Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

Elijah, a bold horseman, had gone out town looking for some stray horses, when came upon horseback riders. Being ne sighted, he thought they were neighbors, I as he drew nearer, he realized they we Indians. They made a run at him, and whirled his horse around and started town. He was riding one of his best horses. jumped a 21-foot guich which ran into t Bonita Creek; the Indian ponies balked at I guich. One Indian got close enough to she two arrows into his hip and one into saddle; but he outran them, and reach town, where several men were stand around. They removed the arrows, and Ell recovered. This incident took place in 186

Lorenzo Dow Yarbrough

Lorenzo Dow Yarbrough was born January 1840, probably in Houston Co., TX, the son of John Swanson, Sr. and Cynthia Unknown Yarbrough. Dow, as his family and friends called him, was known to have lived with his family in Houston, Gonzales, Atascosa, and McMullen Counties, Texas. He very likely attended school in Gonzales County with his sister Mandy and stepbrother's Jim Tope and John Moore.

About 1858 when Dow was 19 years old he moved to McMullen from Atascosa County with his family. They settled on a bend of the Frio River with about 30 other families. This was the first settlement of McMullen County and was named Yarbrough Bend after Dow's father Swanson Yarbrough. He lived there for about three years, until 1861, when he enlisted in the Confederate States Army at Fort Brown, Brownsville, Texas on 23 September. He served first in Captain William G. Gobin's Company, 2nd Regiment, Texas Mounted Rifles, stationed at Helena. He was then transferred to Company K, 2nd Texas Cavalry, under Captain John Donaldson. He is found to be listed on the 2nd Reg't Texas Mounted Rifles Rolls for years 1861 and 1862 and 2nd Reg't Texas Calvary Rolls for the years 1863, 1864, & 1865. Notes on the rolls say that the 2nd Regiment Texas Calvary was also known as the 2nd Regiment Texas Mounted Rifles. The Second Texas Cavalry was originally organized in the spring of 1861 under designation of the Second Texas Mounted Rifles. It was reorganized with all the same officers and enlisted men and at that time it was redesignated the Second Texas Cavalry. Dow appeared on a list of killed and wounded, in an engagement on the Nueces River, near Fort Clark Texas, August 10, 1862, as having a wound in the left hip, a wound that would continue to give him trouble until his death.

He was home on furlough in 1863, when on November 30, he married, in Live Oak County, Miss Nancy Parilee White. She was born on August 28, 1848 in Leon County, Texas, daughter of Headley Coburn "Henry" White and Lydia Wright.

Dow and Nancy are known to have lived in McMullen County, TX where it is expected that most or perhaps all of their children were born. Dow bought a lot of land in block # 36 in the town of Tilden from James Lowe and wife M. J. Lowe in Tilden, McMullen Co., Texas on 16 day of July 1884.

Nine known children were born to Dow and Nancy:

(1) Selitha Y. Yarbrough was born December 1864, married December 27, 1883, McMullen County to Samuel H. Ratcliff.

(2) John Swanson Yarbrough born March 12, 1866 near Tilden, McMullen Co., TX, married Jane "Janie" Louise Crawford on May 14, 1891 in Corizzo Springs, Dimmit Co., TX.

"Family Tradition" from my grandmother Carmen has also stated that around 1901 Dow and Nancy traveled by wagon train to New Mexico somewhere around Eddy County to see about a homestead from New Mexico, but returned, shortly after, back to Texas. We do know that Alevia did travel to New Mexico and circa 1902 married Pete Blakeney in Eddy County, NM, and raised her family there, but it is not exactly known if she was with her parents when she went.

Dow Yarbrough filed for his Civil War pension June 28, 1906. Dow states that he is 67 years old, he resides in McMullen County and has lived in Tilden for 40 years. He is not working at the time and his physical condition is not good. He states he suffers from old age and that he was shot during the war in the leg. He also states that he enlisted in 1861 and served until the close of the war. He states he owns 1 mule worth \$50., 1 horse worth \$50., and 1 wagon worth \$25. It appears that this was a long drawn out process where many Affidavits were taken. Notable affidavits were taken from Daniel T. Winters of Big Foot, Frio Co., TX and Jas. H. Tope of McMullen Co., TX to help prove that Dow actually served in the Civil War. Dow's civil war pension was finally approved on March 25, 1907, more than 2 months after his death.

Dow Yarbrough died January 5, 1907 and his grave is marked with a civil war military stone. Nancy White purchased a home from Bettie Davenport on March 11, 1908 in the town of Cotulla, TX county of LaSalle. Nancy died December 2, 1931 and was buried without a headstone. They are both buried in the Old Cotulla cemetery in Cotulla, Texas. Their son and daughter n law, John Swanson & Janie (Crawford) Yarbrough, and son Dave Yarbrough are also buried on the same row without headstones.

Dow Yarbrough was born in Houston County, Texas, in 1839, the son of John Swanson Yarbrough Sr. and came with him to Yarbrough Bend, McMullen County, when he was nineteen years old. He lived there for three years, until 1861, when he enlisted in the Confederate States Army at Fort Brown, Brownsville, and was in Company K, 2nd Texas Cavalry, under Captain John Donaldson. He appeared on a list of killed and wounded, in an engagement on the Nueces River, near Fort Clark Texas, August 10, 1862, as having a wound, in the left hip. He was transferred to Captain William G. Tobin's Company, 2nd Regiment, Texas Mounted Rifles, stationed at Helena.

He was home on furlough in 1863, when, on November 30, he married, in Live Oak County, Miss Nancy Parilee White. She was born in 1848 in Leon County, Texas, the daughter of Henry and Lidia.Wright White.

Edna, Texas. He is believed to have had a grist mill at Texana. While there, he enlisted in the Confederate Army. He was a private in Company B of the 24th. Brigade. After his service in the war, they brought him home in a wagon and he remained sick for a good while afterwards. J.B. "Jess," Jr. was born at Texana on December 31, 1862. John Lemuel was born February 7, 1865 at McLennan County while J.B. and Fannie were there to pay her father's taxes.

After the Civil War the Edwardses moved to Karnes County. There he made crude furniture, chairs with deer hide seats, and the like. While there, three more children were born into the family: Viola was born May 18, 1867; George Washington was born January 9, 1869 and Ann "Annie" Elizabeth was born on October 25, 1870.

From Karnes County they moved to a place on Salado Creek, then just east of San Rice, had a farm there. The last two Edwards children were born east of San Antonio: David Wesley was born May 21, 1874, and Margaret "Mag" Louisa was born on July 12, 1876.

In the fall of 1876, the Edwardses moved to Pipe Creek. They lived out of their wagon and a ten't until their house was built, according to Candas. The Indians had already left the Pipe Creek area though the last person killed by Indians in Bandera County was killed in the west part of the county that year. The railroads had not reached San Antonio, and the present Texas State capited had not yet been built. It would be built by Governor Oran M. Roberts, to whom, J.B.'s cousin, Frances Wyckliffe Edwards, was married.

J.B. and Fannie's house has a separate kitchen made of rock to protect the house from burning. The house was on the north from the creek and one mile upstream from the creek and one mile upstream from where Highway 46 crosses the creek. The house was also about 50 yards southwest of the present James F. Mayhew home. The water had to be carried to the house from the spring in the creek, which is now covered by a lake. One day while plowing in the field across the creek, the Edwards's son, George, plowed up the remains of an Indian. Their house was built in the fall of 1876 and was torn down around 1909 when the McBride family built a new ranch house farther from the creek.

J.B. enjoyed hunting even though it was a necessity. He taught all his boys to be good hunters. Later in life, he became a layman preacher for the Free Methodist Church, of which he and his wife were both members. J.B. passed away at the home of his daughter. Bertha Alsbury, east of San Antonio, on March 1, 1899, after he had been hunting on Rosillo Creek. After his death, Fannie sold her property to her son, George, and went to live with her son, Jess. She would often go for short stays with her other children. Fannie did not mind walking and would occasionally walk several miles to visit with a neighbor or one of the children, if a ride was not available. She was always ready to help with the cooking as she loved to cook. During her lifetime, Fannie saw a number of technical advances. She went from hiding from the Indians to riding in automobiles, home telephones and the beginning of airplane flights. Fannie died at Pipe Creek at the home of her son, John, on July 14, 1917.

