preface**

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

#### Worksheet/Questions:

Dolores M. Yarbrough (DMY) records show Gustavus b. 1833 in Newcastle 1. Henry Co., KY.

The 1860 Census shows Gustavus age 24, born Virginia, which would make his birth ca 1835/36. Need to check census records of other counties to see if there is a couple in the age group to be Gus' parents with Virginia birth places.

DMY records show Jane Keller b. 11 Dec 1824, d. 14 Feb 1900. 2. Zeleinopel, Butler County, PA. I note you show this with question marks.

The 1860 census gives her age as 27 (b. ca 1832/33) and the 1870 shows her age as 39 (b. ca 1831). It would appear she was probably born ca 1832. Both census records show her born in Kentucky.

- DMY records show a marriage date of 7 Jan 1860 for Gus and Jane. 3. the 1860 census (taken in August), Gus is living next door to Jane and Jane is shown as Jane Keller in the home of her mother. Could the marriage date have been 7 Jan 1861?
- 4. DMY records show that Gus died 1892 with a question mark.

Gus is on the 1860 census and not on the 1870 census. Jane is on the 1870 Census with son Samuel who is age 8.

As Jane has only one child, Samuel b. 1861, and Gus is not listed -- it may be that he died sometime between the 1860 - 1870 census, possibly in the Civil War? If he died close to 1870, it would seem likely that there would have been at least one more child. Do the Court records of Mercer County have any probate records for Gustavus? If Gustavus died during this period, there was probably a guardian appointed for Samuel and that should be in the court minutes. Also, a check should be made for the civil war dead from Kentucky for a G., G.G. or Gustavus Yarbrough. Any idea what the middle initial G. might have been for?

5. On the 1860 census, Gustavus is living in the home of Martin C. and Mary B. Duncan. No relationship is shown.

He may have been a border. However, comparing the 1860 and 1870 census records, Catherine Keller seems to be living on the same property both years. In 1870, however, Jane seems to be living on the adjoining property where Gus lived in 1860.

If Gustavus was living with his family in 1860 rather than being a boarder, his mother may have been Mary B. Duncan and this may have been a second marriage for her. Might check marriage records for a Mary B. Yarbrough marrying a Martin C. Duncan. Also, might check estate, probate and deed records to see if Gustavus either bought or inherited this property.

6. Need to check the 1880 census for Gustavus and Jane. Watch ages - between 1860 and 1870 census, Catherine Keller aged 15 years; James Keller aged 12 years and Jane (Keller) Yarbrough/Yarber aged 12 years. (It must have been a very hard 10 years!)

sion index and World War I draft registrations. The pension files include the entire nation, while the draft records pertain only to Illinois. When requesting draft record information, please provide a county location and, for Chicago, a street address.

#### LAND RECORDS

The Archives has records for the 10 federal land district offices in Illinois. These include only information about the **first** purchase of land from the federal or state government. (Later land transactions between individuals were recorded in the county courthouses.)

Information contained in the federal land district office records includes: names of purchasers, dates of purchase, exact legal descriptions of land purchased and buyers' residences at time of purchase. The former place of residence is not shown. Staff will search an alphabetical list of purchasers' names for two entries. When possible, please provide a county location.

#### **COUNTY HISTORIES**

The Archives holds many published Illinois county histories. Staff will search indexes of specified counties for two names and will return copies of biographical sketches upon request.

# COUNTY AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT RECORDS

The Archives has microfilm copies of records found in some Illinois county court-houses. Patrons may use these films at the Archives.

The Illinois Regional Archives Depository (IRAD) System contains various county, township and municipal records. The IRAD staff will perform a limited amount of research in these local records upon request.

#### INTER-LIBRARY LOAN

Films of the state census schedules for 1855 and 1865 and the federal population schedules for 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900 and 1910, as well as the 1900 and 1910 census indexes, are available through the inter-library loan system. The "Name Index to Early Illinois Records" (census records index 1810–1860) and the war indexes are also available on loan from the Illinois State Library, Centennial Building, Springfield, IL 62756. These should be requested by the surname for which you are searching. Your local librarian must make the loan request for you.

