Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

THE YARBOROUGH FAMILY

1653 - 1953

The Yarborough family derived its name from the residence of its forebearers at Yarborough, in the County of Lincolnshire, England. As early as the Norman Conquest in 1066 A.D. Eustacius de Yarborough was Lord of Yarborough in Lincolnshire. He had a long line of descendants, some of whom made their way across the Atlantic and to the New World of America. The year 1653 is believed to have been the time of their arrival in America.

The Yarborough family came to Virginia* soon after the discovery and settlement of the colony by the English. The first definite record** of them is found in King William County, where the tax records show that John Yarborough, in 1704, owned 150 acres of land; that Richard Yarborough owned 350 acres; and that Robert Yarborough owned 100 acres in Gloucester County in the same year.

The land records* of 1720 indicate that Richard Yarborough of King William County owned 450 acres in Spotsylvania County; that William and Richard Yarborough each owned 450 acres which were surveyed in the same year. In 1722 William Yarborough and Eleanor, his wife, appeared on legal record in the Courts of Virginia**. Henry Yarborough registered a land grant on the Nottoway River in 1722. Other records show that Thomas Yarborough owned land in 1727; that Joshua and Richard Yarborough were credited as "Tithables" in Spotsylvania County in 1734***.

William and Eleanor Yarborough, mentioned above, had eight children. The five sons were Samuel, William, Ezekiel, Moses and Micajah Yarborough. Their daughters were Anne Yarborough Higgins, Carey Yarborough Anderson, and Priscilla Yarborough Robertson.

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

LIMESTONE COUNTY PERSONALITY FOCUS LENA BLAIR AND COPPLAND DAY

Lena Bailey Blair hugged her first and only great-great grandchild. Christopher Kennedy, to her, being careful not to crush the corsage on her new dress. She smiled as she looked at the flowers, for they signified three milestones in her life. The first was the advent of her birth as the daughter of George and Mary Allen Yarbrough Bailey on 5 May 1898, 87 years before this May day in 1985. The second was that of her marriage on 7 May 1916 to Arnie G. Blair: and the third was the gathering of her family and friends on the annual "Copeland Day" in the community where she was born and has lived all her useful life.

That community had known a variety of names during its existence. At some time it would bear the unlikely names of "Lick Skillet" and "Dog Trot," but at the time of Lena's birth. it was probably known as "Pilgrim's Rest." for the little church that came into being in 1896. It was Lena's grandfather, W. J. Yarbrough, who organized a Sunday School in the community in 1895. It was so successful that a year later Mr. Yarbrough, Mr. Leach, and Mr. Sharpe petitioned the Robert Donnell Presbytery, meeting at New Market, to constitute the church which they named "Pilgrim's Rest." The communicants were prepared, for before asking for admission, they had erected, on the two acres of land donated by Jim and Nancy Schrimsher, a one-room, log-silled, board and batten building to house the Sunday School. Thirteen charter members of the church met here: Mr. and Mrs. George Bailey, Mr. and Mrs. Pete Bailey, Mattie Bailey, George Allen and Della Schrimsher, Mr. and Mrs. Leach, John David Leach, Mrs. W. J. Yarbrough, and Mr. and Mrs. Bradford.

The building also served as a school for the community. Lena went through eight grades in the little building. The old hand made benches were rather uncomfor able, but the well just outside the door where all could drink (from the same dipper) of the cool water provided relief; as did the recess periods, where baseball and other games were played. The large tree on the grounds now war just a sapling then, and served as first base for the heated games played there. Sunday School and church picnics were held here, with lemonade and home made ice cream, and all those good things to delight the heart of child and adult alike. Lena recalls that her first teacher was Arthur Mitchell. Others were Misses Emma Waggoner from the vicinity of Mulberry. Tennessee: Mildred Wier; and Zue Laxson. Sometime around 1912, the schools were consolidated and a new school was built where Perry's Shop Ezy now stands on the corner of Copeland and East Limestone Roads.

A young preacher, Berry Copeland (1865-1953), had come with his family from Lincoln County. Tennessee, to serve the church in its infancy, and remained there for many years. He and his wife, the former Nannie Tipps (1866-1959) had nine children, one of whom died young. Lena recalls that the first member of the family that she met was son John, who rode his father's mule over to get corn to take to the mill to have ground. A. M. "Artie" was the oldest son, followed by T. Dishler. "T.D.," 1889-1957, who would later be active in the Athens Presbyterian Church. It was not until these two older sons were in high school in Madison County that Berry Copeland went to school himself, graduated from high school and then took a correspondence course to complete his education.

Other children in the family were William (Berry Copeland baptized the fourth generation of Copeland's with William's descendants, children of Gordon and Dot Warren Copeland. One of that generation. Beverly Copeland, has just received her doctorate in education); Trudelle (Gossett); Lawrence; Roema (Smith); and Mae (Blair). Life wasn't easy for any minister then, but with his large family to help with the farm and house work, there were many pleasant moments. The boys particularly enjoyed those times when Berry Copeland, who was an excellent sportsman, could join them for fishing and hunting expeditions. He had developed his prowess in killing fish and game for mere survival in the years following the Civil War. Now his skill as a horseman was useful, for he traveled a wide circuit on horseback in these days-to Big Cove, New Market, and Madison Cross Roads in Madison County; and to Beulah, Elkmont, Nebo, and often to Athens, as well as to

Pilgrim's Rest. Sometimes he went in a buggy, like the day when he pulled up at Nebo Church, left his Bible in the buggy to attend to some business, and came back, to find that a goat was devouring the Word!