In all, the Edwardses had 12 children. Only four remained in Pipe Creek: Jess and John, who married Scott sisters, Candas and Minnie respectively; George who married Lucy Jane Callahan; and Annie who married Frank J. McCarthy, Jr. Four moved to San Antonio or nearby: Sarah married Lee Little and lived in the Sayers community; Bertha married Tom Alsbury and lived on Rosillo Creek south of the highway to Victoria; Bill married Viola Rosenfield and last lived at 103 El Fleda; and Viola married Jeff Barnes and lives at 610 Day Avenue. The other children were married more than once: Clint first married Louise Hasson and lived in Dewitt County, and second married Betty Yarbough and lived last on 200 West Frio Street in Uvalde: Fannie first married Newton Jasper Merritt and lived on Red Bluff Creek at Pipe Creek, and second married Frank France and moved around a great deal, third married Frank H. Hand and lived on North Little Creek west of Tarpley, then to Boerne, and finally to Bracketville; and last married Archie Cox and lived at Brackettville; Wesley first married Ida Brister and lived at Asherton and second married Charlene Bond and lived at Fort Worth; and Mag first married Henry Martin and lived possibly near Helotes, and second married Jim Hux and lived at 4732 Lennox in Inglewood, California.

J.B. and Fannie had 110 grandchildren, of which twenty five are still living at the time this book is being prepared.

EDWARDS, THOMAS CLINTON F168

Thomas "Clint" Clinton Edwards, Sr. was born November 15, 1854 at Houston County, Texas. His first marriage was on May 18, 1876 at Clinton, Dewitt County, Texas to May "Louise" Louisa Hasson, who was born around 1853 in Texas. Clint was probably born near the Augusta community where his parents, J.B. and Fannie Rice Edwards, had property. Louise's parents were Isaac and Matilda Hasson.

Clint and Louise homesteaded 160 acres on Red Bluff Creek five miles east of Pipe Creek in the fall of 1876. Their property was near his father's homestead. After 1880, they moved to Dewitt County, Texas. They had five children: Thomas Clinton, Jr. who was born at Pipe Creek and married Texana Talley and lived at Seguin; Angelina "Mag" was born at Pipe Creek and married Dick "D.E." Eugene Shawn and lived in Houston; Frances "Fannie" M. married Texana Talley's brother, Texas T. Talley, and lived in Seguin; Roxanna married Stephen Blakeney and lived at Runge, Texas; and Marie who died at birth along with her mother, Louise, at Cuero, Texas. Louise and Marie died around 1891 and are both buried at Cuero.

According to Betty Bingham of Uvalde, Clint's second marriage was on May 15, 1888 at Tilden, Texas to Betty Ann Yarbrough who was born August 3, 1869 at Tilden. Her parents were L. Dowell Yarbrough and Nancy White. Clint was a very good hunter, and hunted for the government near Sanderson for a while. Clint and Betty also lived at Reagan Wells north of Uvalde and at Asherton for some time. When they moved they would load their belongings into their wagon and drive their livestock along with them down the road. Clint was a quick worker. He could cut as many mesquite posts in a little more than a half of a day than it took all day for others to cut. When he was old he had a stroke and fell to the floor and knocked his shoulder out of place. The doctors did not learn of this in time, causing him a great deal of pain for the balance of his life, because his shoulder could not be put back in place.

They had nine children, listed as follows in the order of their ages from the oldest to youngest: William "Bill" Clinton who married Cora Lee and whose maiden name cannot be remembered and they lived at Phoenix, Arizona; Margaret "Maggie" Susan who married Henry Baylor Cummings and ran the general store at Reagan Wells; Nancy "Nannie" who married Asa Hoxey Hearne. Sr. and lived at Carrizo Springs; Lela Bell who married Charles "Charley" Wesley Tollett and lived at Carrizo Springs; Jimmie who first married Edward "Ed" Schaefer and lived at La Pryor, and second married William "Bill" Petry Tollett who also lived at La Pryor; Mattie Angie who first married Benjamin "Ben" Edward Brown and lived at Uvalde, and second married Raymond Ollie Elliott and lived at Dallas; Jesse "J.B." Berthal who married Elinor "Billie" Schultz and lived at Alice where he was killed in an oil accident; Betty Ann who first married George Wesley Kasler and lived at Uvalde, and second married Marion Harold Bingham also of Uvalde; and Joseph "Joe" Lorenzo who did not marry and lived at Carrizo Springs.

Clint and Betty last lived at 200 West Frio Street in Uvalde. Clint died October 15, 1938 at Uvalde and is buried at Asherton. Betty died October 25, 1949 at Uvalde where she is buried.

TENNESSEANS IN TEXAS

"<u>A Memorial And Biographical History of Johnson And Hill Counties</u>, <u>Texas</u>" published by The Lewis Publishing Co., Chicago, 1892)

This series of abstracts began in 1965 when Miss Mildred Dulaney of the Fort Worth Public Library went through the volume of material for McLennan, Falls, Bell and (Myel) counties, Texas, and photostated all biographical sketches mentioning Temesseans. The abstracts from that volume were completed in 1966.

We see again indebted to Miss Dulaney who has now sent photostats of similar sketches from the Johnson and Hill counties, Texas, volume, so that we are able to continue the series.

JESSE M. HILI - Among the many citizens of the South who were loyal to their connictions in the face of the horrors of war, was Jesse M. Hill, whose history is sutlined briefly as follows: He was born in McMinn county, Tennessee, January 15, 1839, and is a son of James and Elizabeth (Mayfield) Hill, natives of South Carolina. (p 185)

FILIP WALKER - One of the oldest settlers of the eastern part of Johnson County, lexas, was born in Chester district, South Carolina in 1815, to James and Martha (Telford) Walker, the former of whom was of Irish descent, and was also born in Chester district. He was a tiller of the soil. About 1821 James Walker removed with his family to Madison County, Alabama, two years later to Jackson County, two or three years were spent in Pickens County, six years in Chickasaw County, Mississippi, one year later in Shelby County the parents were called from life, both iving in 1845. In 1834, Philip Walker left home, came to Texas in the spring of 1835. In 1836 while at St. Augustine he enlisted for the Mexican service under Captain William Ratcliffe. After three months active service he received his discharge, in July, and returned to St. Augustine. In 1839, he removed to Shelby County and purchased a headright of 1,400 acres. In 1845, Philip Walker was married to Elizabeth, daughter of Job and Elizabeth (Landrum) Cooper of Tennessee. children: Martha Ann, wife of John C. Lockett, both dead, three children surviving them; Solon S., a farmer and stockman of Stephens County, married to Clemence Hill, seven children; Sarah Jane wife of William A. Clack, preacher, farmer and blackwith of Stephens County, and is the mother of three children; James H. a larmer and school teacher of Fisher County, married J. Gathen and has four children; and J. Effie F. married Dr. James Dodson, practicing physician of Newberry, has one child. In 1855, Mr. Walker came to Johnson County. During the Civil War he furnished rany horses to the Confederate Army, also beef, blankets, shoes and guns. The first Mrs. Walker died in 1867 at the age of forty years, and in November 1874 he was married to Eleanor Laney, a native of North Carolina and widow of Squire Stephens. to children by second wife. (p 197-8)

P. J. NORWOOD, of Cleburne, Johnson County, is son of St. Clair and Catherine J. Norwood The father was born and reared in Blount County, Tennessee. The mother is a daughter of Peter Hoodenpyle, one of the first settlers of Sequachee Valley, East "ennessee. Peter J. Norwood, one of six children, was born in Pikeville, iledsone County, Tennessee, Oct. 3, 1842. He entered the Confederate Army in August 1601, enlisting in Colone! Henry Ashby's Tennessee Regiment of Cavalry, began his service in East Tennessee and Kentucky, near Cumberland Gap. He was in the fight at Fishing Creek, later at Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge and Lookout Nountain. Went down to Jonesboro, Georgia; was with Hood on his return into Tennessee, and after the dispersion of his forces at Nashville was part of a deitachment that made its way to the Eastern Army, then in North Carolina. He served watil the genera. surrender, was a private throughout, captured but once, held only

THE WALKER FAMILY Joseph and Amanda

Joe had been a widower for about four years in 1864, when he first began to notice seventeen year old Amanda Yarbrough was interested in the presence of his company. She had grown into a very attractive young lady with black hair, dark brown eyes, and olive complexion.

Her mother, Frances Coker Yarbrough tried to discourage the courtship as Joe was twenty eight years older than Mandy. Since 1862 when her husband, John Swanson Yarbrough Sr., was killed in the corral by their house the responsibility of rearing a fifteen year old girl was left to her. For two years Frances can their place with only her. daughter to help her. Two sons, John Moore and James Tope, with her step-son, Lorenzo Dow Yarbrough, jeined the Texas Confederate Army and fought for the South in the War Between the. States.

In 1860 Mary Walker died in Pleasanton and is buried in the old Pleasanton Cemetery. Her grave site is near the grave of her oldest child, Martha Jane Oden, who died in Pleasanton in 1863.

Exactly what year Joseph Walker and famity moved into McMullen County is not known, but there are many records of Joseph's activities in Atascosa County.

