I am inviting you to join with me in the weeks ahead by sharing with your Y. family members your story when you discovered your heritage in YNGHA. The Ozarks Steam Engine Association



In early 1962, several people organized to show their restored steam equipment; that summer they were invited to Billings, Missouri, for their first show. The show date was September 21, 22, 23, and 24, 1962. The first president was Leonard Yarbrough of Springfield and Hal Carlock was the first Secretary. The first show was a big success and the group made plans for a second show. During the fall of 1962 and early 1963 the group was able to purchase 17 acres 2 miles east of Republic, Missouri on the south side of highway US 60. This was to be the permanent home of the Ozarks Steam Engine Association Inc. The second year officers were Leonard Yarbrough, President and Clovis Burrell,

Secretary. Their second show was on August 30th, 31st and September 1st and 2nd 1963 and has grown each year since. They have added to the park twice, bringing it to a total of 34 acres. Today, there is a building that houses a large stationary steam boiler and several stationary engines. There is a "Steam Motel" for storage of the traction engines and a covered sawmill that is used every year. Most recently has been the addition of flush bathrooms and showers. The park that comes alive 10 days after Labor Day for a four day reunion. The steam club meets every other month on the second Saturday night at local establishments.

YARBOROUGH CHRONOLOGICAL DATA

1559 - 1660

collated by Peter Yarburgh (U.K.)

In this last part of the Chronology I have included only the heads or heirs of the Yarboroughs in the counties of Lincolnshire, Yorkshire and Nottinghamshire. There are a great many other Yarborough names on the IGI which I have not included.

In former centuries, most Yarboroughs lived in Lincolnshire but, after 1550, branches of the family moved to the neighbouring counties of Nottinghamshire and Yorkshire. I have indicated the county underneath the underlined date.

I have given a little extra attention to the Alvingham and Saltfleetby Yarbroughs as I believe that Richard Y of Virginia came from this branch.

1559 Oueen Elizabeth I reigned 1559 - 1603

1559


Lincs. 1) The Will of Thomas Yarbrough of Alvingham was written in the first year of the reign of Queen Elizabeth. Witnessed by Richard Horsard.

Thomas Yarbrough does not die until 1565.

(LCC Will. 1565/97. Y.H. p.615)

2) Thomas Yarbrough of Alvingham buys 26 selions of land from Ursula Hall. Thomas Horsarde is a witness. (*Rylands Charter 25. Y.H.p.539*)

* NOTE. It is not certain whether the Thomas Y, who heads this pedigree, was a brother or a cousin of the Cockerington Ys (later spelt Yerburgh). See <u>1594.</u>

1560

Lincs. 1) Thomas Clifford claims ownership of Kelstern manor from the Yarburghs. The case continued for several years. In 1565 the Yarburghs relinquished their claim to the manor. (*De Banco Roll 1187. Easter, 2 Elizabeth. Y.H. p.403*)

<u>15</u>60

Lincs. 2) Thomas Yarbrough of Alvingham purchases land from Dorothy Croftes of Cockerington. (Rylands Alvingham Charter No.2. Y.H. p.539)

1561

Lincs. 1) London. Sir Ralph Chamberleyn of Suffolk sues Charles Yarburgh for a debt of 500 marks. Case adjourned.

(De Banco Roll 1193. Easter, 3 Elizabeth, m.889, Y.H. 405)

2) Thomas Clyfforde brings a case against Charles Yarburgh and George Littlebury for taking 120 sheep from Kelstern.

(De Banco Roll same as above. m.824)

3) Lincoln. Charles Yarburgh, esq. sues William Elvys, of Garnethorp, yeoman, for taking three of Charles's heifers valued at 40 shillings.

(De Banco Roll same as above, m.651)

4) Lincoln. Charles Yarburgh, esq.. sues John Redheade, of Gaton-juxta-Louth, for a debt of £5 6s 8d

(De Banco Roll 1196. Michaelmas 3 Elizabeth, m.286)

5) Lincoln. Brian Yarburgh, gent. and Dorothy, his wife, in a covenant over 4 acre of pasture 'with appurtenances' in South Somercotes made with Thomas Bery.

(De Banco Roll same as above. m.338)

6) London. Sir Ralph Chamberleyn of Suffork versus Charles Yarburgh of Gedding, Suffolk. Case (see 1) continues.

(De Banco Roll same as above. m.338)

- 7) Lincoln. Brian Yarburgh, gent. and Dorothy his wife, in a covenant over 24 acres of land, 26 acres of meadow and 20 acres of pasture 'with appurtenances' in South Somercote. (De Banco Roll same as above. m.249
- 8) London. Charles Yarburgh 'late of Kelstern' agrees to pay Thomas Clyfforde £200 for 200 acres of land in Kelstern. See 1560 (1) &1562 (2).


The case continued in 1564 DBR 1226 Michaelmas m. 1887. (De Banco Roll 1198. Michaelmas 3-4 Elizabeth. m.1250)

1561

Lincs. William Yarburgh, son of Charles and Elizabeth (née Littlebury) was born near this date. He died in 1618, aged about 57.

Simplified pedigree of the Yaboroughs of Yarburgh and Kelstern

(Dates indicate 1st entry for that name in this data base.)



1556-1569

Lincs. The family of Brian Yarburgh, gent.(4th son of Charles Y esq., of Kelstern) was born at Withern. One of their sons, named Richard, and was baptised in 1581.

c.1560

Case brought before the Lord Chancellor, Sir Nicholas Bacon, concerning the inheritance of Margaret (née Mitchell), the wife of Christopher Yarburgh (♥ in the pedigree). The dispute was over lands in three villages 20 miles south of Yarburgh village The case shows that Margaret had died and that there was a son, Thomas.

From the Will of Elizabeth Yarburgh (Christopher's mother) we know that there were two more children: Elizabeth and Anne.

(Chancery Proceedings. Series II. 210/26 &20/42 &140/2., Y.H. 579-561)

1563

Lincs. Wylliam Yarbrough of Alvingham married Ellin Allot. (Alvingham Parish Register 6th June)

1564

Lincs. John, heir of William and Ellen Yarbrough of Alvingham, born near this date.

1) Lincoln. Charles Yarburgh of Kelstern. esq.. is sued for £220 debt owed to Thomas Kyrke of Threddlethorpe.

(De Banco Roll 1218. Easter _ Elizabeth [1564] m. 570 Case continued twice in the Michaelmas term Roll 1224 m.848.

2) London. Charles Yarburgh of Kelstern sues Nicholas Gerlynton of Lincoln for £100. (De Banco Roll 1219. Easter 6 Elizabeth [1564] m.1491)

All these cases must have been making Charles Y unwell. He owed his doctor 40 marks. He owed Thomas Wentworth £1000 and he sold him the manor of Kelstern. Other lands were sold or leased to pay creditors like Thomas Kyrke. Even so he had enough money (£800) to buy the manor of East Wyckam from John Littlebury, who must have been a relation of Charles's wife - Elizabeth (née Littlebury).