#### **DESCRIPTIVE INVENTORY**

For a complete description of all of the record groups in the Archives, consult The Descriptive Inventory of the Archives of the State of Illinois (Springfield, 1978). A copy may be in a local library, or it may be purchased for \$20 from the Illinois State Archives. A Guide to County Records found in the IRAD collection may be purchased for \$5. # Genealogical Records and Mail Research Policy



GEORGE H. RYAN SECRETARY OF STATE AND STATE ARCHIVIST he Illinois State Archives in Springfield is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday from 8 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., except on holiday weekends.

The Archives staff will do a limited amount of research in reply to mail requests. The services of the Archives are provided at **no charge** through the courtesy of the Illinois Secretary of State. Therefore, when requesting information, there is no need to include a self-addressed, stamped envelope. However, there may be a photocopy charge, for which you will be billed.

Please follow these guidelines when requesting information by mail:

- Ask only for one or two specific items at a time.
- Designate the specific record to be searched (e.g., the year for a census record, the war for a service record).
- Provide the complete name(s) of the person(s) to be searched (no more than two at a time). When possible, include the names of spouses and children and their ages and birthplaces to help staff identify the correct entry.
- Do not submit a second request until you have received an answer to your first request.

#### **CENSUS RECORDS**

**1810–1860.** The Archives has indexes covering state and federal census records for this time span. Staff will search these indexes for two specifically named individuals for one census year in a designated county location.

1870. As only a few counties of the 1870 census have published indexes, a township location is necessary for Archives staff to conduct a search. Staff will not search the unindexed schedules of Illinois cities.

1880. There is an index to the 1880 census which lists only those households having children 10 years old or younger at the time of the enumeration. Staff will search this index when the name of the head of the household is provided. (When possible, please provide the county location and names of wife and children.) Staff will also search the 1880 schedules for two persons if a definite township location is provided but will not search the schedules of Illinois cities.

**1890.** The 1890 federal census records were destroyed by fire in Washington, D.C., in 1921 and therefore cannot be searched.

1900–1910. A complete index to each of these censuses exists and will be searched if the name of the head of the family is provided. Again, whenever possible, please provide the county location and names of wife and children. Staff will not search the actual schedules if the name is not found in the index.

State Censuses. Although state censuses were taken before 1855, schedules for very few counties have survived. The 1855 census is indexed and will be searched for two names. The 1865 census, the last state census taken, is not indexed. Also, only the head of the family is listed by name; other members of the household are shown by numerical totals in age categories. Staff will search the 1865 census if provided with a township location. Schedules for cities will not be searched.

#### VITAL RECORDS

The only death records at the Illinois State Archives are the Federal Mortality Schedules for the years 1850, 1860, 1870 and 1880. These records show only those deaths that occurred during the one year prior to the beginning of the enumeration. For example, the 1850 Mortality Schedule lists deaths that occurred between June 1, 1849, and May 31, 1850.

Staff will search 1850 and 1860 Mortality Schedule indexes for two names if given a county location. Searches of the unindexed 1870 and 1880 schedules require that you provide a township location. Also, please note that the 1870 Mortality Schedules for Illinois counties beginning with any letter from A through K (Adams-Kankakee) are missing.

Most Illinois counties did not keep birth and death records until 1877. Between 1877 and 1916, if the event was recorded, it would be found in the county clerk's office of the county in which it occurred. After 1916, the event is also recorded with the Illinois Department of Public Health. For information about birth and death records, an application for a search or an explanation of the fee schedule, contact the Department of Public Health, 605 W. Jefferson St., Springfield, IL 62702 (217/782-6553).

