# **Preface**

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. Many of these records were provided by Ophelia Kessler and Frances (Rea) Donohue, sisters from Texas, who selflessly traveled the states searching for Yarbrough family records. Others who contributed to our records include Ann Y. Broadbent, Betty Humrighouse, Edna Yarbrough, Karen Mazock, Evelyn Goble, Mary Y. Daniel, Pauline Gray, Nelle Morris Jenkins, George A. Yarbrough, Frances Lockwood, Renee Smelley, Edna Yarbrough, Robert Price Yarbrough, Cleveland "Cy" Yarborough, Jean Baker, Dorothy Svec, and Jeanette Wilson. The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

#### **About This Volume**

There's speculation that Isaac is from the Groves Yarbrough line, which would place him as one of the Joshua Yarborough line. That would also seem reasonable, given that he arrived in and settled near Uriah's family when they decamped from Georgia to Blount County, Alabama. However, there is so far no credible evidence proving this to be so.



#### **About the Index**

After each volume of the Blandford Series was scanned into Portable Document File format, it was made searchable using Adobe Acrobat® Pro, version X. Next, an index was created by TExtract®, a software package used by commercial book and document publishers. Among its many features is the ability to merge the individual chapter/volume indices into a composite master index. It is not, of course, error-free, especially when the print quality of the original documents is poor. Nevertheless, the index is mostly error-free, with the exception of page numbering. While a few pages are numbered, most are not, so TExtract counted the pages in the volume, providing the referenced page numbers. While agreement is good, some referenced pages may be off a page or two. In the master index volumes, each indexed term is followed by the term "Vol." and an associated volume number. These two terms are followed by one or more page numbers, separated by a comma. The master index itself is searchable¹, so the best procedure is to use the index to see if, how many, and in which volumes a particular ancestor may be. Then, using the search feature within Adobe's Acrobat Reader, a search can be made for the name/term of interest.



# Searching for Indexed Terms<sup>2</sup>

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term or a desired term of interest and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, a popup message will so state; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> In order for the search feature of Adobe Acrobat© Reader to be enabled, a certain level of document legibility is required. That is, post-scanning processing cannot overcome poor print quality of an original document. With this caveat, each volume has been made searchable by Adobe Acrobat, version 9 or later.




Isaac Yarbrough (c1793-1884) owned land in block's 12 and 13, along the Huntsville Meridian, in what was Blount County, AL. When Cullman County was created in 1877 a part of the land fell into Cullman County.

Cullman County, Alabama deed records reveal the following transactions:

- 26 Jan 1880, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough conveyed 80 acres out of block 13 to Moses Yarbrough (their son). DB 4/149
- 10 Mar 1883, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough deeded acreage out of Block 13, including improvements, to W:T.L. Cofin. DB 5/38
- 10 Mar 1884, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough deeded 40 acres out of Block 13, to David Garrett (son-in-law). DB 5/173
- John E. Yarbrough, a son of Isaac and Mary, deeded land in Block 12, to Lucy A. Oakes on 11 Oct 1883. DB 5/84
- 10 Mar 1884, John E. Yarbrough got a homestead grant of 160 acres in Block 12. Received patent to land on this date in Deed Record 6/178. Then on 19 Oct 1887 again in DB 6/178, with full details of transaction with General Land Office.

#### Civil War

- 23 Sep 1861 Moses and Isaac E. Yarbrough enlisted Co. C, 4th Bn, Alabama Volunteers, later called 29th Alabama Volunteers. The brothers served 1863 at Mobile, then went to Dalton, Georgia in 1864. Isaac E. Yarbrough was a resident of Eastland Co, TX, and Moses Yarbrough resided Flint P.O. Morgan Co, AL according to pension application filed by I.E. Yarbrough in 1905.
- 1877 Cullman County, Alabama created. Apparently, land held by the Yarvrough family fell into a portion of the new county.

Their son Moses and wife Cynthia are enumerated in Blount County, AL This according to 1880 census of both counties

Yarbrough(c1794-1884) through his son Isaac Estes Yarbrough (1831-1907) who moved
to Texas in 1874 and settled in Eastland County.

Proof that Isaac Yarbrough (Sr) and wife Mary were yet alive in 1884 is found in a series of deeds recorded in Cullman County, AL. Both having reached old age the couple was evidently disposing of their property which is why there is no estate settlement or probate for Isaac or Mary Yarbrough in Cullman County.

Isaac Yarbrough owned land in township 9, Range 2 West, Section 13, and in each of the following deeds the parcels mentioned are from the same description.

- 26 Mar 1880, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough conveyed 80 acres to Moses-Yarbrough
- 10 Mar 1883, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough conveyed acreage and improvements to ... W.T.L. Cofin
- 10 Mar 1884, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough conveyed 40 acres to David Garrett

Their son John E. Yarbrough owned land in Section 12, township 9, Range 2 West, which he sold to Lucy A. Caks on 11 Oct 1883, and applied for and got a patent for 160 acres under the Homestead Act which was recorded 10 Mar 1884 in Cullman County, Alabama.

## ISAAC YARBROUGH (c1793-c1884)

The first known ancestor of this branch of Yarbroughs, descendants are attempting to document Isaac Yarbrough. He is thought to have been born in South Carolina, and his parents were natives of Virginia according to census records.

Due to the varients in census records Isaac Yarbrough may have been born as early as 1788, and by comparing his age given in each succeeding census roll he has been assigned ca 1793 as his birth year. It is known that he was still alive on 10 March 1884, when he and his wife Mary deeded land to a son-in-law, David Garrett. Parties to the transaction were all residents of Cullman County, Alabama, where Isaac Yarbrough and wife Mary were enumerated in the 1880 census of that county. Isaac was 87 years old, and his wife Mary was 79 years of age. Their son John E. Yarbrough was living next door in his own household.

Tradition is that the Yarbrough's moved to Georgia to settle on bounty land. Also, that Isaac was a cousin of the Grove Yarbrough clan who were the descendants of James Yarbrough, a Revolutionary soldier. When James Yarbrough and his son Charles were killed in an Indian raid in what was then Franklin County, Georgia in 1805, the family is said to have returned to South Carolina until the children were grown. They then returned to Georgia to occupy lands awarded James Yarbrough for his military service.

Examination of the place of birth for Isaac Yarbrough's children seems to indicate that he left South Carolina about 1829/30 to settle in Georgia. In subsequent census records the children are said to have been born in South Carolina, which could only indicate that the family traveled between the two States for the birth of the children.

The migration pattern has been established as follows for Isaac Yarbrough: South Carolina (place unknown) to Habersham County, Georgia, by 1850 the family was in Cherokee County, Georgia, 1860, 1870, 1880 in Blount County, and Cullman County, Alabama. The age given for the children and parents in census rolls makes it difficult to determine their year of birth, which complicates the problem of documentation. Also, spellings of the name Yarb(o)rough must be taken into consideration when searching old records. The varients include: Yarbraw, Yarber, Yarberry, Yarbro, Yarborrough, Yearbough, and Yerby, to name a few examples.

Many family history's have a "three brothers" tradition. It usually is reported that three brothers came to America, etc., and one of the brothers moved to a new location and was never heard of again. The Groves Yarbrough clan (descendants of James, the Revolutionary Soldier) has passed down the legend that three Yarbrough brothers served as seamen on the ship "Mayflower" That they did not return to England but stayed in America, migrated into Virginia, and provided sons to serve in the Revolution.

There is also a "seven brothers of Yarbrough" story which states that the Yarborough gentry came from England in the early settlement of Virginia and located in Amelia County. (Amelia was created in 1734 from parts of Brunswick and Prince George Counties) Between the years 1729-1775, seven Yarborough "brothers" went to Louisburg in Franklin County, North Carolina. They were: Zaccariah, Archibald, Manoah, Alexander, Thomas, Henry and John Yarborough. In 1775, Zaccariah Yarborough left Franklin County and moved to that part of Rowan County which is now Davidson County, North Carolina... The Yarborough's in North Carolina intermarried with such families as the Lightfoot's, Deaton's, Hicks', Bethune's, Chisholm's, and other prominent families of Montgomery, Franklin, and Rowan Counties.

Most researchers have concluded that Richard Yarbrough, b. ca 1615, son of Sir Nicholas Yarbrough of Snaith Hall, Yorkshire, was the first immigrant. Richard Yarbrough married first Frances Proctor in 1635 in London, and in 1643 made application to go to the Colony of Virginia. He may have been married three times, it is known that another wife was Miss Williams. Richard Yarbrough died at age 87 in 1702, and was one of the first to be buried on Wells' Hill, now historic Blandford Cemetery in Petersburg, Virginia. He had these known children: Edmund/Edward: John: Henry; Richard, Jr.; William Williams; James Charles; Thomas, and three girls. In 1699, Richard Yarbrough, Sr., was apparently disposing of his property. According to land records his son's John and Richard, Jr., claimed land located in Pamunkey Neck granted their father. James Edwards, Lewis Davis, and Stephen Terry claimed 1300 acres devised to them by Richard Yarbrough, Sr., and it is possible that these three were the husband's of Richard's three daughters. Yarbrough's in early records for land, estate settlements, and church records were Peter, and Moses, who may have been grandchildren of Richard Yarbrough, Sr.

Another Yarbrough who came to America was Ambrose, of the Yarbrough de

Bateson branch, born in Yorkshire in 1710. Ambrose Yarbrough left England in 1732 and went to his cousins in Amelia County, Virginia. He is believed to have married Mary Yarbrough, a great granddaughter of Richard Yarbrough, Sr. The family later resided Culpepper County, Virginia where in 1776, Ambrose Yarbrough sold his land and migrated to Union County, South Carolina. He wrote his Will on 27 August 1788, died in 1788, and his estate was appraised 7 January 1789 in Union County, S.C. His known children: Ambrose, Jr.; Humphrey; Jeremiah; Jonathon; John; Mary; Anne Yarbrough Pinnell. There may have been other children who got property before the Will was written.

Having presented a little background of the Yarbrough family, and their migrations from Virginia to establish relationship to one of these two early immigrants, consider the following records.

#### 1810 Census, Chatham County, N.C.

22 October 1818 - Rutherford County, N.C. A lost discharge paper was presented in Court by Richard Yarbrough who stated he was born in Fairfield County, S.C., and that he was 40 years of age. That he enlisted 4 June 1814 at Fort Hawkins during the War, served in the 8th Infantry Regiment in the companies commanded by Capt. Jones and Capt. Hunter. That he was discharged 1 March 1815 at a place 15 miles below Savannah, Georgia. His pocket book containing the discharge paper had been lost in Edgefield County, S. C. Isaac Yarbrough made oath that he saw the discharge of his brother Richard Yarbrough and believed the said discharge lost as stated. S/ Richd X Yarborough, and by Isaac X Yarborough...("I" his mark) It has not been proved that these brothers are of the family we are seeking to document.

Transcribed as "I" Yarborough, this may be Isaac Yarbrough, who had a wife Mary. He is about the right age, and without a marriage date to document him it must be assumed he was married at or near age 24. If so, he and his wife

would have had more children than those listed in the household in the 1850 census. Another Isaac Yarbrough may be found in Hancock County, Georgia in the 1820 census, and is not to be confused with the ancestor Isaac of this paper. The Hancock County Isaac Yarbrough is believed to be a son, or a grandson of James Yarbrough who was living there before 1800. Deed records show that in 1789, a William Yarbray was living in Hancock County; in 1797 James Yarbrough, Jr., got a 120 acre parcel for 30L sterling; and that James Yarbrough got grant #40, and James Yarbrough, Jr., #41 in the 1805 Georgia Land Grant records. Lucy Yarbrough got grant #42 in Hancock County.

Isaac Yarbrough of Hancock County, Georgia was a single man in the 1820 census, age 16/25. He married Jane McDaniel in Hancock County 14 Feb 1823, and in 1850 was listed in census rolls as a resident of Hall County, as was his wife Jane, several daughters, and a son named Francis Yarbrough. Thus, the two Isaac's were contemporaries, and Isaac of Hancock County could not be the I. Yarborough who lived in Jasper County in 1820.

1832 Cherokee Land Lottery of Georgia - Isaac Yarbrough drew lot #217 for 287½ acres in District 26, 2nd Section, in Dyer's District of Habersham County. The survey map shows lot #217 to have been on a creek and adjoining the northern boundary of the 25th District. It is concluded that the man who drew this land is the Isaac Yarbrough of this study.

James Yarbrough and Mary Lucinda Cagle were married in Cherokee County, Ga on 3 Jan 1850, and were living in their own household when the census was taken. James is strongly believed to be a son of Isaac and Mary, b. 1826, James died DeKalb County, Alabama. His first child was born in Cherokee County, Ga on 21 Oct 1850, and was named Joseph Littleton Yarbrough.

Marriages of other children of Isaac and Mary Yarbrough are to be found in records of Cherokee County, Georgia. Their son William Yarbrough married to Elizabeth Cagle on 8 June 1853, by A. T. Tribble, M.G. Their son Isaac E. Yarbrough was married to Mary Ann Priest on 13 Oct 1853, by John Garrett, M.G. Their daughter Elizabeth married David Garrett on 7 June 1857 - her name is written "Yarberry" in the records.

James Yarbrough, age 24 (c1826) b. S.C. and M. L. (Mary Lucinda) age 17 b. Ga. No tombstone has been found for James, but Mary Lucinda Yarbrough, nee Cagle's tombstone data is b. 12 Feb 1831 - d. 27 Jan 1888. Her grave is in Providence Hill Cemetery, DeKalb County, Alabama.