1565.

Lincs. Thomas Yarbrough of Alvingham died in 1565. His heir was William Yarborowe. Thomas's crops, animals and goods were valued at £28 15s, 4d. (£7000 today). His lands and houses was not included. (*Lincoln Record Archives. Inv.* 44/78)

1574


Lincs. Lincoln. Charles Yarburgh, esq.. (formerly of Kelstern). recognizes that he owes Henry Jenkinson £1000. Henry was husband of Charles's 1st cousin, Faith Yarburgh..

1576

Lincs. Ann, daughter of William Yarburgh of Alvingham was baptized.. As an adult, she married John Y, gent. of Withern (the grandson of Charles Y. esq. of Kelstern).

Notts. Near this date Charles Yarburgh, gent, heir of Edmund Y, married Barbara Whalley in Nottinghamshire. This family pedigree was:

Charles Y (d.1616) = Barbara Whalley



1580

Notts. Hercy Yarburgh born. He was the son of Charles Yarburgh, gent. and Barbara (née Whalley). They lived at Willoughby near Newark in Nottinghamshire.

Lincs. Brian Yarburgh, gent. of Withern. died..

1590

Lincs. William Yerburgh, gent. married (H)ellen Clifford. The marriage resolved the dispute about the lordship of the manor of Kelstern. Both families had claimed, by different marriage lineages, the right to the lordship, going back to Sir John Ewerby who was the original lord. (St Peter Eastgate, Lincoln Register 11 August)

Edmund Yarburgh (3rd son of Charles Y of Kelstern) died at Lincoln. A memorial brass to him and his wife was placed in the Cathedral. Charles Y., his eldest son, became the head of the Nottinghamshire Ys. Edmund's second son, Francis, headed the family who was to become the Yorkshire Ys.

1591

Lincs. Henry Yarburgh, son of William and Ellen Yarburgh, gentry of Yarburgh village, was born near this date. He was to marry Frances Cheyney in 1620.

(South Cockerington Baptismal Register 15 August)

1592

Lincs. Ann, daughter of William Y of Alvingham, married John Y, gent. John was son of Brian Y, and grandson of Charles Y, esq.. of Kelstern and Yarburgh. This marriage linked the Alvingham branch to the Y gentry branch of Yarburgh. She was aunt to the Richard Y who sailed to Virginia.

1594


Lincs Robert Yarburgh, yeoman, (Yerburgh ancestor) died. His heir was George Y. (North Cockerington Register 13th December)

This man's descendants continued in unbroken male succession down to the present Lord Alvingham, who now heads this branch. This family claim a pedigree back to Germund in the 11th century.

Descent continues to the present

(Public Record Office C1/1396/PFN 50 Law Suit. LCC 1594 ii 108 Will)

* Robert Y's Will mentions a 'cousin' William Yarburgh. In another Will of 1591 (that of Robert's cousin, Thomas Y++ of Cockerington) William Yarburghe is made the supervisor of the will, again he is called 'cousin'.

This cousin was probably Wm. Y** of Alvingham Y who died in 1597.

1595

Lincs. Francis Yarburgh of Northorpe Manor died (the son of Edmund Y. See 1590)

He had been married twice. In his time, he was a top lawyer.


1597

Lincs. William Yarbrough, yeoman, of Alvingham died. This William Yarbrough was the son of Thomas Y of Alvingham. See the pedigree under <u>1561</u>.

<u>1591</u> Pedigree.

This pedigree can be deduced from William Yarbrough's Will.

(The names in brackets from other sources.)



His Inventory was worth £178 [Worth £370.000 today]

*Thomas. His son, was left lands at Saltfleetby. He moved there shortly afterwards. (*LCC Wills 1598 ii 91*).

<u>1603</u> James I reigned 1603 - 1625

Lincs. Richard Yarborowe married Elizabeth Rownsdale at Great Steeping. It is likely that this Richard was the youngest son of William Y of Alvingham, yeoman.

1609

Lincs. George Yarburgh of Covenham, yeoman, (Yerburgh ancestor) died. He was the son of Robert Y of Cockerington. (See pedigree 1594.) He married twice. His first wife bore him four daughters. After his first wife's death, he married Anne Gentle. By her, he had two sons. His Inventory was worth £346 = £53,000 today.


The Yerburgh male line continued through his second son Robert Y. (b. 1602/3 and d. 1678). This man was on Parliament's side in the Civil War. (See *1649*)

(North Cockerington Register 13th December)

1611

Yorks. Edmund Yarburgh, esq., married Sarah Wormley. Edmund was the great grandson of Charles Y of Kelstern and Yarburgh.

Outline Pedigree:



1612

Yorks. Nicholas Yarburgh (son and heir of Edmund and Sarah Y.) was baptized at Snaith. In 1635 he married Faith Dawney. He was knighted about 1640.

Notts. Hercy Yarburgh, gent. of Willoughby manor, married Elizabeth Woodnett.

1613

Notts. Richard Yarburgh, heir of Hercy Y, was born. His date of birth was so nearly the same as the year that the Virginian Y pioneer that many assumed that Hercy's son *was* the colonizer, However, it this is impossible as this Richard died in 1639.

1614

Lincs. Charles Yarburgh, esq., of Yarburgh village died. His son, William Yarburgh, succeeded him as head of the family.

Lincs. Saltfleetby. Richard Y, grandson of William Y of Alvingham, was probably born around this date. He was, in my estimation, the future Virginian pioneer. (For full discussion see YFO Vol. 6, No.3. pp 5-9)

1616

Lincs. Ellen, wife of William Yarburgh, gent. died. (Yarburgh Register 3rd October)

1618

Lincs. William Yarburgh, gent. of Yarburgh died. His son, Henry, succeeded as head of the branch. (Yarburgh Register 17th April)

1620

Lincs. Henry Yarburgh, gent., son of the late William and Ellen Y, married Frances Cheyney at Boston. They were to have eight sons and a daughter.

1621

Lincs. William Yarburgh, heir of Henry and Frances Y., of Yarburgh village was born about this date. This line was the 'senior' but poorer of the Yarborough gentry.

1625 - 1633

Lincs. Henry and Frances Y had five other children but only Francis (b.1628), and Robert seem to have stayed at Yarburgh. There are no more Yarburgh names at Yarburgh after 1673.

<u>1625</u> Charles I reigned 1625 - 1649 (beheaded)

1625

Notts. Hercy Y, esq. died, His son Hercy was still a boy. His mother married again in 1636. The Nottinghamshire. Y wills are in the Record Office at Nottingham.