The marriage of George Bailey and Mary Allen Yarbrough was one of Berry Copeland's first official duties at the fledgling church. The ceremony was probably performed before church on the Sabbath Day, as was that of Will Higgins and Delia Martin at the bride's home in 1898, followed by a trip to the church for bride, groom, and guests. It was the same when Lena and A. G. Blair were married in 1916; and probably the same when Copeland officiated in 1909 at the marriage of Annie Gray and James Oliver Holt in Elkmont.

It was in that year, 1909, that Lena Bailey joined the Pilgrim's Rest Church. The name had been changed to Bethel by May 1910, however, when a group from Athens visited the church to hear Copeland report on his recent trip to General Assembly in Atlantic City. A new church was soon built about a mile from the former, and dedicated on the first Sunday in May, 1913, as the "Copeland Presbyterian Church," in honor of the beloved minister who had guided his people through good times and bad. Land for the new church was donated by Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Richardson.

The fact that Berry Copeland conducted the funeral of William S. Bumpus (1951-1912), one of the industrious Germans who came to settle in Limestone County, indicates a close contact with these thrifty people. It is possible—that they assisted Copeland in founding the Copeland Community Club and the Copeland Better Farming Club during the time of the first World War. In company with J. D. Leach, L. G. Turner, and county agent Fred Stewart, Copeland went to Tennessee in 1918 to buy purebred Duroc and Poland China hogs and two registered bulls to upgrade the quality of stock in the area.

When Lena was president of the Agricultural School Improvement Association in 1933, she had Berry Copeland to speak on the advantages of a high school education; a subject that was very close to his heart. Lena was active in the celebration at the church in September 1936, honoring Berry Copeland for his many years of service to the church and community which bore his name. Six of the eight Copeland children were present at the time: Lawrence, Will, T. D., John, Mrs. Dell Gossett and Mrs. Floyd Blair.

Even though he continued to conduct a number of funerals. Brother Copeland's active ministry had come to a close, and Rev. W. B. Strong took over the ministerial duties at about that time. Strong was succeeded in 1942 by Rev. L. G. Kaylor. On the occasion of Brother Copeland's 80th birthday in 1945, Rev. Kaylor instituted Copeland Day, which has since been held annually on the first Sunday in May.

The brick church edifice with its adjacent brick manse in front of which Lena Bailev Blair sat in 1985 would not be familiar to Berry Copeland; but the names of those gathered there would be. Turners, Arnetts, Richardsons, Nunleys, Coats, Sandersons, Statons, Pattersons, Millers, and many others could attest to the influence that he had been in their lives. The fifth generation child that Lena held was actually the sixth to be touched by Copeland, since he had officiated at the wedding of Lena's parents, of Lena, and two of her daughters, Naomi (Turner) and Lyle (Zansant), and almost at the wedding of Mary Ellen to Mahlon Nunley; and that of Jean to C. H. Moore. The Nunley's daughter, Marcita Melson, is the grandmother of Belinda Melson Kennedy, mother of Christopher, great-great grandson of Lena. Perhaps we should have started this with the Biblical "begats!" It is significant that Christopher is the fifth generation in two families, the Blairs and the Nunleys.

The Pilgrim's Rest Church building still stands, and is used for storage. The old log house in which Berry and Nannie Copeland raised their children is gone; but the manse in which he lived for a short time before retiring from the ministry still stands. A newmanse was built for the late Dr. Furman Miller and Mrs. Miller in 1974. and awaits the new minister since the retirement of Rev. Gordon Jowers in the last year. May this mixture of progress and tradition remain to touch many more generations of Limestone Countians.

DAVIS FAMILY CORRESPONDENCE

The following letter, written by Aug^S W. Davis at Huntsville, Alabama on 11 November 1819 was contributed by Charles H. McMillan of Columbus, Georgia. Mr. McMillan states, "The exact identity of the writer is not known except for what is revealed in the letter. His grandfather was Jonathan Davis whose will is on file in the Wake County Courthouse, Raleigh, N. C., May term 1819. Several of Jonathan's children named in the will are mentioned in the letter."

Huntsville, Nov^r 11th 1819

Dear Grandmother

The favourable opportunity which now presents itself to me to write you (by our relation Green D. Howze) is too great to be passed over in silence-you are no doubt anxious to know how all your children are in this country. I have been in this place about six months scince which time I have not seen any of the family except my brother Alfred, who lives here; I however get intelligence from some one of the family every week and they were all well with the exception of my father who's health is bad, and I am apprehensive [he] never will be [healthy] again. William Dukes² & Nancy Cooke and husband were all well from the last account I had from Tennessee. I have not heard anything from Uncle Willie & family since I left Nashvillethey were then all well & enjoying good [health] & were doing much better than formally. I have heard nothing from H. Yarborough lately. I visited our old friend William D. Howze and family is in very good health & are much pleased with the country with the exception of Aunt Burchet & cousin Betsey Hays, the Girls are much pleased with their change—they are toasted.³ I have a great many friends & acquaintances here from N. Carolina; Isham R. Howze, Hill & Jno. C. Parry⁴ from Louisburg are here and a great many others which I can [not] pretend to designate with the compass of a letter.

