Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarborough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

It is thought that the father of Mary is either Richard or William, one of the sons of Richard the immigrant.

The last record found for Joshua Yarbrough, Sr., was 1780 in Franklin Co., NC, which was formed from part of Bute Co. in 1778. Joshua was living by his son Micajah. He probably lived on there until his death which must have been before 1790 as he isn't in the 1790 Franklin Co., NC, census. Information on other Yarbroughs living with Joshua in Granville and Bute Counties follows:

Monoah.

Henry Yarbrough, Sr., and wife Martha Robinson, found in Amelia County, VA, by 1739; bought land in Granville Co., NC, in 1760 while still living in Virginia. He died intestate in Franklin Co., NC, between 1790 and 1800. He is said to have children: James, Henry, Charles, Edward, Thomas, Clemert and two daughters.

Henry Yarbrough, Jr., and wife Elizabeth Murray, Henry, son of Henry, Sr., and Martha Yarbrough, left a will in Franklin Co., NC, probated June 1794. (WB A, p. 123) Children: Archibald, Charles, David, Henry, James, Thomas, Nancy, Frances, and Martha.

James Yarbrough, son of Henry Yarbrough, Sr. in Franklin Co. until 1801.

Manoah Yarbrough, was in Granville Co., NC, by July 1756; moved to Georgia in 1769 according to a petition he filed requesting a land grant in St. George's Parish in May 1770. Littleton and Thomas were in the same parish by 1790. They are possibly his sons.

Zachariah Yarbrough, listed in Amelia Co. tax list in 1747 and 1749 as a titheable of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr.; came to Bute Co. before 1771; then to Rowan Co. and finally to Randolph Co., NC, where he made entry for a land grant in 1795 which he received in 1802. He is said to have married Elizabeth Dowd and had children: Zachariah, Jr., Henry, Thomas, Alexander, Manoah, Julia, Elizabeth, Archibald, and John.

John and wife Elizabeth Yarbrough, moved from Amelia Co., VA, before 1755. John was con of thomas Yarbrough, Sr. According to George W. Yarbrough, a descendant, they moved to Fairfield Co., SC, where he died in 1816. Children: Jesse, Moses, Arthur, Thomas, Martha, Joseph, Richard and Nancy.

Micajah Yarbrough, son of Joshua and Sarah, received a warrant for 100 acres by improvement on branches of Mill Stone in Bute Co., NC, adjacent to his own line and his father Joshua Yarbrough's line on 24 Jan. 1778. On 10 Oct. 1783 he received a grant for 100 acres in Franklin Co., NC, on the waters of Sandy Creek. (Grant Book 52, p. 179) He was found in Franklin Co. as late as 1810. He had sons: Micajah, Jr., Joshua, Shadrick and perhaps others.

James Yarbrough, son of Joshua and Sarah, was last found in Bute Co. records in 1770. Evidence leads me to believe he is the James Yarbrough who in 1784 received a grant of 2875 acres in Franklin Co., Georgia, for Revolutionary War services. This James and his eldest son were killed by Indians not long after settling in Georgia. Heirs to his land, which we assume are his children, were: Groves, Joshua, Susanna, Mary, John, Jeremiah, Elizabeth and the wives of Anderson Berry and Jesse Bowden. The fact that one of his sons was named Joshua and that three Yarbroughs thought to be James's brother, Joshua, Jrs.'s sons--Gideon, Jeptha, and Benjamin joined the family in Franklin Co., GA, by 1804 convinces me that this James is indeed James, son of Joshua and Sarah.

Relationships proven by records

<u>9 Apr 1744</u>. Survey. Thomas Yarbrough, Junr, survey on the head of Whetstone Creek joyning Cabines, his own and his father's line [Thomas Yarbrough, Sr.] 400 acres. Surveys, Amelia County VA, Microfilm Reel 56, pages unnumbered.

<u>17 May 1746</u>. Suit brought against Mr. John Yarbrough, son of Edward. The sheriff's return is not dated. The unpaid account begins in 1732 and continues through May 5, 1734. It is signed by Wm Cown on 15 May 1746 which may be the date the suit was filed. "To the Worshipfull Court of Ameila County Thomspon Bell of London Market humbly sheweth that John Yarbrough is indebted to him by amt L1:17:11 and refuses payment wherefore your petitioner prays judgment against him for the same with cost &c. Outside page of return: "John Yarbrough Son of Edward Yarbrough decd ... Lives on Nottoway in Brunswick or Amelia. Enquire for him at John Ellis's or at his Unkle Thos. Yarbrough. NB I have heard he lives at Roanoak." June 10th 1746, sheriff's return says "not in my baliwick" Sam'l Tarry, Sheriff. Original Loose papers of Amelia County, Va., on file at Virginia State Archives, Richmond, Virginia.

<u>5 June 1746</u>. Samuel, William, Hezeklah & Moses Yarbrough, 1,372 acres in Amelia County, both sides of Little Nottoway River and Mallory's creek, beginning in their father's line [William Yarbrough] on south side of Mallory's creek (very long description follows). Amelia Co. VA Patent Book 25, pp 54-56.

<u>19 Jul 1748</u>. Will of William Yarbrough. Prov. 16 Dec 1748. names: Wife, Elliner (all profits and means of my whole estate together with the work and labour of two Negroes John and Phillip during her widowhood, when she marryes or dyes ...desire is that all my personal estate goods and chattles be equally divided between every one of my beloved children Ann Higgon, Samuel Yarbrough, Carymhaporah Anderson, William Yarbrough, Hezekiah Yarbrough, Moses Yarbrough, Micajah Yarbrough, Priscilla Yarbrough); To son Micajah Yarbrough "Four Hundred Acres of Land where I now live together with the Plantation and all the improvments thereon. To beloved Grand Daughter Priscilla Robertson one negro girl named Hannah. To four sons Samuel Yarbrough, William Yarbrough, Hezekiah Yarbrough and Moses Yarbrough four hundred Acres of Land on the South side of little Nottoway River joyning the lines of Robert Bumpass, John Dyons, and James Hudson. Exrs: Wife Elliner and sons William & Hezekiah. Witnesses: Charles Irby, Richard Yarbrough, Richard Yarbrough, Jr. Amelia County VA Will Book 1, p. 50.