The second marriage of Joseph Walker to Amanda Arminda Yarbrough, on May 2, 1864, in Pleasanton, united two pioneer Texas families. Amanda, born on October 26, 1846, in Crockett, Houston County, Texas, was the daughter of John Swanson Yarbrough, 1777-1862, (for whom Yarbrough Bend in McMullen County was named) and

his third wife, Frances Coker (Moore, Tope) arbrough, 1813-1868.

Joe was twenty-eight years older than Mandy, but they were happily married for wenty-four years before his death on June 18, 1888. Even with their trials and hardships, with the Reconstruction after the Civil War, Mexican bandit attacks, and hostile Indian raids, and despite threats from bands of putlaws and cattle rustlers, they survived and prospered. They lived in McMullen and Atascosa Counties where their twelve children were born.

Six children were born at Yarbrough Bend: Melvina Walker (1865-1955) married Francis Middleton Franklin; Joseph Henry Walker Jr. (1866-1933) married Leonora Franklin; Infant (ca. 1868); Jerome McCowen Walker (1869-1960) married Susan Irene Talley; Rebecca Eysile Walker (1871-1938) married Thomas Edward Scogin; and Virginia Alice Walker (1874-1880) died young.

Four children were born in Tilden: Arminda Alma (Minnie) Walker, 1876-1967, married John Edward Mulholland. Myrtle Leonora (Nora) Walker, 1878-1964, married Thomas Robert Kuykendall. Ida Lucy Walker, 1881-1947, married John Hardy McAda. Curtis Lee Walker, 1881-1963, married (1) Lola Quintinilla, (2) Mary Toudouze. Ida Lucy and Curtis Lee were twins.

Two children were born in Atascosa County: William Carroll Walker, 1884-1963, married Amelia Eliza (Amye) Teal. Thomas Hardee Walker, 1887-1957, married Hertha Upton.

Joseph Walker is in the Record of the Marks and Brands of Atascosa County in 1859, and from that time until the late 1880's he owned cattle and land in Atascosa and McMullen Counties. James Emory Walton and Ella Addison Wilcox were married on September 18, 1900, in Conway, Arkansas. Ten children were born to this couple. Five are deceased. There are two babies buried in Rose Hill Cemetery at Wapanucka, Oklahoma; Emory in Graham, Texas; and Edgar and Thelma in the City Cemetery of Jourdanton, Texas.

Mr. Walton was a merchant in Wapanucka, Oklahoma as well as a director of a bank, a Mason, and active in farming and numerous civic activities.

The five living children of J.E. and Ella Walton are: Wayne, Ann, and Enoyse, all residents of Jourdanton, Texas; Mary Edith of Lawton, Oklahoma; and Mardie of Spartanburg, South Carolina.

So that the older children could continue their education in Oklahoma Baptist University located at Shawnee, Oklahoma, the famlly moved to Shawnee in 1920. Six of the children attended Oklahoma Baptist University, and now two members of the third generation are enrolled in that University.

Mr. Walton was a merchant in Shawnee, Oklahoma for ten years, then moved to Texas in 1930, and to Jourdanton in 1932. He led **a** very active civic life as he was vice-president of the Jourdanton State Bank when it was organized in 1942. He also served as a member of the Jourdanton School Board and an election judge. He was a farmer and engaged in the oil business.

Since he was a deacon in the Baptist Church in Wapanucka, Oklahoma, and in Shawnee, Oklahoma, when he came to Jourdanton he served in that capacity in Jourdanton also. His two sons, Emory and Edgar, were also deacons. He served as Sunday School Superintendent and treasurer of the First Baptist Church in Jourdanton, Texas. Mrs. Ella Walton was a loving and caring Christian mother and taught the family to love each other and to be proud of their heritage.

Honors came to this family, as Thelma (Mrs. Frank Bender), was the "Woman of the Year" in the mid-thirtles. Ann was awarded outstanding primary teacher of Texas in 1968. Enoyse's son is now H.E.B.'s private pilot, and Mardie has a son-in-law and grandson who are ordained Southern Baptist ministers. Mary Edith's son-In-law works on nuclear projects in Los Alamos, New Mexico.

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the only friends present as the couple had eloped. After the wedding they returned to Yarbrough

Bend to twenty four years of happy married life. Mandy adjusted well in the familiar surroundings as she was already well trained in the ways of

frontier life. She took over her duties willingly, and with love, as step-mother to Joe's five children still at home. Josephine (Presh) was sixteen years old; James, (Bud) fourteen; Thomas, eleven; Callie nine; and Mary was four and one-half. They called her "Aunt Mandy".

It was the last year of the Civil War and many necessities were difficult to come by, and, if found, were very expensive to buy. Coffee was a dollar a pound, so a type of coffee was made out of sweet potatoes, acrons, or corn, with honey as the sweetner, but there was always plenty of milk, butter, and eggs to help them get by.

With the end of the war the stress of reconstruction was felt by all Texans, but as these early settlers were reconciled to hardships, and denials of many necessities, they may have been able to adjust better than some of the other settlers.

Joe continued to add to his herds of cattle and horses, but due to droughts and the range being more heavily grazed, he had to move the herd around to different locations. One time he went as far as the coast. While he was there he met a sea captain who had landed for fresh water and supplies. Joe traded one of his horses to the captain for a barrel of whiskey. When he returned home he found the horse he had traded had thrown his hobbles and was home ahead of him.

There were still the every day threats of outlaws, rustlers, bandits and hostile Indians. Once when an Indian raid was expected, Mandy baked a big supply of bread so they wouldn't have to have a fire for several days and the men would have bread to take with them if they went to chase the Indians.

One time Joe sold some cattle and there being no bank in which to deposit the money they had to hide it. Mandy dug a hole in the kitchen floor, put the money in a sock and covered it with dirt. She rolled the flour barrel over it, determined the Indians would not find their money.

In the spring the men and older boys would travel for days at a time rounding up the cattle. The women and children would stay at one place whenever possible, Joe told Mandy he was always worried on his return home until the cabin was in sight. He was relieved to see that it hadn't been burned to the ground and his family gone.

Neighbors would ge riding up at break-neck speed shouting, "The woods are full of Indians", when they had been seen in the vicinity. Joe would join a group of men and go out in search of them; Mandy would grab what food was handy, some drinking water, and a few quilts to wrap up in if it was cold, as they didn't dare build a fire. They would take a gun and hide out in the thicket until Joe returned. She, Callie, Mary and the baby Melvina, born June 23, 1865, had another plan. If the Indians started their way, they would run to the bluff by the river. The big problem in those days was how to keep the children and babies quiet. She was afraid if they were found she would be killed and the children taken far away.

Joseph Henry Walker, Jr. (Buddy) was born November 8, 1866. It is believed their infant buried in the Yarbrough Bend Cemetery was stillborn about 1868, the same year Mandy's mother, Frances, died and is buried there beside her.

Jerome McCowen Walker was born September 20, 1869 and was named for relatives from South Carolina. His father always called him "Roamie".

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Mandy was known as an excellent midwife and nurse, as she had learned from her mother, and delivered many babies in the county. She used many of the same herbs and remedies as Frances, such as creosote and horehound for coughs and sore throats, poultice packs on the chest, oil of camphor for toothaches and sores, and castor oil for a variety of ailments. Two bottles with whiskey were always on hand for medicinal purposes; one had blocks of camphor added and the other was mixed with asifidity.

There was a child who was ill and the parents sent for her to come to their home. She saddled her horse, packed her medicinal supplies, and loaded her 45 pistol, which she always wore in a gun belt around her waist whenever she left the cabin. On the way, as she was about to go under a tree, she heard a noise and looked up to see a panther. As she stopped her horse, she quickly drew her pistol and shot her second panther.

October 28, 1871, Rebecca Eysile (Beckie) was born, and on May 31, 1874, Virginia Alice was the last child born at Yarbrough Bend.

In 1875 they moved to Dog Town to a house west of the town. Joe opened a general store in a large, new building in the southern part of the town. Later the post office was located in a corner of the room. He advertised "A person can buy anything from a square nail to a keg of whiskey". A short time later he added a saloon in one of the rooms in the building. This seemed to be an added convenience for his customers while they were doing their weekly or monthly shopping. His relatives in East Texas wrote to him about the disadvantages of operating a drinking establishment when he had a young wife and five small children at home. He waited to answer the letter until the traveling photographer made one of his regular visits to town. He had his photograph taken, sitting at a table wearing his big hat and boots, holding a bottle of whiskey in one hand and a glass in the other. Their reaction isn't known, but as his sense of humor was known to all, they probably enjoyed the joke as much as he.

There are a few legible pages left in the old record book: "Day Book, Joseph Walker, Dog Town, Texas 1876". Some of the prices of merchandise were:

If a man needed cash he could add it to baccount, with whatever else he purchased, an pay his bill later (with no interest). Cattle a horse sales were also recorded in the book, wibrands and ear marks shown.

