#### **Preface**

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

#### **About the Index**

After each volume of the Blandford Series was scanned into Portable Document File format, it was made searchable using Adobe Acrobat<sup>®</sup> Pro, version X. Next, an index was created by TExtract<sup>®</sup>, a software package used by commercial book and document publishers. Among its many features is the ability to merge the individual chapter/volume indices into a composite master index. It is not, of course, error-free, especially when the print quality of the original documents is poor. Nevertheless, the index is mostly error-free, with the exception of page numbering. While a few pages are numbered, most are not, so TExtract counted the pages in the volume, providing the referenced page numbers. While agreement is good, some referenced pages may be off a page or two. In the master index volumes, each indexed term is followed by the term "Vol." and an associated volume number. These two terms are followed by one or more page numbers, separated by a comma. The master index itself is searchable<sup>1</sup>, so the best procedure is to use the index to see if, how many, and in which volumes a particular ancestor may be. Then, using the search feature within Adobe's Acrobat Reader, a search can be made for the name/term of interest.



## Searching for Indexed Terms<sup>2</sup>

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term or a desired term of interest and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, a popup message will so state; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> In order for the search feature of Adobe Acrobat© Reader to be enabled, a certain level of document legibility is required. That is, post-scanning processing cannot overcome poor print quality of an original document. With this caveat, each volume has been made searchable by Adobe Acrobat, version 9 or later.







Thank you for your most interesting letter. I did not receive your second one; but once again, I wish I had more to tell you than I have. It is my belief that our Yarboroughe came to South Caroline with one Reedham Lee, who came here from orth Carolina shortly after the American Revolution. I have a copy of his pension application for service in the American Revolution. He owned a mill in what is now lower Florence County. Certainly what you have researched and what I have only from a family Fible and family tradition. Yes, the William Yarborough of the 1850 Williamsburg County census is "mine". My aunt left my her Bible which states that John Yarborough and his wife Susannah came originally from Virginia, by way of Kentucky and Goldsboro, North Carolina, where they remained for anly a few years, settling at Cowards, S.C., where they remained until their deaths. He was trial justice of Cowards for many years. Their sons and daughters were: John, Jr.; William, who married Hannah Jordan of of Cane Branch; Elizabeth who married Wesley McCutchen of Lake City; Nancy, who married Joshua Hyman of Hyman (Florence County); Catherine, who married Henry McKnight (they had no children); Duncan, who married Emily Galloway of Conway; John James who never married; Hannah Jane (born 1856-died March 31, 1938, age 82, married Daniel Lynch of Scranton. Of these I know so little, except thatWilliam, son of John, married Hannah Jordan and was my greatgrandfather (Lewis) married Mary Ann Permelia Farrott, born Sept. 20, 1855-aled Jan. 24, 1916. They had 14 children, of whom George Leon, born Oct. 4, 1898-died May 9, 1971, was my father.

I thought I had a copy of the abstracts of the early Virginia wills, and intended to look, but I really have not enough data to go on. If you learn of any connection between the two Yarboroughs of the 1850 Williamsburg census, I shall be so very grateful to hear from you.

The Wooten-Gill Bible was offered in an auction sale in Calloway County, Ky., having been acquired in Chicago by a collector who bought old books, letters and various items for re-sale. An article appeared in the local paper (Murray, Ky.) stating one of the oldest Bibles in the county would be for sale. Mrs. Doyle and Mrs. Graham rushed down to ask if they could copy the data in it, since the people named in the Bible were from Tennessee.

(1) Lawsuit: Thomas Yarbrough and Hannah his wife, Plt vs Lyddal Brown and Richard Clough, executors of Samuel Jordon, deceased, For Detinue, Amelia County, Virginia, March 1761, Order Book 6, p. 244.

In April 1761 the court ordered that the deposition of Thomas Yarbrough, Sr. "an infirm witness in this cause who is about to depart this colony" be taken. At this time, Thomas Yarbrough, Sr., was already a resident of North Carolina as is proven by the tax lists of Granville, presently Franklin Co., NC. Thomas was apparently visiting Virginia at the time of his deposition.

The original deposition was found by Greg Yarbrough among the loose original documents at Richmond, Virginia, where the old country records are stored. The deposition was typed ver batim by Karen Mazock from a copy of the original deposition. Found and typed September, 1988. The original documents of Amelia County are closed to the public and can be searched only with special permission which Greg Yarbrough obtained.

FROM A LETTER OF WILLIAM D. KIZZIAH, GENEALOGICAL RESEARCHER OF SALISBURY, NORTH CAROLINA, DATED OCTOBER 24, 1957

"The Yarbroughs were very prominent here, having large land holdings in the county as well as here in Salisbury where as you mention, President Washington stopped. The site of his old home is marked on a HISTORICAL MAP OF ROWAN COUNTY that I helped to design for our Bicentennial of 1953, as well as many other historic names and places."

FROM A LETTER OF MRS. NELLE JENKINS, OF ECELLE, ALABAMA, MAY 2, 1957

"---Mr. Wagner, the Herald of the College of Arms in England, is getting up the authentic line. Mrs. Reeves corresponded with Captain Guy Yarbrough, Lord Alvingham, Earl of Yorkshire, about the line. But C. W. Yarbrough met him and visited in his home and they together had Mr. Wagner work on the line. I have the Yarbrough genealogy back to 1066 as prepared for the Earl for seating of King George's Coronation and the same was used in Queen Qlizabeth's Coronation. Mr. Wagner says that Richard Yarbrough the immigrant, married Frances Proctor in London in 1635 and applied for emigration in 1643. In a court proceeding in Virginia, Richard stated he was born in Lincolnshire. England. He lived in Big Reedy Creek area in Virginia from 1643 to 1649. He probably married several times - tradition says once to Elizabeth Williams. Richard was in the vicinity of the present day Petersburg. Virginia at the age of 85 and died there in 1704. He gave his age as 87 on a deed in 1702. It is known that he had sons Thomas, John, Henry, Richard, Jr., James, Charles and three daughters. In a court record in which Richard was a witness he stated that Thomas had children Edmund, Elizabeth, Nancy, John, Richard, Patsy, Abraham, Hezekiah, a child who died in infancy and Eleanor. We are descended from the first Henry, son of Richard. All this from G. W. Yarbrough who did a 20 year research on the line and for the American Genealogical Society and for which he was made a "Fellon".

The College of Arms can't furnish anything on Christopher Yarbrough but he is supposed to be a son of Richard, Sr. or he might have been a younger brother who came along as a member of Richard's family in 1643.





Henry Yarbrough (shortened to Yarbro after he moved to Tennessee) was born Bute County, NC, moved from there to Randolph County; then to Rowan County about 1775. This information can be found in his Declaration in Order to Obtain the Benefits of the Act of Congress (attached) where it states:

I volunteered ... about the year 1779 or 1780 (which precisely I cannot recollect but I believe I was about 18 or 19 years of age) ... we were marched ... from Randolph County, No. Carolina where I then lived with my father Zachariah Yarbro ...

I was born in [the] year 1761 or 2 in what was then called Butte but now Franklin County, North Carolina. At about the commencement of the Revolution (sic) War, my father oved to Randolph County where we were living when I volunteered in the horse company ... At about the close of the war we moved to Rowan County, No. Carolina ...

Henry first married Bridget Davis in Rowan County, NC. She was the daughter of Myrick and Margaret Davis. It is thought the grave marked "Biddy Yarbrough" in the Jersey Church Baptist Church Cemetery is her grave. The records of Jersey Church prove that Henry was a member there. Beside Biddy is the grave of Margaret Yarbrough, the child of Henry Yarbrough. See the attached copy of the Will of Myrick Davis.

Henry married second Mary Cunningham, a widow with two small children. Mary Cunningham was the daughter of Hugh Cunningham as is proven by his will dated 4 September 1817. She married first Joseph Cunningham, Jr., son of

Mary and Joseph had three children at the time of Joseph's death: sons William and Joseph; daughter Anna. These children are named in his will. The son Joseph died and is buried beside his father at the Jersey Church Cemetery in North Carolina.

Mary and Joseph Cunningham's daughter, Anna, married Jonathan Davis as is proven by the deed records of Rowan County, NC.

In his will (copy attached), Henry names "Anna Davis, daughter of my deceased wife" and "William Cunningham, son of my deceased wife." Because his first wife was Bridget Davis, researchers have assumed that Bridget was a widow with a child. This is not the case. Both children named were the children of his second wife, Mary Cunningham. See the abstracted records of Rowan County attached.

Henry Yarbro is listed in the 1790 census of Rowan County, NC.

About 1823 Henry moved to Tipton County, Tennessee. "In the year 1823, I moved to this county Tipton, Tennessee and where I have resided ever since."

About the same time his brother, Manoah Yarbrough, went to Alabama and settled in St. Clair County. Other families who moved to the Western District of Tennessee and settled in the same area (an area which had been purchased from the Chickasaw Indians) were: Kulbreth, Smith, McQuire, Matthews and Tipton to name but a few.

Goodspeed's History of Tennessee say that Henry was the fourth white settler and the first magistrate of Tipton County. Henry operated a grist mill on Indian Creek (see abstracted copy attached).

"On petition of James Wilson and Thomas P. Hall being filed, it is ordered by the Court that they have leave to build a mill on Indian Creek at a place formerly owned by Henry Yarbro." This was the first water-powered mill in the county, being built by Henry Yarbro early in 1824.

The first record of a land transaction in Henry's name is found in 1824 when he bought 575 acres from Newton Cannon of Williamson County for \$1700 in "7th Section & 5th Range on the waters of Indian Creek, a south branch of Big Hatchie River ... West corner of William Polk ... Isaac Matthew's N.W. Corner ... Witness: Charles Smith, Henry Yarbrough, Jr. Edward Yarbrough and William Kulbreth."

On January 25, 1825, Henry received a land grant of 53 acres by "virtue of occupant."

Henry Yarbro was instrumental in the organization of Tipton County and served as a magistrate.

Henry attempted several times to obtain his pension right for Revolutionary service. In 1833 he appeared before the Court of Please and Quarter Session of Tipton County and age the age of 71 or 72 he obtained \$12.50 per semi-annum. A copy of the declaration is attached.

Henry made a will November 4, 1841 which was probated in the July term of Court, 1843 (copy attached). His sons Anderson C. and Edward Yarbro were appointed administrators of his estate. A. C. Yarbro, E. Yarbro, George Smith, A. H. Owen, H. Larimore, R. H. Munford, C. C. Archer and James A. Calhoun were sureties when the will was presented for probate. asyntham.

The Yarbro family attended the Indian Creek Primitive Baptist Church, organized in 1824 by Rev. J. Lilly. Henry and many of his family are buried in the graveyard there where his stone reads:

> Henry Yarbaro Sr. who departed this life Jan. 30, a.d. 1843 Aged about 80 yrs.

The Mary Yarborough mentioned in Hugh's will is the widow of Joseph, Jr. who married Henry Yarborough. They migrated to Tipton County, TN about 1823.

Proved by latter in May 1794. Part of a state grant made to Lewis Winkler who let to Henry Winkler Aug 1, 1792; who let to Thomas Owen on 2 Aug 1792; who let to said Yarbrough on 17 Feb 1793. Property description: Beginning on the corner of the said Yarbrough & the line of Joseph Cunningham at a white oak...

Book 21, page 73, Oct 25, 1808:

Hugh Cunningham (as Executor of deceased Joseph Cunningham) lets Manoah Yarbrough -- both of Rowan Co -- have 59 acres next to Mr. Frohock on Swearing Creek.

Book 25, page 558, July 5, 1819:

Manoah Yarbrough lets James Mailey, both of Rowan County, have 63 acres on Swearing Creek next to Mr. Frohock, on the original line, for \$300. Wits: Amos W. Spafford; S. T. Spofford; proved by the latter in Nov 1819. This was land sold by William Millsaps to Joseph Cunningham and then sold by Cunningham's executor to the said Yarbrough.

Book 25, p 539, Nov 8, 1819:

James Mailey lets Alfred Owen have 3 acres on bank of Swearing Creek.. part of the land bought from Manoah Y in deed just above.

Book 26, p 888, 30 Sep 1812:

Griffith Cunningham lets Menoah Yarbrough, both of Rowan Co, have 4 acres on both sides of Swearing Creek.

Book 27, page 8, May 17, 1822:

Manoah Yarbrough and wife Mary let Jesse Hargrave, all of Rowan Co,; 154 acres on Swearing Creek next to Peter Smith...of this 154 acres 150 acres were bequeathed to Mary by her deceased father Joseph Cunningham and the other 4 acres were deeded by Griffith Cunningham to said Yarbrough... In the Tipton County Will Book A-1, p 81- Will of Henry Yarbrough, he leaves:

"I give and bequeath Anna Davis the daughter of my deceased wife or to her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

"I give and bequeath to William Cunningham the son of my deceased wife or to his heirs the sum of one hundred dollars."

Because the daughter's name is Davis, some researchers have taken this to mean that she was the daughter of his first wife, Bridget Davis, and have listed that Bridget Davis was a widow with one child. These same researchers have shown the William Cunningham to have been the child of his (Henry's) second wife by her first marriage.

The will of Bridget's father, Myrick Davis, clearly shows that she was not a widow and that Henry Yarbrough, Jr. was the son of Bridget and Henry Yarbrough.

The will of Joseph Cunningham, Jr. names a son William and a daughter Anna. Deeds clearly show that this Ann married a Davis and lived in Lincoln County, Tennessee.

Therefore, both Anna and William named in Henry's will were children of his second wife, Mary Cunningham and her first husband, Joseph Cunningham, Jr.

In his 1808 Will, Myrick Davis says "my three grandchildren" and the only one of Henry Y's children he names is Henry, Jr. If Henry & Bridgett had daughters, I wonder why Myrick did not name them in his will as he did name other granddaughters.

The age on Henry Jr.'s tombstone has to be wrong (36 years). It says "departed this life Jan 3d 1841, aged 36 years. This would make his mother Mary Cunningham as she and Henry married in 1803. As he is clearly named in the Will of Myric Davis as the son of his daughter, the age on the tombstone has to be an error. If the "3" is actually a "5" -- which it looks like -- this would make his birth around 1785 if he died at age 56. This would be closer to the right time for him.

The Jan. 5d 1841 could stand for January - 5th day 1841.

The Tombstone says Henry D. Yarbro. Is there actually any proof that this is Henry Yarbro, Jr.??

The first settlement of the county was made near the present site of Covington in 1821 or 1822 by Jacob Tipton and Nathan Hartsfield. The following year settlements were made on the Mississippi River below the second Chickasaw Bluff by Jesse Benton and M. Phillips and on Indian Creek by M. Holshauser, Henry Yarbro, William Kulbreth and J. Matthews.

Page 809

As the County began rapidly to increase in population the old hand mills disappeared and horse and water powered mills were erected. The first water powered mill was built on a small stream seven miles southwest of Covington in about 1824 by Henry Yarbro. The mills and steam cotton-gins of the County outside of the towns at the present are as follows: Fourth district, one grist mill and gin and one saw mill owned respectively by Don Yarbro and Evans and Mitchell.

H Yarborough was one of the first settlers of Tipton County.

Tipton County like other Counties carved out of the "Western District" had its quota of Revolutionary soldiers who sought lands in the country for their services. Known to have settled and lived in the country was Henry Yarborough, Sr. aged 84 years.

Hardly had N. C. entered into the new Union than the President of the U. S. paid her a visit early in 1791...May 29. As Washington entered the town and pushed his way through the crowd to the court house that stood in the public square where he was to be officially received, a cannon fired 15 salutes in his honor. After the reception the party moved down Corbin Street to the Yarborough House, located in the middle of the west side of Main between Innes & Council, where they breakfasted.

Another society, the Thalian Association, began giving performances in the summer of 1829 at the home of Mrs. Edward Yarborough, the place where Washington had spent a night.

Highway 59W in Tipton County was also known as Liberty St. and Randolph Road.

The Yarbrough name is spelled in all cases as it appeared in the Deed.

In some cases the name is spelled "Yarbro" on the index and in the heading of the instrument, but spelled "Yarbrough" in the body of the deed.

Some deeds had blanks - apparently the clerk or registrar had intended to fill in the space later and it was never done - these blanks are denoted by a line (\_\_\_\_\_) in these copies. When a word was illegible it is shown with a line and question mark (\_\_\_\_\_)

Other words or names that were not legible are shown with a question mark following the word (?).

For 135 pds., paid by CHAUNCY TOWNSEND, he deeds 12,500 acres of land in Granville Co. on Neuse, Eno, and Tar Rivers, which is subdivided from tract No. 12 -- a quit-rent of 12 pds. 10 shls. to be paid yearly to the Earl from Mar. 25, 1757 and the Earl is to have 1/10 of all mines and minerals and 1/5th part of all gold and silver on the land. The rents to be paid until Mar. 25, 1760 and at that time the remaining lands not settled in the proportion of one white person on every 200 acres in the grant is to be surrendered to the Lord Granville and thenceforth the rate of 4 shls. proclamation money or 3 shls. sterling to be paid for every 100 acres. DECLARATION
IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE BENEFITS OF THE ACT OF CONGRESS PASSED
7 JUNE 1832

STATE OF TENNESSEE TIPTON COUNTY

ON THIS DAY OF 4th OF SEPTEMBER in the year of our Lord 1833 personally appeared before Open Court before the Court of Pleas and Quarters Session of Tipton County aforesaid now sitting Henry Yarbrouth, Sr. a resident of said County aged about seventy one or two years, who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the Act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officer and served as herein stated, "Under Capt, Brittain Fuller I volunteered and it was about the year 1779 or 1780 (which precisely I cannot recollect but I believe I was about 18 or 19 years of age) who commanded a horse company. I furnished my own horse and equipage and in the character of a private soldier I volunteered only for three but sorved six months. We were marched by Capt. Fuller from Randolph County, No. Carolina where I then lived with my father Zachariah Yarbro and where I volunteered, to Six Mile Creek in the State of South Carolina. When we arrived there Capt. Fuller resigned his command and Capt. Jacob Williams of Dan River took it, under whom we continued until he left us, which was about two months. Under Capt. Williams we were disciplined and performed all the service required of us, such as scouting and collecting provisions, while we were there stationed and employed, it was then Col. Rugilly the Conspicious Tory of the Brick House was taken by our forces and with him, about two hundred prisioners, who at once surrendered upon exhibition of pine logs painted and made to resemble cannons. They were all marched into the camp and subsequently marched northward under the command of Capt. Williams. After Williams left us with the prisioners, we passed under the command of a captain of horse whose name I cannot now recollect. but he was attached to Gen Morgan's command. There was also Col. Washington, Genl. Greene, Linnborn and several others. Some of whom perhaps had no command at the time. I believe Genl. Greene was our Commander-in Chief. I was actively employed the whole six months in partisan war against the Tories, having frequent skirmishes with them and sometimes some pretty active and sharp fighting. I was then young and being fired with atrocities of the Tories. I bore hard upon them, sparing the women and children. Capt. Knights and Lieutenant Elijah Williams commanded on these occasions.