I presume that you know Madison [County] is the greatest cotton country in the Western World. The people in this county have cotton fields as large as the old fields in Franklin where my father formerly lived. The people in this country are great characters—they talk here of Thousands like Carolinians do of hundreds (and think no more of the latter and of their speech than they do of the latter end of their lives) moreover think no more of a Bale of cotton than the Franklin people would of a meal bag full. The Carolinians will make

On Page 39 of a small book in Madison County marked "Chancery Record H" is a suit of interest filed 2 April 1835: Jenkins A. Herbert -vs- David Davis, Thomas Brandon, William Brandon, and Alfred Davis. William Herbert, John Herbert, and James H. Jenkins, former partners, state that in 1819 David Davis became indebted to Jenkins A. Herbert for a drove of horses and gave his note on 8 March 1819. Property transferred to Alfred Davis, David Davis' nephew. Bond signed by James H. Jenkins of White County, Tn. [Note: David Davis is shown on 1820 White Co. Tn. Fed. Census.] David Davis answered that he owed money to Thomas Gray, Patrick Vance and wife, and to "Moses Norman, his son in law" and others. Jenkins A. Herbert states that David Davis sold slaves to Thomas and William Brandon and transferred their notes to Alfred Davis. Dear Margaret,

I was very glad to get your nice letter . I was deeply grieved to hear of Fenner's death . I had been sick for nearly a week with a cold, else I would have tried to attend the funeral . Fenner lived an active and useful life . He was a great fellow . I once asked him how he faced the responsibility of such a large family. He said his fine family was an inspiration for him to exert his utmost .

Relative to Papa's part in the Civil War I do not know so much about it . I do not Grandfather, William Henry Tarbrough for whom I was named drove about one hundred slaves from Forth Carolina to Limestone County Alabama some time between 1840 and 1850. When he died in the fifties he left apa and Uncule David about one hundred slaves and enough land on which to work them. Paps told me once that he left them \$ 30,000.00 in gold. Papa and uncle avid both were sent to Harvard niversity but neither remained very long. Both preferred to come home and hunt deer, turkey and fox. A great life was it not .

I have papa's certificate of service in the Civil War . It reads: The certificate is dated December 3, 1890, Athens Alabama.

THIS IS TO CERTIFY THAT JAMES A YARBROUGH IS A MEMBER IN GOOD STAND ING OF THOMAS H.HOBBS CAMP # 400 UNITED CONFEDERATE VETERANS: THAT HE ENLISTED FOR SERVICE IN THE CONFEDERATE STATES ARMY ON SEPTEMBER 10, 1861 in Capt. Leonards Hawks Company, which Afterwards became Company D of the 3 regiment A.P.Stewart Brigade, army of Tennessee. and during the latter part of the service he was a aptain in the Quarter master in Company of the 31 regiment, Tennessee, Strahl's brigade. He retired from the army because of surrender in April 1965 gade. He retired from the army <u>because of surrender</u> in April 1865. He was engaged in the following named battles: Perriville, Ky; Mur fressboror, Tennessee and various skirmishes. He was born in Limestone County Alabama on the 5th day of November 1832.



Prior to 1760 seven Yarbough - Yarborough - Yarbor brothers migrated from Virginia to North Carolina. Three preceded the other four. The three were:

John - Henry & Zachariah

They located in what was then Bute County, N. C. It is now Franklin County with Louisburg the county seat. John and Zachariah left Bute County after 1760. John migrated to Fairfield District, S. C. His son John Jr. died there (testate) about 1816. His descendants are found in Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Texas. Zachariah migrated to Anson County, N. C. He married Elizabeth Dowd in Anson County. He died in that county and he and his wife are buried on the Dowd farm. His descendants are found in Tennessee, Arkansas and Texas. His grandson (Manoah) migrated to St. Clair County, Alabama about 1820, and the line is still there.

Manoah's son (Littleton) migrated to Tyler, Texas and his descendants married into the Phillips (Oil 66) family, also the Murchison family.

Henry remained in Bute (Franklin Co.) North Carolina.

He married Martha Robinson before leaving Virginia. He died about

1795 in Franklin County, N. C. His son, Edward, was a Captain during American Revolution and was a staff officer (George Washington)

at the end. He migrated to Salisbury, Rowan County, N. C., and died there. His will is on file at Salisbury and his home

(Yarborough House) is on the list of Tourist attractions. Edward was a charter member of the Order of Cincinatti formed at the end of the Revolution. He was, also, a signer of the Mecklenburg

Declaration of Independence. Other descendants of Henry were Fenner, Henry, Jr., Clement, James, Micahah and Archibald.

These descendants are represented by families in Tennessee (Kingsport area), Arkansas (Jonesboro area), Alabama (Tennessee Valley area) - Marshall Co., Madison Co., Lincolnton Co., and Texas (Tyler and Kilgore areas).