On September 1, 1876, a daughter was bor Joe's brother, Philip Walker, told him he shou name her "Charlott Walker" after a famou actress but they decided on Arminda Alma (Ama da's middle name) and called her Minnie. Ty years later, October 28, 1878 Myrtle Leono (Nora) was born.

Their happiness was in having so many lit children around to love but on October 26, 188 tragedy struck. Virginia Alice died at the age six. She was sitting in front of the fireplace in h little chair and fell over. The cause of death w not known at the time but it is believed it was do to her having been burned a few weeks earlie Mandy said "She was always such a good chi and God called her because she was too good f this world". Her grief was temporarily restraine five months later, March 8, 1881, when the twi were born. They were named for their goo friends Ida Lucy and Curtis Lee Herring, ar called Curt and Lou. Shortly after their births, Mrs. Dilworth came to visit and was admiring the babies. Minnie, four and one-half years old, told her "We'll keep the little girl but you can have the boy. We don't want him." When they were a little older Minnie had to help take care of them by holding homemade pacifiers in their mouths. They were made by putting sugar and butter in a cloth and tying it with a string.

Joe always asked what he could bring back when he went to town. When Lou was about two years old she answered "Pa, I wish you'd bring me a little 'corchet' (corset)." She was never allowed to forget about this and it always brought laughter to the family. The twins were always together and were into everything. One day they decided Joseph's saddle needed to be painted, so with their little paddles, they painted it with axle grease. There were many such incidents but this was the one everyone remembered so well.

Between 1882 and 1884, Joe acquired land on the La Parita Creek in Atascosa County, where they lived part of each year, while continuing to maintain their home in Tilden. They built a larger house with a long porch across the front. Joe and Mandy's room was in the front of the house, with the children's bedrooms on one side, and the kitchen in the back.

In the center of the front room was a table which held the family album. As often as possible, the children were dressed in their Sunday best clothes and were taken to town to have their photographs made by the traveling photographer. Daguerreotype pictures were the earlier ones which they called "tin-type". They were made by an early method on a plate of chemically treated metal.

Other than the regular chores the girls helped with the house cleaning. Great pride was shown when it was once said "No one cleans house like those Walker girls". Other than their daily routine, at regular intervals, they had a thorough cleaning of everything! They took all the pictures off the walls to polish the frames and glass; they swept and washed the walls and windows; the floors were scrubbed with a brush and lye soap; the bedding, pillows, quilts and clothes were sunned along with the mattresses; and the rugs were put on the clothes line and beaten. Of course it was understood at an early age that a girl never went outside without her wide-brimmed bonnet and long sleeves to protect her face and arms from the sun. Each girl had her own trunk where she kept all her clothes and personal possessions put away.

Items for her hope chest were also kept there. It isn't known where the boys kept their belongings.

When her father rode up to the front gate on his favorite horse "Old Lep" Minnie would run out to meet him. She said she always loved the big horse with spots on his back. The family also had a dog named "Ranger" loved by all the children, and there was a mare named "Old Blaze" and a horse named "Old Simpleton" call "Old Simp".

Minnie liked being at home when the family was there and when their many relatives came to visit. One of her favorites was Lon Oden. Even though he was quite a bit older, he was her nephew. His mother was Martha Jane, Joseph's oldest daughter. He would always joke and laugh with the children and sing songs to them. The one Minnie especially liked was "Molly Darlin".

Melvina attended the college in Tilden for a while and three of the girls, Beckie, Minnie and Nora, attended school in Pleasanton and boarded in the home of Mrs. Huffmań. They learned to write and cipher on slates. They read from McGuffey's Readers, had spelling bees, and recited their lessons and poems. As Minnie was left-handed, which was not allowed in school, she had a difficult time learning to write. A ruler applied across the back of her hand was a constant reminder which was the right one. In later years she said she didn't think she could ever like Pleasanton, not because of the school years, but because she never got over being extremely homesick.

When she caught a cold it was her father's remedy she remembered so well. With extra attention he always took the ailing child wrapped her in a quilt in front of the fireplace and made a special hot toddy. The ingredients were honey and lemon juice added to a little whiskey and heated. He thought this was a good cure and sometimes it worked.

Friendliness and generosity were the custom, and strangers were always welcome to stop, rest for awhile, and have a meal. The coffee was always on to boil. They were asked to stay the night or stay for a week should the occasion arise. One of the old sayings was, "The latchstring hangs on the outside of the door". When a traveler rode up to the gate he would say "Hello the house" Joe's greeting in return was always "Light and rest your saddle". This was frontier hospitality.

Joe had a hired hand who lived with them for many years by the name of Dock Parms. They had a field of watermelons planted and there was one extra large melon that Dock boasted was the largest in the county. One day Joe brought it up to the house and Dock said "By golly, I wouldn't have picked that for a million dollars". Joe replied, "W-II, here it is and I picked it for a whole lot less". He thought a lot of Dock and always remembered the time he protected the family from several Indians that came up near the house. He pointed a gun at them and shouted, "Come to me, Reds". The Indians rode away not knowing the gun wouldn't shoot.

Their ninth child was born December 16, 1884 and Joe told Mandy he wanted to name him William Carroll, for his brother-in-law, by his first marriage.

Melvina and Buddy were always inseperable while growing up, probably due to their being the two eldest with only seventeen months difference in their ages. Perhaps that is why their marriages occurred within one week to a brother and sister from another prominent family. Melvina married Francis Middleton Franklin, November 10, 1886, at the Walker Ranch, at La Parita. Buddy married Miss Leonora Franklin, November 17, at Dr. Taylor's Ranch. Their parents were William Morris Franklin and Eveline Drake Evans Franklin. For weeks everyone was busy getting ready for Melvi-

na's wedding. Besides the cleaning, there was sewing to be done for all the family. Miss Amelia Martin came to stay for a week to help with the bride's trouseau. Several cakes were baked as a big wedding was planned including a barbeque and dance. Everything was ready on time and "people came from all around". Aunt Amelia told Melvina it wasn't good etiquette for the groom to see the bride before the wedding ceremony, but the night before the wedding Melvina went to a dance at the old courthouse in Pleasanton, where Frank was playing the fiddle. Lon Oden was there and when he saw Frank he told Melvina "There's 'old 'Flitter Lip' drawing that bow''. Melvina wanted to go to the dance for the last time while single and have a good time without being bossed.

For many years Joe would take wool to the San Antonio market twice a year and buy supplies. He had a good team of horses to pull the covered wagon, and sometimes he took the family with him. It took three days to make the trip and two nights camping out along the way. They slept on pallets on the ground and cooked their supper over a campfire. The children always rode in the back of the wagon, with Joe, Mandy, and the latest baby on the wagon seat in front. After going only a few miles Minnie always become violently ill. Joe would say "Minnie's a sickly child and the runt of the family. I'm afraid we won't raise her, so let her ride in front with us". Minnie felt honored to sit by her father and it helped her problem which was motion sickness. Mandy replied" Minnie is like a little pine knot, stronger than any of the others", but he couldn't see it and would try to get her out of doing her chores at home. Mandy was proven to

be right as Minnie outlived all of Joe's twenty children.

When they arrived in San Antonio they went to the wagon yard to leave the wagon and stable the horses. They stayed in a boarding house nearby where they had all their meals. The children always enjoyed these trips as they shopped in the city stores for clothes and shoes. Melvina saw two dresses she wanted but her-mother asked her to wait until the next trip. When her father heard about it he said "Mel, do you think you can find the store where you saw those dresses?" When they returned Mandy told Joe that he spoiled the children too much. She also mentioned the time the sewing machine agent came by and when Melvina said she would like to have a sewing machine he bought one for her. When Minnie put on a new dress, Joe told her, "Always pick up your skirts and swish them when you walk so you'll be in style." He had little interest in wealth or fashion for himself but he always provided it for his family.

In November 1886, Joseph had presented to the court of Atascosa County his application for appointment as guardian of the estate of Rebecca, Arminda and Nora Walker, minors under 14 years of age. He was appointed and gave bond in the

1891 he was on the Old Dodge Trail with two thousand, one hundred beeves, bound for Colorado. The foreman was Mr. Wilkins, with Mox Pierce, Jim Nix, Will Hunter and Mat Daniels, a cook, a wrangler, and several riders. One time Jerome was singing and they were watching the lightning at bedtime when they heard the terrible roar of the cattle stampeding. The men jumped on the horses that had been left saddled and tried to stop them. With the lightning all around they saw what appeared to be a ghost riding out in front of the herd but when they heard the calling and the singing they knew it was only Jerome looking like a ghost in his white slicker.

Buddy went up the Chisholm Trail to Abilene with cattle belonging to him and his father with the "U Turkey Track" brand.

