

GRAND OLD MAN OF LIBERAL POLITICS

Maverick Yarborough inspired generation of politicians

STIN - Ralph Yarbor-ough has lost more politi-USTIN cal battles than he ever won and made some powerful enemies that would have crushed a

less tenacious man. The fact that Yarborough, the grand old man of liberal Democratic politics, has survived to celebrate his 85th birthday and is still active in the Democratic Party is testimony to a combative spirit that served him well.

His legacy as a champion of liberal social causes in the U.S. Senate inspired a new generation of Democratic politicians like Agriculture Commissioner Jim Hightower, a former aide to Yarbor-ough, and Land Commissioner Garry Mauro, who worked in Yar-borough's final bid for the U.S. Senate. Even state Treasurer Ann Richards got her political start working on Yarborough's unsuc-cessful gubernatorial campaigns in the 1950s.

Yarborough won some hardfought wars that rendered to Texas billions of dollars in education funds and thousands of acres in parkland.

For the nation, he was instru-mental in providing the GI bills that helped send millions of servicemen to college after World War II, in providing Medicare and Medicaid funding and for libraries in public schools, universities and remedial schools. Yarborough passed more national legislation than any U.S. senator from Texas during his Washington tenure from 1957 to 1971

But legislative success came at a high price. Yarborough was fre-quently at odds wi'h established Democratic politicians like former President Lyndon Johnson and former Texas governors John B. Con-nally, Price Daniel and Allan Shiv-

He argued to Johnson against the Vietnam War and was branded a communist during one unsuccessful gubernatorial race with Shivers a label that has annoyed him for decades. Yarborough denies that President John F. Kennedy made his ill-fated November 1963 trip to Texas in an effort to patch up a feud between him and Connally. Age hasn't dimmed Yarbor-

ough's inclination to do battle. For him, Ronald Reagan's policies of cutting subsidies to the elderly and the poor epitomize evil. So do the big money interests of Texas, which he sees as holding back the state's potential. He loves to discuss those issues, jumping up from his chair in excitement as he does The great wealth in Texas is not humane wealth," he says. "It's anti-labor, it's anti-everything for

His supporters and critics ac-knowledge that Yarborough is a maverick who has antagonized the established money interests of Texas with his liberal views on race relations and social welfare. Hightower credits him with forging a "grass-roots progressive movement" for Texas. And Mauro points out that Yarborough will long be remembered as the only Southern senator to support the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

"He was a hero of mine." Mauro, who as a 22-year-old college student dropped out of law school for a semester to carry Yarborough's bags during the 1970 campaign against Bentsen. "He was on the right side of civil rights issues. He passed an awful lot of landmark legislation. You go back and look at the lawsuits he filed, they were landmark suits.

Mauro was referring in part to a time in the early 1930s, when Yarborough was an assistant Texas attorney general under James Allred.

Yarborough wrote an opinion that the Permanent School Fund should share in the bonus and rental payments from oil royalties on land in which the state owned the mineral rights. At the time, those payments had been going to the owners of surface rights to the land. the

Mauro says that more than \$2 billion of the \$5-plus billion in the Permanent School Fund can directly be attributed to Yarborough's opinlons

In 1933, Yarborough also wrote an opinion that Texas, not the federal government, owned the oil-rich Tide-lands of Texas, thus paving the way for additional oil revenues.

For those and other accomplishments, Texans remember Yarborough fondly. But he is just as often remembered for his combative style and his isolation from mainstream

Democratic politics.
"For years, he was the only pillar of the liberal wing of the Democratic Party in Texas," says George Chriswho was press secretary to President Johnson and who campaigned for Bentsen in the 1970 primary. "He was the only one willing to charge hell with a bucket of water.