Also living in the 15th District of Cherokee County, Georgia, and enumerated in the 1850 census was Jesse Yarbrough. However, there is no proof that this man was a son of Isaac Yarbrough and wife Mary. Jesse, born ca1819 in S.C. with two older sisters, could possibly fit into the family of the Isaac Yarbrough who resided Jasper County, Ga. in the 1820 census. The family of Jesse Yarbrough in 1850 Cherokee County, Ga census: Susanna, wife age 26, S.C.; Nancy, 10, S.C.; dau Ealy 8, S.C.; Osborne 4, S.C.; William 2, Ga; dau Louvany 1, Ga. From the birth's of these children, Jesse Yarbrough was somewhere in South Carolina until about 1847/48, being the last two children were born in Georgia.

Isaac, James, and Jesse were the only Yarbrough's in Cherokee County, Ga in 1850. If Jesse could be documented, he would make the six sons and two daughters that Isaac Yarbrough had in the 1840 census of Habersham County, Georgia. There is another possibility - that one son remained in Habersham County. The records contain one Yarbrough marriage, namely, Thomas Yarberry and Milly Barnes, dated 11 June 1857. This may be a second marriage, if Thomas was a son of Isaac and Mary Yarbrough, and listed as one of two sons 10/15 years of age in the 1840 federal census of Habersham County, Georgia.

The Yarbrough family left Cherokee County, Georgia about 1858 and moved to Blount County, Alabama where Isaac and Mary, their sons married and unmarried, are listed as "Yarberry" in the 1860 and 1870 census records.

To further document this family the married daughters should be identified. To do this, it is necessary to go back and read old census rolls as follows: 1850 Cherokee County, Ga: 1860 and 1870 Blount County, Al. If the Yarbrough family followed the usual custom of migrating together, then the married daughters may have followed their parents and brothers to Alabama. Isaac Sr., made several deeds in Cullman County (formerly a part of Blount County, Al) which indicate that he may have had a daughter Lucy Cakes, and another who was married to Jefferson B. Morrison. One should also look for the David Garrett family in census rolls. Also, W.T.L. Coffin.

It is known that two sons of Isaac and Mary Yarbrough saw service in the Civil War. They were Isaac E. and his brother Moses Yarbrough enlisted on 23 September 1861; served in Company C, 4th Battalion, Alabama Volunteers, later called the 29th Alabama Volunteers. The brothers served 1863 at Mobile, and went to Dalton, Georgia in 1864. This data gleaned from Isaac E. Yarbrough's pension application to the State of Texas, which contained a deposition by his brother Moses Yarbrough who in 1905 resided at Flint, Morgan County, Alabama. After the War, Isaac E. Yarbrough moved to Eastland County, Texas, where he was enumerated in the 1880 census of that county.

Cullman County, Alabama was created in 1877 and apparently, the lands held by the Yarbrough family fell into a portion of the new county. Isaac and Mary Yarbrough, and their son John E. and wife Eudica Yarbrough are in the Cullman County census of 1880; their son Moses Yarbrough is listed in the 1880 census of Blount County, Alabama.

Proof that Isaac Yarbrough was alive as late as 10 March 1884, and still a resident of Cullman County, Alabama, is found in a series of deed records. 26 January 1880, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough conveyed 80 acres of Section 13 in township 9, range 2 west, to Moses Yarbrough. Witnesses: Elizabeth Garrett, and Darling Gardner. Signed: Isaac X Yarbrough, Mary X Yarbrough.

10 March 1883, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough deeded acreage and improvements located in Sec. 13, Tnp. 9, Range 2 West, to W.T. L. Coffin. Witnesses were John W. Garrett, Jefferson B. Morrison. Signed by their marks, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough.

10 March 1884, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough conveyed 40 acres out of Sec. 13, Tnp. 9, Range 2 West, to David Garrett. Witnesses were John W. Garrett, and Jefferson B. Morrison. The date of this deed and their marks as signature is proof that Isaac and Mary Yarbrough were alive as late as March 1884.

Cullman County, Alabama records show that Isaac and Mary's son, John E. Yarbrough deeded land in Sec. 12, Tnp. 9, Range 2 West, to Lucy A. Oaks, dated 11 October 1883. John E. Yarbrough then applied for and received a patent for 160 acres of land in Cullman County which was recorded 10 March 1884. Three years later when title was received it was recorded in Cullman County, Alabama on 19 October 1887.

It is apparent that having reached old age, Isaac and Mary Yarbrough were disposing of their property by deed to children and perhaps, grandchildren. It is assumed the couple was cared for by their children. There are no estate settlement or probate papers in Cullman County records. Cemeteries in the county have not been visited to locate gravestones, should any exist.

Documentation of Isaac Yarbrough is needed with regard to his father, and where they lived in South Carolina. From the data presented in this paper there are several probabilities:

- (1) He was the Isaac Yarbrough who witnessed Richard Yarbrough's lost discharge paper in which it was stated that the two men were brothers, and that Richard was born in Fairfield District, South Carolina.
- (2) The Isaac Yarbrough in the 1810 Chatham County, N.C. census would be about the right age, and may have been living with a sister and widowed mother.
- (3) If he is the Isaac Yarbrough found in 1820 census of Jasper County, Georgia, he may be the son of Joseph Yarbrough who died after 1800 according to court records which show the administrator of the estate made his annual report on 1 January 1810.
- (4) He is a descendant of James Yarbrough, the Revolutionary soldier who died in Georgia. It has been reported that they were "cousins." When James Yarbrough died, the family moved back to South Carolina and returned to Georgia when the children were grown.
- (5) One member of Isaac's family said his grandfather's name was Burl, another said his grandfather had a brother named Burl. Burl/Burrell is derived

from Burwell, a family prominent in Virginia. There was a Burwell Yarbrough in Hancock County, Georgia who was deceased by 26 March 1803, when according to court records Richard Fretwell was appointed administrator of his estate. Isaac Yarbrough would have been about 10 years of age when Burwell Yarbrough died. It should be noted that the given name Burl/Burell/Burwell was not used by family members to name a son except one. However, Isaac and James were often used.

(6) Isaac Yarbrough (c1793-a1884) was not a son of any of the above.

This material is presented as a summary of the research that has been done to document Isaac Yarbrough. It is open to corrections and additions, and any conclusions drawn are pure conjecture.

#### HISTORY OF W. O. YARBROUGH

April 23, 1950

Name, W. O. Yarbrough Born in Culman County, Alabama, June the 24th, 1872. My family moved to Eastland County, Texas in 1874. Things I remember in 78 years that I have lived.

First, I remember when every-body lived in 3 villages in the county. The farmer and the rancher men would go to the other farms and help work them, but would leave enough men in each village to guard the women and children. The Indians would make a raid nearly every moon-light night. They made a raid one night on my father's horses and got his stable horses, and father had a cousin that father and mother raised. They crowded the Indians so he cut the horses throat and killed the horses they were trying to steal. Another thing, I remember going to church and the men carrying their six-shooters and Winchesters expecting a raid any time by the Indians. Another thing I remember, on the 10th of June, 1879, was a killing frost, killed all crops, the most remarkable thing which gave me the biggest scare of my young life, was a total eclipse of the sun, coming at 4:00 p.m. That was in 1879. I sure thought the end of the world had come.

If you have never lived in the frontier country, You will never know what it is like to see anybody going west. You would try to get them to stop and stay a week and of course, try to locate them on a new farm.

I could write a great deal of frontier life, but this will give my children some idea of their ancestors.

My mother's name was Mary Ann Press and my father's name was Isaac Estes Yarbrough. He came from South Carolina, was an overseer of Negroes on a farm. Mother came from the Cherokee inhabited part of Georgia. They both came to Alabama where they met and married.

The town of Cullman City, Alabama was built on land my father sold

before coming to Eastland County, Texas in the year 1874.

All of their children, including myself, who am the voungest of the family of ten, three girls and seven boys, were born in Alabama.

This is written as past history of my family for my children. My family came, that is, my ancestors came, from Holland and Scotland. My name, Wiley Owen Yarbrough. In 1895, I talked with one of my father's cousins, who had the history of the Yarbrough family. They came over in the Mayflower and were from Holland and Scotland. My grandfather's name was Burl Yarbrough, and was one of the biggest ranchers in the territory, back in 1878 or 79.

I got married Jan. 6, 1895.

Now I will come on to 1895. I had 3 children born in Eastland County, Texas on the same farm I was raised on, then in 1901, moved to Greer County, filed on 160 acres of land 5 miles south of Mangum. I

lived on that farm for 36 years, never living in a rented hourse or farm. I raised 7 children, all of them have high school educations, some are teachers, others bookkeepers. My wife and me lived together a little over 54 years. She passed away the 26th of Feb., 1949.

In 1879 on to 1880, the first railroad freight train to land in Eastland County was the Texas and Pacific out of Ft. Worth. Then in 1881, the Texas-Central out of Waco, Texas. That was the start of Cisco Town, that is where the Texas and Pacific and the Texas Central crossed. That is where I went to my first school. My father put in the first store which is still called the Red Front Drugstore. We.. the big thing that happened in 1886 and 87 was that it did not rain enough in either year to make any crops at all. The cattle all starved to death for something to eat and for water. The next bad thing was the Cisco Cyclone that was on the 28th of April, 1898 or 1899, I am not sure about the date of that.

Eastland County had no organized law for several years after we moved there. They had nothing but mob law for several years. Heard of numbers of cow thieves passing through the county killing cattle for the hide and tallow. Could go today and show you the tree that those cow thieves paid the penalty for their stealing. They would take the hind quarter and leave the rest for wild animals to eat of which there were plenty, such as panters, mountain lions, cugers, and wolves. Plenty of buffalo in the next county, which is just west of Eastland County. I farmed in Greer County until 1938, moved to Mangum at 513 West Pierce Street, had a reunion of my family and my wife's family which was the P. W. Jones family. They moved here in 1900, raised their family just 4 miles south of Mangum. He and Mother Jones passed away several years ago. Me and one brother, Charley, is all that is left of my direct family.

Brother Frank passed away in 1949. He was 80 years old. Brother Charley lived in Comanche County, Texas. He will be 80 come this September.

I was 78 the 24th of this month (June).

By his first wife, who was also born in GA. YARBROUGH had at least one child, Rufus M., born June 1884, AL, a cotton mill oiler not yet literate, who was probably the Ruphus in 1910 living in Cherokee Co., AL as a miner. With his third wife, Susie, a spinster whom he had married 1900-01, "N. T." as a farmer and employer in 1910 was renting the home farm where was residing in Brindley Pct. 1 of De Kalb Co., AL. Susie, who as 35, born in GA and a farm laborer, had had five children of whom Cleo 8, Emily 7, Thomas 4 and Cleverdell 2, a daughter, all born in AL, were alive. Jennie (ALLEN) YARBROUGH, who had probably died 1900-01, as the mother of four children by 1900 whom Hattie, born July 1891, AL and in school 8 months, but not yet a writer, and Jessie, born Mar. 1898, GA, were then alive.

the town. Mr. Stephens was married May 7, 1871, to Miss Isabella C. Whitfield, a native of Arkansas, and daughter of George W. and Mary (Johnson) Whitfield. Mr. and Mrs. Stephens are the parents of six children, as follows: Edwin Lewis, Ida L., George W., Joseph Henry, Isabella and Sudie Belle. Mr. Stephens is a member of the Masonic Lodge, and also of the A. L. of H. In politics he is a Democrat. He was elected mayor of Provencal in 1888, and is the present competent incumbent. In the same year he was appointed by the governor justice of the peace, and he has also held that office ever since. In the fall of 1888 he was also appointed a member of the school board of the parish of Natchitochee, and he has likewise held this position ever since. He has, therefore, for the past two years, held three official commissions from the governor of the State. Mr. Stephens is a broadminded, liberal-hearted man, and one who possesses much executive ability. Being a native of Natchitoches, he is widely known throughout the parish, and by all citizens he is recognized as thoroughly reliable in every respect, and one whose opinions are worthy the attention of all. He is entirely selfmade, and the position he has won does him credit. The eldest son of Mr. Stephens, Edwin Lewis, completed a commercial course from Keatchie College at fourteen years of age, and is now a member of the junior class in the Louisiana State Agricultural and Mechanical College or University, in which institution be has already been the recipient of merited honors. Besides his literary training, be is a skillful operator. Miss Ida L. Stephens the eldest daughter of Mr. Stephens, is now a student in Keatchie College.

William B. Stille, merchant, Robeline, La. Mr. Stille deserves honorable mention as one of the prominent young merchants of Robeline. He first saw the light of day in Sabine Parish, La., his birth occurring on August 4, 1880, and is the son of Joseph D. and Hattie B. (Smith) Stille, the former a native of New Jersey, and the latter a native of Virginia. To the parents were born six children—five sons and one daughter—all living and named as follows: Anna E., William B., Joseph D., Walter D., Elliott O. and Norrie A. The

mother of these children died in 1878, after which the father married Miss Emma J. Pierson, and they now reside at Many, La. He has two children by this union, Lillian P. and Mary A., both living. Joseph D. Stille, the father of our subject, is an old and honored citizen of Many, La., and for a great many years he has been a merchant of that place. When William B. Stille was five years of age his parents removed to Sabine Town, Sabine Parish, Tex., where the father was engaged in merchandising, and where our subject spent his youth. He secured a good commonschool education, and at the age of fifteen years he entered the employ of R. B. Stille & Co., one of the leading mercantile firms of Many. About one year after he entered its employ, his uncle, R. B. Stille, died, and our subject's father, James D. Stille, succeeded the firm of R. B. Stille & Co., continuing the business ever since. After his uncle's death William B. Stille entered the employ of his father, and continued with bim in the same store as clerk and book-keeper until March, 1889. At that time, with the means he had thus earned, he removed to Robeline, where he engaged in business for himself. Immediately after locating in this place, he purchased a lot and upon it he erected a business building, which is 23x70 feet, and which is not only one of the neatest, but one of the most substantially built buildings in the city. In this he placed a first-class stock of general merchandise, and on July 15, 1889, he opened it up to the public. Though it has been but little more than a year since it was opened, Mr. Stille has already bnilt up a good patronage, and now ranks among the foremost business men.