We were marched from the Six Mile Creek back to Charlettesville, No. Carolina and there discharged by Genl. Morgan, who gave me a written discharge. I continued nevertheless for several years to carry on the partisan war against the Tories, who were so enraged by me that I could not stay at home in safety and who did me great damage. I could relate much of the occurences of the Partisan War in the back parts of North Carolina and South Carolina in which I was previously engaged. Judge Murphy of No. Carolina, when about to write a history of that State sent a man to me requesting a detailed account of this war believing that I could furnish a more connected

history of those events than any other man he knows. I however was upon the eve of moving to this county, and answered I have no time to devote to such matters. I was born in year of 1761 or 2 in what was then called Butte but now Franklin County, North Carolina. At about the commencement of the Revolution War, my father moved to Randolph County where we were living when I volunteered in the horse company as aforsaid. At about the close of the war we moved to Rowan County, No. Carolina where there are many persons by whom I could prove my services. In the year 1823, I moved to this county Tipton, Tennessee and where I have resided ever since. I was once told that if I would send my discharge to Capt. Williams of Virginia, I should draw my pay. I gave it to a man by the name of Davenport. When he returned from Capt. Williams he informed me that Williams said that he had nothing to do with it, that Capt. Fuller, the man under whom I volunteered, was to make out the payroll. When I commanded my discharge, Davenport said he had fallen into a river and lost his pocket book and all the papers. I did not believe him. I was unable ever to reclaim it and have never received a cent for any Service ever rendered by me for the United States. I have no documentary evidence and know of no person in this State who can testify to my service.

I hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension except the present and declare that my name is not on the pension roll of this agency of any State."

In the name of God Amen I Henry Yarbro of the County of Tipton and State of Tennessee being of sound and disparing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament revoking and making all other wills by me at anytime made

First: I give and bequeath that all my funeral expenses and just debts be paid out of any money that I may die possessed of or that may come first into the hands of my executors.

Second: I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Freedle or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Third: I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane Billings or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Fourth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Biddy Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Fifth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Sixth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Seventh: I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Eighth: I give and bequeath to Annie Davis the daughter of my deceased wife, the sum of one hundred dollars.

Ninth: I give and bequeath to William Cunningham the son of my deceased wife the sum of one hundred dollars.

Tenth: I give and bequeath to my son Andrew C. Yarbrough or his heirs my tract of land on which I reside, also my wagon and set of blacksmith tools after payment and satisfaction of all the foregoing bequests and legacies to be made by my executors out of any money of which I may die possessed or from the sale of such of my property as they may think best.

Eleventh: It is my wish and desire that all the remainder of my property and estate of any or every description whatever both real and personal shall be equally divided between my two sons Edward Yarbrough and Andrew C. Yarbrough or their heirs.

#### TIPTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

TIPTON COUNTY ESTABLISHED OUT OF SHELBY COUNTY TERRITORY

Prior to the establishment of TIPTON COUNTY, the territory comprising it had been included in SHELBY County, which had supervision over it.

TIPTON COUNTY was established October 29, 1823. It was named by the Act "in memory of CAPT. JACOB TIPTON, who fell at St. Clair's defeat on 1791", and who was a son of COL. JOHN TIPTON of the WATAUGA VALLEY.

GEN. JACOB TIPTON, under whose supervision SHELBY COUNTY had been organized three years previously, is listed as one of the first settlers of TIPTON County. GEN. TIPTON is said to have had his residence in the county by 1821.

The JESSE BENTON, JR. named on this list is said to have been the brother of the famous THOMAS H. BENTON. JESSE BENTON lived at Randolph and was very active in promoting the interests of the place, which, for a time endeavored to rival MEMPHIS in importance. It did become an important center of the trade for the Western District at one time.

CAPT. TIPTON, the father of COL. JACOB TIPTON married Mary Bradford of Washington County, Tennessee; raised a company for the defense of the northwest against the Indians under GEN. ARTHUR ST. CLAIR. He was killed while leading a charge. He and his wife MARY had a son they had named ARMISTEAD BLEVINS TIPTON, whose name was changed to JACOB TIPTON, after the death of his father, and, it is said, at his request before leaving home on his Indian campaign, in the event of his death. This son was GEN. JACOB TIPTON of Tipton County.

ORGANIZATION OF TIPTCH AND THE NAMES OF ITS FIRST OFFICERS

The first Court for TIPTON COUNTY was held on December 1, 1823 at the home of Nathan Hartsfield, which was located about two miles wouthwest of the present town of COVINGTON, which became the County seat of the County.

The first magistrates of TIPTON COUNTY commissioned and sworn into office at this meeting were:

JOHN C McKEAN
NATHAN HARTSFIELD
JOHN T. BROWN

JACOB TIPTON ANDREW GREER GEORGE ROBINSON JOHN C. McKEAN was the first Chairman of the County Court, ANDREW GREER the first Clerk and JOHN TO. BROWN, the first Sheriff.

COVINGTON was selected as the County seat of TIPTON COUNTY, Land for the location of the town were donated by JOHN C. McLEMORE AND TIREE RHODES, each of whom have been previously mentioned in these notes. RHODES was from VIRGINIA and McLEMORE from North Carolina.

MEMUCAN HUNT AND OTHERS FROM NORTH CAROLINA RECEIVE GRANTS

MEMUCAN HUNT, of North Carolina, the first State Treasurer after independence for that State and his son THOMAS HUNT and grandson, ANDERSON HUNT and other notables from North Carolina, received large grants of land in what is now Tipton County.

Others from North Carolina receiving big grants included ROBERT and THOMAS LOVE, brothers; R. T. MUNFORD, ANDREW GREER (of the Watauga family), JOHN RICE, ANTHONY BLEDSOE and COL HARDY MURFEE, of Rutherford County, Tennessee and North Carolina.

A commission who were to have charge of the survey of the new town of COVINGTON, and the sale of lots, was composed of several notable personages, as will be shown.

MARQUIS CALMES HELPED TO LAY OFF THE TOWN OF COVINGTON

Among the men who helped to lay off the lots and survey the townsite of COVINGTON. TENNESSEE, was that certain MARQUIS CALMES, whose family came originally from Maryland to the Valley of Virginia, and who were intermarried so much with the RICHARDSON family of Maryland. From Maryland, the Calmes Family, spread out and went from near Winchester into both Kentucky and Georgia, always accompanied by some of their kinsmen the RICHARDSONS and BUCKS. Others on the commission to lay off COVINGTON were JOHN ECKFORD, ROBERT G. GREEN, E. F. POPE and ALEXANDER ROBERTSON.

CALMES' TAVERN was the first hotel or public house of entertainment in the town of COVINGTON. Later the same hotel was taken over by a man by the name of WILLIAMS.

ROBERT G. GREEN, of this commission, was a lawyer, and he and THOMAS TAYLOR were the first legal practitioners in the town and county seat. It is said that the first physician of the town was DR. CHARLES C. FISHER.

The town of RANDOLPH, a rival in the early days of COVINGTON for the honor of being the county seat, was also the home of a number of notable families, including JESSE BENTON, from North Carolina, ORVILLE SHELBY, relative of the Governor of Kentucky, originally from the Watauga settlement in east Tennessee, and several members of the ALSTON FAMILY, of VIRGINIA, North Carolina, and SOUTH CAROLINA, of which latter State it furnished an early day GOVERNOR. The town of RANDOLPH is said to have been named for JOHN RANDOLPH of ROANOKE, who had several kinsmen and old neighbors who lived in the town. Also, in and near the town of RANDOLPH there are records that show that

and families named SIMPSON and CLEMENT lived there for a time, at least.

THOMAS RALP built a horse mill not far from COVINGTON, the first in TIPTON CO.

RESIDENTS OF SEVERAL EARLY TIPTON COUNTY "SETTLEMENTS".

Naturally, like other frontier counties TIPTON had several "settlements" along the banks of the HATCHIE and the FORKED DEER tributaries. Among these were one on BIG CREEK, which was the home of

Dr. R. H. Rose Henry Turnage Captain Jones Captain Newman Alfred Hill Major LaGrande

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In the Indian Creek "settlement" there were families by the name of SMITH, OWENS, KELLERS, KINNEYS and WALKS.

There was also a WHITE and ARCHER settlement, where C. C. ARCHER, certain members of the WHITE FAMILY - their names unknown - GEORGE SHARKLEY and a WILLIAM McGUIRE resided.

E. T. POPE, H. TERRELL, R. W. SANFORD, MAJ. LAUDERDALE (probably a member of the family of COL. JAMES LAUDERDALE, killed at the battle of NEW ORLEANS, CAT. SCURRY and DR. HOLD are attributed to early settlement in the county, without mention of where they lived. Also families of the name of DURHAM, MITCHELL, GARLAND, PARRISH, PRYOR, HILL and DAVIS.

Some of the original area of TIPTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, was appropriated in 1835 to make up the territory assigned for the establishment of LAUDERDALE COUNTY, but just what part and how much, the compiler has been unable to ascertain, from any record that has come to his notice.

### TIPTON COUNTY HAD MANY REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS

TIPTON COUNTY, like the other counties carved out of the "Western District" had its quota of revolutionary soldiers who sought lands in the county for their services. The names of many of them appear in the foregoing notes. Others who are known to have settled and lived in the county, were: COL. THOMAS GOOD, 81 years of age (1840); WILLIAM McFERRIN 85 years of age; VINCENT VOSS, who was 84 years of age and also HENRY YARBROUGH, SR., aged 84 years.

Henry Yarbrough, fourth white man to settle in Tipton Co., Tenn. Reportedly only Rev. Soldier to be burried in Tipton Co., Tenn.

# DO YOU REMEMBER?

(By Judge W. A. Owen)

Do you remember the old-time de-Useful Friend, the Horse or the Dog?" and "Which Is the Most Useful Household Object, the Dishrag or the Broom?" were debated pro and con by the best speakers of the community. Great crowds came to hear the words of eloquence spout from the mouths of the able debaters.

Do you remember the Green Court, which was a mock court or kangaroo court which tried its members on some ridiculous charge? A real court scene was presented, judge, jury, prosecutor, defender, culprit and witnesses for and against him. court would meet in the neighboring schoolhouse every Saturday night.

Do you remember the Grange and the grangers? It was composed of both men and women, being a secret order for the benefit of the farmers. Merchants, lawyers and office-holders were not admitted. The Grange was were not admitted. The Grange was succeeded by the Farmers Alliance, and this by the Farmers Union. The members as a rule stick pretty well in hard times, but when prosperity comes the object for which the organization was created is often forgot-

I remember the First Grange fun-eral in this county, that of Brad Yar-brough, who was killed near his home in the Holly Grove neighborhood. The funeral was on Sunday and a great host of his fellow Grangers attended. each wearing a broad band of black crepe on his arm. Do you remember that it was the custom for the membership of secret orders crepe on the sleeve or a black ribbon on the lapel of the coat when a member died?

Do you remember how busy the coroner used to be? An inquest was held on the body of every person who had died an unnatural death. If a horse ran away and killed its rider, if a tree fell on a tree cutter, if a train killed some one, a jury impaneled and a coroner or a justice of the peace inquired into the manner in which the deceased had come to his death. About 25 years ago the Legislature said "no more inquests unless the affidavit of two responsible persons was made that the deceased had met his death by foul means, or at least the witnesses had reasons to believe that the death was the result of a crime.

The Legislature had no doubt heard the story of the justice who held an inquest over the body of an unknown man whose body was found floating man whose body was found floating in the Mississippi river. The justice had a deputy search the body and on it was found \$20 and a pistol. The body was fined \$20 for carrying a pistol. The weapon was appropriated to coeff and the increase and t on costs and the inquest and burial of the unknown charged to the county. An inquest usually cost from \$25 to \$30, so the taxpayers were saved the unnessary expense of holding inquests. Today, with so many people being killed in the larger cities, by autos, especially, if the old laws were in force, the coroner would have to have many assistants to help run his

Do you remember some of the old-

Do you remember the old-time de- Nelly's Eyes Are Blue," "Peck-a-boo," bating societies? Such momentous "Little Annie Rooney," "Green Grow questions as "Which is Man's Most the Willow Trees," and scores of others.

> Do you remember the old-time grocery man? He had one short show case, no can goods, kept his merchandise in bins, his tobacco on a shelf; his candy was in sticks and these in glass jars with metal tops. Do you remember the old-time candy kisses and the candy hearts with loving verses thereon.

> Do you remember the old-time hunting parties? The neighbors got together in the fall to hunt possums and coons. The man who owned a good coon dog was popular. The hunt, was usually with two or more dogs. I have helped to cut some big poplar and oak trees to catch Mr. Coon. you remember the deer and turkey hunts? I can remember a number of deer being killed in Hatchie bottoms near Shingle lake, the Fish Pond and Round Lake.

> Fishing was generally restricted to trot lines and cat hooks in the river. A seine was used to catch fish in the lakes. I have seen hundreds of fine fish pulled in at one haul with a one to two hundred foot seine. Do you remember the Big Lake Hunting Club that went to Arkansas every November for a two-weeks' hunt and fish? Some of the members were Esq. Sarr-Shelton, Dr. L. Hill, Sr., Dr. J. J. Moore, Hon. Holmes Cummins, Hon. Peyton J. Smith, Sam Sherrod, John T. Douglas, W. D. Smith, Thos, Lau-derdale, Don H. Smith, my father and probably a few others. They took a probably a few others. They took a horse for each hunter, three wagons

> and four or five negroes.
>
> Bryant Kent was the boss cook on these hunts. He had cooked at the Shelton House for years. This man was one of the earliest settlers in Covington. Born a slave, he was taught the trade of a tanner and also how to cook. Kent killed a dear in the courthouse yard many years ago. The deer was fleeing from some hunters who had scared it out of Town Creek bottom.

The Big Lake Club killed many doer. and ducks and geese by the thousands. On one of these trips, I was told, 11 deer were killed in one day. I recall that my father brought home three deer from one of these hunts and we had smoked ventson for many months. Wild geese were so plentiful in those days that our people never realized their value or the fact that they might become extinct. They slew as recklessly as the early settlers did the giant trees of the forest without thought to the future.

Don H. Smith, now a citizen of Arkansas, former sheriff of this county, and H. Bate Shelton are the only two living men to my knowledge who went to Arkansas with the Big Lake Club. This club used to be joined by sportsmen from Jackson and some from Kentucky who would

make the trip with our club.

Our law makers have been wise in placing a limit on the hunter's day's kill of animals and fowls, and his catch from the lakes and streams. The open season, too, is now quite short. I hope to see it made still shorter and the kill or catch still more restricted. We must protect time songs, the popular airs which more restricted. We must protect the boys would whistle? "Captain out animals, birds and fish if we are jinks of the Horse Marines."

#### HENRY YARBRO

SON OF: Zachariah and Elizabeth (Dowd) Yarbrough

BORN: 1761-2, Bute County, North Carolina

DIED: 30 Jan 1843, Tipton County, Tennessee

Buried Indian Creek Cemetery, Tipton County, TN

MARRIED: 1. Bridget Davis, 29 Aug 1785, Rowan County, NC

2. Mary Cunningham, 13 Sep 1803, Rowan County, NC

Henry Yarbrough (shortened to Yarbro after he moved to Tennessee) was born Bute County, NC, moved from there to Randolph County; then to Rowan County about 1775. This information can be found in his Declaration in Order to Obtain the Benefits of the Act of Congress (attached) where it states:

I volunteered ... about the year 1779 or 1780 (which precisely I cannot recollect but I believe I was about 18 or 19 years of age) ... we were marched ... from Randolph County, No. Carolina where I then lived with my father Zachariah Yarbro ...

I was born in [the] year 1761 or 2 in what was then called Butte but now Franklin County, North Carolina. At about the commencement of the Revolution (sic) War, my father oved to Randolph County where we were living when I volunteered in the horse company ...At about the close of the war we moved to Rowan County, No. Carolina ...

Henry first married Bridget Davis in Rowan County, NC. She was the daughter of Myrick and Margaret Davis. It is thought the grave marked "Biddy Yarbrough" in the Jersey Church Baptist Church Cemetery is her grave. The records of Jersey Church prove that Henry was a member there. Beside Biddy is the grave of Margaret Yarbrough, the child of Henry Yarbrough. See the attached copy of the Will of Myrick Davis.

Henry married second Mary Cunningham, a widow with two small children. Mary Cunningham was the daughter of Hugh Cunningham as is proven by his will dated 4 September 1817. She married first Joseph Cunningham, Jr., son of

Joseph Cunningham, Sr. Joseph Cunningham, Sr. and Hugh Cunningham were brothers. Hence, Mary and Joseph were first cousins. Mary and Joseph had three children at the time of Joseph's death: sons William and Joseph; daughter Anna. These children are named in his will. The son Joseph died and is buried beside his father at the Jersey Church Cemetery in North Carolina.

Mary and Joseph Cunningham's daughter, Anna, married Jonathan Davis as is proven by the deed records of Rowan County, NC.

In his will (copy attached), Henry names "Anna Davis, daughter of my deceased wife" and "William Cunningham, son of my deceased wife." Because his first wife was Bridget Davis, researchers have assumed that Bridget was a widow with a child. This is not the case. Both children named were the children of his second wife, Mary Cunningham. See the abstracted records of Rowan County attached.

Henry Yarbro is listed in the 1790 census of Rowan County, NC.

About 1823 Henry moved to Tipton County, Tennessee. "In the year 1823, I moved to this county Tipton, Tennessee and where I have resided ever since."

About the same time his brother, Manoah Yarbrough, went to Alabama and settled in St. Clair County. Other families who moved to the Western District of Tennessee and settled in the same area (an area which had been purchased from the Chickasaw Indians) were: Kulbreth, Smith, McQuire, Matthews and Tipton to name but a few.

Goodspeed's History of Tennessee say that Henry was the fourth white settler and the first magistrate of Tipton County. Henry operated a grist mill on Indian Creek (see abstracted copy attached).

"On petition of James Wilson and Thomas P. Hall being filed, it is ordered by the Court that they have leave to build a mill on Indian Creek at a place formerly owned by Henry Yarbro." This was the first water-powered mill in the county, being built by Henry Yarbro early in 1824.

The first record of a land transaction in Henry's name is found in 1824 when he bought 575 acres from Newton Cannon of Williamson County for \$1700 in "7th Section & 5th Range on the waters of Indian Creek, a south branch of Big Hatchie River ... West corner of William Polk ... Isaac Matthew's N.W. Corner ... Witness: Charles Smith, Henry Yarbrough, Jr. Edward Yarbrough and William Kulbreth."

On January 25, 1825, Henry received a land grant of 53 acres by "virtue of occupant."

Henry Yarbro was instrumental in the organization of Tipton County and served as a magistrate.

Henry attempted several times to obtain his pension right for Revolutionary service. In 1833 he appeared before the Court of Please and Quarter Session of Tipton County and age the age of 71 or 72 he obtained \$12.50 per semi-annum. A copy of the declaration is attached.

Henry made a will November 4, 1841 which was probated in the July term of Court, 1843 (copy attached). His sons Anderson C. and Edward Yarbro were appointed administrators of his estate. A. C. Yarbro, E. Yarbro, George Smith, A. H. Owen, H. Larimore, R. H. Munford, C. C. Archer and James A. Calhoun were sureties when the will was presented for probate.

The Yarbro family attended the Indian Creek Primitive Baptist Church, organized in 1824 by Rev. J. Lilly. Henry and many of his family are buried in the graveyard there where his stone reads:

Henry Yarbaro Sr. who departed this life Jan. 30, a.d. 1843 Aged about 80 yrs.

