Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".



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SOLDIERS PENSIONS

Changes in the law and the requirements to be met by war veterans or their widows when applying for a pension are shown in the following chronology.

- 1776 Pensions were granted to maimed soldiers, or those who were unable to support themselves
- 1818 The applicant had to be in want
- 1820 A new law was enacted requiring a soldier to include a schedule of his whole estate with the exception of his clothing and bedding
- 1828 An act was passed granting pensions to all surviving soldiers on the Continental Army. The Treasury Department received and made payments for proven claims. This they did until 1835 when records were transferred to the newly formed Pension Department.

During the seven years between 1828 and 1835, each pensioner was required to make a deposition twice yearly before he received payment. All these papers, together with probate papers have been bound into books. They are stored at the Library of Congress and at National Archives.

ne Yarborough family is indeed of our country's early pioneer es. Yarborough have been here colonial times. Genealogical and records show that there at least three main (Yargh) rough immigrants to the from England before 1800, rd Yarborough to Amelia y, Virginia, in 1653, from nshire, then in 1732; Anthrose rough to Amelia County, Virginia to Amelia County, Virginia and before and 1760 Guy Yarborough to a solve to

generally assumed that most of the Yarboroughs, Yarboros, Yarroughs, Yarboros, Yarroughs, Yarbros, Yarberrys, and Yertys in America today have descended from these three men.

Their sons, grandsons and great sons migrated from Virginia, west into Kentucky and south in to the Carolinas, and thence into Georgia, Tennessee, Alabama and Mississippi. From these states their descendents gradually worked their way into the Louisiana, Arkansas, Texas and Indian territory (Oklahoma) and then pushed on west.

It is of interest to note that once you connect your family line to one of these early Yarborough immigrants, you automatically have one of the longest genealogies anywhere.

The English Yarborough family is one of great antiquity, and can actually be traced back, thanks to old monastery records which were unearthed in World War II bombings, in: an unbroken chain to the year 853 A.D. when the House of Yarburgh was formed by Germund. The family was of Danish origin, and it is generally assumed that its progenitors came into the country (England, known then as Angle-land) during the Danish invasions of about 800 A.D.

The Danes in England, historically being enemies of the Anglo-Saxons, sided with William the Conqueror of Normandy during his invasion of 1066.

As a result, William awarded these Danes with various estates when he came to power. According to records which were extant before World War II, Eustacious de Yarburgh (a déscendent of Germund) was made Lord of Yarburgh Co., Lincoln at this time. It is interesting to learn that Yarburghs are listed in William's Domesday book of 1086.

Not many families have such a rich history, nor can be traced back so far. The Yarborough family is reportedly the eleventh oldest family in England. From the time of their coming to America, Yarb (o) roughs have served their country faithfully and well. They have fought in the American Revolution, the War of 1812, the War for Texas Independence, the Mexican War, the Civil War, World war's I and II, and the Korean and Vietnamese conflicts.

Yarboroughs have served in high governmental positions, especially in the south.

This is a heritage one can be proud to bear.

THE YARRROUGH FAMILY

The Yarbrough family has been closely associated with the Watkins family for many generations. We feel the watkins genealogy will not be complete without a few fact in regards to the Yarbrough family.

As certified by Mr. Wagner, a Herald of the College of Arms, London, England. "The Yarbrough line goes back to 853 A.D. when 'Germund' was the first of the line recorded; Eustacius helped William the Conqueror in the formation of his government in 1066. The house was rewarded by a title; Lord Alvingham (Guy Yarbrough) is titular head of the family today." He declared the "Richard Yarbrough, the immigrant was a member of the above family and came to the Virginia Colony in 1642." Richard died in 1702 and is buried at Cld Blandford Cemetery, near Petersburg, Virginia. (Wm. & Mary Quarterly, Vol. 5 page 233 April 1897).

Richard"s Great grandson, Manoah Yarbrough (son callachariah) was born 1770 in North Carolina, married 16 August 1799 Mary Cunningham, born 12 November 1778, died 24 July 1840, daughter of Joseph Cunningham, born 1738, died 1803 and his wife Ann Burtin, Born 1742, died 1803. Joseph Cunningham was a Revolutionary Soldier.

Manoah and Mary (Cunningham) Yarbrough left their ancestral home in Rowan County, North Carolina in 1822 and made their way west to St. Clair County, Alabama. In 1825 they built a large colonial home, which is still standing today. This home is still owned by descendants of the builder Miss Elizabeth Yarbrough, who has cherished her ancestral home and records for years and years, and her brother, John Live in this lovely old mansion in Ashville, Alabama.

Among the children of Manoah and Mary was Littleton, born 27 July 1802, who married 7 April 1825 Nancy Ashcraft, the daughter of Drury and Nancy (Baker) Ashcraft. Drury a father, Jdyn Ashcraft died in South Carolina in 1815.

Lattleton and Nancy (Ashcraft) Yarbrough were the parents of twelve children. Two of these children married into the Watkins family. See the Watkins Genealogy page 29 this magizine, for the descendants of Reuben and Rebecca (Watkins) Philips, who married descendants of this Yarbrough family.

Colonel (of CSA) George Yarbrough (1826-1898), who moved to Tyler, Smith Co., Texas in 1854, was the son of Littleton and Nancy Yarbrough.

I am a decendent of Jonathan Yarbrough and Delila Abner. Until yesterday, I had not been able to go further, however, Dianne forwarded information sheets to me, that you had sent to her, and it has taken me back two generations -- see #7 and #8 on attached lineage sheet.

I would like to help Dianne if possible -- she has been so very helpful to me. I believe that her line (Groves Yarbrough, son of James Yarbrough, Rev. Soldier,) and my line are connected. There are too many similarities of non-common names for just a coincidence. My grandfather was John Groves Yarbrough. My great, great grandfather was Wyley Yarbrough. Groves Yarbrough's first child was named Wyley. There are also similarities of other names in both our lines, such as Jasper.

I would like very much to correspond with you further on these Yarbroughs, as it seems that we are both decended from the same. I have copied names of those in both NC and SC 1790 censuses -- there are Joseph, Jonathan, James and Ambrose among others.

I am also corresponding with another lady in Fort Worth who is also a decendent of Jonathan and Delila.

I have a little information on a John Yarbrough who was married to an Elizabeth Edwards and I have a list of their children, but they do not match with those on your information sheet. I am confused by this. I would quote more definitely on this, except for the fact that I am at the office, and all of my notes are at home.

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MEMO FROM HUGH LESLIE YARBRO -

I am searching for my grandfather, Joseph Lee Yarbro, my great grandfather, John

Yarbrough, and my great great grandfather, Joseph
(Joe) Yarbrough. (Not sure of the Joseph, but my father, Guy Leslie Yarbro, said that was his name).

My grandfather, Joseph Lee Yarbro, was born August 12, 1861 in Decatur County, Tennessee. Sometime later, he and his family moved to Henderson County in what then was the 19th Civil District with a Post Office address of Juno, Tennessee. Where they lived was near what was called Poplar Springs. My grandfather had a younger brother who died when he was about 10th years old. I do find my grandfather in the Census Records of Henderson County in 1900 with all of his and his wife's children (he married Nellie Taylor on January 18, 1885). At one time, he was a mail carrier, according to my only living Aunt.

I believe I have narrowed it down to two lines and here is the information I have. His father, my great grandfather, married a Martha Ward in Decatur County and this was his Mother. After her death, he married a widow by the name of OGLE and from this union there were born three daughters — mattic, Fumma and Dixie (Elizabeth, I am told) Yarbro. (One varsion has it that they were her children from her marriage to Ogle.) I remember Mattic coming to visit my grandfather and grandmother. There was a Naomi who alwas came with her — do not know the relationship — I thought she was her sister. (My Aunt tells me he was married three times).

In checking the ages in the 1880 Census, it is not likely a wife of 32 years of age has a son 16 years old (actually, 19 years). The rest of the children could likely be theirs. Assuming the "J. L." to be my grandfather supports the fact that he was the only living child. Also, my father, Guy Leslie Yarbro, and my Aunt (Glatha Viola Yarbro) have said that their grandfather and grandmother were born in Tennessee and their great grandparents in North Carolina.

In the 1850 Decatur County Census, there is a Sampson Yarbro with a son John Yarbro. Assuming that this Sampson Yarbro is the father of J. S. Yarbro in the Henderson County Census of 1880 (the ages differ) brings me to this about the Michael that is listed.

My grandfather had an Uncle Mike who went from Decatur County to Omith County, Texas and I have heard him speak of his Uncle Mike. My Uncle Claude Lee Yarbro, just after the turn of the century, went to Texas to work on Uncle Mike's farm. There he met a cousin Laura Belle Yarbrough and they were later married. This Michael was my Aunt Laura Belle's grandfather as listed on the enclosed chart as Cylus Michael Yarbrough.

On an enclosed sheet is William Yarbrough, son of Edmund Yarbro and wife, Sophia Gossett Yarbrough with a son Michael which shows he did go to Smith County, Texas and is buried there. If this is, in fact, the "real" Uncle Michael, then one of his brothers has to be my great grandfather. There is no Joseph Lee (or J. L.) shown in the Unry Yarbrough line in the data I have.

I do not have any information whatsoever on William and Mary's sons, William F. and John T., and neither do I have any information on the J. S. and Sampson Yarbrough.

If you have any information whatsoever on any of these lines, I would appreciate your help as I have been looking for these individuals for years.

My Aunt Glatha (in one of her clearer moments) told me only recently about the connection with the Michael in Texas.


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



Signs Of Spring



Ross W. Hines heard a dove calling on Feb. 25 which has always been a sign of spring is on the way. The daffodilis, buttercups we always incorrectly called them, had been slow coming through the ground. After all, it is hard to push through frozen ground. But just as soon as the temperatures rose, they appeared and have begun to bloom on their short stems.

Two kites were in the air one cold, still day a couple of weeks ago. That seemed to have been a response to the calendar rather than the suitable weather, but more recently many more have been seen fluttering and dipping in the wind on sunny days. The maple tree in the back yard almost resembles a redbud as it begins to bud. The willows are showing green.

On one of the warmer evenings the spring peepers, Hyla crucifers, if you want the scientific name, began their

chorus from the low places.

Spring begins south of us and makes it northward march traveling at around fifteen miles a day, they say. Although we are almost three weeks away from the official date of spring's beginning, there are forerunners or harbingers that make a temporary appearance before the actual date arrives, much in the same way that purple martins send scouts ahead before the main flock arriver.

When we say that spring moves northward at the rate of 15 miles a day we are speaking generally. It seems to us who live in this area that the south side of Chestnut Ridge is more than two days ahead of us. And for some reason West Tennessee seems a week or more ahead of us here.

Several years ago when the post office workers were younger and the substitutes had to swing in slack periods and wait for more work to come in, a good sign of spring was the sound of a baseball smacking the leather mitt as the boys exercised back of the old post office on South Main Street. Back then spring was hearlded by the arrival of hundreds of baby chicks in the mail. From the time of their arrival early in the morning until the carriers went out with them on their routes there was a deafening din. The quiet that followed was most welcome.