They have one child, a son, born September 4, 1800. Mr. Stille is strongly Democratic in his political principles, and when a resident of Sabine Parish he held the office of constable for four years, filling that position ably and in a satisfactory manner. He is a young man of good habits, and possesses every qualification necessary for a successful business career. He is careful and painstaking with his patrons, and

(In December, 1841, the Methodist preachers entered this field, holding services in the court bouse). Mr. Burke attended the little societies at Greenwood, Shreveport, Alexandria, Dunaldsonville, Fort Jesup, Baton Rouge and Franklin, up to 1844, when he resigned. In 1843 a church building was erected here through the efforts of the first pastor. In December, 1844, Rev. Elijah Guion came bere, and remained until June, 1848. For five years the pulpit was filled by visiting preachers, or by the rector of Alexandria. In July, 1853, Rev. Thomas S. Bacon arrived; the corner-stone of the present brick church was placed April 28, 1857, and the house was completed in 1858. Prior to this a silver sucharistic service was presented by Gen. De Peyster, of New York, and a tablet to the memory of his daughter was placed in the sanctuary, on the left of the alter. Mr. Bacon served the churches of this mission until April 12, 1861, when he resigned, leaving a Mr. Binet to take charge. In April, 1865, a Confederate chaplain, Rev. David Keer, succeeded Mr. Binet, but in March, 1867, the pulpit was found vacant, and the bishop appointed a lay reader. In March, 1870, the pastor of the Shreveport Church came here by appointment, but in December, 1870, Rev. Charles Ritter was appointed rector, and served until April, 1871. Rev. John Sandels came in April, 1872, and remained until hie death, in October, 1874. From 1878 to 1883 Rev. Charles A. Cameron was pastor; then the pulpit was vacant for about two years, when Rev. M. T. Turner began his periodical missionary visits. In May, 1886, Rev. R. H. Prosser began his monthly visite, and in May, 1887, Rev. W. T. Douglass succeeded him. The church is now without a pastor, but the registers or records are safe in the possession of Mrs. Sullivan, one of the oldest members. The seats or pews were sent bither from Illinois, years ago, while the organ, built in Baltimore, was placed here in 1871. The bell was presented by Gen. De Peyster. The congregation is made up of thirty families

Union Lodge No. 21, A. F. & A. M., was

chartered in 1818, and continued in existence until 1828. Phoenix Lodge No. 38, A. F. & A. M., was chartered October 6, 1836, with Samuel P. Russell, master; William Long, S. W.; William P. Jones, J. Cloutierville No. 110 was organized at the mouth of Cane River in 1852; Kissatchie Union No. 195, at Kile's Mille, in 1868, surrendered charter in 1880; Lake Village No. 205 dates back to 1869. It is now known as No. 86 with headquarters at Saline since 1874.

Natchitoches Lodge No. 89, K. of P., was in-

stituted June 7, 1889. The officers installed in July, 1800, were: H. M. Hyams, C.; C. H. Levy, V. C.; J. E. Breds, P.; R. S. Calves, K. of R. and S.; H. M. Levy, M. of E., and N. Smith, M.

The Thirteen Club elected the following named officers in June, 1890: J. S. Stephens, Jr., president; J. C. Trichel, Jr., V. P.; Clarence Pierson, secretary, and Simeon Simon, treasurer. club has elegant quarters in the Review Building.

The Free Sons of Israel of Natchitoches were incorporated under the act of March 30, 1871. The object of this association was to subscribe funds to be employed in the erection of a synagogue and keep the burial ground in good order.

In 1879 the Methodist Episcopal Church building was erected, Rev. T. J. Hough being then preacher. The Baptists began their building that year during the pastorate of Rev. V. G. Camingham, but pending its completion held services in the Fireman's Hall. The Baptist, Methodist and South African colored churches were in existence.

THE YARBOROUGH BROTHERS

of

EAST FELICIANA PARISH, LOUISIANA

1798 From South Carolina via Georgia

> James Yarborough Lewis Yarborough Stephen Yarborough

Before I give the families of the Yarborough brothers, James, Lewis and Stephen, I would like to give some background of the area where these people and some of the families into which these and their children married, settled and lived. This area of Louisiana was opened for settlers in 1803 after years of battle between the French, Spanish and British. The United States officially claimed "West Florida" had been under the Louisiana Purchase and began to recognize the claims and grants made by actual settlers between 1803-1810. It was with much difficulty that many of the settlers obtained title to their land.

We are fortunate to have on record a small history of East Feliciana Parish, written by H. Skipwith, "East Feliciana Past and Present" 1898. Although Mr. Skipwirth had been present as early as 1825, some of his history was surely related to him by the ancestors of the pioneers of the area.

Because the Parish of Feliciana has once encompassed almost all the Gulf Coast to the Pearl River, its records are to be found in Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana. It was divided into smaller parishes between 1813 and 1824, and in 1824 the site of the present Clinton, Louisiana, was designated as the county seat. The site chosen by the commissioners was by Pretty Creek, which was the land which had been claimed, cultivated and dwelt upon for at least twenty years. The town of Clinton, Louisiana, now stands on that land.

A visit by this writer, in 1980, to the town of Clinton revealed that at least the knowledge of its early pioneer, Lewis Yarborough, is yet evident. When I asked the townspeople to show me where the log cabin built by Lewis Yarborough had once stood. It was pointed out that, standing in its place, is the present Western Auto Store.

There is so much to be learned from the pages of this small history that I shall include some of its passages: "East Feliciana Past and Present" by H. Skipwith, (La. - Gen 976.3, S. 557, Clayton Library, Houston, Texas)

#### PIONEERS OF THE FIFTH WARD p. 33

My present search is limited to the inquiry "Who made the earliest blazings of civilizations in the fifth ward of East Feliciana?"

Tradition carries us then back, in answer to this question, to the closing years of the last century; when the three Yarborough brothers from Georgia, and Joseph Felps, from the same State, in company with his brothers, James. Thomas and David; and as part of the same immigra-

tion movement, those sturdy old frontiersmen, Isaac Taylor from Pennsylvania, and Robert Nettles and Thomas Albritton from South Carolina, who commenced to make their hatchet clearings, to off fence rows and to build log cabins with puncheon floors in the heart of the primeval forests and cand brakes, the dark green curtains of the watercourses, which irrigated and fertilized the lovely valleys of the Fifth Ward, in the year 1798.

And two years later came into the same community another colony from Elbert County, Georgia, which included several well-remembered pioneers, who figured conspicuously in shaping our civilization, namely: Charles Ingraham, James Higginbotham, Matthew Edwards, Natt Cobb and William

Blount.

Mr. Ingraham, who cleared the place now owned by Mr. L. T. Felps, was a worker in wood, possessing a large and active mechanical genius, and to him the settlers were indebted for the first grist and sawmill, and he was likewise the owner of several slave mechanics, workers both in iron and wood, and Ingraham's mill and blacksmith shop were leading land marks for many years. of which there are still

some vestiges.

His old Elbert County neighbor and friend, James Higginbotham, who likewise was a slave owner, was the Master of the (p.34) first lodge of Masons organized in East Feliciana. He lived and died on his first clearing, but his son, John B., on his father's death, moved eastward into the Sixth Ward, near Nat Cobb and William Blount and the Briants, who had migrated from the banks of the Comite river, in the Fifth, to the valley of the Amite, in the Sxith. Throughout his long and active life, John B. Higginbotham was a strong pillar of the Methodist Church, an Earnest and devout class leader. It is one of the traditions of the Elbert County colony, along the Comite, that young Charles Ingraham was the first Anglo American to die, and that his father put him away in a solid lightwood coffin, which was made air tight by ingenious devices without corroding nails.

As the Felps and Yarborough brothers certainly came into the wilds earlier than the Elbert County colony, those earliest leaders of the column of civilization have had so much influence in shaping the societies which they founded that each may claim a short biographical paragraph.

James Felps founded the ancestral seat, seven miles east of Clinton, on the Greensburg road, in the Eighth Ward. His brothers, Thomas and David Felps, founded their family seats two miles south of him, on the banks of Bluff Creek, in the Sixth Ward.

The fourth brother, Joseph, whose descendants still cling in large numbers around the "clearing" which their ancestor made in 1798, a little south of the present site

of Clinton, chose his home in the Fifth Ward.

The three Yarborough brothers, who came from Georgia with the Felps, founded their homes along the banks of Pretty Creek, in clannish proximity, in the Fifth Ward. Lewis Yarborough made his hatchet clearing and built his log cabin (which I have seen standing in good repair, in 1825) just between the present store of Mr. R. Carow and the new residence of Henry Hartner. His descendants, not long ago, under the advice of Judge J. B. Smith, contemplated bringing duit for all the land on which the town of Clinton now stands.

James Yarborough founded his seat on the heights west of Pretty Creek, within 200 yards of the present residence of Mr. H. A. White; and his descendants, of whom Mrs. A. Levi, of New Orelans, is one, have contributed their loyal quota to the social development of their neighborhood.

The third brother, Stephen Yarborough, was perhaps the most energetic and successful of the brothers. He founded his seat and handsomely improved the heights, on which Hon. T. S. Adams now lives, from which there is a pleasant prospect of green, fertile valleys and forest-clad hill. The career of Stephen was prosperous without any adverse break for years, during which he added a water saw and grist mill and gin to his possessions, until (p.35) he planted his numberous broad and fertile acres of Pretty

Creek bottoms in sugar cane.

He lost his crop in the futile endeavor to express the juice from his cames with water power, which was totally inadequate. This costly failure and the loss of his first wife suggested to the lonely widower of Pretty Creek the need of a partner to share his sorrows. Nature abhors a void, and so did Stephen, the uxorious widower, who, inspired with the resolution to find a suitable partner to fill the void, spruced up one fine Sunday morning in a glossy broad cloth suit, spotless linen, shiny beaver, tight buckskin gauntlets and patent leather boots, and rode upon a showy charger, prancing and curvetting, to the fence around the mansion in which Judge Brame now resides. Inside the building were the bright black eyes of the very pretty brunette Widow Morgan, who sat in widowed meditation, fancy free, biding her time. To accompany the bright eyed widow to church was the objective point of Stephen, and to that same objective the widow cheerfully co-operated. The acquaintance thus initiated soon ripened into a rapid exchange of notes, in which the widower's words, carefully selected from that casket of sighing lovers "the complete letter-writer," fairly sparkley with the Pomethean fire, to which the widow, with experience of thirty winters and a former surrender, was coy and very shy, without a soupeon of gush or any of those traps into which soft and silly maidens often fall. As the correspondence developed the furnaces on the "Heights" became hotter and brighter. In the course of time, when the fire grew dim for want of fuel, and when the flashes from Pretty Creek ceased to illuminate the widow's casket of epistolary jewels, the thrifty widow unmasked a battery from behind the columns of Judge Brame's brick house, which struck terror to the heart of Capt. Adam's uxorious predecessor in his lofty tower on Pretty Creek. The artless, coy, bright-eyed widow filed with the Clerk of the District Court a suit for breach of promise, and \$10,000 damages to salve a broken heart, and founded her suit on twenty odd carefully folded, labelled

and numbered proposals of marriage. Imagine Falstaff before Henry the Fifth's Chief Justice, defending himself from the clamorous assoverations of Dame Quickly, alleging that the oleagenous old scamp had deceived her into various and sundry money loans, and broken her susceptible heart by numberless promises to make her his wedded wife. Imagine the placid and rotund Mr. Pickwick defending himself from the matrimonial aspirations of Mrs. Bardell, and you will have a "fac-simile" of the fat wodower of Pretty Creek before the court in Clinton, on the trial of the suit styled "The widow Morgan vs. Stephen Yarborough. Of all the lawyers, jurors and witnesses in that celebrated case none that I know of are left to tell the tale, except the ex-Chief Justice Merrick and (p.36) this writer. Recalling the ludicrous incidents of that memorable scene, in which the two most conspicuous champions of the much damaged widow were the late Thomas Green Davidson, of Livingston, and the late Henry Marston, Esq. The first proclaimed himself to be the volunteer defender of injured innocence; the latter a knightly old gentlemen from under the shadow of Faneni Hall, who promenaded thr lists, ready to break a lance with whoever presumed to sneer at the agravated wrongs of the wounded dove, who was seeking salve for a broken heart. As the venerable Tom Green Davidson would extract a letter from the bulky package on which the widow's case rested, leaning on his crutch, and holding the letter in the other hand appealing "Gentlemen of the Jury, I crave your close attention while I read to you another chapter of "Stephen on Love," a scene so rich was presented which beggars the numerous presentations of Falstaff and Pickwick defending themselves from Widows Quickly and Bardell. The jury gave Mrs. Morgan \$1000 damages, which was only realized after a hard fight in the Supreme Court, but the widow died before the decree was rendered and Mr. Marston, her chivalrous and steadfast friend, administered her estate, which was kept unsettled by the claim of her volunteer counsel for a fee of \$500, which claim was resisted by the administrator on the ground that the volunteer had put his hand on his heart and solemnly avowed before God and the jury he had no pecuniary interest, and old Tom died a few years afterwards, kicking himself because he had once in his life forfeited \$500 in good money to impalpable gush.