#### **WAR RECORDS**

The Archives has indexes to lists of Illinois units serving during the War of 1812, Black Hawk War, Mexican War, Civil War and Spanish-American War. Staff will search a specified index for two names. Also, staff will search the "Honor Roll of Veterans Buried in Illinois" for two names if a county location is provided.

The Archives contains the resident files of the Illinois Soldiers' and Sailors' Home in Quincy beginning with the year 1887. For information about a resident after 1908, you must first obtain a registry number directly from the Soldiers' and Sailors' Home before submitting your query. Records of the National Home in Danville for the years 1898 through 1934 are also available on microfilm in the Archives.

In addition, the Illinois State Archives contains National Archives microfilm publications of selections from each Revolutionary War pension file, the War of 1812 pen-

Dear Ophelia and Rea:

I should be in the shower getting ready for work, but wanted to send a few lines your way today.

First of all, your package arrived at my office Tuesday in great shape. I am still reading, sorting and trying to file the papers. Some interesting records in this stack!

I have been buried with projects lately. As usual, I have over-extended myself. I told you about David Avant who publishes the <u>Some Southern Colonial Families</u> series. I've been assisting him with records on the Joshua/Jeptha Y. line. I've typed at least 60 pages of Virginia and NC records for him. It has taken time I didn't have, but I am sticking with it for two reasons: (i) a verified Y. line will be published in a book that will be in libraries all over the country; (ii) I am learning how we can start really proving some of the Y. lines in short periods of time. In less than six weeks we have proven a line from 1870 back to 1720. In the process, we have also found the links for a bunch of VA, NC, GA and Alabama lines. I've even identified the Susannah (Thompson) Yarbrough mentioned in the Bute NC County Will! Last weekend I found a court case in Orange County, VA that just may prove this line to Richard the immigrant.

I am sticking with this project because I see no reason why we (Archive Committee) couldn't use the same methods that David has. I will tell you more about this later.

After writing to Leonard and not hearing from him, and getting a letter from Roger that said he hadn't heard from Leonard since Atlanta, I finally called him. September is all but gone and I think that something needs to get out to the membership as soon as possible. It took two calls, but I finally reached him. He said he only had a few little things for the newsletter. Just between you and me, I don't think he has talked to any publishers or anything. He said he had been very busy and I am sure that he has. So, I typed up about 25 pages of "stuff" and sent it to him, along with pictures from the conference that Arlene had sent me. (Relax, I didn't send him the ones of us in our nightgowns!) I called Jeanette and she has mailed me some "how to get started in research" information and I also called Roger and left a message on his answering machine asking him to do the President's letter and get it to Leonard as soon as possible.

I think Leonard is more than qualified to do a really good quarterly -- I am getting the feeling that he is going to have to be "prodded" to get it out. I hope that I am wrong about that! I hope he will surprise me and get something done fast. Please don't mention this to anyone else. I will be the most delighted person of all if I am wrong.

Roger is getting a plaque prepared for Senator Ralph. I suggested to him that we prepare a scrapbook of newspaper clippings to be presented to Ralph at the same time he is given the plaque. I have clippings that researchers have saved and given me from about the 1950's. Roger liked the idea and wanted me to get to work on it immediately. My thought was that this scrapbook might eventually end up in Ralph's old homeplace which is, as you know, a historical site in Texas.

Roger wants me to prepare this as soon as possible (GROAN, another project) and get it to him. I am going to use the original clippings for the book and just make copies for my records. Do you have any clippings for it? If you only have a copy of an article, that is ok -- I have some copies rather than the originals, too. This scrapbook will be from YNGHA to Ralph, by the way. If you have any articles you will donate, could you send them to me ASAP. I have told Roger I will try to have this to him by mid-October and I haven't given myself much time on it.

I suggested to Roger that a presentation would be nice rather than just mailing the plaque and book to Ralph. He thought the same thing and his idea is to have the presentation at Ralph's old homeplace in Texas. I like that idea. I also told him that I thought that some of the Texas members at least would like to be present. I hope that when a date is picked (which may be toward the end of October) that one or both of you can attend and take some pictures for our records.