Sometimes the sound of chicks was changed by a box of little turkeys among them. Just before Easter there were boxes of brightly dyed ducks for the stores to sell at that

MORE ON CYNTHIA ANN PARKER

Paul Parker of Raus has passed along more informat on the connection of Cynthia Ann Parker's family with B ford County. The book on Cynthia Ann, her capture by Indians and her return to her relatives which is consider to be the most authoritive was written by James T. Shie and published in hard cover in 1886. It was reprinted in $oldsymbol{s}$ back in 1936 for the Texas Centennial. DeShields int viewed survivors of the "raid on Fort Parker" befo writing his book, and those writing on the subject after 1 have relied heavily on DeShields for information. Both books are out of print now. In 1912 he brought out a bo called "Border Wars of Texas" in which he carried t story of Cynthia Ann a bit further by telling of her gover ment grants and reburial in Oklahoma.

In the account of the fall of Parker's Fort in that last bo this information on those Parker's is found:

"The patriarch of the settlement was Elder John Parke seventy-nine years of age. His aged wife, "Granny" Parke was, perhaps, a few years younger. He was a Virginian! birth; resided for a time in Elbert County, Ga., chief reared his family in Bedford County, Tenn.; afterwards li ed for several years in Cole County, Ill., and then moved 1833, to Texas where Parker's Fort was erected in ti tollowing year. Some of the family came to Texas prior, ar others subsequent, to that time.

An article in the Times-Courier, Charleston, Ill., Oct. 1 1975, by Larry Underwood (who probably got his inform tion also from DeShields directly or indirectly) said the "John Parker, a Baptist preacher, was born in Virginia, lied for some time in Georgia, moved to Bedford County Tenn., then journeyed to Illinois, settling in Crawford Cou ty along the Wabash River about 1818.

That story also tells of Quanah Parker, Cynthis Ann's so by Pete Nacona, a Kwahadi Comanche war chief, who too his mother's family name. Quanah, as we have relate earlier in this column, was a chief that led his people o many raids after his mother's capture, but he finall accepted the "white man's ways," and became a friend ! Theodore Hoosevelt. The U.S. Government built Quanah large house in Cache, Oklahoma where he lived with seve or eight wives. Teddy Roosevelt once suggested to Quanal it is reported, that he get rid of all his wives except one

Overbury Genealogy probably had its beginning in Riblical times when our Lord told His people to keep a Book of Remembrances (Malacid 3:16). In recent years, however, interest has increased at an infinitely greater rate then ever before. Today universities are offering courses of study in ancestry and heraldry, libraries are devoting entire departments to genealogy, and societies are being formed to enable members to collect, preserve and share information on family history.

Oerealogy as an interesting pasttime has created an urge for Miriam G. Reeves and myself to search for information relative to our mutual family, the Yarboroughs. With meager first-hand information with which to begin, but with lots of enthusiasm, we started our search. Each branch of the family was contacted, when possible, requesting his sharing Rible and other records. We gratefully acknowledge the information given us by Rebecca McKinney Yarborough, Celia Yarborough and Minnie Yarborough Reynolds, among others.

FOREWORD

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THE YARBOROUGH FAMILY

1653 - 1953

The Yarborough family derived its name from the residence of its forebearers at Yarborough, in the County of Lincolnshire, England. As early as the Worman Conquest in 1066 A.D. Eustacius de Yarborough was Lord of Yarborough in Lincolnshire. He had a long line of descendants, some of whom made their way across the Atlantic and to the New World of America. The year 1653 is believed to have been the time of their arrival in America.

The Tarborough family came to Virginial soon after the discovery and settlement of that colony by the English. The first definite record² of them is found in King William County, where the tax records show that John Tarborough, in 1704, owned 150 acres of land; that Richard Yarborough owned 350 acres; and that Robert Yarborough owned 100 acres in Gloucester County in the same year.

The land records³ of 1720 indicate that Richard Yarborough of King William County owned 450 acres in Spotsylvania County; that William and Richard Yarborough each owned 450 acres which were surveyed in the

same year. In 1722 William Yarborough and Eleanor, his wife, appeared on legal record in the Courts of Virginia. Henry Yarborough registered a land grant on the Nottoway River in 1722. Other records show that Thomas Yarborough owned land in 1727; that Joshua and Richard Yarborough were credited as "Tithables" in Spotsylvania County in 1734.

William and Eleanor Tarborough, mentioned above, had eight children. The five sons were Samuel, William, Exekiel, Moses and Micajah Yarborough. Their daughters were Anne Yarborough Riggins, Carey Yarborough Anderson, and Priscilla Yarborough Robertson. Following his death in 1748, William Tarborough's will was presented for probate in the County Courts of Virginia on December 16, 1748, by his widow, Eleanor Tarborough. A copy of that will appears in this document as Appendix I.

William Yarborough, son of William and Eleanor Yarborough, and his wife, Jarney Yarborough, had six children. The sons were James Dandridge Yarborough, Richard Yarborough, William Yarborough, Oswald Yarborough, and Joseph Yarborough. Their only daughter was Elizabeth Yarborough. The Register of St. Phillip's Church in Charles Town, South Carolina, records the marriage of Jamos Dandridge Yarborough to Miss Ann Miles; of Miss Elizabeth Yarborough to Benjamin Alfred Calhoun

on August 2, 1774; and of Francis Augusta Calhoum to Cornella, daughter of Edward Yarborough.6

Ann Tarborough of Charles Town, South Carolina, for 13 pounds, 11 shillings, sold to Francis Rush Clark, Exq., of Charles Town, 1 Negro woman named Trepp and her child, named Sally. Witness to which sale was Lawrence Perry. Proved: October 22, 1782, before Thos. Skottoew, Jq.7

The second William Yarborough of whom we have record died in 1771. Appendix II to this document is a copy of his will which was presented for probate in the Courts of Virginia on November 18, 1771.

Meet Your Grandfather by General Johnson Haygood vives an account of a battle fought during the Revolution on the plantation on Saluda River of Mr. Samuel Savage. Miss Behethland Foote Moore, daughter of Mrs. Savage and stepdaughter to deceased Mose Yarborough, proved herself a heroine. In later years, she married on June 3, 178h, in District Ninety-Six, Captain William Butler, who became a Major General in the War of 1812. The Behethland Butler Chapter of the D. A. R., Greenville, South Carolina, is named for her.

William Yarborough, son of William and Janney Tarborough, was born in King William County, Virginia, in 1753 and died May 6, 1831,

in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He spent his youth on his father's Virginia plantation, participating in the activities of the period.

Farly in the War of the Revolution, he enlisted in the service and joined the Continentals in South Carolina, serving under Captain Benjamin Tutt for 439 days. WcCrady's South Carolina in the Revolution lists Captain Benjamin Tutt as Commanding Officer on duty in the fortified camp at District Ninety-Six on Sunday morning, November 19, 1775, under the Command of Major Andrew Williamson. It was with this unit that William Yarborough rendered his Revolutionary services. Lewis Yarborough also served in the same unit.

At the conclusion of the war William Yarborough retired to private life and became a plantation owner. He received from the Comptroller General's Office, Columbia, South Carolina, credit for 139 days of service as indicated by Rovolutionary Audit Account No. 52. In further recognition of his service to his country in times of stress, William Yarborough was granted the following:

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: Know Ye, that in pursuance of an act of the general assembly of said state, passed the Twenty-eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy-eight; and of an Ordinance of the state aforesaid, passed the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, for the purpose of securing and granting land within this state

JOHN OLIVER, planter, was living in 1647, in the parish of Hampton, York county, Va., when he made an acknowledgment to Dennis Stevens, merchant, of a debt of 1930 pounds tobacco. In 1648, he, with James Besonth, Francis Flood and Thomas Shaw inventoried the estate of John Hartwell, of Queens breek, deceased. In 1659 he sold to Major Joseph Croshaw a tract of land called "St. Andrews Neck," signing "John Oliver, his [seal]."-York Eccords.

John' Oliver had sons Thomas' and Peter': If others, it is not known. Peter' Oliver (or, as some of the descendants say, Thomas' Oliver) married Anne, daughter of Florance McCartie, of Bruton parish, York county, Va., born 25th June, 1706, (see McCarty

Family).

The unusual masculine name of Florance is repeated often in the Muskerry line of the great McCarthy family, of Ireland (of which was also the Earl of Clanearty, and the Lord of Mount Cashel, titles now extinct). Through their intermarriage with the old Munster royal line of O'Donoghues, the name of Florence is remotely traced also into that family .- (Burke.) Florance McCarty, of the Clodane, and Drishane, county Cork, line, whose daughte; Joan, married John Marshall (whose father, Thomas Marshall, came to Ireland in the expedition of Sir John Wilmot, 1602) was of this Muskerry line (Burke), and some of his Marshall descendants are also in America. Justin MacCartie (as he, himself, spells it), b. 1816, of Castle Carrignavar, county Cork, the great parliamentarian, anti-Parnellite, and author, is now the chief of his name in Ireland, and representative of the oldest existing branch of the once sovercian house of MacCartie (as is also claimed for Justin McCarthy, of St. Paul, Minn., in the United States).

Note.—So far, we have positive knowledge only of Dionysius, Francis, Mary Ann and Eleanor-Correspondence is being carnestly prosecuted to complete the other lines. in South Carolina (1805) Susan Jackson (relative of Governor Jackson), and had one son. He removed from Virginia, through South Carolina, to Elbert county, Ga. (then a part of Wilks county), where he served in the Revolution as captain of a Privateer, and also with General Lincoln at the sieges of Savannah and Augusta; was in the battles of King's Mountain and Kettle Creek, in Wilks county. It is said he also served with General Marion. He was captured by the British and, many years after, would relate to his grandchildren the hardships he, and his family of young children, then endured. His home place, says his grandson, Dr. James Oliver, was in Elbert county, on Beaver Dam creek, near "Stenchcomb Meeting House," where he died and was buried. Another grandson, Wm. T. O. Cook, of Georgia (yet living, 1898, at the age of 90), says he had a place in Wilks county, on the south side of Broad river, in the flatwoods, about three and a quarter miles above the mouth of Wahatchee creek. These lands were afterward owned by his sons, Peter and Rev. Florance McCarthy Oliver. There was a fort near by, called the "Block House" (now Washington), to which the people fled when attacked by Tories and Indians. When the men and boys, and their negro slaves, went to their work they carried guns bashed to their backs, even when ploughing. Wilks county began to be settled in 1770, when the Indian line of frontier was thrown farther out. "The young wife," continues her grandson, "was large and handsome, and gifted with great courage, and generally softened the hardships of her little family by playing to them spirited airs on the violin, of which she was the complete mistress, often dancing to its accompaniment, to the no small delight of her youthful andience. Such was the Nerve of the Women of the Revolution.'