Before closing this sketch I desire to add that the water courses that form the eastern and western boundaries

of the Fifth Ward and Pretty Creek which courses through it diagonally from N. E. to S. W., afford large bodies of fertile meadow land, that its soil on hill and valley can be easily and cheaply rejuvenated, and therefore in its reproductive capacity and splendid pastoral advantages, it is the equal of the most favored wards. That its area of cheap, idle, waste and abandoned lands is large, owing to the scarcity of laborers, and that in the matter of good society, good churches and good schools, it possesses inducements which are very attractive to the roving body of home-seekers, for whom this sketch has been written. Hoping it will reach them and attract them, I remain, yours, etc.,

#### H. SKIPWITH.

(P.59) The writer came into Clinton in 1825 from where Wilson now stands by narrow bridle paths, all through dense cane thickets, extending after fording Pretty Creek to the top of the hill on which the livery stable now stands. Around the court- (p.60) house square there were two frame houses used as country stores and saloons, and between Carow's corner and Mr. Henry Hartner's dwelling, there stood in 1825, the dwelling of the original proprietor Louis, (sic, Lewis) Yarborough and his family. The fertile and extensive back country east of Clinton soon attracted mercantile enterprise and merchants reaped golden harvests; the disputes between landed proprietors, questions of boundary and the right of way and the more vigorous collection of debts soon brought into the Forensic arena just opened a large body of intellectual recruits from the law schools all over the Union; and old Tully Robinson (the father of the East Feliciana bar), who had been sent out early in the century by President Jefferson as U. S. District Attorney for the Territory of Orleans, and who, after the Territory of Orleans became the State of Louisiana, clung to the county of Feliciana as the last appanage of his official realm and made his home at the new seat of justice, found himself bearded by a guild of lawyers his equals in all the wire drawn arts of professional skill, though the old settler still held all his rivals at bay in the brilliant science of rhetorical display. the aspiring spirits who first flocked to Clinton in search of professional laurels where Lafayette Saunders, who held the parish judgeship and state senatorship, and would have been, had he lived until March 4, 1849, a member of General Taylor's first cabinet.

While Skipwith's record shows that the Yarborough brothers arrived in Louisiana by 1798 to make their claims, it is evident that their first trip was without their families. Records show that Lewis Yarborough made his settlement claim March 1, 1806. Minutes of Executive Department of Georgia gave passage in 1808. One of the stories told by grandchildren of Stephen Yarborough was that the families walked all the way from Natisulga, Alabama. The journey may have been a long and difficult one with many stops along the way, which

may account for the fact that some of the children were born in Georgia and some in Tennessee. It is the conclusion of this writer that the men in the families came alone to Louisiana in 1798 and returned for their families in Georgia. Knowing the journey's path, they guided other settlers to the spot in Louisiana. They made their clearings and built homes before they made their claims which are recorded in the American State Papers.

It is also the opinion of this writer that the three Yarborough brothers, James, Lewis and Stephen, were natives of South Carolina and were probably descended from Ambrose Yarborough I of Spartenberg, South Carolina.

### EAST FELICIANA PARISH, LOUISIANA

On the day of June 22, 1841, one of the daughters of Stephen and Elizabeth Phelps Yarborough, ran off and got married in Amite Co., Mississippi. This daughter, Mary Ann E. (Elizabeth) was underage and did not have her parents consent. It made both Stephen and Elizabeth so angry that they both went down to the Notary and made out their Wills, in which, they cut off the inheritance of Mary Ann E. Yarborough who married Thomas F. Dixon. The following are their Wills dated July 9, 1841.

ELIZABETH PHELPS (FELPS) YARBOROUGH State of Louisiana, Parish of East Feliciana

Be it remembered that on the day and date hereof, at my office in the town of Clinton, in the said parish and state, I, John Morgan, a Notary Public in and for said parish and state, duely commissioned and sworn, did in the presence of Robert Dyes, George W. Munday & Edwin T. Minick, three lawful witnesses of full age of said place, parish and state, receive the last will and testament of Mrs. Elizabeth Felps, wife of Stephen Yarborough, of the parish and state afresaid, as follows:

viz. I, Elizabeth Yarborough, of the parish of East Felicians, State of Louisiana, being of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last well and testiment revoking all others as follows viz. 1st, at my decease I or-

dain that all my just debts be paid. 2nd. Compelled by a painful duty. I do hereby disinherit my daughter, Mary Ann E. Yarborough, she being a minor, for marrying Thomas F. Dixon of said parish without the consent of her parents and do herby deprive her of her legitimate or legal portion of my estate & of the seizure which is granted by law. 3rd. I give to my beloved husband in full property one tenth part of my entire estate moveables and immoveables and slaves at my decease. 4th. I give and bequeath to my son David N. Yarborough an extra portion for which he shall not be bound to collect - one seventh part of my entire estate at my decease, having conficence in my son and believing that he will at all times hold himself bound to assist my said disobedient daughter if she should need assistance. 5th. I give and bequeath the residue of my estate to my other children, including said David N. Yarborough, to be equally divided between them. 6th. I do hereby nominate and appoint my said husband my executor of this my last will and testament .....

In testimony of all which the said Elizabeth Yarborough signs this act in the presence of the witnesses and me, the said notary public who also all sign this ninth day

of July A.D. 1841.

On December 26, 1844, at the insistence of Stephen Yarborough, a complete inventory of the community of assets of Elizabeth Phelps Yarborough, deceased, and living surviving husband, Stephen. This inventory was made by Lafayette Sanders, Parish Judge, and David Pipes, Sr. and Samuel Watkins.

The inventory included several tracts of land, mill, cottage in town of Clinton, live stock, tools and equipment, household furniture, wagons, carriages, saddles, etc. and 65 slaves, each named and a value placed on each; spinning machine and weaving loom, and a list of all accounts receivable and payable. The interesting part of this inventory was the list of the people, accounts or relatives named in this inventory; C. S. Norwood, T. J. Overton, C. E. Pinkney, Rev. David Pipes, James Pratt, A. W. Noah, R. Rigby, A. W. Reid, W. B. Rouark, Willis Rowley, Job Rowley, W. R. Ragland, L. Saunders, David Smith, J. E. Stout, J. W. Stone, J. B. Smith, J. W. Taylor, B. Taylor, R. Taylor, R. B. Turner, S. Feldon, J. H. Worsham, S. W. Watkins, Jon Walker, Noel Waddill, J. H. Yarborough, B. Bennett, B. Abbott, Ira Bowman, L. Baynard, G. W. Baynard, R. Brown, C. Cleveland, Wm. Colinsworth, J. Munday and Edwin T. Minick, three lawful witnesses of full age of said place, parish and state, receive the last will and testament of Stephen Yarborough of the parish and state aforesaid and dictated by thim to me by him as follows viz. I, Stephen Yarborough, of E. Feliciana Parish, State of Louisiana, being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament, revoking all others as follows viz. 1st. At my decease I ordain that all my just debts be paid. 2nd. In discharge of a painful duty I disinherit my daughter Mary Ann E. Yarborough, she being a minor, for marrying Thomas F. Dixon of said parish without the consent of her parents, and I hereby deprive her of her legitimate or legal portion of my estate and of the seizure which is given by law. 3rd. I do give to my beloved wife, Elizabeth, and my son, William N. Yarborough, one seventh part of my estate after the payment of my debts as a part of my disposal portion without their being obligated to collate or in any manner account for the law; but, if impathy require, I recommend that they be kind to my said disobedient daughter, Mary Ann E. Yarbor-4th. I give the remainder of my estate to my other children, including said William N. Yarborough, to be equally divided among them and constitute them my only heirs. 5th. I do hereby appoint William N. Yarborough executor of this my last will and testament.

In witness of all, the said Stephen Yarborough signs this act in the presence of all who sign here, this ninth day of July, 1841.

Claiborne W. Yarborough married his first cousin Elizabeth Felps, daughter of James R. Felps, Jr. (so his Mother was Elizabeth Felps and his wife was Elizabeth Felps). Claiborne W. Yarborough was the witness in 1834 of the Renunciation by heirs of James Felps, Sr. Sometime after this, he and some of his cousins moved to Bossier Parish, La., where he died at the age of 39, leaving a wife and seven small children. At the time of his death his father, Stephen Yarborough, was made tutor of his children, but Stephen yet lived in East Feliciana Parish. Then James Shaw was appointed tutor. By 1853 the oldest son was of age so he was appointed tutor. Claiborne's widow then married J. J. Lewis who was, for a while. tutor but Elisha W. Yarborough was still responsible for his brothers and sisters until 1857 when he called a family meeting to appoint another tutor. Elisha W. Yarborough then went into service in the Civil War where he died.

#### EAST FELICIANA PARISH FAMILIES TRACED

In February, 1820, Bernard Marigny of New Orleans submitted a petition to the judge of the District Court in East Feliciana Parish, La., claiming he had three tracts of land granted to him by the Spanish King between 1804 and 1811, and that these tracts included 73,000 arpents of land located in the "New Establishment of Feliciana."

Marigny said, in his petition, that he was put in legal possession of these three tracts on the 7th and 15th of May, 1811, and since that time he had paid parish and state taxes on them. He listed the names of persons he said had illegally settled on his land and demanded their eviction.

This list, contributed from the East Feliciana Parish records by Bickham Christian, 644 Herndon Ave., Shreveport, included the following names in the Feb. 19, 1820, petition:

#### THE FELPS FAMILY

At what time this family changed the spelling of their name from Phelps to Felps is not clear. It is evident that this family used the FELPS spelling. H. Skipwith, author of "East Feliciana, Past and Present," stated that the Felps brothers, Joseph, James, Thomas and David, came to the area from Elbert County, Ga., or at least in the same immigration movement from Georgia. I, therefore, have searched for Georgia records which show the Felps and Yarboroughs in the same counties in Georgia.

As early as 1776 there is a land deed to a William Few in Columbia County ... "land beginning at Abbenton Felps corner"

Dec. 1783 "..lands granted to Richard Williamson, adjacent to lands belonging to William Felps, deceased, on both side of Green Brier Creek, on the North Fork of the Great Kiokee.

Dec. 21, 1791 - Columbia Co., Ga. Land deed to Wm. Felps - land bound by James Brown and William Felps.

Aug. 20, 1795 - Columbia Co., Ga. "William Few, Jr. .

..lands on Green Brier Creek, adj. to Felps, etc."

We cannot be sure which generation of Felps the Skipwith refers to when he wrote of the Felps brothers. I am inclined to think he meant the sons of James Felps, Sr., and wife Mary. They owned a tract of land of 1000 arpents on headwaters of Bluff Creek. All of their children were of age when they arrived in the area. In fact, Henrietta Felps, daughter of James and Mary Felps was married to Lewis Yarborough before 1803 as their son, James R. Yarborough, stated on the census that he was born 1803 in Tennessee. We know that James and Hary Felps died before 1834. Hary died earlier and James, Sr. sold their 1000 Arpents of land for 31000 to George T. and John R. Felps. Half of this property should have been in the succession of James, Sr's wife Mary. A renunciation by the heirs of James Felps, Sr. and wife Mary, dated October 27, 1834, before John C. White, Notary Public, witnessed by C. W. Yarborough and Deverly Felps, recorded Book D, p. 277-278, November 20, 1834. Some of the heirs refused to sign. From this document we learn the children and some of the grandchildren of James Felps, Sr. and wife Mary. (Only the grandchildren, heirs of the deceased children, are mentioned.)

The renunciation document did not state the relationship of the buyers, George T. Felps and John R. Felps, to James Felps. Sr. We know by other records that John R. Yelps married Nancy Yarborough, daughter of James Yarborough.








Junior lives at Bagwell. Bobby has a used car lot in Bagwell.

Sally Emily Tremier Yarbrough's sister married a man named Burnstien in St. Louis, Mo.

## Settlers' ancestors tell massacre tale

FORT PARKER - Cheryl Wilson of Dallas sat quietly on her chair on the stage, dressed in early 19th century pioneer garb, the right side of her face lit by floodlights.

Her serene expression belied the tale she was about to tell. Cheryl opened a book and began to read the words of her ancestor, Rachael Parker, one of a handful of white settlers captured by Comanche Indians in a bloody raid on Old Fort Parker on May 19, 1836 — 148 years ago.

"I ran out of the fort and saw the Indians drive their spears into Uncle Benjamin." said Rachael Parker. "I shall not attempt to describe their terrific yells, their curled voices that seemed to reach the very skies whilst they were dealing death to the in-

habitants of the fort."

Rachel Parker's account of the last time she saw much of her family alive was one of many stories of loss, search and finding related last month at the annual "Telling of the Tales," at restored site of Fort Parker, two miles north of Groesbeck.

The presentation that has fascinated audiences for more than 10 years has been pieced together from old diaries, letters and other records stored for more than a century in

an old chest known to Parker descendents as the Blue Box.

But what is most unusual about their genesis is that although the Parker family always has been close and the stories handed down from generation to generation, the man responsible for putting them on the stage is related to the Parkers only by mar-

Gloria Selden, the wife of Jack Selden, mayor of Palestine and author of "Tales," is the great-great-great-granddaughter of Daniel Parker, a colony leader responsi-

ble for bringing the First Predestination Baptist Church body to Texas.

So Jack Selden is a Parker only through his soul. "But don't tell him that," said his

wife, Gloria. "He always been so interested in the stories."

He lets the words speak for themselves. The descendant-actors do not move about the stage, but sit or stand around Selden, the narrator, and appear to read from the actual

For example, Daniel Parker, portrayed by Jim Bob Parker of Elkhart, reads a prayer he had written in the centerfold of his Bible a few years after the fall of the fort.