His graved was marked by the Tipton County chapter of the DAR in a dedication service when a bronze marker was placed there in 1943.



MARRIED Brigette Davis, a widow on Aug. 29, 1785 (Rowan Co., N. C. Marriage Records(; and second, Mary Cunningham, a widow on Sept. 13, 1803. (Rowan Co. Mar. Records)

From the Revolutionary Pension papers and the will of Henry Yarbro we learn much of his early life and of his Eamily. At the beginning the confidence of the war, he was living in Randolph County, N. C. where he volunteered as a private soldier Of the Horse---"at about the close of the war we moved to Rowan County where there are many persons by whom I could prove my services.

by Joseph Hanna (Rowan Co. Marr. Records) who was a widow with a daughter, Annie Davis. Evidentally Annie Davis came to Tipton Co.

Tenn. for she was bequeathed in his will an equal same of his estate as his daughters. On Sept. 13,1803, he married Mary Davis Cunningham, the widow of Joseph Cunningham, and who had a son , William, whom we also assume came to Tipton County and received an equal share in Henry Yarbro's will as his own sons. She was the daughter of Myrick and Magnet Davis of Rowan County, whose will is found Rowan Co. Will Abstracts", Vol 2, p 1805-1850,C-105 made Mar 2, 1808 and probated 1808 in which he names his wife, granddaughter Sarah and Suzannah, daughters of my son, Hugh Davis, "grandson Henry Yarbrough Jr., son of my daughter---" Executors of his will wereHenry Yarbro Sr. and son, Gabriel Davis

Henry Yarbro is listed in the 1790 Census of Rowan County.

About 1822, Henry Yarbro and family came to the newly opened

Honry yarbrosoft & mary tunning lan 13 Sept 1803 Bondonan: Tung sate West & Rolling) Western District of Tennessee which had been purchased from the Chickssaws. At the same time his brother Manoah went to Ala and settled St. Cloud, and other of the family moved elsewhere. He with the Kulbreth, Smith, McQuire, Matthews, Tipton and other families settled in the county, with Henry Yarbro at Indain Creek. Goodspeed's History of Tenn., published 1887, p 808 sayd that he was the fourth white settler and first magistrate of Tipton Sounty. He operated a grast mill on Indian Creek and to-day when the creek is low, the remains can still be seen. "On petition of James Wilson and Thomas P. Hall being filed, were ordered by the Court "that theyleave to build a mill on Indain Creek at a place formerly owned by Henry Yarbeo. This was the first water powered mill in the county, being built by Henry Yarbro early in 1824." (Tipton Co. Min. Docket Bk B,p 274-Sept.1832)

The first record of land transaction in his name is found in 1824

when he bought 575 acres from Newton Cannon of Williamson County for

Henry Yarbro was instrumental in the organization of Tipton County and served as magistrate.

Henry attempted several times to obtain his pension right for Hevolutionary service. In 1833 he appeared before the Court of Pleas and warter Dession of Tipton County and at the age of 71 or 72, he obtained \$12,50 persemi-annum. Acopy of that decclaration is given in full detail an account of his voluntary service as a private in the Horse Company of Capt. Fuller in 1779 and 1780 in the partisan war.

He made a will Nov.4,1841 which was prohated July term of Court 1843. "Anderson C. and Edward Yarbro appointed Administrators of estate of Henry Yarbro late of this county with A. C. Yarbro and E. Yarbro, George Smith, A. H. Owen, H. Larimore, R. H. Munford, C. C. Archer and James A. Calhoun as sureties and presented will for probate." (Ibid Min. Docket Bk C. p 472-487)

The Yarbros attended Indain Creek Primitive Baptist Church (Old Baptist) organized in 1824 by Rev. J. Lilly. He and most of hid family are buried in the graveyard there where his stone reads

"Henry Yarbro Sr. who departed this life Jan. 30, A. D. 1843 aged about 80 yrs."

He was honored by the Tipton County chapter of D A R iin a dedication service when they placed the bronze marker ther in 1943.





the county. He is the only Revolutionary soldier know to be buried in the county. He was a magistrate from the first district in the first court. He owned the first gristmill located on Indian Creek where remains can still be seen in low water. He married Bridgett Davis in Rowan County, N.C. on August 29, 1785 and Mary Cunningham in Rowan County, N.C. on September 13, 1804. He died January 30, 1843 and is buried in Indian Creek Graveyard. We do not know if Mary Cunningham died in North Carolina or Tennessee. He received a pension in 1833 for services in the Revolution serving under Capt. Jacob Williams of Dan River and in the application, he declares that his father and family lived in Davidson County, North Carolina where they have skirmishes and how it became necessary to hide in the woods when he came home and other interesting items.

Edward Yarbrough, son of Henry and Mary Cunningham Yarbro, was born October 20, 1805 in Davidson County, N.C. He came to Tipton County when his father came and settled on Indian Creek in 1822 or 23. He owned land on Indian Creek and Mining Creek and also owned slaves. He married Jane Kulbreath, daughter of William Kulbreath, who also was born in Davidson County, N.C. They were married March 19, 1826 in Tipton County, Tennessee.

On the flyleaf of his account book covering the years 1829 to 1874, Manoah Yarbrough of St. Clair County, Alabama wrote "My cousin, Edward Yarbrough of Tipton County, Tennessee, Covington, Post Office."

Edward died February 4, 1866 at 3 a.m. Jane Died January 31, 1892 at 8:10 a.m. Both are buried in Indian Creek Graveyard.

Landon Bradford Yarbrough, the son of Edward and Jane Kulbreath Yarbro, was born on Sept. 6, 1827 in Tipton County, Tennessee. In the family Bible we find his name as Bradley and in legal documents as Bradlord.

Brad Yarbrough was a man of exceptionally good looks, but overbearing in personality. He and his brother in law, William Kinney had been having family troubles for some time. On an election day, they met on the road to Liberty. After a few words, Brad Yarbrough, seached from his horse

and hooked his walking cane around the teck of William Kinney who was seated in his wagon, William Kinney then drew his pistol and killed Brad Yarbrough, William Kinney was never prosecuted. This was June (9, 1874, (This was told by Mrs. Ola Dickey Kinney in the summer of 1953 and had been told to her by her mother-in-law, Mrs. Jim Kinney.)

The Brad Yarbrough farm was directly in front of the Aubrey Dickey farm.

His first marriage was to Susan McG-ire, daughter of William and Frances McGuire on April 3, 1846. She was born August 26, 1828 and died March 13, 1853 at the age of 24 years.





In the name of God Amen, I Henry Yarbrough of the County of Tipton And the state of onnessee, Being of sound and dispairing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testiment revoking and making all other wills by me at any time made.

First: I direct that all my funeral expenses and just debts be paid out of any money that I may die posessed of or that may come first into the hands of my executors.

Second: I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Freddle or her heirs the sum of 100 dollars.

Third: I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane Billings or her heirs the sum of 100 dollars.

Fourth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Biddy Smith or her heirs the sum of 100 dollars.

Fifth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Smith or her heirs the sum of 100 Dollars.

Sixth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Smith or her heirs the sum of 100 dollars.

Seventh: I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Smith or her heirs the sum of 100 dollars.

Eighth: I give and bequeath to Annie Davis The daughter of my deceased wife, the sum of 100 dollars.

minth: I give and bequeath to William Cunningham the son of my deceased wife, the sum of 100 dollars.

Tenth: I give and bequeath to my son Andrew C. Yarbrough or his heirs my tract of land on which I now reside, also my wagon and set of blacksmith tools after payment and satisfaction of all the foregoing bequests and legacies to be made by my executors out of any money of which I may die posess or fron the sale of such of my property as they may think best.

Eleventh: It is my wish and desire that all to the remainder of my property and estate of any or every description what ever both real or personal shall be equally devided between my two sons Edward Yarbrough and Andrew C. Yarbrough or their heirs.

Lastly: I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons Edward and Andrew C. my executors in witness of which I do thismy last will subscribe my name and affix my seal this 4th day of Nov. A.D. 1841.



And to my daughter Jemima Powler and her heirs I give a negro woman by the name of Sarah. Sr. Another Samuel Y., was in Tipton Co., TN and is on the 1830 Tipton Co., TN census.

Sarah Burkhart, b. ca 1810/11, was the daughter of John and Catharine Burkhart. See Will of John Burkhart (Will Book 1, p. 365, Davidson Co., NC) dated 24 Apr 1841, proven Aug. 1841 Court. Names: Wife, Catharine; sons: Soloman, dec'd (bequest to his 4 children); John and Andrew, deceased; Daughters: Elizabeth Younts, wife of Benjamin Younts; Barbara, wife of John Frank; Margaret (living with Thomas Yarbrough); Sarah, wife of Thomas Yarbrough; Nancy, wife of Jesse Goss; Granddaughter Elizabeth Burkhart, daughter of son Andrew, deceased. Executors: John Frank and A. F. Smith. Witnesses: Peter Owen and James Wiseman.

1850 Census for Tipton Co., TN shows that Washington Green Y (#5 child) was b ca 1836/37 in NC and Margaret Ann (#6 child) was b. in TN ca 1838/39. In January 1837, Thomas Y is buying land from William H. Edwards in Tipton Co., TN. From this we can assume that Thomas probably went to TN about 1836. Perhaps he went first to get settled and his wife and family followed after the birth of Washington Green Y.

- #1. John S. 19 on 1850 census. Deeds from Tipton Co, TN in 1861 state Thomas is a resident of Ark. John would have been 30. It is possible he did not go to Ark with the family. I do not find him in Tipton Co., TN in 1860.
- #2. Thomas Jefferson. 17 on 1850 census. On the 1860 Census of Jackson Co., Ark, he is shown as age 25 with a wife Susan age 20 and dau Emma age 3. He married Virginia Ann Penn in 1866. Did his first wife die? What became of the daughter?
- #3 James Franklin. 15 on 1850 census, 22 on 1860 census. He appears to have his brothers and sisters living with him. Why? Father Thomas is making deeds in 1861 in TN. Was Thomas just in TN to settle up matters before returning to Arkansas?
- #4 Safronia E. 14 on 1850 census, 21 on 1860 census. On 1869 Deed she is listed as S. E. Draffin. Marriage isn't in Tipton Co., The records. One of the neighbors in Tipton Co., TN was named Draffin. A little research would probably show that the Y girls married brothers from this neighboring family.
- Washington Green. 13 on 1850 census, 19 on 1860 census. Married Emmin Huglett 8 Jun 1867 in Tipton Co. A Washington Y is in the Tipton Co., TN records, but more research needs to be done to see if this is the same man.
- #6. Margaret Ann. 11 on 1850 census; She married William M. Draffin 14 May 1856 in Tipton Co., TN. According to the 1869 deed, she was a resident of Woodruff Co., Ark.
- #7 Martha J. 10 years on 1850 census, 20 on 1860 census. On 1869 Deed she is shown as Martha Duke. On the 1872 Power of Attorney her husbands initials are given as E. T. Duke. There is no marriage record in Tipton Co., TN and marriage probably was in Arkansas.
- #8 Andrew Jackson. 7 on 1850 census, 18 on 1860 census. No further information.
- #9 Isaac Newton. 6 on 1850 c, 16 on 1860 census. No further information. He is not listed on the deed where the heirs of Thomas are selling land in 1869. Perhaps he had died between 1860 and 1869?



### PIONEER FAMILIES OF REVEL

## By Milton Yarbrough as told by Maude Yarbrough Schwer

My great-grandfathers were some of the earliest settlers of what is now the Revel community. My great-grandfather, Thomas Jefferson Yarbrough, a captain in the Confederate Service, came from Tennessee to Woodruff County, Arkansas, before or during the Civil War. My other great-grandfather, Samuel Charles Stephenson, was born in North Hampton County, North Carolina, and later moved to Woodruff County at the end of the Civil War.

On February 14, 1866, Thomas Jefferson Yarbrough age thirty-three married Virginia Ann Penn age nineteen. Virginia Ann Penn was the daughter of the Penns' of Maury County, Tennessee, who settled in Augusta in 1849 and established one of the first merchantile businesses there. The couple, known as Jeff and Annie, gave birth to their only child, William Penn Yarbrough, on the Yarbrough farm on February 14, 1870. When William was a year old, Viginia Ann became very ill with pneumonia. A good friend and neighbor of the family, Margaret Stephenson and her baby daughter, Annie Tabitha, came to visit Annie and found a hungry and crying baby William. Since Virginia Ann was too ill to feed the child, Margaret nursed him at her breast. So, my grandfather and grandmother nursed the same breast at one time. Unfortunately, Virginia Ann never recovered from the illness.

When William Penn was two years old his father, Jeff, was killed by a horse. Jeff's brother Frank, a bachelor, took William Penn to raise along with five other orphaned relative children. The only names of the other orphaned children remembered are Ida and Ella Duke and Tom Layn.

When William Penn was fourteen years old, his uncle Frank was killed over a disagreement concerning a small debt. Following Frank's death, William Penn moved into Augusta and boarded with various people and later attended the University of Arkansas.

At age 21, William Penn took over the mortgaged Yarbrough farm and soon began courting Annie Tabitha Stephenson. Annie was the daughter of Samuel Charles Stephenson and Margaret Theresa Cariker Garrett Stephenson. Her father (Samuel), a farmer, preferred to live near a river so that he could hunt and fish. When Samuel was a young man, during the Reconstruction period which followed the Civil War, he left North Carolina with eleven other young men including

two brothers, Ben and Nathan. The young men left their homes a moved West in search of opportunities. Ben, a Civil War veteran an prisoner of war at Elmira, New York, never had a family; nor did brother Nathan who died at a young age.

Annie Tabitha's mother Margaret, was the daughter of Geor Cariker of South Carolina, who came to Woodruff County and settl near what is now Fakes, Arkansas. Margaret's first marriage was Louis Garrett who was killed in Augusta, leaving her with to children named Margaret (Maggie, who later married James Shor and James (Jim, a sheriff of Woodruff County 1910-1914). Margar later married Samuel Stephenson and had four children, Ann Tabitha, Edna (who married Dr. Hargis), Walter, and Victor.

On October 18, 1893, William Penn and Annie were married in the Stephenson home. William Penn and Annie prospered and added more land and property in Augusta. They also owned shares in the Old Revel cotton gin and the Conner Mercantile at Revel. They had fifteen children, two of whom died at birth. They were:

William Jenkins (October 18, 1894 - December 24, 1960). He married Lottie Angelo of Woodruff County, and had three children, Annie Lorene (deceased), William Jerome, and William Penn.

Maggie Annie (November 25, 1895 - September 24, 1916). She married Roland Murphy of Arkansas.

Jefferson Penn (November 18, 1896 - July 10, 1897).

Maude LaVergne was born October 13, 1897. She married Charles Schwer of New York, and is now a widow living in Orlando, Florida. She taught at some of the one-room schools in Woodruff County when she was young.

Samuel Charles (February 19, 1899 - August 18, 1899).

Mable Edna was born August 1, 1901. She married Robert P. Smith of Shreveport, Louisianna, and is now a widow living in Shreveport. She and Maude are the only ones of their generation still living.

Minor Gregory (December 25, 1902 - October, 1947). He married Beatrice Barton of McAdoo, Texas, and had two children, Wanda Lou and Melvin.

My father, Marvin Thomas (December 17, 1903 - November 4, 1980). He first married Martha Maureen Long of Advance, Missouri, whom he met in Little Rock. They had three children, Milton Thomas, Merridy Rae, and Royce Wayne. Maureen died March 2, 1934, and is buried in the Memorial Cemetery of Augusta. Marvin later married Mona Adams of Dickens, Texas, who gave birth to six children, Stanley Norvel, Mona Carolyne, twins Marilyn Edwina and Marvin Edward, Steven Penn (deceased), and Sammie Durrel.

Other children of William Penn Yarbrough and Annie are:

Milton Burpee, (February 1, 1905 - April 11, 1914)

Russell Allen, (February 23, 1906 - August 23, 1906)

Darius Pendell, (May 30, 1907 - April 20, 1929)

Lucy Dean, (August 19, 1908 - March 15, 1984). She married Herman R. Montgomery of Little Rock and had one son, Darius Pendell, who is deceased.

Libbye Victor, (February 1, 1910 - December 28, 1988). She m Carl J. Huckabee of Shreveport, Louisiana, and gave birth i children, Carl Jack (deceased), and Beverly Jean.

Annie Tabitha died February 3, 1911, age forty. William Penn February 27, 1915, age forty-five. It is said that William Penn was first Yarbrough man to die of natural causes in the family for over years. Both are buried in the Memorial Cemetery in Augusta.

William Penn has been described by his children as being char and fun-loving. He enjoyed playing the guitar to entertain his family, and breeding fine show horses. He won first-place awar horse show competitions. Annie, on the other hand, was the serious one. Aunt Maude Yarbrough Scwher remembers her moth being "The navigator of the ship."

My memories of Woodruff County are filled with fishing at Pe Bay and along the Cache River and hunting in the woods with father. My parents were Marvin Thomas Yarbrough and Mau Long Yarbrough. They were married September 11, 1924, in I

Rock, Arkansas, and moved to Texas where three children were born, Milton, Merridy Rae, and Royce. In 1933, my mother and father moved to the farm near the Revel community. In 1934, our mother died. Our father raised us with the help of a black man named Jim Reeves. We were very close to Jim. In 1940, the farm was sold. We moved to Texas where my father married Mona Adams and moved to California. They had six children. All of Marvin Yarbrough's descendants have lived in California since 1943.

# COTTON PLANT'S CHINESE FAMILIES

By Mrs. Walter Miller, Jr.

When Wong's Grocery closed its doors in 1987, an era of Cor Plant's history drew to a close. For the first time in over 60 years, it would be no Chinese-American family store on Main Street, following account is put together partly from memory and partly information supplied by relatives and friends who remember the fondly, including Anne Wilkerson Morris and Wendy Hong.

I am told that the first Chinese-American family in Cotton P was two brothers named Wong. Mr. Shelby Crafford remembers see them when he was a teenager. They wore high hats and smoked fu looking pipes and seemed very mysterious to him. Their grocery s was located in the old Mayberry building where the Will May 5 & Cent Store used to be.

The small red headstone in Cotton Plant Cemetery reads: JEU PAN, Canton, China, 1886-1932.   - A. Welcome to all
  - B. Reba's excellent job.
- 2. When Reba asked me to host the Saturday morning workshop, I thought what she wanted was a physical body present, someone who could direct you to the coffee pot, get the air conditioner adjusted if need ... and I thought I could probably handle those jobs.

However, in later conversations, I discovered that Reba wanted me to have something brilliant to say about research on the family. I do not have Bob Yarbrough's talent for telling a story, and I certainly am not blessed with Senator Ralph's poise, grace and eloquence in speaking. In fact, if I get through this without fainting, I'll put it down in my diary as a day of miracles.

Bob Yarbrough often said that if your ancestor was a poor but honest man, you wouldn't find him in the records. If he was poor, he owned no land and won't be found in the deed records. If he had nothing to leave, he won't be found in the probate records. And if he was honest, he won't be in the court records either.