1631

Lincs. Edmund Yarburgh, esq., (son of Francis Yof Northorpe Hall) died. He left five children. His heir was Nicholas (later Sir Nicholas) Yarburgh, aged 19 in 1631.

1634

Yorks. Chancery case shows that Sir Nicholas Yarburgh's widowed mother owned the manor of Warmswork. This was presumably near Balne. It is possibly the place now called Wormersley. *Chancery Proceedings Charles I. B.118/35, Y.H. p.586*)

1635

Yorks. Nicholas (later Sir Nicholas) Yarborough married Faith Dawney in York.

(I.G.I. entry 26th May 1635)

For pedigree see <u>1611</u>.


Notts. Richard Yarburgh, heir of Hercy and Elizabeth Yarburgh of Nottinghamshire, married Francis Procter in London.

1636

Notts. Hercy Yarburgh's widow married Rowland Hacker.

Lincs. Thomas Yarburgh of Saltfleetby died. He was a brother of the Virginian Y.

His Will show this pedigree: Names in brackets are from other sources.



Witnessed by Richard Yarburgh (almost certainly the man who went to Virginia) and by Thomas Danse (Thomas's manservant)

1637

Yorks. Thomas Yerburgh (later Sir Thomas), eldest son of Nicholas Y of Snaith, was baptized at Snaith 29th August.(*I.G.I. entry*)

1639

Notts. Richard Yarburgh, son of the late Hercy Yarburgh and lord of the manor of Willoughby, Nottinghamshire, dies aged 26. He leaves a widow and two daughters. His death marks the end of that male line.

NOTE. Many felt that this Richard Y was the same man as the Richard Yarbrough, the Virginian settler, but this is proved to be impossible as the Virginian Richard Yarbrough died six decades later.

<u>1640</u>

Lincs Richard Prake in a case against Henry Yarborough (See pedigree under 1561) admits "that

Yarborough and his ancestors for long process of time did hold of the manor a farm worth £40 per annum". The case also shows that, in 1640, Sir Henry Radley was the lord of the manor of Yarburgh. However the Yorkshire Yarboroughs had bought the lordship of Yarburgh manor (Lincs.) before 1670.

(Chancery Proceedings Charles I M36/20. YH p.586-7)

1642

Lincs. Will of Charles Yarburgh is written in the form of a letter.

This man was grandson of William Y of Alvingham. See <u>1597</u> pedigree.

He gifts to his brothers: £40 to John, £70 to Richard. The residue to Matthias Januaries 26 1642

The gift of £70 (worth £10,000 today) to his brother Richard would have given him the money to set sail for Virginia.

1642 -- 49 Civil War

Families were divided in the English Civil War. The Yorkshire Yarboroughs supported the King. Some of the Lincolnshire Ys supported the Parliamentarians. Captain Robert Yerburgh was one of these.

<u>1649 - 1660</u> Commonwealth. Monarchy suspended.

Yorks. Sir Nicholas Yarburgh fined £600 (= £100,000 today) for his support of Charles I.

1652 Oliver Cromwell was Lord Protector 1653 - 1658

Lincs. Captain Robert Yerburgh was ordered to assist in the destruction of Tattershall Castle, near Boston. Robert lived at Boston where he was a Justice of the Peace. His wife was named Mary and his heir, Robert Yerburgh. The latter died in 1717.

(See Yarbrough Family Quarterly Volume 10, No.3 pp 4-5)

1655

Yorks. Sir Nicholas Yarburgh died at Snaith. His heir was Thomas Yarburgh.. See 1662.

<u>1658</u> Richard Cromwell, Oliver's son, was the reluctant Lord Protector. 1658 - 1659

1660 Monarchy restored under Charles II 1660 - 1685

1662

Yorks Thomas (later Sir Thomas) Yarburgh married Henrietta Blagge, daughter of Royalist hero Colonel Blagge. They had sixteen children but six died as infants. This marriage brought Thomas into the royal court circle.

1664

Yorks. James Yarborough, eldest son of Sir Thomas Yarborough, was born in 1664. The Duke of York (later King James II) was his godfather. James Yarborough, aged about ten, became a royal page. As an adult, he rose to be Colonel of the Guards. In 1692. he married the heiress Ann Hesketh of Heslington. Colonel James Yarburgh and Ann lived at Heslington Hall after the death of her father.

1667

<u>Yorks.</u> Henrietta Maria Yarborough, sister of James Yarborough, was born in 1667. She was maid of honour to Queen Catherine (Charles II's wife) and afterward to Queen Mary. She married a baronet in 1688 and had eight children. One of them was Maid of Honour to Queen Anne. (E.R.Y. Some Notes on our Family p.194)

So I end this Chronology of the Yarb(o)roughs with the Yorkshire Ys rising to their zenith and the Alvingham Ys extending their family in Virginia. The Nottingham and Cockerington Ys having established themselves as good County Families. The Yarboroughs may not have been many in number but they are proud of their family and upheld its reputation. They have a good ancestry and worthy progeny.



The Wormeleys and The Yarboroughs

Peter Yerburgh



The Wormleys and Wormeleys

The Wormley branches sprung from a Yorkshire (U.K.) village of the same name. Its origin, I have read somewhere, was due to a giant worm or dragon attacking the area and being destroyed by the local hero, who then called his settlement and himself by the name of Worm slayer.

By the 1300s the descendants of 'the hero' had spread down to other communities along the River Don (a major tributary of the River Humber) towards the port now called Kingston upon Hull. We read of a William Wolmersty of Kingston upon Hull, who in his Will (1375) leaves several shops to his wife, Christina. To his son, Robert, he bequeaths, 'his best mazer (silver mounted drinking bowl), six silver spoons and his best psalter covered with red leather'.

It was probably this son, Robert Wolmersty, who in 1395 had a ocean sailing pinnace in the port of London. In Market Privileges 1391 – 1395 there is the entry 'to allow Robert Wolmersty to load in a ship.....to take to Prussia, 300 dozen hats.' Quite an export - 3600 hats!! In 1404 the same man, with three others, were given permission to load ships with 60 tuns of wine for Ireland.

By the 1500s one branch of this family's had risen to the status of 'esquire' and they were the leading family in a village named Hatfield (perhaps reminiscent of those hats). One of the sons, Christopher Wormley, moved back to Hull and married Elizabeth Hogge. Many researchers have claimed that it was this man's son, also named Christopher Wormley⁴, who sailed to the Caribbean.

⁴ This unlikely as this Christopher was in Yorkshire when the Captain was in Virginia but the latter was probably a cousin.

Tortuga

Christopher Wormley appears in the State papers as being appointed to take men over to Tortuga and create an 'ideal commonwealth'. They were to take men over there to grow tobacco. The Captain was also to harry Spanish shipping in the Spanish Main.