In an old minute book (bound in autanned hog's skin and yet preserved in Wilkes' county, (a.), of the revolutionary proceedings of 1779, in 6 the proceedings of the court, which met at the house of Jacob McLendon, Sr.," about thirteen miles from Heards Fort (now Washington), on the 25th of August, 1779, during which, after a summary trial, nine Tories were declared guilty, and hung in ten days after. Wilks county had neither court house nor jail at the time, and prisoners had to be closely guarded, and all able-bodied men were needed for the common defence, and junger did not feel they could waste the time of men who were auxious to serve their country, an guarding those who had sided with the British, Tories and Indians, in murders, pillage and arson. At the time, Savannah was in the hands of the British, and raiding parties of Tories and Indians disturbed the interior as far up as Augusta, and the people gave short shrift to the marderers when caught.

The Council had fled from Augusta, and established the State government, for a short time, in Wilks county, about six miles north of the site of Washington, and

WILLIAM K. KULBETH (1765-1835): KNOWN HISTORY:

William K. KULBETH (also GALBREATH & KULBREATH) was born c1765, probably in Virginia. He married Mary (Polly) ROBINSON c1798, probably in Montgomery County, North Carolina. rentage for William K. KULBETH is unknown at this writing.

Mary (Polly) RGBINSON was born in Montgomery County, North Carolina c1780 and was the daughter of Tyree ROBINSON (1738-1815) and Mary (Polly) ADAMS (1740-1833) both born in Virginia.

William & Mary are believed to have lived in Montgomery County, N. C. until about 1806 when they moved to Rhea County, Tennessee with the Robinson, Kirksey, Taylor & Powell families. They were in White County, Illinois by 1816 where William purchased land in the name of his son, John Alexander KULDETH. Illinois census records for 1818 & 1820 indicate as many as ten (10) children in the household by that time.

William & Mary lived in White County, Illinois until about 1823 when they moved to Tipton County, Tennessee. They were located there in the 1830 census. William is presumed to have died in Tipton County by 1835. Mary was located in the 1840 census in Fayette County, Tennessee living next to her son, John. At this time, three other persons, believed to be son, Fanoy and two unidentified females were living in the household. The KULBETH and related families lived near the town of Braden, located near the Tipton & Fayette County lines.

Mary moved to Nacogdoches County, Texas (prior to 1850) with her daughter, Nancy D. (Mrs Asher BRANCH). Mary died in that county prior to 1870. To date the exact burial places for William & Mary are unknown. No will or administration has been located for either of them.

Gensus records indicate William & Mary may have had as many as twelve (12) children. is possible that some of those believed to be children were in fact grandchildren or daughters or sons in law. Of the children of William & Mary only five (5) have been identified to date:

John Alexander KULBETH: born c1804, probably in Montgomery County, N. C. He married Julia TROUSDALE in Gallatin County, Ill., on 15 April 1827.

Nancy D. KULBETH: born 1807, probably in Tennessee. She married Asher BRANCH in White County, Illinois on 22 April 1822.

Jane P. KULBETH: born 6 Feb 1808, probably in Tenn. She married Edward YARBROUGH in Tipton County, Tenn. on 19 March 1826.

Elizabeth KULBETH: born c1810, probably in Tenn. She married Amaziah TREAT in White County, Illinois on 10 July 1824. Disappeared after 1838.

Cornelius Fanoy KULBETH: born c1819 in White County, Illinois. Married Mary Ann BEAVER in Fayette County, Tennessee on 26 June 1840. Moved to area of Drew County, Arkansas prior to 1850. Left many descendants.

Early records indicate this family spelled their surname CULBREATH, KULBREATH, GALBREATH, KILBREATH, etc. The signature of William K. KULBETH was found in 1816 and the spelling was KULBETH. That spelling has not been found on any record earlier than 1816. At this writing it is presumed William K. KULBETH descended from the numerous GALBRAITH families that settled in Virginia and North Carolina in the 1700s. The occupation or exact whereabouts of William K. Kulbeth prior to 1816 remains a mystery. It is believed that

(I believe this should be Carter) He left his other sons land "on Elk River in Tenise". It is probable that Anna (Cunningham) Davis and her husband Jonathan had gone to Tenessee and settled

Dear Mrs. Mazock,

I write to inform you of the outcome of the investigation I have made among the official records of the College of Arms concerning Richard Yarburgh, the supposed emigrant to Virginia. Unfortunately, I can not advise you that the searches have yielded a positive result.

In the first instance, I find a pedigree was officially registered here at the Visitation of the county of York, carried out by the Heralds in 1665/6, this pedigree being headed by one Eustacius de Yarborough who is to be identified with the Eustacius mentioned in your letter of 3 March. Sixteenth in descent from this Eustacius is one Edmund Yarburgh of Bulne Hall in the county of York who died 6 May 1631, and who married Sarah, the daughter and coheir of Thomas Wormeley. This pedigree was certified by Thomas Yarburgh of Campsall in the county of York, in the Commission of the Peace for that county, and his brother Edmund Yarburgh of Doncaster, Doctor of Physick, who was then aged 40. These two persons were two of the sons of Edmund and Sarah. In testifying to the pedigree, they referred to their surviving brother, Sir Nicholas Yarburgh, and a sister Frances, the wife of Sir John Reresby. Had they had a brother. Richard, who emigrated to Virginia, it is highly probable that he would have been mentioned.

Sir Nicholas Yarburgh also made an entry in 1666, in which he refers to his cwn son, Richard, a merchant in London, whose elder brother was then aged 27. Clearly this Richard is too young to be identified with the emigrant.

In the 18th century, John Charles Brooke, Somerset Herald of Arms from 1777 to 1794, undertook genealogical work on the above family, the results being lodged in his unofficial private collection. This reveals the existence of a fourth and youngest son for Edmund and Sarah Yarburgh, he being John Yarburgh who died 5 February 1655, aged 24, and who was buried at Bellfries Church, York. Again, no reference is made to any Richard who can be identified with the emigrant.

In the 1930's, extensive work was undertaken on the mediaeval ancestry of Edmund Yarburgh of Bulne Hall. As a result, much of the early part of the 1665/6 pedigree has been discredited. The evidences then collated substantiated the pedigree back to one Germund who was living in 1093. Eustacius de Yarborough does not feature in this more recent registration.

At the Visitation of the county of Lincoln, carried out by the Heralds in 1634, a further pedigree was entered, the same being headed by Charles Yarbrough of Yarbrough in the county of Lincoln, the latter's cousin being Francis, the father of Edmund Yarburgh of Bulne Hall. Although this pedigree covers the period during which Richard Yarburgh, the emigrant, is supposed to have been born, it contains no reference to anyone who can be identified with him.

In the private papers of Arthur Larken, Richmond Herald at the end of the 19th century, I find extensive Yarborough material relating to several families of that surname residing in Lincolnshire, in particular the Yarboroughs of Alvingham and of Covenham St. Mary at the beginning of the 17th century. Neither of these families has any relevant Richard.

The Alvingham Yarboroughs descend from one Thomas Yerburgh or Yarborough, whose will was dated 1565. Later 20th century registration has been effected for the descendants of the brother of this Thomas, namely Richard Yerburgh of Over Poynton in the county of Lincoln, whose will was dated 1545. Again, no relevant Richard is to be found therein.

In the private papers of Sir Alfred Scott Gatty, who was Garter King of Arms from 1904 until 1918, I have found over 300 folios of Yarbrough evidences. Most of this relates to the Middle Ages. Unfortunately, any later material does not include reference to any Richard who might stand as a possible candidate for Richard the emigrant.

In your letter of 11 April, you refer to one Sir William Yarborough who married Ann, the daughter of Edwin Sandys, Archbishop of York. I find no reference to any Sir William in the recognised lists of Knights. Material relating to the Sandys family shows that the above Ann married Sir William Barn of Woolwich; but no Yarborough connection is noted.

Again, in your letter of 11 April you refer to Richard Yerburgh, aged 22, who married Frances Proctor in 1635, he being then aged 22, and of St. Dunstan's in the West. This possible Richard is rendered less likely by a subsequent entry at St. Dunstan's. This entry concerns the burial of "Frances Yarberrow buryed in ye Chancell from St. Martin's in ye Fields" on 14 May 1680. It seems probable that this burial relates to the Frances Proctor of 1635 marriage, thus making it unlikely that her husband, Richard, had emigrated to Virginia.

You make interesting reference to Edmund Yarroborrow, son of Edmund Yarroborrow "late of York", who subsequent to 1646 was apparently still under age. Again, this man would appear to be just too young to be identified with Edmund Yarbrough, the son of Edmund of Bulne Hall. This Edmund is supposed to be 40 in 1665/6.


In the absence of any immediately relevant material in the College of Arms, I am wondering whether an examination has been made of the Mormon microfiche in an endeavour to see whether any possible baptisms for a Richard, or even an Edmund, can be located. This might then give a lead to a precise area in this country where specific searches could be made. I am also wondering whether any further information on Richard might be forthcoming from Virginia. I understand that the name of his wife remains unknown; but possibly any property is less elusive. Property

was frequently named after places in this country, which thus provides a useful lead. At the moment, it would be possible to undertake wider searches among local and national archives; but these would be correspondingly expensive and there cannot be any guarantee of success. For this reason, anything that might provide a clue as to his place of origin would be extremely helpful.

Jarbrough Family Tour

Architecturally the Hall was slightly changed, externally in 1876 when some of the more eccentric parts of the 1855 skyline were removed (notably the staircase towers reverted to their former flat toofs) and internally in 1903. Major changes, of course, were made orior to occupation by the University in 1962. The family had left the Hall at the outbreak of the Second World War, during which the Hall became the Headquarters of 64 Group, Bomber Command. After the war the Hall stood empty for almost twenty years until, with Dr Bernard Fielden as architect, it was converted for use by the University. The :wo wings were gutted of their nineteenth century warren of rooms to provide accommodation in the north wing for the library (subsequently to provide offices for the Registrar's department) and in the south wing for the university's first dining hall (with a new kitchen block to the rear). In the main hall the fireplace and much of the panelling were removed and a new staircase and gallery were built. But the link with the past is intact - Eynns' stucco ceiling, Charles Yarburgh's heraldic panels at the north end, Yarburgh Graeme's heraldic window and the inenfold doors, splendid examples of Victorian craftsmanship at its pest. Other rooms, many with their nineteenth century decorated zeilings and panelling, are little changed, especially the Lesser Hall (G09) and the Morning Room (G12) whilst, above the main entrance, the University's principal administrative building still carries the Yarburgh achievement with its motto "Non est sine pulvere palma".

Introductory Notes on the building and its owners

HESLINGTON HALL

Heslington Hall, as it now stands, is a twentieth century modification of a typical small Elizabethan country house rebuilt in the nineteenth century. The original house, completed about 1568 to the design of a now-unknown architect, was built for Thomas Eynns (Eames, Eymis) and his wife Elizabeth (daughter of Sir Edward Neville). As Secretary and Keeper of the Seal to the Council of the North, Eynns, who came from a Shropshire family, was able to acquire both a moderate fortune and former monastic lands at Lowthorpe, Bugthorpe and Heslington and his new country house symbolised his social and material progress.