Perhaps it was his tenacity that pulled Yarborough out of East Texas in the first place. He was born in Henderson County in 1903, the seventh of 11 children. He briefly at-tended West Point, taught public school in one-room school houses in East Texas and then worked and wandered through Europe. Eventually he returned home and studied law at the University of Texas, grad-

uating with honors in 1927.
Yarborough didn't immediately launch his political career. His wife, Opal, was reportedly against it. So Yarborough specialized in land law, and accepted the job that Allred had offered. When Allred became governor, he appointed Yarborough to fill a vacant slot as Travis County disPAGE 172

trict judge. Yarborough was later until President Johnson left office, elected to the position. And in 1938, he ran for Allred's old job as attor-

ney general, but lost. Yarborough's penchant for dis-tancing himself from established interests was evident as early as 1957, when he was elected to the U.S. Senate On election night, an Austin lobbyist stopped by his office and later told reporters in amazement,

'There wasn't a big shot down there

nothing but people." In the process of aligning himself with the people, however, Yarbor-ough became the brunt of some of the dirtiest political tricks in Texas

During the 1954 gubernatorial campaign, Allan Shivers' staff pro-duced a TV film called the Port Arthur Story in which a trade union was charged with the economic destruction of Port Arthur. The film showed deserted streets of the city, and Shivers said that the story of Port Arthur could be duplicated throughout Texas if Yarborough became governor. He said a network of communist-dominated unions was being erected along the Gulf Coast and that Yarborough sympathized with these unions.

Much later, one of Shivers' staff members admitted that the film of Port Arthur's deserted streets had been shot at 5 a.m.

Yarborough remembers also that his phones were tapped and his family was harassed. Government during this period, he says, was corrupt.

dealings with Price Daniel were less bitter than the ones with Shivers, but still stormy.

Yarborough, after losing two races for governor, decided to try a third time in 1956. Daniel, who had been Texas' junior senator in Congress, decided to enter the race. The result-ing primary race was one of the closest statewide elections in Texas Daniel won the primary by about 3,200 votes, and Yarborough remained bitter for years. But the men had a public and emotional reconciliation in 1985, when they joined hands as attorneys to help two Texas Indian tribes.

Today, Daniel remembers Yarborough as a formidable opponent, but adds, "I don't figure he was any rougher than I was."

Daniel acknowledges that Yarborough was caught up in the ideologi-cal Democratic battles of the 1950s. "All the conservatives (Democrats) just fought him through the years," he says He adds, "I still feel a lot of the causes he fought for in the Senate

were just causes."

Early in his career as assistant attorney general, Yarborough was a moderate Democrat, Daniel recalls. That changed, however, when Yarborough campaigned against Shivers. "He was up against a man that the liberal element was very much against," Daniel remembers.

Christian also remembers Yarbor ough as more moderate. He says Yarborough did not take strong stands against the Vietnam War

During Johnson's tenure in the White House, Yarborough "voted for most of the necessary legislation against the war," Christian said.

The two men did work together to pass national legislation on education, which Yarborough believes was his biggest accomplishment in Wash-

Yarborough sponsored the Na-tional Defense Education Act in 1958 and the Cold War GI Bill, which boosted college enrollment from less than 3 million to more than 8 million within 10 years. He also co-sponsored bills to provide funds for bilingual education and to help physically handicapped and disadvantaged children

Of the education bills, Yarborough says that Johnson "claimed them all He said this is my Great Society. Yarborough also fought for parkland in Texas, and was instrumental in brough Conference . . . creating the Padre Island National Seashore, the Big Thicket National Preserve and the Guadalupe Mountains National Park.

Texas, he sometimes faced formidable Republican opposition.

In 1964 he defeated then-Houston ongressman George Bush in a hotly ontested race in which Yarborough was charged with accepting a \$50,000 bribe from Texas promoter Billy Sol Estes in 1960. Yarborough not only denied the charges, but noted that the FBI and U.S. House and Senate had already disproved the allega-

After 559 starts-83 of them ending in victory, Yarborough, 48, formally retired after the Atlanta Journal 500 at Atlanta International Raceway. He finished 10th in his Hardee's-sponsored Oldsmobile, then climbed out and said, nope, there will be no second thoughts, no comebacks and

"I've thought a lot about how I'd feel right now," he said. "I've thought about



how long time it's been, how much I've enjoyed it and what I've done. I felt aw-fully sad when I made that last (postrace) lap and waved at all the people. But that was the last lap. I'm done. This was it." Then, after hugging old friend and current crew chief Elmo Langley, Yarborough wiped his eyes and told a bystander, Man, I'm glad this weekend is over."

Yarborough did it all-and then some. His 83 victories leave him fourth on NAS-CAR's all-time list behind Richard Petty, David Pearson and Bobby Allison. He

won three Winston Cups with team owner Junior Johnson ('76, '77, '78), was NAS-CAR's driver of the year in '76 and '78 and earned more than \$5 million. And he won all the biggies, most of them several times, including four Daytona 500s. He also drove Indy cars and ran the 24 Hours of LeMans.