The 'Company' which financed this expedition was called The Provident Company and consisted of twenty shareholders, The capital was £100,000 in 1637 - worth about four million pounds today. The shareholders included two earls and four knights. The King, Charles I, signed the permission for them to undertake the project but as his public policy was one of neutrality towards Spain, he probably turned a blind eye to their attacking Spanish ships.

The State papers show that Christopher was not confined to sailing. In 1635, he was appointed Governor of the Island of Tortuga (also called Association Island). He held this post between 1632-1635 The company gave quite strict orders as to what was *not* allowed. They forbade card-playing and gaming, whoring, drunkenness and profanity. It was likened to 'three nests of pirates with the morals of a Calvanist theological seminary'.

Virginia

In 1635, the Island of Tortuga was overrun by a Spanish fleet and Captain Christopher sailed for Virginia. There he was appointed, in 1639, Commander in Chief of Elizabeth City and of York county. He married and had a daughter who married the Governor of Virginia, Richard Kemp Esq.

Christopher died in the 1640s and left his tobacco estates to his brother, Ralph Wormeley. In 1649, a royalist Colonel visited Captain Ralph Wormeley's estate in Wormeley's Creek and reported that he "had a kind reception from all of them (Ralph's guests) which answered, if not exceed my expectations." In the same year Ralph was appointed a member of the Virginian Council. Wormeley died before 1651

Ralph's widow was an English lady, Agatha Eltonhead, and his heir was also named Ralph. The latter added fame to the Wormeley family by becoming Secretary of State and Acting Governor of Virginia. The family was by then very wealthy and the line continued in the male line into the late 18th century but in a quieter manner.

Richard Yarbrough

Richard Yarbrough came to Virginia in the 1640s, which is just about the same time as Ralph Wormeley was coming into prominence. The two men lived on different river mouths – The Wormeleys on the York River, the Yarbroughs on the James River. They were about sixty miles apart but it will be remembered that Richard Yarbrough, when acting as an interpreter and had his own vessel and had twice sailed to New York – a voyage of about 200 miles.

It is highly likely that they knew each other – after all a Yarbrough had married a Wormley two decades before. They also had a common interest in growing, exporting and selling tobacco. What interesting stories they could tell if they were to be alive today. Stories of the voyages, encounters with the Indians, the battles with the Spanish but my question would be to them would be, "How *exactly* are you connected to the main branches of your families?"

HENRY YARBROUGH

(*Zachariah* ~ *Joab*, *Thomas Yarborough*) was born ca. 1761 in Granville/Bute, NC', and died 30 Jan 1843 in Tipton, TN'. He married (1) BRIDGETT "BIDDIE" DAVIS 29 Aug 1785 in ,Rowan, NC', daughter of MYRICK DAVIS and MARGARET (UNKNOWN). He married (2) MARY CUNNINGHAM' 13 Sep 1803 in Rowan, NC', daughter of HUGH CUNNINGHAM and ELIZABETH SMITH. She was born 1779 in Rowan, NC'.= and died 1818 in ,Rowan, NC-".'.

Henry and family moved to Tipton County, Tn. in 1823. He is listed in the 1830 census of Tipton Co., TN

In the name of God Amen I Henry Yarbro of the County of Tipton and the State of Tennessee being of sound and disparing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament revoking and making all other wills by me at anytime made. First: I direct that all my funeral expenses and just debts be paid out of any money that I may die possessed of or that may come first into the hands of my executors.

Second: I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Freedle or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Third: I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane Billings or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Fourth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Biddy Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Fifth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Sixth: I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Seventh: I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Smith or her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

Eight: I give and bequeath to Annie Davis, the daughter of my deceased wife, the sum of one hundred dollars.

Nineth: I give and bequeath to William Cunningham, the son of my deceased wife, the sum of one hundred dollars.

Tenth: I give and bequeath to my son Andrew C. Yarbrough or his heirs my tract of land on which I now reside, also my wagon and set of blacksmith tools after payment and satisfaction of all the foregoing bequests and legacies to be made by my executors out of any money of which I may die possess of from the sale of such of my property as they may think best.

Eleventh: It is my wish and desire that all to the remainder of my property and estate of any or every description what ever both real and personal shall be equally divided between my two sons Edward Yarbrough and Andrew C. Yarbrough or their heirs.

Lastly: I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons Edward and Andrew C. Yarbrough my executors in witness of which I do this my last will subscribe my name and affix my seal this 4th day of November A.D. 1841.

DECLARATION

IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE BENEFITS OF THE ACT OF CONGRESS PASSED 7 JUNE 1832

State of Tennessee

Tipton County

On this 4th day of September in the year of our Lord 1833 personally appeared before Open Court before the Court of pleas and Quarters Sessions of Tipton County aforesaid now sitting Henry Yarboro Sen. a resident of said county aged about seventy one or two years, who being the first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declarations in order to obtain the benefits of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officer and served as herein stated, "Under Capt. Brittain Fuller I volunteered about the year 1779 or 1780 (which precisely I cannot recollect but I believe I was about 18 or 19 years of age) who commanded a horse company, I furnished my own horse and equipage and in the character of a private soldier I volunteered only for three but served six months. We were marched by Capt. Fuller from Randolph County, N.Carolina where I then lived with my father Zachariah Yarbro and where I volunteered to Six Mile Creek in State of South Carolina. When we arrived there Capt. Fuller resigned his command and Capt. Jacob Williams of Dan River took it, under whom we continued until he left us, which was about two months. Under Capt. Williams we were disciplined and preformed all the services required of us, such as scouting and collecting provisions. While we were there stationed and employed it was the Col Rugilly the Conspicious Tory of the Brick House was taken by some of our forces and with him, about two hundred prisoners, who at once surrendered upon the exhibition of pine logs painted and made to resemble cannons. They were all marched into the camp, and subsequently marched northwardly under the command of Capt. Williams. After Williams left us with the prisoners, we passed under the command of a captain of horse whose name I cannot now recollect, but he was attached to General Morgan's command. There was also Col. Washington, Genl. Greene, Linnborn and several others. Some of whom perhaps had no command at that time I believe Genl. Greene was our commanderin-chief. I was actively employed the whole six months in partisn war against the Tories, Having frequent skirmishes with them and sometime pretty sharp fighting, I was then young and being fired with the atrocities of the Tories, I bore hard upon them, sparing the women and children. Capt. Knights and Lieutenant Elijah Williams commanded on those occasions.