One last thing - during the period of "Charlie's fiasco", I wrote Roger several letters with long explanations of how the newsletter was not responsive to researchers' needs. He commented several times that he was not a researcher and did not fully understand exactly what researchers needed. I will say, however, that he has been most responsive in trying to do things that will aid the family researchers. He also commented that though he was not a researcher, he would sometimes like to pick up one of our publications and see something on his line or that he could relate to in it.

I am wondering if we can find anything on Roger's line. All I need at this point is yet another "project" ... still, because Roger has been very receptive to the needs of researchers -- and also because he took on the job of president even though his first preference was not to -- I'd like for us to do something for him. I think it would be a fun surprise for him to open a quarterly and see his line listed...provided we can find anything on it. As what would be printed in the quarterly would have to be edited down to mostly the facts, maybe we could use the documents and records we find for a book to be presented to him at next year's conference.

I told Roger if he would send me what he had on his line that we would check our records and see if we had anything additional. (I had to tell him something to get a copy of his line as we don't have it in our records.) As we haven't "chosen a project" yet for this year, what would you think of working on his line?

The copy that Roger sent me was very pale and wouldn't recopy, so I've typed it off and am enclosing a copy for you. I have also prepared some family

groupsheets and have mailed them to Dolores to complete (she did the original research). I am enclosing a duplicate copy for you and I've kept a copy. I'll send you a copy of whatever she returns to me.

Yesterday I went to the library in Norfolk and started looking at the Census records for Kentucky. I have almost none. The microfilm readers were occupied and by the time I got to use one, I had time only to look at the Mercer County Census (copy enclosed - along with my thoughts and questions after I compared what Dolores did to what I found on this census). While I waited for a reader, I started copying the census indexes for Kentucky - I've typed this up and am sending you a copy for your records. Someone was using the 1870 West Kentucky index and I didn't get to copy it.

Our library has the 1850-1870 census of Kentucky on microfilm. I didn't notice if they had later census records - I didn't look. What the library doesn't have for sure is a printed index of the 1880 KY census. Do you (or your library) have it? It would be faster to work with an index.

Looking at what Dolores sent, and what I found on the census, it appears that we will need some research in Mercer and Fayette Counties Kentucky for sure. Dolores listed Gus as being born in Newcastle, Henry Co., KY. The census, however, shows his birthplace as Virginia.

Except for early Kentucky marriage records and the census, our library doesn't have much in the way of Kentucky records. I am hoping that your library will have a better selection. I'll start on the census records and, while I'm at it, I'll copy all the Y families. I notice that neither one of us seem to have very many.

Dolores gives the name as Gustavus G. Yarbrough. I have no idea what the G might stand for. Also, somewhere in my records I have a note that one of his marriage records had his name as Augustus. I don't know if that is accurate or not. But, you might keep that in mind when you are watching for that name.

Let me know what you think about doing Roger's line.

I must stop and get the wash started. Here it is Sunday evening and I haven't even started the weekend chores.

# National Yarbrough Conference

TO the Regular and Associate Members of the Yarbrough National Genealogical and Historical Association, Inc.

This letter is a status report on the Yarbrough National Genealogical and Historical Association, Inc. sent this day to the general membership of the YNGHA.