Bob Yarbrough also used to say that he wouldn't care if he discovered that his ancestor was a horse thief, as long as he could prove it was HIS horse thief. I feel the same way! Good or bad, they are my family and I love them all -- even the

rascals.

Every family I've researched is pretty much the same. There are the more prominent members -- leaders of the community, officials of the city, county or country, soldiers with metals, or some who are financially successful. These people are not hard to find. They are written up in the history books, in the old newspapers and in the records. You find them in the deed records, probate records, military records.

One the far side of the scale are the "rascals." I don't like the term "black sheep" of the family. We all know there weren't any "bad" Yarbroughs -- but there were a few good Yarbroughs who did a few bad things! You can find these people in the records, too. They were in the newspapers and court records.

And, right down the middle were the majority of our families ... not quite prominent enough to be written up in the history books or on the front pages of the newspapers, not quite rascal enough to be in the criminal or civil records, and mentioned, it seems, but rarely in other records.

I have selected some records to share with you from this group down the middle.

### JOHN YARBROUGH

On February 12th, John Yarbrough was sick. In fact, he was so sick that the family sent for Dr. William Tarborn who prescribed for John Pictoral Julep and Lascaline solution. The doctor saw him again on February 19th, March 10th and again on March 19th when he prescribed antihysterick Pills and antihysterick mixture. The doctor called again on March 14th and 17th and on this latter date gave him another round of antihysterick mixture. John was charged, by the way, for the medicine and the bottle in which it came. On March 20th the doctor called again and this time prescribed a quart of strong antihysterick Decoction. By this time, John owed 3 pounds, 1 shilling and 6 pence to the doctor.

The doctor returned to see John on March 25th, but it appears that the doctor did not see John on the 25th. Though the visit is entered in his records, there is no charge. By March 26th, 1753, Dr. Tarborn had been to the court to sue for his fee. The Sheriff's return notes that on March 26, 1753 "No inhabitant, he is runaway. Abraham Coche, Sheriff.

On 8 October 1754, John Yarbrough's restate was attached in Virginia for the amount of the Dr.'s bill. John still owned land in Virginia. The attachment was placed in the hands of Thomas Yarbrough Jun.

On 9 December 1755, Thomas Yarbrough Jr. was ordered to court and failed to appear as Garishee in the suit by Wm Tarborn

against the Estate of John Yarbrough who is "absconded."

On January 23, 1755, the garnishment was served on Thomas Jr. and discharged.

On 28 March 1755, John and Betty Yarbrough of North Carolina sold their Amelia County land to James May of Amelia Co.,\_Va-

Record shows several things: John left Virginia betwen March 20th and March 25th, 1753. He was apparently still not well when he moved as he got a quart of strong antihysterick Decoction. John didn't "abscond", he moved to NC and appears in the

Granville Co. records.

John was the son of Thomas Y. Sr. The suit was left in the hands of John's brother, Thomas Y. Jr.

### WILLIAM YARBROUGH

William had property and left a will. Many researchers have been puzzled that they could not find an estate settlement. The problem, I think, is they just didn't look far enough. Here is the estate inventory --- filed with the court January 17, 1794 by son Richard Yarbrough --- nearly 23 years after William's death. A rare thing --the reason is was filed so late is also given under oath:

NB: The appraisers did not attend on the day of sale and my remote situation and apprehension that the foregoing Estate might be wasted by an imprudent Brother who had been in possession of it and who (as was represented) had wasted a considerable part thereof, induced me to sell without an appraisement and for the same cause the Negroes were not appraised for they fled to me in Petersburg to prevent James S. Yarbrough's carrying them to the Mississippi, the place he was then destined for. The reason that I have been tardy in not returning these proceedings was that I had settled with all the parties interested under my Fathers Will

except a younger Brother who also went out of this Country but he having lately returned, I think it right to transmit them to the worshipful Court of Prince Edward that they maybe admitted to Record.

# NANSEMOND COUNTY TO WIT

Richard Yarbrough made oath before me a majestrate of the said county that the foregoing Inventory and amount of sales are just and true to the best of his knowledge. Given under my hand this 25th day of October 1793.

## s/A. Richardson

Admitted to record in Prince Edward County February 17, 1794 s/A. Hathinworth(?)

Records prove James Smith Yarborough arrived in the Louisiana in May 1773 with his wife, Mary, five children and his brother. By 1793, Joseph Y and his wife Temperance, lived in Lunenburg Co., VA. There are later records of an Oswell Yarbrough in the Louisiana records, but I don't know if this is the brother who accompanied James.

The moral of this record is, don't restrict yourself to just the few years after a person died when searching for the records.

### MOSES YARBER

It so happened in the life of John Walker that things had got past all endurance. He was a soldier in Camp Mast, but he was sick and tired of it all. John wanted to be well out of it, but he did not wish to desert. When it came time for him to spend a week at the home of his father, Meredith Walker, John got with two of his friends and cooked up quite a plan. John arranged for his friends, Levi Coffey and Erwin Calloway, to "capture" him at the end of his week at home.

It would not do for Levi to be known in the matter as he was John's best friend. For Calloway to "capture" John unaided also seemed to be a plan that smacked of complicity.

It just so happened that some time before Henderson Calloway had brought in from Tennessee a full United States officer's uniform, shoulder-straps, belt and sword. Adorned in this uniform, it was hoped that Erwin would not be recognized. But, where were

the "assisting force" to come from? Levi said he would supply the assisting force.

On the chosen night, Erwin Calloway, dressed in full regimentals, marched his squad into the Walker yard and halted them near the front door. Sergeant Levi Coffeey and the guard remained in the dark, but they were dimly visible.

Erwin rapped on the door for admittance. John and his womenfolk appeared at the door, faces white. Erwin demanded John's surrender. Erwin went inside after issuing some gruff commands for his sentinels outside to stay alert and watchful. There was a parley, John's women pleading for him with tear-bedimmed eyes. Erwin stood his ground and tore Walker away from the arms of his family. For effect, Erwin also captured Jonathan McHaarg at the same time and place. John was hidden and fed by friends. About a week after his "capture", John walked into his home, apparently much crippled up and sorely distraught, but bearing an iron clad paper-writing with his signature attached, a duplicate of one he declared the Yankees in Tennessee had compelled him to sign while in captivity in order to secure his parole. Of course it was a fake, but it worked for when Bingham sent for John, the messenger advised John to respect his parole and he was left at home till the surrender at Appomattox.

This story may not appear to have anything to do with the Yarbrough family. But it does. Remember Erwin's "squad," the "arresting force" that rode up with him that night? All of the

Court Minutes, 1849:

A writ lunatica inquirendi had been issued to inquire into the state of the mind of Edward Yarbrough and to inquire whether he had any estate.

"We of the jury find that Edward Yarbrough now in Court aged about 17 years is a lunatic and has been such for the last two or three months; that he has no estate for his support; that he has not been brought to this state to make a charge on the treasury; none of his ancestors were subject to insanity. In the opinion

men were away at war. Where did he find the five men who waited outside with Sgt. Levi Coffey's?

The "Men" were Levi's wife, Edith; Elvira Taylor, Frankie Danner, Catharine and Jemima Yarber, dressed in men's clothing and armed with stick guns.

of the Jury, he is insane on the subject religion. He is not dangerous nor subject to periodical sane intervals, but is inclined to melencholy and to remorse. It is therefore considered by the Court that the said Edward Yarbrough is a lunatic and that he be taken to and confined in the lunatic assylum at Lexington there to remain until discharged therefrom."

We go now to the court minutes of Thursday, September 30, 1852

A writ of de iodiota inquirendi issued to inquire into the state of mind of Henry Yarbrough and whether he has any estate:

"We of the jury find Henry Yarbrough to be an idiot and has been ever since his birth. He ws born in the County and has ever since resided in it. He has an undivided one seventh interest in a tract of land in remainder after the death of his mother worth forty dollars. His father is dead, his mother alive and resides in this County; she has not estate to support him; he is not capable of labouring for any part of his support."

John Pennybaker was made Committee for said Idiot H. Yarbrough. He sold Henry's share of the estate and when those funds ran out, the Commonwealth of Kentucky paid \$50 a year for the Henry's upkeep.

According to the early law books, the difference between an idiot and a lunatic was that there was no hope of recovery for an idiot, the situation was permanent. A lunatic, on the other hand, could recover.

What this record tells us is that there was a poor, young widow with some real problems to cope with. Note that in the court record it said that Henry had an undivided one seventh interest in a tract of land after the death of his mother. His brother Samuel was already dead, so this record tells us that Henry had six living brothers and/or sisters. It is also in the court records that none of the ancestors of this line were subject to insanity!

William Stout, the father of Hannah, was opposed to the marriage between Hannah and the young Baptist preacher, Zachariah Yarbrough who had preached that slavery was wrong. William Stout was a large slave owner (and Zachariah's father also owned slaves). William had forbidden Hannah to see Zachariah. But 19 year old Hannah had a mind of her own and she didn't always obey her father. William locked Hannah in her room and left a trusted Negro woman to watch her.

Zachariah had tarried most of the day at the home of Lewis and Elizabeth (Stout) Ward, Rachel's Aunt and Uncle. Whether the aunt and uncle were a part of the plan is unknown.

After the Negro woman went to sleep, Hannah slipped out of the window and met her sweetheart who was waiting on horseback for her. The Negro woman awakened just in time to see them galloping away. She quickly roused her master and he went in hot pursuit of them, swearing that he would kill Zachariah on sight.

William arrived in Lexington at the home of Rev. King

just as he was giving the young people his blessing. After much blustering around, William decided not to shoot Zachariah. Instead, he made Zachariah the overseer of his plantation.

Sometime later, Mr. Stout sold one of his women slaves, but kept her husband. Each slave grieved for the other. Zachariah had taken the husband of the woman to Salisbury and the slave confessed to Zachariah that he was going to run away, that he would never stay with Mr. Stout again. From all accounts left to us about Zachariah, he was a very good and kind man. He certainly must have had the trust and respect of the slaves as it must have been quite something to a slave to tell the overseer of a plantation he was going to run away. Zachariah took matters into his own hands. He went to the man who had bought the female slave and sold him the woman's husband. Zachariah put the slave family back together and also figured that Mr. Stout at least had the price of the slave, something he would not have had if the slave had run away.

For this act, William Stout never forgave Zachariah. From that time on, Zachariah and Hannah lived on their own farm. From the stories handed down, Zachariah was a loving and generous husband and father, seeing to it that not only were his children educated, they had a real zest for learning.

Zachariah died in 1844 at 43 years of age, leaving 8 children from 2 to 17 years of age.

Some of you may have read the account in Nelle Jenkins

quarterly of Hannah's trip to Iowa with her second husband and about the daughter, Rachel Yarbrough who was left on the trail. That account was given to Nelle by Alda Rarick, a granddaughter of Zachariah and Hannah. It doesn't quite tell the whole story.

In 1924, Abigail Yarbrough Irish, a daughter of Zachariah and Hannah Yarbrough, wrote a sketch of her sister Rachel's life to present to Rachel's daughter. Aunt Abby called this sketch "Rachel Elizabeth (Yarbrough) Osborne - Her Trip from North Carolina to Iowa in 1847." It is too long to read the entire sketch, so I'll share some of the pertinent parts beginning right after Zachariah's death. I'll also remind you that this was being written for a child.

About the time of his (Zachariah's) death a man to whom he had given a note came to collect the amount from Rachel's Mother (Hannah) which brought the family to very reduced circumstances. There was only one of Rachel's two brothers old enough to till the soil at that time, so Rachel and her older sister, Mima, were taught to lend a hand in the field as well as in the house work. Thus the Mother kept the family together and looked after the two plantations.

As time went on, a tenant farm, who had lost his wife won the affections of Rachel's mother and they were married. Then this man whose name was Joseph Hill wrote to his brother then living in Iowa that if he would come south he (Joseph) would sell the two plantations he had gotten by his recent

marriage and go back to Iowa with him. The brother did not wait to send a letter but hitched up two horses to his carriage and with his oldest son drove back the fifteen hundred miles in three weeks to the old North State. Just before the long journey to Iowa was begun by Rachel's family her older sister, Mima, married the young man who had come from the West with his father. This young man's name was James Hill.

These two girls, Rachel and Mima and their brother. William, had at that time not fully decided to go West with their mother. When their mother married, she went to the other plantation taking only the smaller children to live with her and their step-father. Rachel, Mima and william remained in the old home of their late father. About this time the family learned that the step-father had, at one time, been a driver of negro slaves and was known to be very cruel, and the farm which he now claimed as his was really the property of his wife's children whose father was Zachariah Yarborough. The marriage of the older sister Mima broke up the old home and Rachel then paid her fare to the step-father to bring her along to Iowa. [Rachel was 15 years old] When the brother (William) learned that the step-father had secured an officer to her property with the exception of a fine young team which he kept to draw their wagon to Iowa, it made him and his grandfather very anxious and they hardly

knew what to do to save any of the property for the Yarborough children. The grandfather, William Stout, and the
sheriff came over and arrested the step-father and took him
back to Lexington. There he was made to disgorge some of the
money he had collected by fraud and which had been the property of his wife and her children. After this he promised
he would be kind to the family and so he was permitted to
proceed on his way to Iowa.

But he was disgruntled at what had happened and as soon as he had gotten far enough on the road to feel safe from the law he forgot his promise of good treatment for the children and would not let Rachel ride in the wagon with her Mother and two of her little sisters. He forced Rachel and the two little sisters often to walk miles behind the wagon on this strange road. Oh how weary they often were and were so glad to ride with anyone going their way who would ask them to ride in their wagon.

At that period of time it was customary for people to invite those they met walking along the road going their way to ride with them. Rachel and her younger sisters [Sarah who was 12 and Abigail who was 10] who walked suffered much with blistered and swollen feet and were glad to be invited to ride.

One time a cabman met them who had no passengers in his bus and he invited them to ride. They got in and waved their

hands to their folks as they briskly passed them on the road. Their mother was glad to see that they were getting so rapidly and comfortably over the turn-pike. They rode until the man said he soon had to fill up his bus with passengers. When the family caught up to the cab, the younger ones climbed out. they were overtaken by their family the step-father would not permit them to ride in the wagon with their mother which gave the Mother great anxiety as she knew they were approaching a large city, so she told Rachel to stop at the edge of the city and wait till the family caught up with her.

Rachel at this time was carrying nothing with her, her mother having her money and her clothing in her care. Her step-father in one of his temper fits said that he wanted to lose Rachel and so struck camp for the night long before they reached the outskirts of the city. This was a night of great anxiety for Rachel's mother as well as for herself. The following day when the family reached the outskirts of the city, which was Louisville, Kentucky, the stepfather hurried through the city as quickly as possible so as to prevent his wife having the opportunity to find her daughter. Hannah did not know her husband had taken a different road than the one he had told Rachel he was taking. Every opportunity the Mother secured she inquired along the route if anyone had seen her Rachel, and she also looked up and down the streets

of this city in vain for her daughter. It was worse than death to the Mother to have to go forward on the long journey leaving her child she knew not where nor with whom. The ugly step-father in some manner suspected that his wife had her daughter's money and so he made her give it over to him.

They reached Iowa in late Summer 1846. A couple of weeks after the party had landed at their destination in Iowa, they received a letter from Rachel. She stated that the cabman had lied about having to take on passengers in his bus so when she discovered this she told him to stop and let her out but he laid on the whip to the horses. Then she began to scream and kick; she kicked through the glass doors of the bus. As they were just entering the edge of town, he found it best to let the young girl out of the hackney. dropped her with plenty of cuss words. After this, Rachel sat down near a house to await the coming of her people who she hoped would soon be along on this road. The woman of a nearby house noticed the young girl who looked worried and tired and invited her to come in and have supper. accepted the kind invitation and to this kind and sympathetic woman she related the circumstances which forced her to be alone on the road. Rachel was given lodging and her breakfast and she spent the next day watching in vain for her people -- not knowing her step-father had taken a different road at the last minute.

I will leave Aunt Abby's account here and sum up the next few years. Rachel stayed in Louisville. The kindly woman who had helped her that first day also helped Rachel secure a position with a woman named Mrs. Gartner who had no children and who was kind to Rachel, paying her two dollars a week. Rachel had told her mother that she would plan to come to Iowa by steamer when the ice had melted from the rivers and it would be safe to travel. Meanwhile, Josiah Hill, the brother of Mima's husband, heard so much about the pretty blue eyed Rachel that he decided he would go for her. It wasn't safe for a young woman to travel on the steamers as they often had horse thieves and bandittie as passengers. By the time he returned with Rachel, he was determined to marry her -- and did six weeks later.

Aunt Abby was present when Rachel arrived and she describes quite a happy and tearful reunion. When Rachel and Josiah were married, the step-father was forced to hand over Rachel's money.

Rachel Yarbrough Hill had yet more hardships to face. In the next four years, she had two daughters. Shortly after the birth of her second daughter, her husband died and his death was followed very shortly by the death of her youngest daughter.

The story does have a happy ending. Four years after their arrival in Iowa, James Hill (the evil stepfather) died. Hannah married again two years later to John West, a man very like her first husband Zachariah. He was very good to her and her family until his death in 1861.

The pretty Rachel also married again and she and her husband, George Osborne raised a happy family.

### TOM YARBROUGH

Uncle Peter Wilson Walton was killed by a man named Tom Yarbrough during the war (Civil). It is said that Uncle Wilson denounced Yarbrough for some of his (Yarbrough's) conduct -- claimed that he had all but stolen some widow's cow. Shortly after this when Dr. Walton was in town, he saw Yarbrough enter an old church. Yarbrough had his rifle and Dr. Walton said that he would not be a coward, that he expected to be shot as he rode by. He was shot, but he managed to stay on his horse until he got home, something like a mile and a half away. He lived on Randolph Road just below where uncle Loftin now lives.

He died about 24 hours after receiving his fatal wound.

One of Dr. Walton's sons, W. H. Walton, was in the army at that time.

When Yarbrough learned that there was a likelihood of Dr. Walton not dying, he proceeded to a thicket where Dr. Walton had 12 or 14 bales of cotton hidden and burned them. Cotton was very valuable at that time, worth \$500 a bale.

My grandfather procured a warrant for the arrest of Yarbrough and the sheriff, D. C. Slaughter, with a possee, went to Yarbrough's home to arrest him.

Yarbrough, so happy after learning that Dr. Walton had died, was dancing and had a negro playing the violin or fiddle for him.

The sheriff informed Yarbrough that he had a warrant and had

him submit to arrest.

Yarbrough said, "All right, let me get my hat."

He came out of the house with a shotgun in his hand and two pistols and several dollars in gold in a belt around his person. He began to shoot and the possee returnd the fire. Yarbrough was killed, but not until after he emptied his shotgun and several shots were fired from his pistol.

The only man hit was a man named Capt. Smith, who was a first or second cousin of Dr. Walton. Smith afterward was killed by a man named Martin, and Martin was afterward killed by some man whose name escapes me, but he fled, went to Arkansaw and never was apprehended.

The Merrill Family migrated from England (A French Hugenot Familyof De Merle of the Provence of Auvergne in Central France).

Pichard and wife Sarah Willis Merrill of Warwichshire in the right bank of the Avon, sailed for America and settled on Northfield, Staten Island, New York ca 1675. They and five sons; William, who went west-Richard, a member of the Colonial Assembly-Thomas-Phillip- and John.