[Karen's comments. This seems to be the only mention of son Micajah in the records. Joshua' named a son Micajah. Also note witnesses Richard Y. and Richard Y. Jr. This is definitely not Richard' as he died in 1702. Richard Y. * was b. ca 1652 and if Richard Yarbrough on will is Richard * then he was aged about 86 at the time the will was signed. Not impossible. If it is not Richard, then we possibly have Richard * and Richard * here.]

June Court 1752. Samuel and Hezekiah Yarbrough presented and acknowledged their deed with livery and seizen endorsed to John Folks. Sarah, wife of sald Samuel, relinquished her right of Dower. Amelia County VA Court Order Book 3, 1751-55, page 53.

[Karen's comment. Samuel and wife Sarah went to North Carolina as is proved by records. Will of Samuel Y. dated 5 November 1769, proved April 1770 in Orange County, NC, names wife Sarah; son William to receive land in Amelia County Virginia "whereon his grandfather lived lying between Cold & Nottoway"; Will also names Daughters Elizabeth, Sarah and Lewcey (all under 18 years of age), sons Samuel and John (both under 21 years of age). Exrs: Wife Sarah, William Yarborough and John Bumpass. Wits: Abraham Womack, Jr., Isaac Johnston & James Evans. Orange Co., NC Will Book A, p. 107. 24 Oct 1770, William and Sarah Yarbrough of province of North Carolina County of Orange sell to George Walton of Amelia County, VA 572 acres in Amelia Co., both sides Mailory's Creek. Amelia County Deed Book 11, p. 268. This could be Samuel's wife Sarah and their son William selling the land.]

JOHN YARBROUGH

On February 12th, John Yarbrough was sick. In fact, he was so sick that the family sent for Dr. William Tarborn who prescribed for John Pictoral Julep and Lascaline solution. The doctor saw him again on February 19th, March 10th and again on March 19th when he prescribed antihysterick Pills and antihysterick mixture. The doctor called again on March 14th and 17th and on this latter date gave him another round of antihysterick mixture. He also gave him a quart of Madeira wine and John was charged not only for the wine, but also the bottle in which it came. Apparently neither the medicine or wine had cured John as on March 20th the doctor called again and this time prescribed a quart of strong Antihysterick Decoction. John now owed the good doctor 3 pounds, shilling and 6 pence.

The doctor returned to see John on March 25th, but John was not there. The visit is entered in Dr. Tarborn's records and there is no charge. By March 26th, 1753, Dr. Tarborn had been to the court to sue for his fee. The Sheriff's return notes that on March 26, 1753 "No inhabitant, he is runaway. Abraham Coche, Sheriff.

On 8 October 1754, John Yarbrough's Virginia estate was attached for the amount of the Dr.'s bil. John still owned land in Virginia. The attachment was placed in the hands of John's brother, Thomas Yarbrough Jun.

On 9 December 1755, Thomas Yarbrough Jr. Was ordered to court and failed to appear as Garishee in the suit by Wm-Tarborn against the Estate of solin Yarbrough who is "absconded." On January 23, 1755, the garnishment was served on Thomas J. and discharged.

On 28 March 1755, John and Betty Yarbrough of North Carolina sold their Amelia County land to James May of Amelia Co., Va. A copy of the original Warrent in Debt and Dr. Tarborn's bill are shown on the following pages.

NOTES: 1. John left Virginia between March 20th and March 25th, 1753.

2. He was apparently still not well when he moved as he got a quart of strong antihysterick Decoction just a few days before leaving. His father, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., also moved to NC about this same time. John and his father may have traveled together.

3. John didn't "abscond" to avoid paying his doctor bill, he simply moved to NC and appears in the Granville Co., NC records.

A Note to researchers of this John Yarbrough line. Jehn appears on the Amelia County, Virginia tithe lists in the home of his father, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., Until 1749. By 1752, John is the head of his own household. He probably married between 1749 and 1752 in Amelia Co. His wife was Elizabeth Hudson, a near neighbor in Amelia Co. Elizabeth is named in her father's will and her husband, John Yarbrough, received her inheritance. Katherine Yarbrough, daughter of John and Elizabeth Yarbrough, married Allen Utley in Franklin Co., NC, 24 Dec 1790. See the 1802 Will of Elizabeth Yarbrough in Cumberland Co., NC in Yarbrough Family Magazine, Vol. 3, No. 8, page 60.

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<u>4 Mar 1754</u>. Will of Hezekiah Yarbrough. Proved 27 Jun 1754. Names sister Priscilla Yarbrough; leaves brother Moses Yarbrough tract "I live on" and his right to a tract of land lying on the fork of the Nottoway. Exr: brother, Moses Yarbrough. Wits: John Smith, Henry Yarbrough & Richard Hold. Amelia County Will Book 1, p. 107.

<u>3 Mar 1756</u>. Will of Moses Yarborough. Prov. 22 Apr 1756. "Very sick & weak" .. leaves sister Priscilla Yarbrough all his lands and estate. Names sister Priscilla executrix. Wits: Thomas Yarbrough; Richard Stone & Henry Yarbrough. Amelia Co. Will Book 1, p. 119.

[Karen's comment. Many researchers believe that the Amelia County Moses Yarbrough was the Moses Yarbrough who appears in the Craven Co., SC records. Here is the proof that he was not.]