Many of his family died in the attack, including his mother and brothers, Benjamin, John and Silas Parker and others of the colony. The Comanches captured several of the women and children, including Rachael Parker Plummer and Silas' children, John and

Then there is the story of his brother, James Parker, who searched for the missing family members for years, and once almost died in the wilderness after losing his horse

and supplies.

"It required the exercise of all the fortitude and courage I could muster to keep me from striking down with fatigue and hunger," said James Parker in words spoken by James Parsons of Palestine. "The hope of soon seeing my lost child added new vigor to my body, and summoning all my remaining strength, I pursued my journey."

The journey by James proved to be fruitless. But as the years went by, aimost all the Indian captives were found and returned to their families. All but Silas's daughter, Cynthia Ann, who grew to adulthood among the Comanches and married Chief Peta

Nocona.

About 24 years after the attack, an aging Issac Parker read a Dallas Herald story about a white woman captured in a Texas Rangers raid on an Indian encampment, who fit the description of his long-lost niece.

Issac eagerly traveled to the Pease River encampment, and through an interpreter tried to interview the white woman, who was dressed as a squaw and spoke no English. He later wrote an account of the event.

"I told the interpreter that if she was the daughter of Silas Parker, her name was Cynthia Ann," said Issac, portrayed by Harold Kennedy of Palestine. "When she heard that, she slapped her head and said 'Cynthia Ann, Cynthia Ann.' The question was settl-

With her husband Nocona killed in the attack, Cynthia Ann and her youngest child returned with Issac to Tarrant County.

"And so the last of the lost family returned — a stranger admidst strangers," said rrator Seldef. Cynthia Ann never readjusted to life in the white man's world and died . 1870

One of her sons, Quanah, was the Comanche chief who became famous for his efforts to bring peace among the white settlers and the Indian natives. In 1910, Quanah, who had taken the last name of the Parker family, had his mother's remains exhumed from their Henderson County grave and reburied in the Indian family cemetery in Post Oak, Okla.

## Signs Of Spring

Ross W. Hines heard a dove calling on Feb. 25 which has always been a sign of spring is on the way. The daffodilis, buttercups we always incorrectly called them, had been slow coming through the ground. After all, it is hard to push through frozen ground. But just as soon as the temperatures rose, they appeared and have begun to bloom on their short stems.

Two kites were in the air one cold, still day a couple of weeks ago. That seemed to have been a response to the calendar rather than the suitable weather, but more recently many more have been seen fluttering and dipping in the wind on sunny days. The maple tree in the back yard aimost resembles a redbud as it begins to bud. The willows are showing green.

On one of the warmer evenings the spring peepers, Hyla crucifers, if you want the scientific name, began their

chorus from the low places.

Spring begins south of us and makes it northward march traveling at around fifteen miles a day, they say. Although we are almost three weeks away from the official date of spring's beginning, there are forerunners or harbingers that make a temporary appearance before the actual date arrives, much in the same way that purple martins send scouts ahead before the main flock arrives.

When we say that spring moves northward at the rate of 15 miles a day we are speaking generally. It seems to us who live in this area that the south side of Chestnut Ridge is more than two days ahead of us. And for some reason West Tennessee seems a week or more ahead of us here.

Several years ago when the post office workers were younger and the substitutes had to swing in slack periods and walt for more work to come in, a good sign of spring was the sound of a baseball smacking the leather mitt as the boys exercised back of the old post office on South Main Street. Back then spring was hearlded by the arrival of hundreds of baby chicks in the mail. From the time of their arrival early in the morning until the carriers went out with them on their routes there was a deafening din. The quiet that followed was most welcome.

Sometimes the sound of chicks was changed by a box of little turkeys among them. Just before Easter there were boxes of brightly dyed ducks for the stores to sell at that season.

The final sign that spring had fully arrived and summer was on its way was when Avery Price came in off his route and announced that he had killed his first rattlesnake "down in the Parteenth" on route 2.

#### MORE ON CYNTHIA ANN PARKER

Paul Parker of Raus has passed along more information the connection of Cynthia Ann Parker's family with Beford County. The book on Cynthia Ann, her capture by Indians and her return to her relatives which is consider to be the most authoritive was written by James T. Shiel and published in hard cover in 1886. It was reprinted in sback in 1936 for the Texas Centennial. DeShields intviewed survivors of the "raid on Fort Parker" before writing his book, and those writing on the subject after 16 have relied heavily on DeShields for information. Both 1 books are out of print now. In 1912 he brought out a bo called "Border Wars of Texas" in which he carried t story of Cynthia Ann a bit further by telling of her gover ment grants and reburial in Oklahoma.

In the account of the fall of Parker's Fort in that last bothis information on those Parker's is found:

"The patriarch of the settlement was Elder John Parke seventy-nine years of age. His aged wife, "Granny" Parke was, perhaps, a few years younger. Dear Mr. Parker:

On should I start, Dear Cousin:

I was so happy to neceive your letter this morning. There was so much information in it. I have been corresponding with Mrs. John McQueen Guttery, 1821 Jim Bowie Parl, Pycrsburg, Tennessee 38024. She moved from Jasper, Alabama to Dyersville, Tennessee, where her only son & his family live. Her husband passed away several years upo. Mrs. Guttery had the Parker material from someone in Knoxville, Tennessee, who did some research in the 1930's. She sent me her material, which I made copies from, and sent back to her. In the material, was a reference to our ancestor, William Parker, Arch-Deacon of Cornwall. I immediately looked up the Burke Peerage & Baronetage, for Parker, no luck. I, then searched "Landed Gentry," also by Sir Bernard Burke, and found the entire Parker line back to the 14th Century in Cornwall, also Katheran Buller, married James Parker, and her ancestor, Sir Richard Buller, married Margaret Tretherffe (No. 15, on enclosed lineage) and her dicestors back to Henry de Bohun, Magna Charta Surety; this includes a Royal Lineage from Humphrey de Bohun, VIII., who married Princesm Elizabeth Plantagenet, daughter of Edward I., King of England.

As a result, several of us have become MACNA CHARTA DAMES. Of course, this means all our Parker kin are eligible. Also, AMERICANS OF ROYAL DESCENT.

I blso think we may have kinship with the Cynthia Ann Parker, the white girl, kidnapped by the Comanche Indians, and the massacure of Parker's Fort, here in Texas. Those Parkers too, came from Granville (o., North Carolina, then moved to Bedford County, Tennessee, thence to Elbert County, Georgia, then finally to Illinois, thence to Texas and the massacure. We have not proved this line as yet. Perhaps you can help there in Bedford (o. for us. Will explain this in anoter letter.

I am enclosing a Magna Charta Lineage, Florence Gutlery's granddaughter's Lineage.
I'm also sending my Lineage No. 1 through No. 5.

In tooking through the Knoxville material, I came across a memo, listing Elijah Parker's children, with the notation that the Parker Farm is still in the family. I will begin to check for Parkers in Texas from Elijah, Ir. Incidentally, it might be a goal idea for you to send the Parker data from the Bible and on the tombstones to the Bedford County Historical Society for publication in the Quarterly. This is so very important, so many of us are searching for this information. If you do not type, just send me the information and I will type it up for you gladly. Can you photograph all the stones in the Family Cemetery?

I am descended from Priscilla & Miles Chappell's eldest daughter, Lucy (happell who married George Washington Johnston. Their daughters, Elizabeth and Permelia Johnston married brothers, Tapley I olbert York and James York respectively.

Elizabeth and T. T. York, also Permelia and James York lived in Tuscaloosa and Fayette Counties, Alabame, then immigrated to Rochdale, Milam County, I exas, where they died. My grandfather Frederick York, born in Fayette County, Alabama, married I stumbia Incille Green in Rockdale, and my mother, Goldie Har York and my father, Robert Emmett Higgins moved to Thorndale, I exas and were married there, then they moved to Dallas, where I was born. My father died several years ago, but mother and I live here in Dallas. I am an old child and was lonesome without other relatives near here.

It is such a thrilling experience to find more cousins and find everyone is so interested in the family genealogy. You must tell me all about the Mississippi re-union. #### Preface

The story of Cynthia Ann Parker is one of the best loved true stories of early Texas. It has been told and retold many times. The most authoratative work is a small hard back book authored by James T. DeShields published in 1886 titled, "Cynthia Ann Parker." It was reprinted in a soft back book for the Texas Centennial in 1936 at a time when the author was still alive. Both editions are now out of print.

Texas histories, both before and after 1886 gave liberal space to the Parker incidents. Those appearing after 1886 invaribly quoted from DeShields. It is evident that he made diligent tearch for facts before publishing his 1886 book. At that time several who survived the Indian raid on the fort were still living and he interviewed these survivors.

In 1912 DeShields, with Matt Bradley as editor, brought out a thick hard back book, "Border Wars of Texas." In this book he carried the Cynthia Ann Parker story a bit further, accounting for her government grants and her reburial in Oklahoma.

In recent years much of the Parker writing has veered from fact. The publishers of this booklet deemed it needy to go back to DeShields. To make the book interesting a few drawings and photographs from other works have been included.

### The Fall of Parker's Fort

Settlers at Parker's Fort participated in the "runaway scrape" in the spring of 1836, and went as far east as the Trinity which they were unable to cross, as the river was so swollen by heavy rains. While encamped on its western bank, they were informed of the victory of San Jacinto, and at once started back to the fort, which they reached without unusual incident.

Parker's Fort was located near the headwaters of the Navasota, one-half mile northwest of the site of the town of Groesbeck, in Limestone County, in the heart of what was then a wilderness, but now a fruited and thickly populated region divided into farmsteads and dotted with villages and towns.

Fort Houston, situated a mile or two west of the site of Palestine, on land now included in the John H. Reagan farm two miles west of Palestine, in Anderson County, was the nearest white settlement. Others were distant sixty miles or more.

Parker's Fort consisted of cabins surrounded by a stockade. A large double gate afforded access to the enclosure. The outer walls of the log cabins formed part of the walls of the stockade. Their roofs sloped inward. At one or more corners of the stockade were block houses. The walls around the entire quadrangle were perforated with loop holes. The fortification was bullet proof, and like others of the kind, could not be taken by Indians if defended by a few well-armed and determined men. It was built for the purpose of being occupied by the families living in the vicinity, when there was danger of attack by Indians. Most of the farms--some of them near-by and others a mile or so away--were provided with cabins where the tired colonists occasionally spent the night.

Dwight and his wife and children; David Faulkenberry and his son, Evan; Seth Bates and his son, Silas H.; Elisha Anglin and his nineteen year old son, Abram, and old man Lunn-in O der all thirty-eight persons.

On returning to Parker's fort from the Trinity, the little band busied itself with gathering together its scattered stock and in preparing the fields for putting in crops, all unconscious of the fearful massacre that was to extinguish, so soon, the bright hopes they entertained of the future, and the lives of many of their number; and an unspeakable mental anguish and physical suffering upon others of the survivors.

Early on the morning of May 19, 1836, James W. Parker, Nixon and Plummer left the fort, and repaired to a farm a mile from there, and David Faulkenberry and his son Evan, Silas H. Bates and Abram Anglin went from the fort to their fields a mile farther away.

Seth Bates, Elisha Anglin, and old man Lunn either slept at their cabins the night before, or left the fort prior to 9 o'clock the morning of the 19th.

At that hour from five hundred to seven hundred Indians (Comanches and Kiowas) appeared on the prairie two or three hundred yards from the fort, displayed a white flag, and sent forward one of their number, who said that they had no hostile intentions, and merely wanted some one to come out from the fort and direct them to a spring which they understood was near-by, and to be furnished a beef.

Subsequent events justify the belief that this Indian acted as a spy, noticed that nearly all the men were absent, and reported the practically defenseless condition of the occupants of the fort. Benjamin F. Parker went out to the Indians and, after returning, stated that it was his belief they were hostile and intended to attack the fort. He said that he would go to them again and try to dissuade them. His brother, Silas M.

# On the Trail of Cynthia Ann Parker

She began her nomadic existence in the year 1834 when she moved with her parents from Illinois to Texas. For the rest of her life (and even after her death) she would be a wanderer.

Today, at last, she rests beside her son. But her searching spirit lives on, and the story of her travels and travails are the stuff of legend. She has been the subject of countless articles, books, plays, even an opera. And half the residents of Texas and Oklahoma claim to be her kin.

The trail of Cynthia Ann Parker is dim and difficult to retrace. Yet, we can walk some of the same paths that she walked and perhaps learn something of this lost child.

One of the first and clearest points on that trail is at Fort Parker in Limestone County. Old Fort Parker was rebuilt in 1936 under the supervision of restoration architect Raiford Stripling. He built it according to carefully researched data as to size, shape, and configuration on the location of the original fort.

Today, you can climb the stockade walls and peer out of the portholes to the open ground around the fort. If you squint your eyes to eliminate any recent man-made objects, and if you listen only to the wind and the birds, you might imagine yourself as nine-year-old, blue-eyed, flaxen-haired Cynthia Ann Parker on May 19, 1836, when she looked out and saw a group of painted Indian warriors.

Watch as Uncle Benjamin Parker walks stiffly out to talk to the warriors who stare down at him from their horses. The only sound is the occasional snort of a horse or the call of a bird. Suddenly, the still air erupts with terrifying sound as Benjamin is impaled on the warriors' spears and the screaming, waving Indians race toward the open gate of the fort. Turn and see the fear on the faces of your father and mother.