Joe had been a healthy man all his life but he gradually developed a stomach ailment which none of the old time remedies or doctor's prescriptions could cure. Mandy had heard of the hot springs in Mexico that were supposed "to cure any sickness". In a desperate attempt to save his life, she took him and the baby (Tom) on the long trip in a wagon, however, when they returned to their home near Tilden, his health failed rapidly and he died June 30, 1888, at the age of three

score and ten, and is buried in the Hilltop Cemetery. His epitaph reads:

"A dear one from us has gone, A voice we loved is stilled. A place is vacant in our home Which never can be filled."

Joe's death left Mandy a widow at forty-one years of age with seven children at home, but her faith in God always helped her face her problems calmly and with courage. She was a Baptist, and with the children, attended church whenever possible. She taught them to say their prayers and to read their Bibles every day. Most of the family joined the church in Tilden and attended reqularly. Minnie joined in 1889 and was baptised in the Frio River. She and many of her friends were in a class together in the Baptist Sunday Schooland went to many of the church socials. They were: Amelia (Medie) Martin, Olive Isabella (Issie) Martin, Hope Coker, Jennie Martin, Ollie Martin, Lela Dixon, Rosie Kerr, Eddie Jahn, Willie Harmon and Johnnie Martin. They had a photograph made in the early 1890's and all were dressed in white dresses trimmed in ribbon and lace. They curled their hair with curling irons and wore matching bows and combs.

A friend of the family "Aunt Becky" O'Neal, would take trips to San Antonio in her buggy and ask Minnie to accompany her. They always made an overnight stop at the Dossy Ranch. It was a thrill to go to the big city and ride on the street car to San Pedro Springs. Minnie visited with her halfsister, "Sister Callie" (Lyford Musgrave), and once when her help was needed, she spent the summer with her.

Each one of the girls and boys had an autograph book. There are two pages from Minnie's:

"To Miss Minnie, Love many, trust few and always paddle your own canoe Yours in friendship Jan. 29, 1894 Henrietta Bryne

Beckie and Ed Scogin were married October 26, 1892, and Minnie was left the eldest girl at home at the age of sixteen. With Nora and Lucy's help, she looked after the younger children and cooked, as Mandy became a midwife and nurse once again. Minnie was an expert seamstress and was asked to go to ranches for several days at a time to make school clothes for the children. She also made dresses and men's shirts. She had several beaus and attended dances and socials with them until she married Ed Mulholland, July 16, 1898.

In 1899, Mandy went to the Martin Ranch to be with her step-daughter, Mary, for the birth of Murray, and again in 1901, for the birth of Alonzo Oden Martin. She kept busy with her quilting and sewing also as she believed "idle hands are the devil's workshop".

As her family decreased in size it was decided she needed a smaller house in town. Her sons made frequent trips to Pearsall to buy lumber, and her son-in-law, Frank Franklin built it. Two bedrooms were on the north side. There was a big hall with the east end opening to a small porch on the front and an L shaped back porch with the kitchen on the side. A pen was in back of the house where the cow "Old Stockir gs" was kept.

Joe's picture was always hung on the wall at the head of Mandy's bed. When she thought she had a problem that was too much for her to handle alone (which wasn't too often) she stood in front of it and discussed it with "Mr. Walker".

She always welcomed the company of a grandchild or two to live with her during the school year. Among those who lived with Grandma were Hubert Mulholland and Minnie Franklin. Guy Scogin lived on the Lowe Ranch and rode his horse to school every day, but at noon he would have lunch with Mandy.

She was a good cook and her fruitcake was especially famous. She looked forward to the holidays and, for ten days before Christmas, baked cakes and cookies for all her grandchildren.

As she grew older her eyesight was failing so the house was sold and she spent her remaining years visiting among her children. She always took all of her wordly possessions . . . a feather bed, a hump-back trunk that smelled of moth balls, and a cardboard suitcase. Her trunk held her out of season clothes, the family Bible, a photograph album, and an assortment of cards, trinkets, and keepsakes.

When she visited Will, she and her granddaughter, Alice, would go through the trunk on cold rainy days. She would hold each object in her hands and tell who gave it to her or how long she had it. At night she always slept with her and never missed saying her prayers aloud. When Alice asked her why she prayed aloud, she would say "I want to be sure the Lord hears me".

She always wore the same style dress which was a dark print or tiny check with a high neck, long sleeves and buttoned from neck to hem. Over this she wore a matching cook apron, tied at her waist, with two pockets which held a handkerchief, a tin snuff can, and a "tooth bresh", as she called it. The brush had to be the root of a running mesquite. Most of the time she wore her shoes on the wrong feet (to get them back in shape). As she sat in her chair with her snuff box getting snuff on her brush, she would spill as much on her apron as she got on the brush. Just as Alice would get down in front of her to put her shoes on the right feet she would give her apron a big shake and Alice would be covered with snuff.

Her spending money was sent a few dollars at a time by her sons. When a letter would come from one of them she and Alice would go to the drug store everyday for an "ice cream comb" (as she called it) until the money ran out.

The only time Alice ever felt like Granny wasn't

on her side was when she insisted her mother give her a dose of Black Draught. She took a "pinch" every few days herself.

Alice was very happy as a child, just to have Granny sit out in the yard and watch her play, as she loved her dearly.

Her grandson, Guy Scogin, was always very close to her. He said "We didn't live too far from Grandma, just over the hill, and I'd go stay with her often. When Papa was gone Mama and I wouldn't stay home alone and when we'd go to Grandma's I'd take my big old white cat. We got to her house one evening about dark and she was glad to see us. She said "Oh, you all have come to stay all night!". I said, "Yeh, Grandma, we can't stay out there with those _____ coyotes!" His mama fussed at him for using bad words, but he still dislikes hearing the coyotes how!.

When he was very young his mama and papa would take him fishing for two or three days at a time and Grandma would go along with them. His mama wore her dress when she went in the river but Grandma wore her underskirt (with a camisole, it resembled a dress). He could dog paddle a little but she could really swim across the river fast and he thought how funny it was to see a woman swim. She could use her full skirt as a float by catching air in it and holding it around her waist. He enjoyed swimming with her many times.

She had some steel point arrow heads she kept in her button box and they were still sharp enough for her to-use to take thorns out of his feet. Many years earlier she had taken them from a tree trunk after the Indians had shot arrows at Bud Walker.

In later years when she stayed with Guy, Beckie, and Ed, and was almost blind, she could reach in her old trunk and find whatever she wanted right away. She knew exactly where everything was. She told him many exciting stories about the early days in McMullen County. Guy said "She was a wonderful old woman. We owe those people a lot for what they went through to settle this country down here".

Over the years when Mandy was asked why she didn't marry again when she was left a widow at the age of forty-one, she always replied "Mr. Walker was the best looking man that ever the sun shone upon and the only man I ever loved."

Forty-one years after Joe's death Mandy joined him on December 20, 1929. There was ice on the ground with snow the next day but her large family and many friends attended the funeral to pay their last respects to a grand lady loved by all. Her epitaph: "God's greatest gift returned to God, Our Mother."

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The Alford-Eads Cemetery is located six and one-half miles west on State Highway 79 from Rockdale, Texas. Turn to the right onto a narrow, dirt road and go two hundred yards. There is dense growth and you might miss it. Be watchful.

There is no fence around the cemetery and the tombstones are somewhat scattered, but surprisingly, they are in good shape since everything else is in grass and weeds.

Of the twenty-five stones found only twenty-one are readable. This number includes the stone of a Confederate veteran. The earliest birth year recorded was William Ashton's in 1823 and the earliest burial date seen was Mattie Lou Alford's in 1884. The last burial, as of this writing, was in 1952.

## Forest Grove Community History

Forest Grove is in Milam County, Texas, approximately seven miles south of Rockdale. Lee County line separates the community as some residents live across the line. Mailing address for some residents is Rt. 1, Rockdale, others it's Rt. 1, Lexington.

Years before this community was named Forest Grove, the cemetery was started on the hill west of the present church building and was called Hat Prairie. Two stories were related to this name:

1. The open space on the hill was shaped like a hat.

2. A fellow riding by on horseback lost his hat and sometime later found it on top of the hill.

The first train on the S.A. & A.P.railroad came through in 1888-nc railroad left now.

At a protracted meeting held by C.S. Watson and C.A. Leecraft in August, 1898, a congregation was organized by appointing as a board of elders, W.W. Kyle, J.R. Lothlin, and R.S. Stanley and as deacons, Richard Boswell, H.B. Duncum, Frank Bounds.