Henry Yarbrough's line is still extant in Virginia in the little Molovay river section of Amelia County.

Henry Yarbrough, Sr. and Martha (Robinson) named their first son Henry Yarbrough, Jr.

Henry Yarbrough, Jr. married Elizabeth Murray (see "Abridged Compendium of Va., Vol. 3, pages 495-6.")

Henry, Jr. died in Franklin County, N. C. after 1793 (same reference). His line is represented in Franklin Co. by Hill Yarborough of the legal firm of Yarbrough & Yarbrough of Louisburg, N. C. A female descendant married a N. C. Governor, and a male descendant (Edwin S.) married a Governor's daughter. Due to migrations, the Henry Yarbrough descendants crossed the lines by a Yarbrough marrying a Yarbrough viz - Ambrose Yarbrough and Beulah Yarbrough, Union County, S. C. and James Yarbrough and wife, Lincolnton Co., Alabama. The Union County, S. C. line is of no importance to this study. The Limestone County Ala. line is the Padulo line as is evidenced as follows:

lst. Henry Yarbrough, Sr. of Franklin County, N. C. had a grandson named for him and his wife (Elizabeth Murray).




General statement

Three Yarbrough lines appear in these counties. Two of these tract of Henry Yarbrough, Sr. and wife Martha Robinson of Franklin Co., N.C. The third line traces to Samuel Yarborough of Amelia County, Va. The facts set forth here explains the statement more.

The facts are as follows:

Henry Yarbrough, Jr. of Franklin Co., N.C. died 1793. His will was recorded by the Clerk of the County in June 1794. In the will he named the following: Elizabeth Murray, wife; ARCHIBALD, CHARLES, DAVID, HENRY, THOMAS, & JAMES, sons, and NANCY, FRANCES & MARTHA, daughters.

Frances married a Cook. Martha married a House. I have no record of a marriage for Nancy.

From records of Giles Co., Tenn.

David Yarbrough married Mary Williamson and moved to

Limestone Co., Ala. His wife, Mary, died March 6, 1872 at

age 52. David died liter in Texas. They had a son, David

Archibald, born Aug. 14, 1840 in Giles Co., Tennessee and died

in Limestone Co., Ala, Dec. 21, 1912. He married a Miss Ophelia

Coffman who was born Dec. 29, 1850 and died August 13, 1929. David

and Ophelia married December 24, 1874. Children born to them were:

Willie Lee (9-22-76) who married William Clay. She died 1-23-1924.

A son Charles Archibald, was born 211-1882. I have no date

on him; a son, David Luther was born Sept. 14, 1889. He was living

not long since in Limestone Co.

David Archibald Yarbrough had a sister (Sue, Susan or Suzannah) who married a James Yarbrough, her 2nd cousin. They reared a family in Limestone Co. Henry and Fenner were sons. was at one time Dean of Peabody College, Nashville, Tenn. The tax records show Henry (1820) as the 1st Yarborough in Limestone County and Samuel first in Madison County. Samuel came to Madison Co. from Amelia Co., Va. He was a nephew of Henry Yarbrough, Sr. of N. C. Therefore, Henry, Jr. was his 1st. countn. Samuel had a son born in Va. on Nov. 23, 1832, and mamed Samuel H. (Henry). Samuel H. married Mary Addie Russey. Their children were: William, Elbert C., Charles F., Walter and Texie. The sons formed a Hardware business and built a hotel in Husetville. The descendants are in Husetville now. The Yarbroughs in St. Clair and Marshall Counties are of S. C. origin and tract to Amelia Co., Va. through Moses Yarbrough (1701-1774) the son of William Yarbrough and his wife Elliner (Eleanor). This William had a son Samuel. It is said that he is the Samuel, the father of Samuel H. of Madison Co., Ala. It is possibly true, but I do not offer it as a statement of fact.

Having traced your lines to N. C. and Va., I will set forth your family's connection to earlier Yarbrough families.

Henry Yarbrough, Sr. marrie Martha Robinson in Amelia Co., Va., before 1740. He disappears from the records of that county. in the 1750's. He is found on the tax rolls in Bute Co., N. C. in 1760's.

In 1778 Bute Co. was divided into two parts. One of these became Warren Co., the other became Franklin Co. with Louisburg as its county seat. The records show that the holdings of Henry Yarbrough,

Sr. were in Franklin. These records show, also, that he died about 1793-95 aged about 89 years. He was born therefore between 1760-1710.

The earliest Yarbrough of record in Va. is Richard C.

Who bought land in King and Over Co. in 1643 and later bought
land in King William Co. in 1695-96. He deeded this land to 'his
sons John and Richard, Jr. and established a residence in what is
today Amelia Co. He attended Blandon Church. His tombeat the
church is dated "1702 aged 87 years" and "born in Eincolnshire,
England". He married Frances Proctor in London 1637. During his
life had two wives whose names are not established. Richard, Jr.
sworn in Court that he was born in Va. in 1654, and that his mother's
name was Frances and that John Yarbrough of King William County was
his full brother. We assume two things here: (1) There were other
boys not full brothers. (2) Richard, Jr. was older than John.