Remember the terror of being roughly tied to an Indian pony, and of a crashing ride across the fields, the river, and out into open country, to begin your wanderings with a new family and a new culture. Once you were named Cynthia Ann, a member of the Parker family. lately of Illinois and Texas. Now you will be called Naduah of the Comanches. You will forget your first family and its language and customs. Though you think you will die, you will not. Instead, you will learn and grow strong. And you will raise a son, Quanah, who will one day make both families

But, for the moment, as you be-




gin to retrace this woman's journey of a lifetime, stand in old Fort Parker and remember this child.

Cynthia Ann lived for most of her next 24 years with the most aloof and remote of all the wandering Comanche tribes, the Noconi. Their home territory was the Llano Estacado, the vast Staked Plains of Texas, New Mexico, and Oklahoma.

The deep river canyons that cut across the Staked Plains offered

miles of tranquil camping for the Comanche tipis. The earth provided fruit, nuts, and shelter, and there were buffalo and antelope by the millions. It was a Comanche Garden of Eden.

Today the buffalo and most of the antelope are gone. But much of the land is the same at it has been for centuries. Spring rains still bring the flowers, and canyons still provide shelter against the wind. Each summer, one of the canyons, Palo Duro, is the setting for Texas, a musical drama that tells part of the Comanches' story.

Within the towering walls of that canyon, the child, Cynthia Ann, became the woman, Naduah. She married the tribal chieftain, Putak Nacona, and bore him three children. Isolated by the rugged geography of the region, Naduah and her Indian family must have felt forever secure in their paradise.

But by 1860 the Comanche paradise had begun to shrink. The steady pressure of white settlers and the incessant Comanche need for warfare had taken their toll. The wild game was diminishing, and the days of total Comanche domination of the plains had disappeared.

On December 18, 1860, part of Putak Nacona's band was camped along the Pease River in present-day Foard County, braced against a howling norther. A determined Captain Sul Ross led a team of Texas Rangers into the teeth of that storm and across the Comanche camp. Among the captives taken during the lightning raid was an unidentified white woman who spoke no English and who called herself Naduah. She

and her young daughter were escorted on a seven-day ride back to Camp Cooper on the Clear Fork of the Brazos River. There the frightened woman prepared herself for death at the hands of her captors.


In mid-January, the distinguished former State Senator Isaac Parker arrived at Camp Cooper to interview the white prisoner. When she heard this unknown man speak her childhood name, the blue-eyed Comanche woman lifted her head and pointed to herself saying, "Cynthia Ann, Cynthia Ann."

Camp Cooper exists today only as a few scattered stones marking the foundations of the post buildings that once stood near a bend of the river, a few miles upstream from Fort Griffin State Park. The encroaching mesquite has covered the once open land, and it is difficult today to imagine the bustle of Army camp life. But here, for a few moments in 1861, Cynthia Ann Parker took her first steps from her Comanche pathways to the trail back to her white family.

From Camp Cooper, Cynthia Ann and her daughter, whom the Anglos called Prairie Flower, rode south across the Texas plains with this strange white-haired uncle, to a tiny, two-room log cabin in the community of Birdville near Fort Worth. There she was reintroduced to a culture she had entirely forgotten. For several months, she slept on the floor in preference to a bed and ate with her fingers. Slowly, she lost her fear of her newfound neighbors.

The Isaac Parker cabin to which she returned has been preserved and is now open to the public. It stands in the Log Cabin Village in a Fort Worth city park.


Cynthia Ann stayed in the Isaac Parker cabin for only a few months. During this brief stay, she and her uncle visited a Fort Worth daguerrotype studio where the well-known photograph of her with her nursing child was taken. Before the end of 1861, Cynthia Ann resumed her wanderings, moving to a remote corner of Anderson County in East Texas. She left her uncle to join two other strangers, her brother and sister, Silas and Orlena, whom she had not seen since that day at Fort Parker.

Northeast Anderson County. only 100 miles southeast of Dallas, is one of those Texas areas that even today seems to retain much of its precivilization wildness. Though crossed by well-traveled roads and dotted with small houses, this part of Anderson County still has dim sandy paths that lead away from the asphalt to be lost in the quietness of tree-lined meadows, running streams, wild grass, and wild flowers. Here Cynthia Ann lived her last decade, here in 1871 she died, and here in the sandy East Texas soil she was buried. Later, others would follow her into this small field, now called Foster Cemetery.

Today it is a wild and ghosty place, full of the sounds and memories of earlier times when a lonely woman struggled for understanding. Many years after her death, a stone pillar would be erected to mark her grave. In 1965, a State Historical Marker would also be placed there. But long before either marker, she would be gone—to Oklahoma—moved by an aging and loving son.

Of Cynthia Ann's three children, only her eldest, Quanah, grew to adulthood. He was approximately 15 years old when his mother was recaptured by Sul Ross. Quanah developed rapidly within the Comanche hierarchy, and became chief of the Quahadi Comanches.

Refusing to sign any treaty with the United States, he continued, as late as 1874, to lead raids against settlements on the western Texas frontier. By then, his was the sole remaining band of warring Comanches.

Finally, in 1875, sensing inevitable annihilation, Quanah led his people to the white man's reservation. He immediately began his search for his lost mother. Never satisfied with the knowledge that she was not among her Indian family, Quanah, in 1910, succeeded in having Cynthia Ann's remains moved from the wilds of East Texas to a small cemetery near his home in Oklahoma. Later, after Quanah's death in 1911, she would be moved again, and today she and her son are buried beneath marble columns on the Fort Sill Army Base in Oklahoma.

The Indians say, "If you would know me, you must walk in my moccasins." So each year the relatives of Cynthia Ann Parker, red and white, come together, one year at Cache, Oklahoma, and one year at Fort Parker. At these meetings, the Parkers and their friends retrace the trail left by this legendary woman. For a few moments, they "walk in her moccasins."

If you follow the trail of Cynthia Ann Parker, you will realize that her path crosses only a small geographic section of the nation. Yet her story and the story of her family sweep across all of the American West and across all of our frontier heritage. Each year thousands of Americans discover that trail and help to renew it. Long after her trail should have vanished, it is marked again by new generations. It is a path of pride.

William Nealy Yarbrough was born in Alabama about 1830. His father was from Tennessee and his mother from South Carolina. His wife, Mary E Lewis, was born in Alabama about 1835. She was the daughter of Bennie Lewis of Tennessee. Her mother was also born in Tennessee, but we do not know her name.

William and Mary apparently married in Alabama and came to Texas by way of Arkansas. Their oldest child, William B., was born there about 1855. By about 1857 they were somewhere in Texas because their next child, Sarah, was born in Texas; as were the remainder of their children, including, Amanda, Joseph, Nathan, Robert, and Osscelan.

They traveled by covered wagon to Texas. They possibly lived in Milam County around Cameron when they first came to Texas. They settled in Limestone County between 1870 and 1880 according to the census. They later went back to Cameron for a visit, and on the return trip Nealy became ill from an apparent heart attack. The family tried to get a doctor, but he died almost instantly.

The kind people found a vacant house for Nealy's family and set up beds for them to stay. Nealy was buried there. This possibly took place around 1880 to 1883.

The family then came back to the community of Old Union in Limestone County. They stayed with Mary Yarbrough's brother, Macadja (Cade) Lewis on the old Reeves place until they could get settled on their property, which is still known today as "The Yarbrough Field". They bought this property which is located southeast of the Union school house adjoining the property now owned by M. P. (Babe) Yarbrough.

After a few short years they moved to Buffalo Gap in Taylor County near Abilene, Texas. Joseph, being the oldest, assumed the responsibilities as head of the household. They herded sheep for a living.

We do not know anything else about their travels after that; however, they eventually came back to Old Union. Mary died there from blood poisoning in the foot caused from stepping on a tack. She is buried in the Union cemetary along with at least three of her children - Bill, Ellie, & Sally.

Nathan Earl Yarbrough, fifth child of Mary & Nealy Yarbrough, was born in Milam County, Texas, September 18, 1873. At the age of six he was in Limestone County as listed on the 1880 census.

He was apparently a happy, lively, inquisitive person, even though the family suffered many trials and hardships. An example of this was an incident that occured after his father's death when the family lived on "The Yarbrough Field". They lived in a house with a dirt floor. One night some of their pigs broke out of the pen and tried to root under the kitchen door. Nathan picked up a piece of stove wood, and threw it in the darkness, striking a pig and killing it. Fearing the consequences, he dragged the pig deep into the woods and hid it. He never told of the incident until he was a grown man.

Another example of his ability to love and appreciate life was shown by the fact that he found pleasure even in work. While herding sheep at Buffalo Gap, he found time to chase rabbits and prairie dogs.

Another time, during his teenage years, he was hunting with several friends. Their dogs treed a small wildcat. The others climbed the tree to scare the cat out. They told Nathan to put his hat over the cat when it jumped to the ground. Instead, the cat landed in his arms. He covered t with his hat as he was told. The dogs were running and barking a ound him. When he realized that he actually had the cat in his arms, he removed the hat. The cat was so scared he was staring wide-eyed and meek and gentle as a kitten. He took it home and raised it as a pet.

Nathan had very little formal education. He attended school in the community of Independence in Limestone County. He estimated that he attained the equivalent of the sixth or seventh grade because he studied Texas History; however, his thirst for knowledge was never ended, and he continued always to study and educate himself. He seemed to be blessed with natural wisdom. He was reared as a member of the Church of Christ and lived for some time during his teenage years with Malcolm Smith, and they did church work together. At some time during the time that he lived in Limestone County, he met the girl he would someday marry.

He moved to Navarro County during his late teens. At the age of twenty he returned to Limestone County and married Delilah Angeline Cox, grandaughter of Thomas and Patsy Cox.

We know nothing about Thomas and Pitsy Cox except that he was born in Missouri in approximately 1808. She was born in Tennessee. Aunt Tex Cox remembers Patsy telling about going to the spring for water and worrying about Indians attacking her. She said they held the reins of their horses through the windows at night to keep the Indians from stealing them.

Nathan Earl Yarbrough and Delilah Angeline were married August 17, 1894. Nathan was twenty years old, and Annie was fifteen. Nathan lived in Navarro County at the time. He came to Old Union to get Annie in a covered wagon. His brother, Bill, a widower, came with him. Bill was getting married for the second time to Elizabeth Cox (Obadiah's sister). The Justice of the Peace came out and married both couples in the wagon.

They stayed with Obadiah and Eliza Cox for a while, then they returned to Powell, Texas, in Navarro County. Their first three children were born there. Alva Elma was born May 14, 1896. Orien Gertrude was born January 25, 1899. The weather was very cold and snow was everywhere when she was born. They had no wood for the fire, so Nathan went to hunt some. He found someone else's wood already cut and stacked and took a wagon load. This was very unusual for a man of Nathan's character.

Their third child, Cecil Wade, was born November 16, 1901. When Cecil (Bud) was two years old, which would be about 1903, Nathan moved his family to Oklahoma. Nathan's brothers, Bill and Joe Yarbrough, and their families and Nathan's brotherin-law, Sid Clark, and his family all traveled in three or four wagons on the trip to Oklahoma. They traveled in the fall of the year, and it was very cold.

Cecil (Bud) was only two years old, but le drove the family wagon all the way from Navarro County to Ravig, Oklahoma, near Chickasha. Ravig was a very small place. Nathan farmed there for about a year and worked at the sawmill some. They had some Indian neighbors who came to visit quite often. The Indians sopke both English and their native tongue. Annie was never at ease with them because she thought they were plotting to kill her when they were speaking in Indian.

Nathan and Annie had two children born in Oklahoma. Melvin Percy was born March 2, 1904. He late: became known as Baby Percy and then later just Babe, which he is still called today. Once when Cecil was thinning corn, Melvin stuck his head under Cecil's hoe, and was practically beheaded.

Nathan and Annie's fifth child, Clifford Fugene, was born September 17, 1907. He lived less than a month and died October 3, 1907. He was buried there in Oklahoma.





Dear Rea;
The parents of Ambrose Barwick Yarbrough were James and Tabitha
Yarbrough. A. B. was born in Alabama, probably
in Calhoun County near Piedmont, but possibly near Lodiga. Prior
to the Civil War, I believe, Calhoun County was called Benton County.
His death certificate and possibly other documents show that
he was born in South Carolina, but public records in Alabama show
that brothers and sisters older than he were born in Alabama. The
family came to Alabama from Union County, South Carolina. His
mother was born in Tennessee. Both parents died in Calhoun
County, Alabama. He often mentioned a place called Sand Springs,
and my father believed that this is where the parents are buried.
I have been told by people from Calhoun County that there is no
such place.

Only one of his two wives is buried at Gorman. Lucinda Cason (KuSOHN), the first wife, died in Calhoun County, Alabama, following the birth of their second child, Robert H., in 1883. He married Bura Ann Evaline Evans in about 1884, and came to Texas in the winter of 1890. The other woman in the family burial plot at Gorman is his daughter, Daisy Dunlop Green. The others there are Luby and Ruben, two of his 10 sons, and Lawrence Dunlop, Daisy's first husband.

A. B. Yarbrough's oldest brother, Robert H., sellted at Whitney, Texas about 1866 and raised a large family there. Another brother, Lindsey, lost an arm at Shiloh, married two or more times, and died in Tennessee about 1909. Only one sister survived a diptheria epidemic during the war. Her name was Elizabeth or Nancy. Her husband took to beating her in the late 1880s. A. B. finally killed him for it and escaped to Texas.

Please let me know what you come up with, as I was never able to do the research that I intended to do.

Dear Mrs. Mazock,

I write to inform you of the outcome of the investigation I have made among the official records of the College of Arms concerning Richard Yarburgh, the supposed emigrant to Virginia. Unfortunately, I can not advise you that the searches have yielded a positive result.