25 Sep 1760. Henry Yarborough and wife, Martha, Amelia County, Sell 604 acres to william Jennings of Hanover Co., VA. Amelia Co. Deed Book 7, p. 321.

[Karen's note - This Is Henry Yarborough and wife Martha Robinson who later appear in the Franklin Co., NC records.]

<u>21 Dec 176.</u> Will of Samuel Jurden [Jordan], Parish of Notoway ... "sick & weak" ... names sons: Samuel, William; daughter Hannah Yearbrough; grandson, Edward, son of Samuel; grandson Samuel, son of William. Probated 26 Feb 1761. Amelia County, Virginia, Order Book 6, P. 244;

<u>March 1761</u>. Thomas Yarbrough and Hannah his wife vs Lyddall Bacon and Richard Clough, ex[®] of Samuel Jordon, Dec'd, in Detinue. On the motion of the plaintiffs by their attorney a commission was awarded them to examine and take the deposition of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. an inform witness in this cause and who is about to depart this colony *de bene esse*, giving the defendants legal notice of the time and place of executing the same. Amelia County, Virginia, Order Book 6, P. 244:

[Karen's note: taking a deposition de bene esse - when a deponent might not be available to attend a court the deposition could be ordered taken out of court, even going to the person's home if necessary, before the trial and then the deposition could be used at trial.

"In Detinue - in the old law, this was a case wherein property belonging to one person was loaned to another and then later the person who whom property was loaned refused to return it to the proper owner.

The basis of the suit was Thomas and Hannah maintained a slave, Pat (and her increase) had been given to Hannah by her father many years earlier. When Samuel died, apparently the executors did not want to give Hannah the slave. This suit continued for two years and many witnesses were called and several depositions taken. One of the depositions taken was that of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., the father of Thomas Yarbrough, Jr. By 1761, Thomas Y. Sr. was already a resident of NC.1

DEPOSITION OF THOMAS YARBROUGH [SR]

Thomas Yarbrough aged seventy six years, being first sworn upon the Holy Evangels of Almight God, Deposeth and sayeth that sometime before Thomas Yarbrough the Plaintiff was married to his wife Hannah Daughter of Samuel Jordan deceased, this Deponent was at said Jordans, and heard said Jordan say, he had given his Daughter Hannah five negros, beding, and pewther, together with twenty head of cattle, and further this Deponent says he did not understand said Jorden knew of any contract between his son Thomas and said Jordans Daughter Hannah, That at another time after marriage between this Deponent's son Thomas, and said Jordan's Daughter Hannah, a difference happening between said Jordan and said Thomas the Plaintiff, that this Deponent was called upon to give his Deposition between the Partles, and at that time, he told said Jordan he thought he could not spare all the Negros till his Death, and said Jordan answered that he did not Deny them, and further this Deponent sayeth not. s/John Winn; s/Hampton Wade Original loose documents of Amelia County, Virginia, Virginia State Archives, Richmond, Virginia, copy made from original by Greg Yarbrough.

20 October 1768. Will of Thomas Yarborough. Proven 23 Mar 1769. Names James Yarborough (relationship not given); sons: Jordan & Archibald; daus: Hannah, Mary Jane & Catherine; Wife Hannah, Exr Robert Munford. Wits: Oliver Jeter, John Robertson, Dickerson Jennings, William Jennings.

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Son Jordan given 400 acres of land on Whetstone Creek "whereon James Yarbrough now lives;" Son Jordan also given 200 acres of land of lower part of tract "whereon Thomas Yarbrough now lives" adjoining the lines of Henry Robertson & Giles Nance. Names Grandson Thomas Yarbrough. Amelia County Will Book 2X, p. 271.

[Karen's comment. This is the will of Thomas Yarbrough, <u>Jr.</u>, the son of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. It appears the James Yarbrough mentioned may be James Smith Yarbrough, son of William and Diana (Smith) Yarbrough. This William Yarbrough is the son of William Yarbrough who left the 1748 Amelia County Will - see above. When Jordan Yarbrough's will was proved in Oct 1770, one of the bondsmen was James Smith Yarboro].

<u>3 Jan 1770</u>. Will of Jordan Yarborough Prov. 5 Oct 1770. Names sisters: Janny & Catherine Yarbrough; brother Archibald. Sister Catherine left 200 acres of land "I am now setling." Joseph Winn left 100 acres of land. Brother Archibald left rest of land. Exr. Marston Green & Brother Archibald. Wits: Mary Winn, John Philips, Hannah Yarbrough. Amelia County Will Book 2X, p 332.

[Karen's comment: Jordan Y. was son of Thomas Yarbrough, Jr. (see his will earlier). Jordan names no wife or children. Recall that Thomas Yarbrough Jr. named a grandson Thomas Yarbrough. If Jordan had no son Thomas, by process of elimination, Jordan's brother Archibald must have had the son Thomas Yarbrough. Also, Jordan does not mention his sister Mary, but he leaves land to Joseph Winn. One of the witnesses is Mary Winn. Possibly her husband is Joseph who received the bequest.]

23 Nov 1770. Archibald Yarbrough and wife Anne, of Amelia Co. to William Jennings of Amelia Co; 400 acres adj. Henry Yarbrough. Amelia Co. Deed Book 12, p. 166.

[Karen's comment. According to <u>The Rucker Family Genealogy</u>, Wood, Richmond Virginia, 1932, p. 519: Richard Beasley's 9 Apr 1770 Amelia County VA will (proved 20 Sep 1771, Will Book 2, p. 7) named only son Ambrose, called "Pitts". Wife of Richard Beasley was Nancy Ambrose. Richard Beasley named his grandchildren (children of son Ambrose) as Richard Beasley, Jr., William Beasley and Ann Beasley. Son Ambrose was the executor. Ambrose married Sarah Ryland. Their daughter Nancy (or . Ann) married Archibald Yarborough, son of Thomas & Hannah (Jordan) Yarborough.]