The Va. quit rent rolls for 1700-1704 show Richard, Jr. and John in King William Co. Land involved is same as that deeded by their father, Richard in 1695-96.

In 1722 William Yarbrough and wife El of St. Johns Parish, King William Co. deeded land. The land BEBded formerly belonged to Richard, Jr. In 1724 William owned three parcels of land in Amelia Co. lying on Little Montaray river. He died in Amelia Co. in 1748, testate. It is almost certain that Richard, Jr. was his father for in 1720 they made a joint deed to land on Noteway River. In 1723 Edward Yarbrough of St. Johns Parish, King William Co. obtained 400 acres of land joining his brother William's land so he is a son of Richard, Jr.

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Also, in 1740 Henry Yarbrough and wife Martha Robinson deeded land to William Yarbrough nameing Willaim as brother. Therefore, Henry's father was Richard, Jr. He names Thomas as a brother whose land joins. In 1758 Henry deld all his land to William Jennins and never appears on Amelia Co. records.again. About this date Joshua, Micahah, Samuel and Edward sold their land in Amelia Co.

The records in N. C. show Henry and wife, Martha, in Bute Co. about 1762. The tax records for 1770 show Henry, Henry, Jr. Micabahh Josuah, and that Joshua paid taxes for his son Micajah. At this time Henry names his wife as Martha and his living children as - James, Henry, Jr., Charles, Edward, Thomas, Clement, where it is the daughters whose names are illegible on the records.

Sugmation - From the Facts

Menry Yarbrough, Jr. was born in Va., Amelia Co., the son of Neury Yarbrough and his wife Martha Robinson. He married Elizabeth Murray in Amedia Co., Va. He moved with his father to N. C. after 1760. His grandfather was Richard Yarborough Jr. and his wife Sarah. His grandfather, Richard, Jr., was born about 1654 in King and Owen Co., Va. and died after 1736. His greatgrandfather was Richard Yarbrough, Sr., born in Lincolnshire, England about 1615; married Frances Proctor in London in 1637; came to Va. about 1642; died 1702, aged 87 yrs., and buried at Blandford Church, Petersburg, Va.

Henry Yarborough, Jr. had an uncle, William, who had a son Samuel. The uncle Samuel had a son Samuel H. whose descendants are in Madison Co., Ala.

Henry and William owned more than 3000 acres of land in Va.

The census of 1790 shows that Henry Sr. and Henry Jr owned a large number of slaves and much land in Franklin County, N. C. Henry Yarborough, Jr. had a great grand-daughter who married Governor Dickett of N. C. It is said that the ablest law firm in N. C. today is that of Yarbrough & Yarbrough in Louisburg the county seat of Franklin County.



The Confederate soldier of stone who stands in the middle of the Confederate circle at the Athens City Cemetery was first placed on the courthouse square in Athens. But there was much protest to his stance with the head bowed as if in defeat. It was then proposed by Thomas Maclin Hobbs, son of Captain Thomas Hubbard Hobbs, that he buy a new statue for the courthouse that would depict the Southerner's pride and sense of honor. Hobbs' one stipulation was that he be allowed to choose the inscription to be used on the monument when it was placed at the cemetery. On the south side toward which the soldier faces are the words:

In memory of the strangers who, in the baptism of our soil with their heroic blood, have honored us.

LEST WE FORGET

The brave die never;
They but change their country's arms
For more - their country's heart.

On the north side of the stone are the names:

H. H. King.

Several crosses with the initials corresponding to the names on the back of the monument mark the reinterments of soldiers brought from other parts of the cemetery. All of them died in battle in and around Athens, and all lie before the statue of the soldier who bows in grief over his fallen companions.

Confederate States Army markers are scattered through the older section of the cemetery and were made available through the Joseph E. Johnston chapter of the U.D.C. in Athens. These markers in the shape of a Maltese cross cost \$1.75 each and were purchased from the Atalla Foundry and Machine Company.

The United Daughters of the Confederacy has suffered a reduction in numbers and popularity in the last few decades, but when the statue was erected on Nov.16,1911 there had been but one intervening war (The Spanish-American) which effected the lives of a handful of local people in comparison with the great numbers in the Civil War. Many of the veterans were still alive and their children were in a prime period of activity. When they said "We remember" it was not the evocation of a long forgotten past. Graves were faithfully marked in appropriate ceremonies each year and annual meetings were still attended by a rapidly dwindling membership of the Camp Thomas Hubbard Hobbs United Confederate Veterans # 400. The Limestone Democrat in 1953 carried a picture made 50 years earlier in which veterans were taking off from Athens for the convention in New Orleans on a chartered railway car which had been decorated by members of the U.D.C.

In 1915 the local U.D.C. requested veterans or their descendants to furnish records of their service. These were compiled by Miss Mary Mason and sent to the Confederate Museum in Richmond, Virginia.

It might be well here to include a little history of the Joseph E. Johnston Chapter of the U.D.C. No.205 (later No.198). It was founded under the direction of Mrs. Maclin Hobbs and Miss Richard Snead somewhere around the turn of the century. In 1928 land was deeded by Charles and Ada Vande grift Hendricks and Homer and Eunice Vande grift French to the local chapter upon which to build a log cabin in memory of their grandfather, Dr. Theo Westmoreland, and their mother, Ida W. Vandegrift.