In the first instance, I find a pedigree was officially registered here at the Visitation of the county of York, carried out by the Heralds in 1665/6, this pedigree being headed by one Eustacius de Yarborough who is to be identified with the Eustacius mentioned in your letter of Sixteenth in descent from this Eustacius is one Edmund Yarburgh .. of Bulne Hall in the county of York who died 6 May 1631, and who married Sarah, the daughter and coheir of Thomas Wormeley. This pedigree was certified by Thomas Yarburgh of Campsall in the county of York, in the Commission of the Peace for that county, and his brother Edmund Yarburgh of Doncaster, Doctor of Physick, who was then aged 40. These two persons of Doncaster, Doctor of Physick, who was then aged 40. were two of the sons of Edmund and Sarah. In testifying to the pedigree, they referred to their surviving brother, Sir Nicholas Yarburgh, and a sister Frances, the wife of Sir John Reresby. Had they had a brother. Richard, who emigrated to Virginia, it is highly probable that he would have been mentioned.

Sir Nicholas Yarburgh also made an entry in 1666, in which he refers to his own son, Richard, a merchant in London, whose elder brother was then aged 27. Clearly this Richard is too young to be identified with the emigrant.

In the 18th century, John Charles Brooke, Somerset Herald of Arms from 1777 to 1794, undertook genealogical work on the above family, the results being lodged in his unofficial private collection. This reveals the existence of a fourth and youngest son for Edmund and Sarah Yarburgh, he being John Yarburgh who died 5 February 1655, aged 24, and who was buried at Bellfries Church, York. Again, no reference is made to any Richard who can be identified with the emigrant.

In the 1930's, extensive work was undertaken on the mediaeval ancestry of Edmund Yarburgh of Bulne Hall. As a result, much of the early part of the 1665/6 pedigree has been discredited. The evidences then collated substantiated the pedigree back to one Germund who was living in 1093. Eustacius de Yarborough does not feature in this more recent registration.

At the Visitation of the county of Lincoln, carried out by the Heralds in 1634, a further pedigree was entered, the same being headed by Charles Yarbrough of Yarbrough in the county of Lincoln, the latter's cousin being Francis, the father of Edmund Yarburgh of Bulne Hall. Although this pedigree covers the period during which Richard Yarburgh, the emigrant, is supposed to have been born, it contains no reference to anyone who can be identified with him.

In the private papers of Arthur Larken, Richmond Herald at the end of the 19th century, I find extensive Yarborough material relating to several families of that surname residing in Lincolnshire, in particular the Yarboroughs of Alvingham and of Covenham St. Mary at the beginning of the 17th century. Neither of these families has any relevant Richard.

The Alvingham Yarboroughs descend from one Thomas Yerburgh or Yarborough, whose will was dated 1565. Later 20th century registration has been effected for the descendants of the brother of this Thomas, namely Richard Yerburgh of Over Poynton in the county of Lincoln, whose will was dated 1545. Again, no relevant Richard is to be found therein.

In the private papers of Sir Alfred Scote Gatty, who was Garter King of Arms from 1904 until 1918, I have found over 300 folios of Yarbrough evidences. Most of this relates to the Middle Ages. Unfortunately, any later material does not include reference to any Richard who might stand as a possible candidate for Richard the emigrant.

In your letter of 11 April, you refer to one Sir William Yarborough who married Ann, the daughter of Edwin Sandys, Archbishop of York. I find no reference to any Sir William in the recognised lists of Knights.

Material relating to the Sandys family shows that the above Ann married Sir William Barn of Woolwich; but no Yarborough connection is noted.

Again, in your letter of 11 April you refer to Richard Yerburgh, aged 22, who married Frances Proctor in 1635, he being then aged 22, and of St. Dunstan's in the West. This possible Richard is rendered less likely by a subsequent entry at St. Dunstan's. This entry concerns the burial of "Frances Yarberrow buryed in ye Chancell from St. Martin's in ye Fields" on 14 May 1680. It seems probable that this burial relates to the Frances Proctor of 7635 marriage, thus making it unlikely that her husband, Richard, had emigrated to Virginia.

You make interesting reference to Edmund Yarroborrow, son of Edmund Yarroborrow "late of York", who subsequent to 1646 was apparently still under age. Again; this man would appear to be just too young to be identified with Edmund Yarbrough, the son of Edmund of Bulne Hall. This Edmund is supposed to be 40 in 1665/6.

In the absence of any immediately relevant material in the College of Arms, I am wondering whether an examination has been made of the Mormon microfiche in an endeavour to see whether any possible baptisms for a Richard, or even an Edmund, can be located. This might then give a lead to a precise stee in this country where specific searches could be made. I am also wondering whether any further information on historial might be forthcoming from Virginia. I understand that the name of his wife remains unknown; but possibly any property is less elusive. Property

was frequently named after places in this country, which thus provides a useful lead. At the moment, it would be possible to undertake wider searches among local and national archives; but these would be correspondingly expensive and there cannot be any guarantee of success. For this reason, anything that might provide a clue as to his place of origin would be extremely helpful.

# WILLIAM K. KULBETH (1765-1835): KNOWN HISTORY:

William K. KULBETH (also GALBREATH & KULBREATH) was born c1765, probably in Virginia.

The married Mary (Polly) ROBINSON c1798, probably in Montgomery County, North Carolina.

Tentage for William K. KULBETH is unknown at this writing.

Mary (Polly) ROBINSON was born in Montgomery County, North Carolina c1780 and was the daughter of Tyree ROBINSON (1738-1815) and Mary (Polly) ADAMS (1740-1833) both born in Virginia.

William & Mary are believed to have lived in Montgomery County, N. C. until about 1806 when they moved to Rhea County, Tennessee with the Robinson, Kirksey, Taylor & Powell families. They were in White County, Illinois by 1816 where William purchased land in the name of his son, John Alexander KULBETH. Illinois census records for 1818 & 1820 indicate as many as ten (10) children in the household by that time.

William & Mary lived in White County, Illinois until about 1823 when they moved to Tipton County, Tennessee. They were located there in the 1830 census. William is presumed to have died in Tipton County by 1835. Mary was located in the 1840 census in Fayette County, Tennessee living next to her son, John. At this time, three other persons, believed to be son, Fanoy and two unidentified temales were living in the household. The KULBETH and related families lived near the town of Braden, located near the Tipton & Fayette County lines.

Mary moved to Nacogdoches County, Texas (prior to 1850) with her daughter, Nancy D. (Mrs Asher BRANCH). Mary died in that county prior to 1870. To date the exact burial places for William & Mary are unknown. No will or administration has been located for either of them.

Census records indicate William & Mary may have had as many as twelve (12) children. Dis possible that some of those believed to be children were in fact grandchildren or daughters or sons in law. Of the children of William & Mary only five (5) have been identified to date:

John Alexander KULBETH: born c1804, probably in Montgomery County, N. C. He married Julia TROUSDALE in Gallatin County, Ill., on 15 April 1827.

Nancy D. KULBETH: born 1807, probably in Tennessee. She married Asher BRANCH in White County, Illinois on 22 April 1822.

Jane P. KULBETH: born 6 Feb 1808, probably in Tenn. She married Edward YARBROUGH in Tipton County, Tenn. on 19 March 1826.

Elizabeth KULBETH: born c1810, probably in Tenn. She married Amaziah TREAT in White County, Illinois on 10 July 1824. Disappeared after 1838.

Cornelius Fanoy KULBETH: born c1819 in White County, Illinois. Married

Mary Ann BEAVER in Fayette County, Tennessee on 26 June 1840. Moved to area of

Drew County, Arkansas prior to 1850. Left many descendants.

Early records indicate this family spelled their surname CULBREATH, KULBREATH, GALBREATH, KILBREATH, etc. The signature of William K. KULBETH was found in 1816 and the spelling was KULBETH. That spelling has not been found on any record earlier than 1816. At this writing it is presumed William K. KULBETH descended from the numerous GALBRAITH families that settled in Virginia and North Carolina in the 1700s. The occupation or exact reabouts of William K. Kulbeth prior to 1816 remains a mystery. It is believed that raised thomoughbred horses and was involved in horse racing. It is believed that William & Mary had at least four sons. If the other two survived it is unknown how they spelled their surname.

#### YARBROUGH FAMILY

Ambrose Yarbrough was born into the Yarbrengh do Bateson family of Yorkshire England in the point 1710, and at the age of 22, he emigrated to the Colony. It seems Ambrose left England not for religious reasonn, economics, or political reasons, but simply because he had to obey his adventurous spirit.

Ambrose went directly to Prince George County, Virginia, in the area that became Amelia County in 1735, and there joined his cousins, the descendants of Richard Yarbrough.

shortly after his arrival in Virginia, Ambrese married a young lady named Mary, his distant cousin. Some are convinced that her maiden name was Yarbrough, others are equally convinced that her maiden name was Mary Mason, but all agree that she was a great grand-daughter of Richard Yarbrough, the first Yarbrough in America who came to the Virginia Colony in 1642.

That Ambrose came directly to his kinsmen in Prince George County tells us that the Yarbrough family in England had maintained contact with their Virginia cousins for the 90 years that Richard's line had been in America.

Richard died in the year 1702 at the age of 87, and was buried on Well's Hill at the Old Blandford Church, at Petersburg, Virginia.

Ambrose and Mary left Amelia County and moved to the "Northern Neck", in the area known as Culpepper County. Ambrose born 1710 and died 1788.

#### YARBROUGH FAMILL

The Yarbrough family is truly one of layette's first families. In the Illinois census of this, teram when Illinois applied for statehood, part of the carbi ough's were living along the Kaskaskia River, in what was then Washington County. By 1820 they had moved up the river and were in Seminary Lownship. The first record of the Yarbrough's in Fayette in 1821.

Proof of descent is usually found in estate lapers or in land records. The only Yarbrough to leave estate papers was Dempsey. If the heirs could agree on a settlement and divide the property amicably, there was no need to file an estate, as probate and attorney fees tended to eat up an estate rapidly.

In those days this did not indicate poverty, the land was there, miles of it, and people made improvements or would live on the government land for years without paying taxes.

The Yarbrough's lived near the Rocky River in the northwest part of Anson County, North Carolina. A near neighbor was Robert Lee. It is balieved from wills of Robert Lee and Jonathan Yarbrough, which survived the fire that Jonathan's wife was Millie (Amelia) Lee, daughter of Robert. It is thought but cannot be proven that Humphrey's wife was Mary Lee, sister of Millie.

We next pick up the trail of the Yarbrough's in Maury Co., Tenn. In the tax lists were the following:

1811--Lee Yarbrough (He next appears in 1820 census of Hickman Co., Tenn. and soon after that in Fayette Co., II.)

1812 -- Solomon, Absalom, and Robert Varbrough.

1813 -- Solomon and Absalom

1815 -- same two.

1816--Absalom. All apparently left xoon after this for Illinois.

These are the Yarbrough's, who may or may not have been brothers, who show up in Fayette County and Clinton County records.

According to the 1963 Surname Index you are doing work on Yarborough and Yarbrough genealogy. I am very much interested in the same. During the last month I have spent over 100 hours in the Texas State Library and Archives and in the University of Texas Library working on Yarborough history. I have depleted all the Yarborough information which available in these places.

Working on my Yarborough family gave me impetus to study the origins of all the Yarboroughs and Yarbroughs in Texas, and consequently I have a large file of all the Yarb(o)roughs which may be found in the above mentioned places. My study is not limited just to Texas Yarb(o)roughs, but includes those from several states: Virginia, the Carolinas, Tennessee, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, and Kentucky.

I am descended from William Yarborough (1760-70 -1840) of Sumter Co., Alabama, born in N.C., moving to Tennessee, and then to Alabama, who had four sons [George C., Richard, William, Jr., and Harvey) and four daughters (Margaret, Mary, Susan, and Temperance) of whom I know. My family's roots in Yarbro go much deeper than my parent's move there in 1906. My fathe, Dan Ross, had arrived in fathe, Dan itos, had arrived in the community known as "Steat Easy" as a 7 year old orphan in 1885. He had gone there to live in the home of his guardian, Jasper Yarbro His brother, Burns, arrived at the same time to live on an adjoin-ing farm with his guardian, Pleas Yarbro

Cattle was an important source of income in 1885, and since my (ather was the oldest child in his guardian's family, he was sent alone to the barn before day to "shuck corn" and put out feed. Because of the danger of fire, he was not permitted to take a lantern

mitted to take a lantern.

One morning when he entered the barn, he heard someone run out. When he reported it, Mr. Yarbro said, "That was just one of the cows," but a 7 year old knew it. was not the sound of an animal's 4 feet.

A few days later, they heard A few days later, they hear a that someone had disappeared over the Ark Mo line it was this ease of getting away that was responsible for the name. "Steal Easy."

In 1885 there were only 13

households in the entire com;

their names, and I studied the 1880 census of Mississippi County in an effort to do that. I know that there were the 2 Yarbro families and some Bunch and Collins families. They were D.J. Ingrum, J.D. Carner, W.R. Jones and Adonia Woods, widow. These early set-Woods, widow. These carry ser-tlers came principally from: Missourl, Tennessee and Ken-tucky Of these early residents, the family of Marmaduke and Fanny Yarbro Bunch holds the record for permanence in the community. They were these community They were there when my father arrived in 1885. and they have grandchildren living there today. Over the years their family has played a prominent role in the life of the

community

When the post office was opened March 22,1900, the community was named Yarbro, and Mr Pleas Yarbro was

the first postmaster.