<u>27 Dec 1770</u>. Archibald Yarborough, orphan of Tho. Yarborough, dec. made choice of Ro. Munford, Gt. for his guardian whereof he entd bond with security. Amelia Co. VA Order Book IIA, pages unnumbered.

[Karen's comment. Note that in November Archibald and his wife Anne sold land. Yet, in December a Archibald chose his own guardian. Proves he was over 18 but under 21 years of age in 1770.]

25 June 1772. Ambrose Beasley, Richard Beasley, Sarah Beasley and Ann Yarbrough witnesses for Brooks vs Harper .. Amelia County Order Book IIA, unpaged.

<u>27 Aug 1772</u>. Archibald Yarbrough comes into court and acknowledges that he has received his whole estate from Rob. Munford, Gent., his late guardian and this acquital to be recorded. Amelia County Order Book 11 A, unpaged.

[Karen's comment - he must have reached 21 years of age, making his year of birth ca 1751.]

20 April 1776. It is also my will and desire that all my lands shall be sold by my executors upon twelve months credit and out of the proceeds of the sale of my land it is my will and desire that my executors shall pay to my daughter Patsy Harden three hundred dollars and the ballance (sic) of the money arising from the sale of the land together with all the stock on the plantation at the death of my wife shall be equally divided between all my children or their legal representatives share and share alike. And it is also my will and desire that the crop plantation tools household & kitchen furniture after the death of my wife shall be sold or equally divided amongst my five youngest children to wit Bealle, Elizabeth, Thomas H., John W. and Rebecca Yarbrough or the survivors of them share and share alike to them and their heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my son Bealle (in addition to the foregoing legacies) one negro girl named Charlotte her future issue and increase to him and his heirs forever after the death of my beloved wife.

I give and bequeath to my son John W. (in addition to the foregoing legacies) after the death of my beloved wife one negro girl named Venus with her future issue and increase to him & his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca (in addition to the foregoing legacies) after the death of my beloved wife the following negroes Viz Isham and Esther with the future issue and increase of the female to her and her heirs forever.

It is my will and desire that after the death of my wife the legacy left by the last will and testament of Wiliam Bealle deceased shall be sold by my executors or equally divided amongst my five youngest children Viz. Bealle, Elizabeth, Thomas H., John W. and Rebecca Yarbrough or the survivors of them share & share alike to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I do constitute my beloved wife Elizabeth executrix my son William Yarbrough and my friend Anderson Crawford executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke and annul all other wills or wills heretofore made by me only satisfying and confirming this to be my last will and testament. 





Dear Yarbrough Researchers,

I am writing in regards to our mutual interest in the Yarbrough family. I see from the Yarbrough Family Magazine that you are researching a John Yarbrough, Jr., born ca 1754 Va, who lived for a time in Wake County, NC.

I feel that perhaps my ancestor was also a John Yarbrough. For many years researchers thought Manoah Yarbrough whose estate was administered by Thomas Yarbrough March 31, 1786 in Burke County, Georgia was my ancestor. The belief was that he was married to the Elizabeth Yarbrough who left will in Cumberland County, N.C. in 1804. The theory at the present time is that perhaps this Elizabeth Yarbrough was Elizabeth Hudson who was married to John Yarbrough. I am trying to establish proof of this now.

Elizabeth Yarbrough Will dated 1804 in Cumberland Co., NC mentions sons Littleton, Nimrod and Moses Gilman; daughters: Judith Taylor, Elizabeth Howard, and Frances Youngblood. This will also mentions Catherine Utley and Allen Utley and daughters of Allen Utley: Dorcas Utley, Charelotte Utley, and Temperance Utley. Green Utley is mentioned. Allen Utley was administrator of the estate.

Many of the researchers feel that Catherine Utley was probably a daughter of Elizabeth whom she lived with in her advanced years. The major part of Elizabeth's small estate went to the Utleys.

Now my question to you. In the little research I have been able to do in NC lists the Utley name in Wake Co., NC. I thought perhaps there was some connection to your family. While I realize your John Yarbrough is not the John I am attempting to research, I would appreciate it if you would share your information about your ancestor and the Yarbroughs in Wake Co., NC. I believe my ancestor was born in Virginia also. I won't go into that now because the explaination is rather involved. The information we do have would indicate John was in Franklin Co., NC. Franklin Co. was Bute Co., NC.; before that it was Granville Co., NC.

I have no idea when John was born, but his children would probably have been born around 1760. His sons (if the theory is true) Littleton and Nimrod were in Georgia at the close of the Revolution. Nimrod was my ancestor and I am enclosing the conjectured list of children. There may have been other children; however the boys who are listed are pretty well proven to be his.

This John Yarbrough probably was son of Thomas. Perhaps your John Yarbrough Sr., and Thomas were brothers.

I would appreciate hearing from you. Any information about your line would be appreciated.

There are 345 land entries from Bute County. All of these are abstrac here. Many entries in Bute County belong to grants issued later in Warren and Franklin Counties. The original land entry book is in the North Carolin Archives at Raleigh. There is also a copy in the Franklin County Court How in Louisburg, North Carolina. I have used the original at the Archives, as the Franklin County copy appears to be a later one and contains several erro and at least one emission. There existed four documents for each land grant in this order: entry, warrant, plat, grant. Some of the plats were made on more scraps of paper; others cover a whole page.

The index covers all surnames in the plats and land entries except for the surveyors John Dent, Joseph Hawkins, and William Christmas. Names are indexed by Plat number(P)(same as file number) and by Entry number (E), not page...