Of the original house some parts remain including the two staircase towers, the lower courses of the two wings, much of the courtyard face and, in particular, the pendant stucco ceiling over the great hall which has been compared with the similar ceiling at Gilling Castle and may be the work of the same craftsman.

Eynns died in 1573 and, in 1601, the Hall and the estate were sold by his nephews to the Hesketh family. On the death of Thomas Hesketh III in 1708 the Hall passed, by marriage, into the ownership of the Yarburgh family, where it remained until 1852.

Little happened to the Hall, structurally, during the seventeenth century. Thomas Hesketh I built almshouses in the village and the Hall did not suffer at all during the Civil War even though Fairfax and his army approached York, for the siege of 1644, via Fulford and Heslington and set up cannon on Windmill Hill to fire into the city. In the early eighteenth century the gardens were laid out in formal style. A gazebo, with reflecting rectangular pond and canal, was built and the yew alleys, later to bring the Heslington gardens some modest fame, were planted about 1720. In the great hall Charles Yarburgh (owner, 1754-1789) added a series of heraldic panels, 57 in all, to commemorate all the Yarburgh marriages since the eleventh century. They were all eventually painted over to be rediscovered later and a few still remain.

Socially the Yarburghs achieved their most distinguished match during the early years of their ownership of the Hall when, in 1719, Henrietta Maria, daughter of Anne (Hesketh) and James Yarburgh, married Sir John Vanbrugh who, at the time, was involved in the design of Castle Howard. He does not appear, however, to have had any architectural influence on Heslington Hall. For the rest of the eighteenth century the Yarburghs lived the lives typical of the county squirearchy and the Hall "slumbered in prosperity, sending its patched and commoded daughters to dance country dances in the Long Room


at Scarborough, or to walk minuets at the gree county balls in the Assembly Rooms at York, until it should give them in marriage; an its sons to the militia, or on to the racecourse and to the cockpit". was Henry Yarburgh (owner 1789-1825) who caught the eye of the Revd. Sydney Smith then living in Heslington pending the completio of his new vicarage at Foston. Heslington Hall, he wrote, was "a fin old house of the time of Queen Elizabeth, where resided the last c the squires, with his lady, who looked as though she had walked straigh out of the Ark . . . He was a perfect specimen of the Trullibers of o.c. he smoked, hunted, drank beer at his door with his grooms and doz and spelt over the county paper on Sundays. At first, he heard I wa a Jacobin and a dangerous fellow, and turned aside as I passed: but a length, when he found the peace of the village undisturbed . . . he fire bowed, then called, and at last reached such a pitch of confidence that he used to bring the papers that I might explain the difficult words: him; actually discovered that I had made a joke, laughed till I though he would have died of convulsions, and ended by inviting me to see ... dogs". Henry's brother Nicholas (owner 1825-1852), the last of the line and still referred to locally as 'Major Yarburgh', achieved the family ambition by winning the St Leger in 1839 with his horse Charles XII.

On Nicholas' death the Hall passed into the ownership of his nephev Yarburgh Graeme, the man who, although he already owned and hac rebuilt Sewerby Hall, set about the rebuilding of Heslington Hall. With his architect (P. C. Hardwick who designed the Great Hall of Euston Station) he achieved the virtual destruction of the Elizabethan Hall t. Eynns had built and its replacement by a largely Victorian building. The forecourt face of the building was faithfully restored, a copy of the stone doorway with its two pairs of Corinthian columns replaced the original which was moved into the walled garden; the great hall behind the facade was largely preserved with its original stucco ceiling and Charles Yarburgh's heraldic panels. But the entire garden front, apart from the staircase towers, was re-built and enlarged and the two side wings (one of which had been the stable block) were rebuilt. The sober Elizabethan skyline was punctuated by flamboyant chimney stacks and the two staircase towers were capped with slated pyramids. Inside new panelling, new doors, new rooms and decorative ceilings (many with heraldic devices) replaced the original. The canted bay window of the great hall (dated 1855) received twenty-five stained glass shields display. ing Yarburgh Graeme's personal 'quarterings'. A modest Elizabethan country house became a Victorian mansion of 109 rooms. Outside, the formal eighteenth century garden was re-styled; the rectangular fishpond was grassed over, a new terrace created and much of the available space taken up by an irregularly shaped lake with the inevitable boathouse and dove cote. New stables were built.

Architecturally the Hall was slightly changed, externally in 1876 when some of the more eccentric parts of the 1855 skyline were removed (notably the staircase towers reverted to their former flat :00fs) and internally in 1903. Major changes, of course, were made prior to occupation by the University in 1962. The :wo wings were gutted of their nineteenth century warren of rooms to provide accommodation in the north wing for the library (subsequently to provide offices for the Registrar's department) and in the south wing for the university's first dining hall (with a new kitchen block to the rear). In the main hall the fireplace and much of the panelling were removed and a new staircase and gallery were built. But the link with the past is intact - Eynns' stucco ceiling, Charles Yarburgh's heraldic panels at the north end, Yarburgh Graeme's heraldic window and the inenfold doors, splendid examples of Victorian craftsmanship at its pest. Other rooms, many with their nineteenth century decorated ceilings and panelling, are little changed, especially the Lesser Hall (G09) and the Morning Room (G12) whilst, above the main entrance, the University's principal administrative building still carries the Yarburgh achievement with its motto "Non est sine pulvere palma".





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in Hatfield, which did belong to his brother Symon Wormley, and bought of Edward Wormley, and his manor house of Thorpe in Balne, purchased of Sir Thomas Wentworth, of Wentworth Woodhouse, Kt., he divides between his two daughters. To his nephews Edward, Henry, and Christopher Wormley, and their sister Mary Newsome, he gave £50. (South Yorkshire, Vol. I., p. 175.) To Richard Ramsden, clerk, and preacher at Hatfield, he gave his best cloak; and appointed Mr. Richard Winter, parson of Sprotborough, Mr. James Watt, minister of Snathe, and his grandchildren, Thomas Bosvile, Nicholas Yarburgh, and John Vincent, supervisors. To his sister Moseley, late wife of alderman Moseley, of York, he gave an angell of gold, and desired 7s. 6d. to be bestowed in three prayerbooks, to be given to her two daughters, and to Herbert Thorndike, one of the sons of his said sister's daughter Mary, deceased.

This is an interesting bequest: but the recipient of the prayer-book was not the same who afterwards took part in the Savoy conference of 1662. It appears from the visitation of Lincolnshire, of 1634, (Library of Anglo-Catholic Theology, Thorndike's Works, Vol. VI., p. 266,) that this Herbert was son of Nicholas, who was first cousin to Herbert, prebendary of Westminster, and was then aged seventeen.

By the deed aboys mentioned, Mr. Wormley gave 30s yearly to the poor of Hatfield. Mr. Houses montioned that a license was granted him to eat flesh during Lent, on account of his nickness. The rector of Sprotborough was also Dean of the deanery of Doncaster. He never became proprietor of the peculiar court of Snaith; but that dignity passed to his son-inlaw Edmund Yarburgh, who was also his second wife's nephew, and sole executor to Nicholas Waller, the Benefactor.

Edmund Yarburgh, of Balne Hall, Esq., occurs as proprietor, (jure uxoris,) 11th March, 1624-5, and 22nd October, 1630. He was son of Francis Yarburgh, Esq., of Northampton, serjeant-at-law, of whom a good portrait is preserved at Heslington. His mother was Frances, daughter of Leonard Wray, Esq., of Cusworth, younger brother to Sir Christopher Wray, Kt., Lord Chief Justice of Queen's Bench, from 1573 to 1591. His uncle, Christopher Wray, of Cusworth, by will of 17th October, 1612, "gave to Phillipp Adams, of Owston, all the bookes that have the name of Francis Yarburgh written in them." (See Dugdale's Visitation, pp. 186, 187.) His grandfather, Leonard Wray, by will of 14th August, 1590, gave him £5. 13s. 4d., and to his sister, Elizabeth Yarburgh, £3. 6s. 8d.; and to the poor of Adwick-le-Street, where he was living in 1569, 10s. per annum for ever. For this benefaction he has not had the credit he deserves, as the donor is marked in Lauten's Collectio, (p. 170,) as unknown. His grandmother Wray was Ursula, daughter of Phomas Vicars, Siccosty, and nister to the Benefactor of that name, where liberal and charitable bequest "the poor of many neighbouring towns are still anjoying the bene-(South Yorkskire, I., p. 822)

He was capital seneschal of the manor of Snaith and Cowick, 11th August, 1622, and treasurer for lame soldiers, 2nd Charles, 1626. In the year 1628, it is noted that there was "a good summe to be disbursed to ye maintenance of lame shouldiers, and the prysoners in the gaole." He died 6th May, 1631, and was buried in the church of Snaith the day following. A list of bonds for money due to him is extant, drawn up by the Rev. James Watt, his official; the sum total, including the receipt of Nicholas Waller for £1,860, amounts to £6,359. Among those indebted to him occur his relatives Mr. Leonard Wray, Mr. Vicars, Mrs. Parkins, Mr. Bossevile, of Braithwell; also, Mr. Aske, Mr. Partington, Mr. Lee and his son, Mr. Harebreed, Mr. Norman, of Burton, Mr. George Twissleton, Mr. Trymingham, Mr. Gervase Ricard, Sir Francis Ireland, Mr. Cressie, and Mr Robert Stanley. There is a portrait of him at Heslington. By his wife, Sarah Wormley, he had four sons and one daughter. Frances, married at Snaith, 21st May, 1633, to Sir John Reresby, of Thriburgh, Bart., (South Yorkshire, Vol. II., pp. 39-44,) by whom she had nine children; re-married James Moyser, of Beverley, Esq., (Dugdale's Visitation, Surtees Soc. 212,) by whom she had four sons and one daughter, and died 7th September, 1688. Thomas, baptized at Snaith, 22nd July, 1623, was of Campsall, and died 30th November, 1697, aged 74. (South Yorkshire, Vol. II., pp. 466, 469; Vol. I., p. 57; Burke's Commoners, Vol. II., p. 663.) His great grandfather gave him lands in Usfleet, lately purchased of John Dunn It is not a little singular that the present Mr. Yarburgh, of Campsmount, though not descending from this Thomas, should be third cousin, through the Greames of Sewerby, to the present Mr. Yarburgh, of Heslington, heir-general of Edmund Yarburgh, Esq. His will is dated 6th December, 1694, with codicils of 31st May, 1695, and 26th November, 1696, and was proved 14th March, 1697-8. He entailed Braton-hall, in Campsall, on his sons, charging all his lands with £500. each to his younger children, excepting his wife's jointure, and "that fourth part of Hatfield intailed to me by my mother's will, which is intended to my son Edmund." He desired his son Thomas might have £70. a year at the University, and £100. a year at the Inns of Court. His inventory specifies the hall, the great parlour, the little parlour, the best chamber over the great parlour, the little chamber adjoining the hall chamber, the red chamber, nursery, kitchen chamber, maids' chamber, passage, store chamber, buttery chamber, servant's chamber, wool chamber, store chamber next the garrets, buttery, cellar, kitchen, back kitchen, pastry, dairy, beef-house, brew-house, brew-house chamber, workhouse, corn-chamber, and kilne-house. The personalty amounted to £2,150. 17s.