Due to the lack of communication and misstatements that appeared in the April 1991 NYC Newsletter, it is essential to communicate to the membership the facts concerning the status of our association. Please be advised as follows:

- (1) The Yarbrough National Genealogical and Historical Association, Inc. (YNGHA) was incorporated in 1990 through the efforts of Allen Yarbrough with encouragement from members of the ad hoc board of directors. The main reason for the establishment of the Yarbrough Corporation is to give it formal structure with officers who can carry out the association's business with authority. The second reason the association has been formed is to be able to collect dues from the membership -- the primary need for funds from dues is to support the Yarbrough Newsletter. Prior to the new dues structure the Newsletter has been supported entirely from voluntary contributions. Charles H. Yarbro's outstanding devotion to publishing the family magazine had been supported entirely from voluntary contributions. However, voluntary contributions have never been adequate and many individuals have made contributions to support the newsletter to have it continued to be published. It was recognized by the board that this could no longer continue. Therefore, the new corporate organization was formed and a dues structure established. The YNGHA corporation now has 97 regular members and 44 associate members. The YNGHA board of directors are confident that the corporation can maintain a viable financial budget to sustain the publication of periodic genealogical documents and family information, as well as meet other corporate business expenses.
- (2) Since the death of Allen Yarbrough, president of the association, Roger L. Yarbrough, the elected vice president is now acting president and has recovered the corporate documents from the Allen Yarbrough family and the corporate attorneys Coates & Davenport. It has taken some time to get this done. The corporate documents have been brought up to date and are in the possession of Roger Yarbrough. Roger Yarbrough has made a commitment to serve as president through the annual convention at Atlanta in July of 1991.

- (3) The corporation is not floundering and is in sound financial condition. The corporate annual report was filed with the State of Virginia on March 28, 1991, before the April 1st, 1991 deadline.
- (4) All approved bills of the association have been paid through April 30, 1991. The attorney's fees, registered agent fees, and March printing bills were all paid prior to the April 1991 Yarbrough Family Magazine publication. Attached is the treasurer's financial report for the fiscal year through April 30, 1991.
- (5) No one is authorized to solicit funds other than membership dues. All monies must be collected and disbursed by the treasurer of the association. To do otherwise would cause problems with the IRS.
- (6) The by-laws of the association provide for the election of the association directors and officers at the annual meeting. Notice of the annual meeting is enclosed. Proxies for use by the regular members not able to attend the meeting are enclosed with this mailing.

In summary, the YNGHA is alive and well. Like any infant organization, the YNGHA inevitably will continue to grow and change over the years. Testamentary to the fact that the organizational structure is necessary is that despite growing pains and a bumpy first year in which the president passed away, the corporation is in good shape financially. The YNGHA corporate structure continues to:

- (1) Insure accountability to all members and the IRS.
- (2) Allow for democratic decision-making through an elected board of directors for the benefit of all.
- (3) Provide permanence of organization beyond the life of any one person or group of persons.

We hope to see you all at the YNGHA Convention in Atlanta on July 25th, 26th, 27th & 28th, 1991. Let's make this an enjoyable experience with emphasis on genealogical research, family fellowship, and sightseeing in the exciting Atlanta area. If you are a regular member and unable to attend, please send in your proxy vote for directors and officers. 

Family tradition says that Jane Keller's mother (Catherine Ray) was the sister of Daniel Boone. Catherine Ray was b. 1796 and Daniel Boone was born 1734, 62 years earlier. It would seem that \_? Ray's wife would have been the right age to have been a sister to Daniel Boon, making Cather's <u>grandmother</u> (and Jane's great grandmother) the sister to Daniel Boone. Before discarding the theory completely, it might be worthwhile to check the line of Daniel Boone. I know it has been doen by historians as I recall hearing Pat Boone (the singer) mention in an interview that he was a direct descendant of Daniel Boone's and he had just been to Boonesville for some celebration.

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

there would have been at least one more child. Do the Court records of Mercer County have any probate records for Gustavus? If Gustavus died during this period, there was probably a guardian appointed for Samuel and that should be in the court minutes. Also, a check should be made for the civil war dead from Kentucky for a G., G.G. or Gustavus Yarbrough. Any idea what the middle initial G. might have been for?

5. On the 1860 census, Gustavus is living in the home of Martin C. and Mary B. Duncan. No relationship is shown.

He may have been a border. However, comparing the 1860 and 1870 census records, Catherine Keller seems to be living on the same property both years. In 1870, however, Jane seems to be living on the adjoining property where Gus lived in 1860.