Not surprisingly-considering his home is near Darlington, S.C.—the victory Yarborough cherishes most came 20 years ago at Darlington. "I wouldn't trade that Southern 500 for anything," he said. "It was back when the track was tougher, before they changed it. David Pearson and I beat on each other all day. It was a great win that's still special to me because it started me on my way."

Now a team owner, Yarborough has hired Dale Jarrett to run the full 29-race schedule in '89. The team will continued to be sponsored by Hardee's and will stick with Oldsmobiles.



MRS. PAULINE GRAY put a lot of effort into tracking down family history for a book. Her efforts were rewarded with a first place win in the Oklahoma State Fair genealogy section.

Mrs. Gray stated her book was prepared with a two-fold purpose, to memoralize ancestors and to honor her children and grandchildren. She says that she couldn't have completed the book without the "help of many others, including her husband, Earl, who loves to travel. Mrs. Gray says he has no patience for research, but his efforts to aid her in her search were of great benefit.

Research for Mrs. Gray was fun, she says, especially making trips to courthouses, cemeteries, archives, and finding the home places. She makes note of the fact the rewording and retyping of page after page was not so much fun, but the finished product was very rewarding.

In describing her writings of her

ancestors, Mrs. Gray said, "I wanted the reader to see them as real people who lived and to get a glimpse of the times in which they lived. If I've succeded in a small degree, I will be satisfied."

Mrs. Gray retired from teaching duties in 1981. During her teaching career, she spent 25 years in the Kingston School System teaching in the business and home economic field and also helped put out the school newspaper and year book. She and her husband reside south of Madill.

THIS INDENTURE made the fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty-three between Joshua Yarbrough and Sarah his wife in the County of Orange of the one part and Goodrich Lightfoot, Gent. of the county

aforesaid of the other part,

WITNESSETH that the said Joshua Yarbrough and Sarah his wife for and in consideration of five shillings sterling to him in hand paid by the said Goodrich Lightfoot the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged - hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Goodrich Lightfoot all that tract or parcell of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid county and parish of St. Marks containing one hundred acres the same more or less which the said Joshua Yarbrough purchased of Richard Yarbrough as by the said Richard Yarbrough's deed bearing the date the XXIV of March in the year of our lord 1742 will more fully and at large appear, the said one hundred acres be the same more or less being also a part of a greater tract or parcell of land which the said Richard Yarbrough purchased of the said Richard Mauldin containing six hundred acres the said Maulding's deed bearing the date the XV of July one thousand seven hundred and thirty-five will appear, and is bounded as followeth:

BEGINNING on the South side of Robinson River and where Mr. Joshua Fry's line crosses the said river southwardly with the said Frys line to Thomas Garrett's line thence with the said Carrett's line to Ambrose Powells line, thence with the said Powells line to the said river, thence down the said river to the beginning; And including the land and plantation whereon the sd Joshua Yarbrough now lives and all houses, garden orchards, meadows, commons, wood trees, way waters, profits, commodities hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same beloning or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion land reversions, remainder and remainders, rents and services of all and singular the said premises and every part and parcell thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said land hereditaments and premises above mentioned and every part and parcell thereof with the appurtenances to the said Goodrich Lightfoot his executors or administrators from the day of the sale hereof for and during and until the full end of the term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and fully to be compleat and ended, yielding and paying therefor one pepper corn in and upon the feast of St. Michael Archangel if demanded to the intent that by virtue of these presents and force of the statute for transferring uses into the possession of the said Goodrich Lightfoot may be in the actual possession of all and singular the premises above ment'd with the appurtenances, and thereby be enabled to accept and take a grant and release of the reversion and inheritance thereof to him and his heirs to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Goodrich Lightfoot his heirs and assigns forever,

IN WITNESS whereof the said Joshua Yarbrough and Sarah his wife hath hereunto set his hand and seals the day and month and year first above written.