Edmund, baptized at Snaith, 7th June, 1625, was of Emanuel College, Cambridge, and A.B., January 1644-5: removed to Jesus College, and was M.A., 1648, and Fellew. He was expelled by the solemn League and Covenant, being "a man most devoted to his Church and King." (South Yorkshire, Vol. I., pp. 43-359.)

He was of the city of York, in 1656; in 1665, he took his degree of M.D., and was living at Doncaster, where he practised many years with great success. He was buried in that noble church—which we have lately seen rise from its ashes with even more than its original beauty,-19th May, 1699; and administration of his effects was granted 22nd June following, to his son John, who was baptized 11th March, 1668-9, and is perhaps the same who was A.B. of Christ's College, Cambridge, in 1696. Dr. Yarburgh had seven other sons, all baptized at Doncaster. Thomas, baptized 18th May, 1665; aged four months, 14th September, 1665; buried 7th February, 1669-70; Edmund, baptized May 1667, buried 23rd April, 1668; Nicholas, baptized 28th September, 1671, buried 15th May, 1674; William, baptized 23rd January, 1676-7, buried 17th April, 1677; Stanhope, baptized 14th July, 1674, living in August 1691; Gerard, his youngest son, baptized 9th July, 1678; married at Arksey, 16th February, 1695-6, Ann Ealy, and erected a monument in the church of Hutton Paynell, to the memory of his grandfather, Thomas Stanhope, Esq., of Stotfold, who died 26th August, 1691, and by will dated 13th August, left him half his lands in Hutton Paynell (Miller's Doncaster, p. 284.) I have not found the burial of Dr. Yarburgh's wife, Anne Stanhope. His sixth son, Henry, baptized 19th August, 1675, who voted for Barnby Don, at the general election of 1708, married there, 18th December, 1701, Elizabeth, widow of Antony Gregory, Esq., and daughter of Thomas Farmer, Esq., and had John

baptized there, 13th October, 1702; Thomas, baptized 30th October, 1711; and Edmund, baptized 4th May, 1704; buried there, 23rd April, 1705. (South Yorkshire, Vol. I., p. 217.) His grandfather Stanhope left him half his lands in Hutton Paynell.

John, hantized at Snaith, 21st April, 1629, the youngest son, not named in Sir William Dugdale's Pedigree, was buried at St. Michael-le-Belfrey, York, 3rd February, 1653-4, aged 24 years. (See his M. L. Drake's Eboracum, p. 340.)

Sarah Yarburgh, widow, became Proprietor on her husband's death. The latest bond in which she appears is 1st October, 1663; but she had certainly been more than a year dead and buried. She was baptized at Thorne, 11th June, 1589, and married at Hatfield, 28th May, 1611. In 1635, joined by her son Nicholas, and John Peables Clerk, she gave bond to her own Official; which is a singular instance and a striking proof of what I stated above, (p. 12,) that all public acts were performed by the Commissary. The Proprieter could nominate him; but, once admitted, he exercised a power inherent in his office, derived, not from his patron but from the bishop. The patron of a rectory stands in the same relation to the rector; and the incumbent of a benefice in the same to his stipendiary curate.

In 1640, May 22nd, Nicholas Yarburgh, of Baine, Esq., and Sarah Yarburgh, widow, in consideration of £160, paid by the Rev. James Watt, convey to Sir Christopher Dawney, Bart., and other trustees, a

perpetual rent-charge of £10. per annum, issuing out of 25 acres of land, late belonging to the monastery of Selby, for the use of the said Mr. Watt and his wife; afterwards to a second minister or curate, which shall be an assistant to the other for ever; to be nominated by the said Nicholas Yarburgh and his heirs: with a clause of distress on non-payment. Mrs. Sarah Yarburgh appears to have been a good mother, and excellent woman of business. It seems to have softened the anxiety of her son and daughter-in-law, who were removed so early from their young family, that they could commend their children to her care. A letter addressed to her by her son Nicholas, is an indirect tribute to her worth; and, as it places his amiable character before us, it will more appropriately come in the few notices of him which follow.

She was living at Snaith Hall, 22nd September, 1643. In her will, dated 8th January, 1658-9, proved 23rd August, 1662, she calls herself of the city of York, and desires to be buried near her son John, if she died in that city; but she died at Campsall, and was buried there 17th August, 1662. To her grandson, Sir John Reresby, she gave 20s. to buy him a ring; to the Lady Reresby, her daughter, wife of James Moyser, Esq., of Beverley, a great silver pottinger, and twelve silver spoons. She made her sons Thomas and Edmand Yarburgh, executors; and gave to each of her grand-children, Nicholas, Richard, John, Edmund, Christopher, Elizabeth, and Faith Yarburgh; her grand-children, Edmund Moyser, Gervas, and Edmund Reresby.

the Lady Hoyle, her cousin, she gave the hoope ring, which was her mother's wedding ring. "To the poore £30., at the discretion of my executors, as that they distribute the moste of it to the poore where my estate lyeth, that God hath blessed me with." All the legacies were charged upon "my moiety of West Hall, or Wormley Hall, and my mannor called Storkshold; and lands in Hatfield, Fishlake, Hatfield Woodhouse, Thorne, Sikehouse, Stainforth, Dowsthorpe, and Bramwith, lately purchased of Thomas Bosvile, Esq., and Thomas Vincent, Esq., and Susan his wife and my sister, and other lands in Hatfield, purchased of Lord Carlingford and Sir Robert Anstrother, Kt." (South Yorkshire, Vol. I. pp. 55, 205.) These lands Dame Sarah Yarburgh entailed upon her grandson Nicholas, with remainder to her son Thomas Yarburgh, of Campsall.

Sir Nicholas Yarburgh, Kt., son and heir of Dame Sarah, never was proprietor of the peculiar court. He was "a justice of the peace 16th Charles I., (1640,) and administrator of his majesty's service in the late war." In 1640, October 1st, he is styled Esquire; and in 1642, March 28, Knight. His loyalty cost him a fine of £600, to the parliament; and he seems to have removed from Balne Hall to Snaith Hall, between May 1647, and July 1649. By will dated 30th June 1655, he desires to be buried in Snaith church, near his father; and he was buried there the 22nd August, 1655; no doubt in the chancel, which, as impropriators, his family continue to repair.

His affection for his mether is abundantly shewn by the following letter, which is prefixed to a small volume of manuscript sermons, or heads of University (?) discourses, in Mr. Yarburgh's possession. It was addressed to her from Cambridge, 13th April, 1629; but he took no degree there.

"DEAR MOTHER,

My humble duty remembered, not oblivious of your tender affection toward me, for the which I praise God, that he hath created me sonne to such a mother, whose vigilant care for my good is extraordinary. Now seeing nothing can be more acceptable to you from mee, then my happy successe and proceedinges in piety, I hope these my weake endeavours shall not altogether suffer a repulse, though I confess but small; even as here and there one eare of corne plucked out of a plentifull harvest. Nevertheless, hoping you will accept the will for the deed, I am encouraged to send them, heartily beseeching God to worke the holy operation in you by them; so that God may be glorified, yourselfe edified, and I encouraged to all good actions, Thus, with my humble duty remembered, I take leave.

Your dutifull and obedient Sonne,

NICHOLAS YERBURGHE."

He married at St. Saviour's, York, 26th May, 1638, Mrs. Faith Dawnay, of York, daughter of John Dawnay, Eeq., of Womersley, who died 13th March, and was buried at Snaith, 15th March, 1629-30, aged 36, among his ancestors; in the lifetime of his father,

Sir Thomas Dawney, of Cowick, Kt. Her mother was Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Richard Hutton, of Goldsbrough and Hutton Paynell, Kt., and Justice of King's Bench, (South Yorkshire, Vol. II. p. 143,) who died 26th February, 1638, aged 77, lies buried in the church of St. Dunstan's n the west, Fleet-street, London; where his monument yet remains. Dame Faith Yarburgh's will is dated 30th July, 1656, the preamble being exactly copied from her husband's, and the supervisors being the same, viz.:-John Dawnay, of Cowick, Esq., first Lord Downe, Thomas Yarburgh, of Campsall, Esq., with the addition of Edmund Yarburgh, of the city of York, Esq. Her burial at Snaith, 24th September, 1657, is thus recorded,—"The Lady Faith Yarburgh, of Snaith Hall, that good lady, one of a thousand." Her inventory was taken 18th January, 1657-8, but is unfortunately imperfect: the books in the library were valued at £10.; a clock in the hall £2.; all the plate, being 16lbs. troy weight, £61. 17s.; one black bedd, with furniture, £20. (Whitaker's Richmondshire, Vol. II., p. 334. Whalley, p. 292.)

They had issue first, Thomas, son and heir.

Second Nicholas, baptized 11th October, 1638. "I give to my second son Nicholas Yarburgh, all that moietie or half part of Wormley Hall, in Hatfield, and lands which my mother, Mrs. Sarah Yarburgh, gave unto me in reversion, the part whereof, viz., that was copyhold, I hope the will give him when he comes of age; and I chardge this my said son, that he doe not aliene or sell the same, since it buth anciently belonged to his grand

mother's familie in Hatfield." Will of Sir Nicholas Yarburgh. His mother gave him £200, and commended him to the care of his grandmother, who entailed her lands upon his heirs male, down to the twelfth son, and failing such issue male, upon his heirs female. "Man will not abide in honour." He died within three years; certainly before 15th September, 1665. The freehold portion of the Hatfield estate went to his uncle; the copyhold to his brother Sir Thomas, at whose death the Yarburgh interest in Wormley Hall, ceased. It was mortgaged for £1,200, and he desired it might be sold. It is not a little singular, that every part of the estate bequeathed by Sir Nicholas, except this, about which his mother and himself were so anxious, has remained with his descendants.

Third, Richard, baptized 1st October, 1640, entered at Snaith, and St. Saviour's, York. "To Richard, my third son, £60. per annum, out of those lands I purchased in Yarburgh, in the county of Lincolne; and those lands I purchased of my brother, Thomas Yarburgh, of Campsall, in co York, Esq., lying in Marshland, in the parish of Whitgift." His mother mentions that her son Richard had entered to be apprentice to a merchant in London. His grandmother gave him £50, and he was living in 1666.

Fourth, John, baptized 28th March, 1642; barried in March 1645, at Snaith.