If Gustavus was living with his family in 1860 rather than being a boarder, his mother may have been Mary B. Duncan and this may have been a second marriage for her. Might check marriage records for a Mary B. Yarbrough marrying a Martin C. Duncan. Also, might check estate, probate and deed records to see if Gustavus either bought or inherited this property.

6. Need to check the 1980 census for Gustavus and Jane. Watch ages - between 1860 and 1870 census, Catherine Keller aged 15 years; James Keller aged 12 years and Jane (Keller) Yarbrough/Yarber aged 12 years. (It must have been a very hard 10 years!)

According to Larry's notes he fought for north, was educated at Frankfort and lived there. Does 1892 death date refer to him?

Samuel Keller Y. was born in McAfee, Mercer Co on Dec 18, 1861. Gustavus would have been 28 when Samuel was born. Jane Keller would have been 36.

Later recorded as having 4 more children between 1853 & 1858.
- 2. Parmore Y. married Margaret Voorheis in 1823 (daughter of Francis Henry Co. In 1850 Census (Henry Co), 6 year old Elizabeth Yarbrough lives with Frances Vooheis and wife Nancy. Francis signed marriage bond for Wm P. Y. to marry Catherine Voorheis in 1845 (at age 73?)

The 1860 census gives her age as 27 (b. ca 1832/33) and the 1870 shows her age as 39 (b. ca 1831). It would appear she was probably born ca 1832. Both census records show her born in Kentucky.

- 3. DMY records show a marriage date of 7 Jan 1860 for Gus and Jane. On the 1860 census (taken in August), Gus is living next door to Jane and Jane is shown as Jane Keller in the home of her mother. Could the marriage date have been 7 Jan 1861?
- 4. DMY records show that Gus died 1892 with a question mark.

Gus is on the 1860 census and not on the 1870 census. Jane is on the 1870 Census with son Samuel who is age 8.

As Jane has only one child, Samuel b. 1861, and Gus is not listed -- it may be that he died sometime between the 1860 - 1870 census, possibly in the Civil War? If he died close to 1870, it would seem likely that



# Yarbrough conference held in Springfield

At the eighth annual National Yarbrough Conference in Springfield, Ill., July 26-29, actions were taken to incorporate NYC as "The Yarbrough National Genealogical and Historical Association, Inc." Official papers were filed in Richmond, Va., on July 6.

Attending the conference from Lake County were Charles H. Yarbro of Reelfoot Lake, Route 1, Tiptonville, and Mrs. J. T. (Angeline) Yarbro of Tiptonville. Mrs. Yarbro was also accompanied by her daughter, Linda Joyce Yarbro Hane, of Shawneetown, Ill. Yarbrough and related family members from all over the United States attended, with other West Tennesseans at the event from Dyersburg, Covington, Decaturville, Stanton and Memphis.

Mr. Yarbro of Reelfoot, a founding member of NYC, was renamed as one of nine directors. He also was elected secretary of the new organization and asked to continue as editor of Yarborough Family Magazine. The magazine is edited locally and produced by the Lake County Banner, printed monthly September through May and mailed to over 500 family members, genealogical societies and libraries.

The new YNGHA, Inc., provides a regular voting membership and an associated membership, with one vote per household, and both groups receiving the family newsletter. National conferences will

continue yearly in mid-summer in or near a major US city. The 1991 session will be in Decatur, Ga., near Atlanta, with Mr. and Mrs. William Rice as hosts. Mrs. Rice, the former Reba Yarbrough, sister of Chairman Allen Yarbrough of Fairfax, Va., was tour leader of the Yarbrough genealogy trip to England in 1989.

The Springfield conference was ably hosted by Mr. and Mrs. Roger L. Yarbrough and family of Champaign, Ill., with four days of family study workshops, family meetings, director meetings, family banquet and farewell breakfast.