The congregation met at Oak Hill school house on Sept. 13, 1902 and reorganized with W.W. Kyle and J.W. Crim as elders, and Frank Bounds, J.B.R. Smith, J.P. Keen as deacons. The old church building was built in the Fall of the same year at a cost of approximately \$300 and was paid for except \$25. W.W. Kyle suggested the name Forest Grove because he knew a place in Missouri by that name. The building was dedicated on the 4th Lord's Day in Jan., 1903. Forest Grove had the first homecoming on October 15, 1956 and started a building fund for a new church. On the third Sunday of Sept., 1959, the last services were held in the old church house with James Diamond preaching. The free-will offering on that day was \$1600 for the fund. The old church was moved the following week and the recreation building was used for all services until the new church was finished. The first service in the new one was on Jan. 24, 1960. Dedication services were on April 24, 1960, with five preachers in charge: James Diamond, James Mantooth, Edward Fraim, Charles Jarman, and Hollins DuHon.

Hicks was a very active part of the community for years. In the 1910 & 1920's there was a section house, a depot, 2 stores, a cotton gin, a coal mine, several small rent houses, a three teacher school house, a blacksmith shop, a post office, a commissary. Now none of these are left. In 1917 & 1918, rows and rows of cardwood were stacked beside the railroad near the school and several people said they would walk through the stacks on their way to school each day.

Some of the senior people told from memory some of those facts. Two doctors were in the Hicks community: Dr. McLarty and Dr. Sparks. Joe Magee was one of the managers of the coal mine. Robert Stence, Tom Paul, Will Crim helped operate the commissary. Lee Scarborough, W.O. Hollowell, and Will Alexander were cwners of the stores. Charlie Gard operated the gin. Teachers were Winnie Fitzgerald, Betty Childs, Myrtle Browder, Carrie Spence. A Woodman Hall stood southeast of the church and had active members. A Literary Society used the Hall for meetings toc. There was another school in the area, Oak Hill, located on the southeast corner of the now Fritz Doss farm on Highway 77. Children who attended had to walk; some several miles. Teachers were Guy & Fred Eads, Edna Cook, Ruby Aldridge, Ruby Hickman, Bolivar Carlyle, Johnny Cherry.

For entertainment baseball games were played, house parties held, basketball games, dominces, etc.

Looking at the markers in the Forest Grove Cemetery, the oldest one with printing that is readable is D.B. Hughes, died 1856. (relative of the Overmans)

At this copying, our church building is paid for, also the three bedroom parsonage, and the classroom-patio addition. Beside the regular church funds, the Forest Grove Memorial Fund was started at the death of Henry Spence, September, 1969, and the cemetery fund is used for upkeep. Part of the Memorial Fund was used this year for cushions in the church pews and a new drapery for the baptistry.

# Texas Pioneers in Battle With Indian Horse Thieves

#### By CAPT. A. J. SOWELL, Ex-Ranger

The REGARD to the killing of James Winters by Indians I give the following particulars as rold by Dr. Speed in his account of the affair in the San Antonio Herald. Some years ago the writer had a copy of the Herald containing the account and copied it for future use. The paper hore the date of Nov. 2, 1861. The account was as follows:

Frio County, Oct. 24, 1861.

Manura Editors:

Having partially recovered from my wounds received in an encounter with Indians on Saturday, the 19th instant, at about 11 o'clock, and thinking a lew words from myself and my comredes in defeast may be of interest to your readers, I endeswor to give you some of the incidents of the fight.

At about 8 o'clock on the morning of this fattful day Mr. N. Kennard came to Mr. Hood's near my ratch, and informed me that the Indians had passed near my house with a large caballado of horses and that some of the neighbors were on the trail in pursuit. I instantly mounted my nule, then almost constantly, and for the last four days riding in deep sand. I started home for my gua.

I then happened to fall in with Mr. T. L. Ward, James Bishop, James Craig and N. Kennard. We all started out on a long gallop to find the trail, which we came across near the divide between the south fork of Cesquadara and the waters of the San Maguel (slc). We followed it as rapidly as we could in a gallop analy all the time until we reached a high eminence overlooking the San Maguel valley, at which place I loaded my gun, not having taken time to do so up to this time.

We then started on and in a few jumps we saw Mr. James M. Winters and W. W. Davidson about one mile across the San Maguel on high ground waiting for us. The boys broke off at a rapid rate, leaving me greatly in the rear, their horses being florter than my mule. Upon coming up with them they informed us that the Indians were not more than two miles abead. We all immediately started in pursuit, but did not go but a short distance before Mr. Davidson's horse gave out, being a two-year-old cole, and he, with much regret, was compelled to trans hack, which left but six.

* * *

E DID not delay. We had no organization or undersanding and at this time I mentioned to the boye that we must stay together, but upon the run I cannot asy whether they all leard me or nor. We there struck

the blackjack timber between the Maguel and Black Creek In which Mr. Winters and I were thrown together, when I again aild we must all stay together. His reply I did not distinctly understand, but thought he said, "Certainly," About four or five miller from where we overtook Winters and Davidson, and just as we came out of the thick blackjacks to the valley of Black Creek, Biabop aid:

Boys, there they are.

At this instant Winters and Kennard changed borses, Kennard's

horse being the fleetest in the company. Again I mid we must all smy together, and without anything else being said the boys pushed on as fast as their several horse could carry them without ascertaining the oumber of the Indians, and leaving me greatly to the rear, having to make a run of about a mile from where we first saw tham.

The Indians, on discovering us, began to essemble together and to string their bows. They stabled a little merro boy that they had with them, belonging to Mr. Marcellus French, in two places and gave him some external bruises, none of which were faral, and left him and also the horses in a large most of timber and ran up a hill. When overtaken by the boys they were out in open ground covered with tail grass and scrubby mesquite bushes, and then the fight began.

At this time they were all behind the live oak mott, I could not see them. I must have been 150 or 200 yards behind, pressing on as hard as my onle would carry me. When I rounded the point of the timber all the Indian warriors were on foot and their horses sampeding. Their number was about 25, and they were yelling "Charge" as I understood the meaning of the word in English. They had been at this for some time before I came in sight of them from behind the timber. I then naw our boys in a state of confusion and disorder. Mr. Winters was down on one knee and surrounded by Indians.

At about this stage, Winters said to Ward, "Come to me," which Ward strempted to do until he had exhausted his shots and had to retreat. I, seeing, his coadition, made the charge to his relief, and when near enough fired a volley upon the Indians from a double-bareled shotgan that I had got from Mr. Davidson when he tureed back. Not being in the hebit of shooting such a gun, I caugh the wrong trigger, and before I could touch the other one an Indian abot my mule in the neck, which caused him to wheel around and commence pitching. This be continued to do for some 20 or 50 steps. The Indians, seeing me come up, commenced their charge on me.

At this time I did not know where the other boys were, but when my mule stopped pitching I saw all four on the retress to gether, two on horebacks and two on foot, Craig and Bishop were on horseback, going off the way we came. My mule sgain commenced pitching, turning to the right and an Indian shot me in the back with an arrow, a glancing shot three or four inches deep and I then went to the boys. Ward was wounded in the back. He had lost his gun, and his pistol was empty. Kennard had also lost his gun and was wounded in the shoulder, Bishop and Craig were unhurt. Bishop had no pistol and only a single-barrel gun. Kennard's and Craig's pistols proved insefficient and were of no use. The four had but two guns and one pistol, all empty.

When I came up I gave Ward my shorgun and Bishop got him up habind him, and Kennard mounted behind Craig. After traveling 150 or 260 yards to a clump of trees they got down to load their gues. I then discovered that Ward did not have the gun that I gave him. I asked him what be had done with it, and be asid I did not hand it to him. Some of the hoys now told him I had done to. His wound had so paralyzed him that he was not cognizant of what had transpired for a time. His wound, though painful, was not dangerous. Kennard's wound was alight. The Indians having left the horses and stabled the little asgm, and leaving behind them a large most of timber of which they had complete possession, proved to not that day were willing to make their excape, but seeing the confused state of our hoys in the charge they dismouted and commenced themselves to charge, the horses all scampeding except a few on which were squaw. Their whole number must have been 25 to 30. By not attempting to purwe us in our unarroad and disabled condition proves to me that the hoys did good service with their abors, and when they went back after: Winters there were five or six different pools of blood near where Winters they dead.

Ward any he shot one who fell from his heres and his heres kicked him. Their wounded and dead was the cause of their soc following us. Had I been up to the charge and missed my (word out) all would have been killed for they quit the other hoys and came after me and came near cetting me off from the others, of which I was entirely unconacious until my mole stopped pitching. At this point I looked bedk to see if I could be of any service to Winters. He was failing over, having made his last effort.

* * *

Y COMRADES, no doubt did all in their power to save our unfortunate companion, but of no avail. None knew him but to admire him. He was in every sense of the word a genieman, and as a neighbor, citizen and frontiermann

was all that he should have been. His bereaved companion has lost a kind husband, and his small children a faithful father. This was the second time he had pursued and overtaken the Indians. The first time he and his conrades did not charge them, their number being too small for atrack. After this he had been heard to say the next time he saw the Indians he would make the charge and get some of them amyhow, and now I have no doubt he kept his word, for be never lookad back to see where the rest of us were.