MOSES YARBOROUGHS OF VIRGINIA AND SC FIRST IN SERIES, EXTENSIVE RESEARCH, MUCH THEORY, LOTS TO COME

FROM THE YARBROUGH ARCHIVES BY KAREN S. MAZOCK MOSTS YARB(O) ROUGH

Recently I have heard from nearly all researchers or the Moses Yarb(o)rough of S.C. line. Some information below is from records and the sources are cited. Some, especially the excerpts from the letters of Mrs. Davis, are theory, memories and speculation and are printed here solely for the purpose of providing possible clues to research.

Some researchers believe that the S.C. Moses Y. was the son of William and Elliner Y of Amelia County, VA. (Will of William Y dated 19 Jul 1748, proven 16 Dec 1748, names: Wife, Elliner; sons: Samuel, William, Hezekiah, Moses and Micajah; Daus: Priscilla, Ann Higgons, Caryhapuch Anderson; Granddau: Priscilla Robertson. Exrs: Wife Elliner and sons William and Hezekiah. Amelia Co., VA Will Book 1, p. 50.) While there is perhaps a close relationship to this family, the records of Amelia County, VA seem to indicate that this Moses Y. did not leave Amelia County:

Will of Hezekiah Yarbrough, dated 4 Mar 1754, proven 27 Jun 1754. Names sister Priscilla Yarbrough; leaves brother Moses Yarbrough tract "I live on" and his right to a tract of land lying on the fork of the Nottoway. Exr. Moses Yarbrough, brother. Wits: John Smith, Henry Yarbrough and Richard Holt. Amelia Co. VA Will Book 1, p. 107.

23 May 1754. Indenture between Moses Yarbrough and Gabriel Fowlkes of Amelia Co. Va and John Fowlkes of Hanover Co., Va. ... 800 acres on Nottoway River ... part of a patent granted to Samuel, William, Hezekiah and Moses Yarbrough 5 Jun 1746. Amelia Co. Deed Book 5, p. 154.

27 Jun 1754 - Will of Hezekiah Yarbrough presented in Court by Moses Yarbrough, executor therein ... Amelia Co. Va Order Book 3, p. 179.

Feb. 1755 Court - William Torborn v. Moses Yarbrough, Exr of Hezekiah Yarbrough, dec'd. Amelia Co. Va. Order Book 3, p. 214.

June Court 1755. William Tarborn v. Moses Yarbrough, Exr of Hezekiah Yarbrough, dec'd. Amelia Co. Va Order Book 3, p. 241.

Will of Moses Yarborough, dated 3 Mar 1756, proven 22 Apr 1756. "Very sick and weak", leaves sister Priscilla Yarbrough all his lands and estate. Names sister Priscilla executrix. Wits: Thomas Yarbrough, Richard Stone and Henry Yarbrough. Amelia Co. Va Will Book 1, p. 119.

NOTE: These are not all the records .. just a representative sample showing Moses was apprently a resident of Amelia Co., Va. until his death.

(1771-1774) "Testamentum nun cupatum (oral): Moses Yarborough, late of St. Mark's Parish in Craven County, South Carolina being weak but of sound and perfect memory and mind blessed be God for it do desire that what I now say may be by you who are present remembered so that my real and personal Estate be divided and disposed of in manner and form following --- first --- I do give and bequeath unto my well-beloved wife Frances Yarborough during the time she shall be a widow or until my eldest child Elizabeth Yarborough shall come of age all my estate real and personal and further that she may have the bringing up of my three children by my former wife until they may come of age or are married but should Frances my wife be married again then she shall have a child's part and my estate both real and personal shall be equally divided betwixt my said wife and Jilson my youngest son born of her body and Elizabeth Yarborough, Ann Yarborough and William Yarborough three children I had by another wife and further at the time of her death my estate both real and personal save what I shall hereafter mention shall be equally divided betwixt my four children above mentioned or to --(missing)-of them that may at that time be alive next I bequeath to William Moore and George Moore two sons of my wife Frances by another husband all that plantation or tract of five hundred acres of land lying and being on Little River a Branch of saludy and Bounded by land laid out to John Box, Quinta Hall, John Manly, James Harvey to be by them and their Heirs holden and possesst forever and that further I desire Mr. Benjamin Waring and Richard Waring on a Division of our land run that my part may be sold and the money arising therefrom shall be to purchase negroes to help raise my small family and them all to be divided with their future increase amongst my four children as is above named this with subscribers declared to be the Intent and Meaning of the Testator who departed this life only a few hours after he had thus declared himself being the Second day of October at or near thereof three o'clock in the morning and by us the third day of the same month committed to writing as here set forth." Signed by us the 3rd day of October 1772: David D. Cradocks, Frances Harvey and Samuel Wharton. Proved by virtue of a Dedimus directed by his excellency The Governor to James Mayson, Esq. - 26 Nov 1772. Recorded in original Will Bk 1771-1774 on page 280.