We were marched from the Six Mile Creek back to Charlottesville, N. Carolina and there discharged by Gen]. Morgan, who gave me a written discharge. I continued never the less for several years to carry on the partisan war against the Tories, who were so enraged me that I could not stay at home in safety and who did me much damage. I could relate much of the occurances of the partisan War in the back parts of N.C. and South Carolina if recepory in which I have been previously engaged. Judge Murphy of N.C., when about to write a history of that State sent a man to me requesting a detailed account of this war believing I could furnish a more connected history of those events than any other man he knows. I however was upon the eve of moving to this county, and answered I had no time then to devote to such matters, I was born in the year 1761 or 2 in what was then called Butte but now Franklin County, N. Carolina at about the commencement of the Revolution War; my father moved to Randolph County where we were living when I volunteered in the horse as aforesaid. At about the close of the war we moved to Rowan County, N. Carolina where there are many persons by whom I could prove my services. In the year 1823, I moved to this county, Tipton, Tennessee and where I have resided ever since. I was once told that if I would send my discharge to Capt. Williams of Va. I should draw my pay. I gave it to a man by the name of Davenport. When he returned from Capt. Williams' he informed me that Williams said he had nothing to do with it, that Capt. Fuller the man under whom I volunteered was to make out our payroll. When I Commanded my discharge Davenport said he had fallen into a river and lost his pocket book and all the papers. I did not believe him. I was unable ever to reclaim it and have never recieved any cent for any Service ever rendered by me for the U.S. I have no documentary evidence and know of no person in this state who can testify to my service.

I hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension except the present and declare that my name is not on the pension roll of this agency of any State."

Ans. I volunteered as stated in my declaration for three months and served Six.

5. State the names of some of the regular officers who were with the troops where you served in the Continental and Militia Regiments as you recollect and the general circumstances of your service.

Ans. There was Genl. Greene the biggest in command, Genrl. __ Col Washington of the Cavalry Horse and others as stated in my declaration also his circumstances of my Service is there attached.

6. Did you ever receive a discharge from Service and if so by whom was it given?

Ans. Gen]. Morgan wrote my discharge and gave it to me and it has been lost as stated in my declaration.

7. State the names of the person to whom you are known in your present neighborhood and who can testify your character for veracity and their belief of your service as a soldier of the Revolution.

Ans. John McKee and David M. Smith.

A NOTABLE YARBROUGH...



Democrat Karen Yarbrough (above right) speaks with volunteer Harriet Jackson outside the Broadview Public Library during voting Tuesday afternoon. Yarbrough was reelected to a sixth term in a landslide victory. With 77 of 80 precincts reporting, unofficial results show that Yarbrough, a Democrat from Maywood, received 88 percent of the vote compared to challenger Princess Cynthia Dempsey, a political newcomer from Broadview who ran as an independent. The district covers the south side of River Forest and a

strip of Oak Park along Madison Street, as well as Forest Park, Bellwood, Hillside, Maywood, Westchester, Broadview and Chicago. "I am very pleased with the outpouring of support from the people in the district," she said Tuesday night. "I have always tried to represent my district the same way a would like someone to represent me."

Yarbrough is the founder and CEO of Hathaway Insurance Agency. Her family has a history in local politics. Her father, Don Williams, is the former mayor of Maywood and her husband, Henderson Yarbrough, is the current mayor of Maywood. Dempsey has never served as a statewide elected official. Yarbrough said her two biggest priorities in her next term are education and addressing the state's budget woes. On education, Yarbrough would like to advance a school voucher pilot program, which reimburses students at failing public schools to attend private schools. She co-sponsored a bill introduced this year that would have applied to students at schools that rank in the bottom 10 percent, and would have given the students a \$3,700 voucher for private school tuition. The bill passed the senate but failed in the house.

As for the budget, Yarbrough said she would like to see reductions without impacting those dependant on state services. "We need to address the budget concerns while trying to make sure we protect the vulnerable," she said. "We need to address it without hurting the people who depend on this government." Yarbrough said that she would like to see the state focus on drug rehabilitation to reduce recidivism rates, which she said would drop prison costs. Dempsey didn't say where she would want to cut, stating that she would look at the budget further post-election.

On the economy, Dempsey said she would cut the state corporate tax rate by 10 percent overall. She said this would attract more business to the state. Corporations pay a 4.8 percent income tax, which is state revenue, and a 2.5 percent replacement tax, which is collected by the state and distributed to local governments. Yarbrough said the state should use funds for grants and training to help people become entrepreneurs. She said people who are now unemployed have the necessary skills in their field, but sometimes lack the know-how to run a business.

the annual conference, and Jim, Hal and Barbara have been in high gear planning for this event. Although I knew of the first family conference in Petersburg, the 1984 Nashville conference was the first time I learned of the YNGHA. Thanks to a hectic

What Some Yarbroughs Are Doing

• Brigadier General James C. Yarbrough United States Army

Brigadier General James C. Yarbrough was born in Columbus, Georgia, in 1957 and raised in an Army family. He earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Management from Tulane University in May 1979 and, as a Distinguished Military Graduate, was commissioned a second lieutenant of Infantry.



His initial assignment was with the 101st Airborne Division (AASLT), where he served as Rifle Platoon Leader and Anti-Tank Platoon Leader in 1st Battalion, 327th Infantry from 1979-1981. He was reassigned to 2d Battalion (Ranger), 75th Infantry, where he served as Rifle Platoon Leader, Company Executive Officer, Battalion S-3 Air from 1981-1984, and participated in OPERATION URGENT FURY in Grenada. After graduating from the Infantry Officer's Advanced Course, he commanded a rifle company in 1st Battalion, 31st Infantry (MECH), Republic of Korea, from 1985-1986. Following company command, he served as Operations Officer and Chief, Current Operations, U.S. Army Special Operations Command, then Aide-de-Camp to Commander, XVIII Airborne Corps at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Next, he served as Battalion S-3 for 2d Battalion, 504th Parachute Infantry Regiment (PIR); then Brigade S-3 for the 504th PIR before being reassigned as Chief, Theater Operations Branch at US Atlantic Command from 1994-1996. He then commanded 2d Battalion, 502d Infantry in the 101st Airborne Division from 1996-1998. Following attendance at the War College, Brigadier General Yarbrough commanded the 173d Airborne Brigade in Vicenza, Italy, from February 1, 2000 through June 23, 2002. As the XVIII Airborne Corps G3 commencing July 2002, Brigadier General Yarbrough served for 11 months as CJ3 of CJTF-180 executing Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan, and remained the Assistant Chief of Staff/G3, XVIII Airborne Corps until July 1, 2004. He served as the Deputy Commanding General, United States Army Infantry Center, Fort Benning, Georgia, from July 2004 through July 2006. On 1 August 2006, he became the Assistant Division Commander (Maneuver), 1st Infantry Division, Fort Riley, Kansas. In July of 2007, Brigadier General Yarbrough deployed to Operation Iraqi Freedom where he assumed command of the Iraq Assistance Group.