My interest in Bute County records stems from the fact that many Bute County families(c. g. Bobe, Beatman, Duke) moved to the part of Ninety Six District, South Carolina that later became Union County.

JOHN YARBROUGH

On February 12th, John Yarbrough was sick. In fact, he was so sick that the family sent for Dr. William Tarborn who prescribed for John Pictoral Julep and Lascaline solution. The doctor saw him again on February 19th, March 10th and again on March 19th when he prescribed antihysterick Pills and antihysterick mixture. The doctor called again on March 14th and 17th and on this latter date gave him another round of antihysterick mixture. He also gave him a quart of Madeira wine and John was charged not only for the wine, but also the bottle in which it came. Apparently neither the medicine or wine had cured John as on March 20th the doctor called again and this time prescribed a quart of strong Antihysterick Decoction. John now owed the good doctor 3 pounds, shilling and 6 pence.

The doctor returned to see John on March 25th, but John was not there. The visit is entered in Dr. Tarborn's records and there is no charge. By March 26th, 1753, Dr. Tarborn had been to the court to sue for his fee. The Sheriff's return notes that on March 26, 1753 "No inhabitant, he is runaway. Abraham Coche, Sheriff.

On 8 October 1754, John Yarbrough's Virginia estate was attached for the amount of the Dr.'s bill. John still owned land in Virginia. The attachment was placed in the hands of John's brother, Thomas Yarbrough Jun.

On 9 December 1755, Thomas Yarbrough Jr. was ordered to court and failed to appear as Garishee in the suit by Wm Tarborn against the Estate of John Yarbrough who is "absconded." On January 23, 1755, the garnishment was served on Thomas Jr. and discharged.

On 28 March 1755, John and Betty Yarbrough <u>of North Carolina</u> sold their Amelia County land to James May of Amelia Co., Va. A copy of the original Warrent in Debt and Dr. Tarborn's bill are shown on the following pages.

NOTES: 1. John left Virginia between March 20th and March 25th, 1753.

2. He was apparently still not well when he moved as he got a quart of strong antihysterick Decoction just a few days before leaving. His father, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., also moved to NC about this same time. John and his father may have traveled together.

3. John didn't "abscond" to avoid paying his doctor bill, he simply moved to NC and appears in the Granville Co., NC records.

A Note to researchers of this John Yarbrough line. John appears on the Amelia County, Virginia tithe lists in the home of his father, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. until 1749. By 1752, John is the head of his own household. He probably married between 1749 and 1752 in Amelia Co. His wife was Elizabeth Hudson, daughter of William Hudson - a near neighbor in Amelia Co. Elizabeth is named in her father's will and her husband, John Yarbrough, received her inheritance. Katherine Yarbrough, daughter of John and Elizabeth Yarbrough, married Allen Utley in Franklin Co., NC, 24 Dec 1790. See the 1802 Will of Elizabeth Yarbrough in Cumberland Co., NC in Yarbrough Family Magazine, Vol. 3, No. 8, page 60.

Outside page of return: "John Yarbrough Son of Edward Yarbrough decd ... Lives on Nottoway in Brunswick or Amelia. Enquire for him at John Ellis's or at his Unkle Thos. Yarbrough. NB I have heard he lives at Roanoak." June 10th 1746, sheriff's return says "not in my baliwick" Sam'l Tarry, Sheriff. Original Loose papers of Amelia County, Va., on file at Virginia State Archives, Richmond, Virginia.

<u>5 June 1746</u>. Samuel, William, Hezekiah & Moses Yarbrough, 1,372 acres in Amelia County, both sides of Little Nottoway River and Mallory's creek, beginning in their father's line [William Yarbrough] on south side of Mallory's creek (very long description follows). Amelia Co. VA Patent Book 25, pp 54-56.

<u>19 Jul 1748</u>. Will of William Yarbrough. Prov. 16 Dec 1748. names: Wife, Elliner (all profits and means of my whole estate together with the work and labour of two Negroes John and Phillip during her widowhood, when she marryes or dyes ...desire is that all my personal estate goods and chattles be equally divided between every one of my beloved children Ann Higgon, Samuel Yarbrough, Carymhaporah Anderson, William Yarbrough, Hezeklah Yarbrough, Moses Yarbrough, Micajah Yarbrough, Priscila Yarbrough); To son Micajah Yarbrough "Four Hundred Acres of Land where I now live together with the Plantation and all the improvments thereon. To beloved Grand Daughter Priscilla Robertson one negro girl named Hannah. To four sons Samuel Yarbrough, William Yarbrough, Hezeklah Yarbrough and Moses Yarbrough four hundred Acres of Land on the South side of little Nottoway River joyning the lines of Robert Bumpass, John Dyons, and James Hudson. Exrs: Wife Elliner and sons William & Hezeklah. Witnesses: Charles Irby, Richard Yarbrough, Richard Yarbrough, Jr. Amelia County VA Will Book 1, p. 50.

[Karen's comments. This seems to be the only mention of son Micajah in the records. Joshua' named a son Micajah. Also note witnesses Richard Y. and Richard Y. Jr. This is definitely not Richard' as he died in 1702. Richard Y. was b. ca 1652 and if Richard Yarbrough on will is Richard' then he was aged about 86 at the time the will was signed. Not impossible. If it is not Richard', then we possibly have Richard' and Richard 'here.]

June Court 1752. Samuel and Hezekiah Yarbrough presented and acknowledged their deed with livery and seizen endorsed to John Folks. Sarah, wife of said Samuel, relinquished her right of Dower. Amelia County VA Court Order Book 3, 1751-55, page 53.