Mary and Frances, known as the Stark Twins, were named for their grandmothers. Mary Davis was 70 years of age in 1956 when she was corresponding with Y researcher, Ruth (Yarbrough) Horne. Mrs. Davis' handwriting is bold, but very difficult to read. Below are excerpts from her letters. The date in () is the date of the letter. Please be aware that much of what she wrote was memories. These excerpts are provided, not as fact, but merely as possible clues a researcher may wish to pursue. At the time the letters were written, Mrs. Davis lived at Confederate Lodge, Abbeville, South Carolina.

"I'm too sorry to report all my family are dead. Just my twin sister and I left. We are 70 years young. ... My grandmother on my mother's side was Mary Yarbrough who married Col. Nicholas Miller. It was she who said always in referring to her food on her table as handed down through her French blood and to save me I can't find one ounce of France, name or blood. We even were told of a cookbook in French! She was noted for fine food served by servants etc. to her 10 children. All of my mother's people came into Abbeville County from Old Edgefield. There is a story told by these Edgefield (old fammiles) Yarbrough folk that the first ancestor of ours came .. because of a bacarro game being played with the kind of England. He (the Yarbrough) was accused of cheating and he came to SC. One of the men (I've forgotten his name) in the game died a short time after this old Yarbrough came. This man admitted on his death bed that it was he who cheated, so the king granted thousands of acres to the (Yarbrough) line. I've never found all this,



MOSES YARBOROUGH-Continued from 187 but I do know my grandmother was a lady with inherited 'English' taught by her people. They really knew the parlor conversation and she said her mother did before her and was educated in England. She may have been the French girl. How this is handed down, just what is true, I do not know. I am certain of one thing -- William Yarbrough spoke excellent English so my great grandmother said. His mother was Ann who doesn't sound French to me.

... My grandmother claimed no kin to any SC lines. She seldom spoke of her mother or grandfather, saying only they came into SC from Virginia. Of course, there are the same names in Virginia lines such as Moses, Edward and Littleton. Somehow I've always felt Ann who married Moses Yarbrough was a Littleton. My line .. was in Craven, SC before Moses made his will in 1772. ... All I can say, my mother's mother said she hated to change her name to Miller, that her name was 'Royalty' in England and her family never claimed relation to any Yarbroughs in SC outside of Old Edgefield where they were really the tops in every connection."

(Nov 1, 1956) "..went to Charleston and copied Moses' will. As far as I know, all his land was in Camden and Edgefield and the Fairfield SC Yarbroughs were not mine for William Yarbrough had no land as far as I know in this county. He may have been close kin. You see, my mother's grandmother (Mary Brooks who m. William Yarbrough) said her stepfather had only one half brother, Gilson Yarbrough, born after her stepfather married Frances Foote Moore Yarbrough and after Moses' death she married Samuel Savage ... You see, Will Yarbrough's half brother was Gilson. I think he was named for the Foote side of the family. As far as I know, the Yarbroughs came from any place, maybe VA or SC. My mother did say all she remembered was her mother talking of her French food. They, these in SC, had all the money - education, silver, china and land until the war between the states and were among the real families of Edgefield SC. ... I am certain she (Ann who m. Moses) descends some way from the Littletons, this she knew and I do wish I could remember how this was. ...but can do nothing back of Camden, SC, Moses and William of Edgefield who married into the famous Brooke-Brooks family. (William) received land in this county for his Revolutiona service. I think this was in Camden District. His land for this service was granted in Ninety-Six District on 'Hog Skin Creek' in this section. ... We were led to believe his (Moses) land was all granted to him in SC and no trace of VA lines ever entered my mind. I have land grants to the Fairfield bunch but we were supposed to be no kin. .. My mother's grandfather William Yarbrough said he and his sisters were reared by Frances Foote Moore the only mother he ever knew. I know this Ann, Elizabeth and William inherited much land, furniture etc. from Ann that the Moores never inherited. As I recall, my mother said that the Moores had plenty, too."