Mrs. Thomas Maclin Hobbs requested to be the first donor to the building fund. She made her donation in memory of Dr. Nicholas Davis Richardson (her father) and her husband's father, Thomas Hubbard Hobbs, who formed the first Limestone County company to leave for the seat of war and was killed at the battle of Gaines' Mill (i.e., died from wounds received in that battle). Other memorial gifts shed some light on companies in which some of the soldiers fought and also establish some family relationships. They are:

On May 30,1957 the U.D.C. chapter held its 58th memorial service at the confederate circle. It was announced that the local U.D.C. chapter had received an award from the state because of its continued gifts to the state scholarship program. In that year Miss Mary Mason had established a \$1,250 scholarship at the University of Alabama in memory of her father Robert Beaty Mason who fought under Gen.P.D.Roddy in Co.A lith Ala.Cav. The first recipient of this scholarship was Mary Jane

Pickens of Tuscaloosa. Miss Mary Mason, who did so much for the cause of everything in Athens, died on January 12.1958 and on May 1st of that year it was announced that the Mary E. Mason scholarship was established at Athens College to be ready for the fall session. Mrs.Fred Black, president of the chapter, was chairman, assisted by Miss Henrietta Hine and Mrs. Christine Rogers Thompson. It was a \$600 scholarship at the beginning and Mr. and Mrs. Edmond P. Garrett gave half that amount as a starter. The U.D.C.prize money which had come in the previous year was applied. Bailey of the Confederate cavalry; Patsy Dean Jones descendant of David Gilbert; Nan Johnson descendant of Judge John Nicholas Malone; and Penne Jones Laubenthal descendant of the Parham, Sowell, Lipscomb and other leading families of the county (she is now Dr. Penne Jones Laubenthal, professor of English at Athens State College).

The present officers of the U.D.C. chapter in Athens are: Mrs. Fred Black, President; Mrs. Roy Thomas, vice-president; Mrs. Margie Bayless, secretary; and Mrs. Martina Nelson, treasurer and registrar. Interested persons are invited to join by presenting proof that a lineal ancestor or his brother was a soldier in the Confederate Army. Meetings are held monthly on the second Friday in the homes of the members. The initial payment for joining U.D.C. is \$9.25 with annual dues of \$6.00.

We had hoped to be able to publish a list of all our casualties from Limestone County in all wars, beginning with the first after general settlement of the area--the Mexican War. In speaking to Bob Clem, director of Veterans' Affairs locally, we learned that there are no such lists available--only partial lists can be obtained from the Department of Archives and History. Hopefully someone will undertake to compile such a list of those who gave their lives for Limestone County, Alabama in the United States of America, which was for a brief and consanguinary moment a part of the Confederate States.

It was as United States citizens that these gave their lives during World War I. The placque from which these names were taken is on the front of the Armed Services building on Market Street in Athens. This also is a partial list.

Medical Profession - Limestone County.

In looking over the first pages of our history as a county, we find a role of names belonging to honarable men who were actively engaged in the practice of medicine in those early days, who richly deserve mention at this time.

Prominent among these are the names of Doctors Bibb, Tate and Hester of Mooresville, Doctors Looney, Todd, Thievenott and McLinn of Athens, Dr. Leons, of Slough Beat and Doctors Harris, Moore and Baker, of Nubbin Ridge.

Of these we were able to find no dates.

Drs. Wm. T. Minor and Montgomery were among the first physicians of

Booresville, having begun their professional life, there in about 1820. They

are represented as men of broad intellects; devoted to their profession;

Ladustrious in its administration and successful to an unusual degree.

Dr. John Wright Withers was a Virginian by birth; a graduate of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of New York, 1816. Began his practice at "Cotton Port" near Mooresville and died in Mississippi. Dr. Withers had a large, comprehensive mind and commanded an extensive practice.

Pirst among those who settled in Athens was Dr. John R. Evans. He was here early in 1821 and in July of the same year. attached himself to the Emptist church. He. grew rapidly in favor with the people, was a can of brains, had a tender, sympathetic heart, and gave close attention to his patients. He lived where the Vasser home now stands. His only capture married one of our first attorneys, W. C. Maples, Esq.

Dr. David Hobbs was born in Brunswick County, Va., Sept. 6th, 1791, and moved with his widowed mother and a large family of younger brothers and sisters, to Limestone county and settled on a plantation, which he example out of the wilderness. In the name of God Amen I James Yarbrough of the County of Franklin State of North Carolina, being in good health & of sound mind & disposing memory & recollecting that it is appointed for all men once to die, do think fit to make this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following, To Wit, my Soul I recommend to my Creator from I received it; my body I wish to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors. And as for such Worldly Estate as it has pleased God to endow me with in this life, I give and dispose of in the following manner, To Wit,

- 1st I give and bequeath unto the children of my Brother Thomas Yarbrough the following named negroes & their increase, To Wit, Natty, Hannibal, Huldy, Lafayette, & Lucy, to them, their Heirs & assigns forever to be as nearly equally divided in kind as possible without any resort to Sale to effect a division--