Williams wife was named Grace. Their children were, According to his will, William, Benjamin, and Joseph.

In 1729/30, Benjamin Mrs Penelone Stout Jewell, Widow of Thomas Jewell. This Captian Benjamin Merrill and William Merrill Of Rowan Co. N.C. were brothers. Rowan Co. Records show land deeds signed by both. Benjamin died 1771 and the widow married Harmon ButlerOf Rowan Co. N.C. 1775. A few minutes before Benjamin Merrill was executed by the British he said, "In a few minutes I will leave a widow and ten children". She made a will in 1801, executed 1803 and mentioned son Samuel, daughter Nancy, daughter Ellen, Sons Andrew, John, Johns, William, Charles, Jonathan, Elijah, all Merrills. The will was signed Jemina Butler. Witnessed by Thomas Burham and Azariah Merrill.

Samuel, the eldest son of Benjamin and Jemina Merrill was born 1748. His will in will Book G. Page 5, Rowan Co. N.C. was probated in 1803, mentioning his wife Suzannahand and sons Benjamin, Smith, and Asarriah, daughter Jemina, daughter Sarah, and later

ords names a daughter, Betty. This Samuel was also known as Azariah by the family. He is listed in Salisbury, N.C. District as the one who turned in his certificate in the Revelution amounting to 7-19-11ddated 15 Sept 1782 and paid by the Comptrollers office by John Armstrong. He Received his pay in land 22 April 1784. At one time decendents of Capt. Benjamin Merrill could enter DAR on his merits, but he was hanged before the Declaration of War, it is now discounted, but Samuels line is open.

The Yarbrough Family Bible records show that Jemina Merrill, wife of Thomas Yarbrough was born 6 Oct 1782.

"----- Twelve Regulators were tried and condemmed for high treason in 1771. Among of m six were suspended-- among these last, the most distinguished Bemjamin Merrill who has been Captian of Militis of Rowan (now Davidson Co. N.C.)--- The name of Benjamin Merrill wife was Jamina Stout, Stoutsbridge, Monmouth Co. New Jersey--- Capt Benjamin Merrill was the Great Grandfather of Zachariah Yarbrough, a son of Thomas Yarbrough. The wife of Thomas Yarbrough was Jamina Merrill, a granddaughter of Capt. Merrill.

Mrs . A. Irish of Davonport, Iowa, was a daughter of this Zachariah Yarbrough, who left Davidson Co. N.C. in 1846 for Iowa travelling in a covered wagon. She lived to be more than ninety years old and gave much of this data.

An inscription on the monument in Guilford Battle Grounds reads:
"the first battle of the war of Alsmance in Orange Co. May 1771. Benjamin
Merrill, one of the regulators executed at Hillsboro, 18 June 1771.

Known to the family as "Aunt Abby", Abigail have a strong love for family from her earliest years. She traveled to gather family records and information before the Civil War and it is largely because of her that there are so many records existing of my own line.

Abigail kept diaries for almost every year of her adult life. These diaries are now housed at a University in Iowa and are full of the historical happenings of the day. She also recorded her visits to family members which has given us a rare insight to the looks and personalities of our earlier ancestors. Abigail never lost her love of her birthplace in NC. Until her death in 1925, she received the Lexington Dispatch and kept up with the news of her home.

The Editor of the newspaper asked a question in one issue to which Abigail responded. The Editor was so pleased with her response that he asked her to write some of her memories for the paper. The following is one of the articles she had published.



Lexington Dispatch Vol. XXIV, No. 3, Lexington, N.C. January 17, (year is missing from my copy): "IN OTHER DAYS" Column:

REMINISCENSE OF YE OLDEN TIME by Mrs. S. Abigail Irish.

Editor Dispatch: In response to your request, I will relate more of my memories of the times in Davidson County prior to antebellum days, hoping thereby to interest many another old settler in giving his or her recollections to the public and thus save to the present and coming generations the most toothsome bits of history.

The old flint-lock musket in its rack above the pioneer's door brought terror often to the hearts of the defender, but to the family sheltered within, it gave at all times a feeling of peace and security as well as providing them often with toothsome game. Small wonder was it that this old flint-lock seemed, at least to us youngsters, something to be almost reverenced and there was no day in the calendar - not even Christmas at that time - that could so rouse all the finer feelings of the young Americans in the Sunny South as "Muster Day." 'Twas then these very "gods of Protection, Peace and Plenty" were taken from their racks above our doors and after a thorough cleaning and polishing were carried forth by the householders, who, as members of the home militia, went regularly "To the wail of the fife and the snarl of the drum," to the drill which kept their hands skillful and their hearts inspired with patriotism. The old musket's day is over, but its important place in our history has been established and its place above our doors shall be held sacred to our memory and "the shot heard 'round the world." The placing of the musket above the door came about, no doubt, by a desire to have it in a convenient place in case of emergency, and dates back perhaps to the time of the Regulators and earliest settlers.

Mother often told us children of expected attacks from enemies and once of the excitement that prevailed when a general uprising of slaves had been reported. The night the attack was expected, ail the white folks were armed, their weapons being not only muskets but every available instrument upon the plantation which could be used in striking a deadly blow. Nany slaves remained true to their masters. Grandfather Stout's did, and they, like the whites, were armed in self-defense. The night came with its pall of darkness and weight of fears. As the weary hours dragged by, anxiety became intense, but the foe, where were they? They came not, but the merciful glorious dawn did, bringing rest to tired watchers and cheer to frightened women and children. I cannot now recall the year in which this general uprising of slaves through the South was expected. Perhaps some reader of the Dispatch can throw light on the subject.

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In the year 1842 or '43 there was introduced into Davidson County the first sulphur matches. They were bought as curiosities and were called Lucifer matches because of their blue flame which reminded the beholders of the flames in the under world so forcibly described by the ministers of those days. It took a number of years for this thing of curiosity with its beautiful and effective blue flame to supplant the old tinderbox. This box held the tinder or scorched liner that was easily ignited by letting fall upon it a spark of fire that had been formed by striking together a small piece of flint and steel. From this little spark was lighted the pitch-pine splinters that kindled the fire on the hearth. This process did not seem slow in those days, but in this age of electricity, the tinderbox has been buried beneath the dust of the "Car of Progress." Cnce in a rai while one may be seen in a museum for it has now changed places with the Lucifer match and become the curiosity. The old fashioned question, "Did you come to borrow fire?" which one hears even now put to a caller who announces that he can stay but a few moments, had its origin in the days of the tinderbox, for then it was that persons would go to their neigh-bors to borrow live coals, if their fire happened to go out overnight. Sometimes two or more neighbors might have to be called upon before finding one whose fire had remained alive. Such a course of affairs was far reaching in its bad effect - a belated breakfast, men late to the fields, and a master furious in his remarks to the black cook who smothered her fire in ashes so that it could not survive for the next morning's lighting, were a few of the train of events that followed the necessity of borrowing coals.

Here I am reminded of having seen father and William Sexton arrange wood in the shape of a kiln, then burn it to charcoal which they used on the forge in their blacksmith shop. Here these sturdy men toiled, mending and making farm implements, horseshoes and nails, door hinges and latches, also a variety of household necessities, as well as setting tires and doing the regular smithy's work. The country people also made the tar used on the wheels, axles and were adept at manufacturing any lubricator from tar to peach brandy. last was drunk at least three times a day. The early morning swig was the "eye opener;" the noon one was the "stomacher;" the final at night the "eye-winker." From what I gather in the Dispatch about moonshiners, I am inclined to believe there is still a lingering desire among the men to continue their daily stimulators, or "O be-joyfuls!"

Much of the furniture used in our part of the country was made by one James Taylor. He also made many of the coffins for the community. When anyone died, he came to the house and measured the body, then made the case to fit. Black walnut was most used and quite often this wood was kept on hand by families for this purpose. When such was the case, Taylor, with his assistants, came with their tools, their varnish and glue, to the house and made the coffin while the corpse waited. In case of serious illness, death or dire disaster, a horn was blown in a peculiar note at the outside door and this would notify neighbors and nearby relatives that their presence was desired. This was primitive telephoning, as you might say.

To go to the mill for the grist was quite an occasion in those days and often this duty fell to some of the women of the household. They would take a sack of grain on the horse they rode and then two or three other sacks upon a horse which was led; waiting for the grinding of the grain, they would carry back the meal in a similar manner. I can yet recall three mills. Harris' and Lester's on the Yadkin and William Stout's on Thomas Creek. There had been a mill on the Richard Cranford place operated in very early days by David Stout, an uncle of William. This was before my time and no doubt ground the bread stuffs for the soldiers of the Revolution and certainly the grain ground there was all threshed by the flail, for it was still in use in my childhood. This method and tramping by horses was then the practice. Upon the barn floor would be placed two lengths of sheaves with heads together and several sheaves thick, then horses were driven around upon it, the driver turning the straw meanwhile so as to bring all up to the tramping. When the grain was all loosened, it was put through a fanning machine to clear it of chapp, then it was ready for sacking. William Stout had a stationary thresher in his barn that was run by machiner operated by horses on the outside. In 1843, my grandparents took me with them to Mr. Harris' to see the first traveling thresher brought to Davidson County.

The old time way of shipping tobacco was very primitive, too. A home made truckle, a low. solid, wooden wheeled vehicle with thills placed just wide enough apart for a man to walk between. When loaded, it was drawn by a man with the aid of a breast strap and his hands.

In retrospect the saddest day of my childood was the day Dr. Burris, a surgeon from igh Point (who founded the Burris Clinic) and r. Charles Ray Sharpe (a G.P. at that time, in ton amputated my mother's left limb e of a bone infection, at our home. The auma of that day will live with our family. She arned to walk again with the aid of an artificial mb. It took courage and determination to vercome this handicap.

One of the happiest days I experienced was hen Dr. J.R. Terry (also a G.P. in Lexington)

delivered my baby brother at our home. My grandfather named his grandson Paul Vernon.

When they sent for me to see the baby Dr. Terry said, "Mildred, you have a little baby brother." "Oh!" I replied, "I especially wanted a girl, so I could play dolls with her!" "Well," Dr. Terry said, "Okay, but I only have little black ones." I told him, "This one will be fine. I'll keep him! I'll keep him." (I was 9 years old.)

Other happy days of my childhood were spent playing in a real playhouse with real windows. My friends, especially Elma Davis, and I spent many beautiful hours there. We had real curtains to cover our windows and used real miniature kerosene lamps. (Large kerosene lamps like those used in my grandfather's home.) In addition to our dolls, we played with doll beds, cradles, buggies, and tea sets. We spent many happy hours in this play house.

@ 21/2¢ per lb. — \$1.30.

and have Michel and Gregory. Their other child Thomas G. lives in Denton. He has no children.

Rhonda Miller, their children are Danna, Donell and Eric. They operate a large farm south of Denton; Ralph B. m. Patrica Morris, their children are Pamela, Julie and Ralph, Jr. (Bo). Ralph, Sr. is operator of Carroll's Corner Oil Co. and other businesses; E. Betty (1866-

1955) did not marry. The fourth child, Leach (1867-1941) m. 1886 Jane Bean (1852-1919). Their children are Alice, Della and Jeanie. In addition to larming they sold produce in Salisbury. # GEORGE and MACK KOONTS FAMILIES

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My great grandfather, George Koonts, Sr., 9 Jan. 1806, was the son of Michael Koonts nd his 1st wife. He m. 7 Apr. 1830 Mary Polly" Leonard and had 9 children, the 4th eing my grandfather, George Koonts, Jr., b. 2 Aug. 1945.

At the age of 19, Grandfather Koonts Beorge, Jr.) lought in Gen. Robert E. Lee's rmy in the Civil War. He was captured and eld prisoner on an island for a year. He was

scued 6 months after the war.

He m. 4 Dec. 1866 Elizabeth Lanning, and d 6 children, the third being my father, Mack r Koonts, b. 12 Dec. 1871. Mack m. Mary Bessie Sink and had 7 boys and 2 rls. I am the oldest girl.

Life was not easy as we know it today. The ople lived mainly off the land. Farming was ne with horses and mules. A reaping achine and cradle were used for grains. her lools used were scythes, axes, crosscut

saws, which was a long saw with 2 wooden handles for 2 people to push and pull back and forth.

Homes were heated and meals cooked by open fires, and later, wood heaters. Straw and hay were stacked on piles with a pole in the middle, known as hay stacks. Milk and butter were kept cool in a spring house, which was a covering over a spring, with a box, letting the cool water run around the milk crocks. They hunted wildlife for meat until cattle and hogs were domesticated. The mode of travel was walking, unless it was too far, then, horse and buggy. Wagons were also used. Later, came the Model-T Ford.

The people believed in education as is indicated by all the schools built. Some of the schools I remember my father naming, were the Michael or Livengood School, the Durham Schoolhouse, the Fords School — later known as the Berrier Schoolhouse - Beaver Dam and Shiloh Academy. About all the books used in the one room log schoolhouse were the Blue-Back Spelling Book, and Reading and Arithmetic. Later the people of Reeds formed a new district and the Beaver Dam School was moved to the north side of Indian Grave Branch. About 10 years later (1903) 2 districts, Happy Hill and Turpentine, combined and built a new school near the center of the district. It was a 1 room school, with another room added later. It was called Happy Hill School and is where I remember attending school.

#### PROTUS KOONTS FAMILY

The first Koonts to settle in this community was John Koonts. He came from Penn. and lived in Monkey Bottom West of W. Center St. Ext. He fought in the Revolutionary War and had an honorable discharge. John had a son Mike Koonts; Mike had a son George 1, who had a son George II. George II fought in the Civil War and received an honorable discharge, George II was b. 12 Aug. 1845, d. 22 Aug. 1931. He m. Elizabeth Koonts, and both are bur. in Beulah UCC Cem.

To this union 6 children were born: John, Ross, Mack, Bertie Koonts Sink, Virginia, and Bannie Koonts Koonts. George Koonts II lived in the Happy Hill community in a 2-story log house, the kitchen separate from the main house. They had a well and an ice house and a pond that froze over in the wintertime, and they would cut chunks of ice and put in the ice house for summer use.

Jacob Ross Koonts was b. 28 Feb. 1874, d. 12 Feb. 1928, m. 17 Mar. 1898 Celia Leonard, b. 4 Oct. 1878, d. 29 July 1969. Both are bur. at Shiloh United Meth. Church.

Ross Koonts was a hard-working farmer raising a variety of crops: tobacco, cotton, corn and sweet potatoes. His wife Celia, dau. of Casper (Cap) Leonard, was reared in the Happy Hill community. Casper was b. 16 Dec. 1839 and met with a tragic death 4 Jan. 1896 He was killed by runaway horses,



# AUGUSTIN WASHINGTON MINOR

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Augustin Washington Minor, b. 26 Nov. 18, in the vicinity of Reed's Meeting House, as the middle of the 15 children of Paschal inor and Mary "Polly" Helmstetler. He was 18 Aug. 1842, in Davidson Co. by Andrew vicegood, JP, to Elizabeth Trantham, dau. of seph Frantham and Sarah "Sallie" Michael. Less than a year later this young couple, ong with her parents and several other famis from Davidson Co., left Lexington on 18 oril 1843, arriving at Springfield, Mo. on 4

The trip west has been described as hard d dangerous at best. Three of Elizabeth antham Minor's young brothers and sisters ed be ur, at some point on the trail. The b-of Augustin and Elizabeth Minor. ary, was b. 10 June 1843, in the one-horse agon. Other members of the wagon train had intinued on their journey after the Minors had opped for the birth but waited for the young mily in III. and all crossed the Miss, into Mo.

On 4 July they arrived at Springfield, Mo., d after a brief stop came to Sand Springs in ebster Co., camping in a tent until a house

could be built. The house had a puncheon floor, no nails being used in its construction. The boards were held on the roof by weight poles. Door shutters were made of boards as long as the door was wide and fastened on frames with wooden pins, edges of boards lapped weatherboard fashion. Nearly all implements of industry were home-made and very clumsy and crude looking.

Pitchforks were only forked sticks, dirt shovels were broad boards cut at one end so as to make a handle while the other was left broad. Augustin made a "truck wagon" by cutting wheels from a large sycamore log. He did a great deal of hauling with this primitive vehicle. Almost every article of clothing was manufactured at home. Game was plentiful and the range unbounded.

A family history written by Franklin A. Minor, son of Augustin and Elizabeth Minor, states that his father was "a man of great nerve, possessing all the characteristics of a

pioneer."

Greene Co., Mo. was divided leaving the Minor family in that portion which became Webster. Augustin was justice of the peace for some years before the Civil War and was elected Co. Judge following that conflict. The Minors were members of Timber Ridge Bapt. Church, near Marshfield, Mo. from its founding and contributed land for Minor School which stood in Ozark Twp. for many years.

Augustin Minor and his sons Franklin, Wesley, and William were members of the Union Army during the War and one of the sons, William, was killed at the Battle of Pine Bluff, Ark. After the War, "Gustie" Minor came back to Webster Co. where he d. 10 July 1903, blind and full of years. Elizabeth, his wife, had preceeded him in death, on 20 Jan. 1900. Both are bur, at Timber Ridge Cem., near many of the other pioneers from Davidson Co. who

The Minors were the parents of 9 children: Mary, William H., John Wesley, Franklin Addison, Sarah L., Henry M., Emily C., Ellen C., and George Washington Lafayette Minor.

#### THE MINOR FAMILY

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Paschal Minor arrived in Rowan Co. from Va. c1807. Family records indicate that he was b. there, and the Davidson Co. census of 1840 indicates that he was b. between 1780 and 1790. Tradition is that he was indentured after the death of his parents, that he ran away from his master, and that he was later given a liberal education by a kind aunt. One extant letter written from Davidson Co. in 1844 to his son Augustin Minor in Pleasant Prairie, Mo. shows him to have been a polished writer of English, perhaps tending to confirm the tradition that he was a man of more than average education for the time.

Paschal m. Mary "Polly" Helmsteller, eldest dau, of Peter Helmstetler and Nancy Vannoy, by 1808. To this marriage were b. 15

children: William, Nelson, Elizabeth, Mary "Polly", Matilda, John, Zebulon, Augustin Washington, Rachel, an unnamed infant, Emily, America, Phoebe, Susan, and Paschal Jr.

The Minors lived near Reed's Meeting House, and all the children were b. there, Paschal Minor, Mrs. Polly Minor, Polly Minor Jr. (sic), Zebulin Minor, and Matilda Minor were among those who were converted and granted membership at Reed's Bapt. in 1834. Shortly thereafter Rachel Minor joined the church "by experience."

An interesting incident involving one of the Minors was recounted by Garland A. Hendricks In Saints and Sinners at Jersey Settlement. "Robert Durham accused Zebulin Minor of saying that Durham kept a disorderly house. The charge was investigated and discussed in church conference each month until in Mar. 1839 Mr. Minor admitted 'that he did speak words which, if true, would reflect disgrace on Brother Durham's house." The following month, after a committee of five had investigated further, Zebulin Minor was excluded from the fellowship of the church." Zebulon Minor was possibly the Z. Minor on the 1850 Randolph Co. census.

By 1850 Paschal Minor had d. and Mary Minor, age 63, b. In N. C., appeared on the Rowan Co. census. With her were her youngest children: Phoebe, 23; Susan, 19; Paschal, 18. By 1860 Mary "Polly" Minor was no longer on the census and was apparently

dead.