The workshop featured talks by nationally recognized professor of history, Dr. Cullom Davis, who spoke on the use of oral history and the history of the American Lincoln law practice.

Imprimis I lend unto my beloved Wife Mary Yarbrough the use of my Land Plantation whereon I now live in the County aforesaid during her life. Item I give and devise unto my Beloved Son William Yarbrough the said Land and Plantation before mentioned after the Death of his said Mother Mary Yarbrough and to him and his Heirs forever. Item I give and devise unto my beloved Daughter Amy Yarbrough one Bed and Furniture to her and her Heirs forever. Item my Will and desire is that all my Estate not aforementioned be it of what sort or quality soever be for the use of my said beloved Wife Mary Yarbrough during her life and then to be divided between my forementioned Son William Yartrough and Daughter Amy Yarbrough to them and their Heirs forever. Imprimis. I do Appoint my beloved Son William Yarbrough and my beloved Wife Mary Yarbrough to be my whole and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament utterly revoking and disannulling all other Wills before made by me In Witness whereof I have hereunto set  $\pi_{ij}$  Hand and Seal the  $D_{m_i}$  & Year above written.



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

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

John B. and Parthena (Morris) Yarbrough lived near Jeffersonville, Indiana, Floyd Co. John B. was born January 6, 1824, in Kentucky a son of John M. and Sallie (Rice) Yarbrough. John B. marrie: Parthena Morris about 1847, a daughter of Richard and Rancy (Stenson) Morris. Parthena was born Aug. 3, 1827 in Clark Co. Indiana. p.43, Whereas by virtue of a contract between Charles Cummings and William Kennedy, now deceased, dated April 25, 1783, by which Cummings was bound to make over his right and title to 400 acres in Lincoln County on the waters of Harrod's Creek, granted by certificate by Kentucky and located by preemption warrant, for which the said Kennedy was bound to pay and make over to Cummings 800 acres of land of equal quality on the south side of the main or middle fork of Licking Creek, and whereas Cummings by his preemption warrant became entitled to only 248 1/4 acres by patent May 30, 1785, and whereas Benjamin Beall and James Kennedy became the administrators of William Kennedy, dec'd., and whereas Charles Cummings by his Letter of Attorney to his two sons, James and Robert Cummings empower them to receive the consideration for the tract in cash or whastever they may agree, instead of the land mentioned. Said tract 5 248 1/2 acres being in Mercer County, Kentucky on Harrod's Creek, beginning in John Cavin's line, thence east with William Field's line to land of William Myers and James Harrod's line, conveyed to the representatives of William Kennedy, dec'd. Recorded by the Kentucky Court of Appeals on November 20, 1802.

Witnessed by John Dunn, John Site, Hugh Garrett, and James Garrett. Recorded January 8, 1799 by the Kentucky Court of Appeals.

p.111, Indenture, December 30, 1798, John Taylor and Nancy his wife of Mercer County, Kentucky, to Achilles Sneed of Franklin County, Kentucky, for 5 shillings and other considerations, Lot No.111 in the town of Frankfort, bounded on the east and north east by High Street, on the north and north west by Lot No.112, on the west and south west by Elk Alley, and on the south and south east by Lot No.96. Witnessed by Richard Yarborough, Pleasant Scott, and Milton Burford. Nancy Taylor relinquished rights of dower. Recorded December 30, 1798 by the Kentucky Court of Appeals.

p.112, Indenture, July 20, 1798, William Logwood of Chesterfield County, Virginia, to George Reading, Jr. of Harrison County, Kentucky, in consideration of the locating, surveying and obtaining a patent to 1,529 acres in Lincoln County, Kentucky on the north fork of the Rolling Fork of Salt River by George Reading, Sr., the father of the said George Reading, Jr., in his lifetime, conveys 750 acres of the said tract. #### **Searching for Indexed Terms<sup>1</sup>**

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched<sup>2</sup>. First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.

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