Fifth, John, haptized 1st May, 1645. To John, my fourth son, £60. per annum, which fell to me at the decease of my brother, John Yarburgh, gent? His

mother left him £100., and his grandmother £50. Was he A.B. of St. John's College, Cambridge, in 1664? Or, having an uncle who had already attained eminence in the medical profession, was he M. B. of the University of Cambridge in 1663?

Fifth, Edmund, baptized 16th September, 1651. "To my fifth son, £60. per annum, and the tythes of Cowick." His mother gave him £100., and his grandmother £50. He was buried at Holy Trinity church, York, 8th October, 1694.

Sixth, Christopher, baptized 9th May, 1654. "To Christopher, my sixth son, £60. per annum out of my lands whatsoever, and tythes in Balne and Balnecroft." His mother gave him £100, and his grandmother £50.

Elizabeth Yarburgh, was baptized at Snaith, 25th May, 1647; married there 13th January, 1669-70, Henry Laton, Esq., of Rawden, who died 18th October, 1705, aged 83, and died without issue in 1702, aged 55. (Thoresby's Leeds, ed. Whitaker, p. 260.)

Faith Yarburgh, was baptized at Snaith, 12th July, 1649, and married Marmaduke Constable, Esq., of Wassand, who was baptized at Sigglesthorne, 25th July, 1642, and buried at Goxhill, July, 1690. (Poulson's Holderness, Vol. I., pp. 313-431.) They had issue; Martha, baptized 12th December, 1667, at St. Mary's, Beverley; Katherine, Mary, Marmaduke, Nicholas, Thomas, Faith, and Henrietta Maria. Their sole surviving son, Yarburgh Constable, baptized at Sigglesthorne, 26th September, 1676, married Restoft, and died

4th June, 1731. (Scaum's Beverlac, Vol. II., p. 702,) From him are descended Mary, wife of Sir George Strickland, Bart., of Boynton; Frances, wife of the Ven. W. H. E. Bentinck, Archdeacon of Westminster; the Nevilles of Thorney; (See p. 53,) and the Bests, of Elmswell, in Yorkshire, and Donnington Castle in Berkshire. There is a portrait of Mrs. Constable, at Wassand. Her brother, Sir Thomas Yarburgh, left her £10, in token of his affection; and her nephew Blagge Yarburgh, three guineas. She was buried 20th October, 1721, at St. Mary's, Beverley.

It seems presumptuous to allude to the deficiencies of so great a genealogist as Sir William Dugdale. "Allured," and "Hildyard," are names which might easily be confounded. But the omission of a whole generation, namely, of that Marmaduke Constable who married Elizabeth Shirley, and died in 1607, is a serious error. (See his Visitation, p. 335, and Poulson's Holderness, Vol. I., p. 431.) The same thing has been done in the pedigree of Hammond of Scarthingwell. (Visitation, p. 878.) William, who married Frances, daughter of Sir Thomas Metham, and made his will 2nd November, 1590, had a son Bryan, who died before his father. He left by his wife Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Robert Stapleton, a son and heir, Bryan, (who merried Sarah, daughter of Gervase Crossey, Esq.,) Francis, and John, who were hving 29th September, 1611, when their brother Bryan made his will.

Mrs. Laton, and Mrs. Constable, are thus mentioned by their father; "I bequeath to either of my daughters,"

viz., Elizabeth and Faith Yarburgh, a thousand marks a peece, to be paid out of all the lands my father or I purchased in Balne, Pollington, Snaith, Campsall, and Askerne; and if my eldest son Thomas Yarburgh, Esq., shall deny, refuse, or abstract the payment, the lands to go to my younger children, and their heirs; my two daughters first receiving five hundred marks a peece."

And by their mother thus:—"To my two daughters, Elizabeth and Faith Yarburgh, if they will be advised in their marriage by their guardians and uncles, £150. each; their grandmother, Mrs. Sarah Yarburgh, my mother-in-law, to be their guardian." Their grandmother gave each of them £200. by her last will.

Sir Thomas Yarburgh, Kt., succeeded his grandmother, Dame Sarah Yarburgh, as Proprietor of the peculiar and spiritual jurisdiction. He had from her as a legacy, "a silver salt-cellar, twelve silver spoons with knopps, a gilt tun, with a cover; and two broad wyne bowles, guilded; all which was the plate of his father's grandfather." The earliest bond given to him is dated 10th February, 1663-4, and the latest, 22nd April, 1713.

It might at first sight appear, from the care his father Sir Nicholas took to secure the portions left to his two daughters, that there was some doubt as to his noting honourably by them. His mother also expresses the hope that he would be kind to them.—"My earnest desire to my son Thomas Yarburgh is, and by the tender bowels of a mother, I require, as God made him, (being any sidest son.) the heads of his father's family, that he will behave himself towards his brethren and sisters as

becometh the head towards the members, vizt., becomingly, prewdently, and faithfully." There is every reason to believe that this affectionate appeal was cordially responded to.

Sir Thomas Yarburgh was born at Snaith Hall, 19th August, and baptized 29th August, 1637. He was High Sheriff of Yorkshire in 1673, and Member for Pontefract in 1685 and 1688. In conjunction with his uncle John, first Viscount Downe, (who was buried at Snaith, 9th Oct., 1695,) he was instrumental in defeating a bill, introduced into the House, to place the management of the Levels of Hatfield on the footing contemplated by Sir Cornelius Vermuyden. (Hunter's South Yorkshire, Vol. I., p. 167.) There is a portrait of him at Heslington. Affidavit was made before Sir Thomas Yarburgh, at Snaith, 6th November, 1688, and he was living there, 29th June 1700, where he gave bond to Catherine, Queen Dowager, as receiver of her revenues in the honours of Knaresborough, Pickering, Pontefract, and Tickhill. This post he held in 1690. His will is dated 29th August, 1709, and was proved at at York, 12th April, 1716. He is described as of the parish of St. James, Middlesex; and in that parish he died. He gave £50. to the poor of Snaith and Cowick; and this is, I conceive, the benefaction specified by Mr. Lawton, (Collectio, p. 156,) as now lost. In 1741, it was in the hands of Mr. John Simpson. Geo. Hickes, D.D., Daniel Thornbury, and N. Spinckes were witnesses to his will; of which this notable sentence forms the soundance. I desire to die as

I have endeavoured to live, in the communion of the church of England; which, since the Reformation, I believe to be a true branch of the Catholic Church."

An inventory of goods at Snaith Hall, was taken on the 5th of April, 1716. Most of the rooms were empty; but two bedrooms appear to have been fully furnished. In the white room was a bedstead with blew mohair curtains; in the room called the Alcove, a bedstead with silk damask curtains. It specifies also the hall, parlour, drawing-room, the great room above stairs, the passage, the kitchen, back kitchen, cellar, pantry, the room over the back kitchen, another little room, the nursery; Mr. Dobson's room, Mrs. Margaret Yarburgh's room; brown room, green room, Indian room, and men-servants' chamber. Mr. Bywater, steward to Sir Thomas, stated that the arrears of rent were £391. 5s. Exactly the same number of rooms is mentioned in Dame Faith Yarburgh's inventory in 1658.

He married, not later than March, 1662-3, Henrietta Maria, eldest daughter and coheir of Colonel Thomas Blagge, governor of Wallingford, and groom of the bedchamber to King Charles the Martyr. At the Restoration, this gallant soldier was made Governor of Portsmouth and of Landguard Fort, but died 14th Revember, 1660, and was buried in Westminster Abbey. (Anteny Wood's Life, ed. Bliss., p. 23. Evelyn's Life of Michael Bishop of Oxford, pp. 254, 255.) Her mother was Mary, daughter of Regge North, Kt., of Midenhall, and a person, if

we may believe Evelys, of great piety and esself (Evelyn's Godelphin, p. 6.) Lady Yarburgh's character has been most unjustly aspersed by Anthony Hamilton in his Memoirs of Grammost. The worst that he says of her is no more than this that her eyes were. small, her eyelashes long and white, and her complexion sallow: that she did not understand French, and was coquettish and ridiculous. (Gramment, Walpole's Strawberry Hill edition, 1772, pp. 95, 97, 195, 189 London edition, 1811, pp. 165, 169, 176, 183.) Yet Hamilton declares that the Duchess of York, to whom she was Maid of honour till her marriage, "had so just a discernment of merit, that whoever of either sex were possessed of it, were sure to be distinguished by her." Had there been the smallest misconduct on the part of the eldest sister, it is incredible that this virtuous Princess should have demanded her younger sisters Margaret, (the wife of Sydney Godolphin,) and Mary, (who held that post so late as 1669, and was living unmarried in 1678,) as her Maids of honour. Nor could the Duke of York, with any decency, have stood godfather to her first child. Nor is it likely that Queen Catharine of Braganza would have received her eldest daughter, Henrietta Maria, as her Maid of honour. Her husband, at whom Hamilton sneers, simply because he had flaxen hair, made her sole executrix of his will. And it is interesting to know that a quarto book of 98 pages is preserved at Heslington, entitled "My Lady Yarburgh's Book of Meditations, made by herself when she lived at Snaith Hall." There Temple, Hishop Gunning, spiritual adviser of her sister, Mrs. Godolphin, and other writers, transcribed at great length; and the selection shows a deep religious feeling. One sentence is almost prophetic—"My best actions and endeavours have had no other effect than to make me ill thought of, even by those I most designed to oblige."

Lady Yarburgh was living at Snaith Hall so late as 21st October, 1693; and with her husband, in the parish of St. James, Middlesex, when he made his will; and also 25th September, 1710, when Mr. William Dobson, of Snaith, left her five guineas for a ring. She died before her husband.

There are portraits of Lady Yarburgh, and of Mrs. Godolphin, by Sir Peter Lely, at Heslington. There are also portraits of Sydney Lord Godolphin; of Charles the Second; James the Second (by Wissing); Charles the First, (after Vandyke,) and his Queen, Henrietta Maria; of the great Duke of Marlborough; Bishop Juxon; Lord Leicester; Queen Elizabeth; the Duchess of Orleans, (by Sir Peter Lely); of William the Third; of Henry Prince of Wales, son of James the First; the Duchess of Grafton, by Sir Godfrey Kneller; Queen Mary, Queen Anne; Sir Thomas Hesketh; Archbishop Warham; and other persons of note.

She had sixteen children, of whom all, except four, were baptized at Snaith; where six of them, who died infants, were buried. They were Nicholas, baptized 22nd October, 1666, buried 23rd October, 1670;

George, baptized 28th March, buried 11th October. 1671; Elizabeth, baptized 30th September, 1672, buried 29th January, 1672-3; Nicholas, baptized 5th March, 1673-4, buried 14th December, 1674; Ann, baptized 15th November, 1677, buried 15th February, 1677-8; Charles, buried 16th January, 1680-1.

Rosamond, baptized 13th Aug. 1687, was in 1707 the wife of Nicholas Polexfin, Esq., who was appointed 20th May 1710, one of the commissioners of excise in England, at a salary of £800 a year. Her father gave her £3000 as her portion, and £20 as a mark of his affection.