Elizabeth Minor m. Richmond Matteau of Fork Twp., Davie Co. He was half Cherokee and d. 1843/4 of pleurisy. They had 2 children: Franklin Matteau, who d. of scarlet fever about the same time as his father; and Susan Matteau m. Pleasant Heller who was killed in the Civil War. Following his death she m. a Mr. Waitman and had 4 sons. After Helfer's death, Susan lived with David Gobble, although they apparently never married, Susan, David Gobble, and her mother, Elizabeth went to Mo. after the war. They were in the same household on the 1870 Ozark Twp., Webster Co. census. Both Gobble and Elizabeth d. before 1890, the year in which Susan Matteau Helfer was murdered and her house burned with the corpse in it at Ozark Twp. The murder is still remembered there, and some elderly residents remember their parents blaming it on a son-inlaw who was disliked by Susan.

# PHILIP HOSEA LEE SNIDER FAMILY

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Known as Lee, Philip Hosea Lee Snider was in Davidson Co. 12 Feb. 1872, 5th child of ploman and Mary Ann Garner Snider, grew on his father's farm and attended a oneom school at Poplar College.

He m. 1 May 1898 Mary Ann Skeen, b. 26 ept. 1878 in Davidson Co. oldest child of psea McNeil and Elizabeth Metters Skeen of

Papa and Mama had 10 children and worked ird all their lives on their farm near Denton. hey were self-sufficient and had all kinds of winter and summer, since they had built a m to store the fruit. Vegetables ere ground, hogs raised, cows milked for milk d butter, and sheep were raised for the pol. The sheep were sheared once a year and e wool was sold. Papa never worked at pubwork but made money as a trader to buy the w essentials that could not be produced on e farm. I've heard mother say that Papa

could trade cows and make money but was no horse trader.

We put our milk and butter in the "spring run" to keep it cool as there were no refrigerators. Not having electricity, we used kerosene lamps, but Papa later installed a Delco lighting system, which was a marvel to us all.

We drew water from a well for the livestock but the water had so much limestone in it that we could not do the laundry. On washday we used rainwater that had been caught in wooden barrels or carried from a nearby spring. Soap would not lather in the limestone

When sheep were killed for food, the hide would be sent away to be tanned. This is what the young children lay on to take their naps in the summertime. Blackberries were picked, and vegetables were canned. Mama would also can the meat that was not cured in order to keep it through a season. They heated their home with 3 fireplaces. That meant a lot of wood had to be cut. The fireplaces were in the kitchen, sitting room, and the "parlor."

Growing up on the farm was a hard life but there were a lot of benefits and fun living the country life. One of my fondest memories is the "corn shuckings." Papa and the boys would harvest and pile the corn in the barnyard, while the girls helped Mama prepare food. Friends and neighbors would come on an appointed night and shuck corn until we finished the pile, then all the good food would be consumed. These "corn shuckings" would be repeated nightly until every one's corn was shucked.

In later years Mama would make ice cream in her refrigerator for the grandchildren when they came to visit her on Sundays. She had the prettiest white hair and I remember her telling me it started turning when she was 13.

Papa and Mama were staunch Primitive Bapt. Papa was active in the church and would never miss going to the Assoc. meetings

which usually met the 4th week in Aug. Papa would travel for miles, in the early years by horse and wagon, and camp out in the church yard where the meeting was being held.

Mama d. 16 Mar. 1944 and Papa d. 8 Oct. 1951. They are bur, in Tom's Creek Primitive

Bapt. Church Cem. near Denton.

The homeplace and land is presently owned by direct descendants.

Daddy was a self-educated man and was a great asset and inspritation in helping his children achieve their education. Daddy, his parents, his 4 bros. and 1 sister are bur. in Davidson Co. at Churchland, His sister Mary still survives.

Daddy was a farmer but in early marriage did sawmill work. This took him away from home, leaving mother to take care of the children and grow vegetables to peddle and help with home expenses. The money Daddy made was used to pay the mortgage on the farm.

In June, 1921 Daddy and Mother lost their home by fire. They lost everything in the house except a few items. A piano was saved when 2 neighbors carried it from the house. When they rebuilt, it took 6 men to carry the same piano into the new house. Mother had 30 beautiful quilts that burned. She had always the best for guests, but the fire taught

use the best for herself and her family. Sweet potatoes were grown on the farm and Daddy would grow as many as 3000 bu. a year. He would bed several hundred bushels to sell potato plants in the spring. The money from the plants was used to purchase tractors and other equipment for the farm, pay expenses, and help to supply furnishings for the home.

vegetables and animals were raised to feed the family. Vegetables, fruit, and meat were canned and dried for winter use. Quilts were made for our beds and most of the clothing for the family as very few clothing items were bought. Daddy even put new soles on the children's shoes.

Our delight, expecially in summer, was stopping the ice truck on Saturday evening for ice to make ice cream. We had a 2 gal. freezor and would sometimes make 2 freezors and none would be left. We played lots of games that Daddy taught us. Our parents often joined us in playing, thus enabling them to teach us to prepare ourselves for future years. Every summer Daddy would take us camping. One year we went to the Atlantic Ocean which was really a treat. Our lives revolved around church, school and farm, leaving me with many preclous memories of my childhood.

# SAMUEL LAFAYETTE CECIL

23

A veteran of the Civil War, my grandfather, Samuel Lafayette Cecil, was born to Richard ljames and Sevilla Evans Cecil 25 Aug. 1845. They lived in the Mt. Olivet Methodist church section of the county where, as a young teenager, he farmed with his father until he was about 17 and entered the Civil War. He was a Private in Company K, 21st Regiment of the N.C. Infantry.

During the war he was captured by the Union Army, as a prisoner, was abused by the Yankees while they were trying to get informan from him. When he was telling this to his illdren years later, he told them of being tied up by his thumbs and suspended there with all his weight being supported by them, with his toes just clearing the ground. My mother asked why he didn't tell them so they would let him down. He said, "Honey, I didn't know anything to tell them."

The camp where they were held prisoner was on a river; after the Yankees found that their prisoners really didn't know anything to tell, they said those who could swim the river could go free. The Yankees thought all the "Rebs" would be drowned, and that would be the end of that. What they didn't know was that those rugged men from the South had been swimming in the creeks and rivers since they were little boys, so all swam to their freedom. Somehow they managed to find their way back to their company, much to the relief and amazement of their commander and the other members of the company.

Sam was discharged from the Confederate Army in Va. when the war was over and walked back to Davidson Co. When he reached his father's home, he walked slowly past the house to see if anyone would recognize him. No one did, for he had changed so, and his clothes were different. He turned around and walked back down the road in front of the house. This time someone did recognize him and yelled to the others, then they all started running to meet him. However, he waved them back and told them not to come near him because he was covered with body lice. "Go put on a pot of water so my clothes can be boiled to kill the lice," he said, "and put on another one so I can have hot water to bathe, but don't touch me or my clothes until we are sure the last of the lice are dead." As soon as he was clean and had on clean clothes, there was rejoicing such as they had never seen

Sam resumed the duties of running the farm, but he also learned to make brick, run a sawmill, and build houses. He taught his younger brother, David King Cecil, all these things, and they became proficient at the art of making brick, carpentry, and bricklaying. So great was the need for houses and buildings that Sam married, left the farm, and moved to Lexington to become a contractor.

On 5 Jan. 1871 Sam married Cornelia Rosette Burke, dau. of John and Caroline Spach Burke of the Friedburg Moravian Church community. He built a 2-story house in Lexington, on what is now E. Center St., and the and his wife settled down to the task making a living and rearing their 9 childre John Richard, b. 18 Nov. 1871, d. 2 N 1958, married Mary Eliza (Molly) Yarbro; Hry Lafayette, b. 19 Feb. 1874, d. 22 Jt 1951, married Amanda Jones; Fannie Catl rine Elizabeth, b. 14 Aug. 1876, d. 3 Jan. 18 Eliza Clementine Rebecca, b. 25 Jan. 1878, 12 Apr. 1969, married Thomas Shell Ean

Ida Magdelene, b. 17 July 1880, marı Walter W. Poole; Minnie Lee, b. 24 Dec. 18 married Vander J. Yelvington; Samuel Grer, b. 3 Mar. 1885, d. 1902; Sally Victoria 19 Sept. 1887, d. 3 Aug. 1890; Susan Ellib. 2 Jan. 1890, married Ed Troy Miller.

Two kinds of brick were made: a s unfired brick baked by the sun and used for inner walls and a hard brick fired in a kiln used on the outside of the houses.

Not only was Samuel L. Cecil a big mastature, he was big of heart as well. A maintegrity!

Twelve Regulators were tried and condemmed for high treason in 1771. Among am six were suspended— among these last, the most distinguished Bemjamin Merrill who has been Caltish of Militis of Lowan (now Davidson Co. 4.C.)—— The name of Benjamin Merrill wife was Jamina Stout, Stoutsbridge, Monmouth Co. New Jersey—— Capt Benjamin Merrill was the Great Grand Sther of Zacharian Yarbrough, a son of Thomas Yarbrough. The wife of Thomas Yarbrough was Jamina Merrill, a granddaughter of Capt. Merrill.

Wrs . A. Irlah of Davon rt, Iowa, was a drughter of this Zachariah Yerbrough, who left Davidson Co. L.C. in 1846 for Iowa travellies in a covered wagon. She lived to be more than ninety years ald and gave much of this data.

An inscript on on the monoment in Guilford lattle Grounds reads:
"the first battle of the war of Alsmance in Orange Co. May 1771. Benjamin
Merrill, one of the regulators executed at Hillsboro, 18 June 1771.

#### RICHARD YARBOROUGH b. 1615 England - d. 1702 Virginia

Richard Yarborough, the earliest known Yarbrough immigrant, was born in England. While his place of birth has not yet been established by records, it is believed that he was from Lincolnshire.

"Richard Yarbrough, an Englishman™ is listed as one of the founders of Bristol Parish in 1642. It is believed that Richard came to Virginia sometime between 1635 - 1640.

Pamunkey Neck Claims show that between 1677 - 1679 Richard Yarborow leased a tract of land from the Pamunkey Indians. The exact quantity is not listed, but he sold over 3,450 acres to various people shortly thereafter and records prove that he still held several large tracts.

Tradition says that Richard had the following children: Richard, Jr., John, Thomas, William, Charles, Edward, Henry, James, Ann and Frances. Only two, Richard, Jr. and John have been conclusively proven by records.

During his life, records prove that Richard was a successful tobacco farmer, served his country as an interpreter for treaty negotiations with the Indians, and was an able seaman on Yarborough's Ferry located on the Mattapony River.

The exact date of Richard's death is unknown. His tombstone shows the year as 1702. A land patent granted to William Morris on April 1, 1702 describes the land as "bounded by said William Morris and Mr. Richard Yarbrough." This indicates Richard's death was after April 1, 1702.

# National Yarbrough Conference

Dear Ophelia:

Your letter just arrived and, since I have the Amelia County records spread out all over this room, I decided I'd answer right away. It will save me dragging out all these records at a later date.

I think Pat Streeter has a computer. I received an identical better to the one she sent Charlie except that it was addressed to me instead of him. I have answered her and sent what records I had that I thought would be of interest to her or that would help her. I think you are right that her John Y. is connected to the Wm & Parmalia Parker Y. line.

As for the charts prepared by Evelyn Goble and Gayle Ord ... I hardly know where to start. From John Y. & Betty Hudson forward, they are probably substantially correct. But, there are some serious errors on the pages for Richard Yarborough and Thomas Yarborough. I wrote to Evelyn about two years ago about this and I must have upset her as I never again heard from her.

This chart starts with Richard b. about 1659, so I assume that this is Richard, Jr., not the immigrant Richard.

The 1690 court record that is referenced is the deposition given by Richard Yarbrough in the trial of Captain Jacob Lumpkin. In his deposition, Richard gives his age as "38 years or thereabouts", which would make his birth ca 1652. We have the records that prove Richard, Jr. was a son of Richard the immigrant. We also have the records to prove that Richard Sr. was in this land 10 to 15 years prior to the birth of Richard, Jr. I have serious doubts that Richard Jr. was born in England. I believe he was born in Virginia.

Some 20-30 years ago, George Yarbrough of Alabama stated that there was a New Kent County, Virginia record wherein Richard swore that he was born in England and, according to George, this record named his children. I don't know where George came up with this as those court records were destroyed during the civil war. They do not exist and haven't in his lifetime. Greg and I have searched the records here and have not found this record. IF it does exist and we just haven't found it, I'd be willing to bet money that it was Richard, Sr. who was giving the record — not Richard, Jr.

As to Richard Jr.'s wife being Elizabeth Mason, daughter of Capt. John Mason, this could be correct -- I have nothing to prove or disprove it.

The children listed may be correct and I think Richard Jr. did have a son Thomas, but it is not the Thomas who married Hannah Jordan. Thomas and Hannah (Jordan) were involved in a long lawsuit against the heirs of Hannah's father's estate. It went on for years. One of the persons who gave a deposition in this lawsuit was Thomas Yarbrough, the father of the Thomas who married Hannah

Jordan. In the deposition, Thomas gave his age as 76 years (making his birth 1685 as the deposition was given in 1761). I am enclosing a typed copy of this deposition. I typed it from the original which is contained in the original loose papers of Amelia County, Virginia. Note in the deposition Thomas Sr. states "after marriage between this Deponent's son Thomas, and said Jordan's daughter Hannah.." The father of the Thomas who married Hannah Jordan is clearly Thomas Yarbrough, not Richard Y. Jr. as is shown on the chart.

I think what may possibly prove out one day is that the father of Thomas Y. Sr. was Richard Y. Jr. I am particularly interested in the Thomas Y. Sr. as he is my ggggg grandfather. Thomas Y. Sr. went to NC and was a resident of NC at the time he made the deposition in 1761. The court order for the deposition makes reference to the fact that he is about to depart the colony. I believe he was just on a visit to Virginia at the time of the deposition.

As to the chart for Thomas Y and Hannah Jordan. . .

If Thomas Jr.'s father was born in 1685 (as the deposition proves), then the Thomas who married Hannah could not have been born in 1691 ... his father was only 6 years old in 1691. Thomas also could not have married Hannah in 1719. Using just an average age, if Thomas Sr. were 25 years of age when his son Thomas was born, that would make his year of birth ca 1710 -- give or take a few years.

The John, Manoah and Zachariah Yarbrough shown on this chart to be the sons of Thomas and Hannah is incorrect. These three were the sons of Thomas Y. Sr. Thomas Jr. must have been one of the older children. In 1743 he is having a survey made for land; in 1744 he has a survey done and the land description says this land joins "Cabines, his own line and his father's line." If you look at the Amelia Co. land plat in the last issue of the newsletter, you will see Thomas Jr.'s land right next to Thomas Sr.'s land. In 1744, the tithe list shows Thomas Y Sr. with son John Y. in his household. Thomas Jr. is shown separately on this list. In 1747, Thomas Sr. shows John and Zachariah in his household on the tithe list. This was the first year that Zachariah appeared. As the while males were taxed from age 16, Zachariah must have reached 16 years of age between the 1746 and 1747 list ... making his birth ca 1631. I believe that Manoah must have been the youngest son as he doesn't appear on the list with his father until they were in NC. (1755). All the court records for these years clearly show a Thomas Sr. and Thomas Jr. (or Thomas the elder and Thomas the younger).

In 1753, Thomas Sr. began selling his land. He disappears out of the Virginia records shortly after that and Thomas Jr. begins appearing without the Jr. after his name. By 1755 Thomas Sr. is on the tax lists of Granville Co., NC, along with his son, Manoah (or "Manner").

Thomas Sr.'s son John must have gone to NC about the same time. On 28 March 1755 there is an indenture in Amelia County, Va between "John and Betty Yarbrough of North Carolina and James May of Amelia Co., Virginia" for John Y's land. This was the same land conveyed to John Yarbrough by Thomas Y. Sr.

This is the last Amelia County, Va record of John Y. I think the records conclusively prove that these three were definitely sons of Thomas Y. Sr., not Thomas Jr. and wife, Hannah.

Thomas Y. Jr. stayed in Virginia. His will was written 20 Oct 1768 and proven in Amelia County in March 1769. In his will he named his wife, Hannah, sons, Jordan & Archibald and daughters Hannah, Mary, Jane and Catherine. He left his son Jordan 400 acres of land "whereon James Yarbrough now lives" and he left his son Jordan 200 acres of land "whereon Thomas Y now lives." He also named a grandson Thomas Yarbrough. He did not give the relationship of the James and Thomas Y. If they were his sons, it seems strange that he took the land they were living on and gave it to the other sons. But, they may have been farming the land only until the younger sons were old enough to claim it.

So, his children were:
Jordan
Archibald
Hannah
Mary
Jane (referred to as Janey, too)
Catherine

and possibly

James Thomas.

On 8 Mar 1769 a William Johnson of Nottoway Parish wrote his will and it was proven on 23 March of that same year. He left everything to Archibald Yarbrough, Lewis Parham and Jordan Yarbrough. The witnesses to his will were John Baker, Hannah Yarbrough Sr. and Hannah Yarbrough. I have no idea who he was, but it would appear he was very close kin — possibly to Hannah.

On the 1769 tithe list is shown:

Jordan Yarbrough Archibald Yarbrough James Smith Yearbrough.

I wondered if James Smith Yearbrough was the James Yarbrough mentioned in Thomas Y. Jr.'s will. If it is, then we know that James Smith Y. was the son of William and Dianer (Smith) Y. It would imply a fairly close relationship of William Y. to this family. James Smith Y. was born 2 Sep 1745 which would make him 24 years old in 1769. But, his father William was in Prince Edward County. what was James Smith Y doing in Amelia County? James S. Y. was granted land in Nachez, Mississippi in 1777 and ended up in Louisiana. William Y. died in 1771. This is an interesting family. William died in 1771, but his final estate accounting did not take place until 1794. Maybe that is when his wife died. There is an interesting affidavit with the estate papers of Richard Yarbrough, who was a son of William and Diana and the brother of James Smith Y. The affidavit says that Richard had sold the estate without an appraisal because his brother who had had the estate in his possession had wasted much of it

and Richard was afraid that if he delayed the sale for an appraisal that the brother would have wasted even more of it. He also said that the negros from the estate had fled to him (Richard) in Petersburg to prevent James S. Yarbrough "carrying them to the Mississippa, the place that he was then destined for". Richard went on to say that he had delayed returning the estate proceedings because he had settled with all the parties interested under his father's will except a younger brother who also went out of the county but who had lately returned. The younger brother's name wasn't mentioned, but I think it was probably Joseph who had married Temperance Walton and settled in Lunenburg County, Virginia.

Well, I certainly got sidetracked from the chart of Thomas Y., didn't I.

The chart shows that Hannah was the second wife of Thomas Jr. I don't believe he was married before Hannah. I think someone just decided that he was in order to make these extra children (who were actually Thomas Sr.'s) fit this chart.

I believe that Alexander was also Thomas Sr.'s son. However, I can't prove this.