[Karen's comment. Samuel and wife Sarah went to North Carolina as is proved by records. Will of Samuel Y. dated 5 November 1769, proved April 1770 in Orange County, NC, names wife Sarah; son William to receive land in Amelia County Virginia "whereon his grandfather lived lying between Cold & Nottoway"; Will also names Daughters Elizabeth, Sarah and Lewcey (all under 18 years of age), sons Samuel and John (both under 21 years of age). Exrs: Wife Sarah, William Yarborough and John Bumpass. Wits: Abraham Womack, Jr., Isaac Johnston & James Evans. Orange Co., NC Will Book A, p. 107. 24 Oct 1770, William and Sarah Yarbrough of province of North Carolina County of Orange sell to George Walton of Amelia County, VA 572 acres in Amelia Co., both sides Maliory's Creek. Amelia County Deed Book 11, p. 268. This could be Samuel's wife Sarah and their son William selling the land.]

<u>3 Mar 1756</u>. Will of Moses Yarborough. Prov. 22 Apr 1756. "Very sick & weak" .. leaves sister Priscilla Yarbrough all his lands and estate. Names sister Priscilla executrix. Wits: Thomas Yarbrough; Richard Stone & Henry Yarbrough. Amelia Co. Will Book 1, p. 119.

[Karen's comment. Many researchers believe that the Amelia County Moses Yarbrough was the Moses Yarbrough who appears in the Craven Co., SC records. Here is the proof that he was not.]

25 Sep 1760. Henry Yarborough and wife, Martha, Amelia County, Sell 604 acres to william Jennings of Hanover Co., VA. Amelia Co. Deed Book 7, p. 321.

[Karen's note - This is Henry Yarborough and wife Martha Robinson who later appear in the Franklin Co., NC records.]

<u>21 Dec 176.</u> Will of Samuel Jurden [Jordan], Parish of Notoway ... "sick & weak" ... names sons: Samuel, William; daughter Hannah Yearbrough; grandson, Edward, son of Samuel; grandson Samuel, son of William. Probated 26 Feb 1761. Amella County, Virginia, Order Book 6, P. 244;

<u>March 1761</u>. Thomas Yarbrough and Hannah his wife vs Lyddall Bacon and Richard Clough, ex^a of Samuel Jordon, Dec'd, In Detinue. On the motion of the plaintiffs by their attorney a commission was awarded them to examine and take the deposition of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. an inform witness in this cause and who is about to depart this colony *de bene esse*, giving the defendants legal notice of the time and place of executing the same. Amelia County, Virginia, Order Book 6, P. 244:

[Karen's note: taking a deposition de bene esse - when a deponent might not be available to attend a court the deposition could be ordered taken out of court, even going to the person's home if necessary, before the trial and then the deposition could be used at trial.

"In Detinue - In the old law, this was a case wherein property belonging to one person was loaned to another and then later the person who whom property was loaned refused to return it to the proper owner.

The basis of the suit was Thomas and Hannah maintained a slave, Pat (and her increase) had been given to Hannah by her father many years earlier. When Samuel died, apparently the executors did not want to give Hannah the slave. This suit continued for two years and many witnesses were called and several depositions taken. One of the depositions taken was that of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., the father of Thomas Yarbrough, Jr. By 1761, Thomas Y. Sr. was already a resident of NC.]

DEPOSITION OF THOMAS YARBROUGH [SR]

Thomas Yarbrough aged seventy six years, being first sworn upon the Holy Evangels of Almight God, Deposeth and sayeth that sometime before Thomas Yarbrough the Pialntiff was married to his wife Hannah Daughter of Samuel Jordan deceased, this Deponent was at said Jordans, and heard said Jordan say, he had given his Daughter Hannah five negros, beding, and pewther, together with twenty head of cattle, and further this Deponent says he did not understand said Jordan knew of any contract between his son Thomas and said Jordans Daughter Hannah, That at another time after marriage between this Deponent's son Thomas, and said Jordan's Daughter Hannah, a difference happening between said Jordan and said Thomas the Plaintiff, that this Deponent was called upon to give his Deposition between the Parties, and at that time, he told said Jordan he thought he could not spare all the Negros till his Death, and said Jordan answered that he did not Deny them, and further this Deponent sayeth not. s/John Winn; s/Hampton Wade Original loose documents of Amelia County, Virginia, Virginia State Archives, Richmond, Virginia, copy made from original by Greg Yarbrough.



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

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tithes on his sons, Joshua, Jr., and Micajah. In 1766 he lists James as his son on the tax list. Tithes had to be paid on sons beginning at age 16. We know from the tax lists that Joshua had at least three sons.

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Joshua, Sr., received two land grants in Granville County in 1761. Grant #116 was issued 29 July 1761 for 700 acres on the south side of Shocco Creek. (Book 14, p. 109) Grant #156 was issued 5 Dec. 1761 for 700 acres on both sides of Mill Stone run. (Book 14, p. 109) Samuel Yarbrough, also, received a land grant for 260 acres in 1760. John, Manoah, and Henry Yarbrough bought land in Granville Co. before 1760. Manoah was, also, listed in the tax list as son of Thomas Yarbrough.

Soon after getting his grants, Joshua began selling tracts of land from it. Sept. 5, 1761, he sold Thomas Davis 379 acres on Shocco Creek. March 28, 1763, he sold Joshua Nelms 250 acres on Millstone River. On 23 Jan. 1764 he sold his son Micajah Yarbrough 150 acres on Sliding Rock Branch on John Yarbrough's line. Joshua, Jr., witnessed this deed.

In 1764 Bute Co. was formed from that part of Granville County where the Yarbroughs lived and in 1766 Joshua sold 280 acres more of his land to Eley Eley with Green Hill, Manoah Yarbrough and James Yarbrough as witnesses. Then on 3 Aug. 1766 he sold 120 acres where he lived to Green Hill. Eley Eley and Micajah Yarbrough were witnesses. I feel that these to whom he sold land were his sons-in-law or grandsons.