Howze, Nancy Howze, Frances Washington & Thomas Howze the following named negroes, To Wit, Julia, Peggy, Sallie, David & Farely, & their increase, to them, their Heirs & assigns forever, to be as nearly equally divided in Kind as possible without any resort to Sale to effect a division—
- 3rd I give unto my Brother Archibald Yarbrough the following named negroes & their increase, To Wit, John, Lorine, Amy, Caroline, old Quoco, & Rose to him & his heirs & assigns forever-
- 4th I give & bequeath unto my Brother David Yarbrough the following named negroes, To Wit, Betsey, William & Stephen & their increase, to him & his heirs & assigns forever.
- 5th I give and begueath unto my Brother Henry Yarbrough my negro men Dick & Jim to him & his heirs and assigns forever.
- 6th I give and bequeath unto my Sister Nancy Ligon the following named negroes & their increase, To Wit, Isaac, Chaney, Jenny, Lucy, Rosetta & Abram, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.
- 7th I give and bequeath unto my nephew Henry Y. Howze my negro Man Claborn, to him, his heirs & assigns forever.
- 8th I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my Sister Francis Cook one half of the proceeds of the Sale of my Land, to them, their heirs assigns forever.
- 9th To my Executors hereinafter mentioned, I give the power of Selling my Land & conveying title thereto, either privately or publicly as they may think fit; and upon such payment or payments as they may think not prejudicial to my creditors & the Heirs of my Sister Francis Cook dec^d, to whom I have willed one half the amount it may bring; the other half of the proceeds of the Sale it is my wish should be applied to the payment of my Just debts, together with the proceeds of the Sale of my Crop, Stock, Household & Kitchen furniture, Plantation Winery & C. Should there be any balance left after the payment of my debts, of the funds herein provided for their payment; it is my wish and desire that it be divided between the children of my Brother Thomas Yarbrough, the above named Heirs of my Sister Martha Howze, the

CLAYTON-REEVES-SUTHERLAND.

I am taking the liberty of enclosing a compilation of the family records of certain branches of the Clayton, Reeves and Southerland families based on the records contained in two bibles in the possession of my wife's aunt, Mrs. J. C. Southerland of Memphis, Tennessee. One of the bibles, according to family tradition, belonged to Mary Clayton, wife of Willis Reeves, and the other to the Southerland family. I thought that the George Clayton record might be of especial interest to you as I have not seen in any printed record references to this son of Samuel Clayton.

I have assumed that "Samuel and Eliza Clayton" were Samuel Clayton, of Caroline county and Elizabeth Pendleton.

I think it possible that Temperance Hill, wife of John Clayton (4) may have been a daughter of Green Hill of North Carolina, Treasurer of Halifax District, etc. His son, Green Hill, Jr., married in Brunswick county, Jan., 1773, Mary Seawell, and the marriage bond of John Clayton and Temperance Hill was signed by G. Hill.

YARBROUGH CEMETERY

Located near the center of Section 17, T 3, R 5. This cemetery is wrongly designated as Farrar on county maps and Farrar is designated as Yarbrough. Most of this cemetery was destroyed several years ago. The stones were thrown in a ditch and covered with dirt. Two new stones were erected over known grave sites by a descendant. This was an old cemetery. A deed dated 1835 made an exception of the cemetery when the land was sold and stated that in the center of the cemetery was the monument of Thomas O'Bannion, an early Limestone settler. (C.W.E.) Note: Thomas O'Banion was the first minister of the kound Island Baptist Church when it was organized in 1816. (F.A.)



Howze, Nancy Howze, Frances Washington & Thomas Howze the following named negroes, To Wit, Julia, Peggy, Sallie, David & Farely, & their increase, to them, their Heirs & assigns forever, to be as nearly equally divided in Kind as possible without any resort to Sale to effect a division—
- 3rd I give unto my Brother Archibald Yarbrough the following named negroes & their increase, To Wit, John, Lorine, Amy, Caroline, old Quoco, & Rose to him & his heirs & assigns forever--
- 4th I give & bequeath unto my Brother David Yarbrough the following named negroes, To Wit, Betsey, William & Stephen & their increase, to him & his heirs & assigns forever.
- 5th I give and bequeath unto my Brother Henry Yarbrough my negro men Dick & Jim to him & his heirs and assigns forever.
- 6th I give and bequeath unto my Sister Nancy Ligon the following named negroes & their increase, To Wit, Isaac, Chaney, Jenny, Lucy, Rosetta & Abram, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.
- $7^{\mbox{th}}$ I give and bequeath unto my nephew Henry Y. Howze my negro Man Claborn, to him, his heirs & assigns forever.
- ${\it g}^{\rm th}$ I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my Sister Francis Cook one half of the proceeds of the Sale of my Land, to them, their heirs ${\it L}$ assigns forever.
- 9th To my Executors hereinafter mentioned, I give the power of Selling my Land & conveying title thereto, either privately or publicly as they may think fit; and upon such payment or payments as they may think not prejudicial to my creditors & the Heirs of my Sister Francis Cook decd, to whom I have willed one half the amount it may bring; the other half of the proceeds of the Sale it is my wish should be applied to the payment of my Just debts, together with the proceeds of the Sale of my Crop, Stock, Household & Kitchen furniture, Plantation Winery & C. CLAYTON-REEVES-SUTHERLAND.