In my earliest years, 1911 to
1916, Yarbro was at the height
of its industrial development, and was a delightful place to

live. In retrospect, it seems such a dear, safe place

As soon as children could observe a few safety rules, we were free to roam the sawdust pile, business area, bayou bank pile, business area, bayou bank or wherever our fancy led us. Of course, we were all smart! enough to get suttrely off the proad when 2 of the older tecusgers, Herbert Mullins and the Bunch boy raced their, borses on the way to the stores.

Our home, one-fourth mile west of my father's store was located in "the court," a large wooded lot with 3 homes and a boarding house. Buildings in the court lad originally housed aswinil personnel and em-ployees. The sawmill boarding house had not been used for some time and was torn down a few years later. I do not know what year the?

sawmili came, but by 1911, it ran only occasionally. The stave mill, the Yarbro Coo-perage Co, with its 2 long sheds did not close until around 1916. Women could operate the cutters and a few women worked

When I first remember, the larger timber had been taken out, but much land was not cleared. With the condition of the roads and drainage, rural communities in the county were isolated and it was a great time for the country store.

It was also the age of drummers. Most of them came by train and stayed overnight at Mrs. Tharpe's boarding house which was located just accross the tracks from the Frisco sta-tion. Will Pyles from the' Arkansas Grocery Co. in Blytheville came by buggy.

My first 4 years, we lived a next door to Mrs. Tharpe, and a familiar sound was her hand bell calling boarders to their meals. One of the drummers was disturbed about her beds was disturbed about her beca-mend asked my father about them. I heard my mother ex-plain that Mrs. Therpe's sheets the were nice and clean. They were not white because they were , è made of unbleached muslin.

There were 3 main stores, my father's firm, Winer and Ross, Uncle Sam Thompson's store My father, my sister and I standing near my father's store, Winer Thompson was not my uncle, and Ross Mercantile.

munity. I wish I could supply their various and the Tom Smith store. Mr. Thompson was not my uncle, but everyone called him "Uncle Sam" 'Mr. Smith was a son-in-law of Mr. Pleas Yarbro The Smith and Thompson stores had living quarters above them. My father's store had a high celling and a balcony. A so small office had been cut from the front of out store's long storage room and Dr E V. Hill occupied that space . It was necessary for Dr Hill to keep his medicines in his office, and targe bottles filled his shelves

"Most of my father's mer-chandise came in by freight train (Because I was a small child at that time, I report only about his firm ) Flour, largely in harrels, came in freight that were switched on the bro siding for unloading. Other foods, stands of lard, sugar. etc, came in huge containers. Big families were the rule at that time and customers came from a wide trading area that reached out to surrounding communities and to residents across the Missouri line

Buggies, surries and wagons came in car-load lots and were begunder the stave shed. In the stave shed. those orders, a two-wheel

pony cart for children was in-cluded. It had a wicker seat and was pulled by our pony
Our favorite horse, Bruce,

was from the Bruce stables in Memphis and if the Blytheville Memphis and if the Blytheville band were playing whon we came to town, he pranced and kept time to the music Our borse and buggy were left at the Tom Jackson Livery Stable on Haltroad and Walnut. Years later, Sullivan Nelson Chevrolet Co. was located there, and when I took my car in for repairs, I recalled pleas-

antly my early days there with my parents at Tom Jackson's Yarbro had at that time, in addition to the grocery and general merchandise stores, a general merchandise atores, a post office, a barber shop, a restaurant, a pool hall, a Frisco Station, a blacksmith shop, a boarding house, a stave mill, a Methodist Church, a school, two gins, and by 1912, a bank The bank was in a new brick

building located just west of my father's store, and Yarbro's most eligible bachelors, Jake and Alvin Huffman were in charge there

The Huffman's had the distinction of having Yurbro's first car. Dr. Hill had the second car, one of the early Fords with the brass strip across the early cars caused much excitement among children and animals and I experienced a buggy runaway when the horse became excited

The post offfice was in Uncle Sam Thompson's store, and we would say, "We're going to Un-cle Sam's for the mail." I never thought until recently how ap-

The stave mill sheds, which were slightly longer than a quarter mile in length, were located a short distance from the business district, which was near the railroad; however, the business district faced the main road. In earlier Yarbro, all businesses had faced the railroad. By 1910, families lived In those vacant store buildings, and a family lived in the build-

and a family lived in the build-ing that had housed the pool half in sawmill days. Before the railroad came, buildings faced the road which followed the bayou

At that line, one or two-room white frame school buildings dotted the Arkansas landscape, for every rural community had a school 'Yarbro had the distinction of being the only rural school in the county that

had a 9-month undivided term. Even today, people look at me ; with disbelief when I say, "But we didn't have summer terms 🕏

Until 1918, our school was a two-room white frame building and school elections were always exciting times, for we had 2 factions. You were for or against a divided term. My older sister entered school in 1911, and from that time until Yarbro became a part of the Blytheville system in 1942. there was only one summer

In the midst of all my peace-ful isolation, in the late summer of 1911, F began to be aware of national negative when my father read that the dark horse, Woodrow Wilson had won the Democratic nomination for president The news butch on the train had held back his last paper for Yarbro, and when my lather appeared at the train window, he said, "I knew you'd be here!"

One of my favorite election stories happened before I can remember Drinks had flowed rather freely that year, and as one of the older men was reel-ing down the stairs from an upstairs polling booth, he an-nounced, "I voted for John Lovell, but don't you tell Dan Ross!"

Because we lived in an overflow area, all buildings were erected some distance off the ground and all the stores had porches that were covered

Both my parents had experienced floods; however my mother had grown up on her family's Sawyer farm just east of Blytheville and her Great-grandfather Sawyer must have had an almost uncamy eye for ridges, for as a child, she had seen the water as it moved on their land, but it always stopped at the edge of her laws and orchard.

There was a high spot called Buck Horn in the Yarbro com-munity where cattle had been driven in times of overflow in the early years. There was another ridge a few miles over the Missouri line where cattle had been driven, and it was fit-tingly referred to as "Tallow Ridge" In 1912, there was great


danger of a flood and a break in the levee, and men throughout the county walked the levee in relays at night I recall the night that my father and Mr. Jake Huffman took their turn. My mother had made prepara-tions for taking up floor cover-ings quickly, and we had a new row boat that the children in my family enjoyed using later in shallow ditches

I recall with pleasure thes quiet years preceding World War I.







#### THE YARRROUGH FAMILY

The Yarbrough family has been closely associated with the Watkins family for many generations. We feel the watkins genealogy will not be complete without a few fact; in regards to the Yarbrough family.

As certified by Mr. Wagner, a Herald of the College of A ms, London, England. "The Yarbrough line goes back to 853 A.D. when 'Germund' was the first of the line recorded; Eustacius helped William the Conqueror in the formation of his government in 1066. The house was rewarded by a title; Lord Alvingham (Guy Yarbrough) is titular head of the family today." He declared the "Richard Yarbrough, the immigrant was a member of the above family and came to the Virginia Colony in 1642." Richard died in 1702 and is buried at Cld Blandford Cemetery, near Petersburg, Virginia. (Wm. & Mary Quarterly, Vol. 5 page 233 April 1897).

Richard"s Great grandson, Manoah Yarbrough (son c. Zachariah) was born 1770 in North Carolina, married 16 August 1799 Mary Cunningham, born 12 November 1778, died 24 July 1840, daughter of Joseph Cunningham, born 1738, died 1805. and his wife Ann Burtin, Born 1742, died 1803. Joseph Cunningham was a Revolutionary Soldier.

Manoah and Mary (Cunningham) Yarbrough left their ancestral home in Rowan County, North Carolina in 1822 and made their way west to St. Clair County, Alabama. In 1825 they built a large colonial home, which is still standing coday. This home is still owned by descendants of the builder Miss Clizabeth Yarbrough, who has cherished her ancestral home and records for years and years, and her brother, John Live in this lovely old mansion in Ashville, Alabama.

Among the children of Manoah and Mary was Littleton, born 27 July 1802, who married 7 April 1825 Nancy Ashcraft, the daughter of Drury and Nancy (Baker) Ashcraft. Drury afather, Jdyn Ashcraft died in South Carolina in 1815.

Item 6th, to my son Edward 50 acres of land and a negro man named Peter, and one feather bed and furniture and a chest which was his mother's.

Item 7. to my son Samuel 50 acres, feather hed and furniture and one large chest, and my riding

mare, saddle and bridle, etc.

item 9, to my daughter Sarah a bed filled with feathers, one chest and drawer, and one seal skin trunk, and 5 pounds current money or goods from a store, and ele., and also her mother's horse, saddle and bridle.

item 10. to my daughter Mary Dickson, one feather hed, a pair of blankets, my desk and all that is

in the desk, etc. Cattle, sheep, hogs, etc., equally divided, etc.

My loving sons Abraham, Edward and Samuel my whole and sole executors, etc.

#### Oliver Family, of Elbert County, Ga.

JOHNI OLIVER, planter, was living in 1647, in the parish of Hampton, York county, Va., when he made an acknowledgment to Denius Stevens, merchant, of a debt of 1030 pounds tobacco. In 1648, he, with James Besouth, Francis Flood and Thomas Shaw inventoried the estate of John Hartwell, of Queens treek, deceased. In 1659 he sold to Major Joseph Croshaw a tract of land called "St. Andrews Neck," signing "John Oliver, his [seal]."—York Records.

THOMAS OLIVER (1743) had a negro adjudged 12 years old.

In 1719 Richard Oliver and wife, Sarah, of Antigaa, son and heir of the Hon. Richard Oliver of Antigna, appointed an attorney to take charge of their property in Virginia, "late the estate of Richard Oliver, deceased." — York Records.

JOHN<sup>2</sup> Oliver had sons Thomas<sup>3</sup> and Peter<sup>3</sup>. If others, it is not known. Peter Oliver (or, as some of the descendants say, Thomas<sup>3</sup> Oliver) marked Anne, daughter of Florance McCartie, of Bruton parish, York county, Va., born 25th June, 1706, (see McCarty

Family).

The unusual masculine name of Florance is repeated often in the Muskerry line of the great McCarthy family, of Ireland (of which was also the Earl of Clancarty, and the Lord of Mount Cashel, titles now extinct). Through their intermarriage with the old Munster royal line of O'Donoghues, the name of Florance is remotely traced also into that family — (Burke.) Florance McCarty, of the Clodane, and Drishane, county Cork, line, whose daughter, Joan, married John Marshall (whose father, Thomas Marshall, came to Ireland in the expedition of Sir John Wilmot, 1602) was of this Musk cry line (Burke), and some of his Marshall descendants are also in America. Justin MacCartie (as he, himself, spells it), b. 1816, of Castle Carrignavar, county Cork, the great parliamentarian, anti-Parnellite, and author, is now the chief of his name in Ireland, and representative of the oldest existing branch of the once sovereign house of MacCartie (as is also claimed for Justin McCarthy, of St. Paul, Minn., in the United States).

Note. So far, we have positive knowledge only of Dionysus, Francis, Mary Ann and Eleanor-Correspondence is being earnestly prosecuted to complete the other lines. It is reasonable to assume that most of these located on the south side of the James river, before scattering in the far South and

Many of the names are mentioned in the old county records, and church registers, or flese counties,

in South Carolina (1805) Susan Jackson (relative of Governor Jackson), and had one son. He removed from Virginia, through South Carolina, to Elbert county, Ga. (then a part of Wilks county), where he served in the Revolution as captain of a Privateer, and also with General Lincoln at the sieges of Savannah and Augusta, was in the battles of King's Mountain and Kettle Creek, in Wilks county. It is said he also served with General Marion. He was captured by the British and, many years after, would relate to his grandchildren the hardships he, and his family of young children, then endured. His home place, says his grandson, Dr. James Oliver, was in Elbert county, on Beaver Dam creek, near "Stenchcomb Meeting House," where he died and was buried. Another grandson, Wm. T. O. Cook, of Georgia (yet living, 1898, at the age of 90), says he had a place in Wilks county, on the south side of Broad river, in the flatwoods, about three and a quarter miles above the mouth of Wahatchee creek. These lands were afterward owned by his sons, Peter and Rev. Florance McCarthy Oliver. There was a fort near by, called the "Block House" (now Washington), to which the people fled when attacked by Tories and Indians. When the men and boys, and their negro slaves, went to their work they carried gans lashed to their backs, even when ploughing. Wilks county began to be settled in 1770, when the Indian line of frontier was thrown farther out. "The young wite." continues her grandson, "was large and handsome, and gifted with great courage, and generally softened the hardships of her little family by playing to them spirited airs on the violin, of which she was the complete mistress, often dancing to its accompaniment, to the no small delight of her youthful andrence. Such was the Nerre of the Women of the Revolution."

In an old minute book (bound in untanned bog's skin and yet preserved in Wilke's county, Ga.), of the revolutionary proceedings of 1779, in "the proceedings of the court, which met at the house of Jacob McLendou, Sr.," about thereon indes from Heards Fort (now Washington), on the 25th of August, 1779, during which, after a summary trial, nine Tories were declared guilty, and hung in ten days after. Wilks county had neither court house nor juil at the time, and prisoners had to be closely guarded, and all able-bodied men were needed for the common defence, and judges did not feel they could waste the time of men who were auxious to serve their country. In guarding those who had sided with the British, Tories and Indians, in murders, pillage and arson. The nine Tories hung were, John Bennefield, James Mobley, Dread Wilder, Joshua Rials, Clement Yarbrough, Edmond Dormey, John Watkins, Win. Crut difield, and John Younge.

At the time, Savannah was in the hands of the British, and raiding parties of Tories and Indians disturbed the interior as far up as Augusta, and the people gave short shrift to the murderers when caught

The Council had fled from Augusta, and established the State government, for a short time, in Wilks county, about six miles north of the site of Washington, and