As for John Y who married Elizabeth Hudson, I have nothing on this line except for an identical chart that Evelyn Goble sent me. The source on this chart gives the Will of Thomas Yarbrough Sr. The will referred to is actually that of Thomas Y. Jr. (wife Hannah Jordan). If Thomas Y. Sr. had a will anywhere, I'd dearly love to find it! The 1768 will of Thomas Jr. does not mention a son John. It would be interesting to find a will for John.

John was in Bute Co., NC for a period. In 1767 He bought land from Manoah Yarbrough. In 1776 John and Elizabeth Y sold this land to Thomas Nelms of Virginia. The deed was proven on 11 Feb 1777. On 11 Aug 1774 in Bute County John's son Littleton, brother Zachariah and John's daughter Judith Y each made oath to John Y's accounting at the suit of William Henry. So, he at least had a son Littleton and a daughter Judith.

I don't know where John and Betty went from here. There is a will of Elizabeth Yarborough in Cumberland County, NC, dated 18 Oct 1802 and probated February 1804 that names Catharine Utley, wife of Allen Utley, "my children" Littleton Yarborough, Judith Taylor, Elizabeth Howard, Frances Youngblood, Nimrod Yarborough and Moses Gilmag..."

This would seem to be John's wife. He was apparently dead before her. But, where did he die? This indicates that their children were:

Catharine m. Allen Utley

Littleton

Judith m. Taylor Elizabeth m. Howard

Nimrod

Moses G.

This is the only Cumberland Co., NC record that I have except for some census records and a few marriages (starting with 1815). Do you have any?

I find John Yarbrough on the 1755 Tax list of Granville County, NC, immediately following "Thomas Yarbrough and son Maner".

I find him on the 1771 Tax list of Bute Co., NC - shows 2 adult males which could be John and a son or John and a slave - list doesn't show.

By the 1790 census, there are several John Y's shown:

John Y. Caswell Co. name taken from tax list - census destroyed

John Y. Halifax Co. 6/1/2

This would not appear to be the same as the Bute Co., John as there are 6 sons here and 1 daughter, assuming his wife is one of the 2 females listed.

John Y. Montgomery Co. 2/2/4
This John had 3 sons and 2 daughters. This is the John Y
who married Joanna Chambers. They had children: Henry H.
(Rev. War Soldier); William, Joel, Mary, Frances, Elizabeth,
John, Larkin, Wilson and Sally.

John Y. may have been dead by the 1790 census. The 1800 NC census index shows a John Jr. and John Sr. in Halifax Co and a John Y in Montgomery Co. The Caswell Co. NC Y's seem to be the William & Diana (Smith) Y. descendants.

Apparently John Y died between 1776 and 1802 ... I wonder where. Possibly in Cumberland Co. The only Y in Cumberland Co. in 1790 is Joseph Y. according to the Census.

I note that the chart prepared by Evelyn Goble shows that John died after 1789 in Warren Co. NC and Elizabeth died after 1789 in Warren NC. I have no idea where she got that information. I went to Warren County and searched the records there (the Bute Co. records are housed here) and John is not listed after that 1776 sale. He must have left that area when he sold his land. If the Elizabeth who died in Cumberland Co. is indeed the widow of John (and I believe she is), then she did not die in Warren Co., either. Further, I have nothing in my files and records that indicate that John and George were the sons of this John Y.

Looking back at the Halifax County John Y ... I guess that it is possible that this could be the same John Y. Perhaps the daughters were already married by then and Elizabeth didn't mention the older sons in her will if they were in another county. Someone needs to do some work on this line. There are so many John Y's ... I cringe everytime someone writes me about an ancestor John.

I guess the answer to your question about whether I think these records could be correct is a big no ... From George and Elizabeth Norwood Y forward, they seem to be accurate with the records I have. Behind that I see lots of questions and mistakes. I've found a lot of mistakes in the Morman records. One of the biggest ones is that they have my grandmother married to her brotherin-law. I wrote them to correct this once and they told me that it had already been microfilmed and couldn't be changed. Poor grandma. I wonder if she is happy being incorrectly microfilmed?

I just finished proofing and correcting Marion's printout. I am sure that he must cringe when he sees my return address on an envelope. He took so much of his starting information from Nelle Jenkins and Mrs. Dickey ... and they had so many errors in the information they printed. I am hoping that Marion and I can make a big dent in getting some of this "mis-information" finally put to rest.

I just got a letter from one of our Canadian cousins and he sent me some more photographs of our English cousins. Actually, they are photographs of paintings done in the 1700's. He has them nicely identified and I am going to see if I can get them to copy well enough that Charlie can put them in the newsletter. We have really been getting some splendid information from England and Canada ... what a find these cousins have been.

I am sure that you are tired of reading this ... and probably have better things to do with the rest of the winter than try to get through one of my "books." So, I'll close for this time by thanking you again for all you share -- with me and all the researchers.

#### HISTORY OF CARDWELL BAPTIST CHURCH

The first Missionary Baptist Church of Cardwell was organized on September 26, 1899, by Rev. J.A. Yarbrough. Seven members constituted the organization. They were: C.M. Ashley, J.J. Glenny and wife, Susie Hodge, Emily Suthers, M.L. Thomas, and E.A. Harris. Rev. Yarbrough was the first pastor. Rev. A.B. Church, the first permanent pastor of the church, and J.J. Glenny was the first church clerk. They met three Sundays of each month. For four years they met for worship at private homes and in an old shed located in the southeast part of town. From 1903 to 1905, they worshipped in the Methodist Church building. In 1905, they built their first house of worship and it was located where the present Cardwell Church of Christ now stands. In 1909 while McCanus was pastor of the church. another Baptist Church was started. This church was located in the northern part of town where Eulas Vaughn home is now located, Mr. E.C. Frie, Mr. J.J. Glenney, W.H. Lockard, and R. Williams, trustees of the First Baptist Church of Cardwell bought the lot from Mr. Glenney for \$325.00 on December 24. 1910. The storm blew the building down in 1914. Many of the members of the other Baptist Church were going to this church at the time it was discontinued. The Baptist met in the old First National Bank Building for years, and in 1952, their present church on Long Street was built. Bonds were sold to help finance the building.

The following pastors have served the church since organization: J.A. Yarbrough, S.B. Church, C.A. Merideth, R.D. McKinsley, C.F. Carpenter, E.P. Minton, W.G. Matthews, F.R. Allen, J.W. Seev, G.A. Crocker, Deammon, T.E. Williams, L.W. Lemmonds, N.E. McCoy, Pulliam, J.L. Newson, Rev. Vaughn, G.D. Faulkner, Ernest Blackford, Dr. W. Belton, E.T. Coon, O.C. Wilcoxson, Hovey Williams, George Graham, M.N. Monday, E. Robertson, A.G. Whitworth, Waif Hamilton, Seibert Halley, Jack Wasdrop, Jimmy D. Harness, Louis C. Manner, and in 1972, Rev. Lawrence Ray is pastor. Rev. Ray has been an inspiration to all the citizens of Buffalo Township. He is an old native of Cardwell. His father worked in the sawmills in Cardwell in 1911 and 1912.

The present church has an enrollment of 280 members and some of the active members of the church are Mr. and Mrs. Gus Hart, Mrs. George Sissom, Mr. and Mrs. Randal Sissom family, Mabrey family. Brewer family, Jessy Archer, Killion family, Huggins family, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Burgess family, the


Washingtons, J.B. Hoesman family, Jane Grady family, Luna Halmark, Marvin Wells family, and other faithful members.

Mrs. Chester Mack Washington is the organist and Mrs.

Vernon Hartsoe is pianist.

The church holds services on Sunday morning and night and is a church warm with love. "The Project Day" is the day to see this love and devotion illustrated. All the farmers, businessmen, and families of the church bring in the savings of their prospective money-making projects, and present the money to the church. This money is used to improve the church and parsonage.

Mrs. Lottie Malone of Senath organized the first "ladies aid society" of the Baptist Church (Page 172, Vol I., History of Dunklin County Historical Society). The Cardwell ladies that were active in the first organization of the Baptist Missionary Society in 1926 were: president, Mrs. John Warren; Mrs. Gist, Mrs. Seaborn, Mrs. Frie, Mrs. Estes, and others. Miss Grace Johnson served twelve years as association president.

# THE YARBROUGH FAMILY

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#### YARBROUGH FAMILY

## Early History of Yarbrough's

(I do not know the origin of much of this early history)

The name Yarbrough has been spelled many ways throughout the centuries. It may be spelled Yarberry, Yarbro, Yarbrough, Yarbrough, Yarbrough as well as Yarbrough. According to the chart prepared by the College of Arms, London, England, the original way of spelling the name was Yarburgh, Co. Loncoln. Later on some of the same English family spelled the name Yarbry and Yarbrough.

When William the Conqueror landed in England and conquered that country, the Yarburgh or Yarbough family helped him to organize its new government. The family is Danish in origin and can trace itself unbroken from 853 A.D. in Lincolnshire.

Eustacius Yarbrough of the Norman period was the ninth or tenth generation from the founding of the house of Yarbrough in 853 A.D. by Germund Yarbrough, a fact certified by the College of Arms, London, England.

Mr. G.W. Yarbrough (Senator of Alabama) informs us that genealogists who worked thirty years tracing the line of migration state that the following facts are indisputable:

1. Virginia, in the Big Reedy Creek area, started the family in America.

 From Virginia (Glocester, Prince George, Accomac, King William, King and Queen Counties), after spreading to Amelia, Dinwiddie and Cumberland Counties, migrations began to North Carolina after 1740 and before 1775.

 Migrants were the sons of three Virginia families, Viz: John, Thomas and William. The Virginia families were linked in marriage to the Mason, Jeffry, Littleton, Henry and Middleton families.

4. The migration kept up intermittently to 1804 or 1805.

From North Carolina three distinct lines went elsewhere, viz: a. the Tennessee line, b.
the Alabama line, and c. the South Carolina line (The Kentucky line appeared from the
Virginia and North Carolina lines about the same time-1800 to 1808).

 The South Carolina line came directly from Virginia, augmented by kinsmen from North Carolina, using the Catawba and Yadkin Rivers as bases from which they expanded from 1780 to 1800, and settled in Union, Fairfield and Chester Counties, primarily.

7. The English cousins surely had contact with the Yarbrough's of America for Ambrose Yarbrough left England in 1732 (about 90 years after the first immigrant, Richard Yarbrough came to America) and came directly to members of the family in Amelia county, Virginia, and married his distant cousin. This line came on down to South Carolina, into Georgia and into other states. Another line that came into Alabama in the early 1800's was the Limestone and Madison County families (descendants of Henry Murray Yarbrough Sr. of Franklin Co., NC (Henry M. III in Limestone Co., and Samuel, the son of James Sr. in Madison Co.).

Mr. Wagner, Herald of the College of Arms, London, England, verified in 1956, the fact that Richard Yarbrough married Frances Proctor in London in 1635, and made application for emigration in 1643.

Lord Alvingham of the original family line in Lincolnshire, and Lord Derremore of the Yorkshire branch, had the family chart, dating back to 1066, prepared by the College of Arms for the seating of the nobility in the Coronation of the late King George, the father of the present Queen Elizabeth. This family rated number 11 in order of age in the seating. The king allowed no family to antedate his own in age. As the King's family in England began with William the Conqueror, the Yarbrough's had to start at that date on their chart, even though their history went back more than two centuries prior to that time. Lord Derrimore was titular head of the family as Lord Alvingham died.

## Yarbrough's in America: Family tree

#### **GENERATION 1**

#### Gen. 1: Richard Yarbrough.

Richard Yarbrough was b. ca 1615, and probably married in London, England ca. 1635. There is evidence that he married one or more times after establishing himself in the new country. He was not an older son and had to make a living for himself. The first permanent settlement in America was in 1607; it was only a generation or about 35 or 36 years later that Richard came to America (1643) with his family. He had one of the second groups of land grants in Virginia. The first had come in 1634 when Henrico was founded. It is said that some land in the new world was won from the king by a certain Yarbrough in a card game. Perhaps it was Richard, and that may have been the reason that he came to the colonies. Richard Yarbrough, the first immigrant, was first mentioned in court records across the Chesapeake Bay in what is called Eastern Shore, near what is now called Cape Charles in 1656, in King and Queen County.

Richard deeded land in 1674, 1683 and 1702. He was in the fur trading business. Two sons were Richard Jr. and John, and others may have existed. In Amelia County, VA west and a little south of Richmond are deeds from William, John, Richard, Jr. and Thomas. It was here that Richard, Sr., gave his age as 87 in 1702. In Dinwiffle County, VA, the sons of John and Thomas were there in 1719, 1722 and 1729. It was in this county near Petersburg at old Bandford Church Yard that Richard is buried. His was the first burial in the cemetery and the church was built 33 years later. His grave is just to the left of the front door of the church. The church is Anglican. William and Mary Quarterly Vol. 5, page 233, April 1897, gives the following: "Old Blandford Church Yard near Petersburg, VA- Collected by C. G. Chamberlayne 1896; Richard Yarbrough 1702, age 87". He showed that the inscription, at that time was growing dim with age after 194 years. After John's marriage to Abigail in 1695, he was living in Charles City (Prince George), VA with Richard Jr. and his new wife, Sarah, among her family and friends. He was buried in the Poythress family property. These were neighbors at the time of his death. Children: Richard, John, Edward. Edward m. Frances August Calhoun.

#### Gen. 2. RICHARD.

I. Richard Yarbrough, Jr., I appear to have two different accounts of his birth. One is in Yarbrough Family Quarterly, Vol. No. 2, Page 17. This states he was born in 1653 in the Henrico-Charles City, VA area as his father moved from the area for the Mattapony River. Second, in another report in the Yarbrough Family Quarterly, the following is given for his birth: "Richard Jr., stated in court that he was born in Lincolnshire, England: He swore in court, New Kent County, VA, that he was 38 or thereabouts, and Elizabeth, his wife, was 34. One could not say for certain whether the date was 1680 or 1690. As he had said prior to that time he was born in England and we knew that Richard and family came to America in 1643, we will accept the date of his birth as 1642 and it was 1680 that he made the statement in court". When young, he apparently worked as a Ranger, with duties with the Indians. He appeared to be in this capacity in 1683, working with William Byrd. There is evidence that Richard Jr. married Elizabeth Mason. We know he married Elizabeth in 1680 and she died in 1694/5. In 1704 his wife was Sara, who died in 1719. He may have married a third time then. In 1702 Richard Jr. moved to 'new ground" on tobacco land, along the Mattapony River. In 1704, Richard Jr. and Sara sold the old place to Joseph Cotton. According to the Virginia Magazine of History and Biography on 8 Nov. 1704 Richard Yarbrough sold 80 acres of land to Robert Abbot, Sara Yarbrough, his wife, relinquished her dower right. In 1710 to 1715 the Yarbrough's were in King William Co., VA. The older sons of Richard Jr. were coming of age and needed their own plantations. On 1725, John Yarbrough was granted 400 acres of Reedy Swamp land. In 1724, William and Richard III also got 400 acres in King William Co. In 1722 Henry Yarbrough was in King William County, VA. He sold land to 16 December of that year, which he and John Hutton had patented. William's wife was Elinor, also they sold land to Martin Chandler on 22-February 1722. A list of Surveys shows that William and Richard Yarbrough, each patented 400 acres of land. Another son was Thomas whose mother was Elizabeth Mason. The son Richard III was in Brunswick Co., VA on the tax roll in 1748, near Michael Cadet Young. Richard Yarbrough, Jr. had three sons: William, Richard III, and Thomas (see Gen. 3, p. 5).

- I. Henry Yarbrough, Sr., b. abt. 1720 in VA, d. 1796 in Franklin Co., NC, m. abt. 1740 in VA to Martha Robinson, b. abt. 1725 in VA. They were living in Amelia Co., VA in 1739, and first bought land in Franklin Co., NC in 1766. They moved there with their children and Henry's father, Thomas Yarbrough. Henry and Martha first paid about 130 Pds for 370 acres in Granville Co., NC in 1760. They were residents of VA at the time. He sold this land in VA in 1762, and this was next to land of William Duke. The involvement of Martha Yarbrough in the initial purchase of land in NC makes this reviewer believe she brought a significant inheritance to the marriage. Ten children:

- 2. Nancy "Ann" Yarbrough, b. before 1750, m. John Parrish who d. before 1812, lived in Orange Co., NC.

However, in one of the Census records, he named two women living with him. One was younger and the other his age. Were they family members? Note when Elizabeth Yarbrough m. Alfred Davis in Franklin Co., NC in 1825, Charles was listed as the father in one report, but this was corrected to name his brother, James Yarbrough.

4. Nathaniel Yarbrough (see Gen. 5, p. 6)

5. Clement Yarbrough, b. before 1760, came home from Rev. War emaciated and d. soon afterward, this was told by Martha Curtis' granddaughter (from World Family Tree, Margaret Smith).

6. Thomas Yarbrough (see Gen. 5, p. 7)

7. Edward Yarbrough, d. abt. 1813 in Bute Co., NC (he was living when his brother Charles estate proceeding began in 1812 but not by the end of 1813). He left no heirs except his brothers and sisters.

- 9. Martha Yarbrough, d. 1817, unmarried, heirs were nieces and nephews.

4. Nathaniel Yarbrough, b. 1755 in VA, moved to Franklin Co., NC and lived there, moved back to VA with family abt. 1-16-1803 and d. 5-21-1803 in Petersburg, Dinwiddie Co. VA. The information on this family was provided primarily by Agnes Branch Pearlman. Nathaniel m. abt. 1790 in Franklin Co., NC to Mildred "Millie" Fuller, b. 2-22-1768, d. 7-18-1853 in NC, parents were Jones Fuller, d. 5-1-1812 and Ann Fuller. She is buried in the Oakwood Cemetery, Franklin Co., NC. While on a business trip, Nathaniel Yarbrough turned over his real estate interest to his brother Charles to settle some of his debts. However, this led to a suit in Franklin Co., NC by his family and aunt, Martha Yarbrough, who sued Charles Yarbrough's estate in a suit that continued until 1834 and included all of the Henry Murray Yarbrough Sr. descendants. Mildred m. 2<sup>nd</sup> Anthony Winston on 10-11-1825 in Franklin Co., NC. Six children, all by Nathaniel Yarbrough (from a court document and his Will).

- A. Elizabeth "Betsy" Allen Yarbrough, b. 12-1-1793, m. Simon E. Clement, b. 5-12-1792, in Granville Co., NC in 1811. They were in Red River Co., TX in 1850, and he was listed as a farmer.
- **B. Sally R. Yarbrough**, b. before 1797, m. Simon G. Jeffreys Jr. on 12-10-1811 in Franklin Co., NC. His parents were Mary and Captain William Jeffreys and grandfather, Osborn Jeffreys, all wealthy planters of Franklin Co., NC. He initiated the law suit against the estate of Charles Yarbrough that tied up the settling of that estate until 1834.
- C. Richard Fenner Yarbrough, name change to Yarborough (See Gen. 6, p. 10).
- D. Martha "Patsy" Yarbrough, b. abt. 1799, m. Mr. Curtis.
- E. Mary Ann "Polly" Yarbrough (See Gen. 6, p. 10)
- **F.** Clement Yarbrough?, I have seen where one son was Clement and d. abt. 1813. Five children made the 1800 Census, so they were born between 1790 and 1800. Two of these were listed as males under 10. One of these was Richard Fenner Yarbrough and the other could have been Clement Yarbrough?