In the 1771 tax list of Bute Co., NC, the following were listed: James Yarbrough, 1 poll; Henry Yarbrough, Jr., 1; Richard Yarbrough, 1; Henry Yarbrough, 6; Midajah Yarbrough, 1; James Yarbrough, 1; Joshua, 2; Zachariah, 1. Yarbroughs found in other records of Granville and Bute Counties which haven't been mentioned were: Littleton Yarbrough, John and wife Elizabeth, Martha wife of Henry Yarbrough, Thomas and Charles.

Except for the three children already mentioned--Joshua, Jr., James, and Micajah--we aren't sure how Joshua is related to the others. Some may, also, be his children; others may be brothers; at least, they must all be closely related, so we've tried to learn something about each of them.

An article on the Yarbrough family, printed in the Lexington, NC, Dispatch, January 5, 1898 states: "Between the years 1729 and 1775, seven brothers of Yarbroughs (from Amelia Co., VA) moved to Louisburg, Franklin Co., North Carolina. Their names were Zachariah, Archibald, Manoah, Alexander, Thomas, Henry, and John." Since over a hundred years had passed between the migration of Yarbroughs and the publication of the article, we must view the story as family legend and probably not completely accurate.

True we have convincing evidence that Zachariah, Manoah, John and Thomas are brothers and all four names are found in Granville and Bute County records; however, the Thomas found in Granville Co. wasn't the brother Thomas. As mentioned before their brother Thomas left a will in Amelia County. Furthermore tax records list Thomas Yarbrough of Granville County as father of Manoah, so that proves an error. Also neither Alexander nor Archibald have been found in the early records of these counties, but Joshua was there and I can't help believing he was one of the brothers.

This is the will of Thomas Yarbrough, <u>Jr.</u>, the son of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. It appears the James Yarbrough mentioned may be James Smith Yarbrough, son of William and Diana (Smith) Yarbrough. This William Yarbrough is the son of William Yarbrough who left the 1748 Amelia County Will - see above. When Jordan Yarbrough's will was proved in Oct 1770, one of the bondsmen was James Smith Yarboro].

<u>3 Jan 1770</u>. Will of Jordan Yarborough Prov. 5 Oct 1770. Names sisters: Janny & Catherine Yarbrough; brother Archibald. Sister Catherine left 200 acres of land "I am now setling." Joseph Winn left 100 acres of land. Brother Archibald left rest of land. Exr. Marston Green & Brother Archibald. Wits: Mary Winn, John Philips, Hannah Yarbrough. Amelia County Will Book 2X, p 332.

[Karen's comment: Jordan Y. was son of Thomas Yarbrough, Jr. (see his will earlier). Jordan names no wife or children. Recall that Thomas Yarbrough Jr. named a grandson Thomas Yarbrough. If Jordan had no son Thomas, by process of elimination, Jordan's brother Archibald must have had the son Thomas Yarbrough. Also, Jordan does not mention his sister Mary, but he leaves land to Joseph Winn. One of the witnesses is Mary Winn. Possibly her husband is Joseph who received the bequest.]

23 Nov 1770. Archibald Yarbrough and wife Anne, of Amelia Co. to William Jennings of Amelia Co; 400 acres adj. Henry Yarbrough. Amelia Co. Deed Book 12, p. 166.

[Karen's comment. According to <u>The Rucker Family Genealogy</u>, Wood, Richmond Virginia, 1932, p. 519: Richard Beasley's 9 Apr 1770 Amelia County VA will (proved 20 Sep 1771, Will Book 2, p. 7) named only son Ambrose, called "Pitts". Wife of Richard Beasley was Nancy Ambrose. Richard Beasley named his grandchildren (children of son Ambrose) as Richard Beasley, Jr., William Beasley and Ann Beasley. Son Ambrose was the executor. Ambrose married Sarah Ryland. Their daughter Nancy (or . Ann) married Archibald Yarborough, son of Thomas & Hannah (Jordan) Yarborough.]

<u>27 Dec 1770</u>. Archibald Yarborough, orphan of Tho. Yarborough, dec. made choice of Ro. Munford, Gt. for his guardian whereof he entd bond with security. Amelia Co. VA Order Book IIA, pages unnumbered.



[Karen's comment - he must have reached 21 years of age, making his year of birth ca 1751.]

20 April 1776. Archibald Yarborough and Ann his wife and Hannah Yarborough, widow of Thomas Yarborough, also Joseph Quinn (or Winn) of the County of Amelia .. sel1 to Marston Green of same co. 70 pounds. 400 acres, a trace of land beginning at Cabiness red Oak, along his line to Thomas Yarbrough Jun corner white oak to Cabiness line ... 400 acres granted to JOSHUA YARBROUGH 20 Jan 1747 and from him conveyed to Richard Stone who conveyed same to Alexander Erskine by deed dated 20 Mar 1748 and conveyed by Alex Erskin to Thomas Yarbrough who devised it by wi11 to Jordon Yarbrough as may appear of record ... 300 acres of said land was given by Jordon Yarbrough by will to his brother the said Archibald and the remaining hundred was given by Jordon Yarbrough to Joseph Quinn (or Winn) as may appear of record in this county court. 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



Karen's Notes:

- 1. Until 1753, the records clearly indicate a Jr. or Sr. with the name Thomas Yarbrough. After 1753, Thomas Yarbrough, Jr. dropped the "Jr." from his signature and there is no Jr. or Sr. shown with the name on any records from the 1761 affidavit, we know Thomas Sr. was still living. However, the fact that there was no longer a need to distinguish between Jr. and Sr. indicates only one of them was in the area.
- 2. Except for being named in the Dec 1755 lawsuit, John Yarbrough's name does not again appear in the Amelia County, VA records.