The Indians must have had 200 horses or more, as they covered a large space of ground. We could not see them all for the bushes in the valley. About the same time of day five of our neighbors -Major A. Allen, Natheniel Terry, D. Yarboe, J. W. Bennett and R. Coode - coming on after us over the same trail, discovered a band of Indians going up the Chicon near the mouth of the Francisco and near where our mail had crossed the Maguel. As soon as they could assemble they made the run after the Indians, who, when discovered, commenced to charge. The major and company dismounted, fastened their borses and made a stand. The Indians, be fore coming in range of the guns, turned off. The number of Indians was from 15 to 18, but they finally left and the major and his party went on westward, riding in the direction of where we had the engagement, distant about five miles. We learned at Mrs. Tomlin's that about 12 men from the Hondo were close on the trail, not more than two or three bours after us, where we were in the bartle with the Indians, so if we had all kept sogether and kept them off from the horses we had got all of the animals, or so engaged them until we had been reinforced by those 12 men. Monday morning 20 men started to pursuit six miles beyond D'Hanla about eight or 10 hours behind them, intending so keep the trall until they found out where they went or overtook them.

THAT THEY were indicate of small suscess there is no mistake. The firthe magno boy sold they were all indicate except one, and he was a Mexican and had carly hair, and that

there were chose squares with them. They also killed two grows segroes of Me. French. They killed a man by the name of Hernolon, wounded O'Brien and Anderson, and pursued mother named Tucker in sight of Plessmont, all below here. This is the fourth time they have been in this season, always going out near where we had the fight with them. There seam have been 50 lodians in a space of five mills at the time we fought them.

The writer knew James Winters, Lycurgus Ward, Norvill Kennard, John Bishop, Tucker and Wess Davidson of those mentioned by Dr. Speed, Winters, Ward and Davidson were brothers-in-law, the two former having matried the last's sisters, Mandy and Hannah Davidson. The Winters were old-times Texans, four of them being in the battle of San Jacinto and one of them, Sergennt William Winters, was badly wounded. They were all brave, fearless men and good citizens.

* * *

Dr. Speed was well and favorably known in the community where he lived. His wound was not as alight as he seemed to think it was when he wrote the scoount of the fight, for he died about reo pears afterwards and some think from the effects of the arrow which the Indian had abot into him. Kennard was also a long sime recovering, and Ward carried the iron spike in his back to Pleasanton, and it was with great difficulty withdrawn with a pair of pinchers. After this he was wounded in another indian bartle.

These same Indians on the way out killed "Mustang". Moore, Pric Ketcham and McMurry, tax assessor of Bandera county, but they were defeated in the mountains by "Bigfoot" Wallacs in command of about 30 actilers. About 190 head of horeas were recovered and brought back.

## EARLY SETTLERS AND INDIAN FIGHTERS SOUTHWEST TEXAS A. J. SOWELL

Thirty-three miles southwest from San Antonio is the flourishing little city of Devine, in Medina County. It was named for Judge Devine, of San Antonio, long before the whistle of a locomotive was heard in this country. The pioneers had erected their cabins here and commenced that long and desperate struggle with the savages for the mastery, in which civilization in the

end was destined to triumph. Now, instead of the yell of the Comanche, Lipan or Kickapoo, is heard the scream of the steam engine, and the trail of the redman is covered along the graded track by the right of way. In a radius of twelve miles of this place, covered by portions of Frio and Medina counties, many bloody encounters took place. Nearly every hill, valley, branch, creek, or mott of timber in historic; and many graves are shown here and there, and the traveler is told "they were hilled by Indians." Many of these old settlers still survive who escaped the arrow, bullet, lance, or tomahawk, and among these at the time of which I write (1897) were Tom Galbreth, Lon Moore, Sam McCombs, Gip Tilley, Bee Tilley, J. W. Winters, Big Foot Wallace, Thomas A. James, John Craig, Tobias Long, James Long, West Davidson, Holly Laxon, George Crawford, James Crawford, Mrs. Amanda Long, Aunt Peggy Halsel, Mrs. Minerva Laxon, Rev. Newton, Reese Moore, W. M. Bramlett, Mrs. Anna Burch, Mrs. Sarah Smith, George McCombs, and many others. Nearly all of these have been here from thirty-five to fifty years; the first one to come being Big Foot Wallace.

The writer, in company with an old friend, Tobias Long. set out from Devine in April, 1897, about the 20th, to his ranch and farm twelve miles south of Devine. The country is very sandy in places, which makes locomotion slow, but the soil is very good for corn, cotton, melons, and potatoes. We arrived at Mr. Long's place about sundown, and the writer received a hearty welcome from Mrs. Long, who was an old acquaintance of other days in Guadalupe County, but she could not see me, having been blind for many years. Her first husband, James Winters, was killed by Indians, and during my stay I was shown the three arrows which were pulled from his body, and which she had carefully preserved for nearly forty years. The Indians in scalping him had taken the hair off so close but little was left on the head, and the grief-stricken wife could only procure a small bit just above the ear to keep as a memento. The opposing forces consisted of six white men and twenty-five Indians, and a full description of the battle is given elsewhere. Mrs. Long, before her first marriage, was Amanda Davidson, and the daughter of "Aunt Peggy" Halsel, by Mrs. Halsel's first husband.

In this settlement the writer met two old schoolmates of forty odd years ago, Mr. West Davidson and Mrs. Minerva Laxon, son and daughter of "Aunt Peggy" Halsel. This old pioneer mother. who still lives, was born in Alabama in 1812. Her father, Tobias Long, was a soldier under General Jackson, and was in the battle of "Horse Shoe Bend."

While taking a drive through the country with the family, consisting of Mrs. Halsel, Mrs. Laxon and her husband, Holly Laxon, the writer was shown an old road which was washed out into gullies where it emptied into Cesquadara Creek, at the mouth of Elm, and was told that here a boy's horse fell with him while he was making a desperate run from the Indians. The name of the boy was Simon Fraiser. He was out in the woods near Sand branch when he discovered a band of Indians. The horse young Fraiser was riding was a mustang, which had been caught when a colt and was a rather awkward pacer and not noted for speed. It was two miles home, and the boy turned for the nearest house, only half a smile away on Cesquadara, and made the best time he could, with the Indians in pursuit, three of them on good horses. So confident were they of their little victim that one of them fixed his rope as he ran to throw over Simon's head when he came up beside him. The boy used every effort to urge his mustang to his utmost speed in this run for life, but at first the pony only went in an ungainly pacing gallop. The three Indians were mounted on races horses which they had stolen from settlers, and soon shortened the distance between them and the seemingly doomed boy. Two of these fast horses belonged to Than. Terry, and one noted for speed was called Cornet. The other one belonged to Lon Moore. When the Indiana came near they began to utter loud, keen whistles to terrify the lad, but this likely saved his life, as the mustang became hadly frightened and at once began to get his legs under him in proper shape and to run level and at a terrific speed. In vain the Indians tried to flank him, two running on each side and one in the rear. When the bank of the Cesquadara Creek was reached the boy's horse plunged down and fell, throwing his rider over his head, and then rising dashed away, leaving Simon to take care of himself as best he could. Near by, however, was a family living at the old James Winters place, and thither he made his way in safety. The horse passed this place and went on to Mr. Trout's and was there caught by Miss Louisa Trout. They had been listening to the noise of the running horses across the creek, but were not aware of the presence of Indians in the country, but now realizing the situation, thought sure young Frasier was killed. The Indians came close to the house, trying to get the horse after he threw the boy, for they saw he had wonderful speed, and they wanted him very much, but were prevented by Miss Trout catching and tying him near the door, and the Indians would not come within gunshot of the house.

The boy Simon Fraiser had a brother killed by Indians. His name was Henry McCulloch Fraiser, and he was named for Gen. Henry McCulloch. This boy was out near the house hobbling a horse, and as he raised up an Indian grabhed him around the waist, and pulled a knife from Henry's belt and stabbed him with it, and then stripped him of his clothing. The boy succeeded in getting to the house in this bloody and naked condition and lived long enough to tell how it was done. The Indian who did this was supposed to have put on the boy's shirt, as one was killed shortly afterwards by Montel's rangers who had on a hickory shirt, the sleeves of which were very much too ahort for him. This killing of Henry Fraiser was a short time before the Indians gave his brother Simon such a chase.