In addition to a Master of Arts Degree in Business Management from Webster University in 1991 and a Master of Strategic Studies in 1999, Brigadier General Yarbrough's military education includes the Infantry Officer's Basic and Advanced Courses; Air Assault, Airborne, Ranger and Pathfinder Schools; Jumpmaster, Military Freefall and Freefall Jumpmaster Courses; and U.S. Army Command and General Staff College and the War College.

Nathaniel was a drinking man who liked to gamble. In order to prevent his gambling away the family home, his brother Charles convinced Nathaniel to sign the property over to him. Nathaniel went on a business trip to Dinwiddie Co., VA. (where some of the family still lived) and he died about three months after he got there, on 21 May 1803. Unfortunately, the deed to his property was never signed back over to his family by Charles. Charles died in 1812 and Nathaniel's property became part of Charles' estate. There was a long and bitter court battle over this, with Nathaniel's family losing.

Lest We Forget

On September 8, 1944, an M4 Sherman Tank was destroyed by enemy fire. It was part of the 753rd Tank Battalion attached to the US 36th Infantry Division landing at Provence on August 15, 1944. After the battles in Provence and in the Rhone valley, this unit reached the Doubs' area in early September. This tank was destroyed at Saint Vit, near Besancon. The inside was completely carbonized. There remained practically nothing of the bodies of these soldiers. Because of this, they are not buried in the Epinal American Cemetery; rather, they are registered on the wall of the "reported missing." Those tankers memorialized by the French include Sgt. Clyde B. Yarborough of Texas, Technician 5th Class John E. Borkowski of New York, Corporal Ira Evans of Mississippi, Private Delbert V. Hobb of Missouri, and Private Richard W. Souder of Nebraska.

HONORING OUR HERITAGE

(More About the Edmund & Sophia Yarbrough Gravestone Marker Project) Joan Singlaub

We of the Yarbrough/Yarbro clan have a wonderful opportunity before us. Many of us can trace our lineage back to Edmund Yarbrough, the first Yarbrough to settle in Decatur/Perry County. Sometime after 1818 Edmund and his wife Sophia and their children travelled by wagon to the headwaters of the Tennessee River in Eastern TN. There after they built a flat boat and floated down the Tennessee River. They were caught in a current that pushed them up a small hidden stream which is now named Lost Creek in Decatur County. Edmund tied his flat boat at the first high point he came to and eventually built his first cabin where he lived and raised his family of eight children all born in North Carolina:

Aquila b.1788/89 Sucafiah (Sophia) b.1798

Henry b.1790 Nancy b.1799
James b.1792 Joseph b. 1800
William b. 1794 John H. b.1805

Edmund (1766-1850) and wife, Sophia Gostwick (1761-1841) were married December 5, 1789 in Franklin County, NC. They are buried at their Lost Creek farm in the Yarbro Cemetery, located east of Decaturville in the Mt. Lebanon Community. Their graves are unmarked and in a densely wooded area. To find their graves, turn at W.E. Turpin's place onto a passable gravel road. It is about a five minute walk from the Turpin home.

There are 37 graves, of which about 30 have stones without names. The cemetery is no longer in use. (*This cemetery was indexed on January 1, 1976 by Margaret Smith Alexander.*) <u>The following information was added to her document on April 21, 1980.</u> "Edmund Yarbro b. about 1766 d. 1851 – Sophia Gossett Yarbro b. about 1768 – d. 8-7-1841" It states that "These graves are unmarked, and the information came from Benny Yarbro's family records on January 31, 1979."

We, the descendants of Edmund and Sophia, plan to honor them by placing stone markers in the Yarbro Cemetery. To get there, take the road to Mt. Carmel from Highway 69 South; turn off main road at Guy Yarbro's home and follow the road. The cemetery is on a hill on the left. The graveyard is fenced with 46 or more graves. While family members have been cutting the grass, it lacks maintenance. A tree has fallen on the fence and broken it. Edmund and Sophia's son, Henry and wife Deliah started this cemetery on their farm and are buried there with many family members. We also plan to place a marker on the location where Edmund's cabin stood on Lost Creek.

Zachariah (Joab) Yarborough

The last issue provided the genealogy report of Henry Yarborough (b. ca. 1724, VA, m. Martha Robinson). However, no mention was made of his father, Thomas (ca 1685 VA). Thomas had five proven children – Henry, Thomas, Jr., John, Zachariah, and Manoah. There may be two other children, Archibald and Alexander, whose provenance so far as known hasn't yet been documented.

This issue continues with Zachariah, another of Thomas' children. Zachariah has a prolific number of descendants, so the presentation of this line will be split between this and subsequent issues. His children are a case study in the naming of children by our ancestors; Zachariah's proven children are Henry, Alexander, Manoah, and Thomas! Compare this with the list of Thomas' children. In addition there are these unproven children (if they existed at all): Zachariah, Archibald, Julia, Elizabeth, John, and William. No wonder our researchers spend so much time trying to unravel who is whom!

Again, the caveat that while it is believed these records are accurate, errors do creep in under the best of circumstances, so the reader/viewer is cautioned to always verify what is reported by others.

The genealogy report for Zachariah begins as follows:

1. ZACHARIAH "JOAB" YARBROUGH (*THOMAS*^A *YARBOROUGH*) was born ca. 1731 in "VA^I, and died in Lexington, NC^I. He married ELIZABETH DOWD in "Rowan, NC^I. She was born ca. 1733 in "Rowan, VA^I, and died ca. 1775^I.

Notes for ZACHARIAH "JOAB" YARBROUGH:

"I've never found a marriage record for Zach and Elizabeth. It is my theory now that Zach left Va. and went first to Anson Co., NC.--possibly with relatives of the Ambrose Y. line who left Va. about the same time Zach did and they settled in Anson Co. (which bordered Rowan Co. at that time). One early researcher stated he married Elizabeth Dowd in Anson Co., NC. with no proof or reasons for the statement. My research of the NC Dowd family shows they came from Ireland directly to NC. The only Dowd I've found the right age to have been Elizabeth's father so far is a Caleb Dowd--but I can't locate any records showing his family. Goodspeed states Henry Y. is of Irish Descent. The Y's are English/Danish. But this statement about Henry possibly refers to his mothers line. Please note the above is just a theory on my part."--Karen Mazock In the original article that refers to the 7 brothers, it says "Between the years of 1729 and 1775, seven brothers of the Yarbroughs went over to Louisburg, in Franklin County." This was not 7 brothers.--It appears to be

three brothers and 4 of their sons..more accurately, Thomas, his sons and grandsons.