Faith, baptized 6th December, 1683, never married. Her father left her £1,400; and she was executor to the will of her brother Blagge Yarburgh. She made her will 25th May, 1758, giving £5 to the poor of Snaith, and £5 to the poor of St. Saviour's, York; and "to ye old mades out of Bowdam Barr Hospitall, ten genneys; to my cosen Mrs. Best, ten genneys, and my smolest diamond ring; and to her daughter Rose, thirty genneys, and my watch with ye pickture in ye middle, and my earings with ye green drops to them. To Mrs. Smith's daughters, a pare of sillver candlesticks and candle cup and gold watch that their aunt Dawney gave to mee. To ye Infirmary in this towne £50, and to ye two charity schools for girls and boys £20," She was buried at St. Saviour's church, 8th June, 1760; and her will was proved the following day:

Margaret, whose baptism I have not found, was the second daughter, and in 1707, wife of Giles Cutting.

Req. Her marriage persion was £2,000.

Henrietta Maria, baptized 8th October, 1667, was maid of honour to Queen Catherine, and afterwards to Queen Mary, Her father gave her a portion of £6,000, and she married at Snaith, 29th March, 1688, Sir Marmaduke Wyvill, Bart., who died in 1722. (Whitaker's Richmondshire, Vol. I. p. 322.) Of her eight children, Anne was maid of honour to Queen Anne; and Henrietta Maria was living unmarried in 1756. Lady Wyvill died 15th August, 1738, aged 69, and was buried on the 17th August, in the chancel of St. Lawrence, York.

Thomas, baptized 26th February, 1665-6, is noticed in Dugdale's Visitation. His father left him an estate at Winthorpe, in the county of Lincoln; which, in consequence of his decease before 1724, unmarried, went to his brother James, and still forms part of the Yarburgh estate.

Richard, baptized 1st November, 1680, was living unmarried in 1707. His father had advanced £1,000. to buy him a partnership with Mr. Mollineux, Woollendraper, in St. Paul's Churchyard.

Charles, baptized 17th July, 1682, went to sea, and returned home to die (I suppose in London) before the date of his father's will.

Blagge, whose baptism I have not found, was the third surviving son. He had £200 from his father, and an annuity of £100 a year. In 1716, he is described as of the city of York, and was trustee to the full of his brother James; to whose younger children acted as guardian. He made his will 30th April, 221, and divers codicils 10th April, 10th June, 21st

September, 1738; and it was proved 19th March, 1739-40. To his nephew Henry, he gave his silver-hilted sword, his gold-handed cane, and his case of pistols. He made his sister Faith executrix; and considerately, (for local superstitions are not of modern growth,) adds, "I would have no Minster Bell toule for me." He was buried at St. Saviours, 13th March, 1739-40, unmarried.

Sir Thomas Yarburgh is said in Burke's Commoners, (Vol. III., p. 664,) to have another daughter, Alice; who died unmarried, at New Windsor, 12th March, 1786, aged 97; the queen giving her a pension, inasmuch as she had outlived all her nearest connexions. (See the Gentleman's Magazine, and Noble's Continuation of Granger's Biographical History, Vol. I. p. 360.) She had been maid of honour to Queen Anne, and is alleged to have been introduced at court by her maternal aunt, Mrs. Godolphin. This could not have been the case, as Mrs. Godolphin died in 1678, eleven years before her pretended niece was born. No such person is mentioned by Sir Thomas Yarburgh, or his three children, in their last wills. And one who had a brother's son living, could not be said to have survived all her nearest connexions. Yet, as regards the possibility of the case, there is no difficulty. Thomas Yarburgh, of Campsmount, who was baptized 23rd May, 1687, died 1st September, 1772. Mrs. Douglas Tyrwhitt, of Gayton-in-the-Wold, county of Lincoln, who was born in 1597, on the 13th December, 1703, gave 10s. yearly to the poor of Horncastle. (Information furnished by Lord Monson to the editor of Thorndike's Works, Vol. VI., p. 148.) A collateral ancestor of Lord Brougham, who died in 1789, is said to have been born in 1683. Mrs. Barbara Davye, born in 1669, died in 1765; Mrs. Elizabeth Davye, born in 1670, died in 1767; as a brass plate, in the church of St. Helen's, York, testifies.

James Tarburgh, Esq., occur as Proprietor, 20th January, 1715-6; after which date the Officials only are named in the bonds or marriage licenses. He was godson to King James the Second, and one of the royal pages; and was aged eighteen months, 14th September, 1665. He became lieutenant-colonel of horse, and aidecamp to the great Duke of Marlborough. On the 31st October, 1692, he had licence to marry Ann, elder daughter and coheir of Thomas Hesketh, Esq., of Heslington, by Margaret, daughter of John Calverley, Esq., of Eryholme, County of York; and Littleburne, County Palatine of Durham; eventually sole heir to her brother, Sir Henry Calverley, Kt., of whom there is a portrait at Langton Hall. The younger daughter, Mary, baptized 8th October, 1678, married 12th September, 1693, Fairfax Norcliffe, Esq., colonel of horse, High Sheriff of Yorkshire, in the years 1700, and 1715; and was buried in Ripon Minster, 17th November, 1739. (Burke's Commoners, II. 631.) To her son Thomas Norcliffe, General James Wolfe, father of the Hero of Quebec, addressed a letter, descriptive of the battle of Culloden, in which he commanded a regiment; which is now in the possession of Major-General Norcliffe, K. H., of Langton.

Upon this marriage, the Hall at Snaith was deserted, as Balne Hall, had been previously; and Colonel Yarburgh, on the death of their father, 8th January, 1707-8, went to live at Heslington Hall: but these ladies continued as joint tenants of the Manor and main Estate; and it was not till the year 1793, that a partition was made, when Henry Yarburgh, Esq., purchased some considerable portion of the share which fell to him, from his cousin, Thomas Norcliffe, Esq., Captain in the army, and Lieut-Colonel Commandant of the York Volunteers.

Sir Thomas Yarburgh assigned lands in Balne, Womersley, and divers townships adjoining, for his son's immediate maintenance, to the value of £400. a year; and gave him £600. a year in reversion. He appears as lord of the manor of Snaith and Cowick, by lease from the crown, at the court holden 5th February, 1730-1. Mrs. Yarburgh was born 2nd April, and baptized 8th April, 1676; died the 19th April, 1718, and was buried next day, at St. Lawrence, York; a week after her confinement. She is described on her gravestone as "a woman excellent in all the dutyes of life, whither we regard her as a Christian, a-wife, a parent, or a friend. Of whom the world was not worthy." Her husband, by will of 15th March, 1723-4, desired to be buried with her, and no inscription to be placed on his stone: and was buried there 9th March, 1730-1. He gave his daughter Ann, his white japanned cabinet; his son Henry the chest of drawers in his bedchamber; his son James his "scrutore;" his son Hesketh the "scrutore" in his closet; to his son Charles the "burroy" in his closett: and desired that the cabinet in the great dining room (which had probably been a present from the Duchess of York to his mother on her marriage) to remain in the house as an heir-loom for ever. There are two portraits of Colonel Yarburgh, at Heslington. He had twelve children.

Henrietta Maria, first child, was horn and haptized (at St. Lawrence, York,) 13th October, 1693; and married there 14th January, 1718-9, John Vanburgh, of Castle-Howard, Esq., celebrated as a dramatist and architect; who was afterwards made a knight, Clarencieux king-at-arms, and comptroller of his Majesty's works. Blenheim and Castle-Howard are his best known works; and from his design were built Duncombe Park and Robin Hood's Well near Doncaster. (South Yorkshire, Vol. II. p. 488. See the Lives of Eminent Englishmen, p. 382. Queens of Society, pp. 40, 41. Walpole's Painters, Vol. III. pp. 151-155. Anthony Wood's Life, ed. Bliss.) They had only one son, Charles, an ensign in the army, who died in 1745, from wounds received at the battle of Tournay. Lady Vanburgh, who was left a widow 25th March, 1726, appears to have been joint lady of the manor of Snaith 16th April, 1731, and died 22nd April, 1776, aged 86. Her will bears date 15th June, 1769.

James, born 22nd October, and baptized 7th November, 1698; was buried 3rd November, 1699, at St. Lawrence. Edward, baptized 13th February, 1699-1700, at Holy Trinity, Goodramgate, was buried

the 20th March following, at St. Lawrence. James, baptized 27th October, 1702, at Holy Trinity, Goodramgate; died unmarried, 3rd April, and was buried 5th April, 1740, at St. Lawrence. His will is dated 28th February, 1739-40, and was proved 15th September, 1740. Nicholas, baptized at St. Michael-le-Belfrey, 23rd June, 1704, died 6th September, buried at St. Lawrence, 28th September, 1716; aged 12. M. I. Ann Margaret, baptized at St. Michael-le-Belfrey, 5th December, 1705; buried at St. Lawrence, 20th December, 1715. Rosamond, born 7th January, 1707-8; died the 15th Angust, and was buried at St. Lawrence, 17th August, 1722, aged 14. M. I.

Ann, born 13th April, 1718, being Easter-day, and baptized 10th May following; was living 16th April, 1731, as lady of the manor of Snaith, which came to her by her father's will. She had also lands called Swailes, between Balne and Pollington, formerly a rabbit-warren; and lands in Balne and Heslington. She died unmarried at Whitehall, in March 1738.

Thomas, son and heir, succeeded to estates settled on him. His father cut him off with a shilling; "he having very unhandsomely disposed of himself in marriage without consulting me." He was born 1st February, and baptized 16th February, 1696-7; is described as of Sandhutton, 15th November, 1722: made his will 6th March, 1740-1; and was buried 10th December, 1741, at St. Lawrence. His wife Ann, daughter of the Rev. Thomas Thwaites, in 1740 gave a silver waiter to the church of St. Lawrence; in

which she was buried 27th March, 1753, aged 61. Her will bears date 29th December, 1752.

Henry, born on St. Bartholomew's day, 24th August, and baptized at Holy Trinity, Goodramgate, 4th September, 1707, succeeded his brother. His father had given him half of Winthorpe and Yarburgh, in the county of Lincoln; and he appears as lord of the manor of Snaith and Cowick, 4th May, 1732. His will is dated 12th January, 1746-7, and he was buried at St. Lawrence the 16th January following, unmarried.

Hesketh, born 26th May, baptized 8th June, 1714, succeeded his brother Henry. He had a house and garth at Hayton, by the will of his grandfather's cousin german, Mary Hesketh of York, spinster, dated 25th September, 1718. Was buried 15th May, 1754, at St. Lawrence, unmarried. Administration was granted 25th February, 1758.