**D. David Yarbrough**, d. 9-23-1841 in Marion, Perry Co., AL, moved from Franklin Co., NC to Orange Co., NC, m. Helen M. (Nelly) Dogherty (I have seen it spelled with and without the G.) there on 9-20-1805. Her father was George Doherty of Orange Co., NC. Her sisters were Frances W. Bond (by 1823 it had become Francis W. Porter) and Mary Doherty. Her father left them land in Giles Co., TN. They sold 134 acres of this on 2-26-1839. They were to be paid in corn fed pork in Marion, Perry Co., AL. Three children:

Mary Ann Briggs Malone, b. 8-11-1801 in Sussex Co., VA, and came to AL with her parents in the spring of 1818, d. 10-19-1870 in Limestone Co., AL. She and Henry Yarbrough lived in the Petty community in the rural southwestern part of the county. The location of her grave is unknown. Henry left 4,709 acres in his Will. Seven children:

F. Thomas Yarbrough, b. little before 1770 in Franklin Co., NC, d. 6-13-1837 in Fayette Co., TN from a spider bite, m. 8-25-1812 in Wake Co., NC to Mary Green Davis. Her parents were Winifred Duke and Jonathan Davis of Wake Co., NC (formerly of Warren Co., NC), d. 1818. Thomas Yarbrough was a grocer and close to his uncle James Yarbrough and his children. They grew up near each other and Thomas and James may have been about the same age. He was one of the executors of James Yarbrough's Will in 1814, the Executor of James' son Henry Yarbrough's estate after Henry's early death in 1824, and adopted James' two youngest children, Nathaniel and Elizabeth. When Henry Yarbrough d., the notice for the estate sales was placed at Thomas Yarbrough's store as well as the courthouse. Note that Thomas Yarbrough and his cousin Henry Yarbrough m. Davis' sisters as Henry m. Mary Green Davis' youngest sister,

Winifred Davis. Also note that Mary Green Yarbrough's brothers, David and Green Davis helped inventory Henry Yarbrough's estate. Thomas Yarbrough appears to be missing from the 1830 Census rolls. No wife is listed for Thomas Yarbrough in any of his children's dealings after he died. This leads me to believe that Mary Green Yarbrough died before her husband, perhaps in the early 1820's when they had no more children. I have also wondered if this Thomas Yarbrough was the one who m. a Kimball girl in 1825 in the area. Thomas Yarbrough moved to Fayette Co., TN as an older man. Although Thomas d. in Fayette Co., TN, I did not find any information on him in the County before his death. The records I found after his death concerned his four children. The two oldest children were also listed in the Will of Jonathan Davis, their maternal grandfather. These two children were in Fayette Co., TN as were James H. and Henry Wiley, the youngest two children. Four children:

A. Henry Yarbrough, b. abt. 1896 in Franklin Co, NC, d. bet. 6-6-1824 and 9-12-1824 in Franklin Co, NC. The records of the Nathaniel Yarbrough lawsuit show Henry Y. living in the County in June 1824, so he died sometime bet, then and the first record of his estate in early Sept. of that year. He lived on 207 acres next to Archibald Yarbrough on 12-30-1823. He m. Winifred "Winny" Davis, b. abt. 1896 in NC on 2-8-1817 in Wake Co., NC. Her parents were Jonathan Davis and Winnifred Duke of Warren Co., Franklin Co. and then Wake Co. NC. I believe the Franklin Co. address was on the County line with Wake Co. and the same address. Winifred is mentioned occasionally in the proceedings of Henry's estate. She m. 2<sup>nd</sup> Mr. Winston, and may have stayed in Franklin Co., until the late 1830's. Henry Ann Yarbrough showed up there at two estate sales in 1837. Seth Yarbrough witnessed for Richard Yarbrough a land purchase on 4-10-1839. However, family lore states that they moved from NC to northern AL and then briefly to southwestern TN. Furthermore, court records in Franklin Co, NC in 1834 state that all of James Yarbrough's descendants except Elam Yarbrough were out of state. Nothing else is known of Winifred Yarbrough until abt. 1841 when she arrived in Marshall Co, MS as Winifred D. Winston, and with the children. She appears to have been single at that time. She may have m. a Winston and he d. in the early 1840's. I believe she and her children lived with or near her brother, Wiley Jones Davis, and his son, Ebin Nelms Davis of the Stawberry Plains Plantation. Charles Yarbrough, her former brother-in-law, also lived in Marshall Co., south of Red Banks. In the 1850 census, she lived with her former son-in-law and his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife in the southwestern part of Marshall Co., MS. She later lived with her son, Seth Green Yarbrough in Memphis, Shelby Co., TN in 1860 Census, but was not found in records after that. She likely d. while living with his family in Shelby Co., TN or in eastern AR in the 1860's, but no record of her death has been found. Three children are known to her through court records in Franklin Co., NC and Marshall Co., MS. Three children:

- a. Seth Green Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 22).
- b. James O'Keefe Yarbrough, b. 1821 in Franklin Co., NC, d. suddenly on 4-5-1843 in Benton Co., MS while visiting the camp of Sandy Young. He lived in Marshall Co, MS, joining Benton Co., at the time of his death. James O. K. Yarbrough was listed after Seth as the sons of James

Yarbrough in the Franklin Co, NC suit of Nathaniel Yarbrough's heirs against heirs of his brother, Charles Yarbrough. Family lore states that Winifred and children arrived in Marshall Co, MS soon after 1840, and we known that they were residents of the County in 1845. James O'Keefe Yarbrough fits well as the second son of Henry Yarbrough. He was listed several times in the family lawsuit in Franklin Co, NC. The last time he was listed was when the suit was finally settled on the last day of Spring Court in 1834.

- **B. Nancy P. Yarbrough**, b. abt. 1796 in NC, m. John P. Weathers, b. abt. 1796 in NC (Her aunt Martha Yarbrough appears to have left her a slave in her Will in 1817). They were living in Granville Co, NC in the 1820 Census. They had a son and daughter under 10 at that time. I can not locate them in the 1830 census records. They were known to be living outside of NC in 1833, apparently in TN. They were in Carroll Co, TN in the 1840 and 1850 Census records. In 1840 boys in the household were, one under 5, one 5-10 and one 20-30. Girls were one 5-10, three 10-15 and one 15-20. I believe they had 2-3 boys and 5-6 girls. A lady with them was 60 70 (Was this his mother-in-law, Temperance Elam Yarbrough?). Nancy Weathers also had two brothers to move to that county in the 1820's and one in 1830's. James E. Weathers may be the father of John P. Weathers, as James made him a deed in Granville Co., NC on 1-1-1819. He had also made a deed to William Weathers, possibly another son. Children:

- b. Sophrona M. Weathers, b. abt. 1833 in TN, listed as 5-10 years of age in 1840 Census, m. Wilborn H. Graves on 7-18-1854 in Carroll Co., TN.
- c. Gustavus A. Weathers, b. abt. 1834 in TN, listed as 5-10 in 1840 Census. He was an unmarried lawyer in Corinth, Tishomingo Co, MS in the 1860 census.
- d. Robert T. Weathers (see Gen. 7, p. 22).
- e. Cordilia T. Weathers, b. abt. 1840 in TN, not listed in 1840 census.
- f. Erastus C. Weathers, b. abt. 1845 in TN (grandson?).
- g. Hariet M. Weathers, b. abt. 1847 in TN (granddaughter?).
- h. John P. Weathers, b. abt. 1848 in TN (grandson?).
- i. Robert A. Weathers, b. abt. 1844 in TN (grandson?).

C. Elam B. Yarbrough, b. 1798 in Franklin Co., NC, d. early 1867 in Fayette Co, TN, m. Jane A. Barham (b. 1800 in VA) on 8-20-1819 in Franklin Co, NC. She d. between the 1860 census and Elam's death. John O. Ligon was the best man at their wedding. Elam sold his share of the estate to his brother, Henry in 1823, and moved to Henderson Co, TN after 1835. Charles, Nathaniel and Nancy had gone there in the 1820's. He was in Carroll Co, TN in the 1850 Census. I assume he left Fayette Co. before 1850 for Carroll Co. and then came back in the 1850's. He was a member of the Mt. Pleasant Cumberland Presbyterian Church in the town of Macon in Fayette Co, TN from 1847 to 1856. I believe this church folded and he transferred to

another. The Episcopal Church took over the grounds a few years later. He was living in Fayette Co, TN as a grocer and his son Wilson was farming in 1860. His heirs, submitted his Will to probate Court in early 1867. Elam's afflicted son, Charles E. Yarbrough, was named to receive everything in the estate for his care, except the oldest son, Henry James Yarbrough was to get a grey horse or money in lieu of that horse. After Elam died, the siblings challenged the Will, and the Court ruled in favor of the children. Charles E. Yarbrough was placed in a home outside of the family. Nine children, I believe. I think that I am missing one of the oldest girls in the family. When I look at the early census records, there appears to be a son and two daughters not in the 1850 census. We know the son was James Henry and one daughter appears to be Temperance Elam Yarbrough.

## Will of Elam B. Yarbrough:

In Fayette Co, TN, in Probate Court in February, 1867. Know all men by these present that I, Elam B. Yarbrough, of Fayette Co, TN, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Sept. eighteen hundred and fifty nine A. D., being in his right mind in the name of Almighty God, do make this my last will and testament. Amen. I will that all my estate be given to my wife, Francis Yarbrough at my death, to be hers during her natural life time, and that she shall support out of said estate, my afflicted son, Charles E. Yarbrough, and at her death, if said Charles E. Yarbrough survives her, the estate to accrue to him because of his affliction, if not then the estate be equally divided between my children with the following exception, Item 2<sup>nd</sup>, my son, James H. Yarbrough, in addition to his being an equal claimant with my other children of my estate, shall have by my will, one grey horse or the valuation of one in money.

- a. James H. Yarbrough, eldest son. He may have been the groom who m. in Carroll Co, TN in 1860. A James Henry Yarbrough was in Tippah Co, MS in 1856 Court Document and m. to Elizabeth T. Neal. James H. Yarbrough was living when his father's will was prepared, as he was listed in the Will.
- **b.** Temperance Yarbrough, m. David Kizer on 2-9-1848 in Carroll Co, TN. She has her grandmother Yarbrough's name. They were not found in the 1860 Census.
- c. Mary A. Yarbrough, b. 1826 in Franklin Co, NC, m. Nathan Baxter, b. abt. 1822 in NC, on 8-31-1850 in Carroll Co, but not in 1860 census. She was shown living at home in the County in the 1850 Census. Her husband was a tailor in 1850.
- d. Unknown daughter?
- e. Nathaniel Yarbrough, b. 1830 in Franklin Co, NC in 1850 Census. He was farming at the time.
- f. Charles E. Yarbrough, b. 1832 in Franklin Co, NC, d. 1869-1870. His estate was settled in 1870 in Fayette Co, TN. He was afflicted and remained at home until his father died. Everything in his father's estate except a horse was left to take care of him, but his brothers and sisters challenged the Will in court in 1867 and had him declared insane. They received the estate.
- g. H. D. Yarbrough (?), b. 1835, 25 year old female in the 1860 Census. Three years younger than Charles.
- h. Wilson Carr Yarbrough, (see Gen. 7, p. 22).
- i. Elam F. Yarbrough, b. 1840 in Henderson Co, TN from 1850 Census. In 1860 Census, living in Madison Co, AL with William Yarbrough, son of his uncle, Samuel Yarbrough. He has not been located in a record since then.

**D. Samuel B. Yarbrough** (much of this line is from Ann Bush), b. 12-27-1799 in Franklin Co, NC, d. 11-25-1877 in AL. He moved by 1823 to Madison Co, AL, where he married Elizabeth M. Robinson on Oct. 2, 1823, Madison Co, AL Marriage Book 3, ph 247. She was b. 11-13-1805, d. 10-25-1879. Her father was James O. L. Robinson of Madison Co, AL, who d. 9-11-1837 in AL. Samuel Yarbrough and John Robinson applied for letters of Administration on his estate. He named as heirs under the age of 21: William H. Robinson and Mary B. Robinson. Madison Co, AL Will Book, 7 page 105. In 1843 John Robinson d. interstate. The Yarbrough's post office in 1870 was listed as New Castle. Their daughter, Eliza Jane's children, appear to be the ones with them in the 1870 Census. Twelve children:

a. Charles O Yarbrough (see Gen 7, p. 23).

- **b. John J. Yarbrough**, b. 10-10-1826 in AL, not at home in 1850 census (John his brother-in law was there).

- i. George W. Yarbrough, (see Gen. 7, p. 24).
- j. Erasmus Yarbrough, b. 3-24-1844 in AL, at home in 1860.
- k. Elizabeth Temperance "Temperance" Yarbrough, b. 4-11-1846 in AL, probably named after her grandmother Yarbrough, at home in 1860 Census.
- I. Sarah F. Yarbrough, b. 1-24-1849 in AL, at home in 1860 census.

Erasmus and Sarah were not listed in the bible record and could be grandchildren. C. O. Yarbrough, b. 8-24-1824 and was another child, m. Ameda Rice, 4-13-1848.

William is William Fletcher Yarbrough, and may appear as Fletcher Yarbrough.

E. Charles B. Yarbrough, b. 6-13-1801 (or 9-18-1801) in Franklin Co, NC, d. 11-26-1872 in Marshall Co, MS, buried in Holly Springs, MS in Hillcrest Cemetery, m. in Henderson Co, TN on 9-19-1829 to Sarah "Sally" B. Anderson, b. 6-13-1813 in Lunenberg Co, VA, d. 5-6-1894 in Marshall Co, MS, buried in Holly Springs, MS Hill Crest Cemetery. Daughter of Garland and Nancy Hamlett Anderson (Sarah also had a brother by that name who gave his niece, Martha Garland a gift). Charles moved first to Henderson Co, TN in the early 1820's and then in 1838 to Marshall Co, MS. In the 1860 Census, his real estate was valued at \$15,000 and his personal estate at \$50,000. Note that Emily Peel was living with them in the 1860 Census. She was the granddaughter of his long deceased baby sister Elizabeth Ann Davis, wife of Alfred Davis. Emily Peel's mother was Mary (May) Davis Peel who was orphaned as a small child in about 1828 in TN. She grew up with the Peel's who moved to Marshall Co, MS. Mary m. William Peel and they both died young. Mary had died by 1860. Eleven children, at least:

a. Nancy Lee Yarbrough, b. 5-19-1830 in Henderson Co., TN, d. 6-4-1834 in Henderson Co., TN, stone in family plot in Holly Springs, MS in Hillcrest Cemetery. I have found different dates for she and Rebecca B., but am using tombstone records in Holy Springs, MS for their dates. It appears her father moved Nancy's grave from TN to Holly Springs.

b. Rebecca B. Yarbrough, b. 11-23-1832 in Henderson Co., TN, d. 9-15-1839 in MS, buried in Holly Springs, MS in Hillcrest Cemetery.

c. Martha Garland Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 24).

d. Dianithia Beatrice "Beatrice" Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 24).

e. Charles "Charlie" Garland Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 24).

f. Dr. Archibald "Archie" Samuel Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 25).

g. George Woodson Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 25).

h. J. J. Yarbrough, b. 1882 in MS, living at home in 1900 Census. The dates of this individual make him appear to be a grandchild.

h. James Henry "Henry" Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 26).

i. John W. Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 26).

j. Sallie G. Yarbrough, b. 7-27-1849, d. 1-22-1861 in Marshall Co, MS, buried with parents and other sisters that died as children.

k. Jennie B. Yarbrough, b. 6-5-1855 in MS, d. 4-14-1861 in Marshall Co, MS, buried with parents

F. Nathaniel Yarbrough, b. abt. 1804 in Franklin Co, NC, d. in Smith Co, TN, I believe. He moved to Henderson Co, TN when Charles was there and was listed at the same residence and alone in the 1830 census. However, he married Sarphonia Wallace, b. 1806 in GA, in Henderson Co, TN in the late 1820's so they should have been in the census. Her father was George P. Wallace. They all moved to Benton Co, AR with his family in 1836 (paid taxes there in 1837). They were not in the 1840 Arkansas Census, however. They again moved, this time to Cherokee Co, TX about 1847 and Smith Co, TX about 1849. The Smith County Tax Rolls showed that Nathaniel obtained 111 acres of land in the same survey as James Henry. Is this father and son?

He was a farmer. A Nathaniel Yarbrough, m. Mrs. F. A. Brandon on 9-1-1870 in Nacogdoches, TX. Is this a second wife for Nathaniel, or his son's marriage. His first wife, Sophonia Yarbrough was a member of the Whitehouse Methodist Church in 1869, and removed from the roll in 1875. This membership record was from a teacher's class book in 1869. Did she die in 1869 or 1875?

- G. Elizabeth A. "Betsy" Yarbrough, b. abt. 1805 in Franklin Co, NC, m. Alfred M. Davis of Greensborough, GA on 9-23-1835 in Franklin Co, NC (two corrections printed for this marriage, 1<sup>st</sup> it was Elizabeth A. Yarbro, 2<sup>nd</sup> Elizabeth Yarbrough, daughter of Charles Yarbrough, and 3rd as daughter of James Yarbrough). They died in western TN in 1828. Thomas Yarbrough, exc. Of James Yarbrough's Will, was the guardian of Elizabeth and Nathaniel in 1821. These were the youngest children of James Yarbrough. Her aunt, Martha Yarbrough, left her a slave in her Will in 1817. Two children:
- a. Mary "May" Yarbrough (see Gen. 7, p. 27).
- b. Priscilla Duke Davis, b. 1830 in LA?, d. 2-28-1915 in Little Rock, Pulaski Co, AR in the home of Hunter Peel Alexander after an illness of 5 months (the birth information came from her tombstone, but her great nephew may not be correct on her birth date or state of birth). She was living in her great nephew Hunter Peel Alexander's home when she died in Little Rock, AR. She was buried in Little Rock in the Oakland Cemetery. The obituary listed her as Priscilla Davis Lanier, Hunter Peel's Alexander's aunt. She was a Baptist. She was m. at least three times, and had no children. She lived in Newburn, Dyer Co, TN most of her life. She moved to Little Rock as an elderly lady to live with her great nephew, Hunter Peel Alexander. The 1900 census lists her parents as being from NC, and her mother was known to be a deceased sister of Charles Yarbrough. Priscilla corresponded a lot with her sister, May Davis Peel, until May's death. Priscilla Davis' full name was Priscilla Duke Davis Hampton Lamb Lanier. Married 1st, James G. Hampton, 2-25-1841 in Carroll Co, TN. I have not found the other marriages for her (Her parents d. in late 1828 according to Franklin Co, NC Court Records (Nathaniel Yarbrough heirs vs his family). The obituary birthday of 1830 leaves a year or two discrepancy in dates.

May's son, Hunter Peel, lived with Priscilla in the Newburgh, TN area for some time after the death of his mother. Priscilla's middle name of Duke suggests to me that her father's mother was probably a Duke from Warren Co, NC. Alfred Davis may be a nephew or cousin of my ancestor Winifred Davis Yarbrough Winston. The initial information on both girls came from answering queries from Ellen Wild, a descendant of May Davis, on the Marshall Co, MS Genealogy Society message board.