(March 29, 1957) "(Moses) had 4 children, 3 by wite ann and only one by Frances --- Uncle Gilson as my mother called him and her mother visited him as an old man in Edgefield. Yes, mother knew all about the Butler connection for when Frances married the Savage man the Butlers were never allowed in his house. Ma told me why and I've forgotten. My mother's mother, Polly Yarbrough, daughter of Will and Mary Brooks Y, died in '98 ... and she went every year back in Edgefield SC to visit her Yarbrough-Brooks-Butler relatives ... Will Yarbrough was reared by the Moore/Butler kin. ... Dr. Littleton Yarbrough was son of Will and Mary Brooks Yarbrough. My mother always said the Yarbroughs descended from a Littleton family .. she did not know where they came from. Gen. William Butler and his wife were forever in my grandmother's home here. She had a large home which is today standing ... she gave bountiful dances, dinners, etc. where the meat platters literally covered the table. She had magnificent china, silver and furniture. ... Polly Brooks was the daughter of Polly (?) and Jacob Brooks. I think she (Polly Brooks) was a Taylor. I am sure my Yarbroughs were related to Littletons. My mother said this Polly Yarbrough said shen she married Col. Nicholas Miller she hated to give up her Yarbrough identity."

(September 24, 1957) "...send you a note I found in my data that may prove my grandmother's words true that she had French blood through the Littletons. See Virginia Magazine Vol. 5 page 131 where Ann Littleton left a will in accomack County Va in 1656 - states she leaves a great deal of wearing apparel and furniture equal to the best in England. She was the daughter of Sir Edward Littleton and Mary de Ludlow. I feel sure there must be the French blood for we had Edward Yarbrough and my Moses who married Ann ____ and it is she who must have been some relation of this Littleton family."

(October 4, 1957) "The Littletons, we were told by our grandmother who was a Yarbrough - William and Polly Brooks daughter - she said the Edward and Littleton names used as given names came from Littletons. ... Ann .. must have been a descendant of the Littleton family. The Ann Littleton will I sent you was too far back to prove anything, from 1656. ... (After Moses died) she married Samuel Savage .. I remember hearing my mother say old Savage was well named. This was what her father, William, always said. ... My mother did not dwell on ancestry.said her position was secure and they were educated and the ancestry didn't mean amount to much if we didn't respect the laws of society and were Christians. ... Ma knew little and cared less. She was a member of a large family that had everything. They were gifted, educated and witty. Everyone wanted to be with her family adn they didn't go out to people, people came to them. My grandmother had a large home, beautiful furniture Continued on Page 189

help, rode in carriages and she road over her farm daily. My father said she was the most remarkable woman he ever heard of to go through the day and educate 10 children when her husband was gone and kept her slaves together. She was Polly Yarbrough. From where she got this ability I don't know. I am sure her children (the men) did not succeed as she had, but they were never dishonest - just wonderfully attractive men that could not make

money but spent lavishly for that date. George Miller married Cuclie Reed (Judge Reed's daughter) of Anderson and William Miller married Sallie Ross (Dr. Ross' daughter) of Florence SC, a presbyterian minister and all the girls married into the best families that they had been reared with, so there was something more than the usual ability to my grandmother. She really had little time for genealogy. My mother, the youngest, was 3 years old when her father, Col. Nicholas Miller, died. He was in the Mexican War."

(March 27, 1958) "I saw Ann given in land records as Moses first wife ...was in a rush and don't remember where or when ...feel sure my Mary Yarbrough who married Nicholas Miller knew something of her (Ann's) French blood and cooking. Am sure she told this to her children My mother often referred to this ... I am certain for have been told over and over the Littletons were our Yarbrough kin and certainly this SC family had one Littleton in each generation. There is a close relationship to the Elizabeth Yarbrough in NC for (in her) will (the) names are the same as my SC ones except for Nimrod. I've been told the Gilmers were related and my sister says my mother often said this. ... From the George Yarbrough will in Halifax NC 1798, I imagine George was a younger brother of Moses. Also Elizabeth Yarbrough's (will) in Comerland Co., NC. I imagine her husband was a brother of Moses. ..she died 1803. You see, this Littleton going through her line almost proves the same family. I've never found the proof that my Yarbrough married a Littleton. It was either in Virginia or England before mine came to VA or SC.