While being shown several places of interest by Mr. West. Davidson, we came upon a small elevated place near Sand branch, where was a lone grave in a mott of liveoak trees. The man buried here was a Texas ranger and had been killed near this place in a battle with the Indians in 1845. The rangers on this occasion, twenty in number, were coming back from a scout to their camp, which was at the Garcia crossing on the Medina. It was nearly night, and the rangers were going up Sand branch to a spring, where they intended camping for the night. Eighty Indians were already encamped at the water, and their spies had discovered the rangers approaching. The Comanches met them near this grove and a battle ensued. The rangers took advantage of the liveosk timber along the branch and opened a severe fire from their rifles. The Indians did the same, and many shots were exchanged, during which one of the rangers was killed, and night coming on the Indians went back to the spring, carrying away their dead, and the rangers camped on the battleground, and that night buried their dead comrade and attended to others who were wounded. Next morning the Indians attacked them again, but soon drew off. The rangers went on to their camp, and getting additional force returned and trailed up the Indiana and completely routed them and captured many head of horses and other property. On the way back from the scout the rangers stopped and built a pen of poles around the grave of the dead ranger. When the settlers began to come into this part of the country the grave attracted their attention, and a Mr. Woodward who lived near Pleasanton gave Mr. Davidson the history of it, for he was one of the rangers in the fight. The grave is now marked by a mesquite stake about four inches in diameter driven into the ground. The pen first placed around it by the rangers in time rotted away, and this stake was put here by "Aunt Peggy" Halsel many years ago, and has thus far preserved the site of the grave from being lost. Mr. Davidson could not tell me the name of the ranger or his captain, but thinks the latter was Walker. The old ranger who gave the account is now dead. If the writer could learn the name of this dead defender of the Texas frontier who has now lain for fiftyfour years in this lonely livecak grove, a stone suitably inscribed should be placed over it. The spring mentioned is now filled with sand and used to be known as the "Toola waterhole."

Mr. Tobias Long was one of Montel's rangers, and also served under Capt. Ed. Burleson, and has had much experience on the frontier, and has eaten horse meat with Big Foot Wallace while nearly starving on the plains.

Byrd Smith, an old Texan near Devine, was born in Gonzales County in 1845. One of his ancestors, after whom he was named, was a soldier under General Jackson in the Indian wars and fought in the command of General Cocke. Just before one battle he told General Cocke that he would be killed in the fight, and while it was raging came up to the side of the general and was killed by a rife ball in the forehead. After the war General Cocke named one of his sons Byrd Smith Cocke. This pretty tree-shaded cemetery is very well kept with a nice fence around it. The name ELLIS is on the gate to the cemetery on the left side of the dirt road.)

#### PROVIDENCE BAPTIST CHURCH

Providence Baptist Church was organized on the second Sunday in September, 1841. As such, it is the oldest Baptist church operating in Burleson County, and one of the oldest churches in the state. At the time of its beginning, Texas was an independent republic, and this area was part of Milam County, since Burleson County was not organized until 1846. The church is located about seven miles southeast of Caldwell, in the Providence community, just off Farm Road 166.

The organizational meeting of the congregation was held in the home of James A. Prewitt, with Elder William M. Tryon in charge of the service. Prewitt became the first deacon of the Church, and Elder Tryon the first pastor. There were twelve members on the Church's first day of life. Although the earliest records have been lost, it is thought that the Echols, Morgan, Varner, Thomas, Ewing. Hitchcock, Gray, Mullinax, Stephens, Runnels, Coleman, Newcomb, and Carrington families were among the first members.

From 1850 to about 1875, the Providence church was one of the larger Baptist congregations north of Houston and west of the Brazos River. In pre-Civil War days, planters from the Brazos bottoms and their slaves attended the services. On occasion, in the absence of the pastor, slave preachers would

"exhort" the congregation. Negroes were among the earliest members of the Church, and a few were still on the Church roll as late as 1870.

The first Sunday school was organized in 1879 by John R. Lewis.

The annual revival has always been an important part of the life of the Church. The largest revival, in terms of baptisms, was that of 1868, when forty people were added to the Church. The preacher for that meeting was B.H. Carroll, who began his career at Providence, and later became founder and first president of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary at Fort Worth.

The church has occupied four buildings during its history. The first was made of split logs and stood about one hundred yards east of the present site. The second and third were frame buildings with only a sanctuary, typical of rural "meeting houses" of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The present building was erected in 1954, and contains a sanctuary, classrooms, kitchen, and fellowship hall.

The church has had twenty-seven pastors since its beginning. Due to the loss of early records, their exact dates of service cannot be ascertained. They include: William M. Tryon, N.T. Byars, Hosea Garrett, L. Seward, W.B. Eaves, John Clabaugh, J.G. Thomas, B.H. Carroll, J. Beal, J. Berryman, W.S. Lackey, W.T.H. Beazely, J.W. George, W.B. Rhodes, W.S. Gilstrap, J.M. Rankin, B.J. Benford, A.S. Broaddus, E.E. Carrington, Russell Salmon, John E. Wade, Harold Davis, G. Oren McManus, Don R. Ward, Ellis Smith, Parma Newman, and since 1971, Jack Mitchell. Among these, Rev. Carrington had the longest tenure—twenty-two years, from about 1925 to. 1947.

The single most outstanding event in the life of the church was probably the centennial celebration in 1941. It was attended by about 2700 persons, including Lieutenant Governor Coke Stevenson and State Comptroller George H. Sheppard, and other dignitaries. The master of ceremonies was former senator R.S. Bowers of Caldwell, and speakers included Lt. Governor Stevenson, District Judge W.S. Barron of Bryan, and Rev. W.W. Melton, Secretary of the Executive Board of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

Providence Baptist Church was a "fourth-time" church until about 1925, when it began half-time meetings. Since about 1930 it has been a full time church with services each Sunday.

The church observes an annual homecoming each first Sunday in June. The Providence Cemetery Association also holds its annual meeting on this date. The cemetery is located next to the present church, and dates from 1836.

Providence Baptist Church is affiliated with the Independence Baptist Association, the Baptist General Convention of Texas, and the Southern Baptist Convention.

# 90-year-old Hearne still plans productive future

GRAHAM, Texas (Special) — Liston Hearne, who will take a day off from working his farm to celebrate his 90th birthday Oct. 17, has been busy planning his own birthday party.

His wife, Mamie, said that earlier this summer at a family reunion in Loving, Texas, he said, "I want you all to come for dinner on my birthday."

With a smile, Mrs. Hearne added, "I knew I couldn't cook dinner for all that crowd," so all the relatives offered to bring basket lunches and gather beneath the Cox Arbor at Fort Belknap. A birthday cake and punch will be served at a reception for friends in the afternoon, she said.

Hearne is a 95-pound bundle of muscle and brawn and is a wellknown fruit and vegetable farmer two miles north of Fort Belknap.

He has cultivated and planted his 80-acre deep-sand farm since January 1923.

Pointing to the pavement that runs in front of his neat white home he said, "Back then, that road was ruts and chug holes when it rained."

The heavily wooded area surrounding his farm is now thickly populated. He said that his latest neighbors moved have from

#### Kansas.

Hearne bought his first tractor in 1940, and 10 years later, bought his present Ford Tractor. "I've run it 32 years and put three sets of tires on it," he said proudly.

His farming techniques are simple. "The secret of dryland farming is to cultivate often and shallow to hold the moisture." He fertilizes his Brazos variety of blackberries and peach trees occasionally, but said he doesn't use much fertilizer.

This summer he had a bumper peach crop of Red Globe and Ranger peaches that produced over 400 bushels, most of which he sold to customers from as far away as Lubbock and Wichita Falls. Sometimes his friend, Lawrence Pitts of Newcastle, Texas, helped out with the harvest, but most of the harvesting he does himself.

His wife waits on customers that stop at their roadside stand near the house, and answers the many phone calls. She also cans and freezes much of their produce.

He remembers how one year he and his two sons, Bill and Charles, worked together and grew 40 acres of watermelons, selling trailer loads every day.

He recently harvested a large pear crop and has a second crop

Hearne was born in Limestone County in Kosse, Texas. He came to Young County 70 years ago with his parents, the Will Hearnes, who bought farmland northwest of Newcastle. Of the four sons and one daughter born to the Hearnes, he is the only surviving son. He has a sister, Mrs. Edna Guinn of Graham.

When he met his wife, the former Mamie Alice Moore of Caldwell, Texas, he was working at the "water counter" of a grocery store in Mineral Wells, Texas, selling bottled Crazy Water, in 1918. They were married June 7, 1919.

They moved to Newcastle where he owned and operated a grocery store for three years. He recalls that one day Dr. Coop, who formerly owned the land, came by his store and asked if he'd swap the store for the 80 acres of land. Seems he couldn't get anyone to work the land. Within 24 hours Hearne became a farmer.

As for retirement, "Oh, in about 10 years," said the 90-yearold. "I enjoy working, it's what keeps me young," he said.

He is looking forward to his birthday party, which he says is the first big party he's ever had, other than the couple's go'den