I am taking the liberty of enclosing a compilation of the family records of certain branches of the Clayton, Reeves and Southerland families based on the records contained in two bibles in the possession of my wife's aunt, Mrs. J. C. Southerland of Memphis, Tennessee. One of the bibles, according to family tradition, belonged to Mary Clayton, wife of Willis Reeves, and the other to the Southerland family. I thought that the George Clayton record might be of especial interest to you as I have not seen in any printed record references to this son of Samuel Clayton.

I have assumed that "Samuel and Eliza Clayton" were Samuel Clayton, of Caroline county and Elizabeth Pendleton.

I think it possible that Temperance Hill, wife of John Clayton (4) may have been a daughter of Green Hill of North Carolina, Treasurer of Halifax District, etc. His son, Green Hill, Jr., married in Brunswick county, Jan., 1773, Mary Seawell, and the marriage bond of John Clayton and Temperance Hill was signed by G. Hill.

A deed dated 1835 made an exception of the cemetery when the land was sold and stated that in the center of the cemetery was the monument of Thomas O'Bannion, an early Limestone settler. (C.W.E.)
Note: Thomas O'Banion was the first minister of the Round Island Baptist Church when it was organized in 1816. (F.A.)

In looking over the first pages of our history as a county, we find a role of names belonging to honarable men who were actively engaged in the practice of medicine in those early days, who richly deserve mention at this time.

Prominent among these are the names of Doctors Bibb, Tate and Hester of Mooresville, Doctors Looney, Todd, Thievenott and McLinn of Athens. Dr. Leos, of Slough Beat and Doctors Harris, Moore and Baker, of Nubbin Ridge.

Of these we were able to find no dates.

Drs. Wm. T. Minor and Montgomery were among the first physicians of Mooresville, having begun their professional life, there in about 1820. They are represented as men of broad intellects; devoted to their profession; ladustrious in its administration and successful to an unusual degree.

Dr. John Wright Withers was a Virginian by birth; a graduate of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of New York, 1816. Began his practice Cotton Port" near Mooresville and died in Mississippi. Dr. Withers had

• large, comprehensive mind and commanded an extensive practice.

Pirst among those who settled in Athens was Dr. John R. Evans. He cane here early in 1821 and in July of the same year. attached himself to the Paptist church. He. grew rapidly in favor with the people, was a can of brains, had a tender, sympathetic heart, and gave close attention to his patients. He lived where the Vasser home now stands. His only capture married one of our first attorneys, W. C. Maples, Esq.

Dr. David Hobbs was born in Brunswick County, Va., Sept. 6th, 1791, and moved with his widowed mother and a large family of younger brothers and sisters, to Limestone county and settled on a plantation, which he exact out of the wilderness. It is situated in Slough Beat and now have as the Sowell place. This was in the year 1820 or 1821. Some later, he moved to Athens and built the home afterwards owned by laters on Tanner, Esq, and now occupied by Mr. Issac Rosenau. He lived that until his death. Dr. Hobbs belonged to that class of men whom we have to honor, strong in mind, fixed in purpose, pure in life.

Most of this cemetery was destroyed several years ago. The stones were thrown in a ditch and covered with dirt. Two new stones were erected over known grave sites by a descendant. This was an old cemetery. A deed dated 1835 made an exception of the cemetery when the land was sold and stated that in the center of the cemetery was the monument of Thomas O'Bannion, an early Limestone settler. (C.W.E.)
Note: Thomas O'Banion was the first minister of the Round Island Baptist Church when it was organized in 1816. (F.A.)

"I joined the D.A.R. some 20 years ago on ELI COLLINS' record. That I am interested in is more data on the family. Did you know that ELI COLLINS is buried in the family lot in the Nashville *(Howard Co.)*. rk. cemetery? The Ark. D.A.R. Chatpers placed a monument to his memory in 1931 in the old Cemetery at Washington *(Hempstead Co.)*, rk. We have in our possession his War Record from Washington, D.C. e also have an old Bible even an hundred years old with the COLLINS records in it. However, the records begin with ELI COLLINS and wife ARY ----. ELI COLLINS came from Delaware. I am trying to find his parents. He evidently married MARY ---- in the Carolinas or Georgia, hen the family moved to Alabama. I have no record of NANCY PATTER-ON's parents but she was buried in Washington, Ark. They had ELI VANCE COLLINS married MATILDA NELSON and they had FRANCES ANN COLLINS arried JAMES TRIGG, my parents. ELI COLLINS had several children, so did WILLIAM RAGLAND COLLINS. Some one suggested that MARY ---- might ave been a RAGLAND.''

Searching for Indexed Terms¹

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document

A directory (folder) or even an entire hard drive may also be searched². First, high-light the selected folder or drive and then press SHIFT+CTRL+F to obtain a listing of all the files in which the search term appears. Next, select and open an individual file to find the first occurrence of the search term(s) in the file, as described in the preceding paragraph.

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² This may take quite some time, depending on the size of files contained therein.

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