"Before the Revolution of Independence in 1775, Zachariah left Louisburg and settled in Rowan County. (now Davidson since 1823) There he met and married Elizabeth Doud." (Letter of Mrs. Nelle Jenkins)

Letter from Karen Mazock, dated 26 Jan 1991:

I believe that I have found almost proof positive that the "Joab" referred to in the early Rowan County records is none other than our Zachariah Y. There are two state land grants to Joab Y...he sells one to Thomas Y (my ancestor and brother to your Henry). The strange thing is that in a property description in a 1796 deed, there is a reference to the Joab Y that year.

I have always found it strange that Zachariah Y. does not appear on the census records, but this Joab does for the years when Zachariah should have been there.

On the deed index and on one of the census records, it refers to a Jacob Y. I looked up the deed and it is definitely Joab Y, not Jacob. This is a printed census index and I think the transcriber just misread it. I have only looked at the printed census records and am wondering if the original record would also show that Jacob was actually Joab and just misread by the transcriber. I suspect that this will turn out to be the case.

We know that Zach was born about 1731 from the year that he first appeared on the tithe list in Virginia. I know that Zachariah is the same as Joab in the deed records. If the Joab/Jacob in the census records should also prove to be the same person, then Zachariah lived to be in his 90's. He got a land grant in 1802 in Randolph County (under the name Zachariah). This land was entered in 1794, so it seems that Zachariah should have been on the 1800 census of Randolph County. However, there is no Zachariah in Randolph County--just a Jacob Y. There is no Zachariah Y on the 1790 census, but in Rowan County is Joab Y. Again on the 1810 census is Jacob Yarbrough and on the 1820 Rowan County census is Jacob Y living alone. The 1820 census for Randolph County is missing.

As I said, I know that Zachariah/Joab/Jacob is one man in the deed records. I need to look at the original census records to see if Joab could possibly been misread as Jacob on them. If that turns out to be the case, I think we have found Zachariah for the years he is "missing".

I keep wondering what Zachariah actually did for a living. He doesn't appear to have been much of a farmer. He only had 50 acres when he sold out and left Bute County in 1775. When he got his land grants in Rowan County, the longest he held either of them was 2 years.

Once I finish the marriage records, I am going to go back to this. I've asked a cousin who works at the Davidson County, Nc library to look up the old census records on microfilm and see if she can tell anything about the names Joab/Jacob on them.

If there was actually a JACOB Y there, he is the only Y there we haven't identified. In the deed records, "Jacob" is very clearly "Joab"... and the record is wonderfully clear and legible.

Oh, well, this is something that I am working on and since it is also your line, I thought it might interest you.

DECLARATION

IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE BENEFITS OF THE ACT OF CONGRESS PASSED 7 JUNE 1832 State of Tennessee

Tipton County

On this 4th day of September in the year of our Lord 1833 personally appeared before Open Court before the Court of pleas and Quarters Sessions of Tipton County aforesaid now sitting Henry Yarboro Sen. a resident of said county aged about seventy one or two years, who being the first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declarations in order to obtain the benefits of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officer and served as herein stated, "Under Capt. Brittain Fuller I volunteered about the year 1779 or 1780 (which precisely I cannot recollect but I believe I was about 18 or 19 years of age) who commanded a horse company, I furnished my own horse and equipage and in the character of a private soldier I volunteered only for three but served six months. We were marched by Capt. Fuller from Randolph County, N.Carolina where I then lived with my father Zachariah Yarbro and where I volunteered to Six Mile Creek in State of South Carolina. When we arrived there Capt. Fuller resigned his command and Capt. Jacob Williams of Dan River took it, under whom we continued until he left us, which was about two months. Under Capt. Williams we were

disciplined and preformed all the services required of us, such as scouting and collecting provisions. While we were there stationed and employed it was the Col Rugilly the Conspicious Tory of the Brick House was taken by some of our forces and with him, about two hundred prisoners, who at once surrendered upon the exhibition of pine logs painted and made to resemble cannons. They were all marched into the camp, and subsequently marched northwardly under the command of Capt. Williams. After Williams left us with the prisoners, we passed under the command of a captain of horse whose name I cannot now recollect, but he was attached to General Morgan's command. There was also Col. Washington, Genl. Greene, Linnborn and several others. Some of whom perhaps had no command at that time I believe Genl. Greene was our commanderin-chief. I was actively employed the whole six months in partisan war against the Tories, Having frequent skirmishes with them and sometime pretty sharp fighting, I was then young and being fired with the atrocities of the Tories, I bore hard upon them, sparing the women and children. Capt. Knights and Lieutenant Elijah Williams commanded on those occasions.

We were marched from the Six Mile Creek back to Charlottesville, N. Carolina and there discharged by Genl. Morgan, who gave me a written discharge. I continued never the less for several years to carry on the partisan war against the Tories, who were so enraged me that I could not stay at home in safety and who did me much damage. I could relate much of the occurrences of the partisan War in the back parts of N.C. and South Carolina if recepory in which I have been previously engaged. Judge Murphy of N.C., when about to write a history of that State sent a man to me requesting a detailed account of this war believing I could furnish a more connected history of those events than any other man he knows. I however was upon the eve of moving to this county, and answered I had no time then to devote to such matters. I was born in the year 1761 or 2 in what was then called Butte but now Franklin County; N. Carolina at about the commencement of the Revolution War; my father moved to Randolph County where we were living when I volunteered in the horse as aforesaid. At about the close of the war we moved to Rowan County, N. Carolina where there are many persons by whom I could prove my services. In the year 1823, I moved to this county, Tipton, Tennessee and where I have resided ever since. I was once told that if I would send my discharge to Capt. Williams of Va. I should draw my pay. I gave it to a man by the name of Davenport. When he returned from Capt. Williams' he informed me that Williams said he had nothing to do with it, that Capt. Fuller the man under whom I volunteered was to make out our payroll. When I Commanded my discharge Davenport said he had fallen into a river and lost his pocket book and all the papers. I did not believe him. I was unable ever to reclaim it and have never received any cent for any Service ever rendered by me for the U.S. I have no documentary evidence and know of no person in this state who can testify to my service.

I hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension except the present and declare that my name is not on the pension roll of this agency of any State."

Second, I desire that all my just debts be paid out of my movable property. To my daughter Susannah Ratts I desire that she or her heirs have one hundred dollars to be made out of my lands. To my son Zachariah, I give a Negro woman by the name of Judith.