Charles Yarburgh, Esq., eleventh child, and eighth, but sole surviving son, became proprietor on the death of his brother. He was born 10th May, 1716, being Ascension-day, and baptized the same day at St. Michael-le-Belfrey. He was a scholar of University College, Oxford, of which his cousin Francis Yarburgh of Campsall was then fellow, and took his degree of M. A. in 1741. He died 6th August, and was buried 10th August, 1789, at St. Lawrence. I think it quite unnecessary to specify the subsequent descent of the Rectory, and estates of Snaith and Heslington, because it is fully detailed in Burke's Commoners, (Vol. III. pp. 661-5.) In Burke's Royal

Descents, (Vol. I, Pedigree cz.) a whole generation, namely the father and mother of Mrs. Yarburgh and Mrs. Norcliffe, has been omitted.

On the death of Nicholas Edmund Yarburgh, Esq., who died 6th August, 1852, and was buried the 13th August, at St. Lawrence, his nephew Yarburgh Greame Esq., of Sewerby, assumed the name and arms of Yarburgh, and was High Sheriff of Yorkshire in 1849. (Burke's Commoners, Vol. II, p. 590.) He built a church and school at Sewerby; and re-edified the ancient hall at Heslington, which was originally built by Thomas Eymes, Esq., in 1568; it is said, for the reception of Queen Elizabeth. (See Pope's Maternal Ancestry, by R. Davies, Esq., F.S.A. Neale's Views of Seats, 1820, vol. V. plate, 40.) On Mr. Yarburgh's death, 26th January, 1856, aged 70, Alicia Maria, his sister, wife of George Lloyd, Esq., of Stockton Hall, near York, (Burke's Commoners, Vol. I. p. 245,) succeeded to the estates. As a memorial of their brother, Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd rebuilt the church and school of Heslington: but declined to assume the name of Yarburgh, in compliance with the will of Charles Yarburgh, Esq. The estates therefore devolved upon their eldest son, George John Lloyd, who is the present Mr. Yarburgh of Heslington. He married, 22rd July, 1840, Mary Antonia, third daughter of Samuel Chetham Hilton, Esq., of Pennington Park, in Lancashire, and has issue.

· *

A few scattered notices of the name will close my account of this ancient family; one, as Mr. Hunter

has observed, "where the simple possession of the name may be received as a proof almost complete of descent from the main stock." For a branch settled at Appleton, in the parish of Bolton Percy, I must refer to p. 169 of Dugdale's Visitation. One George Yarburgh was of Sidney College, Cambridge; A.B., 1632-3, A.M. 1636. In 1648, August 1st, William Brown and Ann Yarburgh were married at Hatfield. There was a George Yarburgh, gent., of Pollington, churchwarden for Balne, in 1643, who married at Snaith, 30th May, 1639, Ann Griffin of York, and was buried there 22nd March, 1647-8. By his will of 12th March, 1647-8, he gives £50. to his daughter Elizabeth, who was baptized 2nd October, 1641; and his house in Snaith to his brother Henry Yarburgh and his children; names his wife Ann, and his sister Mulgey; and makes Sir Nicholas Yarburgh, Knt.. supervisor.

Having specified the Proprietors of the court, I propose to give some account of its officers, of whom the Commissary or Official was chief.

I am not aware whether Mr. Jobson established his rights, as Ordinary, by an appeal to the Court of Queen's Bench, (Lawton's Collectio, Vol. I. p. 47,) and whether every proprietor derived a pecuniary benefit from the fees and perquisites of the peculiar. Certain it is that there are hardly any inventories and wills previous to 1580. Certain it is, that in 1693, the profits of the court were worth £30, annually to Sir

THE CAPTAIN'S EMBARRASSING MOMENT

I should say at this point that my name and title during WW II was Lieutenant Yarbrough. I relate here a story about "Life's embarrassing moment" for one man, "a great sense of relief"for another, and a "heart stopping moment" for me.

It began on a quiet Saturday afternoon, forty-nine, soon to be fifty years ago when I reported, in the proper military manner, to my squadron commander, a captain, after an emergency landing due to engine failure of my training plane the day before. It had occurred some hundred miles from base on a rural dirt road deep in East Texas. There was no mechanical damage. A few hours work by an aircraft mechanic restored the safe flyability of the airplane.

My salute went unacknowledged. The captain seemed totally absorbed in paperwork before him, and his eyes never left the surface of his desk. During our encounter and my dismissal, involving a total of two or three minutes of mostly silence, his eyes never made contact with mine.

On the following Monday morning, as per our usual routine, a tall, slim, dark-eyed lieutenant of somewhat swarthy complexion named Martinique, a man of obvious Greek origin, along with eight or ten other student officers and myself, assembled for our usual preflight inspection. I interject here that I am six feet tall, slim and have blue eyes. I am light of complexion and, at that time, I had light brown hair.

About half-way through the inspection process, the captain confronted Lieutenant Martinique, ordered him to rigid attention, (put him in a brace), addressed him in the meanest sort of way for several minutes, then proceeded with his inspection of the rest of us.

Every subsequent morning of that week, into Tuesday of the following week, seven times, Martinique endured the same dressing-down and was just before submitting his resignation from Flying School when the captain suddenly said "Yarbrough, you are the sorriest excuse for an officer I've ever seen". "Sir" said the poor, harrassed lieutenant, "My name is not Yarbrough. My name is Lieutenant Martinique." My heart sank. Obviously, the captain had been after me, Lieutenant Yarbrough, all along! After a long moment of awkward silence, with no correction, no apology, he turned on his heel and, without further word, left the room and never spoke to Martinique or me again. Possibly one of the captain's "embarrassing moments".

Martinique and I graduated three weeks later.

SNAITH CUSTOMS OF ANTIQUITY

WHEN ITEWAS EIGHTH TOWN IN RIDING

HISTORY IN THE CHURCH

GOOLE TIMES, 26/12/19/41

When Snaith was the eighth most

important town in the West Riding there were many quaint customs, some of which ere described in an interesting address oy Mr. Leonard Holmes, of Snaith, at last week's meeting of the Goole Rotary Club. Mr. Holmes is an authority on the ancient township, and the facts related in his address were evidence of painstaking research.

The name of Snaith, said Mr. Holmes, was of Saxon origin, and meant "a place cut off" (presumably by rivers). Formerly it was a place of some importance, and was referred to three times in the Doomsday Book, where it was described as Sneyd or Esneid, while later it was spelt Snaythe. The old market must have been as old as the town itself. Certainly it existed before the reign of Henry III., for in 1223 he granted a fresh Market Charter. Until that time the market was held on Sundays, but the new Chanter changed the day to Fridays. In 1782 it was altered again to Thursday, Holmes produced the actual proclamation which he read every August 10th, St. Laurence Day ..

The Poll Tax of 1378 showed Snaith to be a place of some importance, for it was charged with a demand of £4 7s. 8d., to be collected among the 187 householders. For comparative purposes it might be stated that on the same date Leeds, with only 50 families, was called upon to pay £3 0s. 4d. Pontefract then paid the greatest tax, and next to it, in order came

neaster, Sheifield, Selby, Tickhill, the ham, Wakefield, Snaith and Ripon. Leeds, Knottingley and Bawtry followed, and such places as Bradford, Huddersfield and Halifax had hardly any importance at all, and Goole, apparently, none. The three wealthiest people in Snaith at that time were Richard de Snaith and Thomas Adam, attorneys, and John Frere, a merchant. There were also in the town a tailor, an ostler, a beast merchant, and sixteen artisans, of whorf one was a woman named Margaret del Hook.

A "PECULIAR"

Spaith was a "Peculiar," which meant it had an Ecclesiastical Court of its own, exempt in many matters from the jurisdiction of the Bishop of the Diocese. The Court's powers extended to the proving of wills, granting administration for intestates, punishing persons for ecclesiastical offences, licensing schoolmasters and midwives, and granting faculties for alterations in churches. It had jurisdicton over the townships of Snaith, Balne, Cowick, Gowdall, Heck, Hensall, Pollington, Armin, Hook, Rawcliffe, Góole, Carlton, Swinefleet, Reedness, Whitgiff and Ousefleet, and all these except the last five appointed 'a' churchwarden for the church. Now there were four churchwardens, contrasting with the customary two

The most interesting part of the town was undoubtedly the church and its vicinity. There would be a church at Snaith in 1086, but particulars of it and of Snaith itself were not recorded in the Doomsday Book. The Priory Church of Snaith except for the tower was late decorated and seemingly built between 1420 and 1450, but probably on older foundations. The tower was early foundations. The tower was earry English and not later than A.D. 1250. The roof 'was new, and spoiled the appearance of the building.

The churchyard wall was reparable by the twelve townships which constituted the parish. There was an entry in the churchwardens' account book for the year 1615, when the wall was put into repair, showing the following allocations:—
"Goole, on the east side from the priory wall, in length 16 yards; Hook, 17 yards; wan, in length 16 yards; 1100k, 17 yards; Armin, 18 yards 2 feet; Rawcliffe, 24 yards; Snaith and Cowick, 34 yards; Balne and Pollington, 20 yards; Heck, from the great gate to Gowdall gate, 27 yards; Gowdall, 24 yards; Hensall, 19 yards; Carlton, to the priory wall, 28 yards

SCHOOL AND ALMS HOUSES

Mr. Holmes described several of the more interesting features of the church, and said that at its western end was the old Grammar School founded by Nicholas Waller, by his will proved in 1624. It was a free school to teach grammar and other good authors in the Latin or English language. It was built in 1628, and closed in 1877. A new Grammar School was built at Crosshill in 1878. To the east of the church was the old Butter Market-hence the phrase " selling butter by the yard." It adjoined the churchyard, and next to it were the two old Manor Cells. Next to them was the home of the old manual fire engine which was still in existence.

There were three Bedehouses for men at the west end. Formerly there were four with two men in each and a woman in the other " to look after the men." They were pulled down and three were built at Crosshill, still being occupied but handed over to the Snaith and Cowick Trustees. Later there were six alms houses for women, re-built in 1802, for which the occupants were charged a penny a day, and six modern almshouses.

Other features of the town were Snaith Hall, built about a hundred years ago, and famous for its Paxton conservatory; and the Downe Arms Hotel, an old coaching station. At one time there was a brass band-a team of mummers who were known over a wide area—and an excellent team of bellringers, the church possessing a very fine peal of six bells cast in 1778. There were also handbell

ringers.
The parish registers went back to 1537, and were among the very few which were in September, 1538, They showed that Martin Frobisher was married in Smath Church. Mr. Holmes also referred to copyholds, the fact that Snaith was divided into three Manage and to the old. divided into three Manors and to the old Court Leet dinner.

He concluded with a quaint quotation of a Testor's opinion of lawyers. Christopher Lonsdall, curate of Snaith, had left to him a house in Snaith by his had left to him a nouse in Snaith by his father, Ehristopher Londsall, of Cowick, who in his will in 1622 said: "Now whereas (as God knoweth) yet so oft happens by ye means of some pregnant headed lawyer, or other busy mynded persone yt ye testators his or exors are. caused to wrangle one with another (from which, good Lord deliver) and therefore against this I explayne my Will."