- 1753 10 Feb. Account book of Dr. William Tarborn ... lists medications given to John Y. and visits to his patient, dating from 10 Feb through March 23, totaling L 3.1.6.

 - 10 Oct. Sheriff's note on the summons says "I have attached in the hands of Thomas Yarbrough and summon him to Court. Richard Booker, Gent., Sheriff"
 - 9 Dec. Thomas Yarbrough failed to appear as Garnishee in suit by William Tarborn against Estate of John Yarbrough who is absconded ... said Thomas Yarbrough is convicted as appears to pay for his costs as is found.

(Karen's note: Above records are from the original loose documents of Amelia County, VA. These records can be searched only with special permission. The papers are very old and brittle and do not appear to have been and the search of the 100 years.

Later countrapport was Thomas Latorow John Yarbrolizh (1997) January 1755 between 1753 when he de NC records. The court document says of of John Y., " so he apparently still owned land in Virginia.

Karen's notes:

I do not know where John Y. went after selling his land in 1776.

At least one researcher thinks he went to Fairfield, SC. I have no proof of this and neither did the researcher who thought he had.

Dorothy Phifer's letter of April 1988 mentions:

23 Dec 1785 - Leroy & Mary Ann Hammond sold 400 acres on Uchee Creek in Columbia County "adj ..Littleberry (sic) and John Yarbrough." Historical Collections: GA DAR, Vol 2, p. 245.

John's brother Manoah had a land grant in St. George's Parish in 1770-1771 (Burke County). Columbia County is very near Burke County and it would seem plausible that John went to live near his brother.

According to notes from Dorothy Phifer, the 1802 Will of Elizabeth Yarbrough in Amberland County, NC, may be the will of John's wife. If this proves out, then perhaps John Y. went to Cumberland County. Elizabeth seems to leave most of her personal property to the family of her daughter, Catharine Utley. This might indicate that either she was living with her daughter, or perhaps the Utley family lived with Elizabeth. Elizabeth leaves no land in her will.

I have no Cumberland Co., NC records except this Will. Are there any records for a John Y in this county?

Question remains -- where did John go when he left Bute Co?


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

That at another time after marriage between this Deponent's son Thomas, and said Jordan's Daughter Hannah, a difference happening between said Jordan and said Thomas the Plaintiff, that this Deponent was called upon to give his Deposition between the Parties, and at that time, he told said Jordan he though he could not spare all the Negros till his Death, and said Jordan answered that he did not Deny them, and further this Deponent sayeth not. 

In April 1761 the court ordered that the deposition of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. "an infirm witness in this cause who is about to depart this colony" be taken. At this time, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., was already a resident of North Carolina as is proven by the tax lists of Granville, presently Franklin Co., NC. Thomas was apparently visiting Virginia at the time of his deposition.

The original deposition was found by Greg Yarbrough among the loose original documents at Richmond, Virginia, where the old country records are stored. The deposition was typed ver batim by Karen Mazock from a copy of the original deposition. Found and typed September, 1983. The original documents of Amelia County are closed to the public and can be searched only with special permission which Greg Yarbrough obtained.

1805 GEORGIA LAND LOTTERY³

By an act of the 1803 Georgia Legislature three new counties were formed within the state: Baldwin, Wayne, and Wilkinson. Grantees for land in these new counties were to be decided by lottery in 1805. Any free white male over twenty years old, a one year resident of Georgia, and a U.S. citizen was entitled to one draw if a bachelor. But if he were married and had a wife and/or minor child, he was entitled to two draws. A widow who was a one year resident of the state and had a minor child was entitled to two draws, also. Minor orphans, or families of minor orphans, with father dead and mother dead or re-married were entitled to one draw.

Each of the following represents an entry in the 1805 lottery. Following the name is the registrant's serial number, and a "P", indicating a prize, or a "B", indicating that a

blank was drawn, and his Georgia county of residence.

Imprimis It is my will and desire that all my just debts should be paid as soon as it can be conveniently done after my death by my executors herein after named.

All the rest and residue of my property both real and personal that I may die possessed I do lend to my beloved wife during her natural life and after her death it is my will and desire that my negro man Frank should be sold and the money to be equally divided between my sons William and James Yarbrough. It is also my will and desire that all my lands shall be sold by my executors upon twelve months credit and out of the proceeds of the sale of my land it is my will and desire that my executors shall pay to my daughter Patsy Harden three hundred dollars and the ballance (sic) of the money arising from the sale of the land together with all the stock on the plantation at the death of my wife shall be equally divided between all my children or their legal representatives share and share alike. And it is also my will and desire that the crop plantation tools household & kitchen furniture after the death of my wife shall be sold or equally divided amongst my five youngest children to wit Bealle, Elizabeth, Thomas H., John W. and Rebecca Yarbrough or the survivors of them share and share alike to them and their heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my son Bealle (in addition to the foregoing legacies) one negro girl named Charlotte her future issue and increase to him and his heirs forever after the death of my beloved wife.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth (in addition to the foregoing legacies) after the death of my wife one negro named Phillis with her future issue and increase to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my son Thomas H. (in addition to the foregoing legacies) after the death of my beloved wife one negro boy named Solomon to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my son John W. (in addition to the foregoing legacies) after the death of my beloved wife one negro girl named Venus with her future issue and increase to him & his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca (in addition to the foregoing legacies) after the death of my beloved wife the following negroes Viz Isham and Esther with the future issue and increase of the female to her and her heirs forever.

It is my will and desire that after the death of my wife the legacy left by the last will and testament of William Bealle deceased shall be sold by my executors or equally divided amongst my five youngest children Viz. Bealle, Elizabeth,