To my son's children Joseph H.(illard) and a girl her name I know not, a small black girl by the name of Mary Hasselton, which is to remain in the hands of my son Charles and Aaron until seven years old and then be hired yearly until Joseph H. Yarbrough and his sister become of full age and then the money answering thereby be paid to them together with the Negro and a small note I have signed by my son Samuel for the amount of \$15.00, and to Elizabeth, the widow of my son Samuel, I desire to give \$1.00 out of my estate. The USS Yarborough



The USS Yarborough (DD-314) was a Clemson-class destroyer in the United States Navy during World War II. She was named for George Hampton Yarborough, Jr., who was an officer in the United States Marine Corps and a recipient of the Navy Cross. Born at Roxboro, North Carolina, Yarborough enrolled in class no. 4, Marine Corps Reserve, on 7 April 1917, the day after the United States entered World War I, and was given the provisional rank of second lieutenant. After instruction at the Marine Barracks, Parris Island, South Carolina, he reported to the Marine Barracks at Philadelphia, PA, on June 4, 1917 for duty with the 16th Company, 5th Regiment of Marines. Yarborough sailed for France on June 14th; and reached

St. Nazaire on the 27th.

Yarborough, promoted to first lieutenant on August 11, 1917, served two tours of detached duty while assigned to the 5th Regiment, first at Cosne, France, between December 8, 1917 and January 4, 1918, and then at Gondrecourt, France, between February 22 and April 29, 1918.

On June 23, 1918, the height of the Battle of Belleau Wood, Lt. Yarborough arrived on the front lines. The next day, intense enemy fire from skillfully placed machine guns pinned down Yarborough's unit and platoon in a support position in the American lines. The young lieutenant dashed from one shell hole to another, in the open, steadying his men, until a burst of machine gun fire hit him. Severely wounded, he refused aid until other wounded men in his unit received medical attention. Finally moved to shelter, he succumbed to his severe gunshot wounds on June 26th. Cited for his bravery, First Lieutenant Yarborough was posthumously awarded both the Distinguished Service Cross and the Navy Cross,.



Return to Petersburg



Ten years ago, October 21, 2002, the Association met in Petersburg. The occasion was the third meeting honoring the memory of Richard ("Old Richard" or "The Immigrant") Yarborough with a re-enactment of his interment in the Old Blandford Church Cemetery. The ceremony was well attended as he was memorialized once again, with more than 200 people attending the service. History buffs, members of local organizations, visitors, tourists and judging by the name tags, quite a few of the extended Yarborough families, came for the reenactment of his burial 300 years after his death and first interment.

The Brick Church on Well's Hill, now known as Old Blandford Church of Bristol Parish, was erected in 1735. Rich in Colonial, Revolutionary, War of 1812, and Confederate history, the church was abandoned after the building of another Episcopal church in Petersburg, when the Town of Blandford had been absorbed by Petersburg. In 1901 the city delegated to the Ladies Memorial Association of Petersburg the privilege of developing this church into a memorial chapel and a Confederate shrine in memory of the 30,000 heroes buried in its shadow.

The Confederate States honored their soldiers by placing in the church memorial windows, designed and executed by Louis Comfort Tiffany. There are fifteen of these windows, making this shrine one of the art treasures of our country. Other Confederate memorials have been placed from time to time in this historic building. Memorial services were held here for George Washington, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson at their deaths. The cemetery itself covers approximately 189 acres. The oldest grave marker, that of Richard Yarborough, is from 1702.

Richard Yarborough came to the Virginia colony as a young man, prospered, and was a founder of Bristol Parish in 1642. He was the first person to be buried in Blandford Cemetery when he died in 1702. His resting place is on the rise called Wells Hill, before there was a Blandford Church. The church was built 33 years later. Today, his grave site is just to the left of the front door of Blandford Church.

With just a brief introduction, the Rev. D. Donald Dunn Ill, rector of Saint Paul's Episcopal Church, Petersburg, took the assemblage back to 300 years ago. Then, Dunn said, and "up to the 19th century, the parish church was the center of the community." The church bell would have rung then, first to tell of Yarborough's death, and later to end his funeral service.

Everyone in the community would have known him, Dunn said, but he would not be mentioned by name in the service from the 1662 Book of Common Prayer of the Church of England. Another difference, Dunn said, is that "the vast majority of people in this room wouldn't have owned a Prayer Book - or any book." In order for the congregation to sing the Psalm, the minister sang a line, which the congregation then repeated. That method was used Saturday, even though participants had bulletins with the entire service printed for them to follow.

Times have changed. Old Richard would not recognize the beautiful church where his descendants last met a decade ago, and certainly not Crater Road, nor the American English spoken with a Southern flavor as hundreds waited for the memorial service to begin. He would have known and loved, and been honored once again, by the unchanging worth of Scripture that consigned him to God's mercy and the Psalm time, which Anglicans in 2002 sing to the words "Let saints on earth in concert sing with those whose rest is won."

Next year, the *Yarbrough National Genealogical & Historical Association* will return to Petersburg once again to pay tribute to one of the first members of the extended family to seek his fortunes here in the New World. As details about the 2012 Conference become known, they will be posted on the Yarbrough family website (http://www.yarbroughfammily.org) and published in the *Yarbrough Family Quarterly*.

After Thomas's death, his widow and children went to Woodruff Co., Arkansas. From the papers of Judge Wm. A. Owen, Tipton County, Tn. "Uncle Peter Wilson Walton was killed by a man named Tom Yarbrough during the war(Civil). It is said that Uncle Wilson denounced Yarbrough for some of his (Yarbrough) conduct--claimed that he had stolen some widow's cow. Dr. Walton saw Yarbrough enter an old church. Yarbrough had his rifle and Dr. Walton said he would not be a coward, that he expected to be shot as he rode by. He was shot, but he managed to stay on his horse until he got home, something like a mile and half away. He lived on 'Randolph Road' just below where uncle Loftin now lives. He died about 24 hours after receiving the fatal wound. One of Dr. Walton's sons, W.H.Walton was in the army at that time, who had a daughter married to a man named Dickey-When Yarbrough learned that there was a likehood of Dr. Walton not dying, he proceeded to a thicket where Dr. Walton had 12 or 14 bales of cotton hid and burned them. It was said at the time, the cotton was worth \$500 per bale. My grandfather procured a warrant for the arrest of Yarbrough and the sheriff, D. C. Slaughter, with a posse went to Yarbrough's home to arrest him. He was dancing and had a negro playing the violin or fiddle for him. The sheriff informed Yarbrough that he had a warrant and he must submit to arrest. Yarbrough said, "Alright, let me get my hat." He came out of the house with a shotgun in his hand and two pistols and several dollars in gold in a belt around his person. He began to shoot and the posse returned his fire. Yarbrough was killed, but not until after he emptied his shotgun and several shots were fired from his pistol. The only man hit in the posse was a man named Cap Smith, who was first or second cousin of Dr. Walton. Smith afterward was killed by a man named Martin, and Martin was afterwards killed by Carpenter and Carpenter was afterwards killed by some man whose name escapes me, and this man fled, went to Arkansas and was never apprehended."