(September 24, 1958) "I have always thought maybe that George with wife Elizabeth naming children almost the same (as my line) was some relation. I've felt they were Littletons, but you say she was a Norwood. If this family were related to the Littletons, it would be worth working on for I'm sure my Yarbroughs go back some way to this one. You know Will, son of Moses, married Mary Brooks of Saluda Old Town so I watch for this Littleton name as I believe my lines on Yarbrough were all tied in with Moores, Butlers and Brooks. .. I know my grandmother said her father, Will, was devoted to all the lines in Old Saluda. Blood counted in those days."

(Oct 1956) "William Yarbrough was 12 years old during the Revolutionary War. He was caught by Tories while he was carrying food to the soldiers. The Tories hung him by his thumbs from a tree and left him to die. His half brothers came by and cut him from the tree, but he carried the scars to his grave. His thumbs were all out of shape. His land grant verifies his service .. 200 acres in Edgefield County -- (it) says Rev. Bounty."



After the war, Yarborough became leader of the Democratic Party's liberal wing and ran two unsuccessful gubernatorial campaigns in 1952 and 1956. He won a special election to the U.S. Senate in 1957 and remained there until 1971, when he was defeated in the primary by Lloyd Bentsen.

It is for the stint on the bench that Yarborough will be honored at a courthouse ceremony Friday. A portrait will be unveiled in the 53rd District Courtroom over which he once presided.

Yarborough said the portrait was painted in 1965 and was a gift from farmers and ranchers in the Panhendle. Martha Dickie, president of the Travis County Bar Association and organizer of Friday's event said it has been in the making for some time.

"The Bar Association and Judge (Mary Pearl) Williams have been trying to get this organized for eight to 10 years," said Dickie. But Yarborough's schedule and other factors worked against it.

Dickie, whose father was an administrative assistant to the former senator, said she was determined to see the remembrance accomplished. She said the close family ties gave her the edge in getting Yarborough's commitment to the event.

The ceremony is scheduled for 11 a.m. Friday in Room 421 of the Travis County Courthouse.





All in the Family

Everybody comes from 2 parents, 4 grandparents, 8 great-grandparents, 16 great-great-grandparents, etc. Every generation back we go, we have twice as many lineal ancestors.

This is very much like the Persian Chessboard problem. If there are, say, 25 years to a generation, then 64 generations is $64 \times 25 = 1600$ years ago, or just before the fall of the Roman Empire. So, every one of us alive today had in the year 400 some 18.5 quintillion ancestors or so it seems—to say nothing about collateral relatives.

But this is far more than the population of the Earth, then or now, It is far more than the number of human beings who ever lived. Something is wrong with our calculation. What? We have assumed all those lineal ancestors to be different people. But this is not the case. The same distant ancestor is related to us by many different routes. We are repeatedly connected with our relatives. Every marriage brings cousins together.

If we go back far enough, any two people anywhere on Earth have a common ancestor. Whenever a new American President is elected, someone—generally in England—discovers that the new President is a distant relative of the Queen of England. This announcement is intended, perhaps, to soothe any residual American longing for a king of our own. Of course, when two people derive from the same small corner of the world, and their genealogies are well-recorded, the last common ancestor can be discovered. But whether it can be discovered or not, a relationship is clear; We are all cousins—all members of a vast world-girdling family. It's time, I think, for a reunion.

Despite sub-freezing weather in Austin, a standing room crowd was in attendance. The 53rd District Courtroom was in session Feb. 3, 1989 to honor Ralph W. Yarborough. It was singular that the ceremony was held in the same courtroom where Ralph Yarborough had presided as Judge over 50 years ago. Each speaker gave an outline of Sen. When the senior member of the firm was incapacitated young Yarborough was assigned to continue the case and won the suit.

As a Colonel with the 97th Infantry Division he saw service in Europe and Asia which included witnessing the horrors of the concentration camp to the pacification and rebuilding of Japan.

Senator Yarborough has been styled a "liberal" in politics and it can be saidhe had the courage of his convictions. He proposed and promoted many legislative bills to lift up the less fortunate in our society. Ralph W. Yarborough's life and career will be the delight of an enterprising biographer some day in the future.
